Crime rising in Massena, police say

MASSENA -- Incident numbers requiring police intervention continue to rise at an exponential rate in the village of Massena and Police Chief Jason Olson is trying to solve the root cause.

At a recent village trustee board meeting, Olson presented the department's October figures, noting that from August to October the number of incidents reported has nearly doubled.

"We've gone up 200 incidents per month in the last two months. So I don't really understand what the increase is on that but I'm gonna have to do a little bit of digging to figure out maybe if there's a trend there," Olson said.

Officers issued 69 uniform traffic tickets, conducted 28 traffic stops, made 15 mental health arrests, conducted 47 penal law arrests and responded to 17 motor vehicle accidents in the month of October, Olson said.

Olson also said detectives seized 108 grams of cocaine, 72 grams of crack cocaine, 26 grams of MDMA, executed two search warrants, made 24 felony arrests, issued four felony arrest warrants, two misdemeanor warrants and conducted three drug buys.

According to Olson, MDMA, also known as ecstasy in tablet form and Molly or Mandy in crystal form, is a new

Massena considers changes to spring cleanup in village

MASSENA -- It may be a distant thought for residents but village trustees and the Department of Public Works are working on plans for spring clean-up.

During the village board meeting held Nov. 20, DPW Superintendent Marty Miller and village trustees discussed implementing a pickup system during spring cleanup, one that has not been used in years.

The idea has been kicking around for a few months now but trustees appear poised to take action in the near future, possibly changing spring cleanup from a two-week window to a multi-month period that would allow residents to schedule an appointment for a pickup.

Dates would be available based on zones that would be established around the village, allowing DPW workers to clean up specific sections of the village over set periods of time.

Trustee Ken McGowan has been a supporter of the modified system, saying the broad window would make it easier for residents and crews alike to clean up around the village.

McGowan has suggested using vouchers as they are used now but to allow residents more time to use them.

Landlords would still have the same two-week window in May to participate as they currently do, McGowan said.

If the village were to institute the plan, McGowan

Brewery plan changes location

OGDENSBURG -- Plans to bring a brewery to Ogdensburg's River District will move forward, but at a new location, according to William Hosmer.

That has left the city with a decision on what to do with a piece of land they sold to him last year.

Ogdensburg City Council agreed to sell a portion of Main Street property for \$10,000 to Hosmer for River Street Brewing Company.

The plan was met with open arms from members of the public and council who were enthused about more development in the city's River District.

Hosmer purchased just over half of an existing vacant lot which measured around one acre.


At the time he shared plans to build a 2,200 square-foot brewery and taproom and expected construction to move swiftly, however plans have changed for a variety of reasons.

As part of the agreement when the sale was made, Hosmer said he would return the property to the city should the development not take place within three years.

Although the three years have not yet passed, Hosmer says he plans to develop the brewery at a nearby location. He has requested that the city allow him to keep the property to sell to another developer at the same price he purchased it from the city.

Hosmer, a former city councilor, says the

City police will provide airport security

OGDENSBURG -- Despite signals that the Ogdensburg Bridge and Port Authority would like to provide its own security at the airport, city police will provide the service in 2024.

The OBPA owns and operates the Ogdensburg International Airport

and is required by law to use police officers to provide security for outgoing flights.

The service comes at a high cost, according to OBPA officials, who hope to see legislation passed that would have saved them as much as \$100,000 annually.

Earlier this year bills sponsored by Assemblyman Scott Gray and Mark Walczyk would have changed

state law to allow OBPA to provide security at the airport without using police officers.

The bill would allow the OBPA to hire their own peace officers for airport security.

The OBPA currently contracts with the Ogdensburg City Police Department for the service. But it comes at a very high cost as the OBPA pays the full cost of two police officers.

Although the previous contract was for \$185,000, overtime expenses put the bill closer to \$260,000.

Officials at the OBPA have expressed concerns about the cost, but the bills pushed by local state representatives failed to make it to the Senate floor in 2023.

On Monday the city agreed to a new contract that will have the OBPA pay the city \$240,000 to

cover the full cost of two full-time police positions.

Most of the city council seemed to welcome the news, but Councilor John Rishe suggested that perhaps the OBPA should consider contracting the service with St. Lawrence County Sheriff's Department.

