Milk cartons in short supply

Schools are finding alternative ways to serve milk to St. Lawrence County students due to a national milk carton shortage that's expected to last into the new year.

Milk is required to be served with school meals, however USDA's Food and Nutrition Service officials are allowing districts to serve different types or sizes of milk during the supply shortage.

"Districts in our region can purchase gallons and half gallons of white and chocolate milk in different fat contents from our vendors," said St. Lawrence-Lewis BOCES Central Food Management Assistant Director David Gravlin.

He said district food service managers have placed orders for cups and dispensing supplies so they can hopefully continue to serve milk without any disruptions.

"Our main objective is to ensure students have access to milk, and we will continue to look into other methods of serving milk such as boxed milk, bulk dispensers or different sizes and types of milk," said Gravlin.

Most schools will shift to serving shelf-stable milk.

Shelf-stable milk is milk that has been pasteurized and packaged a little differently than refrigerated milk in order to extend its shelf life. Shelf-stable, or aseptic, milks are common in other parts of the world but didn't really catch on stateside until about 30 years ago, mainly because Americans

Massena Fire gets new rapid deployment boat thanks to CSX grant

MASSENA -- The Massena Fire Department has acquired a rapid Deployment Craft to aid in ice and water rescue missions after receiving a grant of \$5,000 from CSX Transportation.

Fire officials say the craft, which is specially designed for ice and water rescue operations, is a "vital asset that will significantly improve the safety and effectiveness of the Massena Fire Department's response to emergencies involving ice-covered bodies of water, rivers and other

challenging aquatic environments. According to officials, CSX recognized the importance of equipping first responders with the necessary tools to save lives and protect the community," in issuing the grant to the fire department.

Some of the key features associated with the craft include swift deployment, which allows the craft to be launched quickly and to respond rapidly in critical situations while reducing response times.

The craft is also incredibly durable, allowing it to withstand harsh conditions, officials say. It is made of high-quality materials "to ensure

long-term reliability and safety for both rescue personnel and victims." The craft also includes necessary safety features like Ice Commander rescue suits, rescue ropes and buoyancy aids.

Fire officials expressed their gratitude towards CSX Transportation for the grant,

with Chief Patrick O'Brien calling the craft "a game-changer for our department."

The fire department also took possession of a new pumper truck, Engine 30, at the end of October. The new workhorse rescue vehicle is now on duty and replaces Engine 28.

Grant could help bolster city police department

OGDENSBURG -- Ogdensburg's police force will receive a much needed shot in the arm thanks to a grant from the St. Lawrence County District attorney's office.

Ogdensburg City Police Chief Mark Kearns said the Criminal Justice Discovery Reform Grant would fully fund one police officer's salary and benefits for a year.

The grant is designed to offset some of the additional work created by New York state's changes of the discovery laws.

In the past, a sheriff's office position was funded through the same grant.

Kearns explained that the new paperwork associated with making arrests takes nearly five fold the amount of time to complete with the new discovery laws.

He said that the new state

O'burg cheese plant to be laid low

OGDENSBURG -- Ogdensburg's defunct cheese plant will be coming down now that the city council has accepted a bid of \$1.2 million from Bronze Contracting.

The bid drew some protest from councilors Dan Skamperle and Michael Powers who voted against hiring Bronze Contracting with hopes of instead hiring a firm that would employ local contractors to perform the hauling work.

Skamperle said that Dan's Hauling & Demo uses M&M Excavating which is owned by an Ogdensburg contractor. Dan's Hauling & Demo submitted a bid of \$1.38 million, which Skamperle said was about 13% higher.

Skamperle said the bid should be considered due to the fact it would help a local company while still being a responsible bid.

His plan was shot down by fellow council members though due to a variety of concerns including potentially delaying the project, increasing costs associated

with the project and potentially losing funding from the grant provider.

Ogdensburg Mayor Jeffrey Skelly cautioned his fellow councilors to be frugal and pointed out that the project could end up costing more than it seems. He pointed to the engineering mistakes made in the REDI project which cost the city more than \$1 million in local expenses not previously included in the estimate.

