WELCOME TO CLINTONVILLE



The Clinton family reached this area of the Pigeon River their ox became lame and they could not cross. Thus, what is now the City of Clintonville began.

Originally known as the Pigeon for its vast flocks of passenger pigeons, the area is now known as the home of Four Wheel Drive (FWD) and North Central Airlines. FWD now is Seagrave Fire Apparatus and North Central Airlines is now Delta.

A drive down Clintonville's active Main Street provides shops, restaurants and views of stately houses and large shade trees.

The city also has a thriving industrial park. Excellent public schools along with a parochial school — St. Martin Lutheran School — attracts families. An up to date library serves the area.

The city fields an excellent amateur baseball team, which won the 2015 Badger Amateur Baseball Association (BABA) championship.

The city also has an American Legion Baseball





team that plays at W.A. Olen Athletic Field at Don Jirschele Stadium in the summer. For the first time in 22 years, the Wisconsin American Legion Baseball Class A State Tournament was held in Clintonville at W.A. Olen Park in 2017. The Diamond Cats went 3-2 and finished the tournament as the runners-up.

Clintonville is governed by an elected mayor, city council and has a full time administrator to supervise city departments. The city has its own water, sewer and electric utilities.

Numerous parks provide recreational activities year round. When the ice freezes on Pigeon Pond, ice fishermen and cross country skiers come out in droves. A disc golf course is available in W.A. Olen Park and an 18-hole golf course offers a reasonable round of golf.

A community center provides a center for senior activities, a venue for casting your ballot as well as a gathering place for community events.

Clintonville's economy is powered in part by surrounding family dairy farms. A farmers' market during the growing season offers farm fresh produce, cheese, eggs and other products.

A veterans' memorial on Main Street pays tribute to military members. Local veterans groups are active in Memorial and Veterans Day tributes. The American Legion hosts a monthly steak fry throughout much of the year.

Local churches offer a free community meal weekly and a food pantry serves the area. Clintonville citizens look out for their neighbors. Service clubs meet regularly and offer opportunities to get involved in community efforts.

Clintonville is a great place to raise a family or retire. Local realtors are happy to provide a tour of available homes for sale in the city.

CLINTONVILLE HISTORY

Clintonville is the home of the four-wheel drive vehicle, as the first all-wheel drive cars and trucks were created in Clintonville in 1908. The Four Wheel Drive Museums: FWD Seagrave Museum at 325 East 15th Street, and the FWD Seagrave Zachow-Besserdich Museum at 40 East 11th Street can be toured by appointment by anyone looking to learn the history of the Four Wheel Drive Corporation and how it put Clintonville on the map.

Many other aspects of Clintonville history are highlighted at Pioneer Park. Each of the park's buildings is packed with historical items that tell what life in the Clintonville area was like through the years. Operated by the Clintonville Area Historical Society, the park's attractions include: a two-story frame house built in 1861; Clintonville's first town hall and fire department; the Doty-Besserdich House: the 1869 Stavemaker Cabin: and a unique stone collection that includes Pioneer Park's segment of the "Great Wall of China."

The Marion, Embarrass and Bear Creek areas feature unique historical interests. These communities were founded along waterways such

as the Pigeon River and Embarrass River, and are in close proximity to the Wolf River, which was the lifeline for area communities throughout the 19th century.

Embarrass was named after the Embarrass River, whose name derives from a French word for "impede" or entangle, because logs often snagged along the waterway. Bear Creek started as a lumber camp in 1850 when the state of Wisconsin was 2 years old. In those days, the area's only inhabitants were Menominee Indians. Like many pioneer towns, Marion, Bear Creek and Embarrass went through the stages of Indian campsites, logging points and trading centers.

The Four Wheel Drive Foundation began an expansion project nine years ago with the acquisition of the former Topp-Stewart/Atlas Conveyor factory buildings located at 325 15th Street. Through the generosity of Mark Thomas, current Chairperson of the FWD Museum Foundation, he purchased the former Atlas Conveyor property and took charge of organizing a group of volunteers to expand the museum. In its nine years of growth under Mark's guidance, the Foundation formed what is now called the FWD Seagrave Museum. The museum is a 501(c) (3) non-profit foundation, and although it is not owned by the current Seagrave Fire Apparatus Company, it does receive support through services and historic documents.

