Massena loses longtime public servant Nicola

MASSENA -- Long-time elected official Albert Nicola, who served a combined 43 years on the Massena town and village board, has passed away.

The news broke on May 28, just one day after Memorial Day.

Nicola, a veteran of the U.S. Army, attended the Pennsylvania Military College before being commissioned as a second lieutenant.

He later went on to become an Airborne Ranger before leaving the service as a captain.

Nicola then became a large part of the Massena Central School District, working as a history teacher and football coach in the district. He also worked as an assistant football coach for St. Lawrence University for a handful of years.

"The world is a little worse off today. I've known Albert forever, as did most of Massena and surrounding areas. As a teacher and a coach he touched everyone that went through MCS. My three

Murder hearing moved to July, DA says

The preliminary hearing for an Ogdensburg man charged with murder of a Rensselaer Falls man has been adjourned until July 22 in Canton Town Court.

St. Lawrence County District Attorney Gary Pasqua in an email said the matter was adjourned at the request of the defendant, John Free, 51.

The next scheduled appearance in the matter will take place July 22 in Canton Town Court.

Free is charged with the April 11 killing of John Barr, 58, a Rensselaer Falls man found dead more than one month later on May 16 in his home at 12 Heuvelton St., Rensselaer Falls, according to a press release from Pasqua's office.

Free is alleged to have struck Barr in the head with blunt objects, killing Barr, but further details on what the weapon was have not yet been released.

Pasqua said the Free and

Barr were friends and knew each other well, but details on the alleged motive have not been shared.

Free was a former employee of the Academy at Ivy Ridge, a defunct school that was the center of the Netflix Documentary 'The Program' which shined a light on abuse that took place at the academy between 2001 and 2009.

In the wake of the documentary's release St. Lawrence County Sheriff's and District Attorney's offices launched an investigation into allegations made by survivors of the school which is ongoing.

It's unknown if Free himself was part of that investigation.

Free appeared in at least two interviews that aired after he is believed to have killed Barr, but before he was arrested, in which he discussed his actions and time at Ivy Ridge. Free also discussed accusations made against him of sexual abuse which he has publicly denied.

In the interviews Free said

City eyes options for recreation future

OGDENSBURG -- A report highlighting the recreation department spurred conversation among city councilors regarding the need for a new recreation director.

The city's been without one since September 2023 when Mackenzie Cole resigned the position.

The city has had the job open and budgeted with a starting salary ranging from \$46,759 and \$51,093 plus fringe benefits, but there has been a lack of

civil service applicants.

Although the city is not actively advertising the position, a report from Interim City Manager Andrea Smith and Public Works Director Shane Brown showed the scope of work involved in the city's recreation programs and facilities.

It was clear from the discussion that the city wants to see someone in the position, but there was debate about the specifics of the job and what the duties should entail.

At this time the city is looking to fill a union position rather than a management posi-

tion. While the person would help oversee facilities and operations, they would technically be part of the department of public works.

Under that scenario the recreation director would be able to help direct day to day tasks but also assist when needed with maintenance and mowing. In that scenario, the city would also look to add a city maintenance worker. The director's salary is estimated at \$51,093 plus \$30,000 in benefits. The maintenance worker

Firm hired for capital project planning

MASSENA -- The Massena Central School District board of education has announced that King + King Architects of Syracuse has been selected as the next architectural and engineering firm the district partners with for the next capital project.

The announcement came at a recent board of education meeting when board member Daniel Susa told board members the district Facilities Committee.

King + King is said to have beaten out seven other firms that applied to work with the district on the next capital project, school officials said.

Later during the monthly board meeting, members approved the hiring.

The hiring commences immediately upon board approval, Superintendent Ron Burke said.

With the firm now hired, Burke said representatives from King + King will visit the district to discuss a building condition survey and do

some visits of the district buildings to get a better sense of the property before setting the groundwork for future projects.

Burke told board members that the top priority for determining projects will include "health and safety and then working down."

Among the parties involved in the meetings, Burke said the facilities committee, along with fiscal advisers will be involved to determine what projects should be prioritized and what the budgets for such projects would be.

The hiring of King + King brings an end to the hiring process for architectural and engineering services for the next capital project.

School officials had put out a

request for proposal for services on March 1 and closed the window for submissions on March 29.

The action came after the district completed a \$49.6 million capital project that was overseen by Arcadis IBI Group, who has worked with the district on multiple projects.

IBI Group also assisted the district on an emergency capital outlay project to repair an underground heating line that ran from the Central Administration Building to the high school.

That project was completed in December 2023, shortly after the larger capital project was finalized.

This marks the first time since 2018 that the district has sought proposals for projects in the district.

Village administrator working on 14 active grants

MASSENA -- Village Administrator Monique Chatland is currently working on 14 active grants covering a number of topics, ranging from the Massena Schine Theater restoration to municipal water projects.

Chatland updated board members on the progress on a number of grants during the village board's May 21 meeting.

"The Restore NY grant for the restoration of the Schine Theater was submitted Tuesday, May 14. It's a rolling deadline but we should hear a response by June 30," she said.

The total cost of the project is expected to be \$3.2 million, with the Restore NY grant covering \$2 million, if successful.

"They are also seeking additional funds from other various sources, so hopefully with this Restore grant, it should take care of the restoration of the whole theater," Chatland said.

