Canton welcomes new officer

CANTON – The Village of Canton has a new police officer.

The village board on Wednesday night approved the probationary hiring of Paige LaRock, an Ogdensburg native. LaRock was sworn in by Village Clerk Sally Noble in front of a large contingent of family members.

Little time was wasted as LaRock's first day on the job was today (July 20). The starting salary is \$49,905.

"She interviewed very well and she impressed all of the interviewers as a no nonsense go-getter," said Canton Police Chief James Santimaw.

"We are all excited to welcome her aboard as she rounds out the Canton Police Department back to full staff."

Trustee Beth Larrabee who sat on the hiring committee agreed.

"We are so excited. She is enthusiastic and is vested in the community. She will have a real positive impact in the Village of Canton," stated Larrabee at Wednesday's monthly village board meeting.

"She stood out. She has a little grit to her in a good way," Santimaw added. "She will do great."

LaRock will be attending the police academy at SUNY Potsdam beginning Aug. 10. Her probationary period ends upon graduating from the academy.

She is a graduate of Ogdensburg Free Academy and has been employed in one of the area banking institutions.

Norfolk celebrating centennial

NORFOLK – The town of Norfolk is about to celebrate its bicentennial, marking 200 years since incorporation, and Town Historian Theresa Dumas wants to share a part of that history.

As part of the anniversary, Dumas has been hard at work organizing displays in the museum, assisting on the bicentennial committee and creating displays that showcase the unique history of the town.

"There are a lot of things about the town that many people don't even know about. It's a very long history and many things have been forgotten or lost over the years," she said.

Norfolk's beginnings

A man named Gordon Smith first traveled through the area that now comprises Norfolk, in search of suitable sites for provision camps along the Raquette River. It was at this time he continued on foot to Potsdam, leaving behind the area he had considered settling in.

Shortly thereafter, timber thieves came to the area, cutting large pines along the

banks of the Raquette, floating them up the river to be taken to Montreal where they were used as masts for trans-Atlantic ships.

Norfolk as we know it today took years of exploration, negotiation and development to achieve.

First permanently settled in 1809 by Erastus Hall of Tyringham, Mass., Hall and a man named Ira Brewer explored along the Raquette at the insistence of Judge Raymond of Potsdam, in hopes of finding suitable settlements in what is now Louisville.

Hall built the oldest known house in what is now Raymondville in 1809,

Potsdam passes insurance policy for non-union employees

POTSDAM – A new insurance policy for non-union town retirees is in place, pay rates were approved for two summer help employees who joined town highway crew and an agreement between the school and town for busing to Postwood Park this summer has been dissolved.

The town board passed these resolutions at their July 11 meeting.

First the town board adopted a policy for health insurance for non-union town employees and elected officials after retirement.

According to the policy, non-union Town of Potsdam employees who have retired from the town after at least 15 years of full-time employment are entitled to have 50 percent of

their single health insurance premium paid by the town under the policy.

The benefit is in place until the retired employee is eligible for Medicare Insurance at age 65.

The board also approved the pay rates for two summer employees appointed by Highway Superintendent John Keleher for the Town Highway Department.

The board set remuneration for Carter Jerome, who started June 15, and Nick Bates, who started June 14, at \$16 per hour per provisions in the Truck Drivers and Workers Collective Bargaining Agreement.

Finally, the board rescinded an agreement between the town and Potsdam Central



Canton chamber merger approved

CANTON – Members of the Canton Chamber of Commerce overwhelmingly approved a merger with the St. Lawrence County Chamber of Commerce following voting on Monday and Tuesday.

The final tally was 36 to 6 in favor of the merger.

An information session was held on Monday, July 24, at the Canton VFW Post, 34 Gouverneur St. A membership vote meeting took place on Tuesday, July 25, at the Grasse River Heritage offices, 30 Court St., where the votes were tallied.

The affirmative vote meets the criteria to pass - 10 percent of the membership and two thirds voting in favor.

“Today’s vote of the Canton Chamber membership is a huge step toward the vision of an integrated Chamber in St. Lawrence County,” stated Ben Dixon, executive director of the County Chamber. “We are all excited to promote the Canton community and its businesses. In other words, good things are coming.”

All members were notified of the merger voter via a letter, either by post or email, explaining when and where to vote, background and rationale for the merger, benefits of having an integrated chamber, and what the merger with the county chamber means for Canton.

Members were also allowed to complete and mail or email a Proxy Authorization.

Per New York State Statute, at least 10% of the membership of a 501(c)(6) organization like the Canton Chamber was required to vote, and a 2/3 majority vote of those who vote was required for the merger to go through.