Bronze Contracting has performed work for the city in the past.

Also accepted Monday was a bid from Paradigm Environmental, LLC to perform third-party abatement monitoring at cost not to exceed \$155,350.

In May, Ogdensburg received a \$1.8 million Restore New York grant, which will be used to fund the demolition of the dilapidated former Tubroburg Cheese plant.

The cheese plant has languished empty for years following unsuccessful lawsuits and attempts to fund demolition and cleanup of the site that resides in Ogdensburg's Marina District.

The building has attracted vandals and has been considered a safety concern for some time.

County Public Health to get over \$400,000 in fed cash

CANTON -- St. Lawrence County Public Health has received over \$400,000 in federal aid to strengthen healthcare infrastructure throughout the county.

County legislators approved a resolution to accept the funds during the Nov. 6 full board meeting.

Officials say the funds, which are part of a grant through the Center for Disease Control and Prevention, will be used to strengthen county public health departments.

The funds may be used to "strengthen the public health workforce through hiring of public health positions, supporting retention of current staff, making upgrades to the workplace to increase employee satisfaction, providing public health training and providing public health support services to the public health department," according to the resolution.

Officials say over the long term,

the investments "include improvements in the public health of the jurisdiction, especially among socially and economically marginalized communities."

The five-year grant will run for the period of Dec. 1, 2022 through Nov. 30, 2027.

In other action, legislators also approved a budget modification for Public Health totaling \$61,5000 for the Administration and Preventative Services Program.

Officials say expenses for the programs have been higher than anticipated this year, necessitating the modification.

According to officials there has also been an increase in revenue with the two programs as well.

As for the breakdown in appropriations, officials say \$6,000 will be used for the accounting and financial account, while \$20,000 will go towards computer software expenses and \$35,500 will cover other fees associated with the programs.



County budget could feature drop in true value tax rate

CANTON -- The tentative county budget has been released and taxpayers are likely to see a decrease to the True Value Tax Rate (TVTR).

According to the budget documents presented by County Administrator Ruth Doyle, the tentative budget will reduce the TVTR by 45 cents per \$1,000 of assessed valuation.

That means the rate could drop to \$7.15 in 2024, down from \$7.60 per \$1,000 of valuation.

"The Board of Legislators and Administration continue their diligent efforts to decrease the burden on taxpayers in St. Lawrence County," Doyle wrote in a release.

The tax rate proposed would be the lowest seen at the county level since 1985, officials say.

"I want to thank County Administrator Ruth Doyle, all department heads involved with the process, as well as all employees who helped make lowering property taxes possible. Without their dedication to the work they do, lowering the tax rate again would not be possible, while continuing to maintain services," Chairman David Forsyth said.

"Also, I would like to thank Legislators for their determination to continue decreasing the burden on property taxpayers and for their support of county staff," he continued.

Doyle praised the work of county staff members, saying that the "continued attentive approach to managing the resources provided to them, I am proud of the Budget Team who works throughout the year while continuing their day-to-day tasks, and I am proud of the Tentative Budget."

Doyle said the county continues to make strides despite the unpredictable nature of operation expenses, noting the tentative budget "seeks to prepare once again to maintain services and improve upon the infrastructure of the County for the people of the County who support the services we provide."

As part of the \$296.5 million bud-

get, county residents will see a total levy of \$54 million, which represents 18% of the total budget.

A request was made this year to override the New York State tax cap limit by \$579,885 or 0.2% of the budget, officials say.

The allowable tax cap is \$1.7 million and the tentative budget requests a \$2.3 million increase in the levy, according to officials.

In the tentative budget, the county workforce is proposed at 882.53 full-time equivalent.

That workforce would be an increase of 17.86 positions over the 2023 budget, according to officials.

The breakdown of those jobs is 832.5 full-time positions and 50.03 less than full-time equivalents, officials say.

"This is a combination of changes made by the Board of Legislators throughout the current year and recommendations made by the Budget Team," officials wrote.

The board of legislators will hold budget review sessions Nov. 13, 20 and 27 with an anticipated adoption of the budget on Dec. 4 during the full board meeting.

