
Canton car fire was arson, police say

CANTON — A 32-year-old Canton man was charged with intentionally lighting a vehicle on fire on Nov. 21 near the entrance to the Mountain Mart convenience store, 103 East Main St., Canton.

Brian Bellinger, 32, of 224 State Hwy 310, was charged with a felony count of fourth-degree arson and a misdemeanor count of fourth-degree criminal mischief. Bellinger was released on appearance tickets to reappear in Canton Town Court on Jan. 8.

"The resulting investigation led to the arrest of one individual, who

was an occupant in the vehicle when it arrived at Mountain Mart. Once the vehicle was parked and the driver entered the convenience

store, the front seat passenger was observed to exit the vehicle and stay outside near the car. The passenger then lit an object on fire and then placed it in the back seat area of the vehicle. The suspect then walked away from the vehicle and into the store as smoke appeared from the vehicle, which then became engulfed in flames," said Canton Police Chief James Santimaw in a press release.

A window of the convenience store was damaged due to the heat from the fire, he said.

On Nov. 21, at approximately 6:30 pm, the Canton Police

More sculptures planned in Canton village

CANTON — Since the fall of 2016, Grasse River Heritage's Sculpture Garden has treated people to an innovative and unique venue at the entrance to Willow Island.

The non-profit organization has now issued a call for large-scale sculptures for a temporary installation at the Sculpture Garden.

"We are now seeking proposals for the fourth group of sculptures. We haven't formally assessed visitor use but we know that the art is being noticed," said Tom Greene, a member of the Grasse River Heritage Sculpture Committee. "Many tell us they love having work by respected



artists so accessible."

Phase 1 of a Willow Island project that includes a trail on the island is underway; a project that Grasse River Heritage representatives have

immersed themselves in. "Grasse River Heritage was involved from the very beginning in conceiving and planning the cooperative Willow Island project. As land owners, we are committed to fostering the public use of the entire island, including spaces for recreation, concerts or theatrical performances, and the sculpture garden," stated Greene. "So, our goal is to support the varied opportunities afforded by the island, but of course we would love to see more people enjoying the sculptures. The Willow Island project should certainly increase traffic and the project may result in additional space for

Both he and Trustee Abby Lee, who is also finishing her service, were given well wishes and appreciation from other board members at the meeting.

"I just want to publicly acknowledge the village of Potsdam of course, the village board members, Abby Lee. We worked a number of years together. Thank you for everything you've done to help make the job easier. And of course you folks as well," Tischler said to the board during his comments at the start of the meeting.

Tischler, who announced

Potsdam pickleball court upgrades planned

POTSDAM — The village is beefing up its pickleball infrastructure with several planned expenditures.

At its meeting Nov. 20, the board of trustees approved spending more than \$15,000 on enhancements to its facility at Sandstoner Park.

Trustees and the mayor voted unanimously to spend \$10,460.74 from its fund balance to purchase six heavy duty pickleball net systems from a bid from Spartan Athletic Company. The nets feature moveable stands with cranks that weigh about 240 pounds.

The purchase will allow the village recreation department to theoretically expand its pickleball capacity to allow more courts to be set up for the popular sport.

The board also voted to use recreation reserve funds to buy a 10-by-12-foot storage shed for \$4,100 and a leaf blower for \$729.98 for the pickleball courts. The total cost of those expenditures is \$4,829.98.

The village constructed six regulation size pickleball courts in the summer of 2022 and the facility has gotten extensive use from local pickleball enthusiasts and from players outside of the area who travel to play on the courts, which are also lighted for night use.

Initial funding for the courts construction came from the sale of a section of Cottage Street to the St. Lawrence Health system for the expansion project at Canton-Potsdam Hospital.

Potsdam's so-called "Pickleplex" is funded and maintained by the village, but the town also contributes

\$12,500 a year to the effort.

Additional pickleball courts are set up inside Pine Street Arena after the winter skating ice is gone for the warm weather season.

