NYPA helps foot bill for road repairs

CANTON - The Town of Canton will be receiving nearly \$120,000 from the New York Power Authority (NYPA) for damages incurred on town roads during the recently-completed transmission line work.

More than two years, Canton Town Councilman James T. Smith expressed concerns about the wear and tear on town roads from the transmission line replacement work.

"I've noticed over the past two months that the town roads are getting pounded by Michels. There's been a lot of traffic over 32 miles of town roads, which is close to one-third of our roads," said Smith in May 2021. "And we will get left paying for that."

At Wednesday night's (July 12) monthly town board meeting, Smith's concerns were compensated by a \$119,663.43 settlement from NYPA for "wear and tear" on town roads.

The settlement was negotiated by Town Highway Superintendent Steven Smith.

"Steve was tenacious on this," said Councilman John Taillon. "They were trying to low ball us."

NYPA settlements have also been reached for the Town of Madrid and St. Lawrence County.

Sex abuse claims push Diocese to file bankruptcy

OGDENSBURG - The Ogdensburg Diocese has filed for bankruptcy, a move triggered by 124 pending lawsuits from more than 50 alleged victims who say they suffered childhood sexual abuse at the hands of clergy from the 1940s to 1990s.

The Diocese encompasses 12,036 square miles of northern New York, including Clinton, Essex, Franklin, Hamilton, Jefferson, Lewis and St. Lawrence counties, as well as northern Herkimer County.

"This difficult yet necessary decision was made in response to lawsuits filed against the Diocese under the Child Victims Act. 124 cases are currently pending against the Diocese following implementation of the act, which allows individuals who assert that they were the victims of childhood sexual abuse to file claims, regardless of when the alleged abuse took place. The claims filed against the Diocese date back decades (1940s through 1990s), prior to the institution of the Diocese's safe environment policies and procedures," spokeswoman

Darcy Fargo said in a prepared statement.

The Diocese has been encumbered with lawsuits related to sexual abuse allegations and had acknowledged years ago that bankruptcy was being considered.

"The goal for filing a reorganization case is to resolve the legal cases in a fair and equitable manner while allowing the Diocese to continue its mission. Had the Diocese not filed for reorganization, civil actions would continue for many years, with claimants who filed the first lawsuits potentially receiving larger awards or settlements, leaving little, if any, money for the remaining claimants. Filing for reorganization does not hinder claims filed by survivors," said Bishop LaValley. "Instead, it establishes a process for all claims to be treated fairly."

Attorneys who represent victims of the Diocese see things differently though.

"The Diocese of Ogdensburg's decision to file for Chapter 11 Bankruptcy is an unfortunate yet predictable attempt to conceal the truth about the diocese's

Clerk says goodbye after 30-year run

POTSDAM - After 31 years, with a lion's share serving as village clerk, Lori Queor is retiring at the end of August.

Queor and her husband Bob plan to relocate to Tennessee once her retirement begins and spend time gardening and living a more calm, relaxed life. Until then she is on hand to assist incoming village clerk Georgine Scott, but has been using some of her accrued vacation time this summer.

"I've never had a summer off really. Summer here in the village

is traditionally tax season," Queor said with a smile.

It's much-earned time off for the outgoing clerk who has been busy working in public service for decades now.

Queor started with the village on May 4, 1992 in the code enforcement and planning office and worked her way up from the basement to serve the village and the taxpayers in a variety of capacities.

"I started downstairs in the planning department as a keyboard specialist," Queor said. "I've worked with some great people over the years."

When the clerk's position was


available after the previous clerk retired, Queor applied, was hired and started Jan. 14, 2002.

In October 2010, Queor took on the extra responsibilities of the village treasurer, in addition to the clerk job, after the previous treasurer retired, and saved the village money by filling both posts for years.

Troopers say man was high when he crashed into tree

POTSDAM — A Winthrop man was charged after his vehicle crashed into a tree on U.S. Highway 11 July 11, according to state police.