Rishe's suggestion was likely considered by the authority as the agreement explains that both state police and St. Lawrence County Sheriff's Department both declined similar offers.

Additionally the contract assures that the city will receive the full agreed amount even if OBPA chooses to end the contract.

The resolution passed in a 4-0 vote with councilor Michael Powers and Mayor Jeffrey Skelly absent from the meeting.

Massena will seek new police officer, and DPW operator

MASSENA -- Massena village trustees took action on a number of personnel changes during the board meeting held Nov. 20.

Trustees approved the hiring of Janelle Panther as a dispatcher for the Massena Police Department.

In other action, trustees also approved a resolution to canvas for a new patrol officer with the police department.

Police Chief Jason Olson said if all goes according to plan, he will be able to hire an officer to fill the spot of an anticipated departure in the coming months.

"If we identify a suitable candidate prior to the next academy starting, which is going to be starting in late January this year, then if this all adds up the way I think it's going to end up, the day that that new officer starts is the day that the officer that is currently working will be leaving. There shouldn't be any overlap," Olson said.

Trustees also approved a resolution to begin canvassing for a motor equipment operator for the Department of Public Works.

DPW Superintendent Marty Miller said the hire is in anticipation of a retirement in December. Miller said his plan is to be able to come to the December board meeting to approve the retirement and hiring of the two simultaneously.

The new hire would then be able to start Jan. 1, which is the official retirement date of the current employee, he said.

In other action, trustees approved canvassing for a plant operator.

Through the action, trustees also changed the position title to Wastewater Plant Operator Trainee.

Miller said he is anticipating another retirement sometime next summer, something that has led him to request a trainee position.

According to Miller, if he were to hire someone in the near future they can begin training for the position while the current operator is on staff. The trainee position will also be in the 2024/25 budget, he said.

MCS still weighing in on alternative language courses

MASSENA -- Massena Central School District Board of Education members continue to debate the merits of alternative language courses for elementary students. Two board members, Patricia Murphy and Susan Lambert both spoke in favor of such courses and immersion programs to begin alternative language education for elementary students. Both members say numerous studies have shown that young children who begin learning other languages in elementary school grasp languages much faster. "Maybe they could do some-

thing in the UPK (universal pre-kindergarten), like an immersion. Little kids pick that stuff up really quickly," Murphy said. Murphy also mentioned that she remembers songs from kindergarten that were taught in Spanish. "It's just easier to do it when they're younger. I think it's something worth exploring," she said. Lambert, who has lived internationally before, said introducing children to another language at a younger age is the best approach. "Living for almost seven years in Europe and Asia, I am telling you how stupid I felt because you speak one language. These people standing next to you, some of

them older people that didn't even get through our equivalent of elementary school, who could speak at least two languages," Lambert said. District officials have researched the possibility of language education for elementary students before, including earlier this year. One district goal set last year included researching the feasibility of beginning integrated cultural experiences at the elementary level, including "exposure to foreign languages." Board Member Robert LeBlanc requested the report, which was completed in February. According to the report present-

ed to the board in February, only one school district locally offers a similar program that board members hope to incorporate at Massena. Former Superintendent Pat Brady said in February that a similar program in Lake Placid provided some French and Spanish programming, the closest the district could find that involved a teacher actually teaching the languages to young children. Brady also said research suggested there would be benefits in providing language software with games and activities to expose children to the languages. At the most recent board meeting, Board President Paul Haggett said those sorts of resources may be something that Massena could draw upon, "whether they be a

presentation or teacher visits to the Lake Placid system." Though it appears board members are in support of the new measure, Superintendent Ron Burke said implementing the programs may prove difficult due to a foreign language teacher shortage. Burke said one issue is identifying the number of teachers needed to teach both languages, suggesting it may be important to assess what other districts are doing to meet the need. "I think we need to take a look at what some other schools are doing as far as providing at the elementary level," he said. Burke said it is important for Massena to see what the model would be, allowing the board to again present those findings for public consideration.

Vet who threatened lawsuit against fire department to reopen practice Dec. 28

MASSENA -- Dr. Wilfredo Perez, the veterinarian who filed a notice of claim against the towns of Louisville and Massena along with nine fire departments after his clinic burned down, has had his license to practice veterinary medicine temporarily suspended. In an email sent to North Country This Week, officials with the vet clinic said Perez's license was temporarily suspended. No reason was given for the suspension, however officials with the clinic say business will resume Dec. 28.

