Ethics Committee concludes Diny investigation

The Wausau Ethics Board voted on April 3 to conclude its investigation into complaints made against Mayor Doug Diny regarding the removal of a ballot box last September.

In a vote of 4–1, the board agreed that there was sufficient evidence of an ethics code violation to proceed with a formal hearing.

The investigation came in response to a complaint from eight citizens about the box's removal, as well as a report by City Clerk

Kaitlyn Bernarde claiming that Diny had ignored her official request to return the ballot box.

"Acting under the color of law or using official authority to prevent people from voting or to interfere with a federal election is a crime," read the complaint. "...Yet even after being confronted for his illegal conduct, Mr. Diny refused to return the drop box for over a week."

At the time, Diny cited "security concerns" to justify the box's removal.

Diny's hearing is scheduled for April 30 at 4 p.m.

While Supreme Court candidate Brad Schimel dominated the polls in Marathon County on April 1, his opponent Susan Crawford came out on top overall by the end of the night, winning the seat.

Similarly, while Marathon County's voters showed up for Superintendent of Public Instruction candidate Brittany Kinser, Wisconsin's majority disagreed. Incumbent Jill Underly kept her seat.

The state referendum to add Wisconsin's existing law requiring voters to show photo ID at the polls to the state constitution passed both in Marathon County and across the state. Locally, voters shot down a referendum proposed by the Wausau School District to exceed the budget by \$8 million for the 2025–26 school year. The referendum failed to pass by 350 votes.

Washington Street to close through mid-May

As part of a downtown street reconstruction project, Washington St. will be closed to traffic between First and Third St. starting Mon., April 14.

Access to the municipal parking ramp at 101 Washington St. will be maintained at all times. Traffic to the 300 block of Third St. will be maintained via access on Washington St. from the east. Pedestrian access will be maintained on the north side of Washington St.

This closure will represent Phase I of

multiple closures for this project and is expected to be completed by May 19.


Direct File expands to Wisconsin

'Tis the season. As tax season nears its end, the Wisconsin Department of Revenue reminds taxpayers that they can file for free through the IRS's online filing program, Direct File.

Direct File launched in 12 states last year as part of its pilot program with the intent of providing taxpayers with a free means of filing taxes online. The program was introduced to address complaints about the cost and security of commercial tax services. This year, it has been expanded to 25

states, including Wisconsin.

"We've seen firsthand how this program empowers individuals to confidently





manage their tax obligations, and we are thrilled with the positive impact it's having across the state," said Secretary Designee of Revenue David Casey.

Good Shepherd Shelter to shift back to seasonal model

Citing insufficient funding and space, Catholic Charities announced that starting May 1, its Good Shepherd Shelter will halve its year-round service to six months a year.

The announcement came after Catholic Charities reviewed the City of Wausau and Marathon County's latest Request for Proposals, which outlined requirements too ambitious for the charity to fulfill.

"The funding provided for shelter operation is insufficient in both amount and duration for Catholic Charities to responsibly commit to operating under the proposed model," a press release from the charity reads. The Good Shepherd Shelter has operated year-round for two years. Prior to that, it operated on a six-month service model, which advocates for the charity argue allowed it to provide emergency shelter to people who might have fallen through the cracks of a traditional shelter model.

"Our experience operating emergency shelters has shown that shifting to a program-based model could unintentionally exclude many vulnerable individuals from receiving the help they desperately need," said Roberto Partarrieu, Executive Director of Catholic Charities of the Diocese of La Crosse. "We pioneered some of the first low-barrier shelters in Wisconsin because traditional models placed too many obstacles in the way of those struggling with mental health challenges, addiction, and other hardships."


Roth Conversions, a Win-Win

Roth IRAs can be an incredible tax opportunity for many. If your income falls below certain thresholds updated each year by the IRS, you are allowed to contribute a limited amount of your earned income which, if you follow the rules, can grow tax-free, be withdrawn tax-free and is not subject to Required Minimum Distributions in later years. The fact that the government limits the dollar amount of annual contributions is in and of itself an eye opener as to the potential power of years of tax-free growth and withdrawals, or said another way, years of relinquished tax revenue that would have otherwise been received by the federal and state taxation authorities.

A Roth IRA conversion is different than a Roth IRA contribution. A conversion is taking money that already exists in a pretax Traditional IRA and converting those dollars to a Roth IRA.Federal and state ordinary income taxes are due in full on the entire amount of the conversion, in the

year that you convert. In 2010, there was a significant law change lifting the limit on both the amount of dollars that could be converted to a Roth IRA as well as who could convert. Now, anyone regardless of income can convert any amount they wish. What was the incentive to change and keep this law on the books? For the government, it generates up-front tax revenue which would have otherwise been deferred for years by an IRA owner. Additionally, the amount of the conversion is ADDED to ordinary income on your 1040and can push the taxpayer's tax brackets higher, potentially paying a higher percentage of income tax than they otherwise would have in that year or on future withdrawals from the IRA.

