School selection up to lottery

MASSENA -- Parents looking to register their children in the Massena Central School District's pre-kindergarten program will now enter their child in a random lottery for school selection as opposed to a first-come first-served basis like in years past.

According to Student Support Services Director Danielle J. Chapman, the change comes from state officials who want to ensure all students are given "the same equal opportunity" on registration day.

Chapman made the announcement during a recent board of education meeting during which she presented the updated pre-kindergarten plan.

According to Chapman, registration day was previously handled on a first-come, first-served basis but with the state change, the district will move to the lottery system.

Jefferson, Madison and Nightingale elementary schools will be doing the lottery on registration day, she said.

Chapman said after registration day a general lottery will be completed, which will allow parents to pick a school for their child if there is space available.

Family fun center eyed in Ogdensburg

OGDENSBURG -- City council will consider selling land to a local developer interested in bringing a miniature golf course and family fun center to Ogdensburg following a presentation Monday.

Developer Nick Wright shared his plan for the course as well as entertainment extensions such as holiday light shows built within the complex and small spaces for corporate/birthday events. He said it would also include a gem mining area off the main entry for kids of all ages to discover takeaway fossils and mine for gems.

Wright said he's had success in other developments and having grown up in the city he wants to bring an attraction to the area that can draw on the 1.7 million people who live within a 50-mile radius of the small city.

But there are some complications to his plan. The main one being a parcel of land that the city sold to William Hosmer last year and an adjacent property that had been promised to another buyer.

The property was sold though a request for proposal process rather than a standard city auction which has complicated any future sale of the property.

Last year the city council agreed to sell a portion of Main Street property for \$10,000 to Hosmer. Wright is hoping to purchase land at 17 Main Street from William Hosmer, who had previously planned to build a brewery there, but has since found a nearby location.

When Hosmer purchased the land from the city he said he would return the property to the city should the development not take place within three years.

Although the three years have not yet passed, Hosmer

The quake reportedly had a depth of more than 6 miles.

Grad rates at Massena stable, but still low

MASSENA -- Graduation rates at Massena Central School have stabilized in recent years but school officials say the numbers are still lower than they would like to see.

At a recent board of education meeting, Principal Alan Oliver called the situation "sticky" and "stubborn," noting that the graduation rate is currently flat over the last few years.

"We hang right at that 80% give or take for the June rate always. When we drop our August rate in there, I would guarantee it's going to be a flat trend, right about the same as it's been for the last couple of years, right in that 80 to 85%," Oliver said during the meeting.

Oliver noted that 2023/24 graduation rates are harder to predict, saying that a special appeal option is no longer an option for Regents exams.

That special appeal was implemented due to COVID, with state officials admitting there were "holes in the process."

According to Oliver, the special appeal allowed students to gain Regent credit if they passed all four quarters of the class during the school year and scored between a 51 and 64 on the Regents exam.

"So what happens this year when that special appeal goes away because we're certainly not done dealing with the impacts of COVID in the high school in any way, shape or form," Oliver said.

Oliver said the school will continue to track the numbers of students who will graduate on time and following summer school as well.

He said the district tracks every student and administrators are "aware of every kid in the school."

"I've been in and around this district for coming up on 20 years and we've done so much work to try and move this needle. It is a very stubborn needle to move, and I don't know why," Oliver said.

He said the district will continue to regroup and reassess before trying new methods to improve graduation rates.

Oliver said he and District Director of Curriculum, Instruction and

Assessment Nicole Charleson will continue to work on solutions to the problem that "is not a unique Massena worry."

"I know when I talk to my colleagues and I would assume when you talk to your superintendent colleagues, that's not a unique Massena worry. That's an everybody across the state worry this year," Oliver said.

School officials previously announced a strategic plan in May to combat the flat graduation numbers, which included assessing graduation rates, Regents exam scores, dropout rates and the metrics that influence those numbers.

Former Superintendent Pat Brady previously said school officials were working hard and focusing on providing a "safe, effective learning environment for all involved, including teachers, staff and students."

Student attendance has also been problematic in recent years following a difficult stretch of remote learning that was required during the COVID pandemic during the 2021/22 school year.

School administrators and board of education members took a number of academic and social-emotional goals to develop action plans to improve those specific areas in hopes of increasing attendance and graduation rates, while reducing the dropout rate, officials previously said.

As part of the new initiatives, district officials also focused efforts and resources on mental health care throughout the district for students and staff members, while also addressing trauma and the social and emotional needs of students and staff.

Much of the information that led to the creation of the strategic plan came from data gathered from a survey of the student body earlier this year.

Man dead after buggy crash

OSWEGATCHIE -- A 21-year-old Amish man is dead and another has sustained life-threatening injuries following an accident involving a horse-drawn buggy and pickup truck.

State police say Clark J. Zanker, 33, of Ogdensburg, was driving south on State Highway 812 when he failed to observe an Amish buggy, striking it in the rear.

The accident occurred around 7 a.m. today, Dec. 11, and resulted in the death of 21-year-old Abraham Shetler, of Heuvelton.

Also traveling in the buggy was Joseph Yoder, 19, of Lisbon. Police say Yoder was transported to SUNY Upstate Medical University with life-threatening injuries.

ries.

