## City wants public to help shape future development

OGDENSBURG -- Ogdensburg leaders are asking residents, commuters and tourists to help shape the city's future. Ogdensburg launched a community survey aimed at helping create a Downtown Revitalization Initiative Grant, which could land the city as much as \$20 million, and to help gather input to shape a "future vision" for Ogdensburg.

The survey takes about eight minutes to complete, but allows residents to share their thoughts and concerns about how they'd like to see the community grow.

It also seeks opinions on what problems are facing the city, what types of businesses are needed in the city and what's lacking in the city.

"We have such an incredible history and while we are not looking to, nor really can we, recreate the past, we are excited with the prospect of creating a future that borrows from the energy and vitality we had in days gone by," the release from

the city says.

Those interested in helping shape the city's future should take the survey prior to June 11, when it's scheduled to come down.

Since taking office in January, Mayor Michael Tooley and his fellow council members have been discussing ways to garner community input for planning purposes and has put a focus on working with other city entities such as the Ogdensburg Bridge and Port Authority and St. Lawrence County to discuss ways to partner for future development.

The survey follows strategic planning meetings held earlier this year.

Those taking the survey may do so anonymously, but for those who choose to share personal identifying information can rest assured it won't be shared.

"We value your privacy: Your individual responses will not be shared with the public. Any personally identifiable information will be kept strictly confidential. Responses will be grouped by question and made

## Airlines share pros and cons as part of bid for Ogdensburg's EAS contract

OGDENSBURG -- Officials from three airlines pitched the pros and cons of their Essential Service proposals at the Ogdensburg Airport on Tuesday.

The goal of the meeting is to garner community input to help decide which airline the Ogdensburg Bridge and Port Authority will recommend to the Department of Transportation for the EAS award. The OBPA will meet again June 13 at 5 p.m. at 1 Bridge Plaza to further discuss the

proposals and has invited the public to attend.

Although all three options for the future air service have pros, each also has unique drawbacks.

The airlines include Boutique Air with an 8-passenger aircraft, Contour Air with 30-passenger aircraft and Breeze Air with 137-passenger aircraft.

All submitted proposals offering a variety of options that include trips to Chicago, Washington DC., Boston, Newark, Westchester, Pittsburgh and Philadelphia.

**Contour Air**

Currently, air service to Ogdensburg is provided by Contour Air.

The airline offers a 30-passenger jet with 12 weekly flights to Philadelphia, Pa. Their proposal would remain the same but with an average fare estimated at \$75.

CEO Matt Chaifetz admitted to the public Tuesday that Contour struggled with its commitment to Ogdensburg for the past two years. He said Ogdensburg presented a unique challenge as the remote

## SLC residents call on county to address Deer River contamination

Residents along the Deer River in the towns of Lawrence and Brasher are calling on county legislators to step in and stop the contamination of the river before it's too late.

James Gurrola, a North Lawrence resident who owns property on the Deer River, said he has lived in his home for 33 years and has never seen the pollution this bad.

"There has always been a stench the whole time I've lived there, 33 years, but nothing like today," he said.

Gurrola described the stench as "if you were opening a jar of

rotting chicken that's been fermenting with maggots."

That smell and the murky gunk in the water, as it was described, has raised concerns among many residents who question if the contamination is seeping into their wells and the environment surrounding the river.

Gurrola suggested that one possible site of the contamination is North Country Dairy, a dairy processing plant just one mile up river from his property.

According to Gurrola, he and a friend who is an environmentalist, recently walked along the railroad tracks roughly one and a half miles to reach the third lagoon of Upstate Dairy.

"The stench was horrible, my

eyes were watering and we were choking," he said.

Gurrola said his environmentalist friend could not believe what he saw.

"The lagoons are overflowing. It's never been like this before," he said.

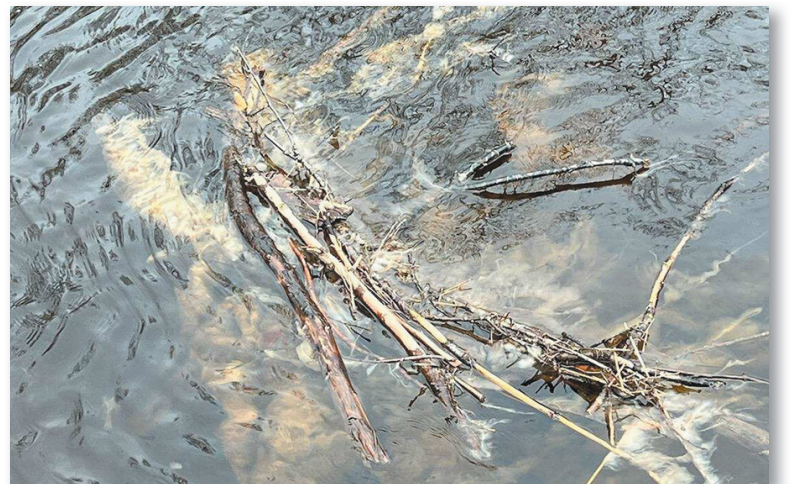
He implored everyone in attendance to go to the dairy processing plant to see the lagoons for themselves.

