Registry for landlords in Massena

MASSENA - Massena village trustees are considering the creation of a registry of landlords and rented properties in light of a fire in an apartment building that claimed three lives last month.

According to Trustee Ken McGowan, the move would make it much easier and safer for fire department members who are responding to a fire, while also assisting the code enforcement office handle any complaints they may receive.

"I think it's a great idea. It's very challenging to get a hold of some of these out of town landlords," Code Enforcement Officer Aaron Hardy told trustees.

If the registry were created, Hardy said it would make it easier for his office to have yearly communications with landlords. In the event of an emergency, the code office would also have a primary point of contact to handle such situations as well.

Hardy also told trustees that the fire department already carries out yearly inspections of businesses, through which his department has been able to gather a great deal of information including building owners, business owners and their contact information.

Ogdensburg fails to name new councilor

OGDENSBURG - After 20 consecutive votes and one candidate withdrawing his name in the interest of time, Ogdensburg still has only six members on council.

Ogdensburg City Council was set to name one of three candidates to fill a vacancy on city council.

The candidates were put forward by the vacancy committee and included Michael Weaver, Michael Tooley and Robert

The council eliminated Michael Weaver and then in secret ballot eight times, voted 3-3 votes for Tooley and Edie.

After concerns raised regarding open meetings law by Councilor John Rishe, votes were then cast publicly.

Mayor Jeffrey M. Skelly, Deputy Mayor Steven Fisher and Councilor Bill Dillabough voted for Edie, while councilors Rishe, Michael Powers and Dan Skamperle voted for Tooley for an additional 12 votes for a total of 20 votes.

Supporters of Tooley said they were voting for him, because he was essentially guaranteed a spot on council as he was running unopposed and that it would be beneficial to have him involved in the budgeting process.

Supporters of Edie noted that he had run in previous elections and secured a large number of votes. They said Edie had put in the work and deserved the appointment.

Edie, who was present at the meeting, asked that he be removed from the process in the interest of moving things

He received praise from Councilors Rishe, Skamperle and

Retirees raise concerns over insurance changes

MASSENA — Town board members say they want to contact the entire list of town retirees who will be affected by a change in health insurance coverage but many retirees say they want the change completed now.

Over a dozen retirees were in attendance at a recent town board meeting, voicing their displeasure with the process to board members.

As it stands, town board officials say they are waiting on Zachary Zuckerman to contact the entire list of retirees to inform them of the policy change.

Zuckerman is a group benefits consultant at USI Insurance Services who is assisting the town with the change.

"I don't know why we have to keep waiting

until you contact every single individual. I think the board should be able to move ahead," Georgette Davis told board members.

Davis is one of the retirees who will be affected by the change.

According to Town Supervisor Sue Bellor, eight retirees still need to be contacted, however she is unaware if any effort has been made because Zuckerman has not responded to an email sent earlier this month by Bellor.

Regardless of when the plan will be voted on and approved, Bellor told retirees the change would not go into effect until mid-October.

Bellor said she wants to ensure every retiree is afforded the opportunity to speak with Zuckerman to ask questions about the policy and to

Convicted neck shooter on the lam

CANTON - A Canton man is on the lam after skipping his sentencing for the crime of shooting a female victim in the neck in March of 2022.

Shawn Sheridan, 8 Mechanic St., Canton, was charged with first-degree assault and second-degree criminal possession of a weapon.

Sheridan pled guilty to the first-degree assault charge, but failed to show up at his July 18 sentencing.

Despite his failure to appear, the judge sentenced Sheridan to 12.5 years in prison and issued a warrant for his arrest.

St. Lawrence County District Attorney Gary Pasqua said Sheridan had already had a warrant out for failing to abide by terms of his supervised bail release.

Pasqua said that he believes the sentencing is appropriate. He said he had several conversations with the victim who was hoping Sheridan would be sentenced to at least 10 vears.

He said the plea agreement saved

the victim from having to relive the trauma in the courtroom

Pasqua said Sheridan has proven himself dangerous, but he's uncertain if he poses any immediate danger to the public. However, he expressed concerns that he could pose a serious threat to officers or deputies attempting to apprehend

"We believe him to be a dangerous individual based on his conduct and what he was convicted of, but I don't know at this point if he is a danger to anyone aside from law enforcement,"

Pasqua is urging anyone with information regarding Sheridan's whereabouts to contact the St. Lawrence County Sheriff's Department at 315-379-2222.