The FWD Seagrave Museum currently has ninety-three vehicles on the property and is displaying seventy-eight of those vehicles for visitors to see and learn about. In 2024, through donations, the museum obtained.

a 1923 Seagrave Water Tower truck. This is one of three owned by the Chicago Fire Department and is on permanent

loan from the Chicago Firefighters Association and museum. The museum also acquired a 1955 FWD Aerial fire truck from Kokomo, Indiana, as well as a 1923 tractor drawn aerial fire truck from the Kankakee Fire Department in Illinois, A 1975 FWD semi tractor was obtained from a construction company in norther Illinois and a 1955 FWD former fire truck with only 682 original miles on it. This spring, the museum will have in its possession, and 1945 FWD COE artillery truck that was located in the Netherlands from WWII. The truck is in terrific condition for being 80 years old, and will be the first WWII era military truck in our collection.

An exciting restoration of the original Zachow-Besserdich Machine Shop located at 40 11th Street is underway as part of the expansion project. A small group of volunteers are transitioning the Machine Shop into what we believe it once was. Efforts by our volunteers to place period correct, belt driven lathes, drill presses, saws and other equipment on display like Otto Zachow and William Besserdich would have used when they

invented the very first successful four wheel drive vehicle back in 1909. That actual vehicle known as the Battleship is kept in running condition and is on display in the vehicle display museum on 15th Street. Once the renovation is completed, it will be like stepping back in time for visitors who come to see and learn about the history of FWD.

Furthermore, volunteers began a renovation project two years ago that is nearing completion. A long room on the west side of the main building, affectionately known as the one hundred foot room is being converted into a small thirty seat theatre, as well as a large display/meeting area and a needed utility room. Seagrave Fire Apparatus donated over 350 historic films that will be digitized so they can be eventually shown to visitors in the theatre. Our mission is to have the history of both FWD and Seagrave trucks as well as the FWD Eliason snowmobiles and FWD military vehicles will be viewable by visitors soon.

The Clintonville City Hall staff is responsible for ensuring the smooth day-to-day operation of all administrative functions and services. The staff includes a full-time city administrator, city clerk, city treasurer and deputy clerk-treasurer.

The City of Clintonville has an elected mayor whose responsibilities include presiding over the council meetings and acting as the chief elected official. The mayor assists the staff in carrying out the policy directives of the common council. The mayor holds regular weekly office hours to give the citizens an opportunity to meet and discuss concerns.

The City of Clintonville elects a 10-member common council that is headed by the council president. The city is divided into five aldermanic districts, each having two alderpersons. The council is charged with developing local policy through legislative process and directing the activities of the staff.

The City of Clintonville also has a number of independent commissions and boards that are appointed by the mayor and approved by the common council.

Clintonville Police Department provides the city with 24-hour police protection and dispatch. The police department is responsible for protecting people and property and for providing a safe working and living environment for residents and visitors.

Fire protection and rescue services are provided by volunteer, paid-on-call firefighters, who are responsible for responding to emergency calls, conducting safety inspections, and advising the city staff and community on matters of fire protection.

Clintonville Fire Department also provides protection to three area townships, Bear Creek, Larrabee and Matteson.

CLINTONVILLE PARKS & RECREATION DEPARTMENT

The city has two community parks and 14 other areas that are classified as either neighborhood parks or green spaces. In addition, there are three boat landings, Ice House Landing at the intersection of W. 12th St., N. 12th St. and Hemlock St., Pickerel Point Landing off of West St. and Pigeon Lake Wayside Landing off of 8th St.

The department is also serviced by as many as 20 temporary part-time employees to ensure that adequate staff is available to perform all functions. The department provides many opportunities for people young and old to participate in recreational activities. There are a wide variety of classes and programs offered by the department. The city owns and operates a Community/Senior Center at 30 S. Main St., which can be rented by the public. There are five outdoor shelters, which can be rented by the public.