The game is known for being accessible to all ages and ability levels, which is part of the attraction for municipal recreation programs looking to engage with a broader sweep of local populations and provide programming for multiple demographics.

Local enthusiasm for the game and for the village courts has been high since the courts were opened in 2022. Tournaments organized by the North Country Pickleball Club at the courts this summer drew players from all over the state.

There is a lifetime membership fee to use the village courts of \$60 for village and town players and \$125 for those who reside outside of the municipalities.

The courts' play schedule is managed through a website called Play-Time Scheduler.

To set up a time to play at the "Pickleplex" or at other pickleball courts in St. Lawrence County visit the play scheduling website at <https://bit.ly/3Dp8eMu>.

To schedule court time at Sandstoner Park, players need to register for a free account on the website.



Giving Trees visible in Canton

CANTON – All over the Canton area, little pine trees decorated with donation envelopes for the Church & Community Giving Tree are appearing, just waiting for generous local folks to make a child's holiday brighter again this year. For the third year, community members will also be helping provide gift boxes for senior citizens who are alone for the holiday season. The envelopes can be found in Canton and surrounding villages at local businesses, schools, and churches.

The program will provide local children from families in need with clothing and toy/gift vouchers, as well as a pair of new PJs and a hand-knitted hat made by a local group who knit through the year to make this happen.

Each family will also receive a Save-A-Lot food voucher to add some sparkle to the holiday meal.

Once again this year, SUNY Canton's women's lacrosse team is pitching in to help local children in need by raising money to help buy new PJs for each child in the program.

Team members, led by head coach Adam Todd, are going door to door, meeting community members and asking them to help provide new winter PJs for children who otherwise might not have them.

As in many past years, local Girl Scouts have also organized ways to help. To assist parents with their wrapping, 100 gift bags and big stacks of tissue paper were collected during a multicultural event by Girl Scouts from many areas of the North Country: the International Rapids, Oswegatchie, Piquet, Raquette Valley, and Nikentsiaki Service Units.

"We are always overwhelmed by how generous people are in our area!" says Cheryl Glidden, Giving Tree Co-Director. "The children who participate in our program are able to have a special Christmas morning when they receive their warm pajamas, a cozy hand-knit hat, and the toys and clothing their parents will purchase with the gift cards they receive. It's heart-warming to know that the parents are able to choose gifts that their children need and will enjoy!"

"Parents know their child's preferences and truly appreciate being able to choose the perfect toy and clothing item for their children," Thadine Wight, Giving Tree Board Member, adds.

A first in 2021 was the addition of a senior gifting component to the program. In 2022, sixty senior citizens joined 384 children in receiving gifts, thanks to the generosity of many local business and individual donors. Again in 2023, Giving Tree will provide a box of gifts for each senior served by the Food Pantry

Senior Squad, which delivers food biweekly to seniors who qualify for food assistance, but who are unable to pick up their groceries in person. Gift bags are also distributed to seniors who lack family and reside in local nursing homes.

"We all think of children when we approach the holidays, and rightly so," says Fran Bailey, Co-Director of Giving Tree. "But there are so many older people who are all alone in our community and we are committed to making their holidays brighter as well."

Gifts and vouchers will be distributed to parents on December 2.

SLC legislators authorize bridge work, inspection services

CANTON — County legislators have approved a supplemental agreement with Barton and Loguidice D.P.C. for additional work

on the Lazy River Road bridge in the Town of Russell that spans the Grasse River.

The additional agreement was passed during the finance committee meeting on Nov. 27.

Barton and Loguidice are

currently providing consulting services for the project after legislators previously approved a resolution for the county to enter into an agreement with the firm earlier this year.

According to officials, the sup-

plemental agreement is required for Barton and Loguidice to provide construction inspection services for the project.

The construction inspection fee will cost \$381,500.