Devon A. Young, 27, was charged with operating a motor vehicle while ability impaired by drugs, seventh-degree criminal possession of a controlled substance, third-degree criminal possession of a controlled substance and failure to keep right, officers said.

Young allegedly crashed his 2015 black Jeep Cherokee into trees on U.S. Highway 11, police said.

While speaking with Young, he was allegedly showing signs of impairment.

Troopers say Young failed field sobriety tests.

While waiting for the tow to arrive, troopers said they searched the vehicle and located glass smoking devices with crack cocaine residue.

Also, inside of the vehicle a collapsible baton was located, officers said.

State police are investigating after a vehicle crashed into and

became stuck in a tree on U.S. Highway 11, according to the Potsdam fire.

Potsdam Fire, Potsdam Rescue, and County Car 10 responded around 10:42 a.m. Tuesday near 8006 US Highway 11 following a report of a car crashing into a tree and the driver unable to exit the vehicle.

West Stockholm Fire Chief Torey Russell happened to be going by the scene and stopped to assist, officials said. He contacted Potsdam Fire to advise them the driver of the vehicle had exited the vehicle.

When Potsdam Fire units arrived on scene they reportedly found the victim outside of the vehicle.

Firefighters set up traffic control. Potsdam Fire was on scene until Johnson's Towing removed the vehicle.

The driver was not transported by Potsdam Rescue, fire officials said.

The scene is reportedly being investigated by the state police.

All Potsdam Fire units were in service at 1:22 p.m.

Canton considers anaerobic digester law

CANTON — The Canton Town Board is ready to introduce a local law dealing with anaerobic digesters to the public.

Town attorney Eric Gustafson told board members that a final draft revised to include comments and recommendations from the public and county officials is ready for a public hearing set Aug. 9 at 5:45 p.m. at the Canton Municipal Building.

The town board hoped to have the local law ready at its June 14 meeting

forcing them to extend a moratorium to Aug. 31.

“We want to get it right,” said Deputy Town Supervisor James T. Smith at that meeting.

Smith has pointed out that a \$25 million digester project is in the works in the Town of Canton by an out-of-town developer. He said the facility would be operating 365 days of the year with manure coming from at least five different farms.

Anaerobic digestion is a process through which bacteria break down organic matter—such as animal manure, wastewater biosolids, and

food wastes—in the absence of oxygen.

Anaerobic digestion for biogas production takes place in a sealed vessel called a reactor, which is designed and constructed in various shapes and sizes specific to the site and feedstock conditions. These reactors contain complex microbial communities that break down (or digest) the waste and produce resultant biogas and digestate (the solid and liquid material end-products of the AD process) which is discharged from the digester, as defined on the Environmental Protection Agency website.

Gouverneur woman allegedly shook boyfriend's baby causing brain injuries

FOWLER — State Police arrested Tiara K. Allen, 25, of Gouverneur, on July 13 for reckless assault of a Child, and endangering the welfare of a child.

Police said Allen was charged after an investigation determined that on July 7, around 9:40 a.m., she was in the care of her boyfriend's 5-month-old child at their residence on Sand Road in the town of Fowler.

Allen became frustrated with the child's incessant crying and began to shake the child, police said.

Shortly thereafter, the child became unresponsive and was transported to Gouverneur Hospital.

Due to the severity the child is suffering, the child

was transported to Upstate Golisano Children's Hospital, Syracuse, NY, where the child was diagnosed with Anoxic Brain Injury and Subdural Hematomas as result of Allen's actions.

The victim is still being monitored at Upstate Golisano Children's Hospital, Syracuse, but listed in stable condition.

Allen was arrested and processed at SP Gouverneur.

She was arraigned in the Town of Fowler Court where she was remanded to St. Lawrence County Correctional Facility in lieu of \$10,000 cash, \$20,000 bond.

self-serving practices at the expense of child sexual abuse survivors," Jeff Anderson and Associates law firm said in a joint press release with LaFave, Wien & Frament, PLLC.