"We have an individual who has shown a propensity for violence. We want to see that he's brought in as quickly and peacefully as possible,"

St. Lawrence County Undersheriff Sean O'Brien confirmed that a warrant was issued for Sheridan's arrest and that law enforcement is working

to locate him.

The crime

On the morning of March 9 2022, at approximately 1:42 a.m., St. Lawrence County Sheriff's Deputies responded to a reported domestic incident at 49 South Woods Road in Rossie.

Upon their arrival, it was determined that a victim had been shot in the neck during the reported domestic incident.

The victim sustained serious injuries and was transported by Medivac to Upstate Hospital in Syracuse for treatment

Over the initial course of this incident, Deputy Sheriff Matthew Merria arrested Sheridan, who was armed with a long gun and a knife, by himself, reports the sheriff's

Deputy Merria also had an intern riding with him at the time of this call, and they were both able to render aid to the female victim until rescue could respond to the scene.

The St. Lawrence County Sheriff's office has issued a warrant for his

Facing drug charges

MASSENA - Massena police have charged a Massena woman with multiple felonies stemming from a sealed indictment warrant following an investigation.

According to police, Alisha M. Crump, 38, was charged with two counts of third-degree criminal possession of a controlled substance: narcotic intent to sell (B Felony) and two counts of third-degree criminal sale of a controlled substance: narcotic (B Felony).

Crump was transported to St. Lawrence County Correctional Facility to be arraigned in St. Lawrence County Court at a later date.

Facing 46 years to life for raping child multiple times

CANTON - A Lisbon man is now facing 46 years to life in state prison after a St. Lawrence County jury handed down a guilty verdict on Friday.

Douglas M. Monroe, 37, of Lisbon, was found guilty following a week-long trial on charges of predatory sexual assault upon a child, first-degree sexual abuse, and two counts of second-degree rape.

Evidence at trial established that between 2020 and 2022, the defendant committed multiple acts of rape and sexual abuse against a child, according to St. Lawrence County District Attorney Gary M. Pasqua.

The defendant is scheduled to be sentenced on Sept. 25.

"Thanks to the fortitude and bravery of the young survivor, the horrific acts of this defendant have been brought to light and he now faces the justice he deserves. I want to commend the courage of the victim that came forward in this case. My office will continue to be dedicated to the prosecution of these cases and will continue to strive to help bring justice to child victims of sexual abuse," Pasqua said.

D.A. Pasqua commends Assistant District Attorney Matthew Peabody and Assistant District Attorney Dominik Maida for their hard work and dedication to ensuring justice for the survivor of these crimes. Pasqua also thanked the St. Lawrence County Sheriff's Office and the U.S. Department of Homeland Security for their assistance with the prosecution.

City to help with grant for waterfront rehab project

OGDENSBURG - City Council will help At the Docks, LLC apply for a \$500,000 grant to renovate historic stone mill buildings on the city's waterfront.

At the Docks, LLC is owned by Chris Frary who also owns the Corner Deli, Tiki Bar and the At the Docks Marina.

The buildings are located on River Street near the former Ramada Inn, which is also owned by Frary.

At a special meeting Monday, council endorsed a plan to seek a Consolidated Funding Application under the New York Main Street Downtown Anchor program.

The application proposes funding to assist property owners to renovate façade masonry, replace the roofs, and complete interior renovations to the historic stone mill buildings for residential and commercial reuse at 119 W. River Street.

Lock, shipping canal closed to recreation

MASSENA – The Great Lakes St. Lawrence Seaway Development Corporation (GLS) has issued a reminder that government property surrounding and including GLS lock facilities and the shipping canal in Massena is closed to the public for outdoor recreational use such as swimming, fishing, camping, and hunting activities.

The North Overlook Parking Lot is open to the public for viewing ships transiting Eisenhower Lock during the 2023 navigation season. It is approximately located at 190B Barnhart Island Road, Massena.

There are numerous locations in the Massena area open to the public for fishing and outdoor recreation, including on the St. Lawrence River, the Grasse River, and the Raquette

The proposed funding will contribute to ongoing community revitalization efforts, a resolution from the city said.

The grant application required city approval.

