Councilor says vacancy belongs to Tooley

OGDENSBURG — Ogdensburg Mayor Jeffrey Skelly says a vacancy on city council will likely remain unfilled until January, but Councilor Dan Skamperle says it belongs to mayoral candidate Michael Tooley.

Skelly said he did not expect the issue to be brought up at the Aug. 14 meeting, nor was the issue under legal review, despite questions raised by members of the public regarding the outcome of a vote on a resolution that would have named Tooley as a member of City Council through the end of the year.

The seat was left vacant by Nichole Kennedy, who resigned the position because she was moving.

The empty seat is at odds with the city's charter, which requires the position to be filled by appointment.

However, despite 20 votes taken to choose a candidate in July, no consensus was made.

The charter required council to vote indefinitely until a candidate received a majority, but after 20 consecutive votes council remained split 3 to 3 between Robert Edie and Michael Tooley.

Several times at the meeting Councilor John Rishe criticized the wording of the charter, in which he says the authors failed to consider the implications of a divided board. He said that endless votes with the

Officials says plan to house migrants is flawed Hotel will stay open after taxes paid

MASSENA — St. Lawrence County has received over \$386,000 in back taxes for the Quality Inn property, located in the village of Massena, where the property owner intends to house migrants from New York City.

St. Lawrence County Attorney Steve Button confirmed to North Country This Week the property is constructively redeemed, however the delinquency was paid by the mortgage company and not by property owner Gary Melius.

Had the payment for taxes, water, sewer and school taxes not been paid by 4 p.m. on Thursday, Aug. 10, the county would have foreclosed on the property

and sent it to auction in September.

Button said the lien holder making the payment on Melius' behalf is the preliminary step for them to protect the asset and decide whether to foreclose on the mortgage.

Melius also owns and operates the historic Oheka Castle, a large hotel and catering hall he described as a "wedding destination" in a New York Post story.

That property, located in Huntington, Long Island, will not be offered as a potential shelter for Migrants, Melius told the Post.

Massena Village Mayor Greg Paquin said the situation is one that the village is not capable of handling, saying there simply would not be enough resources to assist migrants along with Massena resi-

dents who need it.

"We would all be setup for failure. The migrants and village both would be setup for failure and I think the state knows that," he said.

Paquin questioned how the migrants would also be able to get to Canton, where the Department of Social Services and other county departments would have to assist the migrants.

"We have no transit system to get them to Canton. Let alone in the winter months, which complicates things further. We simply do not have the infrastructure to support them. It's an unfortunate situation but I think state officials know that there are better options to

Elections workers may not see checks for 9 more weeks

CANTON — Elections inspectors who worked the polls at the June Primary might not see checks for nine weeks.

St. Lawrence County Republican Election Commissioner Tom Nichols said it could be as quick as three weeks or as long as nine weeks. That's partially due to county payroll going out every two weeks, rather than weekly.

At the heart of the issue is a change implemented by the county this year that required the inspectors to be hired as part time employees rather than vendors.

Nichols says the decision was made by county officials due to concerns of potential

problems from the IRS that occurred in other counties.

However, he said that for decades the county has hired inspectors as vendors, which allows them to be paid faster and with less paperwork.

St. Lawrence County Administrator Ruth Doyle has not responded to a request for comment on the matter.

Legislators also remained silent on the issue at a recent board of legislators meeting, despite concerns raised during public

comment by Sam Bryant of Star Lake.

"We were never notified about this change," he told legislators. He said he was unable to find any state law requiring the change in employment designation either.

He said requiring inspectors to be considered part-time employees is financially irresponsible of the board.

He said someone made a mistake somewhere and he wants to know what happened.

Nichols said that while some inspectors were sent paperwork necessary to become part-time employees, that it was only done for those who were working extended periods of time, rather than those who were

15 months for not registering

SYRACUSE — A Norfolk man has been sentenced to serve 15 months in federal prison, followed by five years of supervised release, after failing to update his sex offender registration.

Northern District of New York Department of Justice officials announced John Arthur Nolan, III, 48, was also ordered to pay a special assessment of \$100.

