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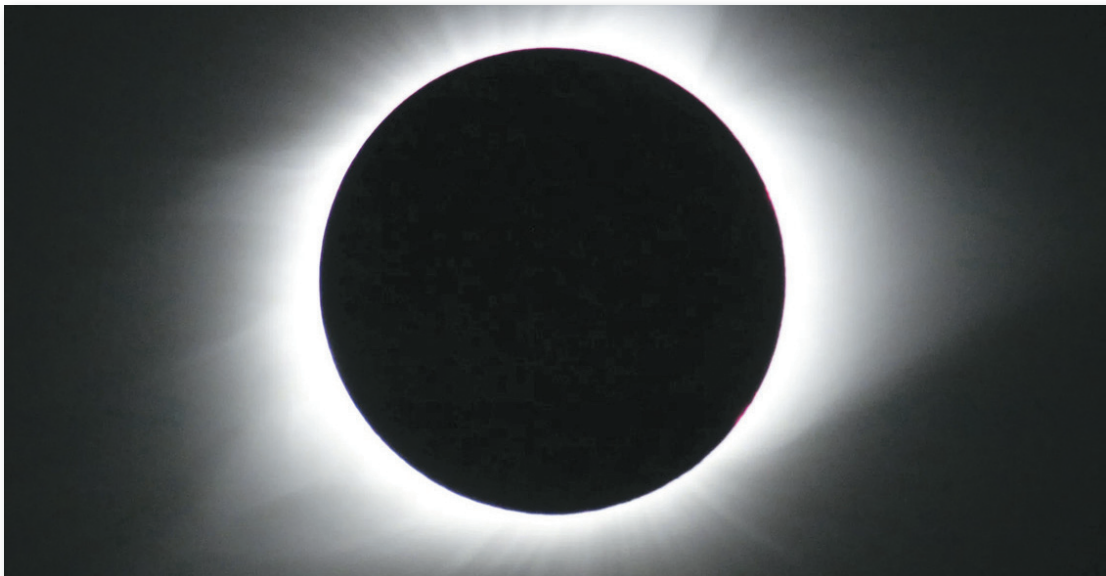

What to expect when it goes dark

The Great Northern American Eclipse will take place Monday, April 8 when the earth, the moon and sun turn in orbital synchrony to produce a complete totality for several moments over a narrow swath of St. Lawrence County.

According to estimates, the partial eclipse will begin over the region about 2:11 p.m., the totality begins about 3:23 p.m. and ends 3:26 p.m. The partial eclipse ends about 4:36 p.m. Times vary depending on where the path travels.

Thousands of people are expected to visit the region for

a front row seat to this celestial show.

The totality over the region is literally a once in a lifetime event with the next total eclipse not scheduled to pass overhead of St. Lawrence County until 2205, and the next time the region will fall directly under the path of totality, similar to the 2024 eclipse, will not occur again until 2399. The last total solar eclipse in New York was in 1925.

A total solar eclipse occurs when the moon passes directly between the sun and the earth. Those in the path of totality, like St. Lawrence County residents will be on April 8, will see the sun form a bright halo ring with an

obsidian center where the moon covers it.

During the partial phases of the eclipse before and after the total event, the landscape will be covered by sharp shades and eerie dim lighting.

During totality the sky will take on a deep twilight, with bright stars and planets appearing.

The light from the eclipse, however, can be quite damaging to human eyes.

Those viewing the event are advised to wear special eclipse glasses, available for free in many spots, and for sale at the St. Lawrence County Chamber of

Library officials advocating for new district

MASSENA -- Massena library officials say they are going to run an honest, transparent campaign in an effort to educate the public about the benefits of switching to a school district library.

The proposition will be on the May 21 ballot when Massena Central School District voters head to the polls to approve the next school budget.

This is the second attempt to transition the library to a school district library following a failed attempt in 2020 that was thwarted after voters in Norfolk and Brasher shot down the plan with a vote of 1,640 to 892.

Members of Friends of Massena Library say they wanted to clear up a few misnomers regarding the proposed transition, including the fact that the school district would have no control over the library.

"It is not a library tied to the school district. It actually refers to the area of the school district, with-

in the Massena Central School District, that encompasses more than the town of Messina," said Donna Bourdon.

