# Nearly 30 electives available to Ogdensburg students

OGDENSBURG — Ogdensburg students will return to school with an extra layer of safety and a multitude of electives available to round out their education.

Superintendent Kevin Kendall said student resources officers will be in all three of the district's schools.

"We're glad to have them. They aren't just there for safety, although that's the primary function. But they read to students and build a sense of community with kids making them part of the faculty," he said.

Kendall says the district is wrapping up a capital project part of which will save the district money and create a safer entrance for students, staff and visitors.

He said a heated sidewalk will save the district in labor and materials used to clear ice. He said it will also reduce wear and tear and more importantly allow reduce chances of potential injuries.

"It's the door that all students come in and out of. It's the door that the community uses. We saw another district try this out for five years and there is a savings there," he said.

Another initiative Kendall says is moving forward in the district is a therapy dog program. He said three dogs are undergoing proper training to serve as therapy dogs for students and staff.

The idea was student driven. He said a group of students researched the benefits of the program and made a presentation to the board that was accepted. "It's a unit study in civics right

## NYC Mayor eyes Massena to house asylum seekers

MASSENA — New York City Mayor Eric Adams may be eyeing Massena International Airport as a location to send asylum seekers, but local leaders say it's not happening.

Adam's proposal is in direct contrast with Governor Kathy Hochul who says asylum seekers must remain within the city's five boroughs.

News of the idea to relocate migrants from NYC to Massena broke late last night, Aug. 29, when CBS News reported Homeland Security Secretary Aljandro Mayorkas provided Adams with a list of 11 potential sites to house asylum seekers.

Adams says the city no longer has the option of handling the influx within its own borders.

"New York City has run out of room. We are going to use any space that's available to take the pressure of New York City residents," Adams said at a recent press conference.

Massena Town Supervisor Sue Bellor said the inclusion of the Massena International Airport as a potential landing site is news to town officials.

"We have not been communicated with in any way. We have yet to hear anything from state officials regarding the situation. It makes me wonder if they have done their due diligence and actually 'It makes me wonder if they have done their due diligence and actually researched what the airport has to offer. There certainly are no living quarters or housing options there.'

Bellor elaborated further, saying the hangers at the airport are small in size and almost all are rented for small aircraft storage.

To celebrate, each week for the next year we will be looking back at highlights from the last four decades.



ing local news source with three editions as well as NorthCountryNow.



## Hydrogen company seeks 20-year PILOT

MASSENA — The company proposing to bring a green hydrogen facility to Massena is seeking a 20-year Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILOT) agreement.

Air Products and Chemicals officials are seeking the PILOT through the St. Lawrence County Industrial Development Agency, according to IDA Chief Executive Officer Pat Kelly.

Kelly presented to the Massena Central School Board of Education recently to update officials on the proposed change to the PILOT.

A PILOT program like the standard 10-year PILOT through the IDA entails an agreement where a company pays no new taxes for the first five years of an agreement, then pays 50% of what would have been paid without IDA involved over the next five years of the agreement, Kelly said.

Over the 10 years of the deal, companies would see a 75% tax abatement on new investment, he said.

A 10-year PILOT is standard, however any change to that baseline requires final approval from any taxing entity where a project may be based.

That means Air Products would require the school district and other taxing agents to sign off on the change as well.

Kelly told board members when the IDA deviates from the standard 10-year PILOT, a process is triggered that requires the IDA to seek approval from school districts, towns and sometimes a village, depending on where the project is located.

"These are broadly speaking the terms and conditions and we are seeking the taxing jurisdiction board to pass a consent resolution, essentially affirming and agreeing to the broad terms of the PILOT," Kelly said.

Kelly said the county currently has around 40 active PILOTS, with about half having received approval to deviate from the standard 10-year PILOT.

Some of those projects are in the Massena Industrial Park, though those projects are much smaller in scale, he said.

"It's more the norm across our portfolio right now than it is the exception," Kelly said.

Kelly said the IDA would need approval from the board of education to move forward with the deviation from the standard PILOT structure, followed by a public hearing in Massena. A resolution would then be brought before the IDA board for the organization to vote on to approve or disallow the deviation, he said.

Kelly said officials are excited about the prospective project, noting that it checks all of the boxes the IDA hopes to fulfill when bringing business to the north country.

"The county has a comprehensive economic development strategy that has five key goals, one of which is the promotion of the area and attraction of new investment, new firms," Kelly said.

"Primarily within that goal are objectives that talk about utilizing our resources, our low-cost, renewable energy, our abundant water resources and workforce, colleges and universities. All of that ties together to have reached this point where we are with Air Products and with the investment that they've proposed to happen here in Massena," he said.