The clinic will also have a new veterinarian joining the staff in the new year, allowing the clinic "to provide our clients with quality care, later hours, faster service and weekend care," according to the email. Perez was embroiled in controversy earlier this year when he obtained counsel and served notice to the municipalities and fire departments who responded to the fire at his clinic "for negligence and other related causes of action in light of the fact that the firefighters who responded, and the way they responded to the fire, created a special relationship with Dr. Perez such that liability attaches," according to court documents.

According to court documents, Perez was seeking \$4.5 million from the municipalities and fire departments. The notice of claim is a legal prerequisite to bringing a lawsuit against a municipality.

Departments from Massena, Louisville, Akwesasne, Potsdam, Madrid, West Stockholm, Norfolk, Brasher-Winthrop and Waddington initially responded to the fire just after 3 a.m. on Oct. 28, 2022.

The fire then rekindled later that morning, leading to a total loss of the structure.

Departments who responded to the rekindle included Massena Louisville, Norfolk, Brasher-Winthrop, Madrid and Waddington responded, with Massena Volunteer Fire responding with an aerial truck as well, documents state.

With the filing, attorneys for Perez attempted to call into question why area fire departments that responded initially to the fire had removed their personnel and resources from the scene prior to the first rekindle around noon that day.

Documents also state, "upon information and belief, only the Louisville Fire Department responded to the second rekindling

that occurred on Saturday, October 29, 2022. Thus, the aforementioned fire departments may bear some or all responsibility for the loss suffered by Dr. Perez." No injuries were reported but at least two dogs were lost in the fire. Java Veterinary Center also offered boarding services for North Country Residents.

In an exhibit attached to the court documents, then Assistant Chief Patrick O'Brien of the Massena Volunteer Fire Department wrote a letter addressed to Dr. Perez, explaining the "Chief of Louisville Fire will make the final determination as to cause of the fire utilizing the investigative reports provided to him by the fire investigators from the St. Lawrence County Fire Investigation Team as well as the New York State Office of Fire Prevention and Control," per New York State General Municipal Law §204-D.

O'Brien is now the chief of the volunteer fire department. According to the letter, the clinic was within the Louisville Fire District, leading other departments to act in support of Louisville.

"The mutual aid departments responding to assist Louisville Fire are not involved in the cause and origin determination or subsequent fire investigation," O'Brien wrote.

Following the fire, a GoFundMe was established, raising over \$64,000 before the organizer disabled new donations.

In total, 532 people donated to rebuild the veterinary center. Benefit events were also held shortly after, including a benefit dinner at Eyland's restaurant, the Massena Moose Lodge and a benefit Christmas concert.

Massena village dump under lock and key following misuse

MASSENA -- The Department of Public Works has taken to locking the gate at the village dump after individuals and businesses outside of the village began dumping at the site.

In a recent village trustees meeting, Trustee Ken McGowan mentioned the issues, saying that only

village residents are allowed to utilize the site.

"I know (DPW Superintendent) Marty (Miller) says he reopened it and I know he'd been in contact with Massena PD to make it known. It's meant for us (village residents), not for business or commercial use and not for out-of-towners," McGowan said.

The conversation was prompted

after it was discovered that an individual was found to be dumping over a dozen large stumps at the site.

A camera that was previously at the location was also found across the road, Miller said.

"We called the individual and got some slack but he had come in, removed them. You hate to see that. You know, that's a nice thing that we do for the community as well," Miller

said.

McGowan said incidents like that put DPW and the village in a tough spot, with social media sometimes painting the village in a bad light.

"Once he hits Facebook, you know that (it looks like) DPW are the bad guys but which isn't the case here, right and you get one person doing the wrong thing. It's like, you gotta lock the gate. You know, it's not right,"

McGowan said.

Mayor Greg Paquin said the village may consider adding more cameras around the community, including one at the dump site, to combat illegal activity.

"We're still under contract with the company that we're with now. I am exploring other options but we can certainly add an additional camera there," said Police Chief Jason Olson.

A Celebration of Life will be held at the convenience of the family at a later date.


