For many veterans serving overseas, most notably during the Vietnam War, coming home was referred to as getting "Back in the World." "The World" was a place of normalcy, family, everyday acceptable and calm conditions...a place to forget the nightmare of combat. However, the reality of getting back in the World did not meet with these expectations for a great many Veterans. The war hitched a ride back home with them in the form of nightmares, posttraumatic stress, ruined relationships, survivors' guilt, and personally destructive behaviors.

these veterans, getting back in the World was the beginning of a new struggle. Veterans of decades past and presentday have similar journeys of recovery, learning to live in a way that does not forget the past and those buddies that they may have lost, but of developing a new life of hope and strength. People as **Beneficiaries**

I have been helping two sets of clients who are brother and sister to each other. They share as beneficiaries of different accounts, few inherited from their mother. We easily transferred their portions of a Roth IRA and an IRA to new accounts, which are now titled as beneficiary accounts in their names. This was straightforward and clear-cut, because the IRA and Roth IRA listed each child of the mother, who was the original account owner, as equal beneficiaries. There is also a non-retirement account owned by the siblings' mother, but it is not so easy to transfer, because the beneficiary designation was not to each named child. In fact, the beneficiary was not left to a person at all, it was left to "the estate."

Naming the estate opened up the probate process. Now, a court must verify the funds and assets of the estate and validate the distribution to the correct beneficiaries. Creditors may come forward with a claim to the money as part of the probate process. Probate is lengthier than directly naming beneficiaries and involves attorney and probate fees that would not have been necessary if the account had people named as beneficiaries instead. We also looked at the taxation that will be levied on the account, which will now be due at the estate level before the money is distributed to the children. Estate level taxes are higher than the tax rates my clients pay individually, so ultimately with taxes and fees, less money from the account is

inherited by the children than would have been had beneficiaries been listed in their names.

Naming an estate as beneficiary can be part of a logical plan in some For example, if cases. one intended and planned distribution complex arrangements as part of their will or trust, where the account owner did not want the beneficiaries to have full and immediate access to the money, naming the estate could be part of that plan. Unfortunately, this did not seem to be the intention. Rather it appears that in this case, the implications of naming the estate as beneficiary were not thoroughly examined, and the inconsistencies of the beneficiary designations across accounts indicate that there had not been an account review process for quite some time by the mother's advisor or herself.

Investments are just one element of an account. Understanding account titling, transferring and beneficiary designations are obviously important but often misunderstood or overlooked. Mistakes can be costly and cumbersome. Unique circumstances may apply to your situation: consult the trusted, professional advisor who understands your circumstances for specific advice. The simplest, most direct way to transfer your accounts upon your death is to name people as your beneficiaries.

gift cards and the Texas Roadhouse "Meals to Go" program provide an opportunity for Veterans to call ahead to pick up their meals.


The Post also provides their Honor Guard members with gift cards after they have presided at more than one military funeral rite on the same