State doling out over \$1 million in taxpayer dollars for local projects

The North County is set to receive over \$1 million in state aid as part of the Not-for-Profit Capital Grant Program, with five entities slated to receive funding for a wide range of projects.

The Village of Massena will receive \$38,500 for a water treatment plant study, which will be used to study the feasibility of installing a branched connection off the village's primary raw water intake pipe and a pump station to serve a proposed liquid hydrogen production facility.

Officials say the Preliminary Engineering Report proposes to complete a unit process evaluation and condition assessment of the treatment plant, including "evaluation of the water intake and distribution system storage tank, to identify deficiencies and recommended improvements."

State officials say The Salvation Army in Massena will receive \$50,000 for kitchen renovations and a job training program.

As part of the project the Salvation Army- Empire Division will design and construct a new kitchen at the Massena Corps that includes "more space to prepare and serve food to those in need."

The new kitchen will also establish space for a new job training program in partnership with the Massena Central School District,

Social Services, Massena Neighborhood Center, restaurants and area churches to train individuals in food service and hospitality industry jobs.

United Helpers will also receive \$100,000 as part of the grant program.

Those funds will be used to convert a former single-story, 3,600 square foot garage into a commercial laundry facility, officials say.

That facility will provide laundry services for United Helpers and other medical facilities in the community.

The new facility will include the purchase of two new washers, six new dryers, 10 linen carts and 20 transport carts.

According to officials, the project will also include a loading dock for shipping and receiving, as well as overhead doors to the three bay garage for easy access that will complement the existing structure.

In-Law Brewing Company will also receive \$50,000 as part of an expansion project through the grant program.

Officials say the brewery will expand from a 7 BBL to a 30 BBL brewhouse with the fund.

The expansion comes with the transfers of its current operating license to a larger 3,500 square foot facility to facilitate the increased wholesale demand.

According to the state, In-Law Brewing will renovate the new space to create a taproom and will purchase additional machinery and equipment, including brewing transfer pumps, a glycol chiller and commercial keg washer.

OBPA was awarded \$954,000 from the North Country Regional Economic Development council adding to previous grants the OBPA has raised about \$4 million for the \$4.6 million project.

To help run the facility the OBPA is planning to partner with the The Arc Jefferson- St. Lawrence., a non-profit membership association dedicated to full inclusion and integration for persons with intellectual and other developmental disabilities.

In August OBPA Executive Director Steve Lawrence offered appreciation to Senators Charles Schumer and Kirsten Gillibrand as well as Congresswoman Elise Stefanik who helped secure an additional \$1 million toward the project. Federal representatives had previously secured about \$2 million prior to this announcement. At that time Lawrence said the project was estimated at about \$4.6 million and was hopeful work could begin as early as 2025 should funding be secured.


The newest grant puts the OBPA in striking distance of the project.

Since September, the program is once again offering indoor dining, with the subsiding of COVID concerns.

Currently, about 100 community members each week are choosing to dine in and 50 meals are still take-out.

"Our mission has always been to create a unity within the community by serving a meal to enjoy together. We love to see you come in and share conversations and smiles with others," said organizer Kathy Perry.

"The original purpose of the meal was to offer a space where people could come to share a meal and enjoy fellowship with each other. We still feel that way," she said.

Tables are set both for large families or for small groups, so people can sit wherever they are most comfortable.

All tables are sanitized after the meal and before set up for the next week.

Takeout meals may not be the same as the posted menu on the Facebook page, due to food availability and whether the meal is appropriate to do as a to-go meal.

"The community meal was started out of a bible study within our church and began as a once per

Grant will enhance local law efforts

CANTON — St. Lawrence County is set to receive \$417,930 from the Criminal Justice Reform Grant, a fund that will allow the county to subsidize the cost of two assistant district attorney positions.

St. Lawrence County District Attorney Gary Pasqua announced the funding during the county legislature's operations committee meeting, telling legislators he has allocated \$248,228 for the two assistant district attorneys, which will cover salaries and benefits for the two positions for a year.

