





April showers bring... blood donors?

In an effort to secure a steady supply of blood donations this April, the Red Cross is offering incentives to lure prospective donors in.

Incentives include Amazon gift cards, free T-shirts and entry to win a \$5k gift card

All April blood donors will be entered for a chance to win a \$5k gift card. In addition, anyone who donates between April 1–13 will receive a \$15 Amazon gift card. For those who stop in during the latter half of the month, April 14–30, the Red Cross will be giving out free Red Cross T-shirts as long as supplies last.

Don't suffer in silence

Following a sexual assault, it can be difficult to figure out where to go or who to turn to for help.

To commemorate Sexual Assault Awareness Month, Aspirus Health is promoting its Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) program, which offers survivors of sexual assault or domestic violence confidential medical care, advocacy support and, if desired, forensic evidence collection.

"[Survivors of sexual violence] have had their choices taken away from them," said Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner Rhonda Knoblock, "so we want to give those back to them. If they decide they want us to collect evidence, we will. If they decide they don't want us to, we won't. But we want to be there for them to provide the resources and the care that they need to help them through this time."

More than half of women and nearly one in three men in the United States have experienced sexual violence involving physical contact in their lifetime, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, although researchers estimate that these statistics do not capture the entire scope of the problem due to the shame that surrounds such incidents.

The SANE program is currently available at nine Aspirus locations across Wisconsin and Michigan, including Wausau.

"Just know that we're here for them. We're available any time of the day for them to come in and we are more than happy to provide that service for them," said Knoblock. "I think if they're hesitant to seek help after a sexual assault or some sort of abuse, I know they're scared, but we urge them to come in and have an exam.

"If they choose not to have an exam, just come in and get the resources from us and talk to us. We're here to help, and we do want to provide that care for them so that they are able to get the resources and hopefully are able to heal after this traumatic event."



Bull Falls Brewery to reopen

Following its purchase this winter by a group of investors, Bull Falls Brewery is on track to reopen later this spring.

Kurt Mueller of Dorchester, who owns architectural firm Critical Dimensions, and Jason Peck of Hartford purchased the brewery at a sheriff's sale following its foreclosure for unpaid debts to the city. A judge confirmed the purchase in January.

"Re-opening Bull Falls is an opportunity to preserve some of the history and heritage of Wausau and Central Wisconsin," said Peck, who plans to relocate to Wausau to tend to the brewery.

On top of plans to add a beer garden, expand food service, upgrade the taproom and potentially build a permanent structure on the south end of the property to support events year round, the duo also expects to make their beer available to local establishments for off-site distribution by Memorial Day.

"We have a lot of work to do to create the new brew pub experience we want but also want to get the brewery open sooner than later as there is a high demand for our beer," said Peck.

Addressing a trend of nationwide brewery closures in recent years, Mueller said, "There are certainly challenges in the brewing industry. I think if we can provide an expanded line-up of great beers paired with really good food and lots of opportunity for entertainment both in the taproom and our outside venues, people will love the experience we will provide."

The brewery will celebrate its re-opening with a grand re-opening event. The event is still in the works and not yet scheduled.

Got land? Get certified

If your community has land to develop, the Certified in Wisconsin Program wants to hear from you.

The Certified in Wisconsin Program helps

communities to obtain site certification by offering partially subsidized site analysis and review, gauging potential corporate interest in the site, providing communities with recommendations for site development and gathering the key reviews, documents and assessments most commonly required for industrial use to effectively market land to developers.

The program is a collaboration between Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation, which claims to be the state's lead economic development agency, and the Site Selection Group, a "global location advisory and corporate real estate" company, per its website.

"The Certified in Wisconsin Program sends a message to site selectors and businesses that these properties and their communities are ready for new development, said WEDC secretary and CEO Missy Hughes. "Going through the process and completing key reviews, documents and assessments offers certainty to developers, site selectors, expanding companies and other attraction prospects."

To be eligible for the program, a site must consist of a minimum of 20 contiguous, developable acres that are available for sale or lease to prospective industrial buyers. Both privately and publicly owned properties are eligible, provided the community either owns the property or has an exclusive option on the property.

Compounding: Working for You, or Against You?

I wrote "One Simple Rule for Building Wealth", about using the "Rule of 72" as an estimation to calculate doubling periods for our money based upon a hypothetical rate of return and time frame. I encourage you to teach those you love about money and how the Rule of 72 can motivate us to build wealth over the long-term. The key component is compounding: putting money to work so that our original contribution earns a rate of return, increasing in size, essentially continuing growth on the growth.

Did you ever stop to think about that concept in reverse? Spending money you don't have, charging your purchases to credit cards and not paying off the full balance immediately the next month can be an example compounding in reverse, and you're now dealing with the debt devil. Your reverse "contribution" is the charge

onto the credit card. If you are charged interest on your balance and you do not pay off the full amount, the interest may accrue adding onto the debt you owe. If you are again charged interest on the new balance, which includes your original purchase plus interest on interest, you are compounding your debt. Even worse are examples of when this debt was used for purchases that do not appreciate in value, which is the vast majority of credit card spending.

Simple good decisions can compound. Simple bad habits can also compound. Which do you choose? Compounding to work for you, or against you?





In less than a week, the Wausau Softball Club will reveal the results of a community contest to christen its upcoming softball team and cement the team in the history books.