Shetler was pronounced dead at the scene.

Police say an autopsy is scheduled for Dec. 11 at 3 p.m. at Canton-Potsdam Hospital.

The New York State Police Bureau of Criminal Investigation (BCI), Collision Reconstruction Unit (CRU), Forensic Identification Unit (FIU) and Traffic Incident Management (TIMS) all responded to the scene to investigate, police say.

State Police were assisted by Ogdensburg Rescue, Heuvelton Fire and Rescue, State DOT and St. Lawrence County Coroner.

Police say the investigation is ongoing.

Firefighters battle barn blaze for 8 hours

WADDINGTON – Waddington firefighters responded to a full-engulfing barn fire around 10 p.m. Thursday night in the Town of Waddington.

The fire was at the Sharpe residence on the Rookey Road.

Firefighters were at the scene for more than 8 hours, according to a post on the Waddington Fire Department Facebook page.

Assisting were fire departments from Madrid, Lisbon, Louisville, Norfolk, Norwood, Heuvelton, Morley and West Potsdam, along with the Waddington Rescue Squad.

A person from the St. Lawrence County Emergency Services was also at the scene.

"A huge thank you goes out to Madrid, Lisbon, Louisville, Norfolk,

Norwood, Heuvelton, Morley and West Potsdam fire departments along with St. Lawrence County Office of Emergency Services County Car 1 for the assistance on scene and numerous other departments standing by at other stations," Waddington fire officials wrote in a Facebook post.

Fire officials also offered thanks to Dave Putney and the Town of Waddington Highway Department for keeping the roads salted and the Town of Lisbon Highway Department for transporting an excavator from Scott Fox.

"As always a thank you to the Waddington rescue squad for the on scene support. Lastly a thanks to Waddington Mayor Mike Zagrobelny for holding down the fire hall and

keeping the coffee brewing. The first responder community never disappoints," fire officials wrote.

Details of injuries or loss of contents are not known at this time. The cause is under investigation.

Cash and drugs seized in stop

MASSENA — A Massena man was arrested Thursday, Dec. 7 on multiple drug charges and traffic violations, and police seized drugs and thousands of dollars in cash after the collar.

Massena Police charged 37-year-old Matthew P. McLean with second-degree criminal possession of a controlled substance: methamphetamine over 2 ounces, second-degree criminal possession of a controlled

substance: stimulant over 10 grams, third-degree criminal possession of a controlled substance: 1/8 oz. methamphetamine intent to sell, third-degree criminal possession of a controlled substance: narcotic intent to sell, all felonies.

He was also charged with second-degree criminal use drug paraphernalia: scales and second-degree criminal use drug paraphernalia: packaging, both misdemeanors.

Police also charged McLean with reckless driving, failure to obey a police officer, second-degree aggravated unlicensed operator, five counts of failure to stop at a stop sign, failure to comply with lawful order and unreasonable speed.

Police seized 80.3 grams of crystal methamphetamine, 37 fentanyl packets, digital scale, packaging material and \$3,901.44.

McLean was arraigned in Massena town court and remanded to the St. Lawrence County jail on no bail.

County taking steps to ensure telephone infrastructure for county offices

CANTON -- St. Lawrence County legislators are taking steps to ensure telephone infrastructure for county offices can continue to operate as normal, agreeing to contracts with Red Comm Inc. to provide support.

Legislators approved the resolution during the operations committee meeting on Dec. 11.

Officials say the county currently owns and operates a Mitel-based telephone system, with components installed in multiple county buildings.

As part of owning and operating such a system, the county must pay

Mitel licensing costs for the infrastructure which must be renewed on an annual basis through a Software Assurance Agreement (SWA) that is through an authorized Mitel partner.

That agreement needs to be signed prior to Feb. 2024, officials say.

Maintenance is also a concern,

legislators say, with ongoing maintenance costs expected. Under a General Maintenance Agreement (GMA), legislators say the costs for both parts and labor will be covered.

Rel Comm Inc. is "a Mitel Gold Partner with over 30 years of experience in supporting Mitel phone systems and offers competitive


pricing for Mitel hardware, software and services on the Sourcewell contract, satisfying the competitive process," according to the resolution.

According to officials, the Sourcewell contract is not to exceed \$16,000 annually for the SWA for 2024 and \$25,200 annually for the GMA in 2024.

New hire at county DSS

CANTON -- The St. Lawrence County Department of Social Services has hired Heidi Soucis to assist and provide additional training in the Children's Services Unit.

Legislators approved the hiring during the full board meeting on Dec. 4.

According to legislators, the case supervisor, grade A, position was vacated on Sept. 28, 2023 due to a retirement.

Following the retirement, legisla-

tors authorized filling the position in the Children's Services unit at Social Services, with an interim supervisor having been appointed in the meantime.

"The position is critical to programs in Children's Services, which includes Foster Care, Preventative Care and Adoption Services," according to the resolution.

Legislators say if training were not provided, "the provision of direct supervision, leadership and review of petitions and violations prior to submission to court, permanency hearings and compliance conferences could be compromised."