Chatland also noted that the village has opened up the third and final round of applications for the Core of the Community grant fund, which comes from the village's \$10 million Downtown Revitalization Initiative award from Dec. 2021.

Chatland said contribution guidelines have been updated for the final round, with business owners being responsible for a 25% match.

Maximum grant awards will be \$100,000.

Chatland said the first two rounds committed approximately \$287,000 for four projects

Previous funding was awarded for the restoration of the marquee and various enhancements at the Schine Theater, new signage and a kitchen expansion at the Gristmill Brewery as well as equipment purchases for a new coffee shop, opening soon.

Officials previously said the fund is a testament "to the Village's continuous commitment to economic development and architectural heritage."

Grant funds can be used for large interior or exterior rehabilitation projects, small projects such as

business signage and awnings, or business equipment.

Applications will be accepted through July 15.

Chatland also touched on the Massena School of Business project that village officials are working on with the St. Lawrence County Industrial Development Agency.

"We're meeting with the IDA consultants next Friday to go over the School of Business.

Chatland previously detailed the project, saying the facade of the building will be saved and preserved, creating a walkway into a courtyard and transition space to a planned riverwalk.

"The construction submissions received a Federal Thriving Communities program grant," she said.

The funds will be used by the New York State Department of Transportation to assess the village and town, along with other neighboring communities, to assist with planning and technical assistance related to transportation infrastructure, she said.

"That is for elements like the Complete Streets program, you know, for bike lanes and that sort of thing," she said.

Bids for the asbestos abatement for the New York Main Street grant for the former JJ Newberry building are also coming to a close, she said.

Chatland said the environmental testing at the site is all done, with asbestos abatement next on the list.

Contracts for the downtown streetscape project and riverwalk were also submitted on April 19.

"We're waiting for the fully executed copy to come back from New York State," she said.

One other grant also underwent budget modifications, delaying implementation briefly, she said.

Overall, Chatland said grant writing and administration is a central focus of her office.

"I'm very busy with grants. Although not all of it is able to be seen, there's a lot of background work that goes into it. With the environmental testing, abatement and various, stringent criteria and requirements that need to be met through various agencies that we receive funding through, it's a lot," she said.

Code enforcement busy in Massena with many violations and inspections to handle

MASSENA -- Code enforcement officials remain busy throughout Massena, a statement echoed by town of Massena Code Enforcement Officer Patrick O'Brien.

O'Brien recently provided an update to town board members, detailing a number of inspections that still need to be completed.

One issue in particular is a marijuana shop in the town limits, something he said that has been "problematic" for him.

"We're working on that right now," he said.

O'Brien said no notice of violations or orders to comply have been issued yet but suggested they may

be coming in the near future.

As for commercial properties, around a dozen occupied buildings need their yearly inspection to maintain their certificate of compliance, he said.

"We've identified about a dozen commercial occupancies that have never been inspected through the fire inspection process," he said.

O'Brien said each of the property owners and renters have been "pretty decent about it" so far.

Other work ongoing includes seven buildings that were issued a notice of violations and orders to remedy, he said.

"We've got three structures that are unsafe. Two are abandoned, and one is the Carey Road residence that we've all talked about several

times," he said.

Some calls to remedy violations have proven to be more unique than others, with one motel that is continually trying to run an electrical extension cord across the road to power a neighboring property.

"We put a stop to that and also addressed the multiple abandoned cars on the property," he said.

Un-permitted activity at the Pet-awatt facility on County Road 42 has also drawn the attention of the code enforcer.

"We've issued them a notice of violation order to remedy, telling them they need to appear before the planning board in June about some un-permitted activity at the site. Other than that, there's just one or two small things that look as though they're going to resolve themselves," he said.

A public portal for permit applications is also in the works, he said.

O'Brien told board members it is nearly ready to go live, with residential and commercial permits being the first available. Everything must be filled out online and will automatically be submitted to the code office for review.

O'Brien said the new system will save both time and money.

As for office work, O'Brien said work continues to clean up computer files transferred from the Village Code Enforcement Office.

O'Brien said in assessing the files, many complaints appear to be left open but are in fact already settled.

Oburg man jailed on drug charges

LISBON — An Ogdensburg man faces drug charges following a one-vehicle motor vehicle accident on State Highway 37 on May 28, according to state police.

Troopers said they charged Andrew J. Jacobs, 30, with second-degree criminal possession of a controlled substance, felony, third-degree criminal possession of a controlled substance, felony.

He was also charged with three misdemeanor counts of seventh-degree criminal possession of a controlled substance 7th(A-Misdemeanor), two counts of unlawful possession of cannabis and sec-

ond-degree criminal use of drug paraphernalia, police said.

Jacobs was allegedly found in possession of a quantity of methamphetamine. Additionally, located in the vehicle were numerous concentrated cannabis vape products, numerous cannabis edible products, hallucinogenic mushroom chocolate bars, a quantity of LSD, a quantity of Psilocybin mushrooms, a quantity of cannabis, and a digital scale, officers said.

Jacobs was arraigned in the town of Lisbon Court and remanded without bail to St. Lawrence County Correctional Facility.

Sherman Inn offering level 2 EV charging stations

OGDENSBURG — The historic Sherman Inn now offers “level 2 charging stations” which will help bring more electric vehicle owners and their families to Ogdensburg’s restaurants, stores and attractions.