According to Bourdon, the outlying areas in the Massena Central School District, including parts of Brasher, Louisville and Norfolk will become part of the tax base that supports the library. Those added tax payers would allow the library to pull from a larger base to create more financial stability for operations, she said.

"We tried this a few years ago, and it didn't work out. The referendum was not accepted. And we think it happened because of a couple of reasons. We think there was a lot of misinformation. Plus it was the start of COVID and COVID shut the country down, shut everything down and things kind of stopped. The message that that was received in the community was more of a kind of a negative one," Bourdon said.

"We don't want a negative

City eyes grant to add firefighters

OGDENSBURG -- City council will move forward with a grant that could offset costs for four firefighters for the next three years.

At a recent meeting council agreed to hire Julie Burline of MJ Burben Inc. at a cost of \$10,000.

Now the city has taken action to submit the application with her assistance.

Burline came highly recommended to the city due to her past success with other municipalities in securing grants aimed at funding emergency services.

Fire Chief Ken Stull told council that despite the decision not to hire her last year, she still provided guidance to the department which was most appreciated.

Any extra funding secured by the city will be welcomed as the city is running on a lean budget.

In recent years the city made deep cuts to the police and fire departments after a change in the sales tax distribution formula used by the county caused a roughly \$2 million drop in revenues.

In the wake of the blow, the city took drastic measures including legal battles with the county and fire department. However, adding

insult to injury the city also dealt with substantial increases in previously approved construction projects along the city's waterfront.

Furthermore the previous council worked to reduce the tax Burden during that time which led to even deeper cuts.

Since taking office the new council has already been working to restore positions cut in recent years, but will need to offset the costs with new revenues or support from grants.

Even if the SAFER grant is secured it will not be able to pay for the firefighters hired earlier this year.

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School to spend \$990,000 on tech upgrades

MASSENA -- The Massena Central School District will receive its final installment of funding allocations from the Smart Schools Bond Act, a program designed to help schools upgrade classroom technology.

Officials say the district is slated to receive the remaining \$990,627 of a \$2,415,023 allocation as part of the act. Those funds will be used to purchase 81 smart boards for all schools in the district at a cost of \$3,599 each, 2,054 for Dell Chromebooks at \$319.77 each for all schools and 1,410 Chromebook chargers at a cost of \$30 each.

Those expenditures were approved in September by the board of education after Director of Curriculum Nicole Charleson informed board members she consulted with Technology Director Michael Allen.

Charleson said she and Allen assessed the district's technology needs and first identified the need to replace Vizio televisions that were being used for the same intended function in the junior high.

Other smart boards are being updated after not receiving upgrades in the previous decade, she previously told board members.

Allen also previously told board members that the 2,054 Chromebooks would put the district in better position for the future, with four years of replacements on hand with the purchase of the new two-in-one touch screen edition laptops.

The purchase of the chargers was also necessary after a number had gone missing over the years, Charleson previously said.

In years prior, she said the district would receive about 60% of all chargers issued at the end of the year.

With the final disbursement of funds planned, the district will conclude purchases under the program that was first approved in 2014.

In previous years, the district spent funds on Chromecast boards, new security cameras and security doors, new interactive boards in the high school, and iPads, officials said.

Those awards totaled \$674,252, \$450,932 and \$299,212 each.

SLC legislators sign deal for paint disposal

CANTON — County officials and the Solid Waste Department are taking steps to safely dispose of solid waste, including with the signing of an agreement to dispose of paint.

County legislators signed off on the deal with PaintCare during the April 1 full board meeting.

“The Solid Waste Department recognizes the potential hazards associated with improper paint disposal, including environmental contamination and health risks,” legislators wrote.

Officials say the Development Authority of the North Country (DANC) has partnered with PaintCare for the collection and disposal of paint.

The non-profit organization PaintCare was estab-

lished to collect and responsibly manage leftover, unwanted or expired paint, officials say.

Under the deal, DANC has requested the county provide a drop off area with the county for one day per month, which will be the county Highway Department facility located at 44 Park Street, Canton.

DANC will provide staff to collect the paint at no cost to the county, officials say.

In other action the county also signed off on an agreement with the city of Ogdensburg for septage and leachate receiving services.

Under the contract, the county will be charged \$0.10 per gallon of septage and leachate received, officials say.

The agreement is an annual agreement with automatic renewals and an opt-out option for the count and city alike.

