CANTON – The EDF Renewables 240-megawatt Rich Road solar project with 20-megawatt battery energy storage system continues its path toward reality following the recent issuance of a draft permit by the Office for Renewable Siting (ORES).

With the permit comes public comment and a public hearing on May 7 at 6 p.m. in the Laurentian Room at the Best Western University Inn, Canton.

Unpaid bill could leave residents without gas

POTSDAM — A more than \$50,000 past due gas bill at Meadow East Apartments has led to a disconnect notice from Liberty Gas and residents wondering if they will lose the service if the bill isn't paid by the May 7 deadline.

For his part, owner Brian Wolofsky of Montreal, when asked for comment on the issue, told North Country This Week that he has plans to address what he called challenges to operating the apartment complex.

"As an owner of one of the only non-subsidized apartments in Potsdam I have made clear that I did not believe the focused water increases were a good idea for the community," Wolofsky said. "Almost all other apartments receive abatements or assistance which make it infinitely easier for them to be sustainable."

"The covid era issues of non-payment also continue to have a significant impact on housing, given the never-before-seen vacancy rates due to the students returning home and the challenges of non-payment of rents due to the imposed policies of New York state which encouraged tenants to not pay rents," he said.

"While we have both a short-term



and long-term plan to work through the challenges, not enough time has occurred to work through them, and we remain focused on getting past them and to continue to provide affordable housing in our community, without much support from the Village," said Wolofsky.

When asked if he intended to pay the bill by the deadline set by Liberty or for specifics on how he is addressing the issue, Wolofsky declined to specify further.

Liberty posted the following message to the tenants at the apartment complex recently:

"Liberty Utilities intends to shut off the gas to this building at 118 Leroy Street Potsdam NY 13676 on or after May 7, 2024 because the landlord has not paid the last due bill for gas service in the amount of \$51,104.62.

SUNY schools to get extra state funding

POTSDAM — The recently passed state budget contains about \$114 million in new operating funding for campuses, but its still too early to tell if the additional funding will help SUNY Potsdam sidestep expected cuts or other measures it takes to deal with its \$9 million deficit issue.

However, college officials are confident the deficit will be knocked back to a cool \$3 million by sometime next year under its fiscal restructuring plan it began implementing last year.

United University Professions, the union which represents SUNY employees and those who work at Potsdam, touted its roll in securing the additional state budget funding in a recent statement.

“From fighting for more than \$150 million more in state aid for campuses and expanded Tuition Assistance Program eligibility to effectively killing SUNY’s plan to close Downstate University Hospital, the efforts of UUP—the nation’s largest higher education union—can

only be viewed as a success,” the UUP said in an official statement.

“This is a very good budget for SUNY, our students, our patients and for our state,” said UUP President Fred Kowal. “We thank Gov. Kathy Hochul and state legislators for hearing our message and acting on it. Our leaders understand the necessity of supporting a world-class university system that provides an accessible, affordable education to all who seek it.”

The newly enacted state budget adds \$114 million for operating funds, \$60 million more than proposed by the governor, and another \$53 million to hire full-time faculty, the UUP said. However, whether or not this will equate to retainment of positions destined for cutting at SUNY Potsdam or additional positions is still too early to tell.

“We are pleased that the enacted 2024-25 New York State budget will build on last year’s historic investment in public higher education, with an additional increase in general operating aid and support across a range of needs,” SUNY Potsdam President Dr. Suzanne Smith said in

an official statement to North Country This Week.

“The budget expands access to the Tuition Assistance Program and doubles the minimum award, making a SUNY education even more affordable for more students and families. It also provides continued support for the Educational Opportunity Program and additional investments for critical maintenance and capital projects,” Smith said.

“While specific details regarding the allocation of such funds are still forthcoming, SUNY Potsdam will advocate vigorously to secure support for our strategic priorities—focusing on initiatives that help to bolster student success, enhance applied learning opportunities, foster community engagement and promote cultural inclusion,” said the president.

There could be some good news on the horizon for the college’s deficit woes.

According to a business affairs report from SUNY Potsdam’s chief financial officer Brent Parker at the April 19th college council meeting, the school could see a large reduction of the deficit over the next year.

“Six months into the Framework for Fiscal Health, we are estimating that by the end of June 2025, as a result of increased support from SUNY and actions taken by President Smith and President’s Council in accordance with the Framework, the College is on track to reduce the \$9 million structural deficit to just over \$3 million,” Parker’s report said.

