Village eyes major grant for bike trail

POTSDAM — The village is applying for a federal grant to help with the engineering costs of proposed safety improvements along the Route 11 corridor leading from the village to the Walmart and Tractor Supply plaza.

If approved, the money will cover the engineering work for the safety measure designs which would be installed inside the village borders.

The town is expected to apply for a similar grant to cover the portion of the study that will deal with the route outside of the village limits.

The village board approved filing an application for the funding at a special meeting on Aug. 3.

The money would come from the U.S. Department of Transportation's Rural and Tribal Assistance Pilot Program. The village is applying for \$320,000 from the program.

The cash will be used "to prepare a technical study for the development of enhanced pedestrian and bicycle facilities to include preliminary engineering, preparation of draft, state, and federal environmental reviews, a construction requirement analysis, cost estimation, cost benefit analysis and public outreach" the resolution reads. Election inspectors want answers

CANTON — Hundreds of election inspectors are still waiting to be paid for work performed in early June, and the county has offered no indication as to when the checks might come.

During elections the county employs election inspectors to oversee polling locations throughout the county. In July, a primary election required the county to

hire hundreds of inspectors. Traditionally inspectors are paid in a timely manner,

but this year a change in employment designation for inspectors has caused major delays.

Several inspectors have reported that they have not been paid for their work and have not been given a clear indication as to when they will.

Furthermore the county allegedly shut down a shared email box that allowed the board of elections to communicate with the inspectors. It has since been reopened.

Inspectors who spoke to North Country This Week shared a message from the board of elections in regard to the problem, but it offered little information as to exactly what is causing the delays and when they can expect to be paid.

The message comes from SLCElectionInspectorSharedMailBox@stlawco.gov, but is not signed by an official employee.

"I am very sorry for the delay on this response and the delay on getting you your pay. The County did an update to our email and it took away our inspectors

CANTON – It's finally time for the Church & Community Program (C&CP) to literally hit the road.

The recent acquisition of a Pacifica minivan will now allow C&CP workers and volunteers to stretch their services into the outlying areas.

Tai Chi students and Master Sean Boutin will be on hand to present their gift to the pantry, an entire set of all-weather mats for the minivan.

"Years of dreaming and planning came together at the end of the year when our first-ever C&CP vehicle arrived. Thanks to years of fundraising and to a generous \$20,000 grant from the Grassroots Fund, we now have a Pacifica minivan," stated C&CP Director Connie Jenkins. areas.

"We'll be able to pick up more food donations and are working on plans for pantry outreach," said Jenkins. "We have a lot of details to work out, and must add more volunteers, but this news is just too good to keep quiet about."

"We still have a way to go to set it up, but we're figuring distribution spots where people farther away from Canton can meet us and pick up their food," she added.

Jenkins applauded Master Sean and his students.

"The mats will keep it (the minivan) bright and shining as pantry volunteers drive to outlying areas to distribute food to people who desperately need it, as well as to pick up donated food from many local businesses who

Reps Walczyk, Gray call for freeze on battery storage facilities at arrays

State Senator Mark Walcyzk and Assemblyman Scott Gray are calling on state officials to put a freeze on battery storage facilities utilized at solar arrays throughout the state.

The initiative comes after a fire broke out recently at a solar facility in the town of Lyme, as well as a second facility in Chaumont.

Walcyzk has been critical of the state's policies regarding solar projects, saying the policies "supersede both logic and the environment."

"If New York's 'Green new deal' (CLCPA) needed a cover photo, you could find it today in Chaumont. Another Convergent Energy battery storage facility has been burning for over a day, posing potentially serious health risks to residents. New York's green groups and Democrat politicians are driving public policy that's destroying the environment. I'm calling on the Governor to pause installation of these dangerous battery storage systems until the conclusion of a full investigation," Walcyzk said in a statement.

The bill, which is being introduced in the Senate by Walcyzk and in the Assembly by Gray, would mandate that every solar farm have the safety data sheet (SDS) conspicuously posted that would likely be accessed by emergency responders in the case of a fire or other emergency.

In the event of a fire, first responders would then be able to pull up to an emergency scene and examine the SDS to make quicker and more informed decisions, according to Walcyzk.

Gray also issued a statement, saying the legislation could address multiple points of concern.

"This legislation is one component of a multiple component issue that we will be looking to resolve. Making sure our Emergency personnel are completely equipped with the right equipment and information needed to respond rapidly and efficiently is the priority," Gray said.

"As this legislation moves forward we will be working closely with the Governor's task force in order to ensure public safety and health are paramount, when developing battery storage sites. This will help prevent and/or mitigate these fires from occurring in the future."