Both memberships of the Massena and Ogdensburg Chambers have approved the integration. The Potsdam Chamber has opted not to participate in the merger. The County Chamber will conduct a vote in late summer.

Some benefits identified with an integrated chamber include community-specific initiatives and community-dedicated staff; gains on operational efficiencies, cost savings, and shared services; increased capacity of staff for community-specific programming; and consolidated budget and financials but with reserved allocations and accounts for community-specific initiatives.

For Canton, the community would benefit from increased chamber programming while preserving its community identity and Chamber activity would build off the unique resources and assets of the community, the letter explains.

An Integrated Chamber would have locally focused staff; that individual would be a full-time employee of the Integrated Chamber and located in the Canton office full-time.

The employee would dedicate half their time specifically on Canton-specific programming, its business community, and chamber members in the Canton area.

Norfolk plans bicentennial celebration events

NORFOLK — After nearly two years of planning, the town of Norfolk is set to kick off bicentennial celebrations on Aug. 4.

Town Clerk Jill Molnar said the 11 member committee that organized the events are continuing to finish up preparations but noted that all events are just about ready to go.

“We have one last meeting on Thursday to finish our preparations and then we will be ready to go,” she said.

Theresa Dumas, town historian, was the ring leader behind the committee, brainstorming and organizing many events.

“Theresa did so much work. The committee as a whole did so much but Theresa really was the ringleader behind it all,” Molnar said.

A number of local non-profit organizations also played a key role in preparations, including the Hepburn Library of Norfolk, Norfolk Volunteer Rescue Squad, Norfolk American Legion and Norfolk Volunteer Fire Department.

“We can’t thank Laurel (Murphy) enough. She and her staff have done a lot to help us and Laurel herself created our brochures,” Molnar said.

Murphy serves as the director of the Hepburn Library of Norfolk.

Events planned throughout the weekend will largely be held at the Dominic Zappia Arena and the baseball field next to it, Molnar said.

“A lot of what is happening will take place there. There are other events downtown as well, including the parade and events at the library as well. We also will have events at Coach Tavern and the American Legion,” Molnar said.

For those with young children, many events will be available each day to entertain children of all ages.

A Kid’s Entrepreneurial Fair will be held at the library from 4-6 p.m. on Friday, Aug. 4, with opening ceremonies planned from 6-7 p.m. at the arena.

“The Norwood Brass Firemen will be playing at the opening ceremony, which is always a great show,” Molnar said.

A family friendly barn dance will also be held on Aug. 4, beginning at 7 p.m. at the arena as well, she said.

“That will be a family friendly dance, it should be a lot of fun with Playback playing,” she said.

Saturday will see events beginning with a town wide garage sale at 8 a.m. and the parade set to beginning at 9 a.m.

A vendor fair will also be held beginning at 10 a.m. at the arena, with multiple types of vendors set to attend.

Carnival rides, face painting, balloon animals and inflatables, along with food trucks are scheduled from 11 a.m. to 8 p.m. at the arena.

“It is sure to be a good time for everyone. We will have a lot going on each day, especially at the arena.

Fireworks will go off at 9 p.m. at the Raquette River Golf Course, with a rain date of Sunday night if weather does not allow.

On Sunday, closing ceremonies will be held with a breakfast planned from 8-11 a.m. at the American Legion and a raffle drawing and scavenger hunt set to follow right after.

“We’re very excited about how things have turned out and we hope everyone comes out and has a good time,” Molnar said.

nois, Elaine Creighton of Potsdam, Dennis and Christine Creighton of Miller Place, New York, Susan and Scott Quinell of Potsdam,

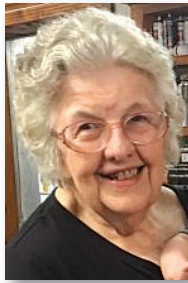

North Country Maple Sales and Service plans fall opening

COLTON — Local maple producers will soon have a local outlet for CDL USA Maple Sugaring Equipment gear and supplies.

Local syrup production company North Country Maple Sales and Service LLC plans to open the doors on a new store front at 239 Tucker Road sometime in November or December, after starting construction sometime in October, said one of the owners Micah Murray.

The new store will be run by Murray, his two uncles Corey Murray and Kyle Murray, and his stepfather Jason Hill, and will dovetail with their existing maple syrup business.

Maple producers looking for pipeline materials and other gear for their production needs will have local access to a full range of CDL USA Sugaring Equipment products the store will distribute, Murray told North Country This Week.

