Massena Central eyes electric bus study

MASSENA — Concerns over transitioning to electric buses prompted Massena Central School District to conduct a study about the feasibility of electric buses in the district.

The move comes after receiving approval from New York State Energy Research and Development Authority to use grant funding through the Clean Green School Initiative, according to Interim-Superintendent Pat Brady.

The announcement came just one month after Transportation Director Darrin Jock raised concerns about the transition to electric buses, saying it was the "biggest hurdle" they may face in the coming years.

Jock told board of education members that the largest concern was the expected mileage of the electric buses and the lack of concrete data regarding mileage for potential replacements for the fleet.

With two bus runs in the morning and two in the afternoon, charging time and efficiency are a

potential problem for the district.

Coupled with trips out of town for field trips and sports teams, along with BOCES runs, the district could struggle to keep up, he said.

"One of the big concerns is the mileage you're going to get and some of our bus runs are longer than the actual mileage you get on a charge from what I've been told. We take trips and go farther than we can be charged," Jock said.

Another big concern for the district revolves around the cost

Engle poised to be next sheriff after O'Brien backs out

CANTON — Undersheriff Sean O'Brien, who was running for St. Lawrence County Sheriff, has withdrawn from the race.

Deputy Commissioner of the Board of Elections Jesse Sovie confirmed to North Country This Week that O'Brien filed paperwork to be removed from the ballot earlier today, July 7.

O'Brien lost the Republican primary in June to Patrick "Rick" Engle, though he was slated to appear on the ballot on the Conservative line.

"After great consideration and in consultation with my family, I have decided to suspend my campaign for St. Lawrence County Sheriff. It has been a pleasure and one of my greatest honors serving the community for the last 20 years. I respect the Republican electorate and will move forward with the next chapter in my life. I sincerely appreciate all of our supporters, their time, and dedication to my campaign. I'd especially like to thank the Conservative party for having the confi-

Family fundraising to bring Waddington man injured in Ukraine home

WADDINGTON — "Bring-Brother CrisHome" had raised over \$16,600 as of July 12 for a Waddington man severely wounded from Russian missiles while volunteering in Ukraine.

Cristiano J. Zeledon, 24, of Waddington, is in a Ukrainian hospital, after missiles hit a pizzeria where he was eating on June 27.

His sister, Marina LaBaff, of Massena, has started a Spotfund webpage, "BringBrother-CrisHome" to raise money for his medical expenses and bring him home.

"Cristiano, an American citizen and a proud former Marine, had selflessly volunteered his time

to deliver essential medical supplies to those in need. Little did he know that the very people he sought to help would become his saviors.

"He has already undergone one of several head surgeries, and his injuries include a fractured skull and severe brain trauma," said LaBaff.

Zeledon is in Ukraine for the summer on a volunteer humanitarian mission.

He joined the marines before college and was a pre-law student hoping to go to Cornell University.

CFCtoo members call on county legislators to support CARE Act

CANTON — A dozen members of CFCtoo were in attendance for the county legislature's full board meeting on July 3, calling on the board to support the Child Abuse Reporting Expansion Act (CARE) Act.

CFCtoo is an advocacy group that supports abuse survivors who have left Christian Fellowship

Center. They work to educate the North Country community on how to prevent and respond to abuse. However, a more short-term goal for the group is ensuring that clergy be added to the mandated reporting list in New York State.

The CARE Act advocates have continued their push for passage of the legislation, which would make clergy mandated reporters. Critics argue the legislation would violate

an individual's First Amendment right.

Many members of CFCtoo spoke at the meeting, highlighting instances of abuse that went unreported to state authorities even after church elders were notified of the abuse.

Abbi Nye, who co-founded CFCtoo, made the most vocal push for legislators to support the CARE Act.

Nye told legislators that Albany has been keeping tabs on events in St. Lawrence County.

"My CFCtoo colleagues and I have spent the past two months meeting with dozens of legislators in Albany. We were introduced on the New York Assembly floor and commended for our work by the Speaker of the Assembly. Albany knows the names of Sean Ferguson and Rick Sinclair," Nye told legislators.

