Several St. Lawrence County communities plan to celebrate the Independence Day holiday this coming weekend with fireworks and other festivities.

The following towns and villages have events scheduled.

Morristown

In Morristown, a busy day of events will take place July 3-4.

Fireworks will be held at dusk on Monday, July 3. There will be live music from Another Fine Mess from 7-11 p.m.

"Everything will return to normal with vendors and food," Morristown Fire Department Member Kevin Crosby said.

On July 4, the day's events begin with the Steven Spilman Memorial Fourth of July Parade on Main Street at 10 a.m. Bands from Gouverneur, Heuvelton, Lisbon, Morristown and Ogdensburg are slated to perform. Those who wish to be in the parade are asked to line up on Main Street at 9:30 a.m.

The parade is named in honor of long-time fireman Steven Spilman.

Moore said Spilman had organized the parade for many years and was named in his honor in 2014, shortly after his passing

Independence Day activities shift to the fire station at 11:30 for a variety of activities. There will be a car show, craft show, chicken BBQ and a water ball tournament.

Engle wins Sheriff primary

CANTON - St. Lawrence County Sheriff's investigator Patrick 'Rick' Engle has secured the Republican line on the November ballot after defeating Undersheriff Sean O'Brien in the primary race by a

Stolen signs, social media arguments and assorted criticism have been hurled over the past few weeks leading up to the race.

Engle secured 2,913 votes while O'Brien received 1,575, according to unofficial numbers provided by the St. Lawrence County Board of Elections.

In a brief interview following the primary Tuesday, Engle offered appreciation to his supporters. He said he "couldn't have done it without them."

He credited his success to speaking with people and giving them time to get to know him on the campaign trail.

"I've had conversations that were 20 minutes and some as long as two and half hours," he said. "It's about getting to know them and them getting to know you," he said.

Engle said he wasn't shocked at the victory, which was nearly 2 to 1, because he believes the support he's received is genuine.

"When I talk to people it's real. It's sincere. They aren't just telling me what I want to hear," he said. Engle's confident he can carry tonight's

City hopes to fill council vacancy

OGDENSBURG — Ogdensburg Mayor Jeffrey M. Skelly says he hopes to appoint someone to fill the vacancy left on the council by Nichole Kennedy's resignation.

Those interested in filling the position will need to reach out to the city's vacancy committee. The committee will then recommend a candidate for approval by July 17.

The appointment would be good through the end of the calendar year. Kennedy, who was serving her second term, resigned her position Monday.

She announced that she'd be leaving at the end of the school vear last November because her husband received a promotion and

has been working in the Saratoga area for some time.

She was not present at the council meeting Monday, but received praise from councilors Dan Skamperle and Michael Powers, who said she was an active voice on the council.

The new vacancy on council has the power to change the dynamics of the upcoming election.

Mayor Jeffrey M. Skelly and councilors Bill Dillabough, Steve Fisher and John Rishe are not seeking re-election.

Ogdensburg Mayoral candidate Michael Tooley, D-Ogdensburg, is seeking the mayor's seat unopposed.

Democrats filing petitions to run for council include Jennifer Stevenson, R. Storm Cilley and

Michael Weaver.

Running on the Republican line is Robert Edie.

However, with Kennedy's resignation, political party chairs will have the ability to nominate an additional candidate to run for the

Under the city charter, the four candidates with the highest votes will win the seats and the one with the lowest number of votes out of the four winners would fill Kennedy's remaining two-year-term.

On Monday, Kennedy said goodbye to her constituents in a letter.

"I have met so many wonderful people and made so many friends over my last several years on council. We have bonded over common

The cheese plant has languished empty for years following unsuccessful lawsuits and attempts to fund demolition and cleanup of the site that resides in Ogdensburg's Marina District.

Burke.



School officials question future electric bus use

MASSENA - Massena school officials have questions about the future use of electric school buses but aren't receiving many answers.

Transportation Director Darrin Jock told board of education members that the transition to electric buses is a big hurdle that the district will have to find a solution for.

Jock said many questions that have arisen have gone untested and unanswered, with "so many things going on" regarding the transition.

State officials enacted legislation through the 2022-23 state budget bill that requires all school districts to transition to zero-emission vehicles, in this case electric buses. New purchases and leases of student transportation must also meet zero-emission standards by 2027, according to the bill.

Of the largest concerns, Jock said the cost to replace the current fleet and install chargers will be exten-

Jock told board members that

not all chargers are compatible with each brand of bus as well, further complicating matters.

Of the three manufacturers, Jock said all three have different char-

"Now they're making adapters but of course they come with a price," Jock said.

Jock also told board members that the range of the buses is a large concern, if not the largest, as numbers for mileage have no been concrete in every meeting.

"One of the big concerns is the mileage you're going to get and some of our bus runs are longer than the actual mileage you get on a charge from what I've been told. We take trips and go farther than we can be charged," Jock said.

Though the transition isn't happening in the next few years, Jock urged board members to begin thinking about and planning for the eventual transition.

"I think it's going to be a real challenge for the board and for everybody that's involved," Jock

County opposing state's fossil fuel ban

St. Lawrence County's Board of Legislators is opposing action by the state to ban the use of natural gas and other fossil fuels in new homes by 2026.