With the passing of the resolution, DSS will be able to ease the transition to a new case supervisor, grade A.

The employee who retired recently is still able to work contractually, in a training capacity, at her most recent hourly rate for a period not to exceed three months to help with the transition, according to the resolution.

In other action, legislators also approved two contracts for cleaning services with the County Department of Highways.

Karol I. Houle-Marolf has been hired to provide professional cleaning services for the Lisbon outpost, located at 554 County Route 28A.

Houle-Marolf will be paid \$74.30 per week for a one-year contract.

The second contract is with Meola Enterprise, who will provide professional cleaning services at the Department of Highways locations in Potsdam and Russell.

Mellow will be paid \$70.50 per week for the Potsdam outpost and \$57.50 for the Russell outpost as part of a one-year contract.

Police say a new feature called NameDrop was added with the update and is turned on by default.

Three North Country municipalities receiving over \$5 million for water projects

The village of Canton, city of Ogdensburg and town of Potsdam have all received large grants from the New York State Water Infrastructure Improvement & Inter-

municipal Grant Award Program.

In the village of Canton, the wastewater treatment plant has received a \$3,375,000 grant to make improvements to the facility.

Canton village officials began exploring funding sources in June for the project that is projected to cost over \$13 million.

At the village board's June 21

monthly board meeting, the mayor and village trustees received an update on the project from Taylor Jennings, a senior engineer with the engineering firm of Barton and

Loguidice.

"There's liner patching and deterioration in the existing liners and there's piping breakdowns," said Jennings.

For the city of Ogdensburg, the \$651,000 grant will be used for the East David Street infrastructure replacement project.

That project calls for the replacement of 1,700 feet of water and sewer lines along the street, officials say.

City council held a special meeting on Aug. 7 to discuss borrowing \$5 million to replace the lines.

A report from engineers says the old pipes allow discharge of raw wastewater in the St. Lawrence and Oswegatchie rivers.

In recent years the city has accumulated a large amount following changes to a waterfront project and massive overhaul of the wastewater treatment facility.

The town of Potsdam will also benefit from the grant program, receiving \$1,399,484 for the Route 56 sewer district.

The funds come at a time when the town has recently considered pulling the plug on the project, saying higher than expected costs will delay construction.

Officials in Potsdam approved the district in Feb. 2021 in hopes of sparking future economic development.

The district will allow the town to supply municipal water and sewer service to residences and businesses along Route 56 within the district boundaries.

LC Drives, an innovative electric motor manufacturing and development company, had also planned to build within the district on Route 56 but closed in Sept. 2021 citing a lack of resources following a withdrawal of funding from an outside investor.

The town will be working with several contractors to handle the environmental work that is required before construction can begin, things like wetlands delineation and archeological surveys.

The total cost of the combined projects could go as high as \$14 million once the project finally goes out to bid.

About \$4.78 million in grants and loans from USDA Rural Development will also help fund the project.

Man who crossed over Moses-Saunders dam illegally to be removed

MASSENA -- The individual who illegally crossed into the United States by crossing over the Moses-Saunders dam in October has been in custody since the incident over six weeks ago and is being processed for removal, according to Customs and Border Protection officials.

North Country This Week has learned that the unnamed individual did in fact use the dam as a means to enter the country illegally, according to Customs and Border Protection officials.

Customs and Border Protection Public Information Officer Ryan Brissette said the individual was apprehended approximately two miles from the dam by Border Patrol as officers investigated a report of an individual who may have illegally entered the United States.

Brissette said Border Patrol "only later determined that the individual had used the dam as a means of crossing into the United States."

"The dam was used as a means of entry due to its logistical point along the St. Lawrence River and connection between the two countries," he said.

Brissette said CBP is currently processing the individual for removal proceedings. Brissette said due to the fact the individual is not being charged criminally, CBP cannot release the name and personal information of the individual.

When asked if the individual was a Canadian citizen or foreign national from another nation, CBP officials declined to comment.

A CBP spokesperson also issued a statement in an email to North Country This Week.

"On October 25, 2023, at approximately 9:30 a.m. EST, Border Patrol Agents responded to a report of an individual who had illegally entered the United States near the Moses-Saunders Power Dam. Upon arrival, agents encountered an individual without legal status who was detained and transported to the Massena Border

Patrol Station for processing and later transferred to the CBP Buffalo (Batavia) Processing Center, Batavia, New York," they wrote.

The spokesperson did not address whether the incident may have been isolated or if it may have been part of a larger scheme for smuggling as has been inferred on social media.

Susan Craig, director of media relations for the New York Power Authority, spoke to the situation, saying safety and security is a "top priority" for NYPA.

"The safety and security of the shared power dam is a top priority. NYPA is working closely with Ontario Power Generation, the New York State Police, and U.S. Customs and Border Protection to review all procedures to ensure the continued safe operation of the dam," Craig wrote in an email to NCTW.

Despite the resolution to the situation, federal and state officials have been critical of the security lapse, saying it is a grave threat to national security and the power grid.

Congresswoman Elise Stefanik, who has long called for increased security measures at the northern border, said increasing security now is paramount.

