Potsdam tackling goose problem

POTSDAM — The village is buying two sets of swan decoys to install in Ives Park to keep the wild geese out of the park.

The board discussed the issue at its meeting Monday, June 17 and authorized Village Administrator Isabelle Gates-Shult to purchase two sets of the swans. Gates-Shult said the purchase would cost around \$160 per set.

"It's crazy, we almost can't even walk in the park. There are just so

many of them," said Village Trustee Sharon Williams who suggested the swans idea.

Ives Park, and the islands and other shorelines of the Raquette River in Potsdam in recent years has been an attraction for Canadian geese and their goslings in spring and summer, but unfortunately with the aftermath as well.

Swan decoys like the ones found at <https://tinyurl.com/demzzj83> are often used to deter wild geese from public areas where they might congregate enmasse without the use of more invasive methods. Swans are

territorial and naturally keep geese away from the areas where they settle.

"In terms of price they are really inexpensive," Gates-Shult told the board. "So we could have it as a trial with board approval."

The village plans to place a swan decoy set at each end of the park offshore.

Village officials have discussed other options to keep the geese out of the park in the past, including netting which was not supported due to the danger to the birds.

Pickleball park coming to The Falls

RENSELAER FALLS — A new pickleball court and playground is in the works in Rensselaer Falls.

"Our village is buzzing with anticipation as we prepare to break ground on significant recreational upgrades," stated Mayor Michael Hammond.

Site work was expected to begin Monday, June 17 with the Town of Canton Highway Department digging the sod and laying a sub-base. A memorandum of Understanding

between the town and Village of Rensselaer Falls was approved by the Canton Toown Board at Wednesday night's monthly board meeting. The cost of the town's work is \$3,779.15.

The new recreational fixtures will be located on State Street, just behind the Falls Market & Deli. The area will be paved by Grasse River Paving during the week of June 24.

"This project is a testament to the power of community collaboration. Over a decade ago, a group of dedicated volunteers came together to install modern playground equipment for our youth. That initial effort

has blossomed into our annual Falls Festival and Playground committee. Despite the challenges posed by COVID-19, this group has successfully fundraised over the past several years, enabling us to now add new playground equipment, a basketball court, and a pickleball court," the mayor remarked. "We also have plans on the horizon for a community built pavilion."

Hammond pointed out that the basketball court will be relocated from Main Street to this new site.

Speed, road width still an issue with Miner Street Road residents

Two gun control bills pass state legislature

CANTON – Speed and width on the Miner Street Road dominated the public comment session at Wednesday night’s monthly meeting of the Canton Town Board. At the board’s May meeting, Town Highway Superintendent Steven Smith reported that New York State Department of Transportation design criteria for rural roads may have an effect on how the town

approaches the reconstruction project dealing with the width of the road and the accompanying bicycle and pedestrian trails. An original design called for a 30-foot width with two 10-foot lanes with 5-foot pathways on each side of the road. The project may now shrink four feet with two 10-foot lanes and two 3-foot pathways.

Canton resident Mark McKenna spoke at length about the project, questioning the integrity of the design while offering suggestions. His concerns also focused on wheelchair accessibility on the path, saying three-foot lanes would not accommodate wheelchairs.

“There is a process and procedure and the public (residents on the Miner St. Road) need to be heard and involved. This is the second public hearing and the town has made a decision without consulting the public. This is a democracy, not a dictatorship,” he said.

“We have one chance to make this right. Put this on pause and go back to the original scope,” said McKenna, alluding to a 2017 scope of work plan by then Highway Superintendent Terry Billings calling for 5-foot shoulders for pedestrian and bicycle use.

He also suggested lowering the speed limit from 30 miles per hour to 20 mph, installing speed bumps and speed cameras.

Miner Street Road residents Brenda and Paul Preston also spoke. “I appreciate the road being redone but I have concerns about talk of narrowing the road,” said Brenda. “At the top of the hill by the cemetery cars are going super fast.”

“I wonder about the engineering end of this and how well this was planned out,” stated Paul.

Barbara Rogers also supported utilizing speed cameras and sug-

gested a two-way 6-foot pathway on one side of the road.

Deputy Town Supervisor James T. Smith agreed speed is an issue. “We’re damned if we do and damned if we don’t. We build a new road and there are complaints that traffic is going too fast. Reducing speed limits is not easy to do,” said Smith. “Enforcement is the only way. The day will come when there will be a camera.”

Toby Irven concluded the public comment by presenting the town board with a petition with 45 town athletes. Town Supervisor Mary Ann Ashley asked Irven to read the petition’s introduction.

