SLU facing \$11.5 million deficit

CANTON – Citing a \$11.5 million deficit in February, St. Lawrence University officials have been working to better position themselves for decades to come.

One move set to take effect Jan. 1 is the reduction of retirement contributions from 10 percent to 6 percent for non-union employees.

“Let me say clearly, St. Lawrence University has been a strong institution for over 150 years and we are positioning the institution for success for the next 150 years,” stated President Kate Morris.

The University will also be awarding all faculty and non-union employees a 2 percent pay increase this year, according to University Spokesperson Kim Asch.

“Our thinking is that it’s better to give our employees flexibility with how they spend their money,” she said.

In February, according to Asch, the Board of Trustees agreed to a three-year window or until 2026, to solve the fiscal issue.

“We have already identified the bulk of expense reductions and new revenue streams to address the deficit, leaving us with the need for \$2.8 million of enhanced revenues and/or reduced expenses by 2026,” Asch stated. “Within the context of a budget around \$125 million, the University remains confident that we will solve this challenge.”

St. Lawrence, like many colleges and universities throughout the country, is striving to recover from enrollment and revenue loss attributed to

Canton teen heading to Rider University on D1 golf scholarship

CANTON – At the age of 5, it didn’t take long for Ryan Jones to realize that the game of golf was special to him. The now Hugh C. Williams High School senior solidified his passion for golf when he won the 12 and under New York State Junior Amateur tournament in 2018.

Potsdam signs deals to develop town-owned lands

POTSDAM — The town board has authorized agreements with outside firms for possible developments on town-owned land on Reynolds Road.

At their meeting Dec. 12, board members also approved several other resolutions including an equipment purchase and agreements for financial services.

The town council approved the purchase of a new 12-foot snow push Fusion Model 477-9892 for

the town’s CAT Loader. The purchase will be from a state contract from Milton CAT, 7903 Eastman Road, for a total of \$10,695.55.

Approval was also given for a site access agreement with St. Lawrence Seaway RSA Cellular Partnership [doing business as Verizon Wireless] to review and perform tests on town-owned land at 74 Reynolds Road in Norwood. The firm is interested in possibly installing a cell tower there. The resolution authorized outgoing Town Supervisor Ann Carvill to sign the agreement.

An option to lease agreement between the town and solar company EDF Renewables Distributed Solutions Inc. was also approved.

The agreement would allow the company to lease up to 35 acres of town land on Reynolds Road in Norwood.

Finally, the town board voted to approve agreements between the municipality and the firm Municipal Solutions Inc. which will provide fiscal advice on the town’s Route 56 water and sewer districts.

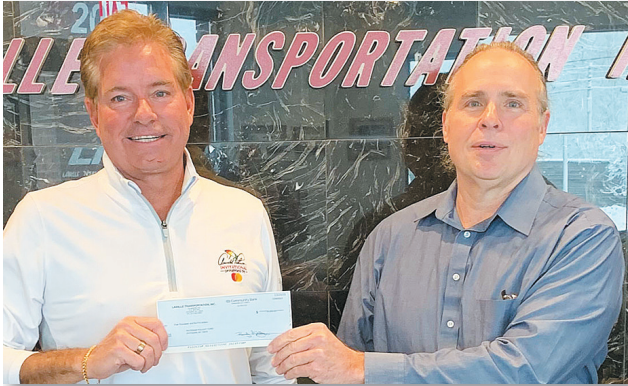

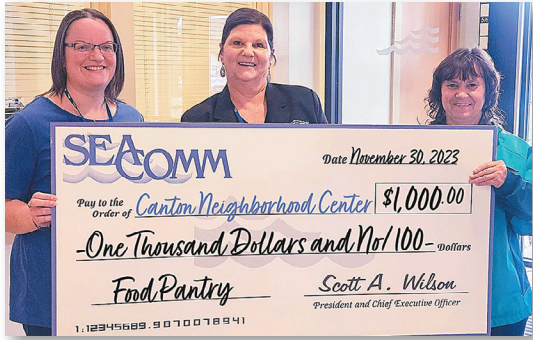

Former Boy Scout troop leader convicted of sexually assaulting child suing county

CANTON -- A former lawyer and Boy Scout troop leader convicted of sexually assaulting a child on a camping trip in Piercefild in 2014 is suing St. Lawrence County and New York State, arguing he should not be registered as a sex offender.