"The Diocese of Ogdensburg's resolution to declare bankruptcy shows, once again, a continuity in their intentions—which are, solely and purely, in service to their own self-interest," said attorney Cynthia LaFave. "In declaring bankruptcy, the Diocese knowingly obstructs survivors' long-awaited opportunity to say their piece; to be heard, to be acknowledged. Make no mistake, silencing survivors is exactly what the Diocese has always done. This decision is another in a long line of decisions aimed at preserving the Diocese's frail veneer by undermining the humanity and dignity of survivors."

The law firms say over half of New York's eight Catholic dioceses have filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy to date.

"The Diocese of Ogdensburg is running from accountability," said attorney Jeff Anderson. "Instead of standing up for the people entrusted to their care and acknowledging the harm done to children for which they are responsible, the Diocese is taking drastic, self-serving measures in an attempt to suppress the truth," the firms said.

Bishop LaValley however, said that the Diocese has instituted extensive policies and procedures to prevent sexual abuse.

"The procedures also ensure that allegations are responsibly and justly handled," according to the Bishop.

"We believe that the fact that there have been no claims filed alleging abuse occurred in the last 20 years is evidence that we have made great progress and are on the right course. Nevertheless, we remain vigilant."

The Bishop added that he is available to meet with every abuse survivor, and the Diocese continues to reach out to them with a goal of fostering reconciliation and healing for those who have been so immeasurably harmed."

The Diocese said that prior to the implementation of the CVA, the Diocese offered assistance to survivors of abuse who made prior claims.

In 2018, as part of the Year of Mercy, diocesan officials reached out to survivors through the Independent Reconciliation and Compensation Program (IRCP) seeking reconciliation with them and offering compensation for their suffering. Through the IRCP, 38 claims were resolved. An additional 14 claims were also settled outside the program.

The law firms say they have no plans to quit pushing forward.

"The survivors' courage and strength will not be extinguished by today's bankruptcy filing," added attorney Taylor Stippel. "North Country survivors are resilient. The true nature of the Diocese's dangerous patterns and practices will be revealed."

ROADS...

Wis., recently completed the construction of new transmission lines from Massena to Croghan.

New York Gov. Kathy Hochul on June 20 announced the completion and successful energization of the New York Power Authority's Smart Path clean energy transmission infrastructure project.

The Smart Path project is an upgrade of 78 miles of transmission lines that span from Massena in St. Lawrence County to Croghan in Lewis County.

With fewer poles made of steel instead of the original wood, the

project will harden the lines against weather events and enable the secure transmission of clean energy from northern New York into the state's electric power grid.

Smart Path's rebuilt lines can transmit up to 345 kilovolts. They will be operated in the near-term at the 230 kV level until the completion of the Smart Path Connect project. Together the lines are currently rated to carry 900 megawatts during the winter months.

Increasing the voltage is a cost-effective way to add more renewable power, especially from in-state renewable generation, anywhere along the transmission line.

The \$484 million Smart Path project involved the replacement of the original H-frame wood poles, some of which are more than 80 years old with 776 new single steel monopoles in the existing right of way.

village board separated the clerk and treasurer positions and hired Queor as clerk-registrar instead on June 1, 2021.

"I've loved the job, and loved the people," she said. "But thirty-one years, it's a lot. I was getting burnt out."

There have been many changes in the community and the clerk's office over the years, along with many memories for the outgoing clerk.

Queor served with three mayors over her tenure, Bill Lawson, Ruth Garner and current mayor Ron Tischler.

She shared a special connection with Garner and remembers her fondly.

"I learned more from that woman in the years I was here and she was here than anyone ever. She was like a second mother for me. She was just amazing," Queor said. "She did a lot for paving the way for females really. I miss her so much."

"It was one of the best things in my 31 years here, was my connection with her."

As she looks back over the years, the long-time clerk said the village receiving the state Downtown Revitalization Initiative funding, and the construction of the Hampton and other commercial development and growth in the village have been great to see. She said she is always surprised to see how quickly real estate sells in the village, as professional people relocate here for the amenities offered in the small, but busy community.

