



Housing collapse

The city council shot down an affordable housing project - but questions about residential housing remain



City leaders almost unanimously agreed that a plan to build a modular house on a city-owned lot for \$350,000 — only to turn around and sell it for \$140,000 — wasn't the best idea.

But the question of what exactly the city can do about affordable housing, especially when it comes to the increasingly rare single-family home, remains.

The city council Tuesday voted 10-1 to kill the plan after the city's Economic Development Committee last week approved 3-2 a proposal by Brian Luedtke Design Group to build a modular home on a city-owned site at 1019 Bridge Street in Wausau.

The proposal came after the city sought out bidders for the lot for the fourth time, with the previous three instances going unanswered. City staff previously said they were trying to work with makers of modular houses because they thought it might work out better. The Bridge Street lot is a difficult one to work on, they told city leaders, because of the close proximity to other houses. Habitat for Humanity was approached with the lot and they turned city leaders down too.

But even staff presenting the proposal acknowledged the sticker shock from seeing the price.

Tuesday's decision highlights the challenging nature of housing in the city. Real estate agents interviewed by City Pages have complained of low inventory in the city's housing stock since mid-2016, leading to rapidly rising prices. And while the city has had some success in the affordable housing realm — The Landmark underwent renovations, and a project by Gorman and Co. on the former Westside





Battery site is under construction right now — singlefamily houses remain a challenge for the city.

"My question is who is going to be building single-family homes in the next ten years if it's not subsidized somehow," asked Chad Henke, the only council member to vote in favor of the proposal Tuesday. "No one is going to be building single-family homes. And that really scares me."

Becky McElhaney, who came out strong against the proposal since it was approved at the Economic Development Committee, said city leaders are working on other

"The people who contacted me almost to a person were not against affordable housing. They were against this project," McElhaney says. "When I see one family for a \$200,000 payout, that just doesn't make sense to me."

WEC dismisses complaint against **Community for All**

A Wisconsin Ethics Commission complaint filed against a group called A Community for All has been dismissed, according to a copy of the dismissal.

The WEC dismissed the complaint following a closed session in December, according to the document. A citizen named Vada Perkins brought the complaint nearly one year ago, claiming that the group's activities, which included organizing a fundraiser for then-Mayor Katie Rosenberg's campaign and putting together endorsement lists of candidates that aligned with CFA's values, made them either a Political Action Committee or an Independent Expenditure Committee. As such, the complaint argued, they should have been required to register as such and report finances.

CFA organizers in response said it was a group of individuals who spent their own money, and any donations made by individuals were reported on the appropriate candidates' campaign finance reports. The organization didn't collect any money, the group argued, and had no bank account of its own.

The WEC largely agreed with CFA's arguments, saying the group didn't meet the threshold of either a PAC or an IEC, which has a \$2,500 spending threshold.

"CFA is pleased that the WEC dismissed the complaint," CFA member Christine Salm said in a statement. "We believe that the Republican Party Law firm along with local Republican Party activists filed the complaint purely to intimidate and silence CFA. We look forward to

continuing to advocate for a more inclusive and welcoming community."

But Perkins' attorney, Lana Ruhland, hinted that further action might come from the complaint.

"True grassroots groups should be fully protected by the First Amendment but overtly partisan groups must be accountable to our campaign finance laws," Ruhland said in a statement. "There cannot be a loophole where groups can effectively operate as a PAC in supporting candidates, hosting fundraisers and engaging in express advocacy without abiding by these laws. Groups cannot skirt these requirements when they've so blurred the lines between advocacy and partisan politics. My client will carefully review all available avenues."

HR committee dismisses complaint from former alderman

A city committee dismissed a verified complaint by a former alderman who called for two city staff members to be fired

The city's Human Resources Committee Monday dismissed the complaint brought by former alderman Keene Winters. Winters in the complaint, obtained by City Pages, accused the city of incorrectly classifying some city debt which meant the city was exceeding its debt limit, violating the law. He accused City Finance Director Maryanne Groat and City Attorney Ann Jacobson of misleading the council on the matter and called for their suspension while the complaint is investigated. And ultimately, the complaint says, called for them to be fired.

The city's HR Committee met in late December to discuss the complaint in closed session and did so again on Monday. Following the closed session, the committee voted unanimously to dismiss the complaint. No further comment on the matter was given.

Mayor Doug Diny told City Pages that municipal attorneys were contracted to evaluate the complaint.

The city's bond council, Quarles and Brady, explained to

city leaders Tuesday that the water and sewer bonds are classified differently than other forms of debt. The firm is charged with specifically ensuring the city's borrowing is in compliance with the law, a representative of the firm told city leaders.

Kronenwetter starts extension after village board member doesn't file paperwork

Interested candidates for the village of Kronenwetter Board have until Friday to file their candidacy paperwork after a sitting board member failed to file paperwork.

Alex Vedvik didn't file candidacy or non-candidacy paperwork, according to Kronenwetter officials, so the deadline to turn in nomination papers has been extended until Friday.

Board member Kelly Coyle filed non-candidacy paperwork, while incumbents Chris Voll and Chris Eiden filed to run again.

Three candidates are running for village board, sparking a primary. Incumbent Voll will face challengers Aaron Myszka and David Baker.

The three will face off in the primary on Feb. 18.