Michael Kelsey, who was also a Dutchess County legislator at the time of the initial allegations, was convicted of first-degree sexual abuse, first-degree attempted sexual abuse, forcible touching and two counts of endangering the welfare of a child in 2016.

The charges and subsequent conviction stem from a Boy Scouts camping trip to Cranberry Lake in 2014. Victims told investigators that Kelsey assaulted one boy and attempted to assault another.

Despite multiple attempts to appeal the decision and subsequent punishment, Kelsey was unsuccessful.

Now he is trying to strike at the constitutionality of his sex offender status.

According to St. Lawrence County Attorney Steve Button, the county will seek to be dismissed from the court action.

"The county feels we have a strong case and are confident the court will eventually support our position," Button said.

At the heart of the court action is the very constitutionality of the Corrections Law in an attempt to overturn his sex offender status.

Initial court ruling

Kelsey was sentenced to an aggregate prison term of seven years to be followed by 10 years of post release supervision following his conviction.

The punishment issued in 2016 was then held up on an appeal, according to court documents.

Kelsey was released from prison in May 2022 but prior to his release,

a risk assessment instrument was submitted by the Board of Examiners of Sex Offenders that classified him as a risk level two sex offender with a sexually violent offender designation.

Kelsey tried to reargue the designation but was denied "based on a failure to provide notice of motion to the People," according to court documents.

Kelsey has continued to appeal that decision but has been continually denied by the court.

Legal challenges

In a new motion, Kelsey is raising a direct constitutional challenge to a certain portion of Corrections Law in an attempt to overturn his sex offender status.

Kelsey has also taken legal action, hoping to successfully obtain a court order that would prohibit the District Attorneys of every county in New York State from retaining copies of pre-sentence reports beyond sentencing.

In the same motion, Kelsey also sought to require the St. Lawrence County District Attorney to destroy all copies of pre-sentence reports. Mary Rain was the district attorney during Kelsey's initial conviction.

Kelsey also sought monetary damages, punitive damages and \$10,000 for attorney's fees. Kelsey is representing himself in all court actions.

In other court actions, Kelsey sued County Court Judge Felix Catena, who presided over his trial, Kim Nethaway, the stenographer who transcribed the trial and former Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals Janet DiFiore, claiming that "various alleged deficiencies in the proceedings deprived him of due process and negativity impacted the appeal of his ensuing conviction."

Those actions were dismissed in State Supreme Court since Nethaway was not properly served notice and Catena was entitled to judicial immunity.

First Amendment cited

Now Kelsey is arguing to overturn his sex offender status saying it violates his First Amendment Rights.

In court documents, Kelsey argues that his status denies him his right to attend religious services in a house of worship.

In other instances, Kelsey said he is suffering further damages to his personal reputation and is unable to attend functions like family gatherings.

In further legal action, Kelsey is seeking relief from sex offender registration act including state statutes regarding use of pre-sentence investigation reports and victim impact statements in SORA determination.

Button said such documents are used in assessing sex offender statuses prior to an individual being released from prison.

"At this time we are unsure if this will go to trial or not but the county is of the opinion that at the very least the county should be dismissed from the case," Button said.

Legal action is expected to continue over the next several weeks, Button said.

Project to close part of road in Canton

CANTON – The Canton Village Board agreed Wednesday night to allow the county to close a section of Pearl Street to traffic during the major renovation of the St. Lawrence County Public Safety Complex on Court Street slated this spring.

Mayor Michael Dalton noted that one stipulation within the agreement is the replacement of storm drains at the Court and Pearl Street area.

The section of Pearl Street to be closed stretches from Court Street to the Pearl Street entrance to Community Bank.

The county awarded multiple contracts valued at nearly \$5 million at a special meeting on Dec. 18.

Local contractors were the recipients of the county contracts.

Northern Tier Contracting, Gouverneur, has been named the general contractor for the project on a con-

tract not to exceed \$2,072,200.

Plumbing services will be handled by ENI Mechanical out of Gouverneur with a contract not to exceed \$899,500.

The mechanical contractor will be Northern Mechanical, Inc., Norfolk, on a contract not to exceed \$1,269,000.

Electrical services will be handled by Colton's S&L Electric, Inc. with a contract not to exceed \$676,000.

Legislators say the decision came after "a comprehensive planning and competitive RFP process" and a "thorough bid process" that included 14 bidders.

More than 75% of bidders were from St. Lawrence County, officials say.