But Gurrola said it may not just be the plant's byproduct in the river.

He said numerous tractor trailers enter the site from Canada, all of which are milk tankers.

"I don't know what they're

# Mock DWI drill held at Heuvelton

HEUVELTON — Students at Heuvelton Central School District learned about the dangers of driving under the influence during a mock DWI exercise at the school on Thursday, May 9.

Heuvelton students, along with emergency services personnel and first responders, acted out what can occur when someone chooses to drive under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs.

Following the mock crash was a mock trial in the Poulton Auditorium, during which the student driver was held accountable for his actions.

St. Lawrence County Emergency Services and the Heuvelton Volunteer Fire Department and Rescue Squad were joined by the St. Lawrence County Sheriff's Office, St. Lawrence County Stop DWI, LifeNet of NY, Frary's Funeral Home, Bill Rapp's Chevrolet, Town of Dekalb Judge, Howard Putney and County Coroner, Kevin Crosby to stage the event.

Students were able to see firsthand the significant resources required to respond to such incidents, and the amount of time that

often passes from the initial collision to individuals receiving help.

Matt Denner, St. Lawrence County Director of Emergency Services, narrated the scene as it progressed, helping students understand what was taking place, and focused on the tragic consequences of making the choice to drive under the influence.

First responders demonstrated how they use the Jaws of Life to extract entrapped victims, and showed students how airbags

deploy. The exercise was not only helpful in demonstrating the tragic consequences of driving under the influence, but also served as a training exercise for emergency personnel.

Students were able to witness how quickly an accident scene is assessed, and resources are deployed to assist victims. Training exercises like the Mock DWI are important for first responders to practice their procedures for real emergency situations.

# Hearing adjourned for man accused of matricide

MASSENA — The preliminary hearing for a Massena man accused of killing his mother scheduled for Tuesday, June 4, in Massena Town Court has been adjourned at the request of the defendant, according to St. Lawrence County District Attorney Gary Pasqua.

No further appearances are scheduled at this time, said Pasqua.

Richard T. Billings, 69, was charged on May 30 by Massena Police with second-degree murder: with intent.

Second-degree murder is a class A felony that carries

a sentence of 20 years to life.

Billings is alleged to have killed his mother Mary Billings, 89, of Massena.

Police say the incident occurred roughly two months ago on March 30, at 23 Kennedy Court, but details on the manner of her death and any potential motive have not been shared publicly due to the ongoing investigation, according to Massena police.

Billings is being held without bail at St. Lawrence County Correctional Facility.

# Investigation of missing Massena woman utilizing State, Federal resources

MASSENA -- State and Federal agencies are assisting with an ongoing investigation related to a Massena woman who has been missing since May 10.

Police have been investigating the disappearance of Kinsley Robert, who was first described as being 5'4" tall, weighing 110 lbs, with brown hair and hazel colored eyes.

Police say she was last seen wearing a black and white zebra print dress near Bridges Street in the village of Massena.

"This is still an active and ongoing investigation. We are currently utilizing all resources available to us, including state and federal resources," Massena Chief of Police Jason Olson said.

Olson said the investigation has included "any and all methods to gather information," including the use of drone searches.

According to Olson, details will be limited due to the nature of the ongoing investigation.

"Rest assured, this is still a very active investigation and we have not sidestepped any potential leads," he said.

Police had asked all residents to review all security footage between May 8 to May 12 for any potential leads as to Roberts' whereabouts as well.

# O'burg man convicted of sexually assaulting child and helpless adult

OGDENSBURG -- An Ogdensburg man has been convicted of sexually abusing a child and an adult who was physically helpless.

St. Lawrence County District Attorney announced Nathan Shaver, 34, was found guilty of three counts of first-degree sexual abuse by a St. Lawrence County trial jury.

According to Pasqua, Shaver had sexual contact with an adult female in July 2018 who was physically

helpless at the time.

Shaver then had sexual contact with a 9-year-old child and an adult who was physically helpless at the time in the town of Massena, Pasqua said in a press release.

"Perpetrators of sexual assault rely on fear and shame to silence their survivors. I applaud the bravery of the survivors in this case for coming forward. My office will continue seeking justice for survivors of sexual assault and I hope this verdict inspires other survivors to come forward," Pasqua said.

Pasqua commended Chief Assistant District Attorney Joshua Haberkornhalm and Assistant District Attorney Matthew Peabody for their hard work and excellent presentation of the evidence to the jury.

Pasqua also thanked the New York State Police Bureau of Criminal Investigation for providing valuable assistance with the prosecution.