The Wausau Softball Club will be a member of Northwoods League Softball, a spin-off of the Northwoods League, the 26-team baseball league that counts the Wausau Woodchucks among its members.

Established last year, Northwoods League Softball is the first for-profit women's summer collegiate softball league.

"[The NWL] wanted to give the opportunities that they have for baseball players to softball players with a softball league," said Brianne Barta, assistant manager of the Woodchucks, who will be taking on the role of general manager for the Wausau Softball Club.

Barta has been with the Woodchucks since 2021, when she came on as a stadium operations intern.

"It was a lot of overseeing the concessions at the ballpark," said Barta. After college, she'd sought a career path that would allow her to work "in the operations side of things," and having worked at a bar through college, she was drawn to the food and beverage aspect of the position.

After a successful internship, Barta was hired on as a full-time manager for operations of food and beverage.

"It was something I really enjoyed in my internship," said Barta of her duties as food and beverage operations manager. "It was nice to be able to stick on with that in my internship and also with the Woodchucks."

A little over a year after she signed on with the Woodchucks, Barta was promoted to assistant general manager of the Woodchucks.

Another year, and she was asked to manage a new team: the tentatively named Wausau Softball Club.

Her duties include working with the club's head coach to recruit the 18 women athletes who will make up the team's roster, ranging from recent high school graduates freshly admitted to college to a limited number of just-graduated college players. Any athletes with softball college eligibility remaining can feasibly play.

The Wausau Woodchucks were founded in 1993. They,

too, relied on the community to help them build their identity, partnering with the Daily Herald for a mascotnaming contest.

Wausau Softball took a leaf from the Woodchucks' playbook, announcing its Name the Team Contest last December.

"We wanted to be able to involve the community in naming the team," said Barta. "It's definitely something you aren't able to do very often, especially being a new team... The Woodchucks are a huge part of this community, and we wanted the softball team to be as well, so right off the get-go we wanted involving them in that naming process to be something that we do."

The official name will be one of four finalists listed on the Wausau Softball website: Polar Owls; Snow Dragons; Curd Crushers; or Ignite.

"It feels really, I guess, exciting to be able to bring softball to Wausau here and to start this new team," said Barta. "I've been involved in sports my entire life. I played a bunch of different ones when I was younger. I ran track and cross country in college. It's always been a part of my life, so to bring high-level college sports to Wausau is really awesome and it's something that I'm really happy to be a part of."

As for what she's most excited for looking forward, Barta had a hard time deciding.

"I think it's two-part for me," Barta said. "I'm really excited for these college athletes to have the opportunity to play in the summer league and to play not only in Wausau, for our fans, but in other cities as well, to be able to showcase their talents. I'm also really excited to bring fast-pitch softball to Wausau... High-level fast-pitch softball is not really something we have in this area."

Whatever team Wausau finds itself host to next week — whether they be Polar Owls, Snow Dragons, Curd Crushers or Ignite — the love of sports, the drive to create world with just as many opportunities for women athletes as men and the passion for the behind-the-scenes logistics — will drive them just the same. As for the rest, that's up to the team and their hometown fans to figure out.

How to help children safely navigate social media



As of October 2024, there were 5.22 billion social media users around the world, according to advisory firm Kepios. That translates to roughly 64% of the global population, a percentage that might upset detractors who see social media as a largely divisive entity that research has found can have an adverse effect on the physical and mental health of its users.

Social media certainly has its ups and downs, which is perhaps why so many parents feel like governing children's usage of platforms like Snapchat and Instagram is akin to walking a tightrope every day. Helping children safely navigate social media is no small task, but finding a way to do so can have a profound impact on youngsters' health. The American Psychological Association offers the following recommendations to parents and caregivers concerned about the safety of youngsters using social media.


Recognize social media features that can be especially harmful. The APA notes that children can learn new social skills and communication strategies on social media. That's a notable benefit of social media usage, but there are some harmful components that can be particularly detrimental to children's still-developing brains. The APA highlights like buttons and the use of artificial intelligence as particularly harmful features because they promote excessive scrolling. Adolescents may be especially vulnerable in this regard, as the APA notes that the brain undergoes dramatic developmental changes during adolescence, when areas of the brain associated with a desire for attention from peers become more and more

sensitive. Social media can exploit that need, which is even more dangerous because the parts of the brain that govern self-control do not fully develop until early adulthood. Parents can limit usage of platforms that tally likes and set screen limits to minimize excessive scrolling.


Monitor usage and maintain a dialogue about it. The APA urges parents to monitor their children's social media usage, particularly during early adolescence. But it's equally important to maintain a dialogue with children about their social media usage. The APA notes studies have found that engaging in ongoing discussions with adolescents about safe social media usage can help them navigate its dangers more effectively. Engaging youngsters each week also can make them feel more safe and not as though they're being judged about their usage. Discuss what they see and their understanding of what they see. Parents also can present hypothetical situations that may unfold on social media and ask them how they would respond.

Lead by example. Children learn many of their behaviors from their parents, so if Mom and Dad exhibit poor social media habits, then youngsters are more likely to follow suit. The APA urges parents to avoid scanning social media during meals and family time. Parents also can self-govern their own usage, setting the same limits on time as they set for children. Periodic breaks from social media usage also can show children how it's alright to take a holiday from the platforms every once in a while.

Parents have a tall task ahead of them in regard to helping kids safely navigate social media. But various strategies can increase the chances kids have a positive social media experience.