Danna Almeida, spokesperson for Congresswoman Stefanik said, "Joe Biden's illegal immigration and border crisis has threatened the homeland time and time again. The Moses-Saunders Power Dam is critical infrastructure and our office is working with law enforcement agencies to get all information regarding the security breach. Congresswoman Stefanik will continue to work to secure the borders and ensure our northern border communities and infrastructure are protected."

In a press release, State Senator Dan Stec said securing the border is of "vital importance."

"Securing our northern border is of vital importance. A crucial part of that is protecting critical infrastructure. The fact that someone could illegally cross the border through Moses-Saunders Power Dam is absolutely unacceptable and puts the security of our power

grid at risk. This event must be thoroughly investigated and state and federal officials must take border security seriously. Sites like Moses-Saunders cannot be vulnerable to illegal entry," he said in the release.

Assemblyman Ken Blankenbush also spoke to the breach, pointing to the possibility that lax border security is also playing a role in illicit drug smuggling.

"The illegal crossing in Massena is a grave reminder of the lax attitude state and federal Democrats have with border security.

There are already concerns about drugs being smuggled through the Canadian border, which trickles

into surrounding communities. We never know people's intentions when crossing illegally. Thankfully, the power dam wasn't compromised. I commend the officers involved for their quick response detaining the individual and I will be closely following the investigation," said Blankenbush.

Assemblyman Scott Gray, who was one of the first state representatives to comment on the situation said it is a matter of "the wrong person, in the wrong place, with the wrong intentions."

"This really could have been catastrophic and I hope that we all learn from this. The situation raises a number of questions, including

how the individual managed to get all the way through the facility and two miles outside of it on the U.S. side. It was a breach of the whole dam," he said.

Gray also questioned if it may have been an issue that began on the Canadian side that opened up the facility to such a breach but commented that regardless of that fact, changes needed to be made facility wide.

"I'm sure we will have a debrief of the situation, likely at a high level, and the steps taken to correct whatever errors are found will be implemented to ensure it doesn't happen again," Gray said.

CANTON -- The St. Lawrence County Board of Elections will continue to utilize the services of NTS Data Services, LLC for voter registration software.

Legislators unanimously approved the measure during the Dec. 11 operations committee meeting.

According to Commissioner Jennie Bacon, the software utilized by the county allows for voters to register, digitizes signatures, offers full document imaging, election reporting and an interface messaging system.

Bacon said with the software in

place, the addresses of registered voters can be automatically updated with an address change at the DMV, with that information sent right to the board of elections to ensure up to date information.

As part of the contract, NTS Data Services, LLC will continue to offer maintenance and support services related to the software for the duration of a one-year contract that will run from Jan. 1, 2024 to Dec. 31, 2024.

"NTS Data Services, LLC has the knowledge, expertise, required software, associated technology and services to provide a quality solution to the needs of the Board of Elections," according to the resolution.

Judges overturn provisions of gun law

CANTON — Federal judges on the Second Circuit Court of Appeals have overturned three provisions of the Concealed Carry Improvement Act (CCIA), leaving all other requirements in place.

With the ruling now out, over two months later than attorneys involved originally expected, applicants hoping to obtain a concealed carry license will no longer have to provide their social media profile information and those with permits will be allowed to conceal carry in houses of worship and on private property by default.

All other provisions remain intact, according to court documents.

The CCIA was passed in "direct retribution" to the U.S. Supreme Court overturning New York's 109-year-old concealed carry laws last year with their decision in the New York State Rifle and Pistol Association v. Bruen case.

Under the CCIA, state legislators and Governor Kathy Hochul passed multiple laws that created new requirements to obtain a concealed carry license and governed firearm ownership in general, including a 16-hour course with two hours of

range time, an extensive list of spaces where firearms are prohibited, the requirement to disclose all social media information to law enforcement, the requirement to disclose all firearms and persons in the home, along with a "good moral character" clause that gave licensing officers broad discretion of what constitutes "good moral character."

Gun rights advocates have been pressing forward for the last year plus to overturn the laws and with the recent ruling in *Antonyuk v. Bruen*, advocates on both sides are claiming victory.

St. Lawrence County Attorney Steve Button, who has been working "of counsel" with Gun Owners of America on the case, said the decision leaves more work to be done and more questions to be answered.

Plaintiffs in the case who are suing the state will now have two options, to appeal directly to the Supreme Court or to re-litigate with the Northern District federal court.

Button said all parties involved will weigh their options in the coming weeks.

State Attorney General Letitia James also released a statement on the decision, saying the "commonsense law" will continue to keep New Yorkers safe.

"Today's decision to permit the state to enforce critical provisions of the Concealed Carry Improvement Act as the court process moves forward will help keep New Yorkers safe. This commonsense law was enacted to keep guns out of danger-

ous hands and away from schools, hospitals, parks, public transportation, and other sensitive locations. My office will continue to defend New York's gun laws and use every tool to protect New Yorkers from senseless gun violence," Attorney General Letitia James said following the announcement on Dec. 8.

Gun Owners of America Senior Vice President Erich Pratt spoke to the decision, saying it was not "a total victory."