Sentencing is scheduled for Aug. 5, 2024. He faces a maximum sentence of 21 years with the New York State Department of Corrections.

# Heuvelton gets \$224,748 for UPK

HEUVELTON — Heuvelton Central School District will receive \$224,748 from the New York State Education Department (NYSED) to expand their Universal Prekindergarten (UPK) program.

The district, which currently offers two half-day sessions for students in UPK, applied for the NYSED Universal Prekindergarten Expansion Grant with the goal of improving the educational program of their youngest learners.

Having been awarded the competitive grant, the district will begin offering two full-day sessions for Prekindergarten classes in September 2024.

# Trinity School to close at end of year

MASSENA -- After 40 years of operations Trinity Catholic School is slated to close due to steep declines in enrollment.

According to a press release, confirmed enrollment for grades kindergarten through six for the 2024-25 academic year was 45 students, while enrollment last year in those grades stood at 78.

In 2022-23, enrollment stood at 106 students. "Painful and disappointing though it may be, we must acknowledge that the loss of over half the student population has made operating the school as it currently exists unsustainable. Therefore, Trinity Catholic School will not open for the 2024-25 school year as it currently operates," the statement reads.

School officials say they are exploring options and hope to have resources to open in September, "but online in a limited capacity."

"If enrollment is sufficient, we hope to accommodate Trinity's rising fifth- and sixth-grade classes for one more year to allow those students to finish their early education at the school. We continue to communicate directly with the parents of those students to assess their intent and level of commitment, and to determine if continued, limited operation is academically and financially feasible," the statement reads.

"For 40 years, our school has been sustained through the grace of God with the love and ongoing collabo-

ration of parents, students, alumni, administrators, teachers, pastors and benefactors. Their countless hours of effort, boundless generosity and sheer good will have helped create and sustain Trinity Catholic School as a source of education, faith, and human formation for our young people, their families and the community. To one and all, we extend our deepest gratitude. The end of this chapter in Massena's Catholic educational environment does not diminish the contributions and legacy of our school. Trinity Catholic School has been a journey of faith and love and will continue to have an impact for years to come," Father Mark R. Reilly, pastor of St. Peter's Parish in Massena said.

Marianne Jadlos, principal of Trinity Catholic School, also touched on the closure.

"Trinity Catholic School (TCS) has been a home away from home for some of our families for generations. However, even those who have walked through the school doors only once were instantly made to feel like part of the TCS family. Although today is a sad day, we will continue to enjoy each of the remaining days we have together. After the doors close, a new mission begins, which is to take the years we've spent at Trinity Catholic growing both academically and spiritually and boldly bring it out into the world," she said.

# Chase Mills man jailed over machete incident

CHASE MILLS — A Chase Mills man was jailed stemming from an alleged machete incident May 30, according to state police.

Troopers responded to CR 37 in Massena around 3:50 p.m. for an alleged order of protection violation.

An investigation determined Michael J. Simser, 34, entered the residence by kicking in the side door, going into the victim's room, grabbing a machete and making threatening remarks. Once Simser found out the victim contacted law enforcement, he reportedly fled the scene before police arrived.

After interviewing the victim, this is an ongoing issue with Simser,

and him violating the order of protection. There was an active arrest warrant for Simser in relation to another order of protection violation incident. Simser was located June 1 and charged with two counts of first-degree criminal contempt, third-degree criminal possession of a weapon, intimidating a victim, and second-degree menacing.

He was arraigned in Massena Court and released on his own recognizance on the aforementioned charges and given a return court date for June 12. Simser was remanded to St. Lawrence County Correctional Facility on an outstanding bench warrant.

# Village to bond for \$3.9 million water project

MASSENA -- Massena village trustees have agreed to bond for \$3,899,035 for a water line system improvement project which will see a redundant raw water supply line added to the village's water system.

Village board members had previously taken steps to declare the village as the lead agency in a State Environmental Quality Review (SEQR) for the project last month.

Mayor Greg Paquin said part of the project would include new water lines that will ensure people in the town and the Air Products green hydrogen facility would have a steady supply of water.

Other projects would likely include water treatment facility improvements, including new pumps, as well as a replacement water tower on Bowers Street.

Trustees also took other resolutions to approve the SEQR classification of action and negative declaration, technicalities that are part of the approval process, officials said.

Paquin previously said the water tower was showing signs of aging and would need repair or replacement in the next five to 10 years.

In response to the need to improve the water treatment facil-

ity, Paquin said it was a matter of future proofing the village.

Paquin said that could pose serious problems for the village and residents as well.

With the village now taking steps to be the lead agency for the SEQR, officials can move forward with a grant application that is due to the state by June 14, he said.

LaBella Associates D.P.C. will prepare Part 1 of the Environmental Assessment Form for the project, officials previously said.