Charges filed in Tomahawk man's death


Prosecutors have filed homicide charges in the recent death of a Tomahawk man.

The Lincoln County District Attorney's Office on Monday filed first-degree intentional homicide charges on Michelle Sanderson, 43, of Tomahawk. The charges also included resisting or obstructing an office and disorderly conduct, and all three charges carried a domestic abuse modifier

Michelle Sanderson is accused in the death of 50-yearold Richard Sanderson of Tomahawk. According to the criminal complaint, police believe Michelle Sanderson stabbed her husband with a steak knife and he was taken to the hospital in Tomahawk shortly before 10 pm. He died of his injuries at the hospital around 10:30 pm, according to the complaint.

Michelle Sanderson told police she heard her husband calling for help from the garage and found him bleeding, the complaint says.

She is currently being held in Lincoln County Jail on a \$250,000 cash bond, according to online court records.

Supreme spending

TV buys explode in next Supreme Court race

Conservative Supreme Court candidate Brad Schimel says in his first TV ad that "justice is my life's work."

Meanwhile, the liberal group A Better Wisconsin Together is up with what it called a mid six-figure buy accusing Schimel of being soft on sexual predators.

Schimel announced Monday he was starting a \$1.1 million TV buy that would run through the end of January. His campaign said it includes broadcast and cable with ads to run in the Milwaukee, Green Bay, Madison, La Crosse and Wausau markets.

In the ad, Schimel says his career



includes helping Wisconsin's most vulnerable, stopping elder abuse, taking on human traffickers and putting pedophiles behind bars.

He also says he led the sexual assault kit initiative, clearing 4,000 backlogged kits so survivors could "finally get justice." The backlog of untested kits was an issue in 2018 as Schimel lost his reelection bid for attorney general to Dem Josh Kaul. Dems have already knocked Schimel as he has

mounted his bid for Supreme Court.

"For me it's not a title, it's my mission statement," Schimel says to close the spot.

LeMahieu: Republics will pull polices from Evers's budget

Senate Majority Leader Devin LeMahieu says Senate Republicans will "pull out all the policy issues right away" when Gov. Tony Evers introduces his budget plan.

"It's not a policy vision for the governor," LeMahieu said on WISN's "UpFront," which is produced in partnership with WisPolitics. "But a lot of the requests, in education, K-12 is way too much. He said \$4 billion was almost too much for him in education, so we'll see what he puts in there."

LeMahieu said Senate Republicans will also "not fully fund" the Universities of Wisconsin request for \$855 million in new funding.

"Outside of Madison and maybe one or two other campuses, enrollment is declining," LeMahieu said. "So I'm not sure why it makes sense to continue to put more money into a system that's in decline."

LeMahieu indicated Republicans will first introduce a stand-alone tax cut bill ahead of budget negotiations with an estimated \$4 billion surplus and likely see different bills coming from the Senate and Assembly.

"I think it's important to get a commitment from the governor to cut taxes first before we pass the budget," LeMahieu said. "We'll work with the Assembly, but it might be a Senate bill, there might be an Assembly bill, and we'll work together to maybe do both or combine."

Senate votes along party lines for Voter ID

The state Senate today approved along party lines a constitutional amendment that would require voters to show a government-issued ID to cast ballots, the first piece of legislation the chamber passed in the new session.

The amendment, approved 17-15 with Republican Rob Stafsholt absent today, next heads to the Assembly, which plans to take it up Tuesday.

Dem state Sen. Kelda Roys, of Madison, chided her GOP colleagues for rushing to take up the constitutional amendment just weeks after a shooting at a Madison school in her district that left three dead. She argued the Legislature should be focused on issues such as gun violence and rising costs for child care, health care and prescription drugs.

Instead, Roys said, Republicans are focused on adding a restrictive voter ID requirement to the state Constitution that they know has already prevented some Wisconsinites from casting ballots because they lack the proper identification. She

argued it was part of a GOP effort to improve their chances at the ballot box.

"We should be making peoples' lives better and protecting people's rights. Instead, we're vandalizing our Constitution and making it more difficult to vote," Roys said.

Dems, GOP view certification through a different lens

Democratic lawmakers remembered the Jan. 6 Capitol riot and promised a more peaceful transfer of power this year, while Republicans celebrated the certification of president-elect Donald Trump.

"Today we remember January 6, 2021, where Donald Trump incited a violent mob of his supporters to attack the Capitol because he lost a presidential election," U.S. Rep. Gwen Moore, D-Milwaukee, said on X. "No attempts to downplay or lie about what happened will erase the truth."

Moore continued to speak out against Trump, citing concerns with his promise to pardon those who stormed the Capitol four years ago.

U.S. Rep. Mark Pocan, D-Town of Vermont, described Jan. 6, 2021, as a day when rioters were "tricked" by a defeated president into defying democracy by storming the capitol.

"January 6th was one of the darkest days in our nation's history and a stain on our tradition as a peaceful transfer of power," Pocan said on X. "While I wish the results were different, I supported certifying the election because the peaceful transfer of power is what makes our democracy work."

U.S. Sen. Tammy Baldwin, D-Madison, acknowledged those mourning a loved one on the anniversary of Jan. 6 in a statement on X, then said she still had a job to do: "Certify the 2024 election because, whether I like the results or not, I am committed to a peaceful transition of power and accepting the results of a fair election."