According to U.S. Attorney Carla B. Freedman and David L. McNulty, as part of a previous plea deal, Nolan admitted that he was convicted of unlawful sexual activity with certain minors in Florida, which required him to register as a sex offender for 25 years.

Officials say Nolan admitted he moved from Pennsylvania to New York in July 2022 and failed to notify either Pennsylvania or New York of his change of residence from that time until his arrest in October 2022.

The case was investigated by the U.S. Marshals Service Sex Offender Investigation Branch and was prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Geoffrey J. L. Brown.

State Police investigate fatal accident in Lisbon

LISBON — An Ogdensburg woman was killed after the car she was a passenger in crashed into a tree Thursday night.

State Police said the one-car accident occurred Aug. 3 around 10:26 p.m.

A preliminary investigation determined a gray 2021 Toyota sedan was traveling west on Brown Road in the town of Lisbon, when the operator, William M. Bruyere II, 38, of Denver, Colo., approached the intersection of State Highway 68 and Cline Road failing to observe a stop sign.

Bruyere attempted to stop, lost control of the vehicle and exited the roadway striking a tree.

Bruyere was transported to Claxton Hepburn Medical Center for

non-life-threatening injuries.

The passenger in the vehicle was identified as Rosella M. Turnbull, 58, of Ogdensburg. Numerous life-saving measures were performed by local fire and rescue personnel, State Police said.

However, Turnbull was pronounced deceased on scene by the St. Lawrence County Coroner.

The NYSP Collision Reconstruction Unit and the Bureau of Criminal Investigation responded to the incident as well.

St. Lawrence County Sheriff's Department, Heuvelton Fire and Rescue and Lisbon Fire and Rescue assisted with the scene.

The investigation of the accident is still ongoing, said State Police.

IDA to help Massena with School of Business project

MASSENA — The St. Lawrence County Industrial Development Agency continues to take strides to assist the village of Massena with the former Massena School of Business project, which will become an entryway for a riverwalk.

The project is part of the village's larger Downtown Revitalization Initiative project. The village was awarded the \$10 million grant in December 2021 and has been steadily working towards final project selection with the local planning committee and state representatives who oversee the award.

As part of the DRI, village officials plan to utilize the facade of the former business school as an entry way to a planned riverwalk, in hopes of maintaining and preserving a historic downtown building.

As part of the planned project to repair the facade, IDA officials have signed a historic preservation agreement with the New York State Historic Preservation Office.

IDA officials say the agreement is necessary to ensure the project can continue to progress forward.

As part of the agreement, officials will be required to complete a photo documentation project and the surrounding area. An interpretive panel "that tells the history of the building within Massena's downtown business district" will also be required,

according to IDA CEO Pat Kelly. "This is due to the historic nature of the building. The alternative is to walk away from the project. I don't advise doing that. We have a lot of good will to complete the project," Kelly told IDA board members.

Kelly said other stipulations tied to the memorandum of understanding also must be honored, including a requirement to stop work if human remains are found on site. If such an occurrence becomes reality, a study must be conducted to determine whether they are forensic or archaeological, officials say.

The IDA will work to stabilize the facade and walls. That part of the project was planned through the DRI.

In the current role of the IDA, the organization will also work to provide bridge funding while also signing grant agreements in its work with Empire State Development, which oversees the DRI program, officials say.

If the project exceeds the projected \$1.9 million budget, the IDA will not be responsible for any additional funding, officials say.

"Our goal is to demolish the parts of the building no longer viable to remain, which is everything excluding the facade. That building is in rough shape. Where we see our opportunity is helping the community, helping the DRI process," Kelly said.

O'burg man sentenced to 24 years for child sex abuse

CANTON — St. Lawrence County District Attorney Gary M. Pasqua, announced Thursday, Aug. 3, that William Laflair, 55, of Ogdensburg, was sentenced for his convictions of four counts of Sexual Abuse in the First Degree and two counts of Endangering the Welfare of a Child which followed a week-long jury trial in May of this year.