Paquin also said the village has had discussions with Air Products Director of Large Business Development Harry Johnston about Air Products assisting with the planned upgrades and enhancements.

Part of that discussion also revolved around assisting with grants, he said.

As part of a deal with the village, Air Products will purchase \$300,000 worth of water each year from the village.

Paquin said that purchase will not affect residential water supply, however officials say they want to upgrade the water pumps at the water treatment facility to ensure a steady supply.

Air Products officials say the facility being built on Pontoon Bridge Road will utilize 1 to 1.2

million gallons of water per day to produce green hydrogen that will be used in vehicles.

The \$500 million project will be built on 84.4 acres of land and should come online sometime in the first quarter of 2027.

Village officials also approved a \$1.493 million bond for a new water line that will cross the Raquette River as well.

On two separate occasions in the last two years, water lines that run along and under the river have failed, leading to limited water delivery for residents south of the bridge.

Officials say they hope the new water line will provide better water delivery for the residents while being easier to maintain since it will run along the bridge.

Department of Public Works Superintendent Marty Miller previously said the state Department of Transportation appeared to be OK with the project with just a few minor details left to be hammered out before moving forward with the project.

Now with the SEQR process underway for that project and an approval of bonds finished, officials said the project will also be able to move forward.

# City's first female firefighter completes training May 31

OGDENSBURG -- Ogdensburg's first female firefighter was among the six newest recruits who completed their academy training May 31.

The six firefighters recently graduated from the Recruit Firefighting Training Academy in Watertown recently bringing much needed relief to the department.

The newly trained firefighters included Mark Barr, Brittaney Bertrand, Luc LaFlair, Cole Piercey, Chad Lacey and Joshua Miller.

In Ogdensburg a ceremony in city hall was held when they were hired in January, when members took their oaths and Chief Kenneth Stull spoke briefly to mark the historic occasion.

"The addition of the six new firefighters will greatly increase our firefighters' health and safety and reduce the cost for us to continue providing the excellent service to the community, which they deserve," Stull said at the time.

Stull also shared that Brittaney Bertrand would be the first woman to serve as an Ogdensburg firefighter.

"Today is a historic day for the Ogdensburg Fire Department," Stull said. "To the best of my knowledge, we've never hired six firefighters at once. Also today I know for a fact that we have never had an appointment for the first female firefighter for the city of Ogdensburg. That needs to be commended," he said.

# Fishing promoter says take river contamination seriously

MASSENA -- Fishing promoter and former television angler Don Meissner says contamination in the Deer River must be taken seriously.

White globules were recently brought to light by St. Lawrence County Legislator John Genet, who believes the cause of the problem is the whey byproduct being discharged from the North Country Dairy facility.

At this time there has been no solid evidence to prove that theory. According to Gennett, Nichelle Swisher of Lewis County Soil & Water suggested the substance might be didymosphenia geminata, an invasive algae commonly referred to as "rock snot," but he's not convinced based on what he's seen and heard.

Department of Environmental Conservation

officials say an investigation was launched in the wake of community concerns being raised.

Meissner said the claims should be taken seriously, before the problem worsens.

He says the Deer River has been home to some of the best fishing in the area, but the contamination appears to be causing widespread damage to the habitat. As a result, fish cannot be found for several miles in the river, he said.

Meissner said he has also been in touch with the state Department of Environmental Conservation.

"They said they would start their research to sort out what the cause of the contamination is," he said.

Meissner said the "white globules floating down the river" are "extraordinarily alarming."

"The reports are that not only the fish, but the animals and reptiles are dying because of

this," he said.

With the impact to the environment being so severe, Meissner said it demonstrates how natural resources such as the Deer River can "just go in a second" when something like this happens.

Meissner said such situations need to be handled swiftly to avoid further issues, like what happened in Black River years ago.

In that situation, Meissner said "millions of fish were wiped out and took decades to come back." He said if something isn't done now, the same could be said of the Deer River.

"We need to do something now. This feeds into the St. Regis River. It feeds into the St. Lawrence River. These are prime waterways with some of the best fishing in the world. We need to protect our resources and our waterways," he said.

# Charged after fairgrounds crash

GOUVERNEUR -- Gouverneur police say Aaron W. Bush, 27, Gouverneur, was charged with second-degree criminal mischief, trespass, leaving the scene of an accident, failure to stop at a stop sign and no or insufficient tail lamps on May 11.

Police said Bush intentionally drove his pickup truck through a cattle barn at the Gouverneur and St. Lawrence County Fairgrounds damaging two sliding cattle doors causing \$3,000 damage.

Bush is reported to have left the scene and his vehicle was later located by police.

He was arraigned in Gouverneur town court and released. He is scheduled to reappear in town court at a later date.

