Compost misuse could end service

CANTON - Misuse of the village composting site has put that service in jeopardy.

At a joint board meeting Wednesday, both town and village leaders voiced their displeasure with the composting situation, reporting that improper and negligent practices at the com-

posting site on the hill off Lincoln Street have become costly and unfairly cumbersome for village Department of **Public Works** employees.

"The trouble now is where to take it. We are not happy with this problem," stated Mayor Michael Dalton.

He noted that people are not putting the shavings

Murderer faces 22 to life

Howell offered kindness in her final moments

POTSDAM — In her final moments on Feb. 18 of 2022, Elizabeth Howell offered help to the man who beckoned her to his vehicle feigning a need for directions.

Michael Snow, her murderer, repaid her kindness with three shots from a .22 caliber "ghost gun" he says he purchased

In the courtroom Howell was described as a helper who cared for other people. She fought for her peers and worked to save other lives as a lifeguard for a time, according to her family.

and had performed with the Crane Symphony Orchestra and the Crane Chamber Orchestra.

She was a cellist and regarded as a "star" student who was working toward her goal of being a music educator.

Snow took that dream away from her and robbed future generations of a teacher who would likely have touched many lives during her career.

That reality was expressed in an impact statement her family submitted to be read by District Attorney Gary Pasqua at Snow's sentencing on Friday.

Snow's killing of Howell took more than her life.

"He took our lives as we know them," her family said in the statement.

Her family said that while Snow will be

Potsdam Co-op finances improving

POTSDAM — The Potsdam Food Co-op has turned a corner away from the financial difficulties reported by the board earlier this year.

In a message to its over 1,300 members Friday, July 28, interim manager Jesse LaRose said the store has logged a profitable second quarter, the bills are now manageable and some needed repairs on the store on Elm Street have started.

"As most of you are probably aware, the Co-op suffered severe financial losses following the pandemic. Our situation had become pretty dire at the start

of this year," LaRose said to the membership. "When I took over as Interim, there was no shortage of difficult decisions that had

to be made to ensure the Co-op could continue to operate responsibly. We were struggling to pay bills, the staff was exhausted in every way imaginable, our current building was in desperate need of repairs, and all of us were faced with the reality that we were not immune to the effect that the pandemic had on businesses."

LaRose said, however, that the store has been profitable in all three months of the second quarter — April, May, June.

She also said that the co-op has received a large tax refund in July from the Employee Retention Tax Credit for retaining employees during the pandemic. That refund

Potsdam Neighborhood Center fills an important community need

POTSDAM -- The Potsdam Neighborhood Center is an outreach program of the St. Lawrence County Community Development Program (CDP), providing food, clothing, housing assistance and many other services to families in need.

CDP's mission is to encourage and assist low-income individuals and families to obtain self-reliance, dignity, and self-sufficiency through education, guidance, and services. CDP has been effectively serving all communities of St. Lawrence County since 1966.

CDP was incorporated in 1965 as a not-for-profit community action agency and operates six Neighborhood Centers in Potsdam, Canton, Ogdensburg, Massena, Gouverneur and Colton/Parishville/Pierrepont. All centers offer a variety of services, some standard and some unique to each center.

Increase in utilization

With the end of the pandemic, some government stimulus support has ended, including supplemental SNAP benefits, formerly known as food stamps.

This has led to a significant increase recently in the utilization of our Neighborhood Centers.

Between October 2021 and September 2022, the Potsdam Neighborhood Center food pantry distributed nearly 62,000 pounds of food, thanks to Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) funding.

Since October 2022, the Potsdam Neighborhood

Center has distributed 55,000 pounds of food to 1,036 families or individuals in need.

Centers also receive generous grants through the United Way Emergency Food & Shelter Program and Stewart's Holiday Match Program.

Generous donations have also been received from various organizations, businesses, churches, and individuals throughout the county communities.

Donations gladly accepted

Many different forms of donations are gladly accepted. Examples include, but are not limited to, monetary donations, food, gently used clothing and shoes, housewares, pet food/products, personal hygiene items, baby items, games and toys, school supplies, small appliances, books, backpacks/purses, and services such as logo, brochure, and business card design.

Still, monetary donations from the community have drastically decreased in recent years.

The combination of events has put some Neighborhood Centers at risk of not being able to provide adequate services to their communities.

CSBG funds pay for Neighborhood Center directors'

Hunger Prevention and Nutrition Assistance (HPNAP) grants are earmarked for Neighborhood Centers and are administered by Food Bank CNY specifically for food purchases from them.