The defendant was sentenced to an aggregate term of 24 years with the state Department of Corrections to be followed by 10-years of Post-Release Supervision.

Evidence at trial established that the defendant sexually abused a child on several occasions for more

than five years, beginning when the child was younger than five.

The defendant also sent the child sexually explicit messages after the sexual abuse had ended.

D.A. Pasqua commended Deputy Chief Assistant District Attorney Joshua Haberkornhalm and Assistant District Attorney Matthew Peabody for their prosecution at the time of the convictions.

The district attorney also thanked the Ogdensburg police and the U.S. Department of Homeland Security for their assistance with the prosecution.

New historian on the job in Massena

MASSENA — One historian has retired and another has assumed the role but only on a temporary basis.

Town officials say MaryEllen Casselman is overseeing the Celine G. Philibert Cultural Centre and Museum on a temporary basis until a new historian is found.

“This position would be per diem and temporary until a new historian can be hired,” Town Supervisor Susan J. Bellor said in a previous meeting.

According to Bellor, Casselman agreed to stay on in the role “as long as necessary until a new historian is hired.”

Officials say the new historian will be responsible for researching and maintaining the history of Massena while serving as a resource to local educators.

Casselman played a key role in the museum transitioning from its previous location on East Orvis Street to its current location downtown, including the transfer of museum artifacts.

Town officials had hired Joshua Davis to replace Casselman, however he resigned the position earlier this year.

In his letter to the town board, Davis said changes in his personal life made it impossible to spread 15 hours per week over five days while still meeting his other obligations.

Davis said changes in his personal life necessitated the change, saying the position was “no longer being an adequate source of employment.”

“(I) must thereby move on. I would like to take this time to thank the board for this opportunity and for supporting my work through this

exciting year,” he wrote.

His last day in the role was May 19.

To qualify, an individual must reside within the Massena Electric Department service area, must pass a drug and alcohol screening and must have the required written and verbal communication skills, officials say.

Cover letters and resumes must be submitted to the Massena town clerk by Friday, Aug. 4 to be considered for the position.

\$5,000 grant will help buy museum storage

New building would store artifacts and displays

MASSENA — A \$5,000 grant from the Northern New York Community Foundation will aid the Town of Massena in purchasing a storage building for the Celine G. Philibert Cultural Centre and Museum.

The new building will be used to store museum artifacts and displays, some that are currently being stored at the St. Lawrence Centre mall.

That space is 3,000 square feet and has a large overhead gate, along with display windows for marketing and advertising.

Officials say the space also has a new roof over it, ensuring artifacts are protected from inclement weather.

Town officials signed a contract last year with mall management in an effort to consolidate storage and to remove items that were previously stored at the former Massena Museum building on East Orvis Street, as well as the Greater Massena Chamber of Commerce’s basement.

“This award will help us so much in getting the proper storage for our beloved archives,” Town Supervisor

Sue Bellor said.

Though the deal currently stands with the mall, officials say there are concerns that management may pivot to utilizing the space for warehouse storage, leading to the town being forced to remove items from the space.

Though that hasn’t happened, officials are taking steps to secure funding for the storage building in the event mall management does decide to go in that direction.

Linda McQuinn, who is the town’s grant writer, said she is seeking grant funding to pay for the \$57,000 storage building.

As part of that effort, the Northern New York Community Foundation has awarded the town \$5,000 to jumpstart the funding process.

“We are pleased to help build upon the investments that continue

to be made to enhance this important resource in the Massena area,” Executive Director Rande Richardson said in a statement. “The facility is a great reminder of the importance of the appreciation of the region’s history and heritage.”

Bellor told town board members the grant came at a great time as the town continues to research funding options for the building.

“I know I am speaking for both the Massena Town Board and that of the museum in extending our gratitude,” Bellor said.

“We certainly want to thank the Northern New York Community Foundation for thinking of us and awarding us that grant of \$5,000, which has helped us substantially to store our archives safely and preserve our history.”

County highway to get \$113,510 for public transit

CANTON — The St. Lawrence County Highway Department is set to receive \$113,510 from the New York State Department of Transportation to invest in public transit projects.