Air Products officials presented the project to town of Massena officials earlier this year, saying the \$500 million facility would encompass over 84 acres of land on Pontoon Bridge Road.

The facility would be supplied power by the New York Power Authority in an agreement approved earlier this year, allowing the company to produce liquid-hydrogen at the rate of 35 metric tons per day.

Air Product officials say the facility would initially employ 80-100 full-time workers with the potential to expand in the future if operations go as expected.

The facility is expected to be operational sometime at the end of 2026.

## Blaze at Washington Street home put down quickly

OGDENSBURG -- Two people are receiving help from the Red Cross following a house fire Thursday night on Washington Street.

Ogdensburg Fire and Rescue responded around 5:30 p.m. to 1028 Washington Street and once on scene requested assistance from Heuvelton fire with Morristown Fire on standby, according to Ogdensburg fire officials.

A water supply was established from a hydrant directly in front of the residence and firefighters stretched initial attack lines to the front and side doors, officials said.

Firefighters forced through the locked front door while and also gained entry through the side.

It was determined there was no fire on the first floor.

Firefighters advanced an attack line up the stairwell and into the front bedroom on the second floor, officials said

Upstairs, firefighters were met with high heat and smoke banked down to the floor.

An attack line was put into use and the bulk of the fire was knocked down quickly.

Firefighters then began to vent the structure and look for extension

As off-duty personnel arrived it was determined fire had spread to the attic space.

An overhaul of the area was conducted, pulling ceilings and exposing all remaining fire.

The fire was determined to be out at 6:15 p.m. and all units returned to service at 7:09 p.m.

"As always a huge thank you to Heuvelton Fire/Morristown Fire for providing us with much needed man power to help protect our community," said fire officials.

"We also would like to extend our thanks to our brothers and sisters of the Ogdensburg Police Department/ Ogdensburg Volunteer Rescue Squad for providing assistance on scene. A big shout out to Cam's Pizza for dropping off pizzas for our staff to enjoy upon returning to the station," fire officials said.

Volunteers from the Central & Northern New York Chapter of the American Red Cross provided emergency aid to two people after the fire.

Financial assistance for necessities such as shelter, food, clothing, emotional support and comfort kits containing personal care items, as well as blankets to two adults were supplied.

## **O'burg recreation director resigns**

OGDENSBURG - Ogdensburg City Council Recreation Director Mackenzie Cole has resigned.

City Council announced Cole's resignation following an executive session held Monday at the regularly scheduled city council meeting.

Cole was appointed to the position in 2021.

City council lifted a hiring freeze for the position as well as a new position.

Ogdensburg announced they would be creating a non-union position which they referred to as assistant to the chief of police as well.

The hiring freeze was implemented in April when then City Manager Mohideen Buharie made the decision to hire two firefighter positions that had not been approved by council.

On Monday Councilor John Rishe noted that the police department has two vacancies already. He said the non-union position was intended to provide some relief for the department which has been dealing with massive overtime expenses.

Aside from city police work, the department also provides security for the airport and a student resource officer position at Ogdensburg City School District.

Ogdensburg Police Chief Mark Kearns has pleaded with the city on multiple occasions to add additional officers to the force to help make ends meet, but has also struggled with high turnover and long lead times on hiring new officers due to academy requirements.

City councilors said they hoped to fill the recreation director position in October when a civil service test will be offered.

MASSENA - A Massena man is alleged to have charged Massena police officers with a knife but was taken into custody without further incident on Aug. 25. According to Chief of Police Jason Olson, officers

were called to a large fight in progress on Willow Street. Officers began to speak with witnesses, at which time Randy S. Weaver, 36, charged toward officers and bystanders while brandishing a knife. Olson said.

Olson said officers responded by drawing duty weapons and giving verbal commands to Weaver, which he complied with.

Officers were able to place Weaver into custody without further incident, Olson said.

"All Officers involved used excellent judgment, restraint, and professionalism to handle an extremely volatile and dangerous situation. MPD officers train for these types of encounters several times a year under a multitude of highly stressful conditions. Each officer's training is crucial for the officer to handle himself successfully, safely, and efficiently in the field. We can't put a price tag on training. MPD has a very robust in-service training program that benefits the officer and the public alike. Without that training, this situation could have ended much differently," Olson said.

ance policy change would mean for them.

Town Supervisor Sue Bellor said she was happy to report Zuckerman had been able to finally reach all retirees to discuss the insurance plans available. As of the July meeting, eight retirees were still not contacted, causing some frustrations with retirees and board members



"There's been a lot of contact between me and Zach Zuckerman and making sure that he's talked to everybody and had conversations with all the retirees so that they have an understanding of the process and what they will have," Bellor said.