Sean Ferguson, 43, was charged with first-degree sexual abuse and acting in a manner injurious to a child in May of 2022. Roughly a year later he was sentenced to six-months probation for the crime after he took a plea agreement to second-degree sexual abuse as part of a plea agreement.

As a member of Christian Fellowship Center, Ferguson's case made waves locally after he was charged in 2022 with sexually abusing children in 2015 due to the fact that church leaders had been made aware of abuse allegations but did not report them to authorities.

Sinclair is the church's senior pastor.

"You have an opportunity to demonstrate to your community and to the state that St. Lawrence County values protecting children," Nye said.

Nye said the CARE Act is simple "when you strip away the disinformation and the red herrings," saying it is a tool to protect children.

Nye continued, telling legislators that officials in Albany are aware of the Christian Fellowship Center and some state legislative staffers watched the video of the county legislature's operations committee meeting on June 12.

It was during that meeting that Legislator Ben Hull, a member of the CFC, asked County Attorney Steve Button for a legal opinion regarding the CARE Act.

Button said that while the goal of the bill, to protect children from sexual abuse, is laudable; it goes to "attack" certain aspects of "truths," known as the penitent priest exception.

The exemption operates in a similar, but arguably stronger, fashion to attorney-client privilege granted to attorneys.

Button said the law would create difficult situations within churches as religious leaders would be at odds with their religious mandates and the law.

The bill however does include "carve out" exemptions for confessions made in confidence to clergy members.

He said that clergy leaders and members would have a difficult time determining the criteria for the exemptions.

Michele Wilbur, one of the most vocal members of CFCtoo, detailed the abuse she and her children suffered at the hands of her husband.

"I will never forget the day I discovered my ex-husband had

molested our adopted daughters. I had stayed with my violently abusive husband for 10 years under pressure from my pastors but that was the day something snapped," Wilbur said.

Wilbur detailed how she defied her pastors and reported the abuse, later leaving her husband.

"I lost everything, my community, my house and my financial stability," she said.

When speaking about the Ferguson case, Wilbur said so much time had passed that District Attorney Gary Pasqua "could not muster enough evidence to put this child molester behind bars" because the case was so old and the children involved were so young.

Wilbur said by the time someone else had reported the crime, four years had already gone by, something that should not have happened.

"This act does not impede our free speech or our freedom of religion, it simply protects children," she said.

Wilbur also read aloud from a letter from Ferguson's mother, Bonnie Ogilvie,

Ogilvie wrote that the elders who were made aware of the abuse of her grandchildren refused to report the crime "even though they had been told this abuse was genital to genital touching and rubbing."

According to Ogilvie, her son escaped justice that was "due him as a sexual predator because his abuse remained hidden within the confine of his church for six years."

She said the pastors chose secrecy, allowing the abuse to happen.

Interim superintendent sworn in at Massena

MASSENA — Pat Brady is now serving as the Massena Central School District interim superintendent after recently being sworn in.

Brady will serve in the role until Ron Burke assumes the superintendent role on Aug. 1, officials say.

Brady officially retired on June 30 after 35 years in education but agreed to stay on in a transitional role as Burke finishes his time with the Canton Central School District.

Burke has served as superintendent at Canton Central since 2018 and comes to Massena on a three-year contract.

In other action, Zachary Monroe was officially sworn in for a four-year term on the board of education.

Monroe replaced Amber Baines after she chose to not seek another term.

Baines most recently served as vice president on the board of education.

Board Member Kevin Perretta will now serve in the vice president role, with a term that is set to expire in 2024.

For her five years of service to the board of education, Baines was given a parting gift by Board President Paul Haggett.

Baines served on the Policy Committee as chair for two years, as well as vice president of the board of education for the last two years, according to Haggett.

"Your presence and your input and your good works on the board will certainly be missed," Haggett told Baines.

Haggett himself was also sworn in during the meeting for another one-year term as board president after being unanimously selected by board members for the position.

Also sworn in during the meeting was Joyce Giroux, who is replacing Timothy Hayes. Hayes resigned his position from the board earlier this year.

Giroux is slated to finish out the remaining three years of Hayes' four-year term.

Massena airport closes for rehab project

MASSENA — Massena International Airport will be closed from July 12 through Aug. 3 to allow for runway rehabilitation.