SLC woman dies after car crashes in Lisbon

LISBON — An Ogdensburg woman was killed after the car she was a passenger in crashed into a tree Thursday night.

Troopers said the one-car accident occurred Aug. 3 around 10:26 p.m.

A preliminary investigation determined a gray 2021 Toyota sedan was traveling west on Brown Road in the town of Lisbon, when the operator, William M. Bruyere II, 38, of Denver, Colo., approached the intersection of State Highway 68 and Cline Road failing to observe a stop sign.

Bruyere attempted to stop, lost control of the vehicle and exited the roadway striking a tree.

Bruyere was transported to Claxton Hepburn Medical Center for non-life-threatening injuries.



Garbage truck rolls over

POTSDAM -- A driver of a garbage truck that rolled over near Dayton Road was rescued after becoming trapped inside the vehicle, according to Potsdam fire.

Rescue personnel responded near 320 Dayton Road Wednesday, Aug. 2, at 12:46 p.m with Potsdam Fire, Potsdam Rescue, and County Car 10 all on scene.

West Potsdam Fire Assistant Chief Mark Maroney arrived on scene first and confirmed entrapment.

Once more firefighters arrived on scene, they worked together to get the garbage truck driver out of the truck.

Firefighters were reportedly able to take the gasket from the windshield and then remove the glass.

Officials said a backboard was then used to get the occupant onto the backboard then onto a stretcher. The driver was transported to Canton-Potsdam Hospital with non-life threatening injuries by Potsdam Rescue.

Potsdam Fire provided traffic control as the area of the Dayton Road was shut down.

Firefighters on scene reportedly used absorbent pads and speedy dry to absorb fluids that had spilled from the truck.

Route 11 Trucking responded with their wrecker to overturn the flipped garbage truck.

Potsdam Town Highway was notified due to the roadway being damaged, officials said.

Personnel on scene worked to clean the roadway along with members from Potsdam Town Highway. The scene is under investigation

by New York State Police.

Potsdam Fire was back in service at 3:59 p.m.

County wants help planning America's 250th

CANTON – St. Lawrence County officials are getting a nearly three-year jump on celebrating the 250th birthday of the United States of America – and they want the Canton community to help plan the celebration.

Both the town and village board addresses the county's invitation to participate at their respective July board meetings.

The county is asking both boards to create a local 250th anniversary committee composed of elected officials and a range of local citizens.

"We would like you to appoint your own local 250th anniversary committee composed of leading citizens, business people, veterans, fraternal organizations, educators, historical groups, museums, libraries, tourism leaders and others who can put together a series of events and activities while also coordinating with our county-wide effort to observe this once in a lifetime anniversary," a letter from County Administrator Ruth Doyle and chair of the Board of Legislators David Forsythe stated.

"It is our intent to encourage communities across the county to create a series of events and activities from now and through 2026 and beyond celebrating our nation's history. Instead of regarding history as the dry realm of musty old books on some dusty shelf, the North Country needs to use this opportunity to harness the stories of our colorful past for economic development by using it to attract visitors and tourists to visit our communities, our stores, our restaurants and our lodging places", the letter continued.

"Many of our communities were settled by veterans of the American Revolution. Some stood in the snow at Valley Forge with George Washington, others fought at

Saratoga, Fort Stanwix and other battles that helped free our nation from a foreign king. Our history is also entwined with British and Loyalists from the 13 colonies who fought for King and Country. It's also about the Oswegatchies and St. Regis Native Americans, some of whom fought for the Revolution and others who fought for the King. Some of the heroes from both sides of the Revolutionary War served in or settled in what is now St. Lawrence County. They built communities along the St. Lawrence River and over time carved out homes in our river valleys, the foothills of the Adirondacks and in between.'

"We should take pride in our colorful past. We hope to work with tribal leaders from both sides of the border, representatives of the Loyalists and others who can help tell their important stories to give our children a better understanding of the important role so many people played in carving out what we now call St. Lawrence County."

"We also are organizing a county-wide 250th Anniversary Commission that will partner with your community and all the communities in St. Lawrence County to help tell our unique stories about our role in our nation's history."

day morning by state troopers eventually ended in charges for a Parishville man who was found hiding in a shed after the chase.

Troopers located Montroy hiding in a shed.

According to the eye witness at the scene, the pursuit of the box truck, which had "Jason Montroy's Driveway Sealing" painted on the side, went from Route 11B, down the McIntyre Road then back onto Route 47 (School Street) before the the truck pulled over into a driveway on that road.