County Administrator Ruth Doyle said the project calls for \$7.5 million in total investment, though the four primary contractors announced account for "the lion's share of the work."

Remaining contracts that still have to be put out to bid include commissioning, front entry work, generator rental, asbestos abatement, HVAC and furniture procurement, Doyle said.

The complex is currently occupied by the Sheriff's Office road patrol and civil enforcement divisions, Emergency Services (PSAP), Planning and Conflict Defender, along with New York State Police, who lease space on the first floor.

New sidewalk support sought

CANTON – The Village of Canton is inviting community members to provide letters of support for the construction of new sidewalks on Cleveland Avenue and Mildon Road.

The Village of Canton is applying for a Transportation Alternatives & Safe Routes to School grant to fund the design and construction of sidewalks on Cleveland Avenue from Judson Street to Mildon Road, and on Mildon Road from Goodrich Street to Farmer Street. These improvements will fill gaps in the Village's existing sidewalk network and will provide increased mobility and safety for pedestrians and other non-motorized users. The project will enhance safety for children and families walking to Canton Central School and St. Cath-

erine of Siena Academy as well as municipal buildings and downtown businesses.

If awarded the Transportation Alternatives & Safe Routes to School grant, the Village will also be able to complete much-needed repairs to the storm drainage system on Cleveland Avenue.

Public support for this project will increase the likelihood of it being awarded. The Village is asking for expressions of support that may be submitted with the application. Donald Colby, 64

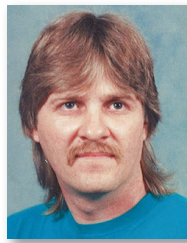

Local senators question electric bus mandate

Senators Mark Walczyk and Dan Stec are calling on Governor Hochul to cover the costs school districts face to convert their bus fleets to all-electric, or to scrap the mandates all together.

They aren't not alone. Many state representatives have raised concerns that the electric bus mandate is moving too fast.

"School leaders I'm talking to are concerned about making up for the education gap shutdowns left behind, enrollment decline, quality instruction, and educating the next generation of leaders and employees," Walczyk said. "Nobody wants battery-buses. Nobody asked for battery-buses. Nobody thinks the Governor's battery-bus plan is based in reality."

In March Lisbon Central School saw a project that would have modernized the bus garage fail. Superintendent Patrick Farrand said he believes that was in part due to the state push toward electric buses.

Ogdensburg Superintendent Kevin Kendall has also expressed concerns about the viability of the electric buses in the North Country.

Cold weather and the geography of St. Lawrence County's rural districts present challenges for electric buses due to the distance traveled in routes.

Batteries used in the vehicles are less efficient in cold weather.

However the state has mandated that schools begin working toward

converting their fleets to electric models, despite those concerns as well as the area's aging powergrid.

As part of the '22-'23 State Budget language was included that requires new bus purchases be zero emission by 2027 for all schools across the state and all school buses be zero emission by 2035.

According to the US Department of Energy, a new, fully electric school bus can cost roughly \$400,000, which is triple the price of an average school bus, which is approximately \$130,000.

Walczyk says that schools across the 49th Senate District will have a difficult time footing the bill for this mandate. NYSERDA estimates show that there's 45,000 school buses in New York, which translates to a \$20 billion price tag for converting every bus in every school district across the state by the 2035 deadline.

"At a time when rural, upstate schools could use more funding to focus on educational services, this expensive mandate would raise taxes and divert resources away from students," said Stec. "Green initiatives are laudable, but the electric bus mandate runs counter to the realities our schools face. Instead of requirements that have a detrimental impact on both our schools and taxpayers, the governor should either lift this mandate or allocate enough funding in next year's budget to cover the \$20 billion its expected to cost to convert the 45,000 school buses in operation statewide," Stec said.

business, the chief said. SLC schools post lackluster scores in state math, English tests

St. Lawrence County School District posted lackluster scores in the latest round of statewide math and English language arts assessment tests, according to new state data.

Not a single district in St. Lawrence County was among the top 100 districts in English Language Arts proficiency and only one district was in the top 100 for math.

Changes to state testing for grades 3 through 8 have resulted in lower scores for most districts throughout the state.

Even districts in Nassau and Westchester county that were tied for first place saw only 86 percent of students proficient in ELA and were slightly worse in Math.

Many districts statewide have seen major dips in proficiency in the wake of the pandemic as well

which appears to have had a major impact on students in 2020 and 2021.