According to Airport Manager Dylan Casselman, the schedule has been moved back a week from the

originally planned dates of July 5-26.

Casselman also told Massena Town Board members that work to runway 523 is currently underway.

Town officials say Boutique Air is notifying scheduled passengers of the change so plans can be changed.

Town Supervisor Sue Bellor suggested that individuals who may know someone who has a flight

booked to reach out and notify them of the schedule changes.

In other news, Casselman noted that numbers at the airport remain strong through the month of May.

“Boutique Air numbers for May of 2023 were 456 enplaned and 424 deplaned, for a total of 880. They had 184 landings. They had two cancellations,” he said.

Village considers paper bags for leaf pickup

MASSENA — Village of Massena residents will have an opportunity to offer comments on village plans to require the use of paper bags for grass and leaf pickup during the

July 18 board meeting.

The idea originally came from Department of Public Works Superintendent Marty Miller, who first suggested it as a means to speed up the cleanup process.

Currently, DPW workers tear open plastic bags and dump the

contents into trucks. If the village were to switch to paper, DPW workers could just toss the entire bag into the refuse truck for processing.

Miller also noted that most other communities in the area have switched to paper as well.

Village trustees noted that many local stores have the bags available, including Walmart, Triple A and Home Depot.

Plastic bags are still allowed if an individual wants to dispose of their leaves and grass clippings themselves at the former DPW site on South Main Street, officials noted.

Hours of operation are 8 a.m. to noon on Saturdays if brush needs to be dropped off.

Gates are open 7 a.m. to 8 p.m., Monday through Friday otherwise.

Mayor Greg Paquin told board members it was important to note that plastic bags were still allowed since many residents do dispose of the waste themselves.

“I think we need to make sure at that hearing that we explain to everyone that you can still bring your own plastic. But, you have to rip it apart and throw it away. Paper is just going to be for pickup. We have to make sure we do a good job of educating the public on that,” he said.

If all goes according to plan, the law will go into effect for this fall.

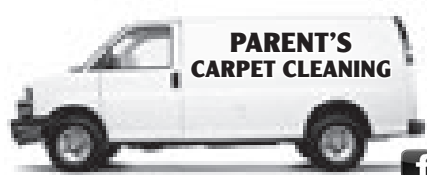
Curbside pickup with paper bags would then begin with the fall pickup in September and October.

Spring clean up runs through April and May.

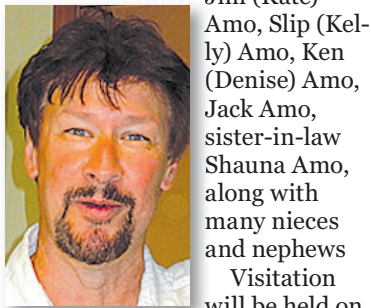

For 12 years this lovely garden of roses has graced Library Park along with the Mirror Gardens and shrub border across the back of the library which the Markerts envisioned and then turned that vision into reality.

Today the fund established to maintain this memorial has at last been used up. A few of the members of the original committee that established the memorial have met again to consider how best to maintain this lovely rose garden. The committee is asking all those, both individuals and organizations, that contributed once before to consider doing so again so that an endowment can be established for the ongoing care of the roses — the flowers Irma and Norb loved the most.

To date \$2,000 in donations has been collected with a goal of \$6,000 for the upkeep of the Markert Memorial.

The fund established in 2011 for the care and maintenance of the Markert Memorial was given to the Ogdensburg Public Library to administer. The library has done well to make these funds last as long as they have. State cash for bridge work

Public records should be easy for anyone to obtain

Information gatekeepers could benefit from FOIL refresher

Public documents should be easy to obtain, but that's not always the case. While New York's Freedom of Information Law (FOIL) is actually pretty open in theory, in practice, it lacks teeth.

There is no real penalty for denying citizens access to documents that are deemed public under the law, aside from civil lawsuits.

That's a problem, as many people and organizations just don't have the wallet to compete with local, state and federal governments. It's also a double-edged sword to bring a lawsuit against an entity, when you're funding your opponent with taxes.

Although that's not likely to change, I'd like to see the state Committee on Open Government active-

ly providing education to public employees responsible for making the decisions.