Queor said one of the big challenges facing the village in coming years will be its hydro plants. "The toughest thing is going to be getting those hydro plant where they need to be," she said.

"The board and the administration have always done the best they can," she said. And, Queor said she expects the village to continue to grow in coming years. "I think you are still going to see a lot of improvements."

Some other changes she has seen over the years at the clerk's office is an increase in the amount of birth and death certificates processed after several changes in the regional healthcare scene which led to Canton-Potsdam hospital taking on a larger portion of that traffic. "We went from a 1-inch to a 3-inch binder. We handled about 600 or 700 a year," Queor said.

The clerk said one of the more difficult times on the job was during the COVID pandemic when the village offices had to switch to working remotely, losing that direct interaction with the taxpayers.

"I did not like working from home," she said. "It was horrible."

The clerk also recalls the weirdest thing she ever dealt with on the job. "I remember a gentleman who

came in to have me notarize a document for him," Queor said, who also served as Notary Public at the municipal offices.

"He proceeds to tell me that he is going to Florida for an exorcism and he needed to have a hold harmless medical release on himself notarized."

"That's probably the weirdest thing I remember. I often wondered 'Is that man okay?'" she said. "That stuck with me."

Queor credited her family, husband Bob, daughter Ashlenn, 23, who lives locally, and son Nicholas, 29, who lives in Washington, with their support during her career. "There have been many meetings, and night meetings. They were always very understanding."

"I'm extremely thankful to the taxpayers for all that they have given me," she said. "Not many can say they are 55 with a 31-year career in public service. It's hard to walk away from, but I was burnt out. Those years as clerk/treasurer were intense."

Queor said she took the responsibility of serving as treasurer of taxpayer money very seriously. "I always looked for savings. Every penny was accounted for. To the penny. But that's always stressful."

She feels that she leaves the village offices in good hands with the crew there now. "They are going to do a great job, I have no doubt," she said. With new clerk Georgine Scott taking over the reigns officially after August, Queor said her best advice to her is "Make sure you know the answer before you give it to anyone."

She said a lot of what the village clerk is able to do for taxpayers is regulated by state law and taxpayers may not realize that in certain instances the village office's hands are tied when it comes to certain things.

"That's the thing I'm going to miss the most is interacting with the taxpayers. There are some amazing people in the village of Potsdam," said Queor.

St. Lawrence County named in Title 42 lawsuit following State of Emergency

CANTON — In a relatively abrupt turnaround, Palisades EOM has filed a motion to amend its legal complaint that named St. Lawrence County as a defendant.

Under the complaint, St. Lawrence County and a large number of New York state counties were named for declaring a state of emergency following the expiration of Title 42.

St. Lawrence County lawmakers first declared the state of emergency in early May following the expiration of Title 42, a Trump era policy that extended into the Biden administration and restricted travel of migrants at the bor-

ders.

County lawmakers previously said that the county was ill prepared for a potential influx of migrants, hence the declaration of a state of emergency. With the state of emergency in place, officials would be able to request FEMA money to support any potential migrants that may come to the North Country.

Alarm bells first went off last month when it was reported that two migrants left a shelter in New York City, making their way north to Rockland County where they were able to obtain Department of Social Services benefits without being citizens, having social security numbers or working papers.

In response, Rockland County, Orange County and Niagara

County all filed for a temporary restraining order and a state of emergency.

In total, 31 counties have filed a state of emergency, though not all have taken the added step to also announce emergency orders or provisions that would bar hotels from housing migrants.

To date, St. Lawrence County has not announced any emergency orders or hotel provisions.

Though the county should be removed from the complaint in the near future, the county will still be on the hook for legal fees after hiring Attorney James P. Youngs of Hancock Estabrook law firm due to state licensing requirements for attorneys in the southern district of the state.

Police: Man strikes vehicle with ax

POTSDAM – A Potsdam man faces numerous charges, including using an ax to damage a vehicle, following an alleged domestic dispute Thursday, July 13, in the Town of Potsdam.