“Over the past few years we’ve seen more electric vehicle owners come to Ogdensburg who have remarked that our community does not offer an easy way for them to charge up their vehicles to continue their journeys or return home,” said Sherman Inn owner James E. Reagen. “As a small family-owned lodging business on the border with Canada, my wife, Donna, and I are seeing a growing number of visitors from Toronto, Ottawa, Quebec, New England, Pennsylvania and New York State coming to our beautiful area.”

“Offering four different Level 2 Charging Stations at our historic Sherman Inn will allow guests and visitors to Ogdensburg a place where they can plug in their vehicles and recharge their batteries at a rate of 25 to 30 miles of range an hour,” he said. “With electric vehi-

cles a growing segment in the U.S. and Canadian car market, Donna and I decided it was important for us to offer this important, cutting-edge service to attract more visitors to Ogdensburg and our Inn.”

“Our guests can now plug in their vehicles when they arrive and have a fully charged vehicle when they leave the next morning,” Reagen said.

“Over the past three years, we’ve seen a growing number of guests who have chosen to travel out of their way on journeys to or from Canada and New England just to stay with us because they like the idea of staying at a converted historic school building tied to our region’s unique cultural heritage.”

“One of the key advantages of offering the electric charging stations will be that our Sherman Inn will now show up on computerized maps of North American charging destinations which are used by electric vehicle owners to plan their travel routes,” Reagen said.

Troopers issue 20 tickets

HAMMOND — State police monitored traffic on State Highway 37 in Hammond while road crews were conducting shoulder work. During the detail, troopers blend in with the workers and watched for unsafe behavior.

20 tickets were issued: One driving while ability impaired, three speeding tickets, one cell phone violation, five seat belt tickets, one moving violation and nine non-moving violations.

Troopers responded May 22 at 8:48 a.m. to a one-car motor vehicle accident on State Highway 37, in Hammond, approximately 6 miles from the work zone, the detail was setting up. An investigation determined the operator, who was identified as Cody J. Gladle, age 28, of Gouverneur, had fled the scene of the accident. A trooper assigned to the detail located Gladle, walking alongside State Route 37.

While interviewing Gladle

regarding the accident, he was showing signs of impairment. Troopers administered SFST which he failed.

He was charged with driving while intoxicated impaired by drugs and transported to SP Ogdensburg for processing. During a safety search of Gladle and his belongings, he was found to be in possession of drug paraphernalia, police said.

Gladle was released on an appearance ticket for seventh-degree criminal possession of a controlled substance and issued a vehicle and traffic ticket for operating a motor vehicle impaired by drugs.

Motorists are reminded to drive responsibly in work zones. Make sure to follow the postage signage and put down any distractions.

Slow down, and move over to another lane when it is safe to do so. Everyone working on the side of the roadways deserves to get back home safely.

County to review town crypto regulations

MASSENA -- The town of Massena is nearing adoption of regulations related to crypto operations in the town but Town Attorney Eric Gustafson wants the county to review the proposal.

At a recent town board meeting, Gustafson told town board members it was not a prerequisite to adopting the regulations, however "out of an abundance of caution" he wanted the County Planning Board to review the proposed regulations before the town adopts them.

"This would be the first time anyone has adopted regulations for such operations, so we want to be extra certain that everything is ready before we move forward," he said.

Once adopted, the regulations would bring to an end an extensive process that has now spanned several years to get to this point.

One operation in particular, North Country Colocation Services, has sought very minor language changes that would allow them and similar operations in industrial zones to expand without the burden of excessive regulations.

North Country Colocation Services is a privately owned data mining operation that employs roughly 85 people currently, with hopes of doubling employment opportunities once an expansion project is approved and completed.

During the March and April board meetings, NCCS CEO David Fogel addressed the board and residents in attendance, informing them of his company's concerns with the regulations and delay in finalizing them.

Fogel spoke at length about the efforts the company has put forth to take care of its employees, ranging from competitive salaries, to benefits packages that are not seen in most industries.

Fogel said those benefits and future jobs are in danger, however, due to language in the proposed regulations that would place extra requirements on operations not only looking to set up shop in Massena but were hoping to expand as well.

He said the planned expansion by NCCS is no different than if Alcoa had sought to expand operations.

"There's all these extra regulations being imposed on us for expanding that wouldn't apply to other busi-

nesses. And, by the way, shouldn't apply to our business because they don't fit what we do. I think they do fit what the small operators do," Fogel said.

Fogel said unlike other operations in the area, NCCS follows all town planning and zoning board regulations, has gone through and will continue to seek site plan approval process, follows OSHA guidelines, along with other various state and federal guidelines for employee safety.

Fogel said the operation is a professional outfit with a proving track record, a notion supported by Massena Fire Chief Patrick O'Brien and Foreman Aaron Hardy.

Both said that Fogel and NCCS have been great partners to the community that have followed all regulations and have posed zero problems to the code enforcement office and fire department.

Following Fogel's addresses and public feedback, town board members and Gustafson tweaked the language of the proposed regulations so companies like NCCS could proceed forward.

As was originally intended when the moratorium was first discussed in 2018, the language of the regulations will largely address sea box container operations and similar outfits that are not housed in a permanent structure and are not within an industrial zone.

Residents first raised concerns about other operations that were deemed an environmental and noise hazard from "amateur operators," as some residents referred to them.