Bruce was born July 10, 1958, in Massena son of the late Joseph and Phyllis (Leggus) Riley.

County talks bridge work

CANTON — County legislators have approved a supplemental agreement with Barton and Loguidice D.P.C. for additional work on the Lazy River Road bridge in the Town of Russell that spans the Grasse River.

The additional agreement was passed during the finance committee meeting on Nov. 27.

Barton and Loguidice are currently providing consulting services for the project after legislators previously approved a resolution for the county to enter into an agreement with the firm earlier this year.

According to officials, the supplemental agreement is required for Barton and Loguidice to provide construction inspection services for the project.

The construction inspection fee will cost \$381,500.

In a separate resolution, legislators approved another supplemental agreement with Stantec Consulting Services Inc. for construction inspection services for the County Route 35 bridge project that spans Trout Brook.

The project, which was awarded through the 2022 Bridge NY Project program, will require the firm's services for construction inspection now, according to Highway Department Superintendent Don Chambers.

The contract for the inspection fee is not to exceed \$358,000, per the terms of the agreement.

In separate action, legislators approved entering into a project with Barton and Loguidice for bidding, construction and inspection services for the Gouverneur Transfer Station Improvement Project.

With the resolution, legislators agreed to modify the 2024 budget for the Solid Waste Department.

Barton and Loguidice have prepared a supplemental proposal to provide bidding assistant, construction administration and general engineering services associated with the construction of the transfer station improvement project. The fee for that supplemental proposal is not to exceed \$40,900, according to the

resolution.

Budget modifications from the resolution include decreasing a retained earnings account of \$440,900 and increasing the appropriated fund balance \$440,900.

A subcontractors account will be increased \$400,000 while an engineering design account was increased \$40,900, according to the resolution.

Legislators also approved a resolution to sign a contract with Karol L. Houle-Marolf for cleaning services at the Department of Highways Lisbon outpost.

Houle-Marolf will clean the site, located at 554 County Route 28A in Lisbon, at a rate of \$74.30 per week on a one-year contract beginning on the award date.

In a separate resolution, legislators approved entering into a one-year contract with Meola Enterprise for cleaning services at the department of highways outposts in Potsdam and Russell.

Under the contract, Meola Enterprise will be paid \$70.50 per week for cleaning the Potsdam location and \$57.50 per week for cleaning the Russell Outpost.

Legislators also signed an agreement with C&S Engineering Inc. for preliminary plans and cost estimates for potential upgrades to the center for maintenance and administration operations building.

The facilities, located on Park Street, are in need of review and future recommendations, according to the resolution.

New Highway Department outposts in Russell, Lisbon and Potsdam are nearing completion and projected to come in under budget, creating the opportunity to assess the Park St. facilities, officials say.

As part of the agreement, officials hope to determine if relocating the maintenance operations and administration function would be appropriate at this time.

The agreement for preliminary plans and cost estimates is not to exceed \$12,500, per the agreement.

Each action will now go before the full board of legislators for final approval during the Dec. 4 meeting.

Tax collections stay flat in Village of Massena at \$6.3 million

MASSENA -- Tax collections for the village of Massena were on a similar pace compared to last year after the village collected just over \$6.3 million during the first quarter of the fiscal year.

According to Village Treasurer Kevin Felt, the village took in 91.8% of the total amount due, which was very close to the 91.3% taken in last year by the village.

Felt said the village is returning unpaid taxes in the amount of \$561,247.96 on 335 parcels which were not paid in full to the county treasurer for collection. Interest and fees owed on the parcels totals \$39,981.46.

Once returned, Felt said the village will receive a payment from the county totaling \$601,229.42 sometime in February.

Those totals compare to \$632,948.16 received last year on 285 parcels after the village returned the unpaid taxes to the county.

Felt said the figures for this year may change slightly after the village received a bad check for tax collections.

"We are giving them time to try and make good on it. I have let the county know. I may just have to come back with updated figures because it's not included in the total," Felt said.

In other news, sales tax collections dropped by 5.77% for the first quarter of the fiscal year for the village of Massena, following a trend that was seen statewide.

According to Felt, the village took in \$615,894 for the first quarter, which was a \$37,699 drop compared to the same period last year.