"Governor Hochul and her cabal in Albany never seem to get the message, and in turn, GOA is proud to have played a major role in rebuking her unconstitutional law. Nevertheless, this was not a total victory, and we will continue the fight until this entire law is sent to the bowels of history where it belongs."

An additional case seeking an injunction against additional measures in the CCIA was also struck a blow by justices on the Second Circuit on Friday.

In *Gazzola v. Hochul*, justices denied a request for a preliminary injunction against the states new background check requirements for ammunition, as well as the fees associated to transfer a firearm.

With the passing of the CCIA last summer, New York State became a point of contact state, meaning all firearm transfers conducted will be handled by the State Police instead of federal authorities with the FBI.

That case has been remanded for a full hearing, though no date has been set at this time.

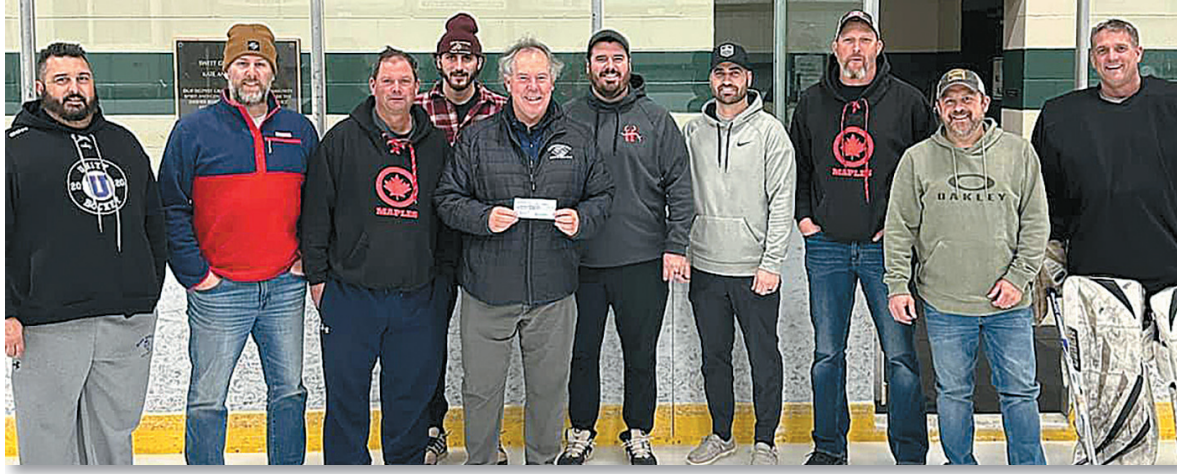

BOCES cites pandemic for harsh state audit

CANTON — St. Lawrence-Lewis BOCES was heavily criticized in a recent state audit, but BOCES officials say the pandemic and a major capital project contributed to the issues.

The audit objective was to determine whether BOCES properly monitored and accounted for Information Technology (IT) assets, according to the New York State Comptroller's Office.

"The key findings reported that BOCES officials did not properly monitor and account for IT assets," the comptroller's office said. "As a result, officials cannot ensure that assets are in BOCES' possession and protected against loss or unauthorized use."

The audit was for July 1, 2021 through Feb. 24, 2023.

The report says officials did not maintain accurate and up-to-date inventory records, affix identification tags to all assets, periodically conduct physical inventories, and ensure sensitive data was erased before assets with hard drives were disposed of.

The comptroller's office said 69 out of 140 recorded IT assets could not be located. The assets cost \$128,102 and included computers, projectors, interactive displays and cameras. Also, 30 out of 95 assets on hand were not listed in the inventory records. Also, none of the 39 IT assets (totaling \$50,018) purchased and placed in service during the 2022-23 school year were added to the inventory records.

- Further, none of the 25 computer disposals tested had evidence that the hard drives were sanitized prior to disposal, and 11 other computers were sanitized and disposed of but were still active in the inventory records.

- Officials added that the inventory records did not always show the proper location of IT assets and sometimes were missing key information such as serial numbers, locations, purchase dates and costs.

"District officials recognize the importance of monitoring and accounting for information technology assets, BOCES Superintendent Thomas R. Burns said. "During the COVID-19 pandemic, the BOCES prioritized supporting our component districts and their needs."

BOCES helped 18 school districts shift to remote learning after schools were shut down, as well as assisted with getting meals to students in the early days of the pandemic.

Burns also cited staffing shortages, added work related to COVID-19 and a capital project that contributed to the negative findings.

BOCES has started implementing audit recommendations, the super said.

He said a physical inventory audit of all three BOCES centers was completed this past summer and the

inventory software is being reconciled to the physical audit. Additional staff training was also noted.

The key recommendations from the audit were to establish written procedures to ensure accurate and up-to-date inventory records are maintained; assets are tagged; physical inventories are conducted and discrepancies are investigated; and hard drives are sanitized when disposed of, and monitor for com-

pliance.

BOCES officials generally agreed with our recommendations and indicated they will take or have taken corrective action.

"We appreciate the opportunity to respond to the findings and recommendations of this report," Burns said. "A comprehensive corrective action plan will be submitted to your office and the New York State Education Department."

Section 5. The Tax Enforcement Officer, who is the County Treasurer, is hereby authorized to accept a deed in lieu of enforcement of collection of delinquent taxes under Article 11.