The Vermont-based company offers tubing, valves, fittings, tools, buckets, evaporators, spouts and other sugaring gear. North Country Maple Sales' new store front will be the go-to location for CDL equipment in the area.

"Right now we are able to sell CDL stuff, but we don't have a building yet," Murray told North Country This Week.

"This will be a one-stop shop in regard to sugaring supplies."

"There is a lot of potential for the area for distributing these supplies," said Murray.

Micah Murray said he and his partners had been in discussions with CDL to set up a distribution company for several months before inking the deal.

The new building will be 4,400 square feet with 2,400 feet of that a heated showroom with double glass doors, and the rest cold storage and warehouse space. The new building will be built in what is now a meadow off Tucker Road by Billy Bonno and his company Bonno Builders of Colton, Murray said.

Murray said the company will also offer service on all brands of sugaring equipment. The new store will have a small heated shop where customers will be able to bring in equipment for service, and will be handling some road calls.

"We are hoping to grow the maple economy in St. Lawrence County," Murray told North Country This Week.

St. Lawrence County legislators support Community Services initiatives

CANTON — St. Lawrence County Legislators took action on multiple resolutions for the Community Services Department during the services committee meeting on July 17.

Legislators approved the signing of a contract with Medicaid Managed Care organizations and commercial insurances for behavioral health provider services.

According to Community Services Director Jay Ullrich, the Community Services Department is in the process of updating and establishing new contracts with insurance providers that cover the North Country region, with nine total major insurance organizations that serve St. Lawrence County.

Those nine organizations are a mix of Medicare and Medicaid Managed Care Organizations, as well as private commercial payers, according to the resolution.

Throughout the contracting process, Community Services will receive consultation from EPOCH as part of the department's current agreement that was passed months ago.

In other action, legislators approved a resolution for the chair to sign a letter to Medicare as part of the credentialing process for the

opioid treatment program (OTP).

Community Services is currently in the process of updating credentialing with Medicare to include the OTP and as part of that process, the chair must provide an official letter stating the county will be legally responsible if any debt is owed to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS).

Legislators also approved the signing of a memorandum of understanding with Fort Drum Regional Health Planning (FDRH-PO) to participate in a health resources and services administration (HRSA) grant.

Fort Drum Regional Health Planning Organization received a four-year Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) grant, which began on July 1, 2023 and runs through June 30, 2027. The grant will assist FDRHPO as it works with the integrated rural health network in Jefferson, Lewis and St. Lawrence Counties.

The integrated network will administer whole person-centered care management for the North Country "through transitional care management after patients' discharges from inpatient or emergency department settings," according to the resolution.

The network also will assist in chronic pain management services where eligible, high risk, high

needs patients work with their care team "on comprehensive care planning to achieve patients' identified wellness goals, engage in preventative care," the resolution states.

Officials say with the network and St. Lawrence County's participation, identified care gaps can be closed, hospital readmissions can be reduced, telehealth resources will become more readily available and patient-centered care will be improved.

Patient care planning and increased collaboration between primary care and community providers is also expected to improve with the network and grant funding, officials say.

St. Lawrence County Community Services will receive \$80 per patient for providing transitional case management services and \$60 per patient for providing chronic care management services, officials say.

Total funding the department will receive will be based on the "number of individuals identified by FDRHPO over the four-year period of the grant who are eligible and in need of those specialized case management services," the resolution states.

All three resolutions now move to the full board for final approval in August.

Officials work on funding for \$13M repairs

CANTON — The village board put the finishing touches on sourcing funding for \$13.5 million in repair work at Canton's wastewater treatment facility.

At a special meeting Monday evening, board members completed Parts 2 and 3 of the State Environmental Quality Review, adopted a

bond resolution and inked an agreement with fiscal advisors.

The bond resolution authorizing the issuance of \$13.5 million in serial bonds to finance the cost of the construction of improvements to the treatment plant.

The project is currently on the state's Clean Water Intended Use Plant list where the project will be rated and ranked for potential funding levels.

"The bond was required to show intent to apply for a series of grants," said Mayor Michael Dalton.

The engineering firm of Barton and Loguidice will be addressing the funding options.

Work to be done includes patching or replacing the liner and repairs to piping. HandBond counsel will be the law firm Bond, Schoeneck & King, Syracuse.