Road paving projects planned in Potsdam, Canton, this summer

CANTON — St. Lawrence County will see an additional 10 miles of county roads repaved this summer, in addition to the projects already slated for completion this summer.

Legislators approved a budget modification of \$1.2 million during the finance committee on July 31.

In the 2023 budget, legislators originally approved paving 38.65 miles of roads.

County Highway Superintendent Don Chambers told legislators on the finance committee that he and County Administrator Ruth Doyle sat down for a meeting two weeks ago to discuss adding additional miles to the existing projects in progress.

"We're going to slowly add additional road mileage to the county work this year," he told legislators.

Chambers said he reviewed the entire county roadway system and came up with an additional 10 miles that would fit into the current plans.

Those roads that will see some work done will be recycled and surface treated, he said.

According to Chambers, it is his hope that additional CHIPS funding will become available in the future so more projects can be completed during the 2024 paving season, allowing the county to continue to expand on planned projects.

Last year, legislators and Doyle recommended adding 10 additional miles of paving to the planned schedule, which cost \$2.1 million due to higher costs of materials.

Legislators again recommended adding an additional 10 miles this year as well to "address the challenges associated with ongoing maintenance of the county road system."

In 2022, the county received \$3,903,961 from the Consolidated Highway Improvement Fund and an additional \$891,118 in PAVE-NY funding from the state, allowing the county to complete 26 miles of paving last summer.

In total, St. Lawrence County has 573 miles of county roads to maintain, along with other infrastructure.

Annually, the county has repaved anywhere from 28 to 32 miles of roads, officials say.

All county roads that are expected to be repaved this summer will

be completed by county employees. The modification will now need

final approval by the full board when they meet again next week.

Appellate Court affirms conviction of Massena murderer

The St. Lawrence County Dis-

the man convicted in the cold trict Attorney has announced that case murder of Lacey Yekel has lost his bid to overturn his 2019

The Appellate Division, Third Judicial Department, on Thurs-

day, July 27, denied the appeal of Christopher A. Hebert, 51, who argued that his conviction was not supported by the evidence and that other errors were committed during the trial.

Hebert killed Yekel on or around June 7, 2014 in Massena. Her skeletal remains were recovered from a wooded area near the Massena Industrial Park on Aug. 29, 2014.

In a unanimous decision, the Appellate Court found that the evidence was legally sufficient to support the verdict, and there were no other errors that would warrant reversal, Pasqua said in a press release.

"Although defendant could not be convicted solely upon his statements to others, there was significant evidence that corroborated the commission of the crime, including the fact that the victim's skeletal remains, clothing and a tarp were found in the precise location relayed by defendant," Justice Michael C. Lynch wrote.

In addition, the Court found Herbert's claims of prosecutorial misconduct unpersuasive stating "The challenged statement and lines of inquiry by the prosecutor were either fair commentary on the evidence, necessary to complete a narrative, or were not so egregious as to deprive defendant of a fair trial."

"We are very pleased with the Appellate Division's decision today affirming the jury's verdict and conviction of Christopher Hebert. I hope this will bring some sense of closure and peace to a family that waited almost five years for answers while the murder of their loved one went unsolved," said District Attorney Gary Pasqua.

"Christopher Hebert violently murdered Lacey Yekel in coldblood, confessed about that killing to several people, and then nearly avoided responsibility for that crime. Today's decision confirms he committed this horrendous crime and provides the justice this young lady deserves," Pasqua said.

At the original 2019 trial, five witnesses testified that Hebert told them he murdered the 24-year-old. One of his confessions was captured in a 2017 jailhouse recording and played in the courtroom.

He was heard on the recording saying he was "consciously aware" of what he was doing and said he killed the woman because he had beaten her so severely that he would have gone to prison even if she hadn't died.

Testimony at trial revealed the killer and victim had been using cocaine together the day of the murder, injecting it with needles.

Hebert had agreed to accept guns from Yekel to pay for the cocaine she was getting from

They went to the Industrial Park on the night of June 7, but there were no guns there, and that's when Hebert killed her, according to the evidence presented at the trial.

During the trial, Hebert took the stand in his own defense, claiming Yekel died of a cocaine overdose.

During his testimony, he said he lied to people about murdering Yekel to gain clout among his criminal associates.

However, the jury didn't buy Hebert's story and ultimately found him guilty.

Municipal building funding options weighed

CANTON – With little or no foreseen grant funding to help pay for a new \$25 million municipal building in Canton, town and village leaders are now looking at freeing up space within the current 60 Main Street building by relocating certain departments to alternate sites.