Section 6. All property acquired by the County pursuant to Article 11, shall be sold in one of the following manners: a.) at a public auction held on the second Saturday in September of the auction year, b.) at a properly advertised private sale subject to approval by the St. Lawrence County Board of Legislators, or c.) at such date and in such manner as established by a validly issued Administrative Order, a validly issued Executive Order, subsequent superseding State Statute, or valid order of a Court with jurisdiction over the matter. Such sales may also be held online if deemed necessary by the County Treasurer.

Section 7. The County sells only its lien and interest, does not warrant title, and will convey only by quitclaim deed. No abstracts will be provided.

Section 8. Any fees associated with the auction and conveyance of properties sold at public auction, to include auctioneer fees, buyer's premium, advertising fees, and recording fees will be the responsibility of the bidder.

Section 9. At a public auction, the highest bidder must tender twenty percent (20%) of the bid or a fifty dollar (\$50.00) deposit, whichever is greater. In addition, the highest bidder is responsible for any buyer's premium, auctioneer fees, and possible advertising fees payable by certified check, money order, cash or credit card. The balance is due within thirty (30) days, also payable by certified check, money order or cash. Confirmation of the sale by the St. Lawrence County Board of Legislators is unnecessary for Article 11 properties sold at public auction. The County must sell to the highest bidder unless the highest bidder defaults. Upon default of the highest bidder, the deposit will be forfeited, and the County reserves the right to accept the bid of the second highest bidder.

Section 10. The former owner, and any other person who may be acting as an agent of the former owner, whether disclosed or undisclosed, is strictly prohibited from bidding at the auction.

Section 11. Any bidder who owns property in St. Lawrence County and is delinquent in their taxes shall be prohibited from bidding at the auction. The term delinquent is defined as prior year tax delinquency. No other person who may be acting as an agent of this bidder shall be allowed to bid at the auction.

Section 12. For properties with actual or suspected environmental contamination, application may be made to the Court in an effort to gain "Temporary Incidence of Ownership", granting St. Lawrence County the legal authority to enter such property and conduct an environmental investigation to determine the nature and extent of any environmental contamination which may exist at the property and the cost for addressing such contamination.

Section 13. The costs to St. Lawrence County associated with addressing actual or suspected environmental contamination of a property, including investigative, cleanup and legal costs, may be charged to the assessed owner and included on the tax assessment roll.

Section 14. This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

ORDINANCE #8 OF 2023

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 189 ENTITLED "STREETS AND SIDEWALKS" OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF OGDENSBURG

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF OGDENSBURG, NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS:

ITEM ONE:

That §189-9 entitled "Sidewalk Maintenance" will be deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

§ 189-9. Sidewalk maintenance.

A. The owner of every building or lot and the owner of every unoccupied building or lot adjoining which there is any sidewalk shall keep the same clean and free from dirt and rubbish, snow and ice. The owner of every building or lot adjoining which there is a sidewalk shall maintain the same in a state of good repair to provide safe passage to pedestrians. If any such person shall fail, neglect, or refuse to comply with the requirements of this section, the Director of Public Works may perform such work, and the cost of the same, together with an additional charge of 50% thereon to cover the cost of supervision and administration by the City, shall constitute a lien upon filing in the office of the City Comptroller and shall be collected at the same time and in the same manner as general City taxes.

B. If an owner disputes an invoice notice for snow removal, based on a claimed factual error or administrative error, said owner may, within 10 days of the date of the invoice notice, send a written appeal to the Director for the Department of Public Works who, upon receipt of said appeal, shall within 14 days, respond in writing. The Director's response to such an appeal shall apply a written form and standards for appeal and potential waiver of charges as developed by the Director for the Department of Public Works and approved by the City Council.

C. Any person aggrieved by the decision of the Director of Public Works shall have the opportunity to request an appeal before the City Manager. Any person requesting an appeal must submit the request in writing. All such appeals must be hand delivered, electronically delivered, or posted by mail within ten days of the decision of the Director of Public Works. When a timely appeal has been made, the appeal shall be held pursuant to this section; any request for hearing received untimely shall not entitle the requesting party to an appeal. Upon receipt of a timely request for appeal, the City Manager shall, if practicable, set a hearing to be held within ten business days, from said request and, further shall give no less than seven days' notice by regular mail or email to the requesting party of the time, date, and location of said appeal. The hearing may be reset by agreement of the parties, as confirmed in writing, but in no event shall the hearing be held any later than forty-five (45) days after the date of the action being appealed. The appeal shall be informal in nature, and the parties may be represented by counsel or appear on their own behalf. After reviewing the evidence presented, the City Manager shall make a written ruling within five days of the hearing affirming or vacating the decision of the Director of Public Works under this section. If affirmed the penalty must be paid within 30 days of the date of the appeal. If the citation is vacated it shall be as if the citation was never issued and no fines related to that specific citation are due or owing.

ITEM TWO:

This ordinance shall take effect ten (10) days after publication of notice, which shall give the title and describe same in summary form.