“These numbers are estimates based on Potsdam’s actions to-date, and actual numbers will vary based on specific dates of planned personnel actions and on unforeseen events and changes that happen. This estimate also has the potential to be impacted either positively or negatively by enrollment next year,” said the report.

“SUNY Potsdam’s \$9 million structural deficit did not happen overnight, and it won’t be solved overnight, but under Dr. Smith’s leadership and with the support of SUNY, the university has taken steps which we expect will address nearly \$6 million of that structural deficit by June 2025,” Parker said in a statement directly to North Country This Week. “I look forward to continuing to work toward a stable operating budget that will allow SUNY Potsdam to continue to be a pillar of the North Country community for the next 200+ years.”

Village board okays budget

POTSDAM — The Potsdam village board of trustees has approved the municipal budget for 2024-2025.

General fund tax rates for village property owners will be slightly increased from the current year’s rate of \$17,16355 to \$17,48229 per \$1,000 of assessed property value, a hike of 1.86 percent.

Overall general fund tax levy for 2024-2025 year will go up 1.9 percent from \$3,822,783 to \$3,896,392. Total appropriations will increase to \$7,763,767 in the coming year from \$7,518,322.

This was the first year village officials and department heads used the municipality’s new ClearGov software package. Board members and the treasurer spoke highly of the software and how it allows for better tracking of municipal finances during the budget crafting process and

during the year.

“It was our first year working in ClearGov. As we continue forward it’s going to have increased transparency because we will be able to use some analytics and compare back and forth. Staff and the board alike are going to be more comfortable using that, to, you know, document any adjustments or requests in the system. So I think its going to be fantastic,” said Village Mayor Alex Jacobs Wilke at the board’s meeting April 29 when the budget was adopted.

“Given that we had to deal with obligation that the village was on the hook for in terms of contract obligations, inflation, other expenses, we wanted to be conservative and budget for all of those, while still being responsible and I think this budget really did a good job of balancing that as best we can,” Wilke said.

Officials sign off on contract for co-management of local waterfront plan

CANTON — The Canton town and village boards have both signed off on a Memorandum of Understanding between the two municipalities for how the two governments will administer an \$81,986 grant to update Canton's Local Waterfront Revitalization Plan.

The town applied for the grant with the state Department of State under the Local Waterfront Revitalization Program on behalf of both the town and village.

The state approved the grant for

over \$81,000 for the municipalities to complete an update to the Canton Grasse River Waterfront Revitalization Plan (LWRP).

Both boards, town and village, held a joint meeting on April 24 and each board approved the MOU on how the grant and update would be handled.

On the village board of trustees, at the joint meeting, Village Trustee Anna Sorensen made a motion to approve the MOU, which was seconded by Trustee Barb Beekman. The resolution was then passed unanimously by the board.

On the town council, Council-

man James Smith made the motion to approve the MOU, which was seconded by Councilman Randy Brown seconded the motion. The town board then unanimously approved the MOU resolution.

Under the MOU, the Village of Canton will provide administration, and oversee completion of the project. The MOU states that the project will include hiring a contractor to do the work as is indicated in the state grant agreement.

The village will be responsible for keeping and submitting records of project cost and local match undertaken during project completion to

the Town of Canton consistent with grant requirements, the MOU said.

Invoices of all of the completed work are to be presented to the Town of Canton.

Handling all of the fiscal records related to the project will be the Town of Canton's responsibility.

The town is to use invoices and documentation received from the village to request reimbursement from the state Department of State. This will be achieved under an

existing Memorandum of Understanding with the Village of Canton for services provided through the Community Economic Development Office, the MOU said.

The joint Town/Village Economic Development Committee will provide oversight of procurement and administration of contracts.

After project work is completed the town is to disburse grant funds to the village to cover the cost.

Section X reviewing violent lacrosse incident

Section X is reviewing a violent incident in which a lacrosse player was injured when another player struck him in the head with a stick, causing a concussion.

The Franklin Academy lacrosse player who suffered a concussion after an Ogdensburg player struck him in the head with his stick plans to keep playing.