Montroy was arrested and transported to SP Canton for processing.

He was released on an appearance ticket for fleeing an officer in a motor vehicle 3rd and issued a vehicle and traffic ticket for speeding.

The tickets are returnable to the Town of Stockholm Court for a later date in September.





Utility line study planned

POTSDAM - The village is hiring an engineering firm to do the preliminary study of constructing a new utility line from Fall Island to Garner Park.

Currently, an sanitary line from Fall Island which travels across the river bed beneath the Racquette River contains asbestos and needs to be removed before it fails, according to the Clarkson Construction Engineering Management Consulting Group (C3G).

The village board heard a presentation on the group's findings regarding the line at their April 24 meeting.

The group recommended a line be constructed and tied in with the construction of a pedestrian bridge connecting the island to the park.

County saving for equipment

CANTON - St. Lawrence County will soon have a capital reserve fund for capital project equipment management.

Legislators approved a resolution to create the reserve fund from the 2022 budget during the full board meeting on Aug. 7.

In recent years, legislators have taken measures to establish and maintain fiscal stability, including yearly recommendations from County Administrator Ruth Doyle to build on existing reserves and create new ones when warranted, officials say.

Since 2018, five reserves have been established and funded, with the capital project management of equipment coming in anticipation of a capital expenditure anticipated in 2025, according to the resolution.

County officials issued a bond in 2017 to purchase equipment for the Highway Department "to ensure the safety of the workforce and to ensure the work completed could be done in a timely and efficient manner with proper equipment."

Officials say around that time when planning discussions around equipment purchases were being had, tentative plans were made to purchase equipment again after a 10-year period.

The move would provide an opportunity to make payments on the bond before looking at financing options on equipment that had not yet been replaced, officials say.

The move to create a capital reserve fund would allow legislators to plan for purchases of equipment in the future, improving the fiscal health of the county by avoiding bonding for equipment, officials sav.

In other action, legislators approved signing a contract with New York State Indigent Legal Services for year five of the Hurrell-Harring contract.

The \$1,769,999.10, awarded for a period covering April 1, 2022 to March 31, 2023, will reimburse expenditures related to indigent criminal defense representation for the Public Defender, Conflict Defender and Assigned Counsel, county officials say.

The resolution passed unanimously.

POTSDAM — The town has approved the annexation of the former Cheryl's Diner property over to the village.

Ronald Page, a local developer and businessman, and the owner of the property requested the annexation so he could supply the restaurant lot with more reliable village water and sewer service.

Prior the town board's approval of the annexation at its Aug. 8 meeting, both municipalities hosted a public hearing to receive comments on Page's request.

Several local residents spoke during the hearing in support of Page's intention to reopen an eatery at the location in coming weeks.

Page purchased the lot at 215 and 219 State Route 11B (parcel number 65.053-2-6) on March

1 for \$45,000 from the estate of Janet Lindsay.

The property, which sits on town land, is surrounded on Field Airport which sits on village land.

The diner, previously managed by Cheryl and Dave Denny, closed in September 2019.

The town board unanimously approved the resolution granting Page's request for the annexation.

County legislators look to improve healthcare

CANTON - St. Lawrence County three sides by the village's Damon legislators took action on a number of resolutions geared toward improving healthcare in the region.

> During the legislature's full board meeting on Aug. 7, legislators approved signing contracts with Medicaid managed care organizations and commercial insurances for behavioral health provider services.

Legislators say the Community Services Department is in the process of updating and establishing new contracts with insurance providers that cover the North Country region.

To date, there are nine major insurance providers that service St. Lawrence County, with a mix of Medicare and Medicaid managed care organizations, along with several private commercial payers, officials say.

Officials say Community Services will receive consultation from EPOCH as part of the current agreement.

Legislators also approved a measure authorizing the chair to sign a memorandum of understanding with Fort Drum Regional Health Planning Organization to participate in a health resources and services administration (HRSA) grant.

Fort Drum Regional Health Planning Organization has received a four-year HRSA grant, which began

July 1, 2023 and ends on June 30, 2027, officials say.

The purpose of the grant is to administer whole person-centered care management for the rural population served by FDRHPO, assisting post-discharge from inpatient or emergency department settings.

The program also seeks to implement chronic care management where eligible, high-risk, high needs patients work with their care team on a comprehensive care planning to achieve patients' identified wellness goals while engaging in preventative care.

Officials say they expect increased closure of identified care gaps, reduced hospital readmissions, increased access to care through telehealth services, improved patient-centered care, patient engagement in care planning and increased collaboration between primary care and community providers.

