Ballot box investigation

The city's ethics board is investigating a complaint against Wausau's mayor

Complaints

After a long meeting with a few twists and turns, the city's ethics board elected to move forward with an investigation into Mayor Doug Diny's removal of a ballot box from the steps of city hall.

The board took that action after determining that the facts in the complaint, if true, did constitute a violation of the city's ethics code. But board members were clear that the specific determination did not mean those facts were verified. That is up to the investigation.

The complaint in question was filed in January stemming from an incident in which Diny on a Sunday removed a ballot box from the steps of city hall and put it into his office. The box, the city clerk says, was awaiting installation by city staff on Monday morning.

The incident led to a city council floor

battle, a DOJ investigation and the raiding of Diny's home and office, and now a citizen complaint filed to the city's ethics

Some raised concerns about now-former ethics board chair Kay Palmer since she signed a letter in October asking the state to look into the ballot box removal. Palmer said she couldn't respond to inquiries when City Pages asked, citing advice from the board's outside legal counsel not to discuss the case.

But on Wednesday Palmer recused herself from the agenda items related to Diny's ballot box removal, citing her statements in her role with the League of Women Voters. She did not mention her signing of the letter.

That bumped up alternate Jesse Kearns, who ran against Diny in 2022 for city

council. Diny won that contest, serving one term on the council before running for Mayor and winning last year.

The board as part of its next steps sought a response from Diny to the complaint, newly elected board chair Calvin Dexter said. And he sought evidence from Diny, the city attorney and the city clerk as part of the investigation.

The board will then use that investigation as the basis to make a probable cause determination. From there, if the board decides there is probable cause, they can either schedule a hearing or turn the case over to the district attorney or another authority.

Given that there is already a case referred to the district attorney that was ultimately elevated to the state level, a hearing is more likely.

Appointment stall

On Tuesday the city council tabled an appointment by Diny of a new member to the city's ethics board.

Diny included the appointment at the last city council, prior to the first meeting of the ethics board, but pulled it citing a scheduling conflict. But that appointment re-emerged on Tuesday night's council agenda.

Dylan Anderson, who Diny put forward for appointment, appeared in person Tuesday. He told the council that he was looking to get involved in the community and someone suggested the ethics board to him since it had an opening, so he applied.

Anderson currently works for Congressman Tom Tiffany (R-Minocqua) helping constituents with their concerns.

But while most council members expressed appreciation for Anderson's interest in getting involved in city politics, and expressed regret for some of the online rumors he endured, they said the timing was too suspect. With Diny currently facing a complaint that the ethics board is in the middle of investigating, it looks bad to have Diny then appoint a member to that

"I received a lot of emails [from people who] were alarmed about the timing," City Council Member Becky McElhaney said Tuesday. "And these are from people who I don't normally hear from. This whole thing has taken up so much oxygen, I don't want to put someone else in the eye of the



appointment until the end of the investigation of the Diny complaint, or until a need arises for another member due to quorum issues. The issue seems to have pointed to a hole in the rules, because there doesn't appear to be an alternative to the mayor appointing board members when that same mayor is the subject of an investigation.

Warm weather closed snowmobile, fat bike trails

Warmer-than-usual late February temperatures have shut down a number of the area's trails this week.

Marathon County announced over the weekend that all county snowmobile trails closed as of Monday morning. Trails had only opened Feb. 14, making a pretty short season without colder temperatures and more snow

The warm temperatures also closed down all of the fat bike trails in the county. Ringle and Nine Mile Forest had been opened and groomed.

Officials from the Wausau/Marathon County Parks Department announced that cross-country skiing and snowshoeing at Nine Mile remain open as of Monday morning, though later reports on Skinny Ski indicated that those conditions were starting to deteriorate. They also say outdoor ice rinks are closed until temperatures are more amenable.

That's not likely to change soon with temperatures forecast a week out into the 30s and 40s.

High-speed chase suspect headed to prison

A man who led police officers on a highspeed chase from Kronenwetter into Wausau last summer is headed to prison, according to court records.

Cody Mayotte, 23, of Antigo was sentenced last week to three years in prison followed by five years on supervision.

Mayotte on Aug. 24 led police on a highspeed chase when officers in Kronenwetter went to execute an arrest warrant on another suspect, Bryse Drake. That led to a chase into Wausau, where Mayotte crashed into a silver car on Grand Avenue near Henrietta Street.