At a joint meeting held Wednesday night, members of both boards pondered the situation.

"Maybe the answer would be to find alternate sites for departments and lessen the cost of a new building," stated Village Trustee Klaus Proemm. "We could look at options and arrive at a doable project."

Deputy Mayor Anna Sorensen noted that funding is limited.

"There is not a lot of funding to build a municipal building. Eventually it would have to be funded by the taxpayers," she said.

Mayor Michael Dalton said the project cost is a steep one.

"Twenty five million is well beyond what the village and town can do. We need to look at a combination of other things," he remarked. "In order to consider this building and do what we want to do, we need to relocate departments."

Dalton said once the former McDonald's building next door is torn down, the parking situation for the municipal building will 'There is not a lot of funding to build a municipal building.

improve.

Village Trustee Barbara Beekman inquired about grant funding for courts followed by Town Councilman Robert Santamoor suggesting researching what grant opportunities are available for town courts and police departments.

"We can ask the police department and court what grants are out there," he stated.

"The biggest chance is the courts," added Dalton.

Town Supervisor Mary Ann Ashley pointed out that she has contacted state representatives to help secure any funding that could be available.

The matter was sent back to each board's respective Infrastructure Committees for further review, mainly searching for alternate sites and funding sources.

In March, both boards were introduced to a municipal building presentation by Bryan Cowell and Ariel Snyder from BCA Architects and Engineers, Watertown.

Blueprints for the new building featured a two-story structure that would increase the square footage from 13,000 square feet at the current building to 35,000 square feet. The price tag would be \$25,710,300.

The breakdown would be \$17,550,000 for the new building, \$1 million for demolition, \$927,500 for inflation, \$1,947,750 for contingency, and \$4,285,000 for incidental expenses.

The first floor will have separate town and village offices, the court system and the police department with secured areas. The second floor will house the historian's office, assessor's office, the economic development office, and separate town and village code enforcement offices.

The bulk of the project will focus on the court area to be located in the rear of the building and will have secure passages and court-room with a 160-person occupancy. Many specifications for a new court area are mandated by the state.

The proposal will see a parking lot at the site of the current building and the new municipal building constructed to the east.

Canton man who shot woman in neck on the lam, police seek help

CANTON — A Canton man is on the lam after skipping his sentencing for the crime of shooting a female victim in the neck in March of 2022.

Shawn Sheridan, 8 Mechanic St., Canton, was charged with first-degree assault and second-degree criminal possession of a weapon.

Sheridan pled guilty to the first-degree assault charge, but failed to show up at his July 18 sentencing.

Despite his failure to appear, the judge sentenced Sheridan to 12.5 years in prison and issued a warrant for his arrest.

St. Lawrence County District Attorney Gary Pasqua said Sheridan had already had a warrant out for failing to abide by terms of his supervised bail release.

Pasqua said that he believes the sentencing is appropriate. He said he had several conversations with the victim who was hoping Sheridan would be sentenced to at least 10 years.

He said the plea agreement saved the victim from having to relive the trauma in the courtroom

Pasqua said Sheridan has proven himself dangerous, but he's uncertain if he poses any immediate danger to the public. However, he expressed concerns that he could pose a serious threat to officers or deputies attempting to apprehend

"We believe him to be a dangerous individual based on his conduct and what he was convicted of, but I don't know at this point if he is a danger to anyone aside from law enforcement," he said.

Pasqua is urging anyone with information regarding Sheridan's whereabouts to contact the St. Lawrence County Sheriff's Department at 315-379-2222.

"We have an individual who has shown a propensity for violence. We want to see that he's brought in as quickly and peacefully as possible," he said.

St. Lawrence County Undersheriff Sean O'Brien confirmed that a warrant was issued for Sheridan's arrest and that law enforcement is working to locate him.

The crime

On the morning of March 9 2022, at approximately 1:42 a.m., St. Lawrence County Sheriff's Deputies responded to a reported domestic incident at 49 South Woods Road in Rossie.

Upon their arrival, it was determined that a victim had been shot in the neck during the reported domestic incident.

The victim sustained serious injuries and was transported by Medivac to Upstate Hospital in Syracuse for treatment

Over the initial course of this incident, Deputy Sheriff Matthew Merria arrested Sheridan, who was armed with a long gun and a knife, by himself, reports the sheriff's office.

Deputy Merria also had an intern riding with him at the time of this call, and they were both able to render aid to the female victim until rescue could respond to the scene.