Pasqua said \$4,212 will be used to cover the cost of the PCMS Program Discovery Storage fees for his department and \$73,128 will be used to expedite Grand Jury transcripts to comply with Criminal Procedure law.

Pasqua noted that the state has recently invested an additional \$40 million in the grant program, allowing the county to receive a much larger allocation than in previous years.

That allocation will allow for the hiring of multiple personnel and to upgrade or purchase software and equipment that will allow the district attorney's office to function

better, he said.

According to Pasqua, state officials said the additional funds allocated for the grant program will be maintained for at least the next five years.

As part of the fund, Pasqua said \$92,362 will come from the Criminal Justice Reform Grant to fund a police office position for the Ogdensburg police department for one year.

Pasqua said he made it clear to city officials and the police department that the funds are to be utilized to hire an additional officer and cannot be used to reimburse the city for existing officers.

According to Pasqua, Ogdensburg Police are down to 16 road officers, a sharp decline from the previous 28 that were on the road.

"It may seem like a drop in the bucket but it's much needed help and any help the city can get with everything that is going on is well worth it," he said.

Though the position is funded by a grant the county will again receive funding through next year, Pasqua said the county is under no obligation to fund the position again next year.

"I hope whatever changes come in January they will be able to increase numbers on their own," Pasqua said.

Pasqua noted that the Ogdens-

burg police department has had more arraignments in recent years than any other municipal police department throughout the county.

"This will help them, help us and will take the burden off the state police and Sheriff's Department," he said.

Chairman David Forsythe also spoke to the funding, saying it will be a big boost for a department that is struggling to keep up with a sharp increase in complaints.

"This will go a long way to help," he said. Forsythe also spoke to funds the department will receive from an additional grant, which will allow the department to hire an additional two officers.

"We know they are short staffed and hopefully they will have two more coming on board soon," he said.

Legislator Jim Reagen said the move to hire additional officers with the grant is a great move by the county, saying that the funds to hire officers will not affect county revenue.

"I want to commend you (Pasqua) for your leadership and for seeing the needs across the county," he said.

Reagen said the county is aware of the issues plaguing the city, saying law enforcement officers there need "all of the help they can get."

State gearing up to finally demolish psychiatric center buildings

OGDENSBURG — Ogdensburg received welcome news that the State Dormitory Authority intends to demolish and clean up additional buildings at the St. Lawrence Psychiatric Center.

In August, DANSY notified the

city of intent to demolish the Letchworth Building Complex.

Now in a letter received Oct. 30, DANSY has expressed interest in expanding the project to include the demolition of Buildings 38, 49, 50, 56, 57, 58, and 86, located on a parcel bounded by NYS Route 37, Entrance Avenue, Cottage Drive, and Hanes Drive.

According to the letter, the project would be completed in a single phase and would include hazardous and regulated material removals.

The buildings to be demolished total approximately 31,832 square feet.

It also noted that the buildings have been vacant for many years and are in a dilapidated and deteriorated condition.

Interim City Manager Andrea Smith said the news came after the city submitted a request to the state to consider demolishing buildings at SLPC that were already in disrepair.

The parcels included in DASNY's latest proposal are what city officials have referred to as Parcel A, and the city has been seeking action from the state on those properties for about a decade.

"This is exciting," she said.

Smith noted that the properties slated for demolition are what the city asked the state to consider in August.

"It's very encouraging that the state is looking at the campus," she said.

Smith said the state also took note of the city's request to preserve sal-

vageable materials during the demolitions for both environmental and historical factors.

The city is set to act on a resolution Monday which would allow DASNY to proceed on the proposal.

Over the last 40 years, the St. Lawrence Psychiatric Center has downsized substantially and more recently the state closed the Ogdensburg Correctional Facility.

In recent months councilors have asked the city to repurpose the prison and have long called on the state to at least tear down the "dangerous" buildings at the psychiatric center.

Bridge and Port Authority moves closer towards setting up childcare center

OGDENSBURG — Ogdensburg Bridge and Port Authority another step closer to establishing a childcare center.

On Monday the OBPA was awarded \$954,000 from the North Country Regional Economic Development council adding to previous grants the OBPA has raised about \$4 million for the \$4.6 million project.