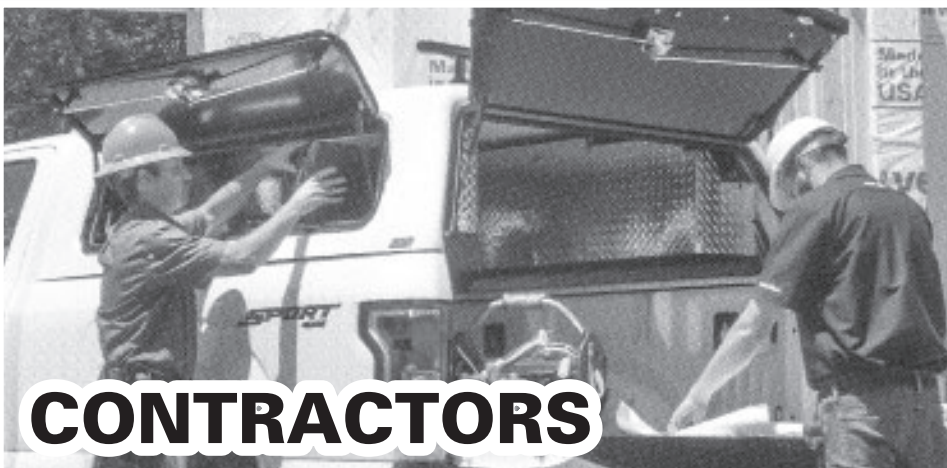
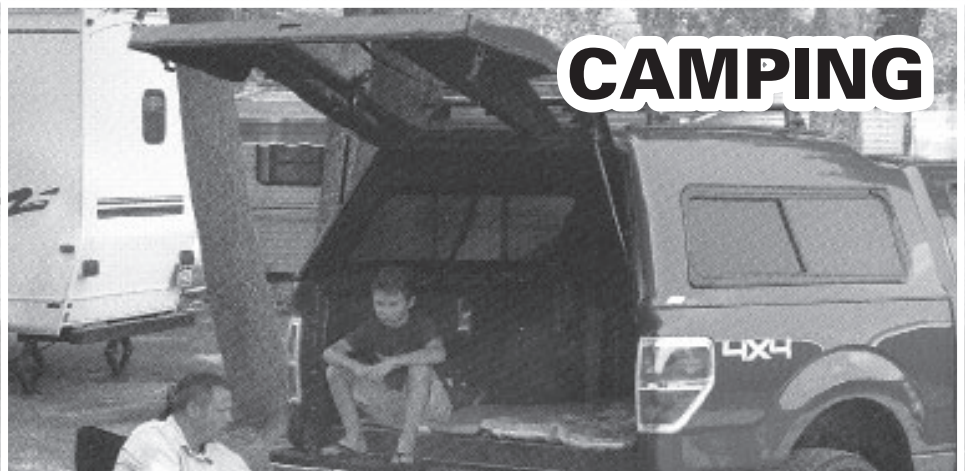

Former McDonald's demo set

CANTON — The demolition of the former downtown McDonald's restaurant is forthcoming as the Canton Town Council and Village of Canton Board of Trustees are seeking Requests for Proposals (RFPs) for the work.

Proposals must be submitted by 1 p.m. on Aug. 7. Bids will be opened in the Canton Municipal Building board room and read out loud.

Interested parties should submit proposals to Tim Bacon, Village Superintendent, 60 Main St., Canton, NY 13617. Additional information can be obtained by calling (315) 386-4700, ext. 207 or email supt@cantonny.us

The town and village boards agreed to purchase the property in July 2021 from the McDonald's Corporation of Delaware for \$295,000. Since then, environmental studies have been conducted with asbestos abatement included in the RFPs.

A main point in the purchase was

acquiring the adjacent parking lot to allow for potential future plans for the municipal building.

General considerations, as noted in a Legal Notice, state a performance bond of 100 percent of the project bid will be required at the time of the award; a notarized non-collusion bidding certificate must be included; and for a copy of the asbestos survey, contact Superintendent Bacon.

This RFP was authorized by both boards at a special meeting on May 4.

Along with demolition and asbestos abatement, the scope of services includes four contingencies:

The site contains materials that could be recycled, including metals and other materials. The successful bidder will own that material.

The bid should list as an option, the removal of the floor and foundation.

The bid should identify how asbestos will be handled.

The bid proposal needs to be valid for a minimum of 45 days.

Immunization awareness month

CANTON — St. Lawrence County legislators are proclaiming August as National Immunization Awareness Month.

Legislators passed a resolution acknowledging the proclamation during a services committee meeting on July 17.

The Public Health Department is observing National Immunization Awareness Month in an effort to raise awareness about the importance of vaccinations for people of all ages.