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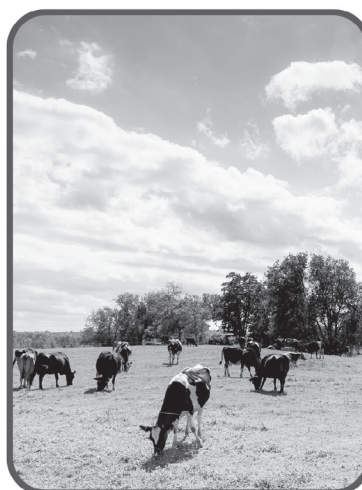

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Arrested on drug charges

GOUVERNEUR — State police arrested a Watertown man on drug charges after a traffic stop on County Route 9 on March 28 around 6:55 p.m.

Troopers report that they observed a 2011 Nissan Sentra committing numerous traffic violations on County Route 9 and they initiated a traffic stop. The operator, John C. Reynolds, 43, of Watertown, showed signs of impairment and after failing SFST's, he was arrested.

During the stop, Reynolds was found to be in possession of a quantity of crystal methamphetamine, bags of suspected fentanyl and a

scale.

Troop B's Violent Gangs and Narcotics Enforcement Team (VGNET) charged Reynolds with fourth-degree criminal possession of a controlled substance (C-Felony), seventh-degree criminal possession of a controlled substance (A-Misdemeanor), second-degree criminally using drug paraphernalia (A-Misdemeanor), DWAI-drugs and various traffic violations.

Reynolds was arraigned in the Town of Gouverneur and released.

VGNET was assisted by the county Drug Task Force, U.S. Border Patrol and Gouverneur Police.



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Massena planning total solar eclipse events town wide

MASSENA -- The total solar eclipse is coming April 8 and many locations around Massena are ready to entertain.

According to Jason Hendricks, who assists the town and village with website design and tourism initiatives, multiple events are scheduled throughout the town, including at the airport, with the library, at Robert Moses State Park, Barnhart beach and Hawkins Point Visitors Center.

Airport Manager Dylan Casselman has also been assisting with the planning of the events, he said.

"Dylan and I went and walked out at the airport. We're going to utilize the hangar so it would be nice overhead depending on the weather. It's a large viewing area for everyone," he said.

Hendricks said local representatives are in the process of finalizing plans and creating the schedule of events as well.

Eclipse glasses are available at the Massena Public Library, Nican-dri Nature Center and through the chamber of commerce, Hendricks said.

As part of the preparations, Hendricks said instructions will be given and airport personnel will be available to direct traffic to the viewing area.

Just how many people will come to the region is unknown, but early estimates suggested up to 100,000 individuals.

Officials with the chamber and town say those numbers may be an exaggeration but noted that hotels are booking up along with short-term rentals.

"We're hoping for a pleasant surprise," Hendricks said.

Aside from the airport, events will also be held before the eclipse as well.

At the Nican-dri Nature Center, family friendly events called "What to Expect When You are Expecting an Eclipse" will be held at 2 p.m. on April 3 and 7.

The event will educate about solar eclipses and will include activities for children and adults alike.

Solar crafts will also be held April

1-7, which runs through spring break for students, officials say.

At the library, an Eclipse Cookie Decorating craft for children under 18 will be held at noon on April 8, followed by a viewing in the parking lot when the eclipse occurs around 3:24 p.m.

Village signs off on bid solicitations, agreement

MASSENA -- Village of Massena officials approved multiple resolutions during the March 18 board meeting, including a handful of maintenance contracts.

Officials approved a resolution to request proposals for mowing properties in violation of village code and for trash and debris removal from such properties.

Trustees also approved solicitation of bids for a street sweeper and paver, along with air packs, masks, bottles and voice amplifiers from the fire department.

Fire Department Foreman Aaron Hardy commented that it was his hope that the equipment from the fire department may benefit a smaller department with fewer resources.

Along with solicitation of such bids, trustees also formally authorized the sale of water to Air Products and Chemicals, Inc.

The village had previously agreed to sell \$300,000 worth of water to the green hydrogen facility that will be built on Pontoon Bridge Road. The facility will be operational by 2026, Air Products officials have said.

The village of Massena has also renewed an agreement with Trane for inspection and maintenance of DPW facilities, along with an inter-municipal agreement with the town of Stockholm.