In a separate resolution, legis-

lators approved another supplemental agreement with Stantec Consulting Services Inc. for construction inspection services for the County Route 35 bridge project that spans Trout Brook.

The project, which was awarded through the 2022 Bridge NY Project program, will require the firm's services for construction inspection now, according to Highway Department Superintendent Don Chambers.

The contract for the inspection fee is not to exceed \$358,000, per the terms of the agreement.

In separate action, legislators approved entering into a project with Barton and Loguidice for bidding, construction and inspection services for the Gouverneur Transfer Station Improvement Project.

With the resolution, legislators agreed to modify the 2024 budget for the Solid Waste Department.

Barton and Loguidice have prepared a supplemental proposal to provide bidding assistance, construction administration and general engineering services associated with the construction of the transfer station improvement project. The fee for that supplemental proposal is not to exceed \$40,900, according to the resolution.

Budget modifications from the resolution include decreasing a retained earnings account of \$440,900 and increasing the appropriated fund balance \$440,900.

A subcontractors account will be increased \$400,000 while an engineering design account was increased \$40,900, according to the resolution.

Legislators also approved a resolution to sign a contract with Karol L. Houle-Marolf for cleaning services at the Department of Highways Lisbon outpost.

Houle-Marolf will clean the site, located at 554 County Route 28A in Lisbon, at a rate of \$74.30 per week on a one-year contract beginning on the award date.

In a separate resolution, legislators approved entering into a one-year contract with Meola Enterprise for cleaning services at the department of highways outposts in Potsdam and Russell.

Under the contract, Meola Enterprise will be paid \$70.50 per week for cleaning the Potsdam location and \$57.50 per week for cleaning the Russell Outpost.

Legislators also signed an agreement with C&S Engineering Inc. for preliminary plans and cost estimates for potential upgrades to the center for maintenance and administration operations building.

The facilities, located on Park Street, are in need of review and future recommendations, according to the resolution.

New Highway Department outposts in Russell, Lisbon and Potsdam are nearing completion and projected to come in under budget, creating the opportunity to assess the Park St. facilities, officials say.

As part of the agreement, officials hope to determine if relocating the maintenance operations and administration function would be appropriate at this time.

The

agreement for preliminary plans and cost estimates is not to exceed \$12,500, per the agreement.

Each action will now go before the full board of legislators for final approval during the Dec. 4 meeting.

Town okays labor agreement with highway workers union

POTSDAM — The town board has come to terms on a labor agreement with its town highway workers union.

The board voted unanimously at its November meeting to ratify the tentative collective bargaining agreement for the coming year with the Teamsters Local 687 which represents the highway workers.

The current agreement is set to expire on Dec. 31.

The Teamsters ratified the agreement on Nov. 7.

Under the terms of the agreement, 2023 wages will increase by \$1.75 per hour effective Jan. 1, 2024.

Wages for 2024 will increase by \$1.75 per hour effective Jan. 1, 2025, and 2025 wages will increase by \$1.50 effective Jan. 1, 2026.

Also under the wages portion of the contract, all new employees will have a probationary period of 90

days and will receive 90% of their classifications hourly rate.

The town will pay up to three employees with CDL A endorsements (chosen by the Highway Superintendent) an annual stipend of \$1,000.

Under the agreement's health and hospital insurance section, all employees must enroll in the Teamsters Composite HRA Plan and the town will contribute \$3,600 for single coverage and \$7,200 for two person or family coverage.

The contract also includes stipulations for holidays, vacations and sick leave.

Under the contract, the town will contribute 65% of premium cost for individual health insurance coverage in retirement.

The agreement also stipulates that the town will contribute 65% of premium costs for two person or family coverage but the employee must turn in 150 sick days in order to access dependent coverage.

Stop sign code amendments planned

POTSDAM — The village plans to amend its code to install stop signs at the intersections of Grove and Waverly and Grove and Leroy streets.