Officials say the Center for Disease Control recommends providing children with vaccines before their second birthday, saying it is the best way to protect children

against 14 serious and potentially deadly diseases.

Public Health officials also say vaccines are recommended for individuals "based on age, health conditions, job, lifestyle and travel habits."

Some childhood vaccines can also diminish in effectiveness over time, officials say.

As a result, adults should keep vaccinations up to date to help protect themselves and others, the resolution states.

Public Health officials also say it is important for pregnant women to receive vaccinations to protect themselves and to create protective antibodies that will be passed along to the baby as well, providing short-term protection.

The shed was reportedly not insured by the owner.

Potsdam Rescue provided standby at the scene, officials said.

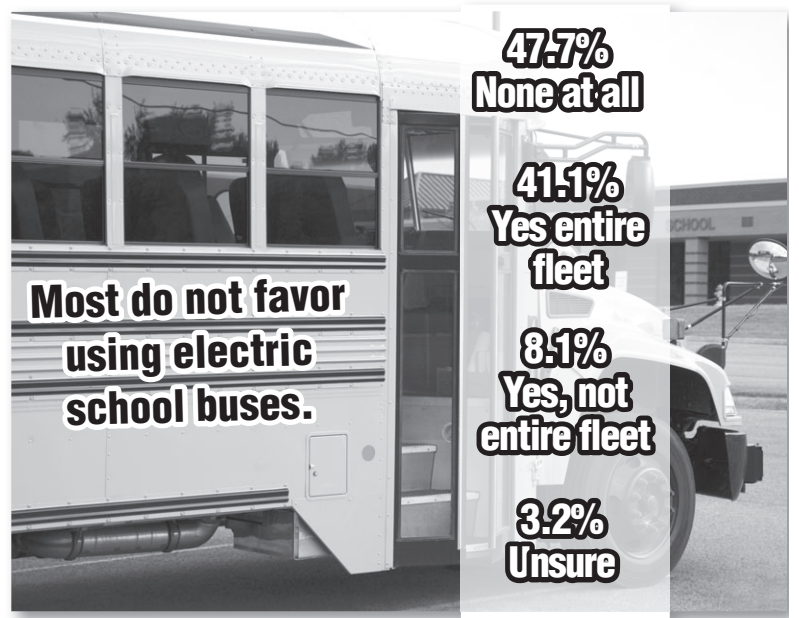

Canoe racers are artists on the water

Rip Friot canoe race taught me how little I know about paddling

A good friend of mine, who I don't get to spend enough time with, recently asked me to join him in the Rip Friot Canoe Race last weekend on the Oswegatchie River, which benefits the Frederic Remington Museum and is hosted by the St. Lawrence Valley Paddlers.

I've spent a lot of time in canoes over the years and have paddled many miles in a single day along the St. Lawrence River and Cranberry Lake. I've paddled canoes loaded with coolers and camping supplies well past recommended weight capacity short distances to campsites.

My old adventure canoe is beat up, built for neither speed nor comfort, but has served me well. It was a substantial upgrade from my previous canoe which had a sponge plugging a small hole and required a bit of bailing now and then.

When we arrived at the Rip Friot race, more than an hour early, I realized our only real goal would be to finish within the time allotted. I knew that wouldn't be easy since the current wouldn't be helping us thanks to a strong headwind.

As experienced paddlers were waxing their canoes, most of which looked like they probably weren't

bought second-hand for \$200, I was working on a playlist of music to listen to for the ride, which I knew at this point would not be leisurely.

The participants we talked to during the pre-race were friendly and many had traveled several hours just to compete in the race.

I knew there was a big difference between a canoe run and a canoe race, but what I didn't realize is just how bad at paddling I really was.

When we finally got on the water, we quickly fell behind as the experienced paddlers used their energy with grace and precision. We shoveled water with about as much grace as we'd shoveled manure on the farm in our youth.

We were fortunate enough to start in the recreation line, which gave us a solid headstart from some of the others.

But not long before we hit the portage around the dam, we were well behind even the second line of paddlers, though there was a rumor that perhaps one person was still behind us. I had a feeling the friendly gentleman who said that was just trying to make us feel better.

As the folks I can only describe as professionals passed us, we laughed and joked with them, some even offered advice.

There was a group in a four-person canoe who were so in sync it was like watching a machine. Their paddles hit the water in unison, their heads turned in unison and I don't think they wasted any oxygen or calories on anything but their goal.

We were quite mindful that we

were playing a different game than the others in the race at this point. We pushed on enjoying the music and the beautiful weather. We didn't push ourselves as hard as we could have, but we certainly were giving a solid 75%, which is still a lot over the course of a 10-mile paddle.