“We, the undersigned participants in the various Stillman-Foote Race Series in Canton are concerned that Miner St. Roads are used by many types of transportation, motorized and non-motorized, including pedestrians and runners. We request the continuance of the speed limit at 30MPH on this approximately 1.0-mile long section of road from the Grasse River Bridge (GRB) to Taylor Park, and the maintenance of a 40 mph limit from Taylor Park to Jingleville Rd. We also petition for the completion of repaving of MSR (GRB to Taylor Park) with 10-ft driving lanes and 5-ft shoulders. Center line and fog line striping must be done and maintained. New informational signage is required.”

The board tabled the Miner Street project agenda item and discussed the matter in a closed session. No action was taken following the executive session, said Ashley.

Also, Smith reiterated his push to continue a 30-miles-per-hour speed limit all the way past the Jingleville Road intersection. That request has been forwarded to the St. Lawrence County Highway Department, who in turn will relay the speed reduction request to the state DOT.

State legislators have passed two gun control bills, with four more currently sitting in committee in the Assembly.

Of the bills that passed, both are now awaiting signature from Governor Kathy Hochul.

“Gun violence has gone beyond a critical point in our nation, turning everyday places into sites of unimaginable tragedy and cutting our children’s lives short. The measures we are taking today demonstrate our unwavering commitment to protecting our communities and ensuring that no parent, child, group or person has to live in fear of gun violence. By enacting these common-sense reforms, we are taking further significant steps towards creating a safer New York for all. I commend all the bill authors for their commitment to curbing gun violence and stopping needless tragedies,” Senate Majority Leader Stewart-Cousins said.

According to legislation, S.7392A and company bill A.7555A relates “to the creation of a public nuisance created by the sale, manufacturing, distribution, importing and marketing of firearms.”

Critics of the laws say it is an attempt to create a “chain of liability” that will allow anyone affected by firearm violence to file civil lawsuits against manufacturers, wholesalers, retailers and private parties involved in firearm manufacturing and distribution.

An additional bill, S.8589 and A.7717B relates to extreme risk protection orders. The legislation, which many say is an extension of the existing “red flag laws,” will expand the class of petitioners.

Under the legislation, the list of petitioners will be expanded to include school teachers, school guidance counselors, school psycholo-

gists, school social workers, school nurses, or “other school personnel required to hold a teaching or administrative license or certificate,

and full or part-time compensated school employees are required to hold a temporary coaching license or professional coaching certificate.”

Red flag laws have been under heavy scrutiny nationwide, with numerous lawsuits attempting to overturn such legislation. In New York State, at least three such lawsuits are still currently active, though none have yet reached the U.S. Supreme Court.

Four other bills are currently still in the works as well, though each faces hurdles in committee with the Assembly.

A 10-day wait period under S.4818 and A.5696 is one of the bills in question. The legislation passed the senate by a 42-19 vote along party lines.

Another hotly contested bill, S.8479 and A.9862 seeks to require payment card processors to establish a specific merchant category code for firearm dealers.

Similar legislation at the federal level was struck down last year as Republicans call the move an attempt to “blackball peaceable citizens.”

Gun rights advocates say the bill is “intrusive and a massive violation of privacy” that is “a type of data collection used to create registries and blackball gun owners” who may seek loans from banking institutions that also issue such cards.

A third pending bill, S.2086 and A.565, would establish a voluntary waiver of the right to purchase firearms, rifles and shotguns.

Though state officials are poised to move forward with the legislation, gun rights groups say that citizens can never waive a constitutionally guaranteed right. Much like an individual’s Fourth Amendment right that protects citizens from searches and seizures that are deemed unreasonable under the law, critics of the legislation say that an individual’s right to keep and bear firearms cannot be surrendered under a plea deal.

The fourth bill still pending in committee with the Assembly is new legislation that would require certification of instructors to be done by the Department of Criminal Justice..

Under the Concealed Carry Improvement Act (CCIA), which was passed in 2022, individuals seeking a concealed carry license are required to undergo an 18-hour course that includes 2-hours of live-fire training.

Instructors must meet specific requirements and carry certain certifications in order to teach the necessary courses, however if S.138A and A.8883A were to pass, instructors would have to meet an entirely new set of criteria as set forth by the DCJS beginning in 2026.

Gun rights groups say the legislation hangs in the balance with numerous lawsuits challenging such provisions in the CCIA, one of which includes Antonyuk v. James, a case that has ties to St. Lawrence County.

Antonyuk v. James is one that has been playing out even prior to Oct. 2022 when St. Lawrence County Attorney Steve Button began his work of counsel. St. Lawrence County legislators approved his involvement in the case, saying the lawsuit could have a direct impact on the rights of citizens in the county.

After months of back and forth and multiple writ of certiorari filings, Supreme Court Justices conferred on June 6 to decide whether the court will hear the legal challenge. There was no word as of press time if Justices will hear the case.

Fire destroys home on State Highway 72

PARISHVILLE – A fire damaged a home on State Highway 72 June 15, according to Potsdam fire officials.