The new plan will save both the town and retirees alike money.

Retirees will be enrolled in Medicare Part C. the Medicare Advantage Program, under the new plan.

The town of Massena is now part of the Broome County Healthcare Alliance, a group of municipalities that negotiate healthcare plans for employees and retirees.

With the new plan set to take effect in October, retirees will major medical coverage that is paid in full and requires no co-pays, along with a \$0 co-pay for generic prescription drugs, \$5 co-pays for brand name drugs and \$20 for non-preferred

brand name drugs, officials say.

Deputer Supervisor Pat Facteau commented that the plan will be a big savings for both parties, a big step that was a major concern for retirees initially.

Nancy Fregoe, a town retiree who was critical of the town board in the past, took a moment during the meeting to thank Facteau and former town board member Tom Miller for taking action on the matter.

"I would like to thank Tom Miller for speaking up, and I also appreciate the help from Francis and Pat who showed great respect to the retirees," she said.

Town Board Member Francis Carvel was also a catalyst to approve the new plan with Facteau, with both saying in July's meeting that they felt it was crucial to approve the new plan well in advance of the October deadline to ensure a smooth transition.

The transition to paper bags was a dual purpose change, one that will aid in the pickup and cut down on the amount of time it takes crews to do so, while also aiding the environment by eliminating plastic bags.

According to Miller, DPW crews previously would have to rip open plastic bags and dispose of clippings and leaves into DPW trucks, adding time the pickup process.

With the change to paper bags, DPW crews can simply throw the entire bag on the trucks and can quickly move on to the next residence. That time saved means the village will save money and will allow crews to work more on other projects like road and sidewalk repair, as well as other infrastructure repairs and upgrades throughout the village, Miller said.

Some residents voiced frustrations with the move however, saying the bags are not widely available and are more expensive than plastic bags.

Trustees moved forward with the local law change, saying it was something many municipalities were doing while noting a number of local stores currently stock the bags.

As of March 1, 2024, only paper bags will be accepted for curbside pickup from DPW crews, however

#### Hydrant flushing planned

MASSENA - The village water department will be testing hydrants in the Massena Water Districts from Sept. 11-22 starting on the north side of the village and ending on the south side. Due to hydrant flushing, water may be slightly discolored. The village says it is safe to drink, but water should be run through the tap a few minutes to clear. Discoloration may stain laundry. Water should clear itself after hydrants have been flushed.

residents who wish to utilize plastic bags can continue to do so if they dispose of leaves and clippings themselves.


Branches and tree trimming pickups occur in April, May, September and October.

Though the law change was approved, residents can still use clear plastic bags this fall for pickups. The supply of those bags is also in question, according to Trustee Ken McGowan.

"I guess it's hard to find clear trash bags in Massena for some reason," he said. Miller noted that a recall occurred recently, affecting the supply at the Massena Walmart.

Miller said officials have reached out to Walmart to post a sign directing residents to Valley Paper to purchase bags.

"We need clear garbage bags because our guys need to see. We need to keep that policy in place for clear bags. It's very important," Miller said.





HERE ARE COMMENTS from some survey participants:


'This will do nothing but give NYS more of our money. They just keep finding ways to pick our pockets.

#### Upset no support for CARE Act

My heart sank and tears flowed when I read that our county Legislators voted not to protect children as they voted not to support the CARE Act at their August meeting. I cannot imagine the betrayal and heartbreak so many who have suffered so much must feel.

Much of what follows was in a letter I sent in the form of an email to the St. Lawrence County Legislators through Ogdensburg area representative, Joseph Light-

sion within the pastor/parishioner relationship. There are nationwide statistics that are accessible through the world of psychotherapy and counseling, that show this over and over. Certified counselors work to help those who are perpetrators in ways that, frankly, clergy are not qualified to do and still the recidivism rate is very high. This means that when clergy are not mandated reporters there are more and more victims. There are folks in this moment today, confessing and continuing to victimize.

Within the confines of the clergy/parishioner relationship I am clear with folks that in order to stop the cycle, get the help the perpetrator truly needs, and move forward in healthy ways keeping everyone safe, I must report them. If a person is truly repentant and wants healing, they are willing for their victims to heal and they are willing to be accountable. This is all within the scope of the love and grace of God.

It is imperative that clergy be required to report known physical and sexual abuse when it is brought to our attention. It is faithfully best for all concerned, and vital to stopping the cycle so victims can begin to heal. For us to have the legal option to look the other way is an injustice to our congregants, who entrust us with their care and believe that faith-based organizations are safe spaces.

