

Engle wins Sheriff primary

CANTON - St. Lawrence County Sheriff's investigator Patrick 'Rick' Engle has secured the Republican line on the November ballot after defeating Undersheriff Sean O'Brien in the primary race by a

Stolen signs, social media arguments and assorted criticism have been hurled over the past few weeks leading up to the race.

Engle secured 2,913 votes while O'Brien received 1,575, according to unofficial numbers provided by the St. Lawrence County Board of Elections.

In a brief interview following the primary Tuesday, Engle offered appreciation to his supporters. He said he "couldn't have done it without them."

He credited his success to speaking with people and giving them time to get to know him on the campaign trail.

"I've had conversations that were 20 minutes and some as long as two and half hours," he said. "It's about getting to know them and them getting to know you," he said.

Engle said he wasn't shocked at the victory, which was nearly 2 to 1, because he believes the support he's received is genuine.

"When I talk to people it's real. It's sincere. They

Canton approves solar PILO

CANTON - Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILOTs) are in place for four of the seven community solar projects in the Town of Canton.

The PILOT agreements are all for 15 years with payments made to the Canton Central School District, St. Lawrence County and the town. The agreements, through authorization from Canton Town Supervisor Mary Ann Ashley, were finalized by the St. Lawrence County Industrial Development Agency (IDA).

In all, the four 15-year PILOTs total more than \$1.6 million.

"The Canton Town Board, along with both legal counsels, did the best we could with what we were faced with in negotiations of the PILOT agreements. The fundamental priority was to try to get

the best result for Canton taxpayers in the long run," stated Ashley.

"It wasn't an easy task, but we took time to ensure the integrity of the process. It took several months to assess the financial impact for the town, ask hard questions and get answers, discuss the fixed PILOT formula, and come to a resolution," she added.

The breakdown is as follows: The State Street Road solar

project (5 megawatt) PILOT is \$432,335.42 The County Route 27 (4.14

megawatt) solar project is \$357,627.86

The US Highway 11 solar project (5 megawatt) is \$432,335.42

The 95 Judson Street Road (4.4 megawatt) solar project is \$380,455.17. The PILOTs were based on

\$5,000 per megawatt the first

year, increasing 2 percent annually

during the term of the agreement.

The PILOT payments will directly benefit Canton Central School District as the biggest benefactor, then St. Lawrence County and then the Town of Canton, Ashley noted.

"The school board, county legislature and town board will each decide how to spend the annual funds," she said.

Although \$1.6 million is an impressive figure, the town supervisor hoped for richer PILOT payments.

"Personally, I wish we would have gotten more, especially for the Town of Canton. We did all the true grit work for the greater good of our Town as a whole and are getting the least amount," said Ashley. "We never gave up on hoping for the best, giving it all we

North Country Children's Museum nears expansion project goal

POTSDAM – The North Country Children's Museum is a few steps closer to its fundraising goal for its multi-million dollar second-floor expansion project.

The museum recently held a fundraising gala which brought in \$15,000 to go towards the project, organizers report.

"The project total is \$3,500,000 and we have secured \$3,000,000 so far (which includes some NCCM cash reserves)," NCCM executive director Sharon Vegh Williams told North Country This Week.

Lead sponsors for the gala were Northern Federal Credit Union, United Renewable Energy, SLIC Network Solutions, and St. Lawrence University.

Project architect, Brooks Washburn, presented slides on the expansion to the 100 guests in attendance.

Ballroom dance instructor Megan Smith taught classic dance steps with live music from Oscar Sarmiento's band

Work on the expansion has been underway, with one phase complete and another in process.

"Because building and renovation costs went up 120% since our pre-COVID estimates, we phased the project so that we could get everything moving forward without delay," Williams said.

Williams said Phase 1, which is the exhibit design done by Toronto-based Blue Rhino Design is complete. Phase 2 which is the building renovation and construction with Northern Tier Contracting of Gouverneur is underway and expected to be completed by December 2023, Williams said.

The last phase, Phase 3, will focus on exhibit fabrication and installation by Ravenswood Studio of Chicago. The executive director said that work is expected to start in 2024, but is also dependent on further fundraising efforts.

The expansion will double floor space to 7,000 square feet, with the second floor being largely geared for children 8 to 12 years old.