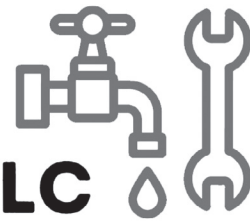

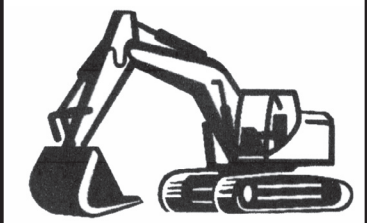

**Town awards contract for sand storage building at Massena airport**

MASSENA -- The town of Massena has taken the next steps for the construction of a sand storage building at the Massena International Airport after awarding the construction project.

Town officials say that D.C. Building Systems, Inc., of Watertown, were awarded the contract totaling \$2,018,600.

In other action, board members also awarded the electrical contract for the facility.

That contract was awarded to DOW Electric, Inc., of Malone, for \$56,975.

Town officials also agreed to sign off on the proposed fiscal year 2025 project to replace the airport's large hangar door located near the ARFF/SRE building.

With contracts signed, officials say the projects will move forward this summer.

The news of the contracts being awarded comes after board members approved completion of an IFE for the proposed sand storage building construction project in April, with a cost of \$1,800 to \$3,000 to be paid for through grant funding.

During the same April board meeting, board members also approved the contract documents with Baseline King Corp for the construction of the Airfield Electrical Improvements at the Massena International Airport and approved signing the final application for the Airfield Pavement Marking project, which will utilize \$234,918 in federal funds, \$6,182 in state funds and \$6,182 in town funds.

Board members also awarded a contract to Hi-Lite Airfield Services, LLC for \$194,282.40 for the Airfield Marking Improvements FAA AIP, with an award contingent upon FAA funding and approval, officials said in April.

Town Supervisor Sue Bellor said with the projects funded and contracts awarded it is sure to be a busy summer at the airport as improvements are made.

**Final application period open for Community Fund**

MASSENA -- The third and final application period for the Core of the Community Fund is now open.

Village officials say the application period opened May 20 and will potentially provide grants from \$5,000 to \$100,000 to businesses to invigorate Massena's downtown district.

"This round includes some exciting changes to the program. The maximum award for building renovation projects has been increased to \$100,000 and the property or business owner's match requirement has been reduced to just 25%, meaning grant funding can cover up to 75% of the total project cost," officials say.

Officials say the fund is a testament "to the Village's continuous commitment to economic development and architectural heritage."

Grant funds can be used for large interior or exterior rehabilitation projects, small projects such as

business signage and awnings, or business equipment.

Previous funding was awarded for the restoration of the marquee and various enhancements at the Schine Theater, new signage and a kitchen expansion at the Gristmill Brewery as well as equipment purchases for a new coffee shop, opening soon.

Applications will be accepted through July 15.

Interested business owners, property owners, and entrepreneurs are encouraged to apply by visiting the Village of Massena's website.

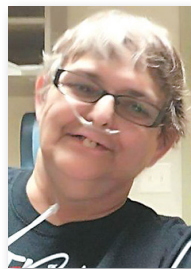

In addition, the Commission may, without further notice by publication, approve a route for the line that traverses municipalities not presently affected by the proposed primary route.

**DESCRIPTION OF THE PROJECT**

National Grid proposes to rebuild and reconductor a portion of the existing 115kV T3170 Colton-Malone 3 transmission line for approximately 18.3 miles between the Colton Substation in the Town of Pierrepont and the Nicholville Substation in the Town of Lawrence (to be known as the "Colton-Nicholville 3 Project", or the "Project"). The Project is located in the Towns of Pierrepont, Parishville, Hopkinton, and Lawrence in St. Lawrence County. The Project is being undertaken to replace deteriorated structures, conductors, and shield wires in order to maintain reliable transmission service. The line utilizes primarily wood single circuit H-frame structures and is approximately 18.3 miles long.

The proposed line between Colton Substation and structure 3 will be rebuilt on horizontally configured H-frame type, single circuit, galvanized steel pole structures located on the existing centerline. The line between Structures 4 and 6 will be rebuilt on delta davit arm deadend, single circuit, single-pole (i.e., monopoles), galvanized steel pole structures located on the existing centerline. The remainder of the line between Structure 6 and the Nicholville Substation will be rebuilt on horizontally configured H-frame type, single circuit, galvanized steel pole structures located on the existing centerline with the exception of the portion of the line between structures 67 and 71. This portion of the line will be rebuilt adjacent to the existing centerline on new 100-foot-wide right-of-way.

The Project proposes to reconductor the existing line, which primarily features 336.4 kcmil 26/7 Aluminum Conductor Steel Reinforced "Linnet" conductor with double bundled 636 kcmil 26/7 Aluminum Conductor Steel Supported "Grosbeak" conductor. The existing 3/8" Extra High Strength 7-strand steel shield wire will be replaced with a single 3/8" EHS 7-strand steel shield wire and a 48-count Fiber Optic Ground Wire. In locations where only one aerial ground wire is installed, the 3/8" 7-strand steel shield wire may be terminated at structures on either end of the single aerial ground wire segment.