The Clintonville High School Rec Center is open to the public seven days a week much of the year and closed on Sundays during the summer. Amenities include a large pool with eight lanes for lap swimming with a maximum depth of 10 feet, a small pool with a maximum depth of 4.5 feet, a whirlpool, an extensive fitness center and a community gym with six basketball hoops.

Admission is available through a day pass or annual pass. Programs offered include swimming lessons, water aerobics, weight training, first aid, CPR, and lifeguard training. A community education room is also available to rent for hosting parties or get-togethers.

CLINTONVILLE COMMUNITY CENTER

The Clintonville Community Center can be rented by the community for private events. The cost of rental depends upon how many rooms are used. Accommodations include a kitchen, DVD/ VCR player, movie screens, presentation boards and white boards. Through the use of movable acoustical walls, the activity room can be arranged into three smaller rooms. The facility is available nights and weekends as well as a portion of it during the daytime on weekdays.

The Clintonville Public Library is located at the corner of Eighth and Hemlock streets. The building houses more than 65,000 items. The library is a member of the Outagamie Waupaca Library System and provides access to items from more than 50 libraries in northeastern Wisconsin through its online catalog. Items can be reserved and renewed through the library's website.

In addition to books, other items available from the library include videos, CDs, magazines and digital items. Public computers are available on a first come, first served basis. CLINTONVILLE AMBULANCE SERVICE

Clintonville Area Ambulance is co-owned by 11 municipalities throughout Waupaca, Outagamie and Shawano Counties. The 24-hour service provides emergency 911 service at the paramedic level and provides Critical Care Paramedic interfacility transports from hospitals in the area.

CLINTONVILLE MUNICIPAL AIRPORT

The City of Clintonville owns and operates the Clintonville Municipal Airport on the southeast corner of the city. The airport handles all types of aircraft, including corporate jets. It has two paved runways that are 4,600 and 3,300 feet long and one 2,010-foot grass runway. The city has five commercial hangars along the ramps that are leased by aviation-related companies. There is no city water and sewer at the site, so the buildings are served by a private well and septic system. There are approximately 21 private hangars that others have built on the land leased to them by the city.

CLINTONVILLE AREA WASTE SERVICE

The Clintonville Area Waste Service is operated by the City of Clintonville, Town of Larrabee and the Town of Matteson. Residents of these three municipalities may dispose of their garbage and recyclables here.

CAWS Hours:

Friday and Saturday • 8 a.m. to 3 p.m.

When disposing of garbage, it must be in clear plastic garbage bags no more than 30 gallons or 27 pounds and must be tagged with a green CAWS sticker. It is the policy of the CAWS Board that NO cash be accepted at the site. Checks will be accepted for the amount of purchase only. The purchase of CAWS stickers are available at the following locations: Tadych's Marketplace Foods, Northside Plaza, Walgreens, and Kwik Trip. The stickers are sold in sheets of 5 for \$17.50 (\$3.50) each).

EDUCATION

The Clintonville Public School District, with an enrollment of approximately 1,300, serves the greater Clintonville area. The school district includes Dellwood Early Learning Center (4-K, Head Start and early childhood), Rexford-Longfellow Elementary School (grades K-4), Clintonville Middle School (grades 5-8) and Clintonville High School (grades 9-12) and two parochial schools, St. Rose St. Mary's and St. Martin Lutheran.

Programs available to students include Advanced Placement courses, gifted and talented opportunities, special education and School-to-Work, a cooperative learning initiative with area businesses and industries.

In addition, Appleton-based Fox Valley Technical College has a regional center in Clintonville. The center offers daytime and evening credit courses, applicable toward associate degree, technical diploma or certificate programs, and non-credit courses for enrichment.

Continuing education opportunities are available within an hour's drive at Lawrence University, St. Norbert College and University of Wisconsin campuses in Green Bay, Menasha, Oshkosh and Stevens Point.