The St. Lawrence County Sheriff's office has issued a warrant for his arrest.

Sen. Schumer visits Lisbon while pushing dairy farm support bill

LISBON — Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer is pushing a bill to keep the Dairy Margin Coverage (DMC) Program intact.

In a visit to Keystone Dairy today, Aug. 1, Schumer said it was time to "churn up support to protect this program for upstate New York farmers and consumers."

"St. Lawrence County is the heart of Upstate New York's dairy industry, with over 230 dairy farms, and by the end of this year many could be looking over a 'dairy cliff' that threatens lifeline payments, puts the industry in limbo, and increases the price of milk," Schumer said.

The program, first passed in 1999, was authored by Schumer during his first term in the Senate.

The DMC is a program that offers monthly price support payments from the federal government to dairy farmers during times when expenses to produce dairy products outweigh the income from the sale of such products.

Though the program has been utilized this year, pumping millions of dollars into dairy farms across the country to offset declining dairy prices, Schumer said in many years such payments have not been necessary to keep farms afloat.

"This program gives monthly payments to our dairy farmers to make up the differences for the price of milk and dairy products. It's a lifeline to our farmers. But if Congress doesn't pass it, it could expire and that could mean our farmers go without the insurance provided by the DMC," Schumer said.

According to Glenn Bullock, executive director of the Farm Service Agency for the USDA, DMC payments released to farms nationwide yesterday and today totaled \$797,831,245.

For farms in New York state,

\$74,468,950 has been received over the last two days.

Schumer said he worked with the New York Farm Bureau in 2018 to pass the bill that offered a "vital lifeline" to many farmers.

"We need to get this done and there are problems in the agriculture bill. That shouldn't affect the DMC. I'm launching a new course to protect this program and as Senate Majority leader...I'm going to do everything I can to see this program is produced as part of the whole farm bill, or separately if we have to do that," he said.

But other issues will also arise if the bill isn't passed, Schumer said.

"The price of milk could potentially double. Cheese and other milk products could also double in price. And then we'd see billions of dollars in avoidable government spending because the Fed would go back to a policy from the 1950's where they bought milk off the market," Schumer

Schumer said St. Lawrence County, the second biggest milk producing county in the country, would be among the first impacted if the bill is not approved by Congress before Sept. 30.

According to Schumer, a lapse in the DMC would endanger North Country farmers and could have irreparable harm to the local econo-

But Schumer said the bill, which has always had bipartisan support, is a top priority for both the House and Senate as the deadline looms.

"Right now, margins for dairy producers are about as tough as I've ever seen them. Thankfully, the DMC program is built for times like these," said Keystone Farms Co-owner Eric

"In recent years, the DMC program has provided our 7-million-pound dairy farm with much needed support in the face of milk prices falling below the cost of production, providing as much as 10% of our farm's income some months," Fonda said.

Schumer and Fonda alike both spoke to the impact dairy farms have on the local economy, with dairy farms in St. Lawrence County selling around \$140 million in dairy products every year.

"That's 72% of the profits of agriculture products in the whole county," Schumer said.

Catherine de Ronde, Vice President of Economics & Legislative Affairs, Agri-Mark Dairy Cooperative also spoke to the initiative to pass the DMC, saying dairy farmers also play a crucial role in regional food

"The Dairy Margin Coverage (DMC) Program is a vital safety-net that has proved invaluable in recent months. Congress must act to reauthorize the pending 2023 farm bill and ensure that the DMC program remains intact and evolves to fit the needs of today's dairy farmers," de Ronde said.

Chairman of the St. Lawrence County Legislature David Forsythe also spoke to the impact failing to pass the bill would have on the local economy, saying farmers are the backbone of the North Country.

"It's only right and fitting that our elected officials stand up for the agricultural community, as Sen. Schumer has done today, to support this essential part of the nation's economy with the inclusion of the dairy margin coverage, the next farm bill. The needed support that you deserve, this is not only about the continued success of the agricultural community but also for those rural communities like Lisbon," he said.

Congress is expected to take up the bill again in the near future, with hopes of both the House of Representatives and Senate passing it before the current bill expires on Sept. 30.

Ulrich told county legislators recently that the averages for each department remain about the same, despite a history of numbers declining slightly during the summer months.

The numbers are not quite as strong this month but they're about the same," he said.

Ulrich said changes to scheduling were made, with the month of

June being the first month to reflect those changes.

"We met with each councilor and we came up with a matrix or a mix of what they needed in terms of how many 45 min visits, 30 min visits, 15 min visits they needed," he said.