Officials also authorized a DANC POP lease agreement extension.

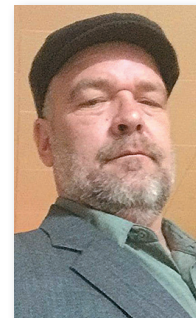

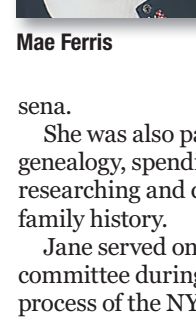

SLC Arts moves back home

POTSDAM -- With a soft opening Tuesday, April 2, SLC Arts has thrown open the doors of its newly remodeled Creative Spirit Art Center to the public this week.

The organization has operated from a store front on Market Street for more than a year while major rehab and remodel work was underway at the Raymond Street center.

The months-long project has seen the staff at the arts council operating from a smaller space and the move back has been much anticipated.

"We are incredibly excited to move back into our space! It has been over a year now in our temporary location, and we are looking forward to settling back into our home," Katharine Dinneen, SLC Arts artistic executive director, told North Country This Week recently. "There is no doubt that our community of artists and supporters are looking forward to seeing us back in the Creative Spirit Community Arts Center! Staff and volunteers have been working diligently over the past week to move and get the space ready for our soft-reopening on Tuesday, April 2nd."

The freshly overhauled space will be open to the public from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Tuesdays to Fridays, from 10 to 5 p.m. on Saturdays, and closed on Mondays and Sundays.

The work completed thus far is only Phase 1 of an extensive overhaul of the former Tile Company into a vibrant Gallery space, said Erica Kelso, SLC Arts managing director, in a message to SLC Arts members.

The finished portion of the space includes a store area and offices.

"While the completion currently encompasses only a portion of the envisioned space, it represents a substantial leap forward in the project's progression," Kelso said.

The elbow room afforded by the move back will allow the organization to move forward with additional programming.

"We have been incredibly fortunate to partner with other organizations across the county to continue programming while in our

temporary space, but we are looking forward to bringing many of these core programs back to the Creative Spirit! Currently, we are offering visual arts, literary, and music programs on a weekly basis. While we couldn't be happier to move back into the building, our time outside of the center has demonstrated a dire need for arts programming outside of Potsdam, and we are also actively working to develop programming for other communities across our region," said Dineen.

The work thus far has included asbestos abatement, HVAC system modernization, electrical enhancements, plumbing installations, and an elevator for downstairs access.

"Despite the completion of only a portion of the space, we remain committed to our mission of fostering artistic expression and community engagement. Various classes and community groups will continue to be hosted within the center. Moreover, plans are already underway to inaugurate gallery exhibitions in September, starting with the highly anticipated return of the Creative Partnership show," Kelso said.

Currently only about a 1/3 of the building is usable until additional construction is complete, Dineen said. The next phase will involve the reconstruction of the floor structure on the former Thrift store side, laying the groundwork for further enhancements.

"At this point, we will not have an anticipated completion date for the remaining portion of the project until SLC Arts has secured additional funding. We are actively working to bring in grant funding, but we are still seeking donations from the community to continue this project," said Dineen.

Phase 1 was funded by SLC Arts' state Downtown Revitalization Initiative grant secured by the village in 2018. Additional support has come from the Stewart's Foundation's \$25,000 donation, a \$10,000 grant from the Cloudsplitter Foundation, and \$5,000 donations from Community Bank and Price Chopper, \$3,500 from St. Lawrence Federal Credit Union and \$1,000 from SeaComm.

Learn more about library referendum

I write to encourage Massena taxpayers to contact Town of Massena Board members regarding the upcoming Massena Library referendum. In conjunction with the Massena Central School Budget vote on May 21, 2024, a second vote will decide how the library will be funded. Now is the time for voters to ask Town Council members how they will handle the current Library funding in future annual Town budgets, in the event that the library referendum passes.

These are the possibilities:

Option 1

The Board continues to include \$504,133, the 2024 Library budget allocation, in its 2025 budget and simply reallocates this money to other budget line items, or

Option 2

The Board reduces the 2025 budget by \$504,133, the 2024 Library budget allocation, with the intent to collect less taxes and pass this savings on to the Town of Massena taxpayers by reducing their bills.