English Language Arts

St. Lawrence County School District's best performing school district for ELA proficiency was Potsdam Central School with just 55% proficiency.

Potsdam was ranked 149th out of the state's 661 school districts.

The only other St. Lawrence County school to crack the top 200 was Colton Pierrepoint with 51% proficiency. CPSD ranks 191st.

Massena and Ogdensburg were tied at 337th with 41% proficiency.

Canton Central was 337th with 31% proficiency.

The lowest ranking districts in St. Lawrence County for ELA proficiency were Gouverneur at 26% in 604th place and Edwards Knox

at 25% in 618th place.

Math

Colton Pierrepoint was the highest ranking St. Lawrence County district for math proficiency with 69%. The district was ranked 84th statewide.

Massena Central School District was ranked 156th with 60 percent proficiency, while Ogdensburg was ranked 364th at 43% proficiency.

Canton Central School was at 54% proficiency ranking 211th.

Math data was not available for Potsdam.

The lowest ranking district in St. Lawrence County for math proficiency was Gouverneur at 27% in 506th place and Edwards Knox at 30% in 488th place.

Canton village board mulling over cost of community composting

CANTON – It appears the consensus of the Canton Village Board is keeping a much-improved composting program alive, although dedicated adequate funding for the food scrap drop off site is in question.

Catherine Shrady, chair of the village's Sustainability Committee, addressed the board at its monthly meeting on Wednesday night, seeking an extension to an initial three-month trial period for the rejuvenated compost site.

"Please consider options at the end of the trial period in January," said Shrady, citing the elimination of problems identified by village officials. "Over a ton of food waste [2,694 pounds] has been saved from the landfill."

Mayor Michael Dalton pointed to the financial side of the program.

"You have done a good job trying to eliminate the problems but the biggest thing is trying to find funding for this," the mayor stated. "Things are really tight."

"The important thing for us is

how do we fund this. The board needs to have a global view and at some point see some support to help fund this," Dalton added.

Shrady told village officials that the committee has been working with North Country Compost (NCC) who have set in motion a compost site that now features an open dumpster to two sealed and local 96-gallon totes and requires users to sign up for free access to the coded lock. Signs at the site provide a QR code that links to an online form where the email, name and primary residence of the user are recorded. Also, the containers are emptied weekly.

She said the committee is exploring grant opportunities.

There was talk about a liaison now on board to engage with the community to promote the program and educate the public about the overall benefits of composting.

Trustee Barbara Beekman said she would like to give the liaison a chance to work before possibly shutting down the program.

It was also noted the village is the sole contributor to the food scrap dump site, although a handful of town residents are using it.

Beekman encouraged people in attendance to contact town board members to seek their support.

"This will be part of our conversation during budget season. Six thousand dollars doesn't look like much but we have a lot of expenses," Dalton said.

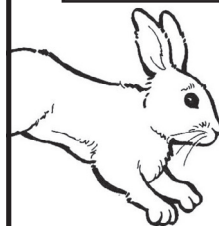

Canton officials discuss cramped municipal building

CANTON – A joint town and village Building Committee continues to weigh issues surrounding a cramped and outdated municipal building.

At Wednesday night's monthly town board meeting, Councilman John Taillon, who sits on the Building Committee, updated board members on the municipal building situation. He said the committee is currently focused on a new building.

In April, both the town and village boards were introduced to a design by BCA Architects and Engineers, Watertown, for a new building at a cost of more than \$25 million. Both boards have agreed the price tag is too expensive.

"The main focus is to scale down the project for a possible new building. We are looking at needs opposed to wants," Tallion stated. "We are working hard knowing \$25 million is way out there. We're trying to whittle it down."

He said one area of interest is reducing storage area.

"There is lots of storage area in the previous plan," he said.

The committee has met with the town justices and town and

village clerks for their input. They are also looking at options for the Canton Police Department.

"We are looking at every department to see where they need to be," stated Town Supervisor Mary Ann Ashley.

"We are looking at everything," added Taillon.

The next Building Committee is scheduled for Dec. 28.

Blueprints unveiled in April for the new municipal building featured a two-story structure that incorporates the now-owned McDonald's property at 64 Main St. The new building would be sited on the former McDonald's property.

The first floor would house separate town and village offices, the court system and police department with secured areas. The second floor, according to the design, would have the historian's office, assessor's office, economic development office and separate town and village code enforcement offices.