Gustafson said the initial draft of the regulations is now complete, with the draft being sent to the county for their review process.

"The county Planning Board doesn't have an approval, but they give an advisory opinion to something like this that has to do with land use regulations. So, it's off to the county for that purpose," he said.

Gustafson said if all goes well, town board members could potentially adopt the regulations next month. However, if even a minor change is required in the regulations, another public hearing would need to be scheduled.

"Every time there's even a small technical change we're going to have to conduct another public hearing before it's adopted. So, that's where we're at tonight," he said.

While the regulations are near-

ing the finish line, Gustafson also began walking town board members through a State Environmental Quality Review (SEQR) process, which is required after the regulations are finalized.

The town will be the lead agency in the SEQR process, which board members will begin working on and should be able to finalize by the next board meeting in June, Gustafson said.

"As a practical matter, there's no other agencies other than the town board to deal with cryptocurrency regulations. It's just us because the county does a review of it," he said.

As it stands, the moratorium for crypto operations will run until Sept. 30, though Gustafson previously said that the moratorium can be lifted prior to that date once regulations are adopted.

Sales tax down for village

MASSENA -- Sales tax collections for the village of Massena are down 3.7% compared to the same period a year ago.

Village treasurer Kevin Felt told trustees that the tax payment received from the county on the first of May totaled \$534,564.

That compared to \$555,283 compared to the same quarter last year, he said.

As of the year-to-date, the village has received \$1,728,131, or \$80,902 less than last year. That equates to a 4.5% decrease in revenue.

Last year the village received \$1,809,033 during the same time frame. The village also re-levied \$609,738.56, down \$10,373.82 from last year's total of \$620,112.38.

Felt also informed village board members that the St. Lawrence County Real Property Tax Office is in the process of completing the village tax roll. The final tax rates for the village of Massena, west Massena and Norfolk are \$17.143359, \$21.627007 and \$20.373265 per thousand, respectively.

Felt noted that the rate may differ slightly from what was used through the budget process is recent assessment changes in the final assessment rolls reported from the count. Bond payments have also been made on the water treatment plant upgrade serial bond and the street sweeper bond.

As for the water treatment plant, the total payment of \$219,512.50 consisted of \$205,000 in principal and \$14,512.50 in semi-annual interest for the payment. The balance remaining is \$440,000 and will be paid off by October 2026.

A total of \$738 was paid for the street sweeper bond.

Supreme Court to make decision to hear gun rights case

CANTON -- U.S. Supreme Court justices will conference on June 6 to decide if they will hear a legal challenge to New York State's Concealed Carry Improvement Act this fall.

The case, Antonyuk v. James, is one that has been playing out even prior to Oct. 2022 when St. Lawrence County Attorney Steve Button began his work of counsel. St. Lawrence County legislators approved his involvement in the case, saying the lawsuit could have a direct impact on the rights of citizens in the county.

Attorneys with GOA submitted a petition for writ of certiorari on Feb. 20, challenging the Concealed Carry Improvement Act (CCIA), which was passed "in direct retribution" for the Supreme Court overturning New York's 109-year-old concealed carry

laws.

A writ of certiorari is the primary means to petition the court for a review of a case.

According to Button, GOA attorneys Stephen Stamboulieh and Erich Pratt have made strong legal arguments that he feels will compel the court to hear the case.

"Both are great attorneys and true constitutionalists that have made a strong argument, not only for the case to be heard but also for the courts to eventually overturn portions, if not the entirety of the CCIA," Button said.

Under the CCIA, state legislators and Governor Kathy Hochul passed multiple laws that created new requirements to obtain a concealed carry license and governed firearm ownership in general, including a 16-hour course with two hours of range time, an extensive list of spaces where firearms are prohibited,

the requirement to disclose all social media information to law enforcement, the requirement to disclose all firearms and persons in the home, along with a "good moral character" clause that gave licensing officers broad discretion of what constitutes "good moral character."

The Antonyuk case is one that has been hotly contested for the last year and a half, with Northern District Court Justice Glenn T. Suddaby largely ruling it to be unconstitutional, including provisions that required advanced training, further disclosure of personal information when applying, as well as the "good moral character" clause.

Following Suddaby's ruling, New York Attorney General Letitia James appealed to the Second Circuit Court of Appeals, which largely upheld the CCIA.

That ruling meant that applicants hoping to obtain a concealed carry

license will no longer have to provide their social media profile information and those with permits will be allowed to conceal carry in houses of worship and on private property by default.

That decision came down in December, leading GOA to petition to the U.S. Supreme Court to hear the case. All other provisions remain intact while the appeal is considered.

Now with a reply brief filed with the court, Button said the justices will conference in the next week or so to decide on whether they will hear the case.

Only four justices have to agree to hear the case for it to be on the docket. Button said if that happens, oral arguments will be heard either late this fall or in early winter.

That timeline would mean that a final ruling would likely come a year or so from now.

"We feel we have a strong legal argument that validates our opinion that the CCIA is unconstitutional and should be struck in its entirety," Button said.

If the justices decide to hear the Antonyuk case it would likely be part of a docket that includes a number of other cases, including VanDerStok v. Garland, which challenges the ATF's "frame or receiver rule," as well as Mock v. Garland, the Firearm Policy Coalition's legal challenge to the ATF's pistol brace rule that reclassified firearms utilizing the devices as short barreled rifles and shotguns. Under federal law, such firearms would require additional background checks, including a \$200 tax stamp and fingerprinting, to legally possess. Such items are illegal to possess in New York State.