I personally counted on our legislators to do the right thing. I counted on them to hold us, all clergy, responsible for doing our jobs properly. We must change the horrific past that allowed clergy to look the other way or believe that they had the power to absolve abusers of their accountability to their victims.

We have a responsibility to keep the children in our North Country communities safe. Like other community leaders, we must serve the community by stopping the cycle of abuse.

## Empire State good at collecting taxes, but redistribution needs work It's time for New York to clean up its zombie properties

The Empire State. Accurately named for its strong emphasis on redistributing hard-earned wages as it sees fit.

In the Great State of New York we pay taxes on the money we earn to the federal and state governments.

We pay taxes on the things we buy with that money.

We pay taxes on our properties annually to our town or city, school and county.

If you are fortunate enough to

live in a village, you'll pay taxes one additional time just to keep ownership of the property you purchased. And generally, you'll pay taxes when you buy property in New York State.

We pay additional taxes on gasoline and even home heating fuels. If you live in a city, village, hamlet with a district you pay fees for water and sewer as well.

We pay additional taxes to register our cars, our boats and ATVS. We pay fees to license our pets. We pay additional fees to drive, hunt and fish. We pay more fees to drive on certain highways.

Soon, we can add ammunition to the list of additional fees for background checks. Make no mistake – a fee paid to the state is a tax by another name.

There's long been talk of adding taxes to soft drinks and other unhealthy items. There have been proposals to actually make it happen. There have even been suggestions that we tax cow farts, and it's not just hot air, it's a real possibility.

Our state representatives redistribute the money taken from us in various ways, though representatives from our area fall into the minority party and have little say about how that money is spent.

I don't claim to be all knowing, and I know I'm oversimplifying here, but I must say I feel like the redistribution often falls short of benefiting those who it's been collected from.

Major tax breaks are doled out to corporations, sports teams, energy initiatives and businesses in the name of job creation and economic development. Tax refunds are afforded to those

with lower incomes as are other social welfare programs with income cut-offs usually based on your pre-taxed wages to ensure that too many people aren't benefiting.

I'm not out to say that we don't need to invest in economic development or that we shouldn't have social welfare programs.

I think both of these are needed, but I question the distribution of funds collected from us and whether the rulers of the Empire State understand how much harder living in the middle has become in recent years.

Do they truly have our interests in mind when they are putting together the budget with money collected from us?

While programs like the Downtown Revitalization Initiative are great for communities that collect the \$10 million prize - such as Potsdam and Massena a lot of communities will get nothing.

Navigating the world of politics is a level of craziness I think many people remain oblivious too. The fact that a letter next to a state representative's name – R or D - has a direct impact on the amount of funding that's distributed to a given area is a bad way to do business.

It's hard for people living in the North Country to watch nearly \$1 billion spent on a sports team, even one we like, while the Empire State closes down area prisons resulting in lost jobs and dilapidated buildings.

Many of these properties are

on prime locations, but remain undeveloped, unsold and ironically, untaxed.

Recently, Ogdensburg received some welcome news that some of the dilapidated buildings at the former St. Lawrence Psychiatric Center would be torn down.

This is a good thing, but is it enough?

Fortunately, in a rare moment of unity, Ogdensburg City graciously offered appreciation to the state and agreed to allow the Dormitory Authority of the State of New York to take the lead on the project.

However, they also asked that the state take a real look at identifying other state properties that could be salvaged, sold or demolished and asked that action be taken on them.

They doubled down on decades-old requests to return unused state land back to the city. They also asked that the state salvage any pieces of historical significance they can as they move forward with demolition projects.

I don't think that's too much to ask. I'd like to see DASNY, Gov. Kathy Hochul and other decision-makers take a good look at that request and ask that they give something back to a community that needs and deserves it.

It's time for the state to clean up the messes it's left behind. In the grand scheme of the state budget, it's a drop in the bucket.





"There are many online resources, text lines, and crisis hotlines that provide support to a person who is struggling. The best thing anyone can do is reach out when they are having

a difficult time," noted Gouverneur Hospital Behavioral Health Services Director Heather Rich, LCSW, CASAC-MC. "Most individuals wait until they are in crisis, or feel they cannot reach out until they are in a crisis, but that is not true. Resources are available to support people even if they think it's a small problem.

The St. Lawrence County Suicide Awareness Coalition (https://stlawco. gov/Departments/CommunityServices/24HoursCrisisServices) is a great resource for learning more about suicide awareness; they offer training for community members and have informational materials available.

One of SLH's counselors is part of the Coalition, and she provided information on suicides in the County over the recent past.