In other action, legislators authorized the chair to sign a letter to Medicare as part of the credentialing process for the opioid treatment program.

As part of the process, the application requires a signed letter from the legislative chair on official letterhead, legislators say.

The letter will state that the county will be legally responsible for any outstanding debt owed to Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS).

County seeks bids for renovation project

CANTON - County officials are soliciting bids for renovations at the public safety complex.

Legislators approved a resolution to solicit bids during the full board meeting on Aug. 7.

According to the resolution, St. Lawrence Count renovated the building at 49 1/2 Court Street in 1994.

The building was changed from an emergency bunker to a public safety complex that included a new administrative office space for economic development, as well as the One-Stop Career Center, a location for law enforcement and public safety answering point for

911 calls.

Legislators say the facility is now in need of updated functional space and technology after 30 years of continuous use and department funding changes.

The Building and Grounds Committee has since reviewed the current and future needs of the public safety complex and is ready to make recommendations for improvements, officials say.

The building is currently occupied by the Sheriff's Office road patrol and civil enforcement divisions, Emergency Services (PSAP), Planning and Conflict Defender, along with New York State Police, who lease space on the first floor.

According to the resolution, the need for an updated and state-ofthe-art 911 center has been evaluated, along with the upgrade to the radio system will increase the volume in the center with an additional two desks and capacity for two more in the future.

The new and better equipment will create an increased ability to respond, officials say.

In 2021, District Attorney Gary Pasqua had also shown interest in sharing the space in the public safety complex as well, according to the resolution.

County officials authorized spending \$5 million in ARPA funding, provided in 2021, to be used for capital projects. The public safety complex was the first to be deemed ready for construction, county officials say.

We were trying to have the county let us pay you one more time as a vendor but it doesn't look like they are budging," the email said.

The response goes on to say that the board of elections plans to send out paperwork to the inspectors to set them up as inspector per diem county employees allowing them to be paid.

According to a local news report, the county has said it is now required to make inspectors parttime employees rather than being paid vendors.

However, a representative from Sen. Mark Walczyk's office said he was unaware of a state requirement to do so.

County officials did not immediately respond to requests for comment.

On Monday at the St. Lawrence County Board of Legislators meeting, Sam Bryant of Star Lake spoke to legislators expressing his concerns.

"We were never notified about this change," he told legislators. He said he was unable to find any state law requiring the change in employment designation either.

He said requiring inspectors to be considered part-time employees is financially irresponsible of the board.

He said someone made a mistake somewhere and he wants to know what happened.

Elections Commissions Jennie Bacon and Tom Nichols were not immediately available for comment Tuesday morning.

Although North Country This

Week could not confirm employment status of the elections inspectors, it's been anecdotally reported that a significant number of inspectors are retirees or people on fixed incomes.

"I speak with 90-year-olds who can't live on \$30 a month of food stamps, and others who can't make by on low-income part-time jobs."

"There's also a steady line of homeless people who are sleeping outdoors or shuffling between motels and single-room-only spaces as the county attempts to find them more permanent housing."

But there's more to C&CP than just food and clothing.

"The food we provide is essential. I wish it could be more but it's good quality and we try hard to get something special for everyone," Jenkins said. "Many times, the opportunity to talk with our clients is as important as the food. Amid the uncertainty of how they will manage to feed themselves and their children, where they will live, and what the future holds, they face a long series of shut doors.'

"They're told they don't matter, and they're coming to believe it themselves. We're here to say otherwise. Everyone matters," she said.

we have to make that a better, safer corridor for both bicycle and pedestrian traffic become a reality.'

Students from the Clarkson Construction Engineering Management Consulting Group (C3G) recently presented three sets of proposed improvements to the town board at its June meeting.

The group, led by Clarkson Civil Engineering Professor Eric Backus, has studied traffic and pedestrian trends and patterns along the roadway and developed solutions to make the route more safe. The town, village, and the Health Initiative each chipped in funding for the study.



Don't sleep on county's camping opportunities

Although I was born in Ogdensburg, when I was just two months old, my family moved out to Washington. My parents purchased a small piece of mosquito-infested property on a river roughly two hours away that was wide enough for boating, but that a reasonable athlete could probably throw a stone across.

The property was just over the state line in Idaho and it was there that my love for camping, swimming and nature truly began.

I remember packing into a van with the seats pulled out and the excitement building on the trip as my brothers and I formulated plans for the weekend.

The property had a steep decline from the road to the river and we had a three-wheeler we'd have to pop the clutch on to start on the way down, then turn out of the way before hitting the water.