Since then, the historian's office has been relocated to a much larger area at 7 Main St.

The new building would be fully handicapped accessible.

Town and village officials are also searching for possible funding opportunities.

the pandemic.

"Like many higher education institutions in the North Country, New York state, and across the nation, St. Lawrence hasn't returned to pre-pandemic enrollment levels and it's not likely they will soon, because all higher education institutions are facing a demographic shift in this country with declines in traditional college-age students," said Asch.

"One of the first things we did was simply right-sizing budgets. We identified some positions that had long been vacant and identified places where budgeted funds exceeded what we were actually spending and made those adjust-

ments. And that was a significant portion of what we have been able to do to reduce our deficit," Asch continued.

So what is St. Lawrence doing to increase revenue and reduce expenses?

The University opened the Canaras Conference Center up to people outside our St. Lawrence community to book for weddings and other events. There is increased revenue from the London study abroad program, the university has introduced a new, inclusive digital textbook platform, and increased fundraising, said Asch in an email to North Country This Week.

Throughout the process, St. Lawrence has worked to adjust to the needs of today's students.

Asch said the University is investing \$30 million in facilities enhancements that include renovations to student spaces in residence halls, the library, and student center.

Over the last two years, St. Lawrence has added six new academic majors - Biomedical Sciences, Data Science, Digital Media and Film, Finance, Pre-Health Chemistry, and Public Health - that have been very popular with students to the extent that almost 12% of the first-year class listed as their primary academic interest one of those 6 new majors.

The University is also launching a new Center for the Environment. New initiatives of the Center, according to the St. Lawrence website, include:

- Environmental Scholars Program - Scholarships for qualified first-year students with special opportunities, including a pre-orientation trip and First-Year Program courses with environmental themes.
- Green Internship Fellowships - Stipends for students engaging in unpaid or underpaid professional opportunities within the environmental sector.
- Green Innovation Grants - Provide funding to undergraduate students who create projects that improve energy use, reduce waste and increase recycling/composting on campus, and otherwise contribute to improving our campus environment and lower our environmental impact.
- Develop an Environmental Fellows program and launch co-curricular, skills-based, and leadership opportunities to achieve an Environmental Distinction.

- St. Lawrence County pharmacies are also offering flu, RSV, and COVID-19 vaccine appointments.
- Talking with your provider or child's pediatrician about the RSV vaccine if you are 32-36 weeks pregnant, the parent/guardian of a baby, and/or 60 years old or older.
- Regularly wash hands with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds.
- Cleaning and disinfect commonly touched surfaces and objects.
- Consider wearing a mask in public spaces when not feeling well.
- Consider wearing a mask around someone who is at risk of getting very sick.
- Letting fresh air indoors, especially when gathering with others, and consider social distancing.

Canton man refutes broadcast

According to North Country Public Radio, as broadcast on the air during the local segment of All Things Considered, and posted on the NCPR website, Gov. Kathy Hochul has signed into law a measure to look at potential reparations for New Yorkers whose ancestors suffered under slavery in the state.

Hochul says that before slavery was abolished in the state in 1827, 20% of New York City's population was enslaved Africans.

This is simply not true. It didn't sound right when I heard it, and I know how to search census records. In the 1820 census only the heads of households were identified by name. Everybody else was a number on the chart, distinguished according to gender, age bracket, whether white or black, and whether slave or free. New York City consisted only of Manhattan Island in those days, and there were ten wards. The reconciliation sheets on which all those numbers were tallied are missing for three wards, and I am not eager to add them up myself, but the complete data for seven wards is enough to make my point. Bear with me. Numbers are important here. For the seven wards combined, according to photographic images of the actual census records, the numbers are: free white males -- 29,093 (42.8%), free white females -- 31,396 (46.2%), male slaves -- 63 (0.09%), female slaves -- 170 (0.25%), free colored males -- 1,825 (2.7%), free colored females -- 2,839 (4.2%), foreigners -- 2,583 (3.8%).