Ulrich said the scheduling assessment and changes are part of a corrective action plan to better utilize

appointment slots.

According to Ulrich, in some cases appointments scheduled to last 45 minutes only lasted 30 minutes, leaving time available that could have been utilized for additional patients.

'We need to correct that and adjust," he said.

The summer months are tough months for Community Services. he said, noting that a number of patients don't come in for a variety of reasons, including nicer weather.

When it comes to the waitlist, Ulrich said the only two people still on the list are seeking OTP services currently.

"At the time it was five, now we're down to two. Those are individuals who can't be seen in a five day period," he said.

Billing services have also dramatically improved, he said, with the previous issues largely being sorted in recent months.

"In terms of the billing process, I'm fairly confident we've got it about 90% fixed," he said.

Ulrich said fixes have been put in place for background settings

that have made it easier to get reimbursement.

Insurance claims are also dropping and getting reimbursed faster and in full, he said.

Revenue for Community Services totaled \$257,016 for the month of June, with \$165,000 being accounted for through OTP, Ulrich said.

During the meeting, Legislator Harry Smithers questioned the decline in wait list numbers, in particular those seeking mental health

"How do you explain it going down to zero? Are they getting help somewhere else," he asked.

Ulrich said his staff have been able to bring more people in for case and in many cases have been able to reach those who are in need. But hiring is still an issue, as two

positions still remain open. "We've had them for well over a

year," Ulrich told legislators.

Despite the two open positions, Ulrich said he and his staff will continue to look for and find ways to improve services and to ensure that everyone who needs care will be able to receive it in a timely fashion.

Potsdam DRI public design workshop set

POTSDAM — Village residents and stakeholders will have one more chance to offer up ideas, concepts, requests and concerns regarding the village's planned multi-million dollar downtown rehabilitation.

The Village of Potsdam has scheduled its final public design workshop for the Downtown Revitalization Initiative (DRI) funded Downtown Streetscape Enhancement and Riverwalk Project on Thursday, Aug. 3, from 6-8 p.m. in the Community Room above the Village Police Station, 2 Park St. The Community Room is accessible for persons with disabilities.

The \$4.3 million Downtown Streetscape and Riverwalk Trail Project is funded through the Department of State and is part of the village's \$10 million Downtown Revitalization Initiative award the village received in 2019.

The first section of the Downtown Riverwalk Trail through Garner Park on Raymond Street was completed in the fall of 2021. Grant funds from the Department of State's Local Waterfront Revitalization Program funded through the NYS Environmental Protection Fund were used to undertake the first phase of the Riverwalk Trail.

Once complete, the project will develop a multi-modal riverwalk trail that will provide greater public access to the Raquette River shoreline

Planned improvements include new sidewalks and curbs, decorative pavements and striping, ADA and crosswalk improvements, art in the landscape, roadway resurfacing, green stormwater infrastructure, street tree plantings, signage and way finding, streetscape furnishings and bike and pedestrian facilities.

After the conclusion of the Aug. 3 public workshop, design work and permitting is expected to roll out by fall, project bidding and contract approvals are slated for winter and spring, and finally construction will begin sometime in next year.

The village's DRI award is supporting extensive project work in the community and among a local businesses and non-profits including an expansion of the Potsdam Food Co-op, a community skate and art park, and expansions and rehab work of the North Country Children's Museum, North Country Arts Center, Market Square Mall, and Roxy Theater.

The state's DRI program redirects millions of taxpayer dollars each year to single communities in various regions of the state through a competitive process some detractors have referred to as the "Hunger Games."

Most recently in St. Lawrence County, Massena was named the recipient of a DRI award in 2021.

The DRI program connects various state approved projects in the recipient communities with specific state agencies and funding streams,

often with local match funding match and public engagement requirements.

Potsdam has sponsored three public design workshops thus far seeking public input in the design process for the Streetscape Enhancement and Riverwalk Trail project including a meeting to solicit input from downtown business and property owners, a second workshop geared toward community residents and most recently, a third at Potsdam SummerFest.

Potsdam's design consulting team from LaBella Associates and CLA Sites are collecting comments from residents, business owners and property owners and will use them to inform the draft for the project's final design.

Residents of the Village and interested parties are encouraged to attend this final design workshop to learn more about the proposed project design and take advantage of the opportunity to provide comments to the Village and its design team, a press release from the village said.

