nience or to send fudge as a gift, Tremblay's can ship an order anywhere in the United States.



"Our game wall right inside the front door won't disappoint,' Holperin declared. "Clue, Sorry, Mr. & Mrs. Potato Head, Farkle, dozens of versions of Monopoly, several chess and checker sets. Again, all the classics. But we've got all the new games, too, like Taco Cat Goat, Cheese Pizza, Sleeping Queens,

What Do You Meme, New Phone Who Dis, Camp, and the list goes on."

Holperin said she is pretty proud of her puzzle section with hundreds of titles, from wooden sets for preschoolers to 1000 pieces and larger. The store even has its own "house brand" featuring local attractions like the ice castles, Pirate Ship, Hodag, Bond Falls and others.

Shoppers will find a fully stocked baby and toddler section, summer outdoor toys, a complete line of Melissa & Doug educational toys, a wall full of Bruder trucks, sun hats and sunglasses, and dozens of kid-pleasers for under \$5.

Right next door to "Grandma's", Eagle Craft & Hobby offers shoppers another store full of variety and delight, according to Holperin's son, Chris, who is the Northwoods

exclusive dealer for TRAXXAS- brand radio control cars, trucks and boats.

"We stock everything from the Bandit, Rustler. Stampede and Slash, to TRX-4ms and LaTrax, up to the XRT, eRevo and MAXX series," Chris Holperin said, "along with a complete line of parts, accessories, batteries and chargers."

Holperin said the store's LEGO-brand wall is always a popular site, along with dozens of plastic models for all skill levels. New this year is the Metal Earth-brand of car and plane models.

"It may rain a couple of days this summer," Holperin winked, "so you'll want to be ready with a paint by number set, a latch hook kit, some embroidery, engraving art, a learn to sketch set, or maybe a wood carving project."

There's an aisle of books in the store with chapter books for teens, field guides and how-to books for adults, activity books for kids, coloring books for all ages, and brain-teaser books for a rainy day.

At the front of the store is "The Rock Shop", featuring a nice collection of rocks, minerals, agate book-ends, Michigan copper, crystal growing kits, healing stones, and a variety of rock-related gifts.

"Our sports card and supplies assortment has been really popular, too, along with vintage coins and comics," added Chris.

Holperin said there's a lot he hasn't mentioned, so a trip downtown is essential. Both Grandma's Toy Box and Eagle Craft & Hobby are open 7 days a week, 9:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., and are located right next to Rotary Square.



Recently, a beautification project took place at the golf course, adding new flowers to the scenery. "This is one of the most beautiful courses you will ever play — wooded, watered, carefully groomed, and totally in keeping with the unspoiled beauty of Wisconsin's North Woods," added Sable.

Anderson and his crew take great pride in providing optimal playing conditions for guests, from the greens to the practice range.