Planned exhibits include a downsized Amish cottage, a maple tree climber with a bubble lookout at the top through the roof, a sound lab in partnership with the Akwesasne community and Crane school of

History, impact

North Country Children's Museum has come a long way since its start as a traveling museum in 2012.

The museum, which now occupies the first floor of the "Red Barn" at 10 Raymond Street, features interactive exhibits focusing on STEAM concepts, environment, art and local culture.

NCCM draws about 20,000 visitors a year, which includes thousands of children who visit on field trips, BOCES students, college interns in academic programs, college professors, parents and senior citizens as well. About 40,000 annual visitors are projected once the expansion work is complete.

Discounted memberships are available for low income families, with about 20 percent of its 600 member families participating in the program.

A Clarkson economic impact study estimated that the museum brings about \$700,000 annually to the local economy directly.

How to help

The museum is still seeking funding in a capital campaign to cover the total cost, including donations from the public. The project will be partially paid for with \$1.4 million in state Downtown Revitalization Initiative funding secured through the village.





Massena fire claims three

MASSENA — Three people died in an early morning residential structure fire on South Main Street Monday, confirmed Massena Chief of Police Jason Olson.

The blaze is currently being investigated by multiple agencies.

According Olson, Massena Police were on the scene with New York State Fire investigators, the St. Lawrence County Sheriff's Office and New York State Police.

"Detectives are heavily involved

in the investigation process at this time and receiving assistance from NYS Fire, SLC Sheriff's Office, and NYS Police," Olson said in a press release.

Olson also wrote that no further details or comment will be provided at this time.

A Facebook post by Massena Fire Department officials also noted the early morning call, with officials saying they would be on scene for several more hours.



Village to invite Boutique Air to use airfield

POTSDAM — Village officials plan to invite Boutique Air to land and launch flights from Damon Airfield in lieu of flights not being able to land or take off in Massena in July.

Village Trustee Monique Tirion at the June 20 village board meeting said several residents have asked her if there was a possibility that the air service provider could fly into and out of Potsdam's municipal airfield.

"Absolutely," said Village Administrator Greg Thompson. "We would definitely welcome that. They have done that before. There was some construction taking place in Massena, I believe it was last year, and Boutique actually flew in here for several weeks and sent us a letter thanking us for the use of our airport and complimenting us on the quality of the runways and the taxiways.

Tirion said that one of the people who approached her was a pilot and that person expressed concern

to her that Massena may not have a plan in place for flight traffic during the coming month.

Could you maybe just make a call and see? That would be nice," Tirion asked.

"I would be glad to," the administrator said. "Again, we have done that before. I would love to bring a carrier into Potsdam with not only our two universities, but being 10 miles from Canton and the ever expanding healthcare system, I think it would definitely behoove the village of Potsdam to have a carrier flying in and out of our airport."

"I will make a phone call tomorrow. They are more than welcome to do so as we've done in the past," he

Last month the village launched a wildlife survey at the airport following a plane-deer collision earlier this spring on the runway. Thompson told the board that several areas were found where the fence surrounding the airfield had been compromised and all of them had been repaired. "So we should be able to hopefully keep the deer off the runway," Thompson

Voters okay Potsdam library funding increase

POTSDAM -- Voters approved the Potsdam Public Library's budget referendum which is an increase of 1-cent per \$1,000 of appraised property value.

The funding increase will change the current library tax rate for district residents from \$1.04 to \$1.05

per \$1,000 of assessed property

The increase will help fund the library budget for 2023-2024, which calls for \$638,711, a decrease from the current year's budget of \$644,405.

Library Director Annie Davey

said that 82% of voters approved the increase and that Janice Brown has been elected as a trustee.

Also, write-in candidate Julie Welch will fill the remaining vacant trustee position, she said.

There were a total of 146 voters, 126 yes, 20 no, Davey said.

Water issues arise during salt shed project

POTSDAM — The village's plans for the foundation for its new salt shed are being modified after a ground water issue was discovered at the village Department of Public Works site where the shed will be installed.

"We've been in contact with Hybrid Builders, which is the company that's building our salt barn. There's a little bit, well I want to say, kind of a significant issue with ground water on the back side," Village Administrator Greg Thompson told the village board of trustees at their meeting June 20.