2019: 12 suicide deaths, 11 male and 1 female

2020: 15 suicides, 12 male, 3 female

2021: 18 suicides, 14 male, 4 female

2022: 12 suicides, 7 male, 5 female Other statistics include men die by suicide more often than women; women attempt suicide more often; working men between the ages of 35-65 die by suicide more often; for

every life lost to suicide, 25 people will attempt; for every suicide, 135 people are exposed; and firearms are the most common method used.

Friends and family members are not trained to look for "signs" in their loved ones to see if they are in danger of trying to harm themselves. However, Ms. Rich pointed out the best thing we can do for those we care about is to truly ask them how they are.

While it is difficult to actually attribute the impact that COVID-19 has had on suicides, it is evident there have been many areas of our lives that were impacted. The pandemic undoubtedly affected the mental and overall health of the youth, young adults, and adults of our region and world.

As children had to "attend" classes from home, and many adults were told to leave their office and work from home, the support they were used to receiving from those surroundings were withdrawn, leaving them isolated.

## **Public health raising awareness for fentanyl prevention**

CANTON - The St. Lawrence **County Public Health Department** marks August 21st as NationalFentanyl Prevention and Awareness Day and is raising awareness about the dangers of fentanyl.

Fentanyl is a synthetic opioid that is up to 50 times stronger than heroin and 100 times stronger than

morphine. It is a major contributor to fatal and nonfatal overdoses in the U.S.

According to the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), fentanyl is commonly added to other drugs such as heroin, cocaine, and methamphetamine. Fentanyl laced drugs are extremely dangerous and many people may be unaware that their drugs are mixed with it. You wouldn't be able to see it, taste it, or smell it. Fentanyl is added to other drugs because of its extreme potency, which makes drugs cheaper,

overdose - you could save a life. Fentanyl test strips (FTS) are a

form of drug testing technology that is effective at detecting the

presence of fentanyl in drug samples before use. FTS are a reliable,

common-sense means of providing people at risk of fentanyl expo-

sure with more information to help decrease the risk of overdose.

Narcan can begin to reverse an opioid overdose until EMS arrives. We encourage people who use drugs to take preventative measures, such as having naloxone on hand, not



in healthier children and fewer childhood deaths caused by diseases.

"While we can't eliminate all diseases, vaccination can greatly reduce the impact they have on individual health in the short term and in the long term," said Jenna Thompson, Public Health Specialist for the county. "This is true for many diseases like measles, mumps, and chickenpox. This shows that vaccinations work and are an effective way to protect our community."

The only exemption available to individuals for school vaccines is based on medical necessity. There will also likely be a small number of students who are unable to get vaccinated due to health concerns.

## SLFCU membership nixes SeaComm merger

CANTON – The membership of the St. Lawrence Federal Credit Union (SLFCU) overwhelmingly rejected a merger with the Sea-Comm Federal Credit Union in a vote held Monday at the Best Western University Inn.

The tally was 2,428 against the merger and 1,023 in favor. "St. Lawrence FCU will continue

on," stated Todd Mashaw, President/CEO of SLFCU in an email. "We are disappointed with the

final outcome of the membership vote. SeaComm wishes the membership and staff of St. Lawrence all its best. We extend our gratitude to the senior management team of St. Lawrence who worked hand in hand with us to try and make this merger happen. SeaComm will move forward on a separate path and continue to offer the very best value to our membership, staff and the communities in which we serve," said Scott Wilson, SeaComm President and CEO in a prepared statement. "Also, in the cooperative spirit of the credit union movement,

we have and will continue to have a good relationship with St. Lawrence."

SeaComm Board Chairman Myron Burns concurred.

"Although disappointed with the outcome, SeaComm's Board of Directors will continue to ensure we move forward strategically, by focusing on our nearly 54,000 members with the same high-touch, exceptional service and diverse product and service offering they have come to know and expect from us," said Burns.

A statement from SLFCU is

expected soon.

In March, SLFCU's Board of Directors voted to move forward with a merger into SeaComm Federal Credit Union. Leadership of both unions said the move would better position the smaller unions to compete in the future. They said it would ensure jobs as well.

However, a significant resistance to the merger developed among members with many putting signs in their yard or wearing T-shirts bearing messages of opposition.

St. Lawrence Federal Credit Union has \$226 million in assets, 12,289 members, 52 employees and six retail branch locations throughout St. Lawrence County, including two most recently opened in Heuvelton and Hermon.

**NORTH COUNTRY** 

SeaComm, with \$808 million in assets, 53,850 members and nine retail branch locations, serves St. Lawrence, Franklin, Essex, Clinton, Jefferson and Lewis Counties, in NY and Grand Isle, Franklin and Chittenden Counties in Vermont.