There is a caveat to this option, however. The Board may have this intention now but are not legally obligated to honor their commitment to not include these funds in future budgets. In that instance the only recourse to voters is to not re-elect Board members who vote to use this money in the 2025 budget.

Taxpayers need to know how the Town will handle the over half-million dollars currently allocated to the Library if the referendum passes and the Library becomes independent. A commitment by the Town Board on the future use of the Library's current funding is critical for complete transparency prior to the vote. Thus, taxpayers can determine how their vote will impact their town taxes.

Please urge the Board to make this decision soon and communicate their decision to the public.

Massena Library Board speaks out

The Massena Public Library is seeking to transform from a municipal library to a library district. Residents directly elect trustees and vote on the budget in a district.

Elected trustees answer to residents and provide the level of service desired. Many libraries have become districts including Brasher, Potsdam and Norwood.

They continue to provide quality library service to their communities.

The library offers programs for all ages, literacy skills for children, resources for job seekers and homeschoolers, access to computers and

internet, and 66 library collections of books, movies and eBooks.

In good times and bad, for those able to afford these things for themselves or not, the library provides this variety of services to improve people's lives.

The proposition before the residents of the school district will shift library funding from town to district residents. This funding would be reliable. The library has suffered funding decreases for many years, receiving the same allocation from Massena now as in 2001. Funding has decreased \$200,000 in the last 12 years. Because of losses and inflation, the library cannot provide as many books, movies, services and hours. If this referendum does not pass, further cuts to hours will be necessary.

The library is appealing to our community for \$679,990, including materials, facilities, and staff. This replaces the current operating budget and in-kind services received from Massena. Town taxpayers will be relieved of that burden, as well as expenses that support the library, including custodial services, bookkeeping and insurance. Library assets, including the building, book collection and equipment, will be transferred to the library district.

Regardless of the library form, trustees' responsibilities include creating the mission and service program, securing funding, adopting

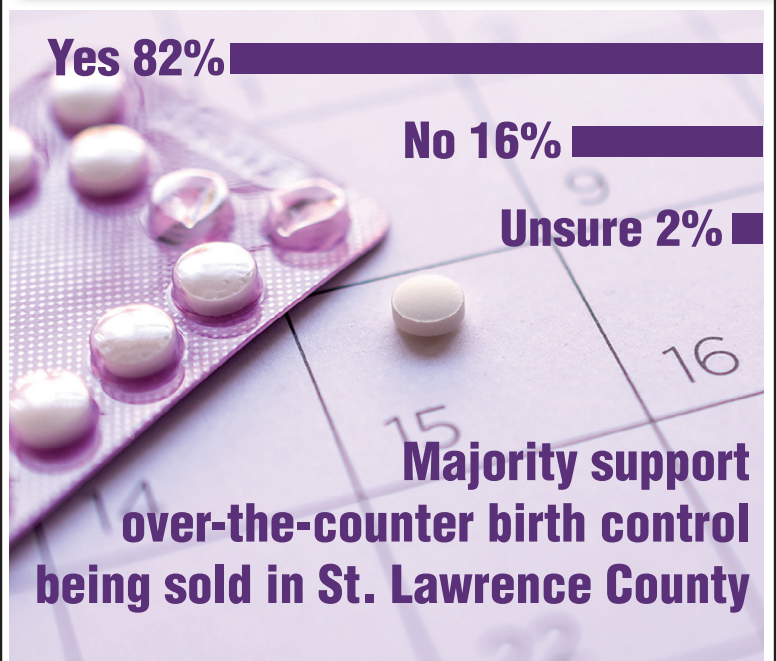
policies, exercising fiduciary responsibility and hiring a director. Fortunately, the library has had excellent directors, including currently Krista Briggs. Directors and trustees manage the library's financial and physical resources. Past directors brought in hundreds of thousands of dollars of state aid to improve the library building's lighting system, heating controls, roof and entryways.

The library has received generous funding from Massena. However, trustees are charged with obtain-

DEC reports one hunting stand incident in SLC

DEC reports 8 tree stand accidents during 2023 hunting season, one in SLC

There were eight tree stand accidents in New York during the 2023 hunting season, including one in St. Lawrence County, according to the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC).

In 2017, DEC Commissioner Basil Seggos directed t Environmental Conservation Police Officers (ECOs) to begin tracking and investigating tree stand injuries for the first time.