"We've re-engineered the ground around the barn. We've fixed the problem. It is going to be a little bit more costly than we had planned," Thompson said. "However I will say we are using what's called New York State Touring Route money. Which, a year ago we had \$400,000. As of today, that has been increased to \$711,000. So we have more than enough money to take care of building (the salt barn), even with the significant change in the engi-

neering plans."

Thompson told the board that the state money is a reimbursable fund and the village will have to front the money first and then will get the money reimbursed later on.

According to the New York State website, "The New York State Touring Route Program provides \$100 million in State funds to cities, towns and villages based on the total number of signed touring route miles for which such municipality has capital maintenance responsibility to support the construction and repair of highways, bridges, highway-railroad crossings, and other transportation facilities."

The village board had also previously approved using \$85,000 in federal American Rescue Plan Act funds for construction of the salt barn's concrete pad.

Thompson said that over the years of the village DPW site expanding, someone covered up an area with new surface material were there was running groundwater. "In order to fix that issue and correct the wrong we basically have to change the way we put the footers in around the back and down one side of the building,"

Thompson said.

"I'm working diligently with Hybrid right now. They should be up here within the week to break ground," said the administrator. "And they said once they break ground they are not going to leave until they are done."

Thompson told the board that he hoped that by their meeting next month that ground had been broken for the project and that the work was "significantly underway."

The administrator told the board that total construction time was estimated to be 30 to 45 days for the building itself. Paving around the site will probably be completed when the village gets its paving operations in full swing sometime in August.

The salt that will go inside the structure is already purchased, Thompson said. He told the board that he bought salt ahead of time at a better rate to save the village money on the overall cost.

"We had money left over so we bought 400 tons in the spring and we filled all of the areas where we could fill with salt," he said. "So at this point we have a really good supply... for next season."

Project cuts likely coming

POTSDAM — The Village of Potsdam, along with other municipalities may be forced to make some cuts in project budgets and anticipate longer waits on materials moving forward.

According to Village Administrator Greg Thompson, project bids statewide are coming in substantially over budget.

"A lot of the projects statewide right now, Fred (Hanss, Village Planner) will attest to this, we've been down this road several times in just the last couple weeks, a lot of projects are coming in anywhere from 100 to 200 percent over bid estimate, excuse me, architectural and engineering estimates," Thompson told village board members at their meeting June 20.

"I just want to make the board aware that we may have to take a look at cut backs on some of the village projects that we have lined up. Not just for this summer but for the next couple summers," the administrator said. Thompson said the issue is statewide.

"One of the beautiful things about living in the North Country is that a lot of the negative effects of nationwide issues are delayed in getting to us. The downside is that when they do get to us, they hang on a little bit longer and it takes a little longer to come out of it."

Thompson said the issues driving up costs center around supply chain problems and lack of labor.

"It's a heads up to the board. My

fingers are crossed that we don't have to do it to any large extent, but the likelihood of having to make cuts is very real," he said.

Village Trustee Alexandra Jacobs-Wilke asked if the village's planned schedule for paving and sidewalk repair was still on schedule for the summer.

Paving projects in the village are expected to get underway in August after the town completes its paving. He said sidewalk construction is underway and on schedule, but experiencing some delays due to a current concrete shortage. Thompson said the village is calling ahead 10 to 14 days to get concrete delivered for sections being replaced.

"That's slowing us down, but my hats off to the guys. They've managed to schedule things, get a hold of the plant, make sure the plant knows when we're going to be doing the project so they are getting the concrete here when we need it."

Village board approves walking trail at Willow Island

CANTON - Canton Island Park on Willow Island will be the home of a new walking trail following approval Wednesday night by the village board to proceed with Phase 1 of a threephase project for the island.

A Zoom presentation by Michele Palmer, project lead from Whitham Planning Design and Landscape Architecture, Ithaca, preceded the Phase 1 endorsement by village lead-

The plan would be to eventually introduce a play area to the island, building it in a naturalistic style with as little impact to the property as possible.

Acceptance of Phase 1 of the project came after several public input sessions and meetings with stakeholders.

"They have been a very active and engaging committee. I have enjoyed working with them, stated Palmer.