It might not have met modern safety standards, but we had a lot of fun.

One year, my brothers and I even attempted to carve a canoe from a fallen tree. We hacked away at the log with hatchets all summer until there was enough room to fit inside, but our adventure was short lived when the log rolled, since we hadn't done much to the outside of it.

We moved to New York when I was nearly 12. And I was again fortunate enough to live where woods were accessible. I'd often make my way out into those woods and camp. A few times I even went on horseback, which was also a pretty neat experience. It also made for some



great "capture the flag" paintball games.

In high school I spent a lot of time out on the St. Lawrence River, camping frequently on what many call Big Island, near Lisbon beach. In those days it was also a hot spot for high school parties, with sometimes well over 100 kids from surrounding areas attending.

After returning to the area as an adult after finishing college, I still often camped on that island and I slowly began to learn just how special this area is for those who enjoy the outdoors.

Not long after moving back to the area, I tried backpacking. One of the first hike-camping combo trips I tried was at Wolf Lake in Edwards. It's a fantastic trail with three DEC shelters on it for those who might have missed it. It's a loop trail that I believe is less than fivemiles round-trip.

As I gained experience, I eventually did the High Falls Loop and later added Dog Pond into the trip. Although I've never completed the full Cranberry 50 in one go, I've hiked all of it in various trips. The full run remains on my bucket list.

Last year, I enjoyed some canoe camping on Cranberry Lake with a couple of friends. In the two-night outing we paddled well over 20 miles and spent one night on Joe Indian island.

I'm hoping to return there before the weather changes.

The best part about these adventures is that aside from my \$200 canoe and a small investment in camping gear, the cost for such outings is very reasonable.

In recent months I've written about mental health, suicide and depression. I talked about how music has been very helpful for me personally in dealing with the harder times in life. Camping, hiking, swimming and paddling in nature are also very helpful to me when things get tough.

These experiences are also amazing and affordable ways to make lasting memories with family and friends. Lencourage anyone who is

friends. I encourage anyone who is physically able and can carve out a bit of time to get out and see what the county has to offer.

Even something a little less adventurous like the Indian Creek Nature Center trails, the Remington Recreation Trail in Canton, the Munter Trail in Potsdam, the Nicandri Nature Center trails in Massena, or dozens of others in the county are an excellent way to spend the day.

As summer begins to wind down, the best camping weather is just ahead of us.

There's nothing quite like being disconnected from the busy world and breathing in the fresh air.



times brides' bouquets were likely made of herbs.

According to the resource

Minted Weddings, these aromatic herbs were used to ward off evil spirits.

Veil

Evil spirits also were the basis for the wearing of bridal veils, as they were utilized to hide brides from these miscreants. Veils now are more style than substance.

Bridesmaids

In ancient Rome, bridesmaids were tasked with protecting the bride. They wore the same dresses as the bride to confuse evil spirits from finding the soon-to-be-betrothed and cursing her. Today's bridesmaids are less decoy and more helper.

They may wear similar dresses to the bride and one another, but they aren't trying to fool any spirits.

Cutting the cake

At the reception, many couples link hands and make the first cut in their wedding cakes.

songs. Ranky Tanky means get "Funky and Work it!"

Their debut self-titled album, 'Ranky Tanky', was released in October 2017.

By the week of February 10, 2018, it was listed number one in the Billboard jazz charts, a position it held for two weeks.

For their album Good Time, the band won the 2020 Grammy Award for Best Regional Roots Music Album. In 2023, they won a second Grammy in the Best Regional Roots Music Album category, for Live at the 2022 New Orleans Jazz & Heritage Festival.

Apart from lead vocalist Quiana Parler, four of the group's members, Quentin Baxter, Kevin Hamilton, Clay Ross, and Charlton Singleton, previously played together in the Charleston jazz quartet 'The Gradual Lean' in the late 1990s.

The Gullah lyrics and melodies that Ranky Tanky uses range from traditional spirituals, to children's rhymes and dance music.

Due to its relative geographic isolation, the Sea Islands region preserved more of the West African rhythms, dialects, and musical traditions than the mainland US, which once combined with British

colonial influence emerged as the distinct Gullah culture.

Ranky Tanky's use of instruments like the electric guitar and trumpet are novel additions to Gullah music, which was historically performed using only a cappella voices and body percussion.

Clay Ross credits the 20th century African American folk singer Bessie Jones as laying much of the groundwork for the band, due to her extensive recording and documentation of the songs and rhymes later used in Ranky Tanky.