Felt said the village has budgeted \$2,350,000 for the fiscal year, noting that inflation played a big role in sales tax collections last year.

Felt also informed trustees that the pension system bills have been distributed by the Comptroller's Office for the current budget year, with \$397,073 due on Dec. 15 for the Employee's Retirement System. That represents an 8.8% increase compared to a year ago.

The village will also pay \$651,502 for the Police and Fire Retirement System, a 10.3% increase from a year ago, officials say.

According to Felt, by utilizing the prepayment option of paying the

invoices by Dec. 15, the village will save \$7,540 total.

Sales tax collections are also off pace from the same period last year, according to Felt.

The village received \$615,894 from the county, a \$37,699 decrease from the same fiscal quarter compared to last year. Felt said that decline is 5.77%.

The village has budgeted \$2,350,000 for the fiscal year.

According to Felt, the village also made the semi-annual interest payment on the Water Treatment Plant Upgrade serial bond, in the amount of \$14,512.50, which was due on Oct. 15.

The final payment on that bond will be made in April 2026.

The village also paid a principal

and interest payment on the street sweeper bond, which was also due on Oct. 15.

Felt said that bond payment totaled \$45,895.50, with that bond expected to be paid off in April 2027.

In other action trustees approved a letter of agreement with Rust Charles to conduct the annual audit of the financial statements for the village for the fiscal year ending May 31, 2023. The estimated fee is \$17,000.

Trustees also approved budget modifications for the Department of Public Works to cover the cost of new water billing software. Those modifications total \$5,000, \$5,000 and \$9,018 each.

New York State Health Department warns of synthetic weed

MASSENA — New York State Department of Health officials are issuing a warning about synthetic cannabinoids that have been solid in the Mohawk Valley.

Officials say the samples contained synthetic opioids that can create a deadly cocktail when ingested. Two samples taken of the can-

nabinoids, often known as K2 and Spice among other names, were purchased at local convenience stores and contained five Novel Psychoactive Substances (NPS),

including two potent novel synthetic opioids.

“Synthetic cannabinoids should never be confused for legally sold cannabis,” New York State Health Commissioner Dr. James McDonald said. “These synthetic cannabinoids often contain harmful substances that have a range of effects from euphoria to causing extreme anxiety, disorientation, hallucinations, and psychosis. However, it is rare to find opioids in the product and this new addition can cause overdose or even death. If you witness someone experiencing an overdose, treat it as an opioid overdose and administer naloxone as soon as possible.”

Officials say synthetic cannabinoids are not natural products but rather chemical mixtures created in a laboratory to mimic THC, which is the main psychoactive ingredient in marijuana.

Over the years, hundreds of different synthetic cannabinoid chemicals are manufactured and sold, with new ones appearing each year, state officials say.

According to state officials, the synthetic marijuana is then sold in convenience stores, gas stations, head shops, and bodegas, as well as by individuals to users who often

believe they are legal and safe.

In some cases synthetic marijuana can have unpredictable and harmful effects, officials say.

“The Department reminds New Yorkers that naloxone can be an effective antidote for opioid overdose including synthetic opioids and should be used for any suspected overdose including incidents where it is reported the individual only used a synthetic cannabinoid, like K2 or Spice, or other pills or drugs including stimulants such as cocaine and methamphetamine,” officials said in a press release.

Two samples tested by the state Department of Health came in packaging labeled “Gorilla Glue Bags,” however officials in the department say synthetic cannabinoid products can be purchased in bulk and repackaged individually for consumer sale in a variety of packaging.





Highlighting St. Lawrence County historians

CANTON — St. Lawrence County has a long and vibrant history. What we know about such history is because people preserved it and passed it down for over 220 years. Up until 1919, the task of doing so was left up to local governments and everyday citizens. With the passing of the New York Historians Law 57.07 on April 11, 1919, that task became the job of the local municipal Historians. The law states that every municipality in New York State is required to appoint a Historian.

The Historian is a sworn in officer of the municipality. The Historians have 4 areas that they are required to complete each year. They are Research and Writing, Teaching and Public Preservations, Historic Preservation, and Organization, Advocacy and Tourism Promotion. St. Lawrence County has 41 town/village Historians, 1 city Historian, and 1 County Historian. Each one is a dedicated official that upholds the Historians Law to the best of their abilities with the funding they are allotted.