However, one village board member wants to rescind the requirement that the board of trustees hold a public hearing and approve a local law to amend village code, and then submit the change to the state for approval, every time they wish to install a stop sign to try to control high speed traffic issues.

The village board of trustees held the required public hearing Nov. 20 on its proposed amendments to Chapter 168, Vehicles and Traffic, Article X, Schedules, Section 168-66, Schedule VIII: Stop Intersections of the Village of Potsdam Municipal Code. The amendments would change the intersections to full stops and the municipality plans to install stop signs at those locations.

During the hearing, the only member of the public to speak about the changes, Larry Zuckerman of Grove Street, thanked the board for taking up the issue to install stop signs at the intersections.

"I live on Grove Street and I walk my dog at different hours and it's crazy. And, it's not just one person," Zuckerman said. "Hopefully the stop sign will help, the enforcement of the stop sign will help."

During the hearing, Trustee Steve Warr questioned the need to go through what he called a "convoluted" process involving the state just to allow the village to install stop signs on its own streets.

"To me it's common sense. Why do we need a local law to decide where we want to put stop signs?" asked Warr during the hearing.

Mayor Ron Tischler said he thought that the requirement was in place to provide a record. Warr suggested that a resolution by the board without a local law would also provide a record.

"Why do we have to have a local law, and pay all the money to the state to update the local law to revise the local law?" Warr said. The trustee said the village could rescind the local law requirement which would allow the board to approve and install stop signs more efficiently.

Warr said he was in favor of the stop signs considered at the public hearing, but raised the issue that

there were other intersections on Leroy and elsewhere where high rates of speeding were chronic. He specifically mentioned the need for a four-way stop at the intersection of Leroy and Bradley. Warr said the people who live near those locations may also want stop signs installed to slow traffic speeds and the village would have to go through the lengthy process yet again. "All of a sudden we are going to get all the people up the other side of Leroy Street going 'They're going 55 miles per hour across Leroy Street,'" he said.

"We have kids coming over the

hill and all four tires are off the ground," Warr said.

"The easiest way to slow people down is stop signs, but if we have to do this every time? It's such a convoluted process, that I don't think we need it. It's a stop sign," he said.

Tischler suggested the board look into whether or not the village could drop the local law requirement with the state.

The board is expected to approve the amendments for full stop intersections at Grove and Waverly and Grove and Leroy streets at a future meeting.

The board approved several resolutions at its November meeting.

tax assessment revaluation services. The RFP submissions are due to Town Assessor Danielle Mitchell by 3:30 p.m. on Dec. 15, 2023.

The board authorized the reeve of unpaid District 1 water and sewer bills onto the 2024 Town and County tax bills.

Town Supervisor Ann Carvill was authorized to sign a service agreement with SLIC Network Solutions for telecommunications services and fiber optics.

Carvill was also authorized to sign a service agreement with NCC Systems and NEC Systems to provide equipment and phone service to the town offices.

CARES funding deadline nears for businesses

CANTON – Small businesses have less than a month to take advantage of what the Canton CARES Small Business Grant Program (CCSBGP) has to offer.

Canton Director of Economic Development Leigh Rodriguez said her office will be accepting applications through Dec. 20 at 4 p.m.

"The CCSBGP has been established to provide grants to micro-enterprises and small businesses with less than 25 employees in the Village that have been impacted by the pandemic," said Rodriguez in a release to North Country This Week. "As such, the primary goal of the program is to address improvements that support customer and staff safety and improve business resiliency related to future occurrences of the virus or other disasters; allowing businesses to prepare for, prevent, or respond to impacts of the pandemic."

Rodriguez pointed out that all types of microenterprises and

small businesses within the Village of Canton will be eligible for consideration, with the exception of not-for-profits. Businesses must commit to demonstrating job retention or creation with at least 51% of jobs taken by or made available to low-moderate income persons. A microenterprise owner can also qualify by meeting the definition of a low-moderate income person.

"All applicants must demonstrate how the proposed use of funds will enable the business to prepare for, prevent, or respond to impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic," she explained.