In general terms, the proposed route of the Project will traverse the Town of Pierrepont, Town of Parishville, Town of Hopkinton, and Town of Lawrence, all within St. Lawrence County. The proposed route will traverse approximately four miles within the Adirondack State Park. ## County to receive nearly \$500,000 for youth employment

St. Lawrence County will receive \$479,824 as part of a \$55 million state initiative to help at-risk youth enter the workforce this summer.

The announcement comes from Governor Kathy Hochul's office, as more than 20,000 youth from low-income households are expected to be employed across the state this summer as part of the state's Summer Youth Employment Program.

The \$55 million investment is an increase of \$7.9 million over last year.

To be eligible for the program, youth must be between the ages of 14 and 20 and be a member of a household with a household income below 200 percent of the federal poverty level, which varies by household size and, for example, is \$51,640 for a family of three.

# State offering pay off for energy upgrades

New York State introduces \$39.6 million in funding for energy efficiency and electrification upgrades

New Yorkers hoping to upgrade their homes with more energy efficient and electric appliances now have the opportunity to do so as part of a \$39.6 million state program.

The news comes from Governor Kathy Hochul's office, who announced the "first in the nation" program that has been received through the U.S. Department of Energy.

The initial \$39.6 million formula grant will expand the reach of New York's EmPower+ program by allowing more low-income families to improve their homes with energy efficiency and electrification upgrades that will reduce energy costs and transition away from burning fossil fuels in their homes.

Today's announcement supports the State's nation-leading Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act (Climate Act) goal to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by 85 percent by 2050 and requirement for at least 35 percent, with a goal of 40 percent of the benefits of clean energy investments supporting disadvantaged communities.

"As the first state in the nation to offer these Inflation Reduction Act rebates, we are expanding access to home improvements that will save

New Yorkers money on their energy bills and reduce our reliance on fossil fuels," Governor Hochul said. "Thanks to our strong partnership between New York State, the Biden

Administration, and U.S. Department of Energy, we are making important progress to make the clean energy transition affordable for all New Yorkers."

## County proclaims June as Dairy Month

CANTON -- St. Lawrence County's Dairy Princess and her court were on hand during the county legislature's June 3 meeting as officials proclaimed June as Dairy Month, marking the 87th anniversary of National Dairy Month.

One of the larger events the dairy court took part in was the recent Dairy Festival in Canton, which was held May 31 and June 1.

As part of the festivities, the dairy court provided refreshments and snacks as part of the "Get Moving with Milk" one-mile fun run and 5K.

Much like the 5K, the court also attended a recent track meet at St. Lawrence University, taking the opportunity to hand out over 800 cartons of chocolate milk to athletes.

In 2023, county dairy farmers produced 890 million pounds of milk, ranking St. Lawrence County fifth in the Northeast Milk Marketing Area, which extends from New Hampshire to Virginia.

According to the Northeast Statistical Handbook, there were 176 dairy farms operating in St. Lawrence County in 2023, making the county the third-highest number of farm operations in the marketing area.

Those farms, which play a crucial role in the regional economy, are also some of the largest employers in the county, officials say.

Locally produced milk goes into many of the products county residents consume, including Cabot sharp cheddar cheese, which is produced with milk from Upstate Dairy, Putman said.

St. Lawrence County residents have a chance to shape the future of travel in the North Country by weighing in on which airline they'd like to see awarded a federal subsidy known as Essential Air Service.

It's an opportunity for you to have a say in the future of the county and I'm told that public sentiment is a major factor in the decision process.

Known as EAS, the funding subsidizes air travel in rural communities that otherwise would not have to traffic to justify the cost.

Small airports like Ogdensburg and Massena are able to secure air service providers through the program.

Following a runway expansion in recent years, the Ogdensburg airport was able to provide commercial flights to Chicago and Washington D.C., as well as Florida.

Although the pandemic took a heavy toll on many industries, few were hit as hard as the Ogdensburg Bridge and Port Authority, which saw the international bridge travel

greatly restricted and air travel nearly shut down.

The economic downturn led Skywest to end service. Fortunately the OBPA was able to find another service provider through the Alternative Essential Air Service program. For the past few years Contour Air has been providing flights to Philadelphia. And while many have complained about canceled flights, especially in the winter months, the service has allowed St. Lawrence County residents to fly out of Ogdensburg to major travel hubs.

With that contract nearly up, Ogdensburg Bridge and Port Authority recently requested proposals to help the Department of Transportation determine which airline should receive the EAS subsidy and a part of that decision, which is weighed heavily in the pro-

cess is public comment.

The airlines vying for the award are Contour Air, Breeze Air and Boutique Air.

Contour Air is offering 30-passenger flights to Philadelphia.