Three pre-schools and several fully staffed day care centers are available for residents with small children.

HEALTH CARE

ThedaCare Physicians Clinic provides family health care and a variety of X-ray, laboratory and

specialty services.

The Clintonville Area Ambulance Service provides emergency service on a 24-hour basis. Licensed personnel, EMTs and paramedics are located at two stations and operate at the Advanced Life Support level.

Two hospitals are located within 15 minutes of Clintonville, ThedaCare Medical Center-Shawano and ThedaCare Medical Center-New London.

Four health care facilities for residents needing extended care and several assisted living facilities are available in the community.

Dentists, optometrists, chiropractors and rehabilitation therapy centers meet the needs for total healthcare. The community is also served by two veterinary clinics for pet and animal care.

MANUFACTURING

The industrial community in the City of Clintonville has a unique heritage serving as the birthplace of four-wheel drive technology. The city has a diverse industrial park located north and south of State Highway 156 and east of State Highway 22. Numerous improved lots are ready for development. Current occupants include businesses that manufacture plastics, paper products, metal forging, fire apparatus and metal fabrication.

The Clintonville Industrial Development Corporation is a local corporation that assists businesses in locating in Clintonville and helps existing businesses expand. The city has Revolving Loan Funds available at a low interest rate to assist in the creation of new jobs. TRANSPORTATION

Public transportation is offered by a local taxi service, call 715-861-6866.

Commercial air service is available from airports in Appleton (35 miles), Green Bay (40 miles), Mosinee (60 miles) and Milwaukee (130 miles). Clintonville's municipally owned airport handles all types of aircraft, including corporate jets. It has two lighted, hard surface runways and a turf runway. Full-service maintenance, including avionics, paint, fuel, instruction and complete aircraft maintenance, is available at this facility. VILLAGE OF BEAR CREEK

Bear Creek started as a lumber camp in 1850 when the state of Wisconsin was just 2 years old. In those days, the only inhabitants of the area were Menominee Indians. Like many pioneer towns, Bear Creek went through the stages of Indian campsites, logging points and trading centers.

Enterprising lumberman Welcome Hyde founded the village when he located his lumber camp on the bank of the river and cut the first road into the area. Within a short time, other families built homes nearby and many of these earliest settlers found employment in the lumber camps that came into the territory. There was no village in the whole township area of the present Bear Creek until the railroad was built in 1880. About this time, F.M. Hyde constructed a store at what became Bear Creek Station. The Truman brothers built a second general merchandising store after Hyde, and a depot and a post office came along. Before long, the station became a settlement of considerable importance in this lumbering area.

Catastrophe hit the village in 1902 when fire wiped out three-quarters of its area. This fire, still referred to by old-timers as "The Big Fire," was the main reason behind the move to incorporate the village that same year. One of the first steps taken by the village fathers was to provide as much firefighting equipment as possible. Within two months, the village had a hand-powered engine with 500 feet of hose and a large cistern reservoir.

When the village was incorporated, it was named Welcome to honor its first settler. Within a few years, the name had changed back to Bear Creek because of the confusion resulting from the village and railroad station having different names.

Presently, Bear Creek has a population of 441. The village's main industry is GLK Foods, which is the largest sauerkraut company in the world. The original Flanagan Sauerkraut Factory was opened in 1916. A main event held in the village is the St. Mary's Sauerkraut Festival held on Saturday and Sunday of the first full week in August.

VILLAGE OF EMBARRASS

The Village of Embarrass, named after the Embarrass River, has grown to become a picturesque fishing destination.

Embarrass also features a community park that is home to Embarrass Fun Daze every year in late July. The event celebrates the village's unique identity and is put on by the Embarrass Fire Department, a volunteer force that is a contributor to the community both in safety and fire protection services as well as community involvement.

Embarrass is a friendly, caring community that works for residents and businesses alike. Drive along the tree-lined streets and you will sense

something special: a sense of pride.

The village has enjoyed decades of growth and prosperity that is mirrored in the well-kept homes, the thriving businesses and the spirit of the people. Generations of hard-working people have shaped Embarrass into a community, a role model for progressive small towns everywhere.