A video from NFHS Network on April 20 shows a routine scuffle for the ball, followed by an Ogdensburg Free Academy player swinging his stick directly at the head and neck of 10th grade student Landyn Pierson. Pierson immediately fell to the ground in pain and the OFA player threw his stick to the ground in apparent frustration. Watch the video at bit.ly/44okdFJ

Landyn was taken to Canton-Potsdam Hospital and diagnosed with a concussion, according to his mother Bethany Berkman-Pierson.

Berkman-Pierson and her family have sought legal counsel and filed charges with the Malone Police Department on April 22.

She said they took statements, photos and medical records. Ultimately the matter will be turned over to juvenile courts due to the age of the OFA player.

The game, which was being played at Crouner Field in Malone, was a normal contest up until the violent incident.

"OFA was winning ... he (OFA player) retaliated for losing the ball," Berkman-Pierson said.

She thinks a ban from all Section 10 sports is the right punishment.

"An apology goes a long way," the mother said.

But so far she said she has not heard anything from the player or his

family.

However, she heard from OFA Superintendent Kevin Kendall, who she said apologized and said he was taking the situation very seriously.

School, Section X responding

For now, OFA is remaining quiet about the actions of their player.

"The district is following its protocols and procedures as required by our Code of Conduct, said Kendall. "I cannot comment any further on this matter."

Section 10 held a meeting to discuss the matter on Friday, but Berkman-Pierson had not yet heard the results of the meeting.

Section X Athletic Director Mark Wilson emailed North Country This Week a statement on the incident.

"Section X recognizes the seriousness of this incident and has a process for dealing with such matters, which may include a Section X Sportsmanship Committee review," he said. "The school district has its own, separate process, which it is following. The Section cannot comment further at this time."

Road to recovery

Landyn is still hopeful to play again once medically cleared.

He has been in contact with the district superintendent and athletic director, who have been checking on his well-being.

A CT scan did not show any neck damage, but future tests are possible to ensure no long-term damage.

In order to play again Landyn will need to pass medical protocols.

Franklin Academy and OFA are not scheduled to meet again during the regular season.

Should they be matched up somehow in the playoffs, Berkman-Pier-

son is not sure if she would allow her son to play against OFA. Especially if the player who struck her son is still allowed to play.

Landyn, playing in his third year, is not letting the incident impact his desire to continue lacrosse.

"Lacrosse is more than a game, it's about friendship and families," he said.

"He doesn't want other kids to be scared of playing because of what happened," his mother said.

Man charged with rape, incest in Potsdam

POTSDAM -- Potsdam police have charged a Potsdam man with first-degree rape and third-degree incest.

Police say Charles J. Davies, 35,

was charged on April 24 stemming from an investigation that occurred after a sexual assault was reported in the village of Potsdam.

Davies was remanded to St. Lawrence County Correctional Facility in lieu of \$1,000 cash bail or \$2,000 bond.

Due to the circumstances of the case, police say no further information related to the investigation will be released by the agency.

Woman charged with DWI with child in vehicle

NORFOLK — A Norfolk woman allegedly crashed her vehicle while impaired, resisted arrest and refused to be fingerprinted April 24, according to state police.

Pearl L. Alexander, 36, was charged with aggravated DWI: with a child less than 16 years, resisting arrest, and second-degree obstruction of governmental administration, officers said.

Troopers responded around 10:20 p.m. to State Route 420 to investigate a report of a vehicle off the roadway. Police located a red 2005 Chrysler van in the ditch and identified Alexander as the driver.

Police say she showed signs of impairment and failed field sobriety tests. When police took her into custody she initially resisted by pushing back from troopers, officers said.

The child in the vehicle, under age 16, was turned over to a family member who arrived on scene, police said.

Alexander allegedly refused police commands and refused to be fingerprinted, officers said.

She was arraigned in Norfolk court, where the judge ordered her to provide fingerprints, police said.

Alexander was cited and released, officers said.

No more meters: Downtown parking in Potsdam will be free

POTSDAM — The village is removing parking meters in the downtown business district centering around Market Street and has made parking free, with a two-hour limit, to encourage shopping and commerce there. Village Trustee Sharon Williams, who sits on the village's parking committee, made the announcement about free parking at the board of trustees's April 29 meeting.

The issue of village parking was one the municipality wanted to move quickly on this year in light of major construction overall during the upcoming streetscape project funded by state Downtown Revitalization Initiative money.

Last year, village officials had proposed doing away with meters and installing digital parking kiosks during the streetscape overhaul.