Ogdensburg businesses were hit particularly hard by the pandemic due to the proximity of the Ogdensburg International Bridge.

The majority of Canadian traffic had been all but halted due to COVID restrictions.

Despite the challenges development on River Street has fared well.

In March, Ogdensburg City Council approved the sale of a portion of 17 Main Street to William Hosmer, owner of Homer's Marina and Smuggler's Cafe.

The brewery was being developed under River Street Brewing Company LLC. Hosmer is also seeking approval to put up an ice cream

Meanwhile, At the Docks LLC has expressed interest in another portion of the 17 Main Street loca-

Also located in the city's marina district is the former cheese plant, which the city recently secured funding to demolish.

Shareholders approve sale of Arconic hedge fund Apollo Global Management

MASSENA - Shareholders have approved the sale of Arconic to hedge fund Apollo Global Management,

Apollo Global Management, Inc. provides asset management services. According to the Wall Street Journal, Apollo "offers its clients excess return at every point along the risk-reward spectrum from investment grade to private equity with a focus on three business strategies: yield, hybrid, and equity." The company was founded by Marc Rowan in 1990 and is headquartered in New York, NY.

Shareholders approved the sale with 99% of shareholders voting to approve the merger.

In a press release issued by Arconic on July 25, officials say the vote took place during a special meeting on June 12.

"This transaction represents a realization of value for Arconic shareholders at a meaningful premium and enables the Company to execute its long-term strategic vision. We are pleased to reach this agreement with Apollo," Chairman of the Arconic Board of Directors Fritz Henderson said.

The deal was first announced on May 4, with an approximate sale value of \$5.2 billion.

The transaction, which will be an all cash sale, includes minority investment from funds managed by Irenic Capital Management, officials say.

Strategic investment in infrastructure like

machinery is expected with the completion of the sale, with hopes of maximizing the full potential of the company's "unique production capabilities,"

Upgrades are expected to bring the facilities and processes up to state-of-the-art standards, with investment also expected in cleaner processes to benefit local communities, according to officials.

There has been no word on how the Massena plant will be affected, if at all, with the sale now expected to go through.

A total of 125 employees are currently employed by Arconic in Massena.

The sale comes a year after United Steelworkers members approved a four-year contract that runs through May 15, 2026.

'We have been assured that the contract will remain in place. All of the negotiated benefits will continue, with no changes," United Steelworkers Local 420-A President Mark Goodfellow said.

Alcoa will be unaffected by the sale with Arconic having split from Aloca previously. Alcoa currently has a seven-year contract that will ensure operations continue in Massena until at least 2026.

With the split from Alcoa in 2016, Arconic became a second, publicly traded company, with primary focuses on engineered products for the automotive and aerospace industries.

Arconic officials say the sale should be completed in the third quarter of 2023, making Arconic a pri-

Winthrop equipment rental expands

Trustees also took action to board up a number of properties on Sycamore Street and at the corner of Sycamore St. and Woodlawn Ave.

Hardy said in those cases, the code enforcement department has reached out to landlords without any success.

"We've reached out to one owner multiple times and haven't been able to make contact since the first week of COVID, so you're talking about the first or second week of

March 2020," he told trustees. Those properties are all in des-

perate need of repair, he said. In many cases, power and water have been shut off to the buildings and vagrants have inhabited the spaces, making it difficult for the village to take proper action.

Hardy said members of his department would be going over to secure the properties in the next week or so.

"Please, make sure you contact the police department and have an officer with your staff. We want to make sure no one gets hurt," Mayor Greg Paquin suggested to Hardy.

"We already planned on it. We're going to take every precaution when we do," he said.

Paquin also spoke to the registry, saying it was time to take action to create one but said he would allow the code enforcement office to take the lead on the initiative.

Though village officials seem poised to take action, McGowan said it would not be an easy process, noting there were "a bunch of concerns we have to figure out."

No fee is expected for landlords to be listed, however officials did say they would make a requirement that the code enforcement office have information regarding the buildings.

"If you own a bunch of apartments on Sycamore, we need

to know who you are. The fire department needs to know who the contacts are, who the tenants are," McGowan said.

More than one hour into the meeting and with just one candidate left, a resolution was brought forward to appoint Tooley to council, but Skelly and Fisher abstained from the vote, and Dillabough voted

Councilors Powers, Skamperle and Rishe voted in favor of the appointment, but since there was no quorum he was not officially appointed.