"Prospective applicants should contact the Office of Economic Development for application information. The OED will screen applicants for program eligibility, and provide materials to those interested," Rodriguez stated.

County prepping for solar eclipse crowd

CANTON -- St. Lawrence County legislators are moving forward with a Planning and Emergency Management Ad Hoc Committee in preparation for the 2024 solar eclipse.

Officials say St. Lawrence County has been identified as one of the "premier locations to observe the total solar eclipse in the United States" but that notoriety may bring a number of unique challenges.

This will be the last total solar eclipse until 2144, 120 years away, he said.

According to multiple resources, including NASA and the American Astronomical Society Solar Eclipse Task Force, the path of the total eclipse will cross through St. Lawrence County, with the very middle of the eclipse crossing the bottom third of the county.

That will occur between 3:20 p.m. to roughly 3:26 p.m. and will last for two and a half to three and a half minutes.

County officials say they expect anywhere from 50,000 to 150,000 visitors to the county, which will "significantly contribute to the local tourism economy and marketing of the county."

Despite the positives that will come with enhanced tourism, officials say the influx of visitors will contribute to a "short, although tremendous impact on resources available in the county."

That impact could greatly and

negatively affect emergency services and response times, officials say.

In the best interest of public safety, officials opted to organize a local planning effort and committee to advise and make recommendations to the board of legislators on a formal safety plan.

The committee will advise legislators policies related to public safety, public health, traffic control, community events, marketing and emergency planning sufficient to address the crowds expected in St. Lawrence County.

According to Emergency Services Director Matt Denner, Emergency Services has been drafting an emergency management plan for the event and has distributed it to legislators for consideration.

Denner said some of the unique challenges the county will face include transportation, with limited highways in the central zone of the eclipse.

Some areas may face mass congestion, especially with viewers pulling off to the side of the highway or other public highways for viewing.

That mass congestion will also potentially cause issues with cell phone coverage, with thousands of extra devices taking up the already limited bandwidth in many areas.

The inability to make calls in the event of a medical emergency are a concern, especially now that land lines are no longer prevalent, Denner previously told legislators.

Denner said the influx of tourists will also provide Emergency

Services with an opportunity to exercise multiple plans and annexes that typically are only simulated as well.

One concern many at the state and county level have raised is the potential for cell coverage to be limited as a result of the influx of people.

Denner said cell phone coverage is a primary concern that has already been identified by the state, noting that the possibility of adding temporary cell towers has been raised to mitigate those concerns.

Questions onslaught of parking tickets

If you've visited the village of Potsdam in recent weeks, you have probably been thanked by being fined for contributing to the economy of our community—sending you home with a parking ticket.

I personally have witnessed the escalation in ticketing, passing dozens of cars in the past few weeks adorned with the “thank you for visiting Potsdam” parking ticket.

You may have noticed that Potsdam's downtown streets are now being roamed with yellow-vested ticketing agents. As a life-long resident, I was curious by this new sight. Upon some investigation, I discovered that these “parking enforcement officers” were a very recent addition to the village payroll—being generously compensated with your tax dollars at \$21.85 an hour.

I must say, the commitment and relentless exhibited by these officers in handing out tickets is indeed commendable in a day and age where few actually want to work. The Deputy Clerk's desk—adorned with rows upon rows of parking tickets and an unnaturally large stack of them piled high waiting to be sorted—is a testament to the commitment these enforcement officers exude.

And while they are simply doing what they were hired to do, they work at the behest of our Village Trustees. Trustees who were elected by the residents and taxpayers of Potsdam. Trustees who were elected to make the village of Potsdam better for the residents and taxpayers.

Per the Nov. 6 village board meeting, they approved a \$5,717 study to “analyze downtown parking.” While I assume the study could potentially be useful, what would truly inform our community is a comprehensive report outlining the annual expenses tied to the current meters—including the wages, taxes, and payroll costs associated with the parking enforcement officers—juxtaposed against the yearly revenue generated from the existing meters.