The showdown in the Supreme Court would be the culmination of an intense legal battle between state officials and gun rights advocates, which ramped up with the Dec. 8 ruling by the 2nd Circuit Court of Appeals to uphold the majority of the CCIA.

"Today's decision to permit the state to enforce critical provisions of the Concealed Carry Improvement Act as the court process moves forward will help keep New Yorkers safe. This commonsense law was enacted to keep guns out of dangerous hands and away from schools, hospitals, parks, public transportation, and other sensitive locations. My office will continue to defend New York's gun laws and use every tool to protect New Yorkers from senseless gun violence," Attorney General Letitia James said following the announcement on Dec. 8.

Officials with GOA called the decision a modest rebuke of Albany. "Governor Hochul and her cabal in Albany never seem to get the message, and in turn, GOA is proud to have played a major role in rebuking her unconstitutional law. Nevertheless, this was not a total victory, and we will continue the fight until this entire law is sent to the bowels of history where it belongs," GOA Vice President Erich Pratt said at the time.

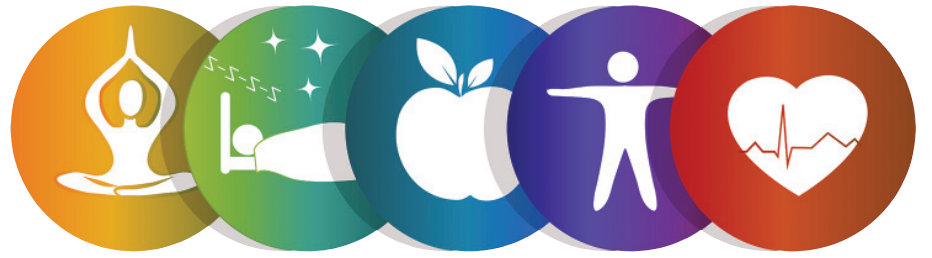

Watch out for ticks as weather warms in SLC

Warm weather has brought many people outside in St. Lawrence County, but public health officials are urging those enjoying sunny conditions to check for ticks.

Lyme and other Tick-Borne Disease, transmitted through the bite of an infected tick, are endemic throughout St. Lawrence County and are a nationally recognized health concern.

Individuals are at risk of contracting Lyme and other Tick-Borne Disease throughout the year.

However, warm weather increases outdoor activities, and St. Lawrence County residents and visitors work and recreate in our woods, fields, and open areas that may be inhabited or infested by ticks carried by wildlife, birds and domestic animals, increasing the risk of infection during the spring and summer months.

Lyme and other Tick-Borne Disease infected nearly 250 people of all ages in St. Lawrence County in 2023, this is about the same as in 2022 but a 40% increase (148) from 2021.

Lyme and other Tick-Borne Diseases, when not properly diagnosed or treated, may affect many body

systems, making proper diagnosis more difficult, thereby making the need for public information regarding prevention, treatment, and control a priority.

It is important you keep track of any symptoms you are experiencing.

Don't Ignore Your Symptoms:

- Fever
- Chills
- Severe headache
- Malaise (general feeling of discomfort or illness)
- Myalgia (muscle aches and pain)
- Joint pain
- Stiff neck
- Gastrointestinal symptoms (nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, loss of appetite)

- Rash
- Enlarged lymph nodes
- Facial paralysis

If you've been experiencing any of the symptoms listed above for a prolonged period of time, you may have a tick-borne illness.

Talk with your provider, especially if you've spent some time outside.

Tick-borne diseases can be treated effectively if caught early, but when ignored can lead to long-term health problems.

Found a Tick on You?

You'll want to remove the tick if it is attached. To do this, use tweezers to grasp the tick as close to the skin's surface as possible. Pull upward with steady, even pressure. After removing the tick, clean the site and your hands with soap and water.

If you find a tick on you, talk with your doctor. You may be eligible for preventative treatment.

Prevention

- Know where to expect ticks. Ticks live in grassy, brushy, leafy, or wooded areas. Many people get ticks in their own yard.

- Wear long pants, long sleeves, and tall socks to reduce exposed skin.

- Tip! Wearing light-colored clothing helps to spot ticks on you.

- Tick Check! Check for ticks after being outside. Areas to focus on include: under the arms, in and around the ears, behind the knees, between the legs, around your ankles, and on the hairline.

- Use insect repellents.
- Check your pets for ticks when they come in

Mental health awareness month

Governor Kathy Hochul made the proclamation on May 1, directing 15 state buildings and landmarks to be illuminated in green at dusk to raise awareness around mental health and behavioral health care.

"Nearly every New Yorker has either experienced or known someone who has struggled with a mental health challenge," Governor Hochul said. "Today, as we mark Mental Health Awareness Month in New York, we acknowledge these struggles, commit to eliminating stigma, and renew our efforts to ensure that people are best equipped to lead happy, productive lives."

The recently adopted fiscal year 2025 state budget includes \$20 million to continue expanding school-based mental health clinic satellites, \$19 million to provide critical care to young people outside of school environments, \$33 million to build supports for individuals living with a mental illness who are involved in the criminal justice system, and \$55 million to add 200 inpatient beds at state-operated psychiatric centers, state officials say.