Breeze Airways would provide 137-passenger flights to either Washington D.C. or flights to Washington D.C. and Orlando, Florida.

Boutique Air's proposal is lengthier than the other two with a total of seven options. Boutique flights would offer an 8-passenger plane with a pressurized cabin. They offer six options with destinations ranging from Newark, Chicago, Westchester, Washington D.C. and Pittsburgh.

Although I realize many St. Law-

rence County residents may not use the service, that doesn't mean it can't benefit the community. Flights to and from major hubs allow access to our community which can be a bit daunting to reach due to our lack of major highways.

So I would strongly encourage all St. Lawrence County residents to consider sharing their thoughts and opinions on what destinations they think would be most beneficial for the area. This is one of the times your comments really do matter, don't miss the opportunity.

bringing but I do know they are crossing the border and I know they are milk tankers," he said.

Gurrola implored legislators to step in now before it's too late.

"We need to find some resolution to this and stop the pollution of the Deer River," he said.

"I'm mad, the town's mad, nobody wants to see anyone lose their jobs. But these people have a responsibility to not pollute our rivers, our wells and our people," he said.

Stewart Legacy, a Brasher resident who lives along the river, said the smell is not nearly as bad where he lives on the Deer River, however that doesn't mean the contamination hasn't reached his home.

Legacy detailed his interactions with DEC officials, beginning in February of this year.

According to Legacy, he and his family could see "blobs of gel" in the river, thinking they were possibly feathers.

"The DEC officer told me flat out, this is coming from the dairy plant," Legacy said.

Legacy said he was given a number to call environmental officials in Washington D.C., however he has yet to receive a call back.

"There's no justification for what they're (DEC) doing," he said.

Legacy doubled down, saying DEC officers are not testing the water coming from the plant, along with the water around the plant.

"Why not test the water if you can visibly see what's in it," he asked.

Legacy said anything in the river is "coated with crap," which has led him and his family to utilize other waterways for recreation like kayaking.

"There's no way you would put your body or kayak in the river," he said.

Legacy told legislators he felt the DEC was covering up the situation.

In response to the initiation of an investigation, Legislator John Gen-

nett submitted FOIL requests to the DEC for all records pertaining to the testing and licensing of the facility.

That request was met with a response from the DEC who claimed they needed more time, Legacy said.

While Gurrola and Legacy pointed fingers at the dairy plant, Brasher Town Supervisor Mark Peets suggested it could be runoff from a local farm of the town of Lawrence sewer facility.

Peets spoke of a board meeting in April that had numerous residents in attendance, all voicing concerns about the river. One resident also brought in samples from the river to show the board just what was happening.

Following that meeting, Peets said he spoke with DEC officers who immediately mentioned the dairy plant's permits as being in need of updating.

"It hadn't been updated in 20 years," he said.

Residents had previously said in various meetings that the permits are essentially "rubber stamped" every four years, with no real review process required before they are issued.

Peets said he and residents do not want to see a review completed and a new permit issued with a higher output threshold to make the plant compliant. He said a proper review and data collection needs to be completed to gauge just how severe of an impact the waste has on the river.

Peets said he will not allow his grandchildren to even go in the river because of the pollution.

In conversation with fishing promoter Don Meissner, Peets said he and Meissner agreed that fishing is a hidden gem in the region, something that is being lost in the deer river due to the pollution.

"The DEC has assured me that they are working on getting this permit done," Peets said.

Taking things a step further,

Peets said he and other board members met with representatives from the dairy plant "not about jurisdiction" since the plant is in Lawrence, but rather to raise concerns about the three municipalities and numerous residents affected by the situation.

Peets also suggested that an area farm along the river could also be part of the problem, with manure runoff getting in the river.

He said nutrients are getting in the water somewhere, which is allowing the white sludge to grow at an exponentially faster rate.

Another possibility is the town of Lawrence sewer facility, which is a raised bed leach field system that is over 35 years old, he said.

"I'm 11 miles from the dairy plant, I can see it in the river behind my house," he said.

Whatever is happening, Peets said it is happening in a concentrated area upstream "where a lot of things are happening."

"I do not want to see the Deer River turn into the Black River," he said.

Peets said fisheries are being compromised right now, with the St. Regis and St. Lawrence Rivers at risk if something isn't done now.

"We need to get to the bottom of what's going on. We don't want finger pointing, we just want a solution," he said.

Several legislators also voiced support for a deeper investigation, saying they too are concerned about the contamination.

Some suggested that county officials need to use all resources available to assist with the matter, including the Environmental Management Council, which is part of the county Planning Office.

No formal action was taken.

location made it difficult to get parts for maintenance and said the schedule was busy and left little time to deal with issues as they

arose.

However, he said Skywest is now a 25% shareholder in the company, which has been a major game changer. He said the partnership has given the company access to more planes, improved maintenance turnaround that will allow the Contour to address the frequent cancellations in flights the airport saw in recent years.