Having worked with many school and municipal employees over the years, I am often able to obtain documents without filing a formal public records request. I really only take that route when other paths have failed.

I've certainly been wrongly denied access to documents that should have been released, at least in the opinion of the Committee on Open Government. But aside from filing multiple appeals and informing the public of a denial, I've never had the resources to pursue legal action and quite frankly, it shouldn't come to that. To be fair, I've also been rightfully denied requests as well.

One of the more recent changes to open meetings law I was initially excited about was a 2021 amendment that records should be made available to the public at least 24 hours before a public meeting, to the extent practicable.

It says records may be available for a reasonable fee or by posting them online.

"The Law addresses two types of records: first, those that are

required to be made available pursuant to FOIL; and second, proposed resolutions, law, rules, regulations, policies or amendments thereto."

When either is scheduled to be discussed during an open meeting, the law requires that they be made available to the public, "to the extent practicable, at least 24 hours prior to the meeting."

This is important, as school boards, town councils and county legislatures may pass resolutions without much discussion. When this happens, there has almost certainly been more information provided to the lawmakers than we see at the meeting, which leaves us with a lot of questions.

The 2021 amendment also says municipalities and schools with the resources to make documents available should. That's another area I believe we could see some improvement in locally.

"If the agency in which a public body functions maintains a regularly and routinely updated website and utilizes a high speed internet connection," records scheduled to be discussed "shall be posted on the website to the extent practicable at least 24 hours prior to the meeting," the law says.

Don't get me wrong, I think most lawmakers and public employees are acting in a manner they believe is right and nine times out of ten, when I request a public document that I should have access to, I get it. I don't think records requests are usually being denied out of malice,

but I do think there should be better education available to our gatekeepers because the general public should not have to work very hard to get access to documents they are entitled to.

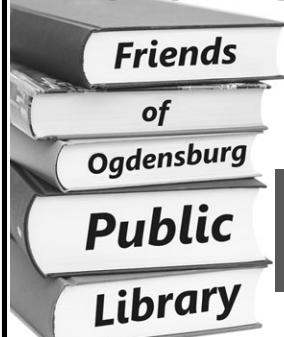

What to know about installing a pool at home

Summer is a season of relaxation when school is not in session, vacation season is in full swing and people everywhere are getting outside and soaking up the summer sun.

It's hard to imagine how that can get any better. But it can for people thinking of installing a pool in their backyard.

Pools definitely have a wow factor that's hard to replicate.

Homeowners considering pool installation can take note of these factors as they try to decide if a pool is right for them.

Cost

The cost to install a pool depends on a host of factors,

including which type of pool homeowners are considering and where they live.

According to the online home improvement resource Angi (formerly Angie's list), the average cost to install an above ground pool in the United States in 2022 was \$3,322, while the average inground pool installation in the same year

was \$55,000.

That's quite a disparity in price, and homeowners should know that the average cost of each project is higher in certain regions and under certain circumstances.

Potential ancillary costs, such as excavation and plumbing relocation, will add to the final cost of the project.

The erection of fencing around the pool if no fencing currently surrounds the area where the pool will be located also will add to the final cost.

As noted, above ground pools, on average, require a considerably smaller financial investment than inground pools.

This is an important consideration, but which option may ultimately prove the better investment is worth researching.

Homeowners can speak with a local real estate professional to determine if an inground pool or above ground might yield a significantly higher return at resale.

If an inground pool is likely to increase property value by a substantial amount, it could be well worth the extra upfront costs.

Maintenance

Pools are undeniably fun, but they still require maintenance.

The experts at Better Homes & Gardens note that vinyl liners in

pools last approximately six to 10 years, while painted concrete may require a fresh coat of paint every five years.

Plaster finishes may last as long as 15 years, while cement-coated products can last a lifetime.

Pools also need periodic cleaning, and chemicals to keep the pool operating safely and cleanly will require an additional, if somewhat minimal, financial investment.

Homeowners investing in a new pool should be aware of the maintenance required to keep the pool clean and be willing to do that maintenance.

And though homeowners typically can open and close pools on their own, it's also possible to hire someone to do it for a relatively small fee each season.

Preparation

A survey of the land in a yard can reveal how smoothly a pool installation may or may not go.