St. Lawrence County Sheriff's deputies charged Russell P. Snyder III, 28, with third-degree criminal mischief, damage the property of

another greater than \$250, a felony, act in a manner injure child less than 17, a misdemeanor, and second-degree harassment.

Deputies responded to a residence on Bagdad Road to find Snyder engaged in a physical altercation with a female causing her injury. It is alleged that Snyder also used an ax to damage

the vehicle of the female while a 13-year-old was seated in the vehicle.

Snyder was arraigned in front of Judge Velez of Hermon Town Court and was released on his own recognizance to appear in Potsdam Town Court at a later date.

Budget modifications, grant funding okayed

CANTON — St. Lawrence County legislators on the operations committee approved a resolution to authorize a contract with New York State Indigent Service Providers, which includes the Public Defender, Conflict Defender and assigned counsel.

The Hurrell-Harring Grant provides the funding for use of Indigent Criminal Defense, according to the resolution.

Under the contract, the three offices are entitled to reimbursement of expenditures related to indigent criminal defense representation, county officials say.

The Office of Indigent Defense consists of the Public Defender's Office, the Conflict Defender's

Office, and the Assigned Counsel Program.

The St. Lawrence County Public and Conflict Defender Offices represent individuals in local criminal courts, County Court, Supreme Court, and Family Court, according to the county website.

Reimbursement totals \$5,309,997 over the course of five years, with \$1,769,999.10 being reimbursed from April 1, 2022 through March 31, 2023, according to the resolution.

In other action, approved a budget modification to accept \$113,510 for the county planning office as part of the Accelerated Transit Capital Program (ATC) through the New York State Department of Transportation.

As part of the program, funds can be used for projects like rehabilitation, restoration and modernization of public transit assets that have a

minimum life of five years, according to the resolution.

The NYS DOT requires grantees to sign off on the grant within thirty days of receiving award notification, with funds distributed and used within three years of executing the agreement.

Legislators also approved a resolution to accept a grant of \$2,996 for the Office of Emergency Services to purchase four Apple iPads.

The devices will be used to help fire investigators "more efficiently investigate and determine the origins and causes of fires."

The iPads will be issued to fire investigators and stored at the Office of Emergency Services or on the mobile command vehicle.

All three resolutions will need final approval from the full board next month.



Complete survey by C3G Group

A few letters have been submitted to NorthCountry NOW/This Week In response to the ongoing study by the Clarkson University Construction Engineering Management Consulting (C3G) Group regarding pedestrian and bicyclist safety between the Village of Potsdam and Walmart on NYS Hwy. 11. I'd like to provide some information and thoughts on the discussion.

I reached out to the C3G Team to get some information. According to their website, (<https://sites.google.com/clarkson.edu/c3g-route-11-potsdam/home>) a survey prior to options being suggested showed that out of 111 respondents - made up of Potsdam residents and local college students - the majority (85%) regularly bike or walk to businesses along this part of Route 11.

Survey results also showed the respondents would utilize the space if adequately suited for pedestrian use. I'm sure those that had a concern were the most likely to respond to the original survey, but I will add that I have seen many traverse this path on foot in all seasons and I am always hoping for safer conditions for them. I have biked this corridor often and am glad for the change to two lanes on the railroad overpass by DOT to make biking safer.

The group (many of whom I'm told are bikers) is now continuing to survey people as to possible options to make the corridor even safer for pedestrians, bikers, and those in vehicles. These include very robust, moderately robust, and least robust options that are out for public feedback from large parts of the community.

As is stated in the Clarkson Group's scope of work, these comments, as well as all those being collected in the ongoing survey, will be included in the revised final concepts (which will include costs for implementation and ongoing maintenance) provided to the municipalities and the DOT as they move forward to make this corridor as safe as it can be. The devil is certainly in the details and I think this group of students under the guidance of their professors is looking to consider all the details.

Check out new church window

On April 4, 1906, a brand new stained glass window was installed in the chancel of St. Philip's Church in Norwood.