Despite our clear lack of paddling knowledge, improper equipment and any sort of real preparation we finished the race.

We were greeted by the friendly paddlers, who were well rested and recovered when we arrived. They clapped and celebrated our finish I'm sure as much as they did from everyone else.

As we packed up the canoe tired, sore and hungry, I couldn't help but be amazed by the skill and dedication of this community of paddlers. It's pretty amazing what they are able to do.

I probably won't enter another canoe race, out of respect for the sport, which I clearly have no business being in. But I'm glad we tried it. I learned that there is truly an art to paddling.

Supreme Court really out of control

On June 30th, a letter from Murray Armstrong argued that the Supreme Court was "out of control" and that it should be packed with four more seats "to restore ideological balance." Mr. Armstrong pointed to the numerous ethical debacles surrounding right-wing justices, and to the Court's newfound eagerness to ignore precedent to promote right-wing policies on issues from abortion to affirmative action to environmental protection.

In last week's paper, a letter from "J. Neil Devine, Esq." disagrees. He seems to argue that Mr. Armstrong was never taught about the Constitution in history or civics classes, though the grammar in his insult makes it difficult to tell. To support his disagreement, Mr. Devine, Esq. does nothing but claim that he is "an elder legal advisor (Ret)" and make middle-school level assertions about the separation of powers in America. He then accuses Mr. Armstrong of having a "quick and undocumented opinion."

I don't know what an "elder legal advisor (Ret)" is, but I am a retired attorney. I find Mr. Armstrong's arguments far more persuasive.

What little support Mr. Devine, Esq. presents for his opinion is an empty façade. He makes the simplistic point that the Judicial Branch is to ensure "the other two branches are acting in accord with the Constitution, and must and should always be free of political party influence."

But what does it mean to "act in accord with the Constitution"? In 1973, the Supreme Court ruled that abortion access was a right enshrined in the Constitution, so

a state's law banning abortion was not "in accord with the Constitution."

In 2022, the Supreme Court ruled the exact opposite.

Are abortion rights "in accord with the Constitution" or not?

It depends on your politics and, far more importantly, on the politics of the Supreme Court Justices.

For four years, Republican politicians packed the court to get a 6-3 majority. They fabricated a rule in 2016 to prevent then-President Obama from appointing Merrick Garland to the Court, appointed a Republican instead, and then shredded that very same rule in 2020 to ram Amy Coney Barrett's confirmation through in record time before they lost the White House. The Justices they chose were appointed precisely because they would overturn Roe v. Wade.

The Supreme Court is political, and it is now legislating for all right-wing causes, not just abortion. Where a case's facts present obstacles to that goal, the Court ignores them (303 Creative) or makes them up (Kennedy v. Bremerton School District).

But conservatives are eager to ignore this reality because they like how it's going.

Trust me. I'm a retired attorney.

More than meets the eye

Sean Myers defended Murray Armstrong's contention that the Supreme Court is "out of control". Mr. Myers stated;

"In 1973, the Supreme Court ruled that abortion access was a right enshrined in the Constitution, so a state's law banning abortion was not "in accord with the Constitution."

Nowhere in the Constitution is the term "Abortion access" specifically stated as a "right". The Roe

vs. Wade decision was based on a tenuous interpretation of a violation of a citizen's right to privacy based on Section One of the 14th amendment, not abortion itself. Ruth Ginsberg, an ardent liberal judge and feminist icon, did not think privacy was a viable reason for establishing abortion rights. Ginsberg believed the matter should have been framed as one of equal protection under the law rather than a case of privacy. She thought Roe vs. Wade decision was hastily made and would polarize the nation. She was correct.

The Court's decision never established abortion as an unlimited civil right. It allowed government to regulate or restrict abortion access based on the stage of pregnancy. As it is, six states, and Washington, D.C., do not impose any term restrictions abortion, allowing a baby to be terminated in the ninth month of pregnancy.

Norma McCorvey, AKA "Jane Roe", had lived a long troubled life of bad choices before the decision. She lied being gang raped to justify having an abortion. She admitted after the decision was passed that she had an unplanned pregnancy instead. The Roe vs. Wade case was founded on a fabrication that should have resulted in the case thrown out prior to the vote. Ironically, Ms. McCorvey later became a Roman Catholic, a Pro-life advocate, and sought to have Roe vs. Wade overturned.

Mr. Myers wrote: "The Supreme Court is political, and it is now legislating for all right-wing causes, not just abortion."