To help run the facility the OBPA is planning to partner with The Arc Jefferson-St. Lawrence, a non-profit membership association dedicated to full inclusion and integration for persons with intellectual and other developmental disabilities.

In August OBPA Executive Director Steve Lawrence offered appreciation to Senators Charles Schumer and Kirsten Gillibrand as well as Congresswoman Elise Stefanik who helped secure an additional \$1 million toward the project. Federal representatives had previously secured about \$2 million prior to this announcement.

At that time Lawrence said the project was estimated at about \$4.6 million and was hopeful work could begin as early as 2025 should funding be secured.

The newest grant puts the OBPA in striking distance of the project.

Lawrence said the need for child-

care in the area is very real. On top of only a small number of providers in the area, the high cost of childcare can impact people's ability to enter the workforce because they may only break even after paying for the service.

Lawrence said that the project would also incorporate early development education and would not just provide daycare services.

The project would consist of a 15,000-square-foot childcare center for the residents of St. Lawrence County to provide daycare, an integrated preschool program and other childcare services. He estimated it would provide service for more than 100 children.

Last year, Schumer secured over \$2 million to support the Ogdensburg Bridge and Port Authority child care center project.

"On behalf of the Ogdensburg Bridge and Port Authority, I wish to extend our sincerest gratitude to the NBRC and Senator Charles Schumer for their invaluable support in selecting the OBPA childcare project as a recipient of the \$1 million dollar grant award. This substantial support underscores our shared commitment to nurturing quality childcare services and will undoubtedly shape a brighter future for the children of our community," Lawrence said at the time.



Should medical debt should be reported in a consumer credit report?

Most feel medical debt should not be part of a consumer credit report



TWO YEARS AGO, the state implemented a law banning debt collectors from garnishing wages or placing liens against property for medical bills. Last session, the state Legislature passed legislation that would prohibit medical debt from being collected or included as part of consumer credit reports. The law is awaiting signature from the governor. Do you believe medical debt should be reported as part of a consumer credit report?

HERE ARE COMMENTS from some survey participants:

"No. The medical industrial establishment is corrupt and grabby. When you seek medical help you're not given the prices that you will have to pay so there is no idea on your part what

you'll owe. If you can't pay what your insurance won't cover, you're up the creek through no fault of your own. Kiss your untethered life goodbye."

"Debt to private medical facilities should be on report. Public clinics and hospitals, no."

"Medical costs are far too high in the first place, even if a person has insurance. A person should not be penalized for getting sick and trying to prolong their lives by seeking medical treatments!"

"Absolutely not. The healthcare billing system is a massive fraud."

"Yes, just like student loans, you made the debt, pay it!"

"Any debt should be reported but maybe the medical people should make

it more affordable so people don't get behind in their most vulnerable and difficult times. It hurts the people that are trying to do their part."

"If you start exempting certain types of debt from the credit reports, then what good is a credit report?"

"Debt is debt. Medical debt should be treated like other debts. You owe that money and it can be garnished from wages under certain circumstances."

Sweethearts & Heroes discuss bullying with Morristown students

MORRISTOWN -- October was National Bullying Prevention Awareness Month, and an amazing superhero without a cape was in Morristown to show students and educators how they can spread HOPE (Hold On, Possibilities Exist) in their classrooms — and beyond.

Pat Fish, of Sweethearts & Heroes, worked at Morristown Central School earlier this month.

Sweethearts and Heroes is a student empowerment and empathy activation team that aims to prevent bullying and suicide with a focus on the basic components of social-emotional learning (SEL). Sweethearts & Heroes offers a profound, engaging signature presentation that calls for HOPE, Empathy and Action; Circle, which is built on the ancient ritual of communicating in a circle to build empathy; and BRAVES Buddies, which trains older students in bully drills that they, in turn, teach to students in lower grades.

"We are thrilled to welcome Sweethearts and Heroes back to our District this year. We started the year with Pat Fish and his focus centered around the practice of Circles. This unique session fostered a profound sense of community, emphasizing the power of active listening, meaningful

sharing, and the strength found in shared moments of vulnerability," said Superintendent, Staci Vaughn. "The impact of this workshop has been inspiring, as it aligns seamlessly with our commitment to nurturing a positive and inclusive learning environment. I believe that creating such spaces for connection is fundamental to the well-being and success of our students and staff."