Like the beautiful rose window at the western end of the sanctuary, this new window was designed and created by Harry J. Horwood, Worker of Art Glass, in Ogdensburg, NY. The new window was a reproduction of the 19th century painting by German artist Bernard Plockhorst, of Jesus as the Good Shepherd. The installation of the window was made possible by generous donations from many members of the parish. The total cost of the window, frame and installation was \$581.50.

Since that day several generations of people at St. Philip's have enjoyed the beauty of our Good Shepherd window: the artistry and skilled craftsmanship, the enduring richness of the colors, and the comforting image of the Good Shepherd, tenderly guiding his sheep. But in recent years it had become clear that the window was badly in need of repair and restoration, a task far more costly than the original installation.


This year we were extremely grateful, therefore, to be awarded a very generous grant from the Rock Charitable Fund through the Northern New York Community Foundation. This grant enabled us to finally accomplish this very important maintenance of our window. The work is being done with meticulous care, under the direction of Ed Dehors, of the Historical Restorations Foundation. In April the window was taken from its frame, section by section, to be taken apart, piece by piece, for cleaning and any necessary repair, and finally to be reassembled and returned to its frame. We expect the window to be back home above our altar some time in August.

The people of St. Philip's would like to express our heartfelt thanks to the Rock Charitable Fund, established by Marjorie Rock, a long-time member of St. John's Episcopal Church in Ogdensburg, for the purpose of preserving the beautiful and historic buildings, churches, and cemeteries in our area.

Our thanks, too, to the Northern New York Community Foundation. Without such generous provisions, much of great value and beauty might be lost forever in the historic buildings of our communities.

We would like to invite all of our neighbors to stop by sometime and see our newly-restored window.

Potsdam UPS workers gearing up for potential Teamsters strike

POTSDAM — Potsdam UPS workers are joining their National Teamster allies in a potential strike.

On Wednesday, July 12, union members gathered in front of the Potsdam location for a “practice strike.”

Jeffrey Norman, Teamster Business Agent, spoke on behalf of Local 687 in a brief interview with North Country This Week Wednesday.

“We are putting the company on

notice,” he said.

The contract is due July 31, and UPS employees across the nation plan to strike if a “fair” contract isn’t brought forward.

Norman says UPS has the absolute power and authority to avoid the strike by bringing a fair offer forward.

“They are continuing to reward shareholders and forgetting about Main Street,” he said.

Norman claimed UPS made \$100 Billion in 2022, \$13 Billion of which is sheer profit.

He said many employees make just a bit over \$15 per hour, a wage he says doesn’t make ends meet in the current economy.

“These people have worked through the pandemic. They were called heroes. They were called essential workers. Many of them loaded vaccinations on the trucks when they themselves couldn’t get the vaccinations,” he said.

Norman said the company has not provided a kind environment for employees either.

“It’s not hassle free. It’s not an easy job to complete,” he said.

Norman said the current situation is “corporate greed.” Negotiations between UPS and the Teamsters union came to a halt recently, in part due to conditions for part-time workers.

A nationwide walkout by 340,000 UPS workers would be the largest strike against a single employer in national history, according to media reports.

The last time UPS workers went on strike was in 1997.

Property tax levy growth at 2%

For the third consecutive year, property tax levy growth will be capped at 2% for 2024 for local governments that operate on a calendar-based fiscal year.

State Comptroller Thomas P. DiNapoli released the data on July

13. This figure affects tax cap calculations for all counties, towns and fire districts, as well as 44 cities and 13 villages.

“Allowable tax levy growth will be limited to 2% for a third consecutive year,” DiNapoli said. “Although the rate of inflation has begun to decrease, it still poses a challenge for local governments and their budgets. As local governments spend down their one-time federal pandemic assistance, officials will need to carefully develop and balance their budgets for the coming year.”

In accordance with state law, DiNapoli’s office calculated the 2024 inflation factor at 6.26% for those local governments with a calendar fiscal year, well above the 2% allowable levy increase, and indicative of the higher costs facing these localities.

The tax cap, which first applied to local governments and school districts in 2012, limits annual tax levy increases to the lesser of the rate of inflation or 2% with certain exceptions including a provision that allows municipalities to override the tax cap.