One can say the same concerning the infamous 1857 Dredd Scott decision, of whom 7 of the 9 judges were Democrats ruled that citizenship and constitutional rights did not extend to those of Black descent.

Political liberal support of Roe vs. Wade resulted in Black women leading the nation with the greatest number of abortions, freezing the Black community at 13% of the US population for decades. Coincidence? I think not. Margret Sanger would have been pleased that Roe vs. Wade legalized her racist agenda to prevent the growth of minorities.

I'm not a legal expert. Only an ordinary citizen whose research discovered there is more to the issue than meets the eye.

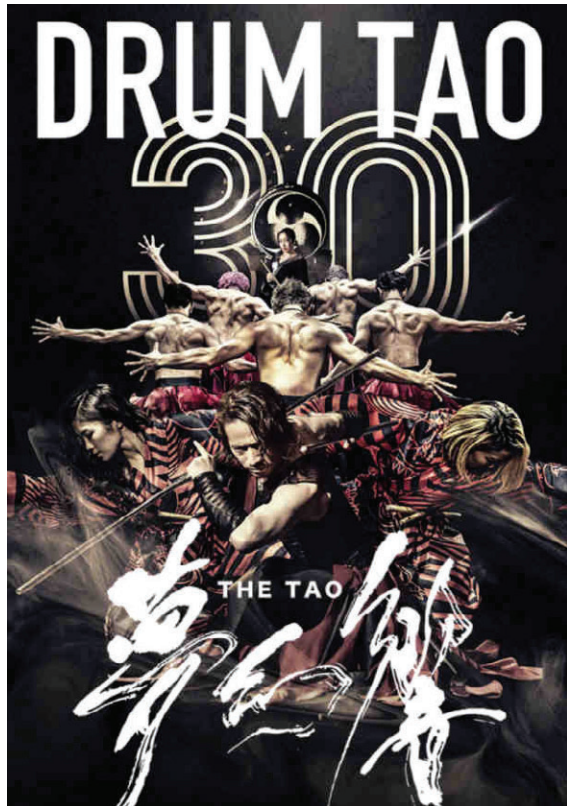

spending the first winter there in 1810 when he returned from Massachusetts with his family.

As the town began to develop, sawmills were established to supply the critically needed lumber for homes and businesses.

A dam was built in 1812 to harness the power of the Raquette for a grist mill.

Bridges were established and more dams were built in the coming years, making Raymondville and Norfolk a hub of manufacturing at the time.

“Norfolk grew quickly once industry came here. A lot of families settled in and around the area to work at the saw mills, grist mill and other businesses,” Dumas said.

A brick yard was soon established too to aid in the construction efforts and to build homes.

Trade came to the area too, with potash, also known as black salt, being a major source of income for many settlers.

By the 1840’s, Norfolk grew large enough that multiple grist mills, brick yards and post offices were built, leading to the railroad cutting through townie the 1850’s.

Tanneries soon followed in the

1860’s and quarrying of abundant limestone began in earnest in the 1870’s.

Norfolk modernizes

By the early 1900’s, Norfolk began to leave behind it’s frontier image and became a self-sufficient township with a population of roughly 2,000 people.

By this time, the town boasted multiple lumber yards, brick yards, general stores, a drug store, post office, a hub factory, a furniture store, tailor shop, quarry and many other industrial businesses.

“Norfolk expanded pretty quickly at that point and was known for industry,” Dumas said.

The borders of the town were also well established at this point, after many dealings that incorporated Raymondville but also saw some land given back to Stockholm and Louisville over the years.

The Norfolk paper mill was also built around this time, in 1901-02, becoming a staple of the town.

At the time of construction, one machine had a 150 inch width, making it the largest in the world for paper production.

“A lot stayed the same during that time, businesses came and went but everything remained about the

same,” Dumas said.

One thing that was out of the norm was a murder in Norfolk that was the result of a love triangle.

“The bartender was actually the one who figured it out, it was strychnine poisoning. The bartender saw a film on the glass used and figured out that one of the men involved had laced the glass with poison,” Dumas said.

That story made national news, with an extensive publication in Master Detective in the July 1944 edition. The story of Joe Jessmer and Florence Dowe is one that stands out in the history of Norfolk, Dumas said.

Rail service came and went, the post office moved multiple times and industry was developed time and time again. In 1937, water works projects were undertaken downtown, then a major step in modernization. More change came to the town through the 1940’s and 1950’s, following World War Two and during the creation of the St. Lawrence Seaway.