NOTICE OF ADOPTED LOCAL LAW
WHEREAS, Section 214 of County Law of the State of New York requires official publication of Local Laws,

I HEREBY CERTIFY that the following is a true and complete copy of Local Law C (No.) for the Year 2023, adopted December 4, 2023, by the St. Lawrence County Board of Legislators: PROPOSED LOCAL LAW C (NO.) FOR THE YEAR 2023, AMENDING LOCAL LAW 3 FOR THE YEAR 1993, "AMENDING LOCAL LAW NO. 2 FOR THE YEAR 1956," "THE ST. LAWRENCE COUNTY INSTALLMENT PAYMENT OF TOWN, CITY, COUNTY, AND SCHOOL REAL PROPERTY TAX LAW"

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of Legislators of the County of St. Lawrence as follows:

Section 1. This local law shall supersede and repeal all prior local laws regarding the installment payment of Town, County, and School Real Property Tax Law.

Section 2. PURPOSE
The purpose of this local law is to designate the St. Lawrence County Treasurer's Office as the St. Lawrence County Real Property Tax Collection Agency and to permit, by option of local School Boards, Town Boards, and City Councils, the installment payment of January Town and County Tax Levies, January City and County Tax Levies and September School Tax Levies. This local law is being adopted pursuant to Title 4-A of Article 9 of the Real Property Tax Law (RPTL, 972-976) and related provisions in Article 13 (RPTL, 1336-1342) which authorizes Counties, Towns, City, and School Districts (other than City School Districts) to establish a coordinated system for the collection of County, Town, City, and School District Taxes in installments.

Section 3. ADMINISTRATION
Upon the enactment of this local law by the County Legislature, the Towns, City, and School Districts of St. Lawrence County may decide, by a majority vote of the Town Board, City Council, or Board of Education, to permit the installment payment of current taxes. The decision to permit the installment payment of taxes requires the local Town/City/School District Tax Collector must collect and receipt for taxes on the same system the County Treasurer uses. Local Tax Collectors must use the County's computer billing and accounting system. In a Town, City, or School District which has decided to permit installment payment of taxes, each taxpayer may either pay the taxes in full, avoiding the associated charges, or elect to pay taxes in installments, which is accomplished simply by paying the amount designated as "First Installment" on the tax bill. No interest is charged on the installment payments (since the cost associated with the delayed receipt of the tax payments are absorbed into the Service Charge, which in the next Section of this local law, unless the payment is not made on time, in which case the standard rate of interest applies (as defined in Real Property Tax Law).

January Town/County/City Tax Bill: The First Installment is due on or before January 31. Failure to make this payment on time disqualifies Taxpayer from Installment Payment system. The amount to be paid on first Installment must be at least one-third the January Tax Bill plus Service Charge. The second Installment is due on or before March 31. The amount to be paid on the second Installment must be at least one-third the January Tax Bill plus Service Charge. The third and final Installment is due on or before May 31. September School Tax Bill: The first Installment is due on or before September 30. Failure to make this payment on time disqualifies Tax Payer from Installment Payment System. The amount to be paid on the first Installment must be at least one-third the September Tax Bill plus Service Charge. The second Installment is due on or before October 31. The amount to be paid on the second Installment must be at least one-third the September Tax Bill plus Service Charge. The third and final Installment is due on or before November 30.

Section 4. SERVICE CHARGE
A Service Charge of two percent (2%) is to be paid by those taxpayers electing to pay their January Tax Bill in installments. A Service Charge of one percent (1%) is to be paid by those taxpayers electing to pay their September School Tax Bill in installments. This Service Charge is to be County Revenue and is to be used to pay all costs associated with the development, implementation, and administration of Installment Payment of current year taxes.

Section 5. GENERAL POWERS OF THE COUNTY TREASURER
In addition to the powers granted to the County Treasurer in the local law, he/she is hereby authorized and empowered to:
A. Make, adopt and amend rules and regulations appropriate to the carrying out of this local law and the purposes thereof;
B. Annually review the Service Charge Fees and to make necessary increases/decreases in the Fees to cover all costs associated with the Installment Payment of taxes;
C. Delegate his/her functions hereunder to the Deputy County Treasurer or any employee to employees of the Office of the County Treasurer.

Section 6. EFFECTIVE DATE
This local law shall take effect immediately upon its adoption. School Districts which decide to permit Installment Payment of current year School Taxes must so notify the County Treasurer by copy of the official Board of Education Resolution on or before August 1, preceding the September School Tax Levy. The decision to permit Installment payment of current year School Taxes will remain in force until revoked by a Board of Education Resolution, a copy of which must be given the County Treasurer on or before August 1, preceding the September School Tax Levy.

Town Boards and City Boards which decided to permit Installment Payment of current year Town/County or City/County Taxes must so notify the County Treasurer by copy of the official Town Board Resolution on or before October 1, preceding the January Town/County Tax Levy. The decision to permit Installment Payment of current year Town/County Taxes will remain in force until revoked by a Town Board Resolution, a copy of which must be given the County Treasurer on or before October 1, preceding the January Town/County or City/County Tax Levy.

Both Jefferson and Nightingale will be able to accommodate 18 students in general education and Madison will have 12 students in an integrated program.