Dragonboats race in Hannawa

HANNAWA FALLS — Fifteen dragon boats, each holding 20 paddlers, a drummer and steerer, paddled together in sync with the drumbeats at Postwood Park on July 16.

A large crowd cheered on the boats competing in the second year of The Raquette River Dragon Boat Festival.

The event, organized by Clarkson University Health Services Program, in conjunction with Potsdam Town Recreation, raises money to support mission trips, health initiatives and health education in St. Lawrence County.

"Last year we raised \$13,000. We are hoping for \$15,000 this year," said Chris LaPoint, event organizer and Assistant Clinical Professor of Clarkson University's Physician Assistant Program.

"The money raised will fund new health initiatives," said LaPoint. "Last year we did a fitness program, Girls on the Run," for third and fourth grade girls. We are looking to add a yoga and mindfulness program in schools this year," he said.

"This event teaches Clarkson Health Science students how to organize events and it gives them something fun to do," said LaPoint. "It also helps promote local businesses and helps Postwood Park grow," LaPoint said.

First place winners were "Clarkson Hockey," a combined men's and women's team. Second place went to Ichor Life Sciences, a biotechnology company partnering with Clarkson University. St. Lawrence Valley

Paddlers' "Paddle to the Medal" team took third, and Canton-Potsdam Hospital's "Stroke Protocol" took fourth place.

Highlights of the event included two Buffalo women's teams made up entirely of cancer survivors, "Nina's Hope" and "Nina's Dream."

"The Hope Chest runs support groups that show what breast cancer survivors can do. It's a positive support group that started their dragon boat racing in 2000," said Anne Kist, head coach and organizer. "The teams' names honor their co-founder, Nina, whose spirit lives on with the 125 women who currently make up three Nina teams."

Several local catering food trucks were available, as well as music, corn hole, and raffles.

Dynamic Dragon Boat Racing, of Knoxville, TN, again supplied the boats and navigator for each competitor boat. Dynamic Dragon Boat Racing was the company which helped stage past events in Waddington.

Both LaPoint and Michelle Garrow, Potsdam Town Recreation Director, have plans to keep growing the festival. This year had an inaugural youth team made up of soccer students from Edward-Knox, Canton, Heuvelton and Norwood-Norfolk schools. They hope to engage more youth teams next year.



How to share your extra garden

Nothing beats the taste of those first few harvests from the garden. The flavor and freshness, combined with the pride of having grown it yourself, just can't be beat... but when the novelty wears off, the freezer fills, and the excitement of processing your harvest turns into a chore, you might find yourself with an excess of wonderful food and no energy left to deal with it.

When you find yourself with an overabundance, you can share it with the people in our community who love delicious, fresh food, but have no means of growing their own. Here are some suggestions for connecting with them:

GardenShare has created a comprehensive interactive map where you can filter for food pantries and community meals. Locations and details are listed online at gardenshare.org/food-guide. United Helpers has a number of subsidized housing units throughout the county, and their house managers would be glad to talk to you about donating to the residents. Recovery and Safe Houses also welcome donations and reaching out to their respective directors would help you understand what they need most, or what they could consume.

There are many food donation options in every community here in the North Country. In my experience, these organizations and the people they serve are always grateful for fresh, nutritious food, even if you have enough for one family. Free will dinners sometimes provide "take home food" when they have extras, and your produce could be part of that offering. If we all share just a portion of our harvests, the impact will be staggering.

I recommend looking for an organization near you now, even if your harvest isn't ready. Find out who the best contact is, where you can drop things off, and what they will/can accept. Once you make that connection, when the busy harvest time arrives, it will be easier to follow through with the donation. When you create a connection with someone in your community who is doing wonderful work to serve your neighbors, I'm confident you'll be impressed with their dedication, and you'll learn about the real needs that are present right where you live. Those are the connections that make the world a better place.