Legislators also approved signing a contract with New York State Department of Transportation for Accelerated Transit Capital Funds during the full board meeting on Aug. 7.

A corresponding budget modification was approved in the resolution.

The NYS DOT has awarded St. Lawrence County \$113,510 as part of the program, allowing the county to invest in projects to rehabilitate, restore and modernize public transit assets that have a minimum life service of five years, officials say.

Funds must also be obligated within three-years of an executed grant agreement, according to the resolution.

Legislators also approved accepting a grant award for \$2,996 from FM Global for the Emergency Services Department.

The department will utilize the funds to purchase four Apple iPads to help fire investigators more efficiently investigate and determine the origins and causes of fires.

Officials say the iPads will be issued to the fire investigators and stored at the Office of Emergency Services or the mobile command vehicle.

In other action, legislators officially signed off on a budget modification that will allow the county to pave an additional ten miles of county highways.

In the 2023 budget, legislators originally approved paving 38.65 miles of roads.

County Highway Superintendent Don Chambers told legislators on the finance committee that he and County Administrator Ruth Doyle sat down for a meeting two weeks ago to discuss adding additional miles to the existing projects in progress.

“We’re going to slowly add additional road mileage to the county work this year,” he told legislators.

County officials say in 2022 the county also added an additional 10 miles to the paving schedule but at a much higher cost of \$2.1 million.

The difference in budget has been attributed to significantly higher material costs in 2022, officials say.

In total, St. Lawrence County is required to maintain 573 miles of roads and infrastructure. County officials say 28 to 32 miles are repaved annually.

The budget modification was approved unanimously by legislators.

Pleads guilty to money laundering

ALBANY — A Hogsburg man has pled guilty to conspiring to launder money in connection to a tobacco smuggling ring.

Carey Terrance Sr., 42, pled guilty in Federal court on Aug. 4, officials say.

United States Attorney Carla B. Freedman; Matthew Scarpino, Special Agent in Charge of the Buffalo Field Office of Homeland Security Investigations (HSI); and Thomas Fattorusso, Special Agent in Charge of the Internal Revenue Service, Criminal Investigation (IRS-CI), New York Field Division, made the announcement.

In his admission, Terrance Sr. admitted that from 2013 to 2016 he worked with co-conspirators to acquire cut rag tobacco and smuggle it into Canada, where it was made into contraband cigarettes, federal officials say.

Members of the conspiracy sold the contraband cigarettes, making substantial profits by avoiding taxes and duties, and used some of their profits to buy more cut rag tobacco that they sent into Canada, federal officials continued.

Terrance faces a maximum term of 20 years in prison, a fine of up to \$500,000 and a term of supervised release of up to 3 years, officials say.

Hospitals get millions in federal aid

As part of a nearly \$1 billion increase in Medicare Wage Payments, North Country hospitals are set to see an influx of \$41,720,328 after being shortchanged for years.

Massena Hospital will receive \$1,522,056 as part of the plan, with Claxton-Hepburn Medical Center set to receive \$7,165,654.

Canton-Potsdam Hospital will receive \$5,538,938 and Adirondack Medical Center will receive \$4,911,601.

Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer announced the increase during a press conference on Aug. 2, saying the finalized rule will ensure increased payments from the Federal government every year for upstate hospitals.

“This is one of the biggest shots in the arm for federal funding Upstate NY hospitals have seen in decades. This will be a monumental boost to healthcare for our families and to help our healthcare providers fix budget shortfalls, address doctor and nurse shortages and so

much more. For years, our hardworking healthcare providers have faced unfairly low Medicare payments, receiving cents on the dollar for the care they provide, but now after over a decade of fighting I am proud to announce I have secured the rules change which will bring nearly \$1 billion every single year to hospitals across Upstate NY,” said Senator Schumer.

According to Schumer, the Medicare Wage Index rate is used to determine how much money the U.S. government pays hospitals for labor costs when they treat Medicare patients.