The concept plans for the Downtown Streetscape Enhancement and the Riverwalk Trail are also available for the public to view and offer comments. The plans are on display in the Civic Center Board Room. Written comments will be accepted until Aug. 8.

Although not officially part of the Seaway Festival, a small but magic thing happened on Ford Street recently, and while most St. Lawrence County residents probably missed it, for those in attendance it

was quite the reunion.

In the 1990s and early 2000s, the local music scene here was thriving. Nearly every weekend teenagers played live music at community centers and American Legions, garages and Hurleys in Potsdam.

It was no small task to convince venues to allow for the mayhem that ensued, but somehow dedicated musicians worked to make it hap-

The music scene created something rare, it brought kids across the county together on a near weekly basis.

Many of the life-long friendships I formed were created by this atmosphere. As the years went on many of us left and would return from time to time.

New bands would form and Sully's Tavern in Ogdensburg had become the venue of choice for the old bands, when they reunited from time to time

When COVID-19 hit, bars took a

major blow. Live music sort of dried up for a bit and people fell out of touch.

Greg Bresett, an Ogdensburg Free Academy graduate, artist musician who was at the forefront of the old music scene and who has probably set up more live shows than some professional managers, decided it was time to bring everyone back together during the Seaway Festival.

He currently plays in a successful surf rock band in the Syracuse area called Underwater Bosses, but you may recognize him from other bands including Milwaukee Talkee, Snake Blood Drinker or The Oswegatchie River Boys. I'm probably leaving out a half-dozen other bands he was in, including his short stint with my old cover band The Smugglers.

fowl, especially ones that readily habituate to a human presence (like Mallards), we find irresistible. Kids and adults love watching them, and feel the desire to attract them, and to treat them to the kindness of free food. It's all with light hearted good inten-

There is a sad truth here though, that can't be seen in those brief encounters. You only see it when you observe these animals throughout the entire cycle of the seasons. The sad truth is that these intended acts of kindness have devastating consequences for the waterfowl being fed. Often the artificial feeding leads to nutritional deficiencies or imbalances that can lead to crippling conditions in the ani-

It creates overcrowding leading to potential disease spread, and perhaps even more disturbing, unnatural changes in behavior and a basic degradation of the individual animals as well as the species.

In nature, Mallards spend the majority of their time foraging. When humans provide food, they fill their bellies in just a few minutes. Not needing to forage, they take to other activities, such as relentlessly attacking other Mallards until they eventually kill them – not so cute after all. Perhaps the most devastating and inevitable consequence is the loss of the migratory instinct. If Mallards are fed throughout the Summer and into the Fall, they simply will not leave the area. They'll find open water nearby, but they won't find enough food to survive the Winter. The "kindness" we bestow upon these graceful creatures, unfortunately, leads to their demise.

Please continue to observe and admire them in their habitat, and show them true kindness by not altering their habitat with unnatural food sources. There is a chance that if the feeding is discontinued early enough, they will feel their natural food sourcnatural instincts may return in time. Please, please, please, don't feed Mallards or any waterfowl.

attention. For us to have the legal option to look the other way is an injustice to our congregants who entrust us with their care.

I would like to say that clergy respect our congregants' needs for care and trust, but at times our own human proclivities overrun us. We can be fearful of the political consequences of calling out abuse; we can become arrogant and assume that we have the resources to deal with situations involving abuse "in house," when in fact we do not; and at times we run the risk of taking on the role of God by offering forgiveness to offenders of abuse before justice

Currently, New York State lags behind nearly 30 other states at holding clergy responsible when abuse is reported to us. This must change. Every week newspapers report on clergy who have covered up abuse, and our society is becoming increasingly aware of the exponential harm this causes.

It's time to act. It's time to hold clergy responsible. It's time for us to become mandated reporters of physical and sexual abuse.

I am counting on you to do the right thing – to hold me and my colleagues responsible for doing our jobs properly. Like other community leaders, we must serve the community by stopping harm in its tracks.



MARIJUANA CAN NOW be legally sold to adults over age 21 at fairs, festivals, and other venues in New York state under a measure approved by state regulators July 19. Pot farmers around New York have said they entered this growing season still stockpiling marijuana from last year because the state has been opening stores too slowly. There are only 20 licensed retailers currently open statewide, and more than 40 in development, according to regulators. Do you support marijuana being sold at fairs, festivals and other events in St. Lawrence County?

HERE ARE COMMENTS from some survey participants:

'If the wineries are allowed to sell their products, marijuana growers should be allowed to sell products as well.'