That led to legal questions, regarding whether or not Tooley had in fact been appointed.

There was a request for legal review made by councilors, but there did not appear to be consensus for the appointment or the review.

During public comment, Tooley explained that while he did not run in the last election, that it was due to work commitments and a lack of time, but now retired, he has chosen to seek the position.

RETIREES...

"As far as I know we've had no negatives in regards to this," Deputy Town Supervisor Pat Facteau told attendees.

Bellor said another concern is that some people covered by the policy may lose prescription coverage if they change their plan.

Facteau then suggested putting the policy change to a vote at the next meeting in August, saying that to delay to vote could push things to "the eleventh hour," a situation both he and Board Member Francis Carvel say they want to avoid.

"I think we have to move with this in a reasonable amount of time. The next board meeting would be reasonable," Carvel said.

"I don't see where the waiting is going to do us any good. We've waited long enough. It's always nice to not wait until the 11th hour. If you get it a couple months early, it allows everybody a lot more time for the plan to contact these people."

Bellor said she didn't feel it was fair to those who have not yet been contacted, saying a vote right now

was not necessary. But Davis said she disagreed and wanted a vote soon because "many retirees go south for the winter," with some leaving as early as October or November. Despite opposing the idea of a vote in August, Bellor asked Facteau to push Zuckerman to make contact with the remaining retirees so a vote could be had.

"We just want to have a conversation with each person. I think that's fair to each individual," she said.

Carvel suggested that a vote would be more than fair now, since the majority of those affected by the change have already been contacted and voiced support for the policy.

Facteau agreed, saying they have done the best they can to make contact and the majority have agreed to the change.

Another retiree, Nancy Fregoe, also voiced concern over a delayed vote. Fregoe addressed the board, saying a letter they received previously essentially told retirees the decision was made already and they could "come and listen to the program" at a previous presentation from Zuckerman and board members. Bellor refuted the idea, saying the letter told retirees what plan was proposed and that input was requested before any final authorization would be given.

"It didn't sound like it, it said come to the meeting because we're going to explain your new insurance. Had we all not showed up en masse, it was going to get voted on. That's why we actually come to the meetings. It sounds like it would have gotten approved if we hadn't been here, and now you want to contact every single person," Fregoe said.

Bellor took a moment to reiterate her concern that some retirees might lose prescription drug insurance and should be afforded an opportunity to speak with Zuckerman. The town of Massena is part of the Broome County Healthcare Alliance, a plan that sees major medical bills paid in full with zero co-payments required by members.

As part of the plan, insurance plans are negotiated as a consortium to save money for municipalities and enrollees alike.

Under the plan, prescription drugs have a co-payment of \$0, while preferred brand name drugs have a \$5 co-payment and non-preferred brand name drugs have a \$20 co-payment.

A good friend of mine, who I don't get to spend enough time with, recently asked me to join him in the Rip Friot Canoe Race last weekend on the Oswegatchie River, which benefits the Frederic Remington Museum and is hosted by the St. Lawrence Valley Paddlers.

I've spent a lot of time in canoes over the years and have paddled many miles in a single day along the St. Lawrence River and Cranberry Lake. I've paddled canoes loaded with coolers and camping supplies well past recommended weight capacity short distances to campsites.

My old adventure canoe is beat up, built for neither speed nor comfort, but has served me well. It was a substantial upgrade from my previous canoe which had a sponge plugging a small hole and required a bit of bailing now and then.

When we arrived at the Rip Friot race, more than an hour early, I realized our only real goal would be to finish within the time allotted. I knew that wouldn't be easy since the current wouldn't be helping us thanks to a strong headwind.

As experienced paddlers were waxing their canoes, most of which looked like they probably weren't bought second-hand for \$200, I was working on a playlist of music to listen to for the ride, which I knew at this point would not be leisurely.

The participants we talked to during the pre-race were friendly and many had traveled several hours just to compete in the race.

I knew there was a big difference between a canoe run and a canoe race, but what I didn't realize is just how bad at paddling I really was.

When we finally got on the water, we quickly fell behind as the experienced paddlers used their energy with grace and precision. We shoveled water with about as much grace as we'd shoveled manure on the farm in our youth.