Though it's possible to install a pool in just about any yard, some spaces might require greater preparation and pre-installation effort than others.

Sloped backyards, for example, may require the services of a landscape architect to prepare the space, which can extend the time it takes to complete the project and add the overall cost.

Tips on how to replace gutters

Certain home renovation projects are more glamorous than others. A remodeled kitchen is sure to garner its share of “oohs and aahs,” while a newly paved driveway is much less likely to dazzle guests.

Turn attics into livable spaces with renovations

Houses typically feature various areas that are traditionally designed for storage, such as garages, basements and attics.

However, with some renovation, these spaces can be transformed into livable areas.

Furthermore, an attic that was not initially designed as a room when the house was built can add extra “load” upstairs if it is converted. That could present certain structural problems. That means a structural engineer also must be consulted to see if adding beams, flooring and drywall will necessitate other changes elsewhere in the home to accommodate the extra load.

In order to have a functional attic room, building codes will dictate that it needs to be accessible by a full-size staircase. Also, it will need to have another exit in case of an emergency so that will likely be an accessible window, according to the home information site The Fill.

Homeowners' budgets and renovation plans will need to factor into these considerations. Homeowners also are advised to check local permits to determine what else may be required to go forward. It is best to follow the rules. Lack of a permit for work can affect the ability to sell a home down the line.

Individuals also should plan for heating and cooling upgrades as the home will need to have ductwork installed in the attic, or at the least, a stand-alone heating and cooling unit.

As heat rises, it can get quite warm in an attic, so ventilation and comfort should be considered. The attic will need to be wired for electricity for lighting and other needs. Air sealing and additional insulation can the attic space more comfortable as well.

Consult with a qualified electrician and an HVAC technician and have an energy audit done to discuss needs.

Conserve energy and be cool

Air conditioning is a welcome luxury come the dog days of summer. Few people can imagine getting through a hot summer afternoon without turning their AC on, and that can make July and August some of the more costly months on the calendar in regard to energy consumption.

maintenance appointments with an HVAC technician can ensure the unit is clean and refrigerant levels are correct, helping it run as efficiently as possible.

Embrace natural ways to keep a home's interior cool. Cranking the AC is not the only way to maintain a comfortable temperature inside a home during the months of July and August. Closing curtains on especially warm days keeps the sun out and makes it easier to maintain comfortable temperatures inside without lowering the temperature on the thermostat. Avoiding the stove on hot nights and preparing cold meals or firing up the grill outside is another way to keep the house cool.

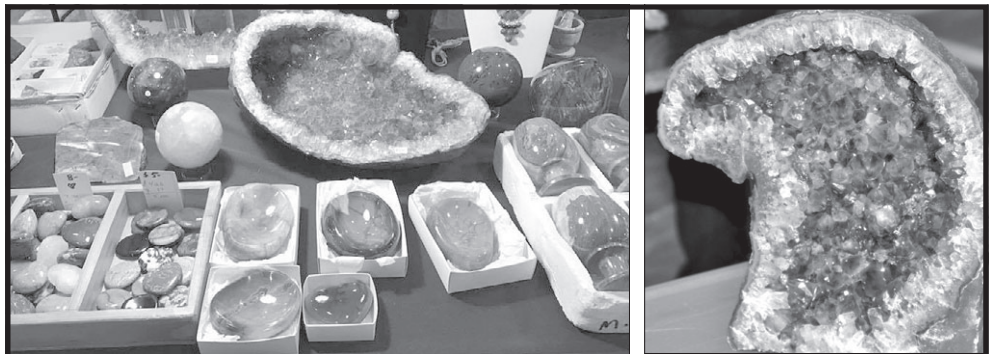

In 1760, the two-part Battle of the Thousand Islands signaled the end of the French régime in North America.

The French vessel L'Outaouaise was captured by British gunboats off Isle Royale in August and later that month Fort Lévis (on what is now known as Chimney Island, located opposite the Ogdensburg shoreline) surrendered to the British after more than a week long artillery bombardment.

Fort de la Lévis, defended by about 300 French, Canadian troops and Native Americans fell to an Anglo-American Army over 10,000 strong.

In September 1760, Montreal surrendered and Canada officially joined the other American colonies as part of the British Empire after the signing of the Treaty of Ghent in 1763.