No St. Lawrence Credit Union branches would have closed with the merger and no job cuts were proposed.

## Stefanik talks Farm Bill at Greenwood Farm in Canton

CANTON — Congresswoman Elise Stefanik was in Canton on Aug. 24 to promote her Farm Bill at Greenwood Farm.

The congresswoman was joined by Assemblymen Ken Blankenbush, who sits on the agriculture committee in the assembly, and Scott Gray.

Numerous farmers from the North Country were in attendance, including potato farmers, maple operations and dairy farms.

According to Stefanik, her top priority with the Farm Bill is to ensure that New York farmers have a "seat at the highest levels."

"New York is an agricultural powerhouse. We all know that. But I think a lot of times people across the country don't realize that," she said.

Stefanik noted this is the second Farm Bill she has worked on, with the first coming in 2018.

Though some "significant wins" were included in the previous bill in 2018, including the addition of the Dairy Margin Coverage Program.

That program, which helps bridge the gap for farmers during lean times, replaced the "disastrous

MPP Program," Stefanik said. The Margin Protection Program

was a voluntary risk management program authorized in the 2014 Farm Bill to provide dairy operations with risk management coverage at times when the price of milk or average cost of feed fell below certain levels.

"We still need to make some updates to the Dairy Margin Coverage Program to account for feed costs and input costs. So we want to work on continuing to improve that but it's certainly better than the MPP Program," Stefanik said.

Stefanik also touched on the inclusion of specialty crops in the bill, including maple and apple producers.

As part of the bill, Stefanik said she aims to include investments in those industries and hopes to ensure programs are funded in full.

Through the USDA, maple producers have various funding opportunities like the FSA Farm Storage Facility Loan Program, as well as conservation resources and recovery support like the RMA's Whole-Farm Revenue Protection plan.

Despite the support for farm operations, Stefanik said it was an uphill battle on some fronts, saying state officials' overtime rules that were "jammed through Albany" could significantly impact a number of operations throughout the North Country.

According to Stefanik, a number of constituents have also raised numerous concerns with federal regulations and rule making that makes day to day operations more difficult and more expensive.

One attendee spoke to the new minimum wage regulations in New York State, which he said may be worse than the new overtime laws. "They make it very difficult. A lot of us are under...where they're limiting the production that we can produce and our expenses just keep going higher and higher. That's not a win-win situation," he said.

The wide ranging conversation also touched on the push to bring electric vehicles to the state, including in farming operations and the impact that solar projects have on farmers.

Jon Greenwood, owner of Greenwood farms and host of the event, said the push is simply not possible and is completely unrealistic.

"My real concern is the solar projects that are going in, especially up here in the north country. It is taking land out of production that will probably never be put back," Greenwood said.

"That's putting pressure on neighboring farms because they can no longer use them,"he said.

With the need to implement new transmission lines to send the energy downstate, Greenwood said the move will only continue to remove prime farmland from circulation for area farmers.

Stefanik noted that some counties, including St. Lawrence County, have taken up the issue with solar arrays being placed on prime farmland.

CANTON — With the merger of multiple chambers of commerce into one entity in the St. Lawrence County Chamber of Commerce, strategic planning for the future is well underway.

With votes completed, the state Department of State now just has to sign off on the legal paperwork.

St. Lawrence County Chamber of Commerce Ben Dixon informed legislators of those plans during the county operations committee meeting on Aug. 28.

According to Dixon, tourism will prove to be the central focal point of the chamber's efforts. The brand "Life Undiscovered" is the central theme, he said.

Dixon said it is his belief that numerous people are discovering what the North Country has to offer, saying that numbers are trending up when assessing tourism figures.

Dixon said the chamber's next steps are to finish establishing sat-

have agreed to the merger.

Dixon implored the legislature to continue to raise topics for discussion with chamber officials.

"Be in touch with us with your feedback, with your suggestions," Dixon said.

Dixon said it is his goal for the chamber and the satellite offices to be responsive to any questions, comments or concerns that may arise.

Also addressing legislators was Brooke Rouse, outgoing director of tourism.

According to Rouse, tourism has increased over the last six years, with the supply of vacation rentals rising 32% since 2022.

In direct correlation, revenue on rental properties has also risen 35% since 2022, she said. Hotel revenue, average daily rates and supply has increased minimally since 2022.

Rouse noted that Airbnb and Vrbo are huge drivers for the use of the 324 active rentals listed online, saying bookings with Airbnb up 67% Though Airbnb has clearcut processes to remit sales tax to counties, Vrbo does not, something local and state lawmakers are hoping to address in the near future, Rouse said.