'Yes, as long as it is only sold to adults over 21 years of age. Just like alcohol, ID is mandatory in order to buy it.'

'I've seen people cause a scene because they got drunk at a public event. I have never seen someone make a scene while high at a public event. Weird.'

'No! I will immediately leave any fair or festival selling pot. This is crazy and dangerous.'

'Absolutely not due to the presence of minors at all these

events. Keep it accessible in stores that minors are not allowed to enter.'

Byrd, Lambiase Group to perform at Village Green

NORWOOD — The Norwood Village Green Concert Series will continue its 50th Anniversary Season on Sunday, Aug. 6 with a special performance from the world touring Brad Byrd and The Ray Lambiase Group at 7 p.m.

Brad Byrd is a name that you have likely heard over the years. Whether it be from consistent new music releases, syncs in popular TV shows & and major films, to radio play (legendary LA radio DJ Nic Harcourt has been spinning Byrd's in rotation for years), to national and regional touring, the songwriter/troubadour has made a name for himself along the way.

After years bouncing from Boston to NYC to LA and back, Byrd resides in the high desert of California. Transitioning away from the frenetic city life, has allowed the artist the space to produce his work in a more focused and joyful manner. Byrd has also made a name for himself as an abstract painter in recent years for the same reason. The pandemic aided in drifting away from Los Angeles and allowed Byrd to slow down and focus on writing some of his strongest material that authentically reflects the human condition back at the listener. Yearly national runs around the country in his touring van have transformed him into a seasoned road warrior and when he's not delivering a full band performance backed by top session/touring musicians in Los Angeles, Brad Byrd has a polished, one-of-a-kind solo show where he plays drums, bass, keys, and loops swelling guitars over edgy

Ray Lambiase began writing and performing his own songs as a teenager on Long Island. In the late '70's he was involved in the early formation of the legendary Racquette River Rounders. After traveling the college coffeehouse circuit in New York, New Jersey and Connecticut, he formed his first band and recorded Slow Dance Romeo/Who'll Run to You Now in the early 1980s.

During a career with ABC TV News he continued to perform, record, and write songs. Now retired from the daily news grind, Ray continues his musical odyssev. His fourth CD, 'Kid Bayonne', debuted in December 2018 at #7 on the Folk DJ radio chart, and featured ten original songs, anchored by the title cut suggesting love is always worth fighting for. Ray Lambiase has recently released his fifth full length CD, 'The Road Ahead', featuring eleven new songs that celebrate a range of Americana musical genres, and stories that will introduce listeners to a number of new memorable characters.

The band features nationally recognized musicians Kenny Kosek on fiddle (performed with Jerry Garcia, James Taylor), John Widgren (performed with Martina McBride, Toby Keith) on pedal steel, and Howard Emerson (performed with Billy Joel, Eric Andersen) on guitar.



A growing community

Downtown Norfolk, circa-1930's, was a bustling district with numerous businesses that supported a growing community of factory workers and loggers. Today, many of the previous buildings and businesses no longer exist as workers sought employment in larger towns.

Mills, railroad, library and fires part of Norfolk's history

On April 9, 1823, the town of Norfolk was divided from Louisville as a large swamp

forms a natural dividing line between Louisville and Raymondville.

Norfolk became a separate township in excess of 35,000 acres, when a section of

Stockholm was annexed.

On April 5, 1844, a portion was returned to Louisville, Raymondville soon became known as Lower Village to distinguish it from Norfolk, the Upper Villag3e, and East Norfolk became known as Slab City.

The first Norfolk Village ost Office opened on May 22, 1823. The first saw mills were built in East Norfolk in 1824 and 1825.

The growth of the young town was reflected in the development of its churches: Grace Episcopal Church, organized in 1825. In 1820 the Episcopal Church Society had been organized by Russell Atwater. This church was destroyed in a 1915 fire which burned both sides of West Main Street and never rebuilt. The First Presbyterian-Congregational Church in Raymondville was formed in 1828 as a branch of the Norfolk village church.



- 1913: First Norfolk HighSchool graduating class
- 1915 and 1918: Two worst first in Norfolk
- 1920: High school opened
- 1921: Hepburn Library opened on Hepburn Street

"It's not the DPW's job," Dalton said. "People are starting to bring other junk.

Users are throwing non-acceptable items in the "Metal Only" dumpster located at the Village DPW. It was noted signage and cameras are not deterring the abusive activity and enforcement of violators was fruitless.

"It's costing the taxpayers money," said Deputy Mayor Anna Sorensen.