I advocate that such a study also takes into account the economic contribution of the demographic our village claims to want to attract—students and young professionals. These individuals play a vital role in our community's growth, and they should not be marginalized by anti-community parking policies that hinder their participation in our local economy.

If you, like me, care about our community, or are just tired of being

'Detective' approach to patient ailments

CANTON – With the COVID pandemic out of the limelight, many people are not giving a second thought as to how an Infectious Diseases (ID) specialist may be able to assist them with their healthcare. The ID team with St. Lawrence Health (SLH) has office hours at its Medical Campus at 6119 US Route 11 in Canton, and are regularly seen tending to patients at Canton-Potsdam Hospital.

Daniel Soule, DO; and Jamie Gibson, FNP-C, are the two main providers in the ID team. They have expertise in anti-infectives, with a foundation in Internal Medicine. They are sometimes asked by colleagues to provide their skills by working up a patient's symptoms and using a "detective" approach in discovering the patient's ailment.

"Infectious Diseases is a specialty in medicine that does not necessarily focus on an organ system and its pathology, like cardiology and the heart, or pulmonology with the lung,

but instead focuses on outside factors that can impact an organ system's function," Dr. Soule said. "This allows us to encounter pathology across all different organ systems, across a wide range of ages. Often, if we can identify an infection, there may be a cure or treatment that will help our patients feel better after only a short period of time."

Some common health concerns patients turn to Dr. Soule and Ms. Gibson for include:

Recurrent fevers without explanation

Concerns for an undiagnosed infection that may be causing symptoms or lab abnormalities that have not yet been explained or diagnosed

Concern for sexually transmitted infections

Management of chronic viral illnesses, like HIV or Hepatitis B

Management of infections that can be regulated by a Primary Care Provider, but are either difficult to treat

or the provider requests assistance in overseeing treatment (such as HIV, Hepatitis C, Lyme Disease, recurrent skin and soft tissue infections)

Infections of prosthetic materials

Sexually transmitted infections (STIs) are diagnosed on a regular basis, and while HIV is no longer a front page news article, it is still a global and local health concern, and can affect any person, regardless of age, gender, or sexual orientation. With the four colleges in our area, Ms. Gibson finds herself educating patients on a regular basis about STIs, viral hepatitis, and HIV.

PREP can benefit the community by decreasing the transmission of HIV. Furthermore, part of PREP management is as-needed screening for non-HIV sexually transmitted infections (STIs), as well as routine quarterly screening for other STIs.

St. Lawrence Health pays tribute to EMS and rural health

Most Northern New Yorkers don't give much thought about the fact that when they need to go to the Emergency Department or visit a friend at Canton-Potsdam, Gouverneur, or Massena hospital, they are walking into a rural hospital.

North Country residents simply know they are going to the local hospital. Rural healthcare is an actual category among NY State institutions, and the three hospitals operated under the umbrella of St. Lawrence Health (SLH) are being recognized throughout November as being a strong backbone in Rural Health.

Also of special note this month is that Patient Transport Week is being observed, and SLH is proud to be the owning organization of Seaway Valley Ambulance in Massena.

SLH Regional Director of Planning Albert Hanson pointed out rural hospitals are critical institutions for our regional communities.

"Our hospitals are where our neighbors come to receive high quality care without having to travel several hours to receive it," he said. "Rural hospitals historically have had to care for a generally older population with multiple comorbidities, such as diabetes, cancer, and other diseases, which has made it imperative that we provide quality care, right here at home."

SLH's hospitals have to be more agile and creative in their approach to offering excellent care and being a member of their communities.

To provide more advanced care to their patients, Canton-Potsdam Hospital (CPH) is in the middle of a multi-million dollar Regional Care Pavilion expansion project; Massena Hospital (MH) is preparing for the opening of a Wound Care Center; and Gouverneur Hospital (GH) is advancing with new equipment and technology.