"So that's a little bit different than what has happened before, but we want to make sure that we're giving equal access to all the students," Chapman said.

Chapman said that parents will also be able to undergo an orientation process with the schools, which include parent-teacher conferences and either home visits during the summer or orientation at the school for parents. Parents are an important figure in a child's life and "play a pivotal role" in their early development, she said.

As part of the student's educa-

tion, Chapman said developing and increasing fine and gross motor skills are a large part of the program.

"I have been sitting in data meetings all week with our kindergarten folks, and they see when we're working on fine motor and gross motor skills, that intervening early is certainly necessary. I wish we had more providers," she said.

Luckily outside organizations and agencies can apply to take part in the pre-k program.

Chapman said communities agencies that are considering partnering with the district need to provide a number of details, including ways they will meet district goals set forth in the district plan, along with services provided, staff qualifications, what the student to staff ratio is, budgets and other details.

According to Chapman, a number of outside organizations are eligible to partner with the district, ranging from day care agencies to private schools, Head Start and libraries. She said state officials are aiming to ensure that all students have access to pre-k services.

"We know that early intervention is the most important intervention," Chapman said.

says he plans to develop the brewery at a nearby location.

He has requested that the city allow him to keep the property to sell to another developer at the same price he purchased it from the city.

Hosmer, a former city councilor, says the development of the area would be good for the city, and a

direct sale between him and the developer would be faster than returning the property to the city, which would likely be a more expensive endeavor for all involved.

Hosmer said that he'd actually be taking a loss on the property due to surveying and closing costs that were already paid, but said the development would have obvious benefits for his existing restaurant and future brewery.

As part of the RFP established in the sale of the parcel, property adjacent to the 17 Main Street parcel was slated to go to another developer. Now the city will need to issue a new request for proposal or reach out to that developer before proceeding with that sale.

Interim City Manager Andrea Smith told council she had not heard from the other developer since the RFP was issued but would make contact to gauge interest.

City Councilor Dan Skamperle said he wanted to see the city figure out how to move forward with a sale to Wright. Councilor John Rishe who was critical of the RFP last year said that all city land should be sold at auction. He said the city's decision to create an RFP led to the current situation and suggested that the other parcel in question should be sold at auction.

Picture it...no, not Sicily 1928...but sitting around in a soft lit, cozy living room after a large family meal celebrating the winter holidays, a fire gently crackling in the background.

What is the group talking about?

Maybe you're reminiscing about past holiday gatherings and missing those who've since died, how the food was, what gift you're anticipating giving or getting most, or how wonderful it is to see those who live far away?

All worthy topics to be sure.

Have you ever thought about using this comfortable, relaxed environment to discuss some of the most important things in life; how to live fully and ways to share our legacies with generations to come?

These topics make up what are known as "courageous conversations."

These courageous conversations are focused on the steps one can take to have the end-of-life experience that they want – one that matches up with their values – and one which allows them to have a say in how their legacy is shared with others.

What better time than when you're surrounded by those you love, those who may be making medical decisions for you at some point, those who will want to carry your legacy forward?

Keep it casual

There is no need to get out a notebook, find a notary, or hire a lawyer just to talk about these things.

Having general, low-key conversations about things like what you want done with your body after you die, if you want calling hours or not, or if there's a charity you'd like donations to be made to in your memory, can still provide valuable insight to your family and friends about how to best honor your legacy.

Humor helps

Do not make these conversations overly serious.

You're talking about some tough topics here, take time to laugh!

Try questions like "What's the one piece of advice you give that people continue to ignore and can we put it in your obituary," "What

would you say your superpower is," or "Will you include the full secret recipe for the meatballs in your will"?

Read the room

If you try to bring up these topics and everyone is too uncomfortable or if there was a recent death within the group, this may not be the best time.

You can still have broad conversations about the beauty of life by asking things such as "What is your favorite family tradition and how did it start," "What's your definition of a life well-lived," and "Do you prefer sunrises or sunsets and why?"

Powerful conversations

These topics can be hard to broach, but doing so allows for enriching and powerful conversations between you and those with whom you spend the holidays.

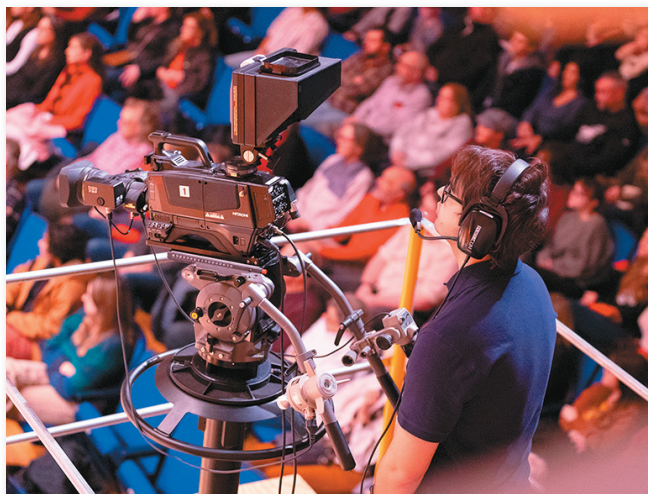