"It's another example of Albany telling us what we can't do," said Harry Smithers, R-Gouverneur.

Smither's said St. Lawrence County has a good supply of natural gas and said that while he believes the state's goal is laudable, he believes they should focus on making electricity affordable, rather than mandating its use.

Legislator James Reagen, R-Ogdensburg, pointed to the harsh North Country winters. He said

that during the ice storm, many St. Lawrence County residents went without power for weeks. He said other forms of heating, such as natural gas, provide more of a safety net during such times.

Legislator Ben Hull, R-Madrid, said he did not believe the technology is at a level where it can support a conversion to electricity.

"Natural gas is widely used in the United States, and according to 2020 data from the U.S. Department of Energy, sixty-one percent (61%) of American households used natural gas for either space heating, water heating or cooking in 2020, and that number is higher in the Northeast where sixty-seven percent (67%) of homes use gas, including fifty-two percent (52%) in New York State,"

the resolution said. "According to the American Gas Association, the direct use of natural gas is ninety-two percent (92%) efficient from production to customers which underscores how important it is to look at how energy is produced and delivered when looking to define energy efficiency."

Legislators said natural gas plays a critical role in ensuring Americans have access to affordable and reliable energy, and consumers should have the choice to use this abundant fuel source for their appliances.

Not all legislators supported the measure. Margaret Haggard, D-Potsdam, said the resolution did not include enough information about the governor's energy plan.

The measure passed in a 14-1 vote.




McKnight has been a town councilman for over 12 years and has served much of his time on the board in the capacity of deputy town supervisor.

assessing the client pool.

With more members comes a better star rating for the company, meaning a greater reimbursement from the federal government.

In many cases, employers will put out a request for proposal to shop for rates as opposed to wasting resources doing it themselves, Zuckerman said.

One such case was Broome County, who established an association known as Broome County Healthcare Alliance. That association covers over 6,000 retirees.

United Healthcare won the bid with Broome County, offering four plans.

One of the benefits, according to Zuckerman, is that the major medical portion of the plan has been paid in full.

There are also no co-payments for members and prescription drugs have a \$0 co-payment for generics, \$5 for preferred brand name drugs and \$20 for non-preferred brand name drugs.

That means there are no hidden expenses for prescription drugs, saving the town a large sum of money on premiums.

Federal funds for Heuvelton fire

The Heuvelton Fire Department is the recipient of \$98,460 in federal funding to be used to provide protective gear, training, and supplies to emergency personnel.

It's time to re-think how and when we track homeless populations

Nothing works well in January in the North Country

I've never been homeless, though I once did share a two-bedroom apartment with eight people, which may technically qualify.

Unfortunately, many people have been and continue to be in St. Lawrence County, which has long had an "invisible" homeless problem.

In recent years though, the curtain has been pulled back.

Last year, we saw numerous reports of a growing homeless population in the Ogdensburg area.

The problem was exacerbated by the county's drug problem and

led to human waste and needles becoming a common sight in the city's parks.

I recently spoke with officials in Ogdensburg who said that while the homeless population has not been as visible this year as it was last year, it's still larger than it once

St. Lawrence County's massive geography combined with its low population makes providing services particularly expensive and difficult to administer.

There are many organizations that offer some services, but navigating the path to public assistance tends to be a deterrent to many who need help the most.

I don't have up-to-date numbers on the county's homeless population, but I feel confident in saying I doubt it's improved significantly since a story I wrote some time ago.

In a 2016 report, it was estimated

that as many as 1,000 people were living homeless in St. Lawrence County.

A 2013 report noted that more than 223 families had sought help for shelter from the St. Lawrence County Department of Social Ser-

According to the state Education Department, 533 children from pre-K through grade 12 in St. Lawrence County's 17 school districts were counted as homeless at some point during 2014-15.

Most, 485, found shelter by "doubling up" with relatives or friends of their parents.

Five were sheltered for a time in a hotel or motel.

Thirty-eight were "sheltered" in a "primary nighttime residence" other than a hotel or motel, or a friend or relative's home.

Five were "unsheltered," staying in cars, parks, campgrounds,

temporary trailers, or abandoned buildings.

Counting the number of homeless adults is more difficult and accurate numbers are hard to come

Speaking with people in the know on the issue, I'm not sure that isn't by design.

Each year the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development conducts a homelessness assessment.

The goal is to get a snapshot of the homeless population in a particular moment of time and use that as a sort of census to determine the number of homeless on a single night in a given area.

The problem with the survey is it's held in January.

That's a problem in places like North Country, where the homeless population becomes particularly invisible. The bigger problem then becomes that these numbers are used to target funding and services. In other words, we were using bad numbers to make determinations on spending and targeting funds.

My estimation, though I'm no expert, is St. Lawrence County's being overlooked.

In recent years, local leaders have questioned if a homeless shelter is needed in St. Lawrence County. I don't know the answer, but I know it's a conversation that needs to continue.

In the meantime, I think it's time to reach out to those in power and seek a change on when the homeless survey is done, because nothing works well in the January where we live