St. Lawrence County Historian Nancy LaFaver believes that it was time that these dedicated Historians were recognized. St. Lawrence County Administrator, Ruth Doyle and the St. Lawrence County Board of Legislators agreed. Nancy created an exhibit titled "History in the Hallway". Easels and tables were set up along the main hallway of the St. Lawrence County Courthouse. On the easels and tables were framed posters showcasing each of the Historians. Each had a picture of the Historian and a bio describing their work.

At 5:30 pm on October 2, the exhibit was opened with a reception. Then at the Board of Legislators' meeting immediately following the reception, a resolution was passed declaring October St. Lawrence County History Month. Chairman Dave Forsythe called the County Historian to the podium to recognize each Historian present.

Nancy asked those Historians to stand and be recognized for their work. It should be noted that there are four Association of Public Historians of New York State Registered Historians in St. Lawrence County and all four were present. Those four are Julie Madlin-Ogdensburg, Bryan Thompson-DeKalb, MaryEllen Casselman- Massena and Nancy LaFaver- Lisbon and St. Lawrence County. The road to being a Registered Historian in New York State is a rigorous one that takes several years to complete. This is a distinction that should be honored as well.

To continue the St. Lawrence County History Month celebration, The St. Lawrence County Historians' meeting was held on Oct. 21 in Canton at the Public Safety Building's conference room.

New York State Historian Devin Lander made the trip to Canton to further recognize the Historians. This is the first time the New York State Historian has ever come to St. Lawrence County. He spoke about the NYS 250 the Commemorative Commission to celebrate the 250th anniversary of the Revolutionary War and what that commission is working on doing for those celebratory activities. He was impressed to hear that St. Lawrence County had already formed a 250th Commemorative Commission as well as one town having passed a resolution forming their own 250th Commemorative Commission.

That town is Lisbon. He spoke of some other initiatives at the state level, some things he is doing around the state, such as his podcast, "In a NY Minute" and he finished by answering questions from the historians. Lunch was provided for all from Morgan's Munchies and Catering. The meeting ended with a Walk and Talk about the Government Complex Buildings, inside and out, (including the parking lot where it is rumored that Civil War General William Goodrich's horse is still buried underneath.)

Taking a 'detective' approach to discovering ailments

CANTON – With the COVID pandemic out of the limelight, many people are not giving a second thought as to how an Infectious Diseases (ID) specialist may be able to assist them with their healthcare. The ID team with St. Lawrence Health (SLH) has office hours at its Medical Campus at 6119 US Route 11 in Canton, and are regularly seen tending to patients at Canton-Potsdam Hospital.

Daniel Soule, DO; and Jamie Gibson, FNP-C, are the two main providers in the ID team. They have expertise in anti-infectives, with

a foundation in Internal Medicine they are sometimes asked by colleagues to provide their skills by working up a patient's symptoms and using a "detective" approach in discovering the patient's ailment.

"Infectious Diseases is a specialty in medicine that does not necessarily focus on an organ system and its pathology, like cardiology and the heart, or pulmonology with the lung, but instead focuses on outside factors that can impact an organ system's function," Dr. Soule said. "This allows us to encounter pathology across all different organ systems,

across a wide range of ages. Often, if we can identify an infection, there may be a cure or treatment that will help our patients feel better after only a short period of time.

Some common health concerns patients turn to Dr. Soule and Ms. Gibson for include:

Recurrent fevers without explanation

Concerns for an undiagnosed infection that may be causing symptoms or lab abnormalities that have not yet been explained or diagnosed

Concern for sexually transmitted infections

Management of chronic viral illnesses, like HIV or Hepatitis B

Management of infections that can be regulated by a Primary Care Provider, but are either difficult to treat or the provider requests assistance in overseeing treatment (such as HIV, Hepatitis C, Lyme Disease, recurrent skin and soft tissue infections)

Infections of prosthetic materials

Sexually transmitted infections (STIs) are diagnosed on a regular basis, and while HIV is no longer a front page news article, it is still a global and local health concern, and

can affect any person, regardless of age, gender, or sexual orientation. With the four colleges in our area, Ms. Gibson finds herself educating patients on a regular basis about STIs, viral hepatitis, and HIV.