Talk to teens about pot risks

CANTON -- St. Lawrence County Public Health officials are urging parents and guardians to clear the smoke with teens and young adults about the risks of using marijuana.

SLC county public health officials have offered some tips for talking to young adults and teens about using pot.

- Start the conversation early (whenever they first start asking questions) and before they consider using.

- Plan to have more than one conversation- many short talks work best. Keep the conversation casual instead of having a formal family meeting.

- Look for natural ways to bring up the subject, such as driving past the dispensary or seeing a reference to cannabis on TV.

- Focus on the facts and how cannabis can influence the developing brain.

- Talk with your children about having an "exit plan" if they're offered cannabis.

- Peer pressure can be powerful and having a plan to avoid it can help them make healthier choices. Talk with your children about what they would do if faced with a decision about using drugs or alcohol, such as texting a code word to a family member.

- Be aware of your own attitudes and behaviors, embrace the fact that this conversation may feel awkward for both of you. Set your expectations and communicate them clearly.

What to do if Your Child is Using

Cannabis

- Stay calm - overreacting may lead youth to rebel, feel resentful, or take greater risks.

- Talk about your concerns and give the facts and positive reasons for wanting them to stop using cannabis with a focus on the impact cannabis can have on the developing brain.

- Encourage questions, be non-judgmental, and listen to them.

- Keep calm and let them know you are there for them. Make sure they know they can always come to you, or another trusted person if they're in need of an adult.

- If they have their driver's and/or boating license, remind them not to use cannabis and drive/boat, as it is illegal and can be dangerous. Cannabis can slow your reaction time and motor coordination and can be incredibly dangerous to drive under the influence.

"Marijuana use is increasingly viewed as harmless, due to its growing acceptance," St. Lawrence County Public Health said a press release. "However, research shows the brain is still developing until about age 25. This means using cannabis before the age of 25 can change the way the brain develops, making it especially harmful to teens and young adults."

Public health says the negative effects of teen marijuana use can include difficulty thinking and problem-solving, problems with memory, learning, reduced coordination, difficulty maintaining attention, as well as problems with school and social life.

for me and my family. Again, thank you and am infinitely grateful to those who supported and believed in my vision for St. Lawrence County," O'Brien wrote in a statement.

O'Brien was named Sheriff Brooks Bigwarfe's Undersheriff in 2020.

After graduating Ogdensburg Free Academy, he attended SUNY Canton where he obtained a degree in Criminal Justice. In January 2003, almost two decades ago, he was sworn in as a Police Officer and attended the David Sullivan Law Enforcement Academy at SUNY Canton.

While attending the Police Academy, he was an active member for the Ogdensburg Rescue Squad, the Ogdensburg dive team and the Morristown Fire Department.

He worked part-time for the village of Antwerp in Jefferson County and the Norfolk Town Police before joining the St. Lawrence County Sheriff's Office.

During his career, he worked for Sheriff Gary Jarvis, Sheriff Kevin Wells and Sheriff Bigwarfe.

Engle, who won the primary by a nearly 2-1 margin last month, appears poised to be the only candidate on the ballot for sheriff this November.

Engle, who lives in Lisbon, is a 20-year veteran of the Sheriff's Office. He previously served in the United States Marine Corps.

In an interview with NCTW, Engle said he fully intends to press forward with his campaign despite O'Brien dropping from the race.

"This doesn't change anything for me. I still intend to show the people who I am. I'm still going to meet with the people of St. Lawrence County to find out their needs and find ways to address those needs," Engle said.

Engle also said he intends to continue to attend town and village board meetings throughout the year, while also meeting with volunteer fire and rescue departments.

"They're really the pillars of the community and we need to do everything we can to support them and to have strong working relationships with them," Engle told NCTW.

Future campaign events include events in Edwards and Fowler, with meet and greets scheduled throughout the summer.

Engle said as more events are scheduled his campaign will continue to announce them to keep the public informed.

When asked about the primary election, Engle said he was slightly shocked but excited to see just how many voters went to the polls last month.

"To see just over 20% come out to vote in an off year election shows that people were paying attention and really cared," he said.