Mayotte pleaded no contest to fleeing an officer with property damage, second-degree recklessly endangering safety and causing injury in a vehicle while under the influence of a controlled substance. The first two charges are Class G felonies.


Kronenwetter to hire clerk

Kronenwetter decided to continue searching for a new clerk after the village has been without one for several months now.

The Kronenwetter Village Board decided to make that decision Monday after a closed session meeting. The village has been without a clerk since Bobbi Jo Birk-LaBarge resigned in November.

LaBarge's departure was the latest of what has been a revolving door at the village. The village also had two administrators start and quit in 2024, and the finance director also resigned. Jennifer Poyer has been operating as interim clerk.

Sports bill

Dittrich introduces new transgender sports bill following Trump's executive order

State Rep. Barbara Dittrich,

R-Oconomowoc, reintroduced legislation to ban transgender women and girls from playing the team or sport that matches their gender identity.

The introduction yesterday comes after the Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association changed its transgender athlete policy last week to comply with President Donald Trump's executive order barring transgender women and girls from playing women's and girls sports. The National Collegiate Athletic Association



has also updated its policies to reflect the president's executive order.

The proposals, which began circulating for co-sponsorship yesterday would require transgender women and girls in K-12 schools, Universities of Wisconsin schools and technical colleges to play the sport that aligns with their sex assigned at birth.

Dems and Gov. Tony Evers have blasted the legislation as discriminatory.

Evers vetoed both bills last session, and has vowed to "veto any bill that makes Wisconsin a less safe, less inclusive, and less welcoming place for LGBTQ people and kids."

The co-sponsorship memo, which includes Sen. Rob Hutton as a co-author, says "society overwhelmingly agrees that only biological women should play against other biological women."

"We must protect our daughters, sisters, wives, and granddaughters on the field of competition," it states.

Before WIAA made the policy change, Dittrich had told WisPolitics she would reintroduce her bills to ensure Trump's policy is codified into state law if a future president overturns the executive order.

Fair Wisconsin Executive Director Abigail Swetz in a statement said: "We've fought these discriminatory bills before, and we'll do it again."

Roys defends Evers' spending increase

State Sen. Kelda Roys, a member of the Legislature's budget-writing committee, says Gov. Tony Evers' proposed 20% spending increase is not only responsible but needed

"I would go as far as to say, let's look at the context here," the Madison Dem said on WISN's "UpFront," which is produced in partnership with WisPolitics. "This budget helps repair some of the damage done by 15 years of Republican incompetence and financial mismanagement, debasing our tax structure and underfunding our most critical public services like K-12 schools and the universities."

Roys said Dems, who are in the minority both in the Legislature and on the Joint Finance Committee, will work to tout Evers' proposal through the budget-writing process. His plan includes a new tax

"We need to have public services," Roys said. "If we just cut taxes for everybody, including the wealthiest, who have, by the way, already enjoyed many years of far reduced taxes, then we don't have the money to keep our public schools open."

Roys said Dems won't back a standalone tax cut bill that Republicans may propose ahead of passing the budget.

"It's like everything that they see is a nail," Roys said. "They've got one tool. It is tax breaks for the wealthiest, and to do that outside of the context of the state budget would be incredibly irresponsible, and I would not support that."

Musk, WMC make push into **WI Supreme Court race**

A group tied to Elon Musk and another linked to the state's largest business group are up with new TV ads knocking Supreme Court candidate Susan Crawford for sentences she's handed out as a Dane County judge.

Meanwhile, Musk's America PAC has launched a \$1 million canvassing effort backing Brad Schimel, and Crawford has launched a new spot of her own.

The WMC Issues Mobilization Council has \$2.9 million in reservations on broadcast and cable TV through March 19, according to AdImpact. Meanwhile, the Musk-aligned Building America's Future has \$1.6 million in reservations on broadcast and cable TV through March 5.

According to AdImpact, Schimel and those backing him had an advantage of more than \$7 million in future reservations as of Thursday morning. There was \$7.7 million reserved to back the Waukesha County Circuit Court judge to \$572,000 boosting Crawford.

The WMC spot says the judge's nickname is "Catch and release Crawford," and the narrator says she gave three years to a "pervert" who was facing 25 years for 10 counts of child pornography. The narrator adds Crawford also "allowed a felon to

escape prison after he brutally beat and strangled a woman."