PREP can benefit the community by decreasing the transmission of HIV. Furthermore, part of PREP management is as-needed screening for non-HIV sexually transmitted infections (STIs), as well as routine quarterly screening for other STIs.

St. Lawrence Health pays tribute to EMS and rural health

Most Northern New Yorkers don't give much thought about the fact that when they need to go to the Emergency Department or visit a friend at Canton-Potsdam, Gouverneur, or Massena hospital, they are walking

into a rural hospital. North Country residents simply know they are going to the local hospital.

Rural healthcare is an actual category among NY State institutions, and the

three hospitals operated under the umbrella of St. Lawrence Health (SLH) are being recognized throughout November as being a strong backbone in Rural Health. Also of special note this month is that Patient

Transport Week is being observed, and SLH is proud to be the owning organization of Seaway Valley Ambulance in Massena. SLH Regional Director of Planning Albert Hanson pointed out rural hospitals are critical institutions for our regional communities. "Our hospitals are where our neighbors come to receive high quality care without having to travel several hours to receive it," he said. SLH President Donna McGregor stated the Regional Care Pavilion is more than a construction project.

"It's not only the bricks and mortar that go into a project like this, but it's the soul of the community. This building will be around for generations, and what we are doing today is really laying the groundwork for health care in the future for the North Country," she noted.

Part of being a good neighbor, means being involved. As individual hospitals or as a whole of SLH, donations are made to community efforts on an annual basis. Staff members can also be seen at local events where they have information tables set up and are always delighted to talk with those who stop by.

"A characteristic of a rural health hospital is having a connection between the staff and area residents," Ms. McGregor said. "We take care of our community - our patients and staff - like they are family."

"Our organization has developed into a true provider of choice in St. Lawrence County, and continues to look for new and better ways to deliver high quality healthcare, while also providing services that have never been available in the region," he continued. said it would cut down on people illegally bringing in items to be disposed of in the village. The village would still require payment to remove mattresses and more than four tires, he said.

Other materials like commercial building materials and hazmat products would also not be eligible to be disposed of during the cleanup period.

Miller has told trustees that he has spoken to DPW superintendents in other municipalities about similar programs. The possible plan that may be implemented in Massena would likely be modeled after those used in Plattsburgh and Watertown, Miller said.

The proposed plan would also allow residents to plan accordingly for pickups while ensuring that waste and items to dispose of would not be left at the curb for days or weeks on end while awaiting pickup.

According to Miller, the village would likely be divided into four zones and residents would be notified of pickup windows so they could schedule an appointment that would work for them.

Village Administrator Monique Chatland asked if the operation would save the village money or be an added expense to the village due to overtime expenses.

Miller said the plan would be to have DPW crews handle the work during normal shift work.

"There's going to be a cost savings, I mean, like I said, our guys would get done with garbage pickup and they go back and just keep driving the streets picking up yard waste or brush or whatever. So, I guess you're paying the guys for eight hours a day, I guess they're just going to keep making the rounds for two hours. I'm just saying you're going to keep making the

rounds. They're being paid for that anyway," Miller said.

Chatland also suggested doing spring cleanup at the same time as the town of Massena, noting that village residents are also part of the town.

"Why don't we participate in the town spring cleanup? We're residents of the town too. I don't know...in all honesty, if we're paying taxes on that. We should be able to utilize it in my opinion," she said.

According to Chatland, some residents have said they do not like the current system that was implemented as a cost saving measure when staffing levels declined with DPW.

Some residents also said they did not have access to pickup trucks or trailers to haul anything by themselves, saying the previous pickup system worked much better for them.

When discussing whether com-

mercial property owners could utilize the same system, Chatland also posed the question as it relates to regular trash pickups.

"I'm just playing devil's advocate but if they are paying for garbage pickup all year, just like a resident is, if they're paying monthly, why wouldn't they be able to utilize the service as a commercial (owner)? I'm just playing devil's advocate," Chatland said.

McGowan and Miller both said at a certain point the program would be a burden to DPW staff and would likely cost taxpayers more money in the end, likely due to overtime expenses.

Miller also said the logistics of taking appointments, scheduling the pickups and ensuring they are completed on time will take a significant amount of coordination, communication and time to complete.