We were fortunate enough to start in the recreation line, which gave us a solid headstart from some of the others.

But not long before we hit the portage around the dam, we were well behind even the second line of paddlers, though there was a rumor that perhaps one person was still behind us. I had a feeling the friendly gentleman who said that was just trying to make us feel

better.

As the folks I can only describe as professionals passed us, we laughed and joked with them, some even offered advice.

There was a group in a four-person canoe who were so in sync it was like watching a machine. Their paddles hit the water in unison, their heads turned in unison and I don't think they wasted any oxygen or calories on anything but their goal.

We were quite mindful that we were playing a different game than the others in the race at this point. We pushed on enjoying the music and the beautiful weather. We didn't push ourselves as hard as we could have, but we certainly were giving a solid 75%, which is still a lot over the course of a 10-mile paddle.

Despite our clear lack of paddling knowledge, improper equipment and any sort of real preparation we ahad tha maaa

We were greeted by the friendly paddlers, who were well rested and recovered when we arrived. They clapped and celebrated our finish I'm sure as much as they did from everyone else.

As we packed up the canoe tired, sore and hungry, I couldn't help but be amazed by the skill and dedication of this community of paddlers. It's pretty amazing what they are able to do.

I probably won't enter another canoe race, out of respect for the sport, which I clearly have no business being in. But I'm glad we tried it. I learned that there is truly an art to paddling. I also learned that I'm more of a "canoe run" guy than a "canoe race" guy.

'Green initiatives could bring jobs, prosperity, and cleaner living to an impoverished area. Fear of change will stifle that. It's really sad.

'Gas is bad for the environment. Also the fumes are bad for children and adolescents.'."

More than meets the eye

Sean Myers defended Murray Armstrong's contention that the Supreme Court is "out of control". Mr. Myers stated;

"In 1973, the Supreme Court ruled that abortion access was a right enshrined in the Constitution, so a state's law banning abortion was not "in accord with the Constitution.'

Nowhere in the Constitution is the term "Abortion access" specifically stated as a "right". The Roe vs. Wade decision was based on a tenuous interpretation of a violation of a citizen's right to privacy based on Section One of the 14th amendment, not abortion itself. Ruth Ginsberg, an ardent liberal judge and feminist icon, did not think privacy was a viable reason for establishing abortion rights. Ginsberg believed the matter should have been framed as one of equal protection under the law rather than a case of privacy. She thought Roe vs. Wade decision was hastily made and would polarize the nation. She was correct.

The Court's decision never established abortion as an unlimited civil right. It allowed government to regulate or restrict abortion access based on the stage of Washington, D.C., do not impose any term restrictions abortion, allowing a baby to be terminated

admitted after the decision was passed that she had an unplanned pregnancy instead. The Roe vs.

Wade case was founded on a fabrication that should have resulted in the case thrown out prior to the vote. Ironically, Ms. McCorvey later became a Roman Catholic, a Pro-life advocate, and sought to have Roe vs. Wade overturned.

Mr. Myers wrote: "The Supreme Court is political, and it is now legislating for all right-wing causes, not just abortion."



MADRID - Fort Tribute will host its annual Civil War Weekend, July 29-30, Saturday 9 am – 5 p.m. and Sunday 9 a.m.-1 p.m.

The event will be held on the grounds of the St. Lawrence Power & Equipment Museum and co-hosted by the St. Lawrence County Historical Association.

Visitors will be able to attend talks on a variety of topics, including the "Care of the Wounded."

Both Union and Confederate field hospitals will be set up providing information on how soldiers who were wounded were cared for in the field.

Visitors will also be able to experience camp life, firing demonstrations of artillery and muskets, blacksmithing on a traveling forge, period cooking, field medical techniques, blacksmithing, lectures on Women's Fashion in the 1860's, a first impression on Mary Todd Lincoln by a living historian and battle skirmishes both days.

The Fort and other buildings on the Museum grounds of the time period will be open to tours, including the school house, log cabin and blacksmith shop.

Troops from all across New York, Pennsylvania, Michigan, Vermont and Canada, portraying both Union and Confederate infantry, artillery, medical and cavalry will provide spectators a glimpse into the past as they darn varying types of uniforms and equipment soldiers had used.

Fort Tribute is the home to the only monument dedicated to the Congressional Medal of Honor recipients from St. Lawrence County.