In a previous interview with North Country This Week, Engle said his priorities include expanding the county's school resource officer program, tackling the drug epidemic plaguing the county and protecting Second Amendment rights. He says as sheriff he believes he can improve morale of the sheriff's deputies, the corrections officers inside the sheriff's office and rebuild relationships with other law enforcement agencies. Engle will also run as an independent.

In his primary consolation, O'Brien told NCTW it was disheartening to see only 20% of the Republican electorate go to the polls for the primary.

"We respect the Republican electorate but when less than 20% of the Republican Party comes out to vote, it is disheartening. We will evaluate these results and look at how we progress moving forward," he said.

of the vehicles, with numbers varying from one manufacturer to another. Through legislation passed in the 2022-23 state budget, districts must purchase or lease new vehicles that meet the zero-emission standard by July 1, 2027. By 2035, all vehicles in school fleets must meet that standard and diesel powered buses will be completely phased out.

The only potential respite for districts would come from a delay of the 2027 deadline, if approved by state officials, that would allow districts to delay implementation by two years. The survey will be conducted by IBI Group, who have overseen the district's \$49.6 million capital project.

NYSERDA is set to provide \$40,000 to \$50,000 to conduct the survey. The study is expected to provide the district with information to prepare for the eventual transition to zero-emission vehicles.

"It has all of the different factors that they are going to be looking at, such as bus route characteristics, our bus fleet, the size of our district, our electrical capacity, estimated capital and operating costs if we are to go to electrification," Brady said.

The survey should be complete by December, officials say.

Other districts have attempted to cope with the new regulations, with Lisbon Central School District voters rejecting a \$16 million capital improvement project in March.

The project failed with a vote of 156 to 146, a sharp rebuke by voters who pushed back against a project that would have set in motion the conversion of the school's fleet to all electric vehicles. Superintendent Patrick Farrand blamed the electric bus mandate largely for the failure of the vote.

"We are one of the very first schools that have seen what planning ahead for this conversion looks like. The price is too high. If the state isn't adequately aiding in that storage cost the taxpayers aren't going to support it," he told North Country This Week in March.

The estimated cost of the project was \$16,174,000, with \$500,000 supplied from district reserves.

The project was eligible for state aid reimbursement up to 80%, meaning that approximately \$2.7 million would have been levied to taxpayers over a 30-year span.

If the project did not include a bus garage, the project would have been eligible for 96.5% state aid reimbursement. The difference for a taxpayer with a home assessed at \$100,000 jumps from about \$13 per year to \$90 per year due to the difference in aid.



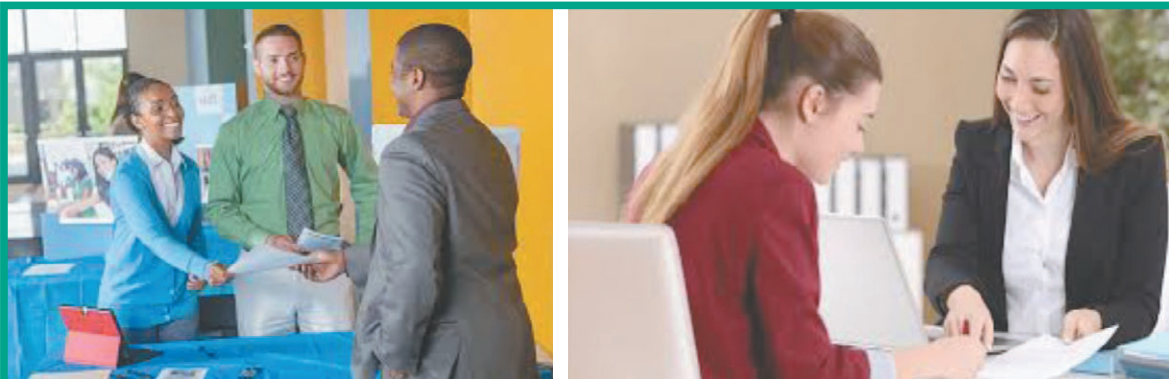

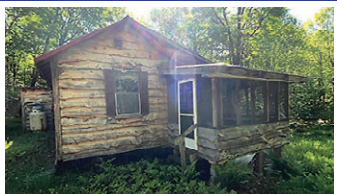