Each metro area is assigned a rate that dictates whether they receive more or less than the national average for health care labor costs, however, historically hospitals in Upstate NY had received less than the true cost of providing healthcare for the areas they served.

With the fiscal year 2024 Inpatient Prospective Payment System (IPPS) rule, area hospitals will now see a significant increase in reimbursements.

Public warned of horse with encephalitis

CANTON — St. Lawrence County Public Health officials are warning the public about a horse in the Morristown area that has tested positive for Eastern Equine Encephalitis (EEE, Triple E) virus.

Officials say the virus is transmitted by mosquitoes and can infect people, horses and other mammals, some birds, reptiles and amphibians.

“The very rare, but serious, virus can cause inflammation of the brain, also known as encephalitis,” they say.

About 5-10 EEE human cases are reported each year in the U.S. In New York State, there have been 8 human disease cases between 2003-2022.

These cases occurred in Oswego and Onondaga counties.

EEE can cause various symptoms, such as fever, headache, vomiting, diarrhea, seizures, behavioral changes, drowsiness, or coma.

If you're under 15 or over 50, you're more likely to

develop a severe form of EEE.

The best way to prevent EEE is to protect yourself from mosquito bites.

The risk of getting EEE is highest from late July through September, and there are no medications to prevent or treat EEE virus infections in humans.

If you are a horse owner, consult your veterinarian about vaccination against EEE.

Public Health officials suggest cleaning gutters, drains and other systems to avoid stagnant water, which can be a breeding ground for mosquitos that can carry the virus.

Jailed after fleeing police

A Winthrop man is now an inmate at the St. Lawrence County Correctional Facility after attempting to flee state police in a stolen vehicle.

Lawrence P. Leashomb, 41, was charged Aug. 4 with third-degree criminal possession of stolen property, seventh-degree criminal possession of a controlled substance, fleeing an officer in a motor vehicle, along with multiple vehicle and traffic tickets.

According to state police, around 8:23 p.m., troopers observed a red 2012 Mitsubishi Galant reported stolen traveling east on McCarthy Road in the town of Stockholm. Troopers attempted to conduct a traffic stop but the operator failed to comply, starting a pursuit. The pursuit was terminated due to the vehicle and the troopers entering

the village of Norwood.

Police later located the same vehicle on State Highway 56 on the side of the road because it ran out of gas. Troopers approached the vehicle and identified the driver as Leashomb. Two passengers in the vehicle were identified and released.

While searching Leashomb he was in possession of a glass smoking device containing drug paraphernalia.

Leashomb was arraigned in the Town of Norfolk and remanded to the county jail in lieu of \$15,000 cash bail or \$30,000 bail bond.

State Police were assisted by the Norfolk Police Department, and St. Lawrence County Sheriff's Department. The vehicle was towed by Route 37 Auto and secured at SP Massena.

way down, then turn out of the way before hitting the water.

It might not have met modern safety standards, but we had a lot of fun.

One year, my brothers and I even attempted to carve a canoe from a fallen tree. We hacked away at the log with hatchets all summer until there was enough room to fit inside, but our adventure was short lived when the log rolled, since we hadn't done much to the outside of it.

We moved to New York when I was nearly 12. And I was again fortunate enough to live where woods were accessible. I'd often make my way out into those woods and camp. A few times I even went on horseback, which was also a pretty neat experience. It also made for some great "capture the flag" paintball games.

In high school I spent a lot of time out on the St. Lawrence River, camping frequently on what many call Big Island, near Lisbon beach. In those days it was also a hot spot for high school parties, with sometimes well over 100 kids from surrounding areas attending.

After returning to the area as an

adult after finishing college, I still often camped on that island and I slowly began to learn just how special this area is for those who enjoy the outdoors.

Not long after moving back to the area, I tried backpacking. One of the first hike-camping combo trips I tried was at Wolf Lake in Edwards. It's a fantastic trail with three DEC shelters on it for those who might have missed it. It's a loop trail that I believe is less than five-miles round-trip.