But not everyone was happy with the concept or the machines.

A vocal segment of the community including downtown business people and residents, along with Williams and Village Trustee Lynzie Schulte, who also serves on the village parking committee, were against the idea.

One of the main criticisms of the kiosks and of paid parking in general was that it would deter downtown traffic. The village traditionally had paid parking meters to keep Market Street shoppers moving along so cars were not parked in front of busy storefronts all day. However, the downtown

economy has waned in recent years and village officials are focused on attracting commerce to the Market Street block.

During several meetings over the last few months, those opposed to paid parking advocated for free two-hour parking plan instead of kiosks and meters as a way to inspire shoppers to frequent the area.

A few weeks ago, the board dropped the kiosks idea after hearing feedback from the public calling for a different solution.

Williams and the other members of the parking committee studied the issue in some depth with Village Police Chief Mike Ames.

"And we also felt that the parking meters were a deterrent to downtown shopping which obviously needs as much support, and as local government officials, we're doing away with both (kiosks and meters) and parking will be free," Williams announced

at the April 29 meeting. "There's just free two-hour parking downtown and all-day parking behind for people who want to stay longer."

She said for village residents there are parking permits available for those who are interested.

Trustee Schulte also spoke to the change.

"It is exciting. We've already had parking meterheads taken down and it looks really nice along Elm Street right now. They've actually dug out the posts and it looks really nice," Schulte said.

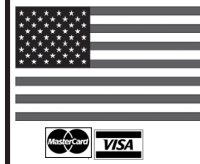
"And, things that were kind of eyesores will slowly but surely start looking better in downtown," the trustee said.

Schulte said one of the highlights of the change is that the village is shifting the parking lot areas around a bit to make parking more accessible. Part of that is increasing handicapped parking spots to around 30 from only about 10 previously, she said.

New four-way stop in Potsdam

POTSDAM — Drivers traveling along Waverly or Grove streets will notice a new four-way stop at the intersection of the two roads.

Village DPW workers installed the new signs earlier this week. The intersection at Grove and Leroy streets were also changed to a full four-way stop.

Following requests from village residents regarding the speed of traffic on Waverly and Grove streets, the village has changed the intersection of the two routes to a four-way stop.

Several letters to the editor of North Country This Week have complained of traffic speed on the roads over the years, and the village board has heard comments from the public on the issue at their meetings.

The village board approved the change at their meeting Dec. 4

The change required an amendment to village code, specifically Chapter 168, Vehicles and Traffic, Article X, Schedules, Section 168-66, Schedule VIII: Stop Intersections of the Village of Potsdam Municipal Code.

A public hearing on the code change was held last November.

Installation of new signs alerting drivers of the stop, however, was delayed by winter weather and by delivery from the manufacturer.

Hermon-DeKalb school board pushes for U.S. 11 lower speed limit

DEKALB -- The Hermon-DeKalb Central School board of education say they support reducing the speed limit on Route 11 near the school.

In a press release April 26, officials say members of the board voted unanimously to encourage law makers to reduce the speed limit along

that stretch of highway.

"The board passed a resolution, which it previously approved for the first time in February 2020, calling

for the speed limit to be reduced from 55 mph to 45 mph on Route 11 for the maximum distance the state will allow in each direction from the

school district's property," officials wrote.

Officials say the concern of the athletic field sand playground being on Route 11 are concerning, with students often walking or riding bikes on the state route to attend school or school functions.

"There is a steady flow of traffic in and out of the district's parking lots. Much of that traffic must utilize the intersection, which has been the site of numerous vehicle crashes over the years, including two fatal accidents within the last four years," officials wrote.

"As a district, we have been advocating for this change for two decades," said Superintendent Mark White. "While I understand we cannot arbitrarily adjust speed limits on state roads, this change is long overdue. We would like to see every opportunity to make the road safer for our students, staff and the community in general."

The resolution formally supports two pieces of legislation; NY State Senate Bill 2023-S8791 and NY State Assembly Bill 2023-A9514. Both measures, if passed by lawmakers in the state senate and assembly, would allow the town of DeKalb to reduce the speed limit on this portion of Route 11.

On April 10, the town of DeKalb passed its own resolution on the issue in conjunction with the Hermon-DeKalb Board of Education resolution.

"We appreciate the longstanding support we've received from our local lawmakers and officials on this issue," said White. "Our sincere hope is that this time, our collective efforts will be successful in fixing this dangerous situation."