Tree stand injuries were under-reported, and DEC was and is not always notified when tree stand falls occur.

Last year, eight tree stand incidents were reported and investigated; none were fatal. Seven of the

hunters involved in these incidents suffered extensive injuries after falling while not using a fall-arrest harness system.

In St. Lawrence County, DEC officials say a 21-year old man was hunting in a hang-on stand Oct. 28 while not wearing a harness. The hunter reportedly fainted while in the stand and fell 20 feet. The person fractured several vertebrae and sustained extensive injuries to their spinal cord.

The hunter had six years experience hunting, DEC said.

Tree stand incidents are a major cause of hunting-related injuries, so tree stand safety has become a regular part of the hunter education course required for all first-time hunters in New York.

Massena fishing tournaments prove to be big hit at sport shows

MASSENA -- Fishing tournaments continue to attract anglers and fans alike to the North Country but according to Massena Sport-Fishing Promotion Director Don Meissner, it's the goodie bags that brings the North Country to sports shows.

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Massena Hospital receives 'Critical Access' status

MASSENA – St. Lawrence Health announced that Massena Hospital (MH) officially received Critical Access Hospital (CAH) status with Swing Bed approval. The letter, notified by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services, dated March 21, stated the CAH transition went into effect on

Thursday, Dec. 7, 2023. "This is a federal designation providing rural hospitals cost-based reimbursement for Medicare services. The status is anticipated to provide MH considerable improvements toward our financial solvency and has long been in the works.

With this change to a CAH, there will be no changes to the services we currently provide or to the number of patient beds we have. This has been a seamless transition for our community and patients," noted MH Associate Chief Operating Officer Brent Bishop. St. Lawrence Health President Donna McGregor said this transition marks an important step in the future sustainability for Massena Hospital. "The CAH designation ensures the essential services provided by MH will be maintained, and promotes the Hospital's financial sustainability and its viability of moving forward," she said. "St. Lawrence Health's Gouverneur Hospital received CAH

status in June 2013, and they have received national recognition as a top Critical Access Hospital. The MH team will look to their Gouverneur colleagues to help identify and adopt best practices with successful outcomes," McGregor said. In receiving Swing Bed approval from Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services, patients who no longer need 24-hour nursing attention, but need help getting back to optimum function, can now receive this hospitalized care in Massena, as well as at Gouverneur Hospital. A coordinated team of providers, nurses, technologists, and nurse aides develop an individualized plan for each patient in the Swing Bed program. A social worker/case manager further assists patients and their

families with discharge planning dependent on the patient's needs. "Our neighborhood is now actively utilizing our Cardiac Rehabilitation center, has access to Swing Bed care, and will be seeking assistance through our Wound Care Center that is opening in April," he stated. "As Massena Hospital continues to move forward with its growth initiatives and seeks future opportunities, we will keep the community updated," Mr. Bishop said. \$10,000 grant for Salvation Army to expand kitchen

MASSENA — A \$10,000 Northern New York Community Foundation grant will help the Salvation Army of Massena complete a new commercial kitchen at its Victory Road facility to alleviate food insecurity in the greater Massena area.

The Community Foundation's Board of Directors approved the grant award during its March 26 meeting.

"Over the past year, we have seen more households new to us coming to access our services, including our meal programs and case management," Salvation Army of Massena Officer in Charge Lt. Nicholas White said. "With no community meal program or soup kitchen in Massena, we plan to expand our services and create a commercial grade kitchen to accommodate this need."

The Salvation Army has been a critical partner in the Massena community to assist and provide

support to families experiencing food insecurity.

The Massena Central School District relies on the local Salvation Army to provide resources and support for district families experiencing hard times.

"We know that many continue to face challenges as they relate to critical and basic needs. As a donor-supported community organization, we see this as a way to partner with an organization that is already doing important work to help address these issues," said Rande S. Richardson, Community Foundation executive director. "As more donors are approaching us wanting to maximize their impact locally, together, we are able to provide larger grants in St. Lawrence County for projects such as this."

The new kitchen will allow the organization to offer clients at least three hot meals each week, improve programming, and help establish a job training program

for people seeking employment in the local food service and hospitality industries. It is also projected to increase the number of families and individuals served each week by up to 150 and enhance after-school and summer youth programs.