"All trends are upward, so that's good to see," Rouse said.

The St. Lawrence County Chamber of Commerce also finalized the selection of ARPA tourism grant applications recently, awarding 14 capacity grants totaling \$350,000.

An additional 21 grants were also awarded as part of the ARPA program. Rouse said the chamber, along with the county Industrial Development Agency, selected the award winners and will assist in distributing funds across the county for the various projects.

"It helps us understand and see what our partners are doing," Rouse said.

The ARPA funds, distributed by the federal government in the 2021 American Rescue Plan Act, aims to

#### pandemic.

When it comes to tourism, Rouse said the county will continue to be the point people, advocating for the tourism industry throughout the county while educating the future tourism workforce.

Relationships with state politicians also play a critical role, Rouse said, with state officials advocating on behalf of the chamber and county to bring tourism dollars to the region.

Rouse said a tourism roundtable with Assemblyman Scott Gray is scheduled for Sept. 26 at 3 p.m. at Applewood Orchards in Rensselaer Falls to discuss many of the chamber's initiatives.

Tiffani Amo, interim director of tourism, also updated legislators during the meeting, highlighting the work done online by the chamber to market the North Country.

According to Amo, web traffic for 2023 is already higher than total web traffic from 2022.

Total traffic sits 56% higher from

STLC.com receiving 189,942 unique visits year-to-date in 2023.

Chamber officials also track the numerous geographic targets identified by the chamber for marketing and advertising.

According to Amo, New York and Virginia are the top two states that feature in analytics when assessing VisitSTLC.com, STLCtrails.com and fishcap.com. Other states that feature in the top-ten for each site include Georgia, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Florida, North Carolina, Indiana and Michigan, along with the province of Ontario.

As it stands, one of the primary initiatives from the chamber is the rebuilding of the Canadian market, one that was hit hard during the pandemic.

Amo said the chamber is marketing directly to Canadian tourists who account for 9% of traffic to STLCtrails.com, 5% of traffic to VisitSTLC and 14% of traffic to fischap. com

## Hunting, trapping licenses now on sale

Hunting and trapping licenses and Deer Management Permits (DMPs) for the 2023-24 season are now on sale, reports the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC).

Licenses and permits can be purchased online, at any of DEC's license-issuing agents, or by telephone at 866-933-2257. Hunting and trapping licenses are valid from Sept. 1 through Aug. 31 each year, while annual fishing licenses are valid for 365 days from date of purchase.

New York's habitat serves a vital role in maintaining healthy and sustainable fish and wildlife resources. Purchasing a hunting, fishing, or trapping license helps support DEC's conservation projects and ensures the future of natural resources for generations to come.

DEC also encourages outdoor enthusiasts to consider purchasing a Habitat & Access Stamp each year. Funds from the \$5 Habitat & Access Stamp support projects to conserve habitat and improve public access for fish-and-wildlife-related activities. This year's Habitat & Access Stamp features an opossum.

The DEC Call Center is accessible from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday through Friday, and from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturdays through Nov. 30. Regular call center weekday hours resume on Dec. 1. Purchasers should allow 14 business days for receipt of hunting licenses purchased by phone.

Individuals should have the following items ready when buying a license:

Complete contact information (e.g., name, address, email address, telephone number);

DEC customer ID number (if applicable);

Proof of residency (e.g., driver's license or non-driver's ID with a valid New York State address);

If purchasing by phone or internet, a valid credit card; and

If not already entered in DEC's automated licensing system, individuals are required to provide proof of hunter or trapper education certification or a copy of a previous license for all hunting and trapping license purchases.

## Deer Management Permits (DMPs)

DMPs (tags for antlerless deer) are available at all license-issuing outlets, by phone, or online through Oct. 1, 2023. DMPs are used to manage the deer herd and are issued through an instant random selection process at the point of sale. The chances of obtaining a DMP remain the same throughout the application period; hunters need not rush to apply. The 2023 chances of selection for a DMP in each Wildlife Management Unit are available online, through license issuing agents, or by calling the DMP Hotline at 1-866-472-4332. Detailed information on DMPs is available on DEC's website.

Online and In-Person Hunter Education Training Courses

All first-time hunters, bowhunters, and trappers must pass one or more courses before they can purchase a license. Online and in-person courses are available.

In-person courses include a field day where new hunters can get hands-on experience. All in-person courses are free of charge, but space may be limited. Courses fill quickly, so be sure to sign up early. Visit DEC's website for more information, including a list of courses, registration instructions, and ways to obtain study materials.