Canton village board approves budget

CANTON -- The village board of trustees has approved the municipal budget for 2024-2025 which features a 2.34 percent increase in the tax rate for village residents.

The board held a special meeting Monday morning, April 29, to pass the budget which features a 2.96 increase in the overall tax

levy, exceeding the state's 2 percent municipal tax cap.

The general fund tax rate for property owners will increase to \$10.755 from \$10.506 per \$1,000 of assessed property value.

Total appropriations for the 2024-25 general fund are currently estimated to be \$7,450,097, up \$292,095 from the 2023-24 budget.

The 2024-2025 budget would use \$116,100 in appropriated fund bal-

ance to make ends meet.

Village officials have said that the budget covers several state mandated expenses, including the minimum wage increase.

The village's fiscal year begins June 1.

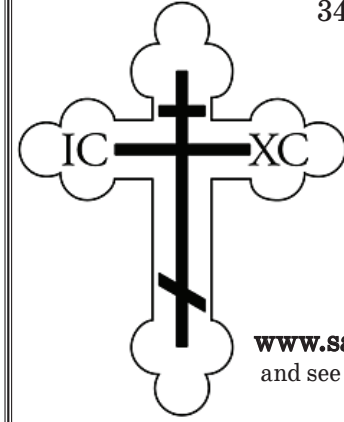

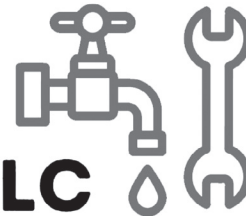

Green burial workshop offered at Unitarian Universalist church in Canton

CANTON – The Unitarian Universalist Church of Canton will host a Green Burial Workshop, Thursday, May 9, 7-8:30 p.m.

Barry Walsh, recently retired professor Funeral Service Administration at SUNY Canton, will present a consumer-centered presentation on green burials followed by a question-and-answer period.

For many people that opt for a green burial, it can come down to cost, environmental impact, and legacy.

Individuals planning their options are considering how to minimize negative environmental effects, conserve natural resources, limit carbon emissions, mitigate health risks, protect natural habitat, and preserve the environment.

Choices can be made at each step of the death care process to limit waste, reduce the carbon footprint, and nourish the local ecosystem, said a press release from the church.

“We are returning to the earth. We decompose back into fundamental elements that can nourish a nearby tree. We’re incarnating the interdependent cycle of life,” said the Rev. James Galasinski, minister of the Unitarian Universalist Church.

Walsh practiced in Conway New Hampshire prior to relocating to Canton.

He worked as a professor of funeral service administration at SUNY Canton for 32 years until his recent retirement.

He has lectured throughout New York to groups of funeral directors, hospice volunteers, funeral service students, and fellow educators.

“End of life rituals reflect the needs and values of contemporary society. Climate change and concerns about pollution have led to the

realization that we need to do better. Natural or “green” burial is an effective way to address these problems,” Walsh said.

Requests for green burials are increasing.

Last week, in the April 19 edition of North Country

Now, it was announced that Bayside Cemetery in Potsdam has been approved by the state to offer “natural burials” in certain sections of the cemetery.

Bayside has set aside two areas for natural burial, a riverside section, and a wooded

section.

Both sections are near roads to make winter burials possible, and each area has approximately 20 spots.

According to John Omohundro, member of Potsdam’s Bayside Cemetery Association and former

president and treasurer of the Bayside Cemetery Board, materials involved in Bayside burials will be compostable and will not contain metal, chemicals, or a vault.

Presently in Northern New York, natural burials are offered by Bayside Cemetery,

Keene Cemetery, and Spirit Sanctuary.

The green burial workshop will be held in the church’s Romer Room, 3 1/2 E. Main St., Canton.

William M. Buchan, the attorney hired by the town and village to handle solar issues, confirmed the issuance of a draft permit dated March 4, 2024.

"The draft permit is available to the public at ORES.ny.gov. Search Matter number 22-00031 on the ORES website to review the Draft permit. The issuance of the Draft Permit opens a 60-day comment period culminating in a public comment hearing before ORES Administrative Law Judges," noted Buchan.

Both the Town and Village of Canton will present written Statements of Local Law Compliance to ORES as part of a statutory mandated process. The statements are also due in early May.