Office of Mental Health Commissioner Dr. Ann Sullivan said, "Mental Health Awareness Month provides us with an opportunity to engage in conversations about mental illness, reduce stigma, and encourage New Yorkers of all ages to know they can get the help they need, when and where they need it."

Anyone can call 988 and speak with a counselor anytime day or night. Governor Hochul continues to make mental health a priority and has dramatically expanded care for all New Yorkers, especially those most in need."

Key initiatives like Youth Assertive Community Treatment teams, which provide wraparound services and support to young people at risk of entering residential or inpatient psychiatric treatment, will be expanded with \$9.6 million to continue serving them at home and within their community whenever possible.

An additional \$4 million will support a loan forgiveness program specifically for licensed mental health clinicians serving children and families.

Ogdensburg Command Performance's final show Oct. 15

OGDENSBURG – After 62-years of bringing live professional theater to the north country Ogdensburg Command Performances will end their decades-long run with a showing of 'Menopause: The Musical 2

Cruising Through The Change' on Oct. 15.

Sally F. Palao, OCP administrator, informed members of the organization at their annual meeting recently that the difficult decision

has been under discussion with the OCP board of trustees for the past year.

She cited a myriad of reasons for the decision, including increasing difficulty in meeting the technical

requirements of the larger touring shows, a dwindling selection of performance options, shows willing to travel to the region, and a shrinking pool of volunteers.

She said it is also becoming more difficult to find the required number of skilled local crew willing to work early mornings and late evenings to load shows in and out of The George Hall Auditorium at Ogdensburg Free Academy on performance days, according to Palao.

"The business of live theater has changed dramatically in recent years and has never fully recovered from the Covid pandemic years that put many production and touring companies out of business," she said. "The school administrators and staff, our volunteers and the greater community should be immensely proud of what has been accomplished with this organization. I know I am."

Ogdensburg Community Players began in 1963 when eight community members determined that the performing arts should be brought to Ogdensburg, according to the organization's website.

Now theatergoers travel from 84 adjoining communities to experience live professional theater, according to Palao.

"The spirit of these civic-minded individuals was in no way dimmed by their lack of fiscal resources.

Energy plus enthusiasm were the key ingredients that contributed to the early success of Ogdensburg Community Players," according to the site's narrative.

In 1992 the name was changed to Ogdensburg Command Performances and 54 volunteers committed themselves to running a business with a new mission to present the finest professional touring productions and to provide educational opportunities. The organization also created "Youtheatre: Class Acts," a program that brings live theater to area schools for students in grades pre-kindergarten through 12.

Youtheatre will continue for area students with Ogdensburg Free Academy and Gouverneur High School hosting this important program, according to Palao.

Palao has served as OCP administrator for more than 30 years. She said 'Menopause: The Musical 2 Cruising Through The Change' has been chosen as OCP's final show on Oct. 15 because Menopause has been one of the organization's most popular presentations.

"It is a long-running show nationally and internationally and always sells out when it has taken the stage in Ogdensburg in the past," she said. "It seems like the perfect fit for audience members to enjoy at our finale."