We watch for opportunities in our clients' income tax years when their taxable income may have taken a dip. Ebbs and flows in business income, an early retirement or a switch to a part-time career





could be opportunities to take advantage of a Roth IRA conversion. You'll pay taxes now, which is a win for the state and federal government's current fiscal year, and you'll avoid taxes later, which is a win for your future tax years. Roth conversions can be a win-win!

Traditional IRA account owners have considerations to make before performing a Roth IRA conversion. These primarily include withdrawal limitations from a Roth IRA, and income limitations for future

contributions to a Roth IRA. In addition, if you are required to take a required minimum distribution (RMD) in the year you convert, you must do so before converting to a Roth IRA.

Barn Quilt Revival Project brings back vibrant tradition

Local artists, historians and county officials hope that 2025 becomes the first year in a long legacy of reviving an American tradition in Central Wisconsin.

Barn quilts are an American folk art believed to have been introduced roughly 300 years ago in Pennsylvania by Dutch immigrants as a means of decorating their barns.

Consisting of colorful, geometric patterns that resembled quilts — hence the name — barn quilts not only served as decorations and means of self expression, but they provided farmers with a means of communicating with passers-by.

'That area used barn quilts as signals to anyone on the Underground Railroad, so certain designs on certain barns meant, 'You're going to make a left soon to get to Canada,' or 'This farm is a safe haven,'" said Jacquelyn Tolksdorf, who runs Central Wisconsin community art nonprofit Rise Up.

"It started to trickle up to Wisconsin and the Midwest," she continued. "Those designs all mean something. There's designs that mean they're going to retire soon. There's designs that mean good luck with growing and stuff like that.

Tolksdorf wants to educate Central Wisconsinites on barn quilts as part of an effort to reintroduce the tradition in the area, a collaboration between VisitWausau and Rise Up, the organization behind several murals around Wausau.

"Jodi [Maguire] at VisitWausau wanted to bring back the revival of barn quilts because if you go to places like Shawano, they have hundreds of barn quilts that they showcase through the tourism board," said Tolksdorf.

After 15 years of its own barn quilt project, Shawano County brands itself as "Wisconsin's barn quilt capital." Shawano's iteration of the project has three objectives: to encourage preservation of the county's old barns; to promote tourism for the county; and to partner with community organizations seeking community service projects.

"Me and Jodi each have different personal attachments [to this project]," Tolksdorf explained. "From the art side of things, I'd like to bring back the tradition and knowing what the designs mean. The whole idea of a barn quilt is the whole community got together to celebrate a new farm in town..."

Central Wisconsin's Barn Quilt Revival Project plans to operate much the same way, with six area farms receiving new barn quilts painted by the community.

"Jodi comes from a farming background and, with tourism, works with agricultural initiative, and it's been a really rough 6 months for farmers," said Tolksdorf. "It was definitely a year it felt like to get this kicked off."

Rise Up held a presentation on April 6 to promote the project. Turnout was "decent," according to Tolksdorf six farms attended in person and about as many attended online. With that in mind, Tolksdorf expects to fulfill the goal of granting six farms with barn quilts this year, but the application will remain open until April 17 even for those who didn't attend.

As for who can apply, Tolksdorf said that as long as someone is a farmer — active or retired — they are eligible,

and they don't necessarily need to get the quilt painted on a barn.


"It can be an old barn, a new barn, a pole shed. It can be someone's house if they're farming," she said.

The barn quilts are expected to be erected around June. While the project is funded for this year, Tolksdorf said that the team is looking for a business interested in sponsoring it.

"We really want to do this every year to get the tradition kicked off," Tolksdorf said. "The community will come together to paint it... It's all going to be based around the community and supporting local farmers."

Tolksdorf also plans to take care that no infrastructure is damaged in the painting of the quilts, as has happened in places like Stevens Point following the erection of murals on historic properties.

"Murals that are painted directly onto surfaces don't last as long, so our nonprofit was taught by Mural Arts of Philadelphia how to use military parachute paper to wallpaper," said Tolksdorf. "The parachute paper is not seethrough at all, but it's a little porous so that the brick or the concrete or the wood can breathe so that we don't create any rot."

Applications are open to any farms who want new barn quilts, have quilts that don't mean what they should or would like to have a weathered quilt restored.