Buchan told members of the Canton Town Board Wednesday night that he is working vigorously to meet the submission deadline.

Buchan said the written statement will include views on Canton's comprehensive plan, existing town code regarding solar projects, battery storage safety, and impacts on agriculture.

"We are working hard to have the best possible statement," he said.

The public is encouraged to attend the public comment hearing to provide input to ORES. The issuance of the Draft Permit is a major milestone in the New York State process for siting the Rich Road solar energy project signaling that the applicant has met its burden for meeting the comprehensive set of regulatory requirements issued by ORES that are a prerequisite for a permit to be issued. As a practical matter, the issuance of the Draft Permit makes it more likely than not that a major power plant, as detailed in the Draft Permit, will be sited in Canton.

The Draft Permit, at page 3 states: "The proposed Solar Facility will contribute meaningfully to New York State's Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act (CLCPA) targets by producing up to 240 MW of renewable solar energy directly to New York's energy market. According to the application, the Facility will produce enough zero-emissions energy to power approximately 61,400 households in New York State. The Facility will also create job opportunities, support economic growth, and protect public health, safety and the environment by significantly reducing greenhouse gas emissions."

On issuing the draft permit conditions, ORES staff takes the position that the proposed facility, together with the uniform and site-specific standards and conditions contained in the draft permit, would comply with applicable laws and regulations. ORES staff recommends that the Office elect not to apply, in whole or in part, any local law or ordinance that as applied to the facility is unreasonably burdensome in view of the Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act targets and the environmental benefits of the proposed facility.

EDF's mission

Jonathan Geldard, project developer Grid Scale Power - NY, said the hearing will have the ORES Hearing Examiners presiding over the session, they will do a brief introduction and then will have a stenographer available to record comments made by the public. The public will have approximately

three minutes to provide verbal comments. They can also submit written comments alternatively or to supplement their verbal statement. It is not a Q&A session and the developer will not make a formal presentation, but instead the Hearing is solely an opportunity for the public to put comments on the record for ORES to determine if any substantive issues remain for further review.

"A municipal statement of compliance is the Town's opportunity in the 94-c siting process to submit for the record their position on how the Facility complies with substantive provisions of applicable local laws and is part of the 94-c Process for every project. In this case, EDF has been engaged with the Town on the local laws, including the recent zoning changes, for well over three years," said Geldard. "In the 94-c process, substantive standards in local laws are applicable to the Facility as of the date the Application was deemed complete (1/3/2024) and will be applied unless an applicant requests relief for specific provisions and ORES also determines such provisions to be unreasonably burdensome in the context of the overall project and the State's goals established in the Climate Leadership and Protection Act. In this case, EDF has requested in our Application filed March 2023 that a few local law provisions be waived on a limited basis as was determined collaboratively with Town representatives during the development of the Project in 2022 leading up to our initial application filing."

In regard to new town code, Geldard said the timing places the EDF project in a "grandfathered" status.

"When ORES deems a project's 94-c Application as Complete, the record for new information closes to facilitate the progression towards final determinations in the Permit. The Town adopted their new zoning regulations on February 14, 2024. As the project Application was deemed complete prior to these changes, the permit review and determinations being conducted by ORES have been grandfathered to the zoning laws and regulations that were in effect during the study, design, and collaboration of the project up until that point," he noted.

Geldard also addresses the continued concerns around battery storage.

"As part of our supplemental application materials provided Sept. 7, 2023, EDFR included robust revisions to both the Site layout and the Safety Response plans including, but not limited to, adding a gravel pad on the BESS Access Road as an emergency response muster point, a 20,000-gallon water storage tank for use by emergency responders, and a Revised Safety Response Plan committing to develop procedures for containment and management of fire protection water used in the event of a BESS fire with use of cleanup kits that contain absorbent materials, booms, and other portable barriers appropriate to contain runoff of fire protection water. This information was also provided directly to the Town and the Fire Chief for their review," Geldard stated.

"Since performing those modifications, EDFR has been closely

following the New York State Inter-Agency Fire Safety Working Group's recommendation report and will align with the results implemented moving forward, in addition to working with the Town and Fire Departments on these efforts," he added.

A spokesperson with the company verified the shutoff notice with North Country This Week.

"While we do not typically discuss customer accounts, we can confirm that a termination notice was delivered on behalf of Liberty. We work very hard to avoid any disruption of service and encourage tenants with questions or concerns to contact the landlord or New York Public Service Commission," Pamela Bellings, Liberty's regional communications specialist, told North Country This Week.