The Sweethearts & Heroes team is Tom Murphy, Director and Founder, of St. Albans, Vt.; Ret. U.S. Army Sgt. Rick Yarosh, a HOPE expert and motivational speaker from New York who was burned severely while serving in Iraq; and Pat Fish, BRAVES and Circle Leader, who first saw Sweethearts & Heroes when he was a student in South Glens Falls.

"We're cultivating compassion and empathy in schools again this year, and we're glad that our friends in Morristown invited us back," Murphy said. "We aim to stop students from making destructive decisions and help them treat each other with kindness. We also make our messages sustainable in schools, so that they also have an eventual and sustainable effect on the local community. The spider web effect is powerful, and there's HOPE for everyone."

tend to equate refrigeration with freshness.

"Yes, we are purchasing shelf-stable milk, as opposed to refrigerated milk in cartons," Ogdensburg School Superintendent Kevin Kendall said.

USDA's Food and Nutrition Service officials have also stated that schools can skip milk all together during this shortage.

There are no plans to go that route as of now, Kendall said.

At Potsdam Central, they anticipated having enough milk cartons to get them through the next couple of days.

"After that, we'll be placing Igloo Self-Serving Stations around each cafeteria," PCS Superintendent Jerry Griffin said.

Potsdam will serve milk in the stations for about two weeks.

"After that, we should be able to serve shelf-stable cold milk in cartons until the issue is resolved nationally," Griffin said.

Milk cartons have run out at Norwood-Norfolk Central.

"We have been diligent in searching for alternatives to the hard-to-get cartoned milk," NNCS Superintendent James Cruikshank said.

With their milk carton supply exhausted, the school is using Igloo coolers and cups.

"It's not the solution we all want, but it worked today fairly well," he said.

Long-term, the school is planning to serve shelf-stable milk as well, which comes in a self-serve container, the super said.

"We felt that providing a milk product was better and more nutritious than many alternatives," Cruikshank said. "We should have this product at some point next week."

The superintendents seemed to agree that the shortage is expected to be relatively short-term, possibly lasting into early 2024.

"With the holidays and school vacations in November and December, this should be a short-term issue," Kendall said.

The reason for the shortage is still somewhat of a mystery.

Several superintendents said they were told there was a fire in the milk carton distribution plant, while national stories are reporting production issues with the company that produces the most milk car-

tons.

"As for the reason for this shortage, I'm not completely sure," Cruikshank said. "We've heard there was a fire, but I cannot point my finger at any one situation leading to this."

Congresswoman Applauds Schools "I applaud our Upstate schools that have quickly adapted to serving our students by purchasing milk by the gallon to serve individually to ensure our kids have uninterrupted access to a proper nutritious meal as this milk carton shortage persists," Congresswoman Elise Stefanik.

"I am deeply concerned about the milk carton shortage that threatens to remove our children's access at school to nutritious milk essential for their healthy development. Our dairy farmers in Upstate New York and the North Country work hard to produce nutritious dairy products so that our children can access these essential nutrients for their development. The health benefits from diets that include milk are undeniable which is why I cosponsored the Whole Milk for Healthy Kids Act, legislation that would expand access to whole milk options in schools," said Stefanik.

the budget which will fund two additional officers into the budget, however council will still need to formally accept the grant which is expected to occur at the next city council meeting.

Although the grants could fund three new officers for the city, it could be tough for the city to find candidates to fill them.

Law enforcement has seen sharp declines in candidates in recent years and several area law enforcement agencies are looking to fill vacancies.

Further creating difficulty for Ogdensburg is the lack of stability in the department, which saw deep cuts in recent years.

In a recent interview, Interim City Manager Andrea Smith said the city needs to set a tone for rebuilding the police department and showcasing what the department has to offer.

She said the city police force does have some attractive benefits such as 12-hour shifts and generous leave and vacation time, which she is hopeful those seeking law enforcement careers will be interested in.