The Salvation Army of Massena is working to thoughtfully address critical needs in two towns and surrounding communities. In the past year, the organization has served more than 3,500 individuals through its emergency food service program at its Victory Road facility and through its Mobile Mission Center that travels to six locations in the county.

The nonprofit Feeding America reports that 14.2 percent of St. Lawrence County residents — or 15,430 people — are food insecure. Child food insecurity in the county is 17.7 percent with 18,808 children considered food insecure. Some 17.9 percent of county residents live below the federal pov-

erty line and 44 percent are Asset Limited, Income Constrained Employed, making almost half of the county ineligible for many federal relief programs.

Nationally, 11.8 of U.S. adults and 16.1 percent of children are classified as food insecure, while 9.6 percent of adults in New York state and 14.6 percent of the state's children are food insecure.

Soup kitchen and food pantries are often the only source of free, healthy, and nutritious food in a community.

Consumers of the services of the Salvation Army have other needs met as well. While they visit for food assistance, they may also receive education and social interactions.

The Community Foundation also provides support annually to organizations that operate in partnership with the Food Bank of Central New York, Syracuse, including several in St. Lawrence County.

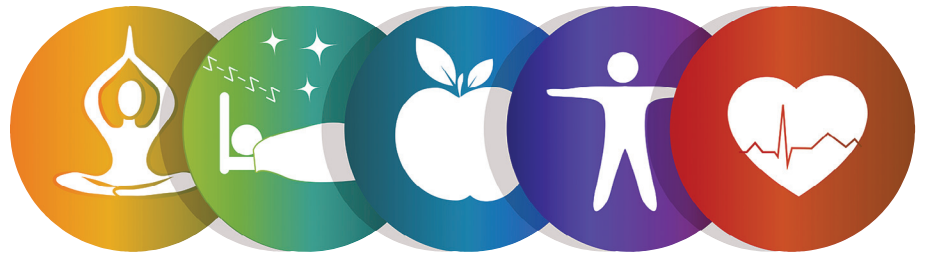
After she retired, and while in Florida in 2007, she found out that the Professional Photographers of America were having their convention in Tampa, so she went.

Parishville man settles into senior living

CANTON - A former snowbird who decided he no longer wanted to travel back and forth between Florida and the North Country said he's thankful for this move to United Helpers Independent Senior Living. In fact, both he and his children credit the move for possibly preserving the quality of life he's able to continue enjoying today.

John Snell, formerly of Parishville, was speaking on the phone with his daughter, Kathleen Reagan, when something didn't seem right. Mrs. Reagan noticed too.

It was that sense of loneliness that led Snell to the ISL.

"My daughters had mentioned it two or three times and then one day on my own I came to check it out and thought, that doesn't look so bad," he recalled.

Snell was living along Higley Flow during the spring and summer, while spending the colder months in Florida.

Since moving into the ISL, Snell said he has made several friends and also reconnected with some people he hadn't seen in a long time.

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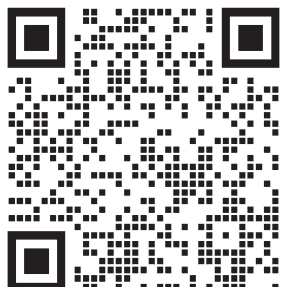
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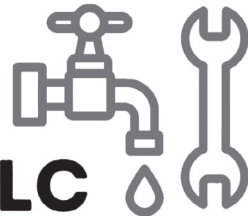

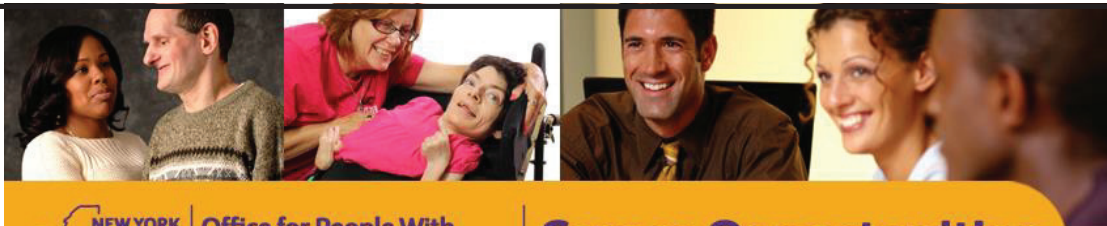