A Meadow East resident who wishes to remain anonymous said those who live in the complex are worried.

"I am a concerned resident that wants to bring awareness and focus on what's going on at a local apartment complex. It was posted today at the Meadow East Apartments located at 118 Leroy Street Potsdam NY 13676, that the landlord named Bryan Wolofsky has not paid the gas bill in some time," the resident said. "The notice states that if the amount of \$51,104.62 has not been paid by May 7, 2024 that all gas will be turned off."

"There are currently 11 buildings, all with labels a-k. Each building has 6 apartments in each. That does not include the 10 townhouses as well. That is 76 units that will be without gas," the resident said. "Meaning they will not have hot water or heat in their homes."

"In New York the average gas bill is \$100 a month give or take. This is very concerning to me and I'm going to assume all the residents of this community. I apologize for not sharing my name but I would prefer to remain anonymous due to the severity of the situation. I'm hoping by sending this to you it will help bring awareness to what is going on. And hopefully help find a solution so a large amount of people don't lose gas or end up having to move in such a short period of time," the resident said.

Wolofsky has been an outspoken critic of local village government and how the village handles its water service utility and its cost. The Montreal businessman has written numerous letters to the editor calling out village officials, and has backed two candidates for village trustee and mayoral positions with extensive paid advertising with North Country This Week.

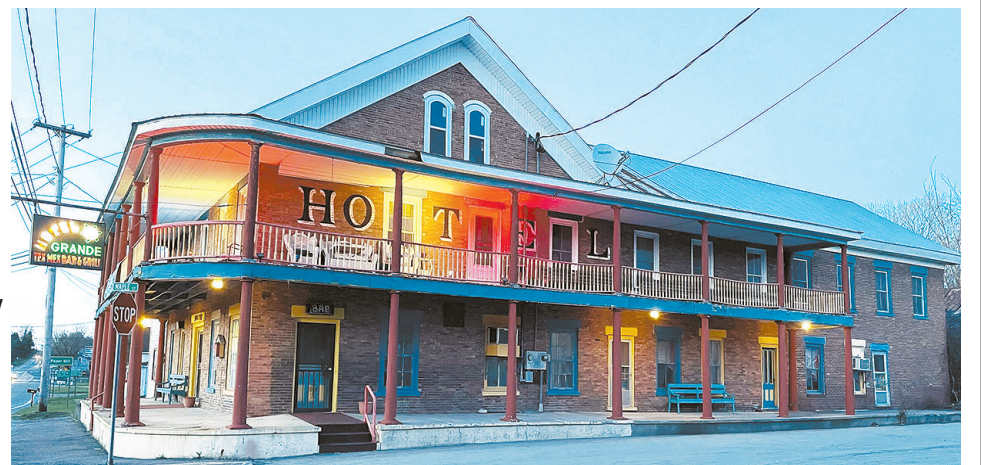

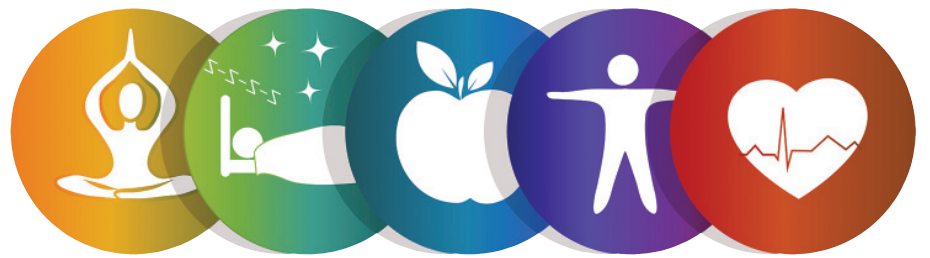

Take your foot care seriously says CPH podiatrist, endocrinologist

CANTON – As we head into sandals and flip-flop season we may be thinking more about our feet, but they are a part of our body we should keep healthy year-round.

April is Foot Awareness Month, and St. Lawrence Health (SLH) Podiatrist Jason Sabatini, DPM, pointed out everyone should have regular physical exams to take care of their bodies, and that includes proper attention to our feet.

“Everyone should take their foot care very seriously. Having problems related to the feet can be

debilitating and lead to the inability to walk, run, and even work on their feet,” he said.