'Catch and release Crawford lets criminals off easy all the time," the narrator says to close the spot. "No one is safe with dangerous liberal judges like catch and release Crawford."

The narrator in the Building America's Future spot says a repeat child molester sexually assaulted a 7-year-old at a local swimming pool and faced 100 years, but Crawford gave him four.

Evers budget calls for boosting schools, health insurance company audits

Gov. Tony Evers Tuesday night called for boosting funding to Wisconsin schools by \$3.4 billion, creating a new program to audit health insurance companies that deny too many claims and passing a series of tax cuts.

The tax cut package totals \$2 billion in relief via cutting local property taxes, eliminating the income tax on tips, and exempting products such as diapers and utilities from Wisconsin's sales tax.

And he called for a new individual tax rate that would hit millionaires. He again called for a cap on a tax break for manufacturers. The moves would generate more than \$2 billion in new revenue for the

Evers hailed his proposal as the "most pro-kid budget in state history," from his proposals to address lead exposure to the investments in education.

"This budget is about doing what's best for our kids—yes, by addressing pressing challenges facing our kids today," Evers said. "But we must also work to do what's best for our kids' futures, too.'

Altogether, Evers' plan would spend \$50.5 billion in general purpose revenue, money the state collects through things like individual, sales and corporate taxes. That'd be an increase of 18.1%, leaving the state with a gross balance of \$646.3 million in the general fund at the end of 2025-27, CP

How to Change a Beneficiary Designation

Updating beneficiaries is straightforward, but the actual process can depend on the type of account. Many accounts can be checked and changed online. Some accounts require filling out paperwork. A spouse's written consent may be required to name someone else as beneficiary. A beneficiary change could require a sign-off from a plan administrator.

When naming a beneficiary, be as detailed as possible. Most designation forms ask for a person's full legal name and their relationship to you. You may also need to provide details such as the beneficiary's contact information, date of birth, and Social Security number. You should also request and save beneficiary change confirmations. 

Andy Nevitt has already kayaked the entire Wisconsin River in record time — now he's going for a new record



Andy Nevitt has completed several long-distance races before crossing setting the solo record for paddling the entire Wisconsin River.



Andy Nevitt got a kayak for Christmas in 2019. It was a Sun Dolphin, a perfect boat for casually paddling around a lake or a leisurely float down a river.

Nevitt took his kayaking in a different direction from most. That gift from his in-laws led to seeking out some of the toughest kayak challenges in the country — days-long paddles where sleep is a luxury.

That culminated in 2023 when he not only paddled the entire length of the Wisconsin River — that would be impressive enough. Beyond that, he paddled it in record time, faster than anyone has ever paddled it solo in a kayak.

This year he plans on doing more — he wants to paddle the river in the fastest time ever, with any kind of nonmotorized boat.

Nevitt plans to undertake this paddle this summer, which will involve sleep deprivation, paddling in the dark, and navigating rapids. The City Pages sat down with Nevitt recently to hear his story.

From Sun Dolphin to serious kayaker

I personally own the same Pelican kayak I've had since 2014. It floats, gets me around the lake or river and is wide enough that I have yet to flip it.

Nevitt is different. He caught the bug. After getting the kayak, he was on the water one day when he remembered his wife's cousin mentioning this race across Missouri. Nevitt thought to himself that day, I'm going to do this race.

The MR340, according to the race site, is the longest river race in the United States. It runs this year from July 7-11. Racers can paddle straight through or stop at checkpoints.

Nevitt started entering smaller races with the goal of competing in the MR340. But when he went to sign up, it was delayed due to high water (making the river dangerous). It was pushed back more and more. Finally, it was canceled until the next year.

By then, he'd made a kayaker friend in Chicago who also wanted to do it. They paddled a tandem kayak to the finish that year in about 73 hours, Nevitt says.

He had blisters all over his hands, lower back pain, and soreness in a lot of uncomfortable spots.

He was hooked. "I think a lot of it was finding out whether I could," Nevitt says. "A lot of the people in this race just want to finish. They're not top-tier athletes who are training year round."

Maybe not. But after that race, Nevitt wanted to do more than just finish a race like that.

Each of these races becomes a kind of puzzle, Nevitt explained. They're like a math problem. He plans out his sleep schedule, his nutrition.

He knows what his pace is, so it's a matter of planning his stops around knowing how fast he will travel and where that will put him at.