The Willow Island Park Enhance-

ments (WIPE) committee is comprised of Leigh Rodriguez, Varick Chittenden, Scott Goldie, John Larrance, Sean O'Brien, Brooke Rouse, Tim Savage, Lance Rudiger, and Michael Scriminger. Former Village Trustee Carol Pynchon also sat on the committee.

Bids for the trail work and other tasks, including running power to the island's south end, could be sought as early as August.

In December 2019, the village received a state grant of \$529,739

for the Miner Street Trail Connector and Willow Island projects. Funding for the Willow Island enhancement project is \$236,956 with a local match of \$87,955.

That cost figure could fluctuate with in kind work mainly from the village's department of public works.

There are also plans to reconfigure the parking area with lighting. The trail will be ADA compatible.

Mayor Michael Dalton said the grant money should cover the cost of the Phase 1 project depending on construction costs.

Phase 2 will focus on the stabilization of a portion of banks on the island.

What kind of money will it take to stabilize the banks?" inquired Dalton. "It's quite expensive work," Palmer responded. "A ballpark figure is between \$300,000 and \$400,000."

Phase 3 will involve the playground or play area work and the art park.

There was also discussion about adding restrooms to the island, either permanent or portable.

Canton native Matthew Mazzotta has been engaged in design work for the performance space.

"I appreciate that so much time and effort has gone into this," said Trustee Beth Larrabee.

"I compliment Michele and her team. It's been a good process and very thorough," said Trustee Barbara Beekman.

The village board also approved a negative declaration SEQR that will satisfy all phases of the Willow Island project.

He became Neil's attendant, touring with him throughout the U.S. and

Europe, and ultimately landed on the east coast where he met Deborah, Neil's second cousin.

Deborah and Jackson lived in New York City before moving together to the North Country in 2000 when Deborah was hired as a voice teacher at The Crane School of Music

One day while canoing on the Raquette River, Jackson's boat capsized, and he swam to shore to dry off.

He found himself in a sun-dappled clearing that he instantly

Coincidentally, the land was put up for sale that same month, and Deborah and Jackson bought it with a plan to build a home.

They were married on Veteran's Day, November 11, 2011, in the still unfinished house.

Jackson worked as a volunteer for the Potsdam Food Co-op for many years, and donated his backhoe services, materials, and creative vision to all his friends throughout the community, trying to make lives better and places more beautiful wherever he saw an opportunity.

Following a catastrophic stroke in 2017 which paralyzed his left side, he was suddenly wheelchair-bound.

Over the next several years, Jackson and Deborah sought treatment and therapy across the northeast, landing in 2019 at St. Joseph's Home in Ogdensburg,

But the effects of the stroke and related complications eventually proved too severe, and he died on June 5, 2023.

Jackson was a rebel and an innovator, who with sheer gumption and imagination forged an uncommon life, dedicating himself to the service of others.

His masonry and concrete work can be seen throughout the Potsdam area, and he fell in love with the red sandstone so prevalent in this community.

He cultivated a landscape of imaginative play in Peru, VT. where his nieces gathered each summer as children, building an outdoor theater from split trees, and concrete sculptures that sheltered fairy houses and treasure hunt clues.

Always in his signature straw hat or wool beret, he crafted gardens, stone walls, porches, and even entire houses for friends, family, and people he had just

He was a fearless dumpster diver, known to stop at every yard sale across northern New York and Vermont.

He repurposed well-made pieces few others appreciated, and it was usual to see his car and trailer parading down the street piled high with scavenged treasures.

He worked hard on his marriage and his relationships with his adult children, and he remembered the name of everyone he

He made a point of showing his gratitude and appreciation for all the support and loving care he received throughout his life.

In his last days, he said simply, "I did what I could do as well as I could do it."

Union at SLU remains dissatisfied with wage offer

CANTON – The union representing employees at St. Lawrence University remains dissatisfied with the University's stance on increased wages. Officials at SLU say the contract is fair.

On Thursday, June 8, union officers of the St. Lawrence University unit of SEIU Local 200 United and their staff representative met with the University's management team to receive the University's official reply to Local 200 United's recent wage improvement proposal.

The wage proposal referenced was brought to the University in March and called for an across the board wage increase of \$2.00/hour to mitigate the effects of historic inflation, improve the University's poor retention rates, and boost increasingly low morale, an email from Brian D. Teucke, union representative Central New York stated.