In fact, Chaifetz said he'd even be willing to put a clause in the contract that would allow the OBPA to terminate the agreement if the company fails to meet desired metrics.

One of the biggest strengths for Contour Air is interline partnerships with other airlines, which allows customers to book connecting flights as one purchase. This means avoiding baggage reclaims and checks between flights and would allow customers to book flights from Ogdensburg to say L.A., which would connect from Contour's D.C. flight.

**Breeze Airways**

Breeze Airways would provide a 137-passenger jet and is offering two options, however due to regulation changes, the second option has since been scrapped.

The remaining proposal would provide one daily round trip flight from Ogdensburg to Washington D.C. One-way fares were estimated at around \$60.

The scrapped proposal would have provided two weekly flights from Ogdensburg to Orlando.

Breeze said a change in federal regulation placed a distance limit on EAS travel that disqualified the Florida flights.

However, Breeze is in ongoing conversations with the airport about offering flights outside of the EAS proposal that could include flights to Florida.

Breeze Air representative Eric Fletcher noted that he was formerly an employee of Allegiant Air, which once offered flights from Ogdensburg to Florida, which were not part of an EAS contract.

He said Breeze Air currently offers that service in Plattsburgh and says market data suggests that such flights could be profitable in Ogdensburg, despite being ineligible for federal subsidies.

The weakness in Breeze's proposal is the lack of interline partnerships.

Fletcher said that while he believes that such partnerships will exist by 2024, at this time he can't share details.

Essentially that would mean travelers would need to book their connecting flights from D.C. separately, if such deals do not come to fruition.

As for strengths, the larger jet planes tend to be more palatable for some fliers and the planes will include Wifi and options of three levels of seating ranging from gen-

eral to first class.

Fletcher noted that the company believes it can capture the Canadian market in Ottawa with the flights to D.C.

**Boutique Air**

Boutique Air's proposal is lengthier than the other two with a total of seven options. Boutique flights would offer an 8-passenger plane with a pressurized cabin.

Option 1 would include 28 weekly round trip flights from Ogdensburg to Washington D.C. in the offseason and 35 weekly round trips to DC in the peak season. The proposal also notes that Boutique Air reserves the right to move roughly half of those flights to Newark, New Jersey, or Westchester County. Fares are estimated at \$99.

Option 2 would provide 21 weekly round trip flights to Newark or Westchester and seven round trip weekly flights to Chicago. Fares are estimated at \$119.

Option 3 would provide 21 round trip weekly flights to Washington D.C. and 7 weekly roundtrip flights to Chicago. Fares are estimated at \$129.

Option 4 would provide 14 weekly round trips to Washington D.C. and 14 weekly round trips to Pittsburgh, Pa. Fares are estimated at \$99.

Option 5 would provide 28 weekly round trip flights to Boston, similar to what is currently offered at the Massena airport. Fares are estimated at \$89.

Option 6 would provide 28 weekly round trips to Newark / Westchester. Fares are estimated at \$89.

Boutique CEO Shawn Simpson pointed out that while their planes are unique, efficient and incredibly safe, their model for success is very different from their competitors.

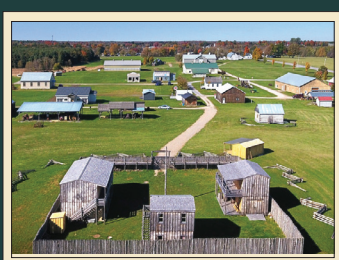
Boutique flight completion is 99.6 percent, with cancellations solely due to weather or airport closures. That's because the company has maintenance crews and spare planes available on hand to ensure downtime is minimized.

The company currently provides air service at Massena and is also interested in promoting the area and local events to draw people to St. Lawrence County.

Boutique's biggest weakness on paper compared to its competitors is the smaller plane size can be a deterrent for some, but Simpson noted that those who fly on the Piaggio Avanti planes tend to enjoy the experience.

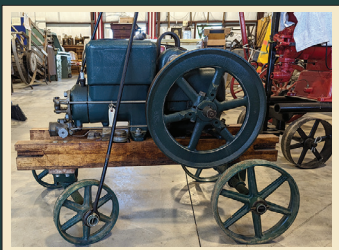

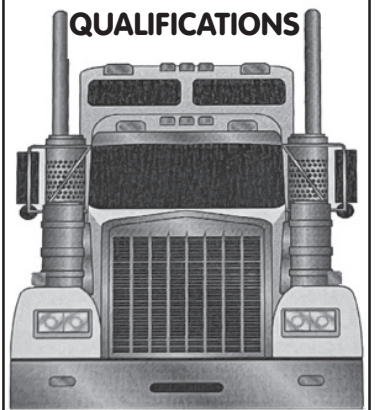