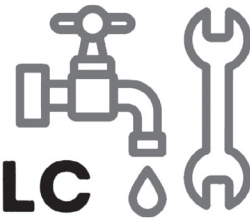

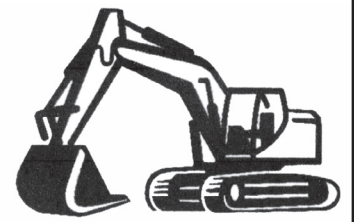

(b) Wireless communications service suppliers shall begin to add such surcharge to the billings of its customers and prepaid wireless communications sellers shall begin to collect such surcharge from its customers commencing December 1, 2024.
(c) Each wireless communications service supplier and prepaid wireless communications seller is entitled to retain, as an administrative fee, an amount equal to three percent of its collections of the surcharges imposed by this Local Law, provided that the supplier or seller files any required return and remits the surcharges due to the New York State Commissioner of Taxation and Finance on or before the due date for that return and that payment.
Section 2. Administration of surcharges.
The surcharges imposed by this Local Law shall be administered and collected by the New York State Commissioner of Taxation and Finance as provided in paragraph (8) of Tax Law § 186-g, and in a like manner as the taxes imposed by Articles Twenty-eight and Twenty-nine of the Tax Law.
Section 3. Applicability of State law to surcharges imposed by this Local Law.
All the provisions of Tax Law § 186-g shall apply to the surcharges imposed by this Local Law with the same force and effect as if those provisions had been set forth in full in this Local Law, except to the extent that any of those provisions is either inconsistent with or not relevant to the surcharges imposed by this Local Law.
Section 4.
Net collections received by St. Lawrence County from the surcharges imposed by this Local Law shall be expended only upon authorization of the Board of Legislators of the County of St. Lawrence and only for payment of system costs, eligible wireless 911 service costs, or other costs associated with the administration, design, installation, construction, operation, or maintenance of public safety communications networks or a system to provide enhanced wireless 911 service serving such county, as provided in paragraph (9) of Tax Law § 186-g, including, but not limited to, hardware, software, consultants, financing and other acquisition costs.
The County shall separately account for and keep adequate books and records of the amount and object or purpose of all expenditures of all such monies. If, at the end of any fiscal year, the total amount of all such monies exceeds the amount necessary for payment of the above-mentioned costs in such fiscal year, such excess shall be reserved and carried over for the payment of those costs in the following fiscal year.
Section 5. Effective date.
This Local Law shall take effect December 1, 2024.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN by the Chair of the St. Lawrence County Board of Legislators that the Chair and the members of the Board of Legislators of the County of St. Lawrence will meet at the Board of Legislators' Chambers, Court House, located at 48 Court Street, Canton, New York, at 5:30 p.m. on Monday, June 3, 2024, for the purpose of conducting a public hearing regarding:
ADOPTING LOCAL LAW E (NO.) FOR THE YEAR 2024, "AMENDING LOCAL LAW 2 FOR THE YEAR 2023, SETTING POLICY ON ACQUISITION AND SALE OF TAX DELINQUENT PROPERTY IN ST. LAWRENCE COUNTY"
BE IT ENACTED by the Board of Legislators of St. Lawrence County as follows:
Section 1. This local law shall supersede and repeal all prior local laws regarding real property tax foreclosure proceedings.
Section 2. Pursuant to Article 11 of the Real Property Tax Law, The St. Lawrence County Legislature hereby exercises the following options for the collection of delinquent taxes in St. Lawrence County.
Section 3. A charge of up to either \$250 on each parcel with delinquent taxes, or two percent of the sum of the taxes, interest and penalties due on the parcel, whichever is greater, shall be deemed reasonable and necessary to cover allowable administrative costs in tax foreclosure. This charge will be applied on June 1st of the year following the tax bill.
Section 4. The Tax Enforcement Officer is hereby empowered to take installment payments of delinquent taxes. Said installment payments shall have a payment term of 24 months with payments due every three months. The Tax Enforcement Officer shall add \$2 to all delinquent tax bills to cover the cost of notifying the taxpayer of this right. All Installment Agreements shall be entered into on or before September 30 of the year in which the tax becomes a lien. The Tax Enforcement Officer shall collect 25% of the tax due at the time the taxpayer signs the Installment Payment Agreement. The remaining seven installments are payable every quarter, with the first one due on December 1, following the Installment Agreement.
Section 5. The Tax Enforcement Officer, who is the County Treasurer, is hereby authorized to accept a deed in lieu of enforcement of collection of delinquent taxes under Article 11.
Section 6. All property acquired by the County pursuant to Article 11, shall be sold in one of the following manners: a) at a public auction held on the second Saturday in September of the auction year, b.) at a properly advertised private sale subject to approval by the St. Lawrence County Board of Legislators, or c.) at such date and in such manner as established by a validly issued Administrative Order, a validly issued Executive Order, subsequent superseding State Statute, or valid order of a Court with jurisdiction over the matter. Such sales may also be held online if deemed necessary by the County Treasurer.
Section 7. The County sells only its lien and interest, does not warrant title, and will convey only by quitclaim deed. No abstracts will be provided.
Section 8. Any fees associated with the auction and conveyance of properties sold at public auction, to include auctioneer fees, buyer's premium, advertising fees, and recording fees will be the responsibility of the bidder.
Section 9. At a public auction, the highest bidder must tender twenty percent (20%) of the bid or a fifty dollar (\$50.00) deposit, whichever is greater. In addition, the highest bidder is responsible for any buyer's premium, auctioneer fees, and possible advertising fees payable by certified check, money order, cash or credit card. The balance is due within thirty (30) days, also payable by certified check, money order or cash. Confirmation of the sale by the St. Lawrence County Board of Legislators is unnecessary for Article 11 properties sold at public auction. The County must sell to the highest bidder unless the highest bidder defaults. Upon default of the highest bidder, the deposit will be forfeited, and the County reserves the right to accept the bid of the second highest bidder.
Section 10. The former owner, and any other person who may be acting as an agent of the former owner, whether disclosed or undisclosed, is strictly prohibited from bidding at the auction.
Section 11. Any bidder who owns property in St. Lawrence County and is delinquent in their taxes shall be prohibited from bidding at the auction. The term delinquent is defined as prior year tax delinquency. No other person who may be acting as an agent of this bidder shall be allowed to bid at the auction.
Section 12. For properties with actual or suspected environmental contamination, application may be made to the Court in an effort to gain "Temporary Incidence of Ownership", granting St. Lawrence County the legal authority to enter such property and conduct an environmental investigation to determine the nature and extent of any environmental contamination which may exist at the property and the cost for addressing such contamination.
Section 13. The costs to St. Lawrence County associated with addressing actual or suspected environmental contamination of a property, including investigative, cleanup and legal costs, may be charged to the assessed owner and included on the tax assessment roll.
Section 14. The costs to St. Lawrence County associated with addressing actual or suspected contaminated, condemned, abandoned, and/or blighted property, including investigative, demolition and legal costs, may be charged to the assessed owner and included on the tax assessment roll subject to recovery pursuant to the provisions of the Real Property Tax Law.
Section 15. This local law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State.

daughters had him as a teacher and what they always used to talk about was how he and George Ham-mill, another teacher, used to have an almost comedic commentary outside of their classrooms every period," former Town Supervisor Steve O'Shaughnessy said.

Regardless of where he was or what he was doing, many say that Nicola was a dedicated member of the Massena community.

Former Deputy Town Supervisor Sam Carbone echoed the sentiment.