As I gained experience, I eventually did the High Falls Loop and later added Dog Pond into the trip. Although I've never completed the full Cranberry 50 in one go, I've hiked all of it in various trips. The full run remains on my bucket list.

Last year, I enjoyed some canoe camping on Cranberry Lake with a couple of friends. In the two-night outing we paddled well over 20 miles and spent one night on Joe Indian island.

I'm hoping to return there before the weather changes.

The best part about these adventures is that aside from my \$200 canoe and a small investment in camping gear, the cost for such

Many voters fear demographic change

In his new hit song, country singer Jason Aldean imaginatively describes nefarious outsiders stirring up trouble in a small town.

Big city bad men jump out of the FOX News headlines to "sucker punch somebody on a sidewalk, carjack an old lady at a red light," aided by others who "say they're gonna round up" the "gun that my granddad gave me."

That "might fly in the city," sings Aldean, but, he continues forebodingly, "try that in a small town." Aldean is sparse in his description of the song's heroes, the "good ol' boys, raised up right," who threaten those dastardly outsiders "looking for a fight."

But that's okay, because I've figured out who Aldean's "small town" people are. They are the American version of the British small town folk in the 2007 comedy movie "Hot Fuzz."

In "Hot Fuzz," a hardworking, honest London police officer is resented by his lazy colleagues for making them look bad, so he gets reassigned to a seemingly pristine rural English town. Spoiler alert—sorry, the movie's 16 years old, you've had plenty of time to watch it—the police officer discovers that the nice, friendly folk keep their town winning annual "village of the year" awards by killing off various people that threaten the town's award-winning image.

Almost a decade ahead of time, Hot Fuzz presaged Brexit, Trump, and the worldwide anti-migrant,

anti-outsider hysteria that broke out in the 2010s during this new age of authoritarianism, where anti-democratic, xenophobic figures like Trump, Orban, Modi, Netanyahu, Bolsonaro, and Le Pen have either risen to power or come close. And it pretty much boils down to bigotry.

Even in advanced democratic nations, a good 40 percent of the voting populace irrationally fears demographic change and will vote for any person that tells them there are too many Syrian migrants or too many Muslims or too many Guatemalans crossing the border.

And it's usually those in the

demographically homogeneous small towns that never see the diversity they fear. Brexit, which removed the United Kingdom from the European Union and their own citizens from the benefits of visa free travel and work around Europe, was passed by the votes of rural white people who feared London's growing diversity, much like Trump's fluke 2016 victory and continued cult-like support come mainly from rural white Americans who rarely see the non-white migrants that Trump tells them to fear.

Norwood Village Green Concert Series wraps up season on Sunday with Ranky Tanky

NORWOOD — The Norwood Village Green Concert Series will conclude its 50th Anniversary Season on Sunday, Aug. 13 with a special performance from two time Grammy winning group, Ranky Tanky at 7 p.m.

Ranky Tanky is an American musical ensemble based in Charleston, South Carolina. The group specializes in jazz-influenced arrangements of traditional Gullah music—a culture that originated among descendants of enslaved Africans in the Low country region of the US Southeast. The overall goal of the group was to create a contemporary interpretation of the Gullah musical vocabulary to share with the world, while remaining true to the pared-down, working-class attitude of their cultural songs. Ranky Tanky means get “Funky and Work it!”

Their debut self-titled album, ‘Ranky Tanky’, was released in October 2017. By the week of Feb-

ruary 10, 2018, it was listed number one in the Billboard jazz charts, a position it held for two weeks. For their album Good Time, the band won the 2020 Grammy Award for Best Regional Roots Music Album. In 2023, they won a second Grammy in the Best Regional Roots Music Album category, for Live at the 2022 New Orleans Jazz & Heritage Festival.

Apart from lead vocalist Quiana Parler, four of the group’s members, Quentin Baxter, Kevin Hamilton, Clay Ross, and Charlton Singleton, previously played together in the Charleston jazz quartet ‘The Gradual Lean’ in the late 1990s.