A nice thing about Embarrass is the great outdoors are just outside your door, surrounded by a year-round scenic paradise for boating, canoeing, hiking, biking, golfing, fishing, snowmobiling and hunting. Within the city and surrounding area there are acres of parks, trails and recreation facilities.





The Clintonville Elevator serves the local area as a feed mill and grain elevator.

It first opened in 1929 and was originally located in the downtown area. With no room to expand, a new feed manufacturing facility was built in 2007 in the Clintonville Industrial Park and the business moved there.

This allowed the business to grow, as well as add capacity. New and state of the art equipment was also installed at that time. A 50-mile radius is served by the Clintonville Elevator.

The feed mill portion of the business makes all types of livestock feed, of which about 95 percent is feed for dairy cattle.

There are also three full-time nutritionists employed to help farmers balance feed rations to maximize herd nutrition, production and reproduction. Samples are

taken at individual farms and sent to a lab in order to determine what is best for each herd.

In addition to creating livestock feed, the feed mill portion of the business also creates custom mineral mixes.

On the grain side, Clintonville Elevator is a fullservice grain dealer. It can dry grain for customers as well as store it for them. In addition, Clintonville Elevator can contract with customers and market their grain on the open market.

After harvesting grain from their fields, farmers can bring it to the Clintonville Elevator to have it dried to use for feed immediately, or have the grain stored at Clintonville Elevator. If the grain is stored, farmers can use it in the future for their feed needs, or have Clintonville Elevator market it on the open market.

The Cordwood House is the one we are trying to restore., the home of Wm Besserdich, one of the inventors of the FWD axle.

The fourth building we own "Museum on Main" was the original home of Dr Wm Finney, a prominent doctor in Clintonville.

On June 21, 2025 the society will have a celebration at Pioneer Park at 32 11th St. All houses will be open for tours as will the FWD machine shop. There will be trolley tours of historic places in Clintonville, Jeff Pockat will entertain the crowd with his Celtic Harp.. The Legion will be selling grilled food and a fur traders encampment will be set up in Olen Park.



SPRING CRUISE CAR SHOW, ON THE "MAIN DRAG" FOR OVER 20 YEARS

The Spring Cruise Car Show, originally called the Beat the Heat Car Show, began as a small event in the parking lot of Culver's restaurant.

Lynn Lorge, who worked at Culver's at the time, suggested the car show idea to the Beat the Heat Youth Program. Dick Fletcher, Craig Hodne, Steve Norder, Mike Wright, and Terry Lorge planned the first show as a way to raise funds to help support the group.

After two years at Culver's, it was clear that the show needed more room to allow for more show cars. Show organizers sought and received approval from the City of Clintonville to move the car show on to Main Street. Thus, on the third Friday of May, each year, the Annual Spring Cruise Car Show was born.

The show became an immediate success and, according to co-organizer Terry Lorge, "It is considered one of the nicest car shows in Northeast Wisconsin." Lorge says as many as 270 plus cars have been displayed on both sides of Main Street, stretching from 7th to 12th Streets.

"A food stand and music with a DJ make the show a great destination for an evening of beautiful show

cars, great food, musical entertainment, 50/50 raffle, and a place to reunite and visit with friends," said Lorge.

Many local merchants remain open on this evening, allowing attendees to stop in and browse the stores, taverns and restaurants.

Thirty trophies in 15 different classes are awarded at the end of the evening and dash plagues are provided for each car entered in the show. The show car owners themselves vote for the winning cars in each category and three special trophies for Mayor's Choice, Police Chief's Choice and Chamber's Choice are awarded.

The Beat the Heat Youth Program ended in 2015 after 22 years in the community, but the proceeds from the car show continue to serve area youth by providing annual scholarships to high school graduates in the Clintonville school district that are planning on attending a trade school or college in pursuit of an education in the automotive or mechanical field.

The 23rd annual 2025 show is slated for Friday, May 16th from 5-9 PM., the same weekend as the Clintonville Lions Carnival.