For these races, Nevitt's wife helps as ground crew. Sometimes he thinks she has the tougher job of the two. Being sleep-deprived, tired and groggy puts him into a state that's kind of like a toddler. He says she needs to manage his mood and all the other logistics.

She's been doing more kayaking herself, Nevitt says.

Tackling our river

Nevitt moved to Rib Mountain four years ago from LaCrosse, where he went to graduate school, and he set his eyes on another challenge. A friend sent him an article about someone setting a record for paddling the entire Wisconsin River. It was meant as a joke. Nevitt took it as a challenge.

Nevitt and another friend started scouting the river, taking two-day trips at a time. The more they scouted, the more Nevitt was convinced he could beat the record, and maybe beat it pretty handily.

A man named Rich Hodgkins had previously completed the entire length of the Wisconsin River, from Lac Vieux Desert in the Northwoods down to its terminus in Wyalusing State Park south of Prairie du Chien (where the Wisconsin River meets the Mississippi River) in six days,

Nevitt did the math. With his pace, he was sure he could do it in less time.

Setting the record straightNevitt couldn't help but grin as he paddled into the final stretch of the river, paddling to touch the Iowa side before completing the journey at Wyalusing Park south of Prairie du Chien. Nevitt's wife, his parents and his friends Mark and Ellen were on hand for his arrival.

Remarkably, he managed to gain a pound during the

But more importantly, he set the solo record for kayaking the entire Wisconsin River in five days, two hours and 19 minutes.

That was 2023. This year, Nevitt has another goal in mind. The top record holder for the whole thing.

Setting a new record

Nevitt this year aims to be the first kayaker to complete the entire Wisconsin River in record time, for any kind of non-motorized vessel. The current record was set by two men in a canoe in 1995. Together they paddled the entire thing in four days, two hours and 22 minutes.

They're in the Guinness Book of World Records for a similar trip on the Mississippi.

Nevitt believes he can beat it. Again, to him, it's a math problem.

On the Wisconsin trip, he explains, he stayed in hotels and slept a reasonable amount. For this attempt, he plans to sleep very little in order to gain time. He has a faster boat than he did in 2023 and a better night paddling set-up.

"This time I'm going to be sleeping in the boat ramp, catching an hour of sleep when I do pull out for the night."

That might seem extreme, and it is, but Nevitt has done that with other boating races before.

Some of it is up to Mother Nature as well, Nevitt explains. Higher or lower water could make it more challenging, or cancel the plans atogether. And Nevitt, who works in the medical field, has to request his vacation a long time in advance, so it's tough to adjust his window of time to complete the trip.

There's also portaging. The river has 26 dams along the $\,$ way and each one needs to be portaged around. Wheels are allowed for the record, but the kayak must move of the kayaker's own volition — no help moving the boat is allowed.

And Nevitt says about 85% of his calories come from supplements when he's paddling. He uses a brand called Infinite Nutrition. It's similar to the kind a triathlete would use when racing. "I'm going to be carrying hydration anyway," Nevitt says. "It might as well be my calories too."

Then there are the Whirlpool Rapids. While most of the rapids aren't too bad, Nevitt says, the Whirlpool Rapids near Rhinelander are pretty intense. The key is to plan the trip's start so that the rapids come up during the day, since they would be treacherous at night. They're not easy to navigate with a 20-foot kayak. "If you're in the wrong spot in the rapids, it's not like you can nimbly maneuver your way through them," Nevitt explains.

Finishing with a record


Nevitt plans to leave in the afternoon on Memorial Day to attempt to set the record. But when I ask about what might be next if he completes the record, Nevitt is clear that this is probably the last such venture for a while. He mentions the Mississippi River, but that's probably not in the cards. "I'm not at a point in my life where I want to take a big chunk out of my life and my family's life to commit to something like that."

Nevitt says he will post a tracker online where people can follow his progress. And he's hoping to set up something where people could kayak with him on the Wisconsin River when he makes his way through Wausau.

Meanwhile, I asked Nevitt what his 8-year-old daughter thinks about all this. Two years ago, she didn't seem to understand much about it. But recently a TV reporter who will be doing a mini-documentary came to his house and was setting up cameras and lighting. Afterward, she asked him "Dad, are you famous?"

In a sense he is, as the fastest solo time paddling the entire Wisconsin River. And perhaps more so if he completes the total record for the river.