The Gullah lyrics and melodies that Ranky Tanky uses range from traditional spirituals, to children’s rhymes and dance music. Due to its relative geographic isolation, the Sea Islands region preserved more of the West African rhythms, dialects, and musical traditions

than the mainland US, which once combined with British colonial influence emerged as the distinct Gullah culture. Ranky Tanky’s use of instruments like the electric guitar and trumpet are novel additions to Gullah music, which was historically performed using only a cappella voices and body percussion. Clay Ross credits the 20th century African American folk singer Bessie Jones as laying much of the groundwork for the band, due to her extensive recording and documentation of the songs and rhymes later used in Ranky Tanky.

Wedding traditions have meaning behind the customs

Veil

Evil spirits also were the basis for the wearing of bridal veils, as they were utilized to hide brides from these miscreants. Veils now are more style than substance.

Bridesmaids

In ancient Rome, bridesmaids were tasked with protecting the bride.

They wore the same dresses as the bride to confuse evil spirits from finding the soon-to-be-betrothed and cursing her. Today's bridesmaids are less decoy and more helper.

They may wear similar dresses

to the bride and one another, but they aren't trying to fool any spirits.

Cutting the cake

At the reception, many couples link hands and make the first cut in their wedding cakes.

Wedding Wire says it's a tradition that around 80 percent of wedding couples partake in.

It is believed this tradition symbolizes the couple's first official task performed together, and marks the promise to support and take care of one another throughout the marriage.

However, in the past, brides were responsible for cutting the wedding cake alone and distributed slices to guests to aid in fertility, according to BakingNook.com.

Average engagement time about 16 months

Getting engaged is an exciting moment in the lives of a couple.

One might think that excitement would lead to couples hurrying their way down the aisle to tie the knot, but studies have shown that couples spend a significant amount of time between getting engaged and saying, "I do."

According to The Knot 2021 Real Weddings Study, the average engagement length among couples in the United States is 16 months.

Though those figures are likely affected by the COVID-19 pandemic, which undoubtedly contrib-

uted to longer engagements as couples waited to get married until large gatherings were deemed safe, it's worth noting that lengthy engagements are not specifically a COVID-related phenomenon.

Taking more time to get to know one another also seems to be a popular approach among modern couples, as The Knot Jewelry and Engagement Study found that three-quarters of all couples who wed in 2021 had dated for two or more years prior to getting engaged.

same outcome made little sense and urged the council to table the matter, but he was unable to secure support.

At that meeting Edie, who was present, eventually asked his name to be removed for consideration in order to allow the city to move forward.

Although Tooley was then the only remaining candidate, a resolution to appoint him to the position failed in a 3-2-1 vote.

Voting in favor of the Tooley's appointment were councilor's John Rishe, Michael Powers and Dan Skamperle. Against the appointment was Bill Dillagbough.

Although they didn't explain their reasons for doing so, Skelly and Deputy Mayor Fisher abstained.

The vote failed, according to City Clerk Cathy Jock who said a quorum, or 4 affirmative votes, was needed for the resolution to pass.

However, some members of the council questioned whether that was true due to the abstentions.

Skamperle accused the mayor of violating the charter by blocking Tooley's appointment.

"I think the seat, according to the charter, belongs to Mike Tooley. I think they are breaking the law and committing a crime against the taxpayers," he said.

Skamperle said he's reached out to the governor's office and board of elections to seek clarification on the matter and is waiting on a response.

"If the mayor has his way it will remain vacant, but I'd like to see the Governor's office to step in. Someone has to stand up to this," he said.

At the July meeting Skamperle and Powers sought clarification from the city attorney, but a rule agreed to by the majority council in recent years required four members of council to give consensus in order

to seek legal review

Ogdensburg Democratic Committee Chair and council candidate Jennifer Stevenson also criticized the mayor and deputy mayor for abstaining from the vote.

She said that as she interpreted the City Charter Tooley had in fact been appointed. In an Aug. 9 interview, she said she does not believe the issue has been resolved.

"As the Democratic Party Chair, I'm still pursuing clarification on the voting that occurred at the last meeting," she said.