The need for crushed stone and sand for the project led to a boom in quarrying in the town, which also led to a population jump to over 5,000 residents. Following the conclusion of the project, population decline began to show and many local industrial manufacturers began to shutter or downsize significantly.

“We saw the closing of the movie theater in the 1960’s, which was

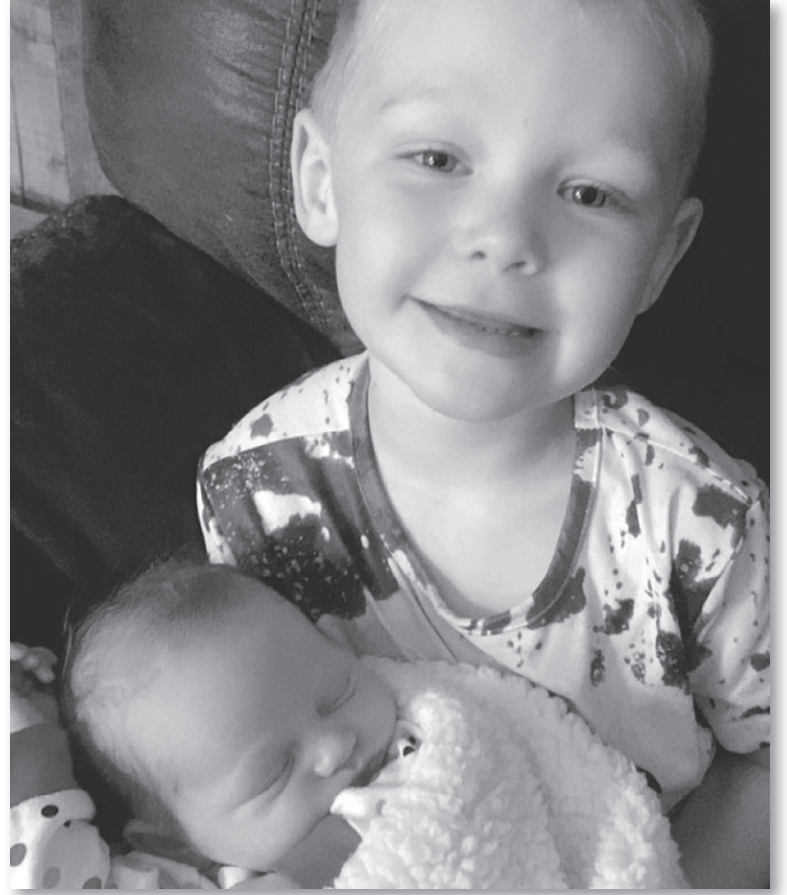

right on Main Street. A lot of people began to take jobs in surrounding

towns as things slowly changed,” Dumas said.

By the 1970’s, Norfolk became a largely residential town that depended on some industry and educational institutions in the surrounding towns for primary means of employment.

The future of Norfolk

But it’s not all doom and gloom. Though the bicentennial celebration will look back at the town’s history, Dumas said there is a lot happening in the town.

Visitors and check out the museum exhibits on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m.

A winery is also available on Main Street, along with an ice cream stand. Two super markets are available for groceries, along with a butcher at Smith’s Market-place.

Folks looking for take out can also purchase pizza and subs at Smith’s Pizzeria or can dine in at Sabad’s restaurant almost any night of the week.

“A lot of folks have been putting a lot of time and effort into Norfolk in recent years, from businesses to community groups,” Dumas said.

Though she plans to retire on Aug. 8 after serving as historian for the last five years, Dumas said she intends to still assist where she can and will look after a pet project she developed years ago to send cards to those unable to get out of their homes often.

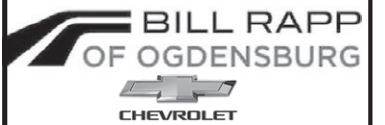

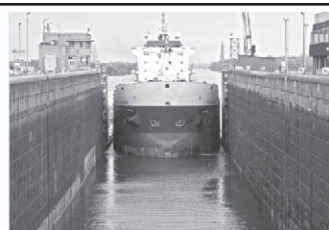

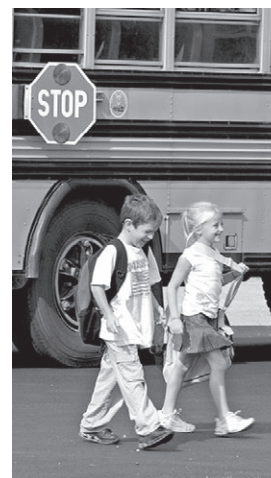