Yes, you read that correctly. Out of a total population of 67,969, only 233, one-third of one percent,

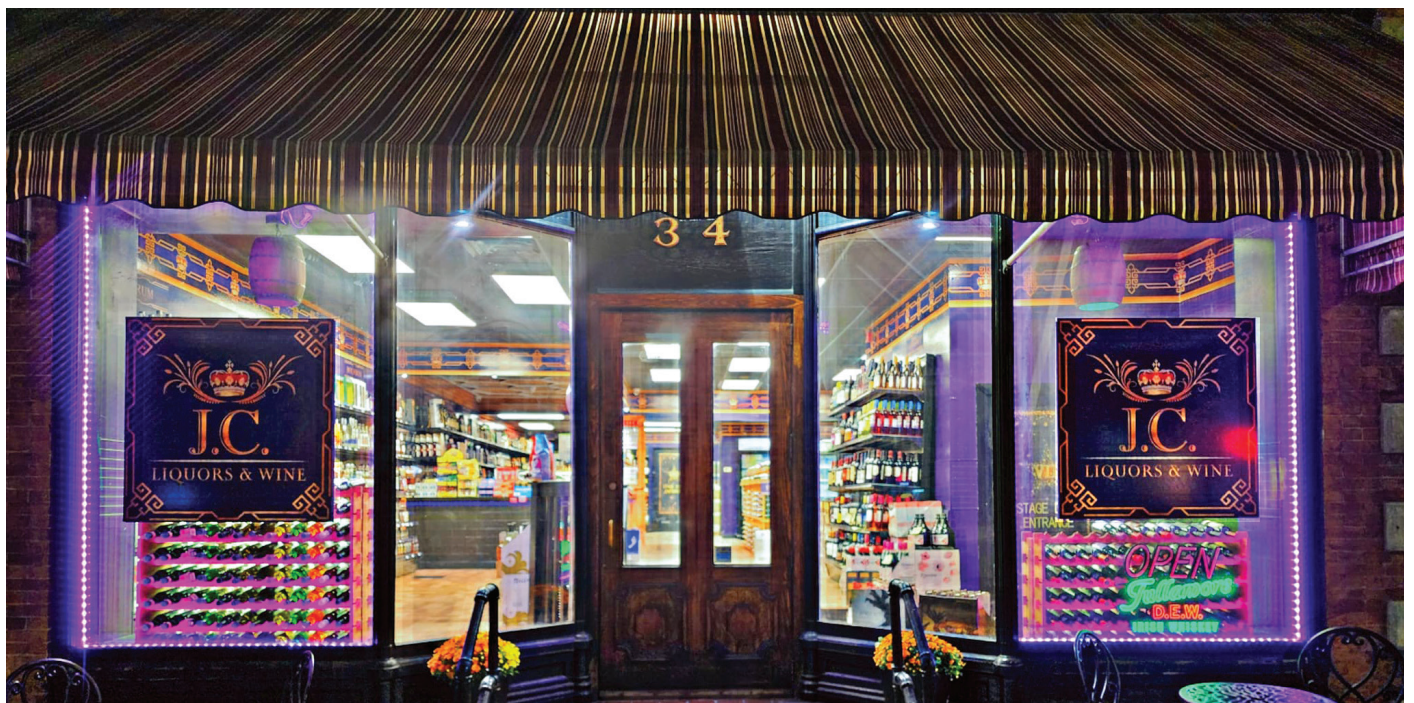

Hochul creating reparations task force

New York state is creating a commission tasked with considering reparations to address the "harmful effects of slavery in the state," in a bill signed by Gov. Kathy Hochul on Tuesday.

However, some representatives say that state officials should wait to address those issues until the state can get its house and coffers in order.

It comes on the heels of failed attempts to pass federal legislation and follows in the footsteps of legislation passed in California.

"In New York, we like to think we're on the right side of this. Slavery was a product of the South, the Confederacy," Hochul said "What is hard to embrace is the fact that our state also flourished from that slavery," she said.

Not everyone is on board

with the idea, especially at a time when the state has failed to pass budgets that are balanced or on-time.

Among the detractors are North Country Assemblyman Ken Blankenbush (R,C-Black River).

He said Hochul's reparations task force will consist of nine members appointed by the governor, Assembly speaker, and the Senate temporary president.

The objective of the task force is to identify individuals who are descendants of slavery and determine appropriate compensation and remedies. While the members won't receive compensation, they will be reimbursed for expenses related to "performing their duties," he said.

"New York Democrats are chasing the past while the rest of the state is suffering in the present. They are further perpetuating the notion

people are nothing more than their race," Blankenbush said.