All the requirements to earn a New York State hunter education certificate can also be met by completing DEC's online hunter education course and passing the exam. Upon passing, participants will receive a hunter education certificate so they can purchase a hunting license. Participants must be New York State residents and the cost of the course is \$24.95. The online course can be accessed at https:// www.hunter-ed.com/newyork/.

New York State is also offering an online bowhunter education certification course. Upon passing, hunters will receive their bowhunter education certificate so they can purchase a bowhunting privilege. Participants must be New York State residents and the cost of the course is \$30. The online course can be accessed at https://www. bowhunter-ed.com/newyork/.

#### **Additional Hunting**

old hunters may pursue deer with a firearm or crossbow under the supervision of a licensed adult hunter in counties that opt in to the program (see Junior Big Game Hunting map and details), and the new holiday deer hunt provides a second portion of the late bow and muzzleloader season from Dec. 26 to Jan. 1 in the Southern Zone.

These opportunities contribute to deer management, allow for young hunters to be mentored by experienced adults, and let families hunt together during the holiday season.

### Opportunities for Junior Hunters and Trappers

To foster the next generation of hunters and trappers in New York, DEC expanded opportunities for junior hunters (licensees aged 12-15) by designating special youth hunts for deer, wild turkey, pheasants, and waterfowl; and opportunities for junior trappers (younger than 12 years old) through a trapper mentoring program.

These opportunities allow youth hunters and trappers to spend time in the field with experienced adults and gain the necessary knowledge and skills to become safe and responsible members of the hunting and trapping community.

#### Remember: Hunt Safe, Hunt Smart

The number of hunting-relating shooting incidents is declining, but even one incident is too many. Hunters can prevent injuries and fatalities by following the cardinal rules of hunting safety:

Assume every gun to be loaded.
Control the muzzle in a safe direction.

 Keep your finger off the trigger until firing.

• Be sure of your target and beyond.

• Wear hunter orange. Tree stand falls are a major cause of hunting injuries. These hunting-related injuries and fatalities are easily preventable.

Hunters are advised to use a fullbody harness and fall-arrest system and stay connected from the time you leave the ground until the time you return.

had sat down to lay out the options available to the state.

St. Lawrence County Legislator Rita Curran, who represents a portion of Massena, agreed with Bellor, saying there simply is nowhere to house any migrants.

"There simply is nowhere to house them at the airport, unfortunately. There are no living quarters there and we wouldn't be able to properly take care of them," Curran said.

Adams has been lobbying federal officials for aid in recent months as migrants flood into the city in record numbers, though Adams has yet to receive any federal aid.

A letter was recently sent to Adams from Mayorkas, who criticized the mayor for "structural and operational issues" in the handling of the migrant crisis in New York City.

Hochul has also been vocal on the subject in recent weeks, most recently attempting to reassure upstate lawmakers that they would not be required or forced to house migrants unless they explicitly offer support.

That statement is contrary to Adams' stance, who said the city is not equipped to handle the influx of over 100,000 migrants over the last 16 months.

"Any plan that states that all migrants must stay in New York City, that's a failed plan. Any plan that does not include stopping the flow at the border is a failed plan," Adams said in a press conference recently.

Adams said the big question is how federal and state officials can stop the flow of migrants into New York.

By working with Homeland Security, Adams appears poised to come into conflict with Hochul who has suggested recently that migrants should be housed only in the five boroughs of New York City.

"We cannot and will not force other parts of our state to shelter migrants," Hochul said last week.

According to CBS News, other sites in consideration by Homeland Security include Camp Smith in Westchester, Stewart Airport in New Windsor, three sites in Schenectady, Massena International Airport, the Army Reserve Center on Staten Island, an IRS building on Long Island City and the Marine Corps Reserve Center at Floyd Bennett Field that officials previously said was not suitable.

This is the second time Massena has been in the crosshairs of state officials and city lawmakers, coming just weeks after a New York City businessman openly lobbied Adams to utilize the Quality Inn hotel to house nearly 180 migrants.

Local officials say that plan is a non-starter.

is one that the village is not capable of handling, saying there simply would not be enough resources to assist migrants along with Massena residents who need it.

"We would all be setup for failure. The migrants and village both would be set up for failure and I think the state knows that," he previously said.

Paquin also noted that the owner, Gary Melius, owed over \$386,000 in back taxes that were paid in the eleventh hour by the lien holder, the first step towards protecting an asset before foreclosure.

Even if state officials approved the sending of migrants to Massena, Paquin also noted that by housing migrants long term the state would be defying local code. Paquin said Massena Village Code does not allow for a boarding house.

"If they house them here, that would make the hotel a boarding house. That is not allowable under our code, so unless the state wants to override our code, it's just not going to happen," Paquin said previously.