Test it out this year to find your place, then as you plan for next year, consider increasing plantings of one or more crops that you can share. For most gardeners, the garden is our happy place and our therapy. By sharing our harvest, it also becomes a chance to grow our community.

How to make strawberry popsicles

Homemade popsicles are a great way to share a treat with your family.

The sugar can be significantly reduced from the store bought version without sacrificing on taste. There are infinite fun flavor combinations to experiment with.

The variations below include strawberries, but other fruits available in northern New York include blueberries and raspberries, or even applesauce!

Ingredients

- 4 packed cups strawberries, fresh or frozen
 - 2 tsp vanilla extract
 - 1/2 cup maple syrup
 - 1- 2 TBSP minced herbs such as mint, basil, lemon verbena
1. Puree all ingredients until smooth in a blender or food processor.

cessor. Taste and adjust as needed.

2. Pour into popsicle molds until nearly full and freeze until solid

Notes

- You can increase the amount of sweetener in the popsicles because cold foods reduce the tongue's perception of sweetness.
- Popsicles are flexible, experiment with dairy or lactose free substitutes such as silken tofu, oat milk, or coconut milk.

Dragon Noodles

Fresh, local, quick stir fry

Enjoy a quick noodle stir fry filled with fresh local vegetables melded with a tasty peanut sauce.

Techniques used:
Stove top cooking

Time: 45 minutes
Yield: 4 servings (15 minutes prep, 30 minutes cooking)

Ingredients

Noodles

- 1/2 to 1 package rice noodles

Stir fry

- 1 medium-large bunch leafy greens (bok choy, kale, swiss chard, collards, etc), chopped roughly
- 1-2 cups chopped mushrooms (small button varieties, such as crimini)
- 1/2 cup small diced radishes
- 3 scallions, chopped
- 1/4 -1/2 cucumber, chopped
- 6-8 garlic scapes, chopped
- 1 package tempeh, cut in 1/4 inch- 1/2 inch squares (see protein substitutions below)
- 2 TBSP olive oil

Sauce

- 1 small bunch cilantro, chopped
- 3-4 TBSP peanut butter
- 2-3 TBSP soy sauce or coconut aminos
- 1/2-1 can full coconut milk or 1 cup regular milk
- 1 TBSP sesame or olive oil
- Lime juice to taste

Instructions

1. In a medium bowl, combine all sauce ingredients and whisk together until a lightly thickened sauce forms. If the sauce is thick and doesn't spread well, add more coconut milk or milk to achieve a thinner sauce.
2. Cook noodles of your choice according to package directions. Drain and rinse with cold water.
3. In a medium to large pan, heat olive oil over medium heat. Cook tempeh until golden on each side, approximately 5 minutes. Remove from the pan and place onto a plate.
4. In that same pan, add additional oil if needed. Add in mushrooms, garlic scapes, and scallions. Cook until softened. Add in greens and



cook until wilted and slightly soft. Remove from heat. Toss in radishes and cucumbers raw for an added crunch or keep separate.

5. Assemble your dragon noodles either by tossing noodles, vegetables, tempeh all in one big bowl with sauce or place noodles, vegetables, and tempeh topped with sauce in individual bowls.

6. Top with a squeeze of lime juice and/or chopped peanuts if desired.

Notes

- You can use any type of milk, sub approximately 1 cup of milk instead of the coconut milk.
 - To make prep easier, try a food processor to lightly chop radishes, cucumber, mushrooms, scallions, and garlic scapes. Process the radishes and cucumber separately from the ingredients that will be cooked so you can add them raw. Overprocessing will result in mushy bits.
 - Vegetables can be prepared ahead to be ready for busy weeknight cooking.
 - Cubed chicken, thinly sliced beef, shrimp, etc, can replace the tempeh.
 - Adjust sauce spicing to your liking - such as adding red pepper flakes, ginger or lemongrass.
 - Increase sauce as needed to coat the noodles and vegetables well.
- Find sourcing options for seizing summers' bounty in the GardenShare Local Food Guide, which covers St. Lawrence County, and the Adirondack Harvest Map, which covers a multi-county region across northern New York.