"Albert has been a huge part of our community and my life over the years. Our families have been acquainted over the years, between his father's restaurant of the time, Massena Diner, as a MCHS History teacher and Football coach, he has touched many of our lives. He could command the classroom after his military service as Army paratrooper captain, yet make you laugh, laugh with you and help you see subject matter from another perspective," Carbone said.

Mayor Greg Paquin also shared kind words for the late public servant.

He worked with Nicola as an educator at Massena Central School and said he learned a lot from him.

"He taught social studies, just like me. He was a great mentor to me personally and a friend of my family. He could see if you were struggling as a teacher and just had a way of pulling you aside and putting you at ease. He would almost always make you laugh when he did and you know things were going to be alright," he said.

Paquin joked that Nicola knew him for many years, from the time he was five-years-old.

"We lived in the same neighborhood, so I'm sure he saw me terrorizing the place from the time I was five. He will be greatly missed," he said.

Throughout his 43 years as a

town board or village board member, Nicola was widely regarded as a steady hand that helped guide six town supervisors over that span.

"Albert was proud to have served with six town supervisors and most as the deputy town supervisor.

When I was elected town supervisor Albert asked not to be appointed as deputy because he felt it was going to be very difficult in the upcoming years. So, on election night when I was voted in, I went straight to him and said that I really needed him to be the deputy town supervisor. Without hesitation he agreed and the town was a better place because of that decision," O'Shaughnessy said.

Nicola was also known to be a voice of reason. In many cases when board members were unable to reach a consensus, he would bring further insight through a breadth of knowledge and history that would help enlighten the decision making process.

"So many times the town board would be discussing some topic and often it was difficult to come to consensus and when that happened we would be arguing for different points and slowly everyone would stop and we would all look at Albert. He would stroke his chin and look off to somewhere and then offer a solution that the rest of us should've thought of way before," O'Shaughnessy said.

Nicola was also known for his sharp wit and big smile.

"Albert greeted you like a long lost friend he hadn't seen in some time, just glad to see you most of the time. He will be missed," Carbone said.

For his years of dedicated service to the Massena community, town officials named room 30 in the town hall building in his honor.

"Albert was a man who would automatically smile as he approached and I will miss him.

One of the proudest accomplishments was as he, Sam Carbone

and Bob Elsner were finishing our terms, we named the conference room complex on the second floor as Albert due to his 43 years of service to the Town and Village as a councilman and trustee," O'Shaughnessy said.

Wherever he went, Nicola was known to command the room, Carbone said.

Though he may be gone, Carbone said Nicola's legacy will live on.

"The town Hall conference room dedication is truly a testament to Albert's commitment to Massena," he said.

would receive \$46,134 plus \$30,000 in benefits.

The total cost for those positions would be roughly \$160,000.

Under the alternative scenario the city would hire a Director of Recreation with a salary of \$70,000 plus \$30,000 in benefits. Additionally the city would add two recreation maintenance workers at costs of \$45,760 plus \$30,000 in benefits each.

The estimated cost would be \$250,000.

Essentially the two scenarios represent what the city does now and what the city has done in the past.

The former represents the city's current situation and the latter represents how the city handled recreation prior to dissolving the department.

Although there was no consensus on how best to move forward it seemed clear from discussion that in an ideal scenario the city would be able to return to a Director of Recreation scenario, an idea that was strongly supported by Deputy Mayor Dan Skamperle and Doug Loffler who was recently appointed to the recreation commission.

City Councilor Storm Cilley seemed to agree and said he believed that the salary for the recreation director scenario was too low to be considered competitive in

his opinion.

And while no one was actively opposed to restoring the recreation department, Mayor Michael Tooley and Councilor Michael Powers suggested waiting to make any drastic changes until the new City Manager Xenofondas Chronis takes over city administration in July.

Tooley noted that returning to the city's former practice of handling recreation would require a charter change and financial investment. The current scenario is budgeted and is in line with existing charter language.

He said that he would like to see a charter commission established this fall to properly review and suggest charter changes prior to moving forward.

Although no formal action was taken, Smith told council that there has been an uptick of interest in the position. In a brief interview May 29, she said that if a candidate arises for that position and meets the requirements for the position the city would likely consider filling the position as it had been advertised but added that council is likely to delve more into the future of city recreation once Chronis settles in.

In the meantime, the Ogdensburg Recreation Department is being overseen by Department of Public Works Director Shane Brown and Interim City Manager Smith who is also working as the city planner.

Thanks to their efforts and those of the Ogdensburg Recreation Commission and various volunteers and organizations, the lack of a recreation director has not stopped the city from moving forward with its summer recreation camps.

This year the city is offering camps for track and field, baseball, cheer, soccer, tumbling, basketball, softball, lacrosse, volleyball and wrestling.

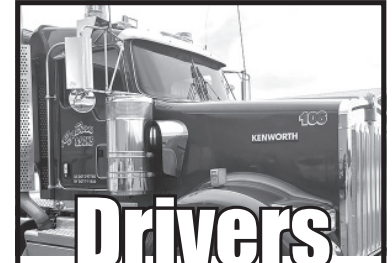

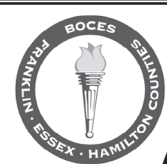

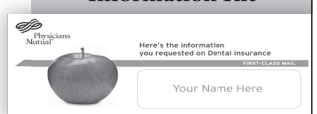