Some of the most common foot debilitating conditions Dr. Sabatini sees are related to various foot deformities such as bunions, hammertoes, flat feet, fractures, and arthritis. These problems can all become painful and possibly debilitating over time. There are also problems relating to diabetes that can develop, including neuropathy (numbness in the feet/legs), wounds, infections, and Charcot

Arthropathy.

SLH Endocrinologist Paul Tejera, MD, explained that diabetic foot neuropathy is usually caused from high sugars, or uncontrolled diabetes over a long period of time. It is damage in the feet that can lead to multiple symptoms including:

- Numbness (similar to when your foot falls asleep)
- Loss of feeling or sensation (starting in the foot, but can radiate up the leg over time)
- Burning or pain which can be worse with rest or at night; tingling

(resting neuropathy)

• Increased sensitivity to a light touch being bothersome or painful (like the touch of a bed sheet over the foot)

• Less common symptoms can include an itching sensation, or the feeling of extra padding under the foot that isn't there (like a rolled up sock under the foot)

Both physicians said the new Wound Care Center at Massena

Hospital will be a great asset to some of their patients.

Heuvelton Central food pantry thriving thanks to community donations

HEUVELTON – In 2018, the Heuvelton Central School District became host to the first school-based food pantry in St. Lawrence County.

Currently, the HCS Food Pantry is serving an average of 64 customers each month during pantry shopping hours and through the school district Backpack Program.

Like many local food pantry organizations, the Food Pantry at HCS receives New York State grants from the Food Bank of Central New York each year through The Federal Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP.)

The USDA provides TEFAP with American-grown USDA Foods and administrative funds, enabling the program to supplement the diets of low income individuals at no cost.

In addition to NYS grants, the Heuvelton Central School Food Pantry is the beneficiary of many private and community donations throughout the year.

These donations include anonymous donations of money, student birthday fundraisers, and donations from community groups and local organizations.

In the past, local Girl Scouts have donated boxes of cookies to be provided through the food pantry.

They have also prepared and donated "Birthday Bags," containing everything needed to host a child's birthday party including cake mix and pan, frosting, cards, candles and balloons.

Most recently, the Food Pantry benefited from a generous \$600 donation from the local Stewarts Shops in Heuvelton as a part of the

While donations keep the pantry afloat, it wouldn't be able to operate without its volunteers.

Community members Rosemary Simmons, Ellen Place, and Darlene Roacher spend countless hours in the pantry restocking shelves and assisting customers.

Rosemary Simmons says that she loves doing service work for the community, and participates in the HCS Food Pantry to help improve food security for the local population. Ellen Place, who is also a

teacher in the school district, says, "I volunteer for the food pantry because I have been blessed and it feels good to be of service to others."

According to Ellen, the pantry has also benefited from the help of a student volunteer this year, Kaylee Simmons-Noel.

To increase their impact, two years ago the Heuvelton School Food Pantry partnered with the Bulldog Backpack Program, a school-based program run by the Heuvelton Teachers' Association to

pool resources and improve food security for district families and students.

The partnership leverages the purchasing power of the Food Bank of Central New York, while increasing the number of patrons served.

The Heuvelton Central School District Food Pantry is open to shoppers on the fourth Thursday of each month from 3:30-5 p.m. Community members in need may

The Food Pantry purchases all foods through the Food Bank of Central New York, greatly expanding the purchasing power of every dollar, and 100% of monetary donations go directly to food purchases.

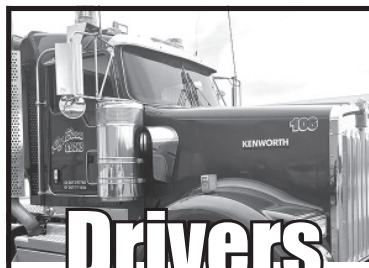

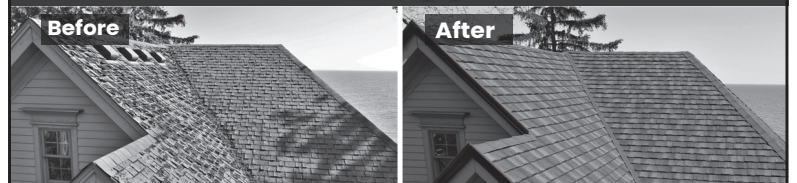