County to track number of people using public transportation

CANTON -- St. Lawrence County public transportation will soon have more accurate figures for the number of riders after legislators approved a resolution to purchase an electronic passenger counting system for county buses.

Legislators approved the resolution during the Nov. 13 operations committee meeting.

Director of Planning Jason Pfotenhauer said the new system will be provided in the near future after the county received and accepted on bid to implement the technology.

Passio Technologies was awarded the contract, which will be paid for by state aid, Pfotenhauer said.

Pfotenhauer said the software, which will integrate with existing hardware on the buses, will offer more flexibility and accuracy to track how many passengers are riding buses.

At present, drivers are responsible for counting and tracking the number of passengers who ride county public transportation and must detail where those passengers are picked up.

By implementing the new software, officials say bus routes will be able to run on a tighter schedule

with automatic counting alleviating some burden from drivers.

The new software will also link to an app that riders can utilize to track buses and see maps for routes.

In order to track passengers, riders will not need a smartphone or the app, Pfotenhauer said.

Pfotenhauer said county officials will also be able to see which bus stops are utilized the most and least with the use of the software, something that will aid county planning officials in mapping out routes to best utilize county resources.

Funds for the project come from a New York State grant, Pfotenhauer said, with basic requirements set forth like purchasing equipment that has a shelf life of at least two years.

Though the grant funding is not specific for the counting system, Pfotenhauer said his department felt it was a great investment to pair the software with existing technology on the buses.

In other action, legislators also approved a contract with Bracco International, Inc. for a solar powered bus shelter.

Officials say Bracco was the lone bid and will construct a solar powered bus shelter that will provide automatic evening lighting.

The project will not require any

county contribution and will be reimbursed with state and federal transit funds awarded through the state Department of Transportation (DOT), officials say.

Legislators also approved a \$147,403 budget modification for the Planning Office for public transportation services for the county.

The move comes as legislators were notified of a \$750,625 allocation from a DOT grant that is used to offset the cost of county public transportation.

Legislators had previously budgeted for \$603,222 in 2023, however grant funding exceeded that total, necessitating the budget modification for increased revenue.

Legislators also approved a second resolution for a budget modification to accept \$889,500 in federal funding to offset costs for public transportation in the county.

As part of the funds from the Federal Transit Administration, St. Lawrence County was awarded funds to offset \$396,880 in 2022 and \$525,515 in 2023.

Officials say the funds are part of the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2021.

The resolutions will now move to the full board for final approval in December.

Section 2. Pursuant to Article 11 of the Real Property Tax Law, The St. Lawrence County Board of Legislators hereby exercises the following options for the collection of delinquent taxes in St. Lawrence County.

Section 3. A minimum fee of \$150 shall be charged to each parcel with delinquent taxes on June 1 of the year following the tax bill. This fee shall be used to cover the costs involved in tax foreclosure – primarily abstracting and legal fees.

Section 4. The Tax Enforcement Officer is hereby empowered to take installment payments of delinquent taxes. Said installment payments shall have a payment term of 24 months with payments due every three (3) months. The Tax Enforcement Officer shall add \$2 to all delinquent tax bills to cover the cost of notifying the taxpayer of this right. All Installment Agreements shall be entered into on or before September 30 of the year in which the tax becomes a lien. The Tax Enforcement Officer shall collect twenty-five percent (25%) of the tax due at the time the tax payer signs the Installment Payment Agreement. The remaining seven (7) installments are payable every quarter, with the first one due on December 1, following the Installment Agreement.

Section 5. The Tax Enforcement Officer, who is the County Treasurer, is hereby authorized to accept a deed in lieu of enforcement of collection of delinquent taxes under Article 11.

Section 6. All property acquired by the County pursuant to Article 11, shall be sold in one of the following manners: a.) at a public auction held on the second Saturday in September of the auction year, b.) at a properly advertised private sale subject to approval by the St. Lawrence County Board of Legislators, or c.) at such date and in such manner as established by a validly issued Administrative Order, a validly issued Executive Order, subsequent superseding State Statute, or valid order of a Court with jurisdiction over the matter. Such sales may also be held online if deemed necessary by the County Treasurer.