In the event that the program were to be expanded or additional pickups could be made, Mayor Greg Paquin said it may be something that has to be paid for in the future.

Paquin said in some municipalities like Watertown, residents pay fees for similar cleanup programs, though he said the board hopes the day does not come that they have to charge for the service.

"There are other communities that still do provide the service but there is a charge. I think it's a great

idea right now and all," he said.

Paquin also suggested that the cleanup being considered may be something used every other year to ensure it remains a service taxpayers do not have to pay extra for.

Whatever the board decides, Miller said a new system like the one being posed would be a learning curve for everyone involved, from DPW staff to village residents.

"We'll all learn together, it's all different for all of us and it's going to take time to adjust," Miller said.

development for the department that has not been seen very often.

Olson said the department will continue to investigate further to see if the influx of MDMA is an isolated incident or not.

development of the area would be good for the city, and a direct sale between him and the developer would be faster than returning the property to the city, which would likely be a more expensive endeavor for all involved.

Although Hosmer didn't want to speak out of turn, he said the new developers plan would be beneficial to the water district.

Hosmer said that he'd actually be taking a loss on the property due to surveying and closing costs that were already paid, but said the

development would have obvious benefits for his existing restaurant and future brewery.

Councilor John Rishe explained the situation following an executive session Monday.

He said that during the closed meeting the council discussed whether or not the city should take back the property since the brewery wouldn't be moving forward at that location.

"The discussion was that they aren't going to build on that site, so under the agreement we have the option of taking the property for \$10,000 or we have the option taking that site back for \$10,000 or relinquishing our rights so it stays with the private owner and that's my favor and I guess that I ask that that it be put on the Dec. 11 agenda to give people time to think about it and consider it," Rishe said.

Deputy Mayor Steve Fisher disagreed. He said the city should take the property back to ensure the area gets developed in the future as it's located near the city's waterfront.

"I think the whole area needs to be tied together. You can't just piecemeal it. You don't buy half a suit," he said.

Although no additional discussion on the matter took place, it's expected to be discussed further at the next city council meeting.

Work starts on Massena Little League building

MASSENA -- Massena youth will be playing baseball once again with work beginning to reconstruct the two-story concession and equipment building at Leo Lashomb Field in Massena.

The structure, located at a baseball field near Springs Park, burned in August.

In a post on the Massena Little League Facebook page, Leon Shorette updated community members with some positive news regarding the rebuild.

According to the post, the league has raised \$75,516.60, \$27,000 of which has been spent on an equipment order.

Essential items were ordered to provide for each division, ranging from T-ball through Majors, according to the post.

The remaining \$48,516.60 will be used to construct the new equipment building and concession stand, as well to purchase appliances and supplies for the concession stand.

Officials say they aim to purchase a tractor and field equipment as well. "We are working hard and are very hopeful that this all (will be) accomplished prior to next season," the post reads.

Shorette passed along his thanks to every individual and business who had a hand in the rebuild, saying Massena Little League will "continue to provide our youth with a great baseball program, thanks to your generosity.

The building was considered by many in the community to be the home of Massena Little League and was known to store all equipment used for the program.

Bats, balls, pads, pitching machines and a tractor were all

destroyed in the fire, along with the concession stand, old uniforms and trophies that represented the history of the program.

Officials with the league said the building "served Massena Little League for decades and holds countless memories for players from many generations.

"While the memories can't be replaced, we will do our best to rebuild and continue providing Massena's youth with a place to play baseball," officials said in a statement at the time of the fire.

Massena Permanent Firefighters asked residents in the area to check for camera footage that may offer any tips to the department and police throughout the investigation of the fire, which occurred sometime during the evening of Aug. 26 or early morning hours of Aug. 27.

"Your Massena Career staff has been a sponsor of Massena Little League for decades," an online statement from Village of Massena Permanent Firefighters IAFF Local 2220 said. "We will continue to support them, and help in any way we can in the rebuilding efforts."

A GoFundMe page was also established hours after the fire, with a goal of \$100,000. As of press time, \$23,210 has been raised on the page, though many community members and businesses are known to have provided donations outside of the page.

"This is a place so many have spent countless hours enjoying," the fire department previously said.

"It was a disheartening scene this morning, but as always we know this community is going to pull together and build it back better than ever for the children of Massena."