"The union members and staff of SEIU Local 200 United have reminded the University's management team that because of their refusal to offer even one penny of economic relief to union members, and because they chose to offer a paid holiday to only one half of the unit, the problems of low staffing, low morale, worker burnout, and high turnover will only continue to worsen as time goes on, the email continues.

The union says that since March St. Lawrence University has broadcast how important and valuable their employees are, but have not taken any steps to match the message with "substantive action."

"It is the union's position that if the University truly cared about the workers they claim to have such admiration for, they would not allow any form of economic injustice to occur at their institution. While some upper level administrators are becoming wealthy off of their salaries at St. Lawrence, the hourly workers of the SEIU Local 200United bargaining unit are living paycheck to paycheck and struggling to get by. This is an economic injustice and one that the University created."

University response St. Lawrence University contends that the contract, which was approved by the union, is fair.

"St. Lawrence University values all of our employees, including the members of the SEIU Local 200. Just last year, the University agreed to a contract with SEIU Local 200 that runs until June 30, 2025 and is honoring the terms of that agreement, which was approved by more than 73 percent of union voters," stated Kim Asch, director of strategic communications and marketing at the University.

"Through our agreement, the University provides a generous compensation package for SEIU staff including new "longevity" payments which were expressly requested by SEIU in the last round of bargaining. The negotiated pay increases in each year of the agreement, in addition to step increases, provide a competitive total compensation package, and

She also pointed out that as part of the contract, general increases for all members included 1.5% on January 1, 2022, 2% on July 1 of 2022, 2023, and 2024. In addition, a step increase of \$1.50/hour was given on July 1, 2022 to those who had not reached the maximum of their grade. Step increases of \$0.50/hour will be given on January 1 and July 1 of 2024, and January 1, 2025 to those who have not reached the maximum of their grade. Two step increases in a single year equate to an annual increase of more than 4% depending on the employee's grade and where they fall within that grade.

"The University looks forward to a continued productive relationship with members of the SEIU Local 200," said Asch.

Rally held


Teucke said union members shared with management how the low wages earned by union members create severe economic hardships for 200 United members and their families.

As a result, a community petition which supported the wage boost received over 360 signatures and an April rally in Canton Village Park drew more than 150 union members, community supporters, and student supporters who attended to express their solidarity with Local 200United.

"At this rally, bargaining unit members described how they are struggling living paycheck to paycheck and simple expenditures they used to be able to afford are now unaffordable. Despite the union's reporting and their community support, and despite the management team lauding the first-rate quality of work put forth by 200 United union members, the University decided at the meeting to completely reject the union's wage proposal," wrote Teucke.

"The union will continue to push for economic relief and continue to press the University to answer key questions on their actual economic situation until the economic injustice thrust upon 200 United bargaining is rectified." It's never too late to get in shape!

It's time to re-think how and when we track homeless populations

Nothing works well in January in the North Country

I've never been homeless, though I once did share a two-bedroom apartment with eight people, which may technically qualify.

Unfortunately, many people have been and continue to be in St. Lawrence County, which has long had an "invisible" homeless problem.

In recent years though, the curtain has been pulled back.

Last year, we saw numerous reports of a growing homeless population in the Ogdensburg area.

The problem was exacerbated by the county's drug problem and led to human waste and needles becoming a common sight in the city's parks.

I recently spoke with officials in Ogdensburg who said that while

the homeless population has not been as visible this year as it was last year, it's still larger than it once

St. Lawrence County's massive geography combined with its low population makes providing services particularly expensive and difficult to administer.

There are many organizations that offer some services, but navigating the path to public assistance tends to be a deterrent to many who need help the most.

I don't have up-to-date numbers on the county's homeless population, but I feel confident in saying I doubt it's improved significantly since a story I wrote some time ago.

In a 2016 report, it was estimated that as many as 1,000 people were living homeless in St. Lawrence County.

A 2013 report noted that more than 223 families had sought help for shelter from the St. Lawrence County Department of Social Ser-

According to the state Education Department, 533 children from

pre-K through grade 12 in St. Lawrence County's 17 school districts were counted as homeless at some point during 2014-15.