Section 7. The County sells only its lien and interest, does not warrant title, and will convey only by quitclaim deed. No abstracts will be provided.

Section 8. Any fees associated with the auction and conveyance of properties sold at public auction, to include auctioneer fees, buyer's premium, advertising fees, and recording fees will be the responsibility of the bidder.

Section 9. At a public auction, the highest bidder must tender twenty percent (20%) of the bid or a fifty dollar (\$50.00) deposit, whichever is greater. In addition, the highest bidder is responsible for any buyer's premium, auctioneer fees, and possible advertising fees payable by certified check, money order, cash or credit card. The balance is due within thirty (30) days, also payable by certified check, money order or cash. Confirmation of the sale by the St. Lawrence County Board of Legislators is unnecessary for Article 11 properties sold at public auction. The County must sell to the highest bidder unless the highest bidder defaults. Upon default of the highest bidder, the deposit will be forfeited, and the County reserves the right to accept the bid of the second highest bidder.

Section 10. The former owner, and any other person who may be acting as an agent of the former owner, whether disclosed or undisclosed, is strictly prohibited from bidding at the auction.

Section 11. Any bidder who owns property in St. Lawrence County and is delinquent in their taxes shall be prohibited from bidding at the auction. The term delinquent is defined as prior year tax delinquency. No other person who may be acting as an agent of this bidder shall be allowed to bid at the auction.

FOR THE YEAR 2023, AMENDING LOCAL LAW 3 FOR THE YEAR 1993, "THE ST. LAWRENCE COUNTY INSTALLMENT PAYMENT OF TOWN, CITY, COUNTY, AND SCHOOL REAL PROPERTY TAX LAW"

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of Legislators of the County of St. Lawrence as follows:

Section 1. This local law shall supersede and repeal all prior local laws regarding the installment payment of Town, County, and School Real Property Tax Law.

Section 2. PURPOSE: The purpose of this local law is to designate the St. Lawrence County Treasurer's Office as the St. Lawrence County Real Property Tax Collection Agency and to permit, by option of local School Boards, Town Boards, and City Councils, the installment payment of January Town and County Tax Levies, January City and County Tax Levies and September School Tax Levies. This local law is being adopted pursuant to Title 4-A of Article 9 of the Real Property Tax Law (RPTL, 972-976) and related provisions in Article 13 (RPTL, 1336-1342) which authorizes Counties, Towns, City, and School Districts (other than City School Districts) to establish a coordinated system for the collection of County, Town, City, and School District Taxes in installments.

Section 3. ADMINISTRATION: Upon the enactment of this local law by the County Legislature, the Towns, City, and School Districts of St. Lawrence County may decide, by a majority vote of the Town Board, City Council, or Board of Education, to permit the installment payment of current taxes. The decision to permit the installment payment of taxes requires the local Town/City/School District Tax

Collector must collect and receipt for taxes on the same system the County Treasurer uses. Local Tax Collectors must use the County's computer billing and accounting system. In a Town, City, or School District which has decided to permit installment payment of taxes, each taxpayer may either pay the taxes in full, avoiding the associated charges, or elect to pay taxes in installments, which is accomplished simply by paying the amount designated as "First Installment" on the tax bill. No interest is charged on the installment payments (since the cost associated with the delayed receipt of the tax payments are absorbed into the Service Charge, which in the next Section of this local law, unless the payment is not made on time, in which case the standard rate of interest applies (as defined in Real Property Tax Law).

January Town/County/City Tax Bill: The First Installment is due on or before January 31. Failure to make this payment on time disqualifies Tax Payer from Installment Payment system. The amount to be paid on first Installment must be at least one-third the January Tax Bill plus Service Charge. The second Installment is due on or before March 31. The amount to be paid on the second Installment must be at least one-third the January Tax Bill plus Service Charge. The third and final Installment is due on or before May 31.

September School Tax Bill: The first Installment is due on or before September 30. Failure to make this payment on time disqualifies Tax Payer from Installment Payment System.