Skelly said his understanding of the rules is that the only member of council who could bring the resolution to appoint a councilor member to fill the vacancy is Bill Dillagbough.

He said typically a defeated resolution may only be brought up again by someone who voted against it.

She also called for a legal review on the matter, but regardless of the potential legal implications or charter violations, a resolution to appoint someone to the vacancy sounds unlikely to resurface.

Attempts to seek comment from councilor Powers were unsuccessful

Wednesday as were attempts to get comment from Tooley.

assist them," Paquin said.

Though community concern has increased in recent days, Paquin said there is zero chance of events transpiring as Melius insists they will.

"We have heard nothing from the state about housing migrants here and we would be given ample notice if it was even being considered. I just ask that everyone take a deep breath right now. There is no chance that this is going to happen. The state knows we would all be setup for failure if it did and I'm sure Mayor (Eric) Adams, along with state and city officials are well aware of that," Paquin said.

Though officials who are handling the situation have not reached out to village officials, Paquin did note that Assemblyman Scott Gray has reached out and voiced his support for Massena.

"Assemblyman Gray said he will carry out a message into the Assembly and said he will do everything he can to assist us with the situation," Paquin said.

Paquin also questioned Melius' business practices, pointing out that the Oheka Castle property is also in foreclosure as of press time.

"I think if folks did even a little research into his business practices, they would find that they are questionable at best," Paquin said.

Massena Village Administrator Monique Chatland said Melius has had zero contact with village officials concerning the situation.

Chatland also said the situation is one that is largely out of the control of village officials, as the property is a private business that is following local regulations.

"We have received a number of calls from concerned residents the

last few days. We have been recommending everyone also reach out to state and federal officials to voice their concerns about the situation," Chatland said.

Massena Town Supervisor Sue Bellor also raised a number of concerns, saying the town and village are not equipped to assist a large influx of migrants whose needs will be extensive.

"While I understand that the migrants are in a challenging situation in the large cities, how will the situation be improved in a small village in a small town without any municipal transportation and with limited healthcare," Bellor asked.

In a Post story, Melius said his centrally located hotel is within walking distance to schools, grocery stores and a hospital, saying it was an "ideal situation for everyone."

Public transit, though available, is severely limited in scope and would not benefit migrants without transportation, officials said.

"And then we have the concerns of the winter months, which they will not be equipped for. It just complicates things further," Paquin said.

In recent years, Massena Hospital has seen services limited or cut as part of a re-designation as a critical access hospital. Services cut include birthing services, the intensive care unit, as well as a walk-in clinic.

Birthing services are available at Canton-Potsdam Hospital, which is over 21 miles away but with no public transit system to transport migrants, the ability to receive healthcare services will be limited, town and village officials said.

The closest grocery store is Price Chopper, which is a two mile round-trip, with Wal-Mart being even further away at nearly three miles round-trip.

"I think it's obvious that he (Melius) has probably never been to

working the polls.

He said attempts were made to submit the rest as vendors, but that those in charge of payroll denied the request.

Nichols also said he had not heard a response from the County Administrator regarding the issue as of Tuesday afternoon.

Some inspectors who reached out to North Country This Week said the delay in payment has been frustrating and that when work is performed timely payment is expected.

Nichols shared those concerns. "I feel absolutely horrible that the county has not paid them," he said. "This is not how the Board of Elections does business. We've always worked very well with our inspectors. They worked on the front line with us on Election Day and they deserve to be paid immediately."

Nichols said that he wanted to see the county forgo the employee designation change for the primary and implement the new method in November so that people could get paid sooner, but that the request was not answered.

"We have done our absolute best to expedite the process as much as possible, but we don't hold the cards. I share their frustration."

Nichols says he's hopeful the delayed payments won't sour inspectors from showing up in November.

"I hope it won't, but I'm afraid it will. Because the county has not gone out of it's way at all to work with the inspectors on this," he said.

Nichols said paperwork will be mailed out this week to unpaid inspectors, it will need to be filled out and returned in order to receive payment.

He said for those who don't want to wait, paperwork can be picked up at the Board of Elections office.