Town Supervisor Mary Ann Ashley said she thinks it's time to discontinue the composting initiative, an experimental program put in place two or three years ago.

"We don't know where we're going with this. The intent and desire to do it was right but it's not working," Ashley stated. "It's great to do new things when you have

the money or staff. I don't think we should continue."

The issue was referred to the village board's Sustainability Committee who will examine ways to make the composting program economically feasible and more correctly utilized before a decision is made to shut down the composting site.

Acceptable materials include fruit and vegetable scraps, coffee grounds and filters, tea bags, cut or dried flowers, houseplants, rice, pasta, bread and cereal, egg and nut shells, and soiled brown paper

Not permitted include meat, chicken, fish, greasy food scraps, oil, animal waste, litter and bedding, coal or charcoal, plastic or Styrofoam.

After depositing food waste, people are asked to add a scoop of wood shaving located next to the waste receptacle, then take all plastic containers and other trash with them to dispose of at home.

in prison for at least 22 years, those who knew and loved Howell will remain in a prison of grief for

the rest of their lives.

In the impact they talked about

How they will wait for her to walk through a door she'll never

How their holidays and family gatherings would be changed.

How they will not get to see her achieve her dream of spreading her love of music to others or get to see her graduate college.

Her parents, who are also musicians, won't be able to enjoy songs they once cherished with their daughter.

They will never get to hold her

Howell, though, will not be forgotten.

Her legacy as a musician and goal of becoming an educator will live on through scholarships established in her name.

St. Lawrence County District Attorney Gary Pasqua did not mince words at the sentencing.

He said that when Snow is up for parole two decades from now, whether he is a private citizen or a district attorney, he will do his best to convince the parole board that Snow should remain incarcerated for the rest of his life.

Pasqua revealed previously undisclosed details about Snow's plan to kill someone, which began more than two years prior.

He said Snow twice attempted to purchase an AR 15 rifle, but had been denied. Snow was angry over the loss of a family member as well as co-workers whom he believed were at fault for him losing his job.

Pasqua said he stalked the co-workers and had plans to take revenge on them and when they became aware of his plans he changed his course of action.

He would instead take revenge on their employer SUNY Potsdam. His plan was then to hurt their reputation with an act of violence.

On Feb. 18, 2022, he put that

plan into action.

His plan to kill someone was not spontaneous, according to Pasqua.

Although the murder was planned, the victim was chosen at random.

She was simply walking home, when Snow beckoned her over to his vehicle under the guise of needing directions and shot her three times, Pasqua said.

Snow, himself, described Howell as "helpful" and "pleasant," in the moments before he shot her, according to Pasqua.

He says Snow has failed to show remorse for his actions.

Snow also spoke at sentencing. He said he regretted his actions and offered an apology to the family, but those in attendance did not appear convinced by or concerned with his statement.

They weren't alone.

Judge Craig P. Carriero agreed that Snow should remain behind bars for the rest of his life.

"All Beth was trying to do was help you with directions. And you killed her," he said.

Carriero did not know Howell. However, he was still touched by her as he read through the impact statements.

He said that he believed she would have been the kind of teacher who would help talented musicians flourish while also ensuring those without such natural gifts could be drawn into and touched by music.

He said that in two decades on the bench, Snow's case was the

"The killing of Beth Howell was cold, random and senseless," he

He said that the record of the court will show that his actions were "evil."

In a brief press conference following the sentencing, Pasqua and his team and members of local law enforcement discussed the sentencing.

Pasqua said that quick action by multiple law enforcement agencies allowed his team to build a strong case against Snow and led to the plea that could keep Snow behind bars for life.

Pasqua was clear though, that even if Snow remains imprisoned, it will never bring peace to those who knew and loved Howell.

In an email sent to the SUNY Potsdam community President Suzanne Smith said grieving services were being offered and invited those looking to reflect and remember Howell to visit Cassie's Harp, a memorial space dedicated to all SUNY Potsdam students "who have been lost too soon."

"Our hearts are with Beth's family and friends, and with all members of our community who have been affected by her tragic loss-today and always.

For all who knew and loved Beth, there are no adequate words of solace or comfort, even as her murderer is sentenced. A talented Crane School of Music student, Beth was a gifted cellist and an aspiring music teacher who was beloved by all who knew her. She was set to graduate with honors in May 2022.

As her family wrote, Beth "knew what she wanted out of life, and went for it without hesitation."

Following her death, SUNY Potsdam posthumously awarded her degree and presented it to her family in her stead at Commencement, alongside her classmates," she wrote.