"The task force has no financial limits and no clear timeframe for dispersing these reparations. It's essentially a money pit taxpayers will be funding blindly. We are coming into a new year expecting to pay people who were never slaves, and who will be compensated by people who never owned slaves. The money would be better used to revitalize disadvantaged communities, invest in community-based programs that benefit our youth, or invest in more affordable housing, but of course, that's too common sense. For a political party that allegedly prides itself on inclusion, its consistent divisive rhetoric continues to drive people apart. SLC People Project. "So far, close to 200 children have been outfitted with brand new coats, winter boots, hats and mittens, but there is still a need.

She said a \$50 donation would provide one child with the items needed to be outside in the North County weather.

SLC Cancer fund awards nearly \$70k in grants

The St. Lawrence County Cancer fund recently awarded grants to seven local Cancer Care centers and non-profits totaling \$67,000.

Each year monies raised through the SLCCF/Edward I Moses Walk/Run for Life and various other events are available for local non-profits to apply to educate, diagnose or treat those in St. Lawrence County who are battling cancer.

This year's recipients are:

The Cancer Care center at Gouverneur Hospital (\$10,000) to assist up to 40 high risk patients to be genetically screened for prevalent genes that are related to cancer. This is specifically for patients who are uninsured or whose insurance will not cover the cost. St. Lawrence Health System has started a program for people at a high risk of cancer. Depending on specific criteria, patients are recommended for genetic testing to determine if they carry any genes that put them at a higher risk. Patients and their families are supported and counseled about their results and the associated cancer risks. These screenings will help with future diagnosis and possible treatments for those who have been diagnosed with cancer.

The Richard E Winter Cancer treatment center (\$10,000) will use some of its funds to purchase a Medical Precision Comfort Marker 2.0 system with a patient marking set. This system offers the ability to not only improve the patient experience, but also offers more precise accuracy due to its pen grip. It also allows for markings small enough that the patient will not have permanently noticeable alterations. Similar to a permanent make-up device, the device allows for depth-controlled injection resulting in less pain to the patient as well as uniform shape of markings. It offers sterile, disposable safety needles to minimize the risk of needlestick accidents while also aiding in infection control measures.

The Center for Cancer Care at CPH (\$10,000) will direct most of its funds for the patient transportation program, including gas and preventative maintenance on the vehicle, as well as direct assistance to help cover travel expenses. Many patients are unable to find reliable ways to get to appointments when they do not have their own vehicle or driver. Patient transportation assistance continues to be a critical factor in delivering high quality care to patients.

Ryan's Wish requested and was awarded \$10,000 to continue its efforts to promote the mission of helping those who are suffering from a serious illness to "play and live strong." The foundation primarily serves patients in the St. Lawrence County Region of Northern New York who are diagnosed with cancer. Funds received from the foundation helps offset traveling costs and other expenses incurred by patients and their families

during treatment or hospitalization. The foundation has given out on average between \$45-50 thousand dollars a year, figuring 20 years since the conception of the foundation would total close to \$1,000,000 distributed to people and families in need.

St. Lawrence Valley Hospice and Palliative Care was awarded \$10,000 to help fund its AIM (Advanced Illness Management) program to provide services directly to community residents living with cancer and fills a large gap in the county's medical system. Family members benefit tremendously from AIM services due to the very nature of home visits. Caregivers don't have the added burden of transporting their loved one to a clinical setting, and, while in a comfortable and familiar environment, have ample opportunity to ask questions, learn about disease progression and discuss fears and concerns. Over the last 11 months, AIM used SLCCF grant funds to defray the cost of providing 321 visits to 58 patients with cancer. With an average loss of \$400 per visit this year, the shortfall for 25 visits was completely covered with the funds provided by the SLCCF.

Jerry's Run for a Cause was awarded \$7000 to help continue their collective mission of assisting families and other members of our community who are directly affected by Cancer in memory of Jerry Ferguson and avid motorcyclist. Proceeds from our annual motorcycle ride go directly to local families within St. Lawrence and Jefferson Counties who are battling cancer. Our support helps pay for prescriptions, travel costs for treatments, groceries for special diets and other related expenses. Collectively Jerry's Run for a Cause has given assistance to over 200 cancer patients in need, giving out upwards of \$109,000.

Compassionate Care Foundation, founded in 2022, was awarded \$7000 to help provide integrative education and treatment options in our rural communities for those who are battling cancer. They fill a significant gap in care for cancer patients. Conventional medical treatments and interventions are available in the North Country; however, integrative cancer care which includes massage therapy, acupuncture and Reiki sessions are now accessible through CCF. These supportive therapies are available to all cancer patients at the initiation of their treatment and remain available throughout their disease management journey be that curative, control, or comfort. Regardless of the medical phase of the disease, the therapeutic benefit of these treatments remains even through hospice care. In Specific to St Lawrence County, CCF has provided on-site supportive therapies at the Richard E. Winter Cancer Treatment Center since March of 2023.