Most, 485, found shelter by "doubling up" with relatives or friends of their parents.

Five were sheltered for a time in a hotel or motel.

Thirty-eight were "sheltered" in a "primary nighttime residence" other than a hotel or motel, or a friend or relative's home.

Five were "unsheltered," staying in cars, parks, campgrounds, temporary trailers, or abandoned buildings.

Counting the number of homeless adults is more difficult and accurate numbers are hard to come

Speaking with people in the know on the issue, I'm not sure that isn't by design.

Each year the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development conducts a homelessness assessment.

The goal is to get a snapshot of the homeless population in a par-

The problem with the survey is

That's a problem in places like North Country, where the homeless population becomes particularly invisible.

The bigger problem then becomes that these numbers are used to target funding and services. In other words, we were using bad numbers to make determinations on spending and targeting funds.

My estimation, though I'm no expert, is St. Lawrence County's being overlooked.

In recent years, local leaders have questioned if a homeless shelter is needed in St. Lawrence County. I don't know the answer, but I know it's a conversation that needs to

Route 11 study mostly a solution to a non-problem

The safety options study for Route 11 reported in last week's paper is mostly a solution to a non-existent problem. A link to an online survey was provided, which I completed. However, the survey lacked a key response option: "none of the above."

How many Clarkson residents, not to mention Potsdam village residents, are going to walk or bicycle from the campus or town to Walmart or the stores across the road? The distance from CU's west entrance to the traffic light at Walmart is almost two miles, plus another 0.2 miles to Walmart's front door. The distance from downtown Potsdam is three miles-one way. How many people will make a 6-mile round trip on foot or bicycle in 90-degree heat or -10 degree cold or in the rain or snow, carrying their purchases home?

I patronize Walmart only as a last resort, but I occasionally shop at Aldi across the road, and I go there by bicycle. I never see any other bikes there, nor have I seen any at Walmart. I don't recall seeing any bike racks at either location. And I rarely see pedestrians walking along Route 11 beyond CU's campus.

It's quite easy to bicycle from the Village to Walmart (and beyond), with the wide shoulders on Route 11.

There's also plenty of room for the few pedestrians who need or care to walk on the highway. Therefore, I fail to see a reason to spend money for such a minimal benefit.

When NYSDOT repaved Outer Maple Street they wisely restriped the road from four lanes to three,

thus providing 8-foot shoulders on both sides. This greatly increased safety and comfort for cyclists.

I do not object to building a sidewalk on one side of Route 11 outside the Village, but who will maintain it, and how many people will use it? The most ambitious option proposed would create a physical barrier on the south side of Route 11 to separate pedestrians and cyclists from motor vehicles. Where, then, would snow plowed on that side be placed? How would a barrier affect the road's drainage? How would emergency vehicles reach people injured on a walled-off path? How would people using the pathway access destinations on the other side of the road?

It appears to me that the Clarkson group designing this project has very little understanding about how bicycling is or should be done. Are any of them experienced cyclists? My impression is that they looked in various sources and picked a design they thought would work, not fully understanding what they selected. Crash data show that hits from behind, which many novice cyclists have been conditioned to fear, are a very small percentage of all car-bike collisions.

In my life-long cycling experience, when non-cyclists design bicycle facilities they usually get it wrong, and that may be the case here. Two possibly useful ideas the group considered but did not explain further are a relocation of Morley-Potsdam Road to the Walmart traffic signal, and a roundabout at Maple Street and Clarkson Avenue.

As always, the devil is in the details.

of sexual abuse, he was given only 6 years of probation. Because Ferguson and his wife refused to let their daughters testify and because of the 6-year delay in reporting the abuse, Ferguson's homeschooled victims are constantly exposed to their predatory

This is not about a hypothetical case in which a child molester wants to make a deathbed confession; this is about real victims in our community who were betrayed by the people who should have protected them-their pas-

Faith leaders have a moral and biblical obligation to protect vulnerable children.

Clergy should not need a law to protect children from predators, but unfortunately, there are too many cases in which clergy do not report child sexual abuse. The CARE Act is a necessary step toward addressing the moral failure of pastors who declare that there is no biblical mandate to report a crime.

The CARE Act will pass. And when it does, I plan to stand behind Governor Hochul when she signs it into law.