SLH President Donna McGregor stated the Regional Care Pavilion is more than a construction project.

"It's not only the bricks and mortar that go into a project like this,

but it's the soul of the community. This building will be around for generations, and what we are doing today is really laying the groundwork for health care in the future for the North Country," she noted.

SLH, its hospitals, and its affiliation with Rochester Regional Health make it a very unique organization.

"SLH is special due to its story. From its inception with CPH and GH, to adding MH in 2020, and our affiliation with Rochester Regional at the beginning of this year, SLH has a focus on ensuring community members will have access to healthcare in their own towns. SLH is committed to bringing skilled specialists to each of its hospitals for the benefit and convenience of their patients," Mr. Hanson said.

SLH has made great strides in working with neighboring institutions, such as Clarkson University, to provide the opportunity to train and hire emergency management services personnel. Clarkson has established a nine-month Paramedic Program that has its students job-ready upon completion.

SLH Director of Emergency Medical Services Mark Deavers pointed out they are currently hiring drivers, paramedics, and emergency medical technicians.

"We complete approximately 40 transports between hospitals each week, but that is dependent upon the availability we have of personnel," he said. "With more trained team members, we would be able to take on more transports, which would significantly reduce the wait time for patients who need to be moved to another hospital."

The majority of SVA's transports are within St. Lawrence County, yet many are also transferred to outlying hospitals in Rochester, Syracuse, or Vermont. As the entire North Country is facing a shortage of rescue squad personnel, SLH is taking steps to increase the availability of these trained professionals.

SLC youth Jiu Jitsu team successful in Syracuse

NORFOLK — Several North Country Martial Arts Academy members traveled to Syracuse to compete in a Jiu-Jitsu tournament at the OnCenter in Syracuse.

From five years to fifty-five years of age, the north-country natives were organized into divisions based on age, weight, sex, and skill to test their grappling abilities. Participants are set up in a bracket and have 4-6 matches per division.

"While securing a submission like an armbar or triangle is the ultimate goal, it's difficult versus an evenly matched opponent," said Coach Spencer Paige. "There is also

a points-scoring system."

Competitors score two points for a takedown, three points for passing the guard, and four points for mount control, Paige said.

Throughout the match, a referee issues points as they are earned while another referee keeps score. If no submission has happened by the end of the match, the competitor with the most points gets the win.

"This was a very special tournament because it was the first competition the academy's youth team had entered, he said.

There were over 700 registered competitors and teams from around the Northeast in atten-

dance.

"It wasn't all sunshine and rainbows, there were some tears shed and some lessons learned the hard way. However, learning to persevere through these struggles and not quitting helps them to develop character and a type of resilience that they will carry with them throughout their lives. This is one of the major benefits of participating in martial arts," Paige said.

The group is already back to training for the next tournament in January!

DEC warns hunters not to use drones to recover game

The Department of Environmental Conservation is reminding St. Lawrence County hunters that drones are not allowed to be used to assist in the recovery of hunter-harvested game such as deer or bear.

"Recently, DEC has received inquiries about the potential use of unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs or drones) to assist with the recovery of hunter-harvested deer or bear," a press release from DEC said.

Tracking and recovery of a deer or bear are part of the hunt, and New York laws do not allow drones to be used in this way.

Drones are defined and regulated as aircraft by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), and aircraft may not be used to aid deer or bear hunters. This applies to both hobby/recreational drone pilots and drone pilots flying under FAA commercial regulations.

"Confusion comes because the same section of law that prohibits use of aircraft also prohibits use of dogs to aid in hunting deer or bear," DEC said. "However, a sepa-

rate section of law authorizes DEC to regulate and license the use of leashed tracking dogs specifically to aid in the recovery of deer and bear. The law does not make a similar provision for aircraft, including drones, and DEC cannot regulate or license the use of drones without authorizing statute.