Walczyk eyes election problems

Senator Walczyk introduces bill to increase penalties for impersonating Board Of Elections officials

Across New York, individuals are confronting voters at their homes and claiming to be Board of Elections officials, claims a press release from State Sen. Mark Walczyk's office.

These people have been asking voters personal questions and intimidating voters by claiming that they appear in New York's voter database more than once, the press release claims.

The local Boards of Elections, along with the State Board, have put out warnings to voters about these bad actors, the press release said.

As the Ranking Member on the Senate Elections Committee, Walczyk is deeply troubled by these recent actions, the press release said.

Citizens should not have to live with the fear of strangers coming up to their door and making concerning allegations about their voter status, the senator said.

In response, Walczyk has introduced Bill S7661, which creates the

crime of impersonating a Board of Elections worker or commissioner.

"Regardless of one's political affiliation, intimidation of this kind cannot be tolerated," Walczyk said. "In a time when faith in our electoral system is diminishing, these imposters actively undermine voter confidence. I'm proud to work with Assemblyman Norris to carry a common sense bill that Republicans and Democrats alike can support."

"Reports of fraudulent board of elections scams are extremely concerning. As a former elections commissioner and the Ranking Member of the Assembly Elections Committee, I know all too well how detrimental these kinds of scams can be to our democratic process and discourage people from participating in our elections. That's why I am standing up and sponsoring this new bill," said Assemblyman Mike Norris. "Please know, it is crucial that people continue to vote and if there is ever a question about your voter enrollment, please contact your home county board of elections to look into the matter. There

will always be a few bad actors threatening our democracy but I am proud to have the partnership of determined colleagues, like Senator Walczyk, working with me to protect the sanctity of our elections and your vote."

"I want to commend Senator Walczyk for maintaining and safeguarding our election integrity so every voter will have confidence, and those who try to break the law will be held accountable. We should be doing everything we can to protect election integrity," said Tom Nichols, St. Lawrence County Board of Elections Commissioner. "Some election laws are watered down, too many examples of penalties that are too lenient, the consequences for breaking the law should be deterring people from even attempting to break the law"

Walczyk represents the 49th Senate District, which includes the entire counties of Jefferson, Lewis, Hamilton and Fulton. As well as parts of Oswego, St. Lawrence, and Herkimer counties.

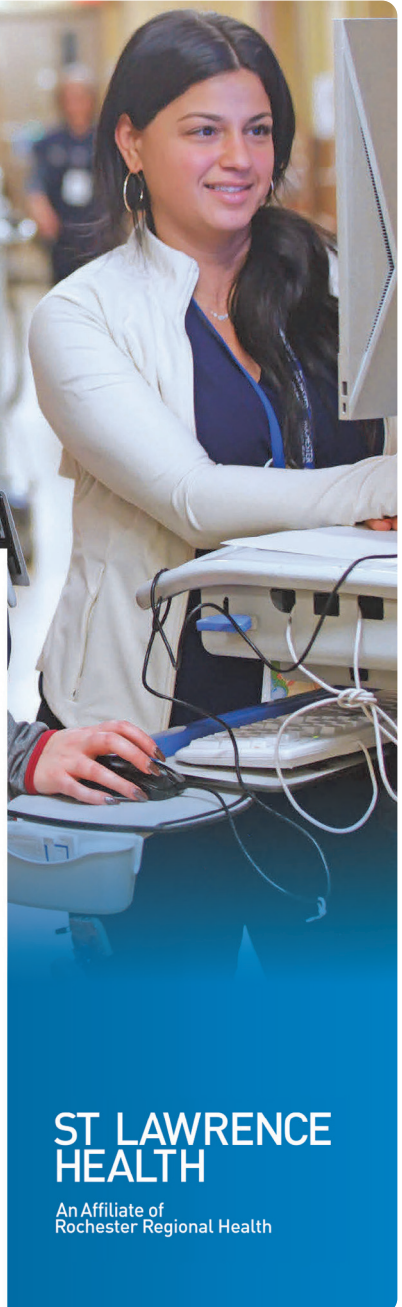