Potsdam Fire Driver Mark Maroney said Parishville Fire, Parishville Rescue, County Car 36 responded to a blaze at 960 SH 72 around 12:41 a.m. and requested assistance from Potsdam Fire not long after.

Colton Fire was also requested to the scene with a tanker and Hopkinton-Fort Jackson was requested to Parishville Station to fill tankers.

The house was mostly consumed by fire; so firefighters began to set up a defensive fire attack, Maroney said in an online statement.

“Engine 80 set up a water supply by dropping porta tanks to supply

Parishville’s ETA-45 with water,” Maroney said.

He said firefighters on scene performed exterior scene work as the stairs and floors were burnt through inside the structure.

Firefighters ventilated the structure and removed the ridge cap of the roof. Maroney said Tower 5’s master stream was utilized to extinguish any hot spots that remained inside of the structure.

West Stockholm Fire and Hopkinton-Fort Jackson were also on scene with manpower.

Maroney said the cause of the fire is under investigation by St. Lawrence County Fire Investigation Team and New York State Fire.

Potsdam Fire was in service at 10:13 a.m.

Rt. 56 sewer meeting set

POTSDAM – Town residents along Route 56 north of the village, and any other town resident, had a chance Thursday to hear a comprehensive overview of where the Route 56 water and sewer districts currently stand.

Following numerous comments and questions by a handful of district residents at recent town board meetings critical of the project to establish water and sewer service to the Route 56 corridor, the town board decided to host a meeting to cover all the details as they stand right now.

The meeting was to be held June 20 at the Potsdam town hall. The meeting was also to be streamed on Zoom at <https://tinyurl.com/3y-8hu8z8>.

Formation of the districts to improve infrastructure and encourage development along the Route 56 corridor north of the village has been years in the making. Expected project costs however have ballooned leading several residents in the districts to raise concerns.

The price tag for building the water and sewer lines and reservoir for the district are projected at \$15 million. Around \$1 million has already been spent on design work from Canton-based firm C2ae from a \$2.5 million bond the town obtained to pay for the upfront work of the project.

To offset that expense, the town has secured about \$7 million in grants and is looking for more.

The districts were originally approved by a district vote, and residents there will be required to vote on the project again due to the greater than anticipated costs after the town secures bids for the work.

Residents raising concerns are mainly upset about the cost and want the town to pull the plug right now instead of moving forward. However, if the town were to do so, the residents of the district, around 80, would be on the hook to pay off the design work bill spent thus far, with no grant money to reimburse the expense.

Representatives from the firm C2ae that is handling the design work for the project will be presenting at the informational meeting and will be available to answer questions on the project.

Canton solar project closer to siting permit

CANTON – The EDF Renewables 240-megawatt solar center on the Rich Road in the Town of Canton is closing in on final approval.

Town Supervisor Mary Ann Ashley informed members of the town board on June 12 that findings from a May 9 public hearing on the Rich Road solar project leaned toward the issuance of a final Siting Permit.

“Based on comprehensive review of the Application, Staff respectfully recommends that the proposed Facility, together with the uniform standard conditions, site specific conditions and required compliance filings in the Draft Permit, would comply with Executive Law § 94-c and applicable provisions of the Office’s regulations at 19 NYCRR part 900, and avoid, minimize and/or mitigate, to the maximum extent practicable, potential adverse environmental impacts of the Facility. Accordingly, staff recommends a

finding that no substantive and significant issues requiring adjudication have been demonstrated in this case, and further recommends issuance of a final Siting Permit,” a filing on the New York State Office of Renewable Energy Siting (ORES) website reads.

Convening the May 9 public comment session were the Honorable Christopher McEneny Chan and Honorable Dawn MacKillop Soller.

Now that comments have been made and replies submitted back, the next step of the ORES process is for the Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) to review the permit file and case record to make what’s called an Issues Determination. In the Issues Determination, the ALJ opines on the comprehensiveness of the Draft Permit and if there are any outstanding substantive issues identified in submitted comments. If any substantive issues are identified, the ALJ will conduct oversight of a formal hearing process to review any specific issues. If the ALJ does not find any substantive issues, then their findings will

allow ORES to proceed with Permit issuance.

EDF Renewables’ Project Developer Jonathan Geldard said specific issues still need to be ironed out but was confident the permit process would move forward.

EDF Renewables hopes to be producing electricity sometime in 2027.

“An issued permit will come with many contingent requirements for the Project to satisfy prior to being given approval for construction. So after a permit is issued, the project will continue design and development of associated construction and operation plans for approval from pertinent stakeholders,” he added.

The majority of comments made at the May public hearing were directed to safety issues at the solar center and its 20-megawatt battery energy storage facility.

The project is located on over 1,700 acres along Rt. 11 south, stretching from the Eddy-Pyrites Road toward the village along Miner Street Road and along the Irish Settlement Road.

Potsdam child goes missing twice, found safe

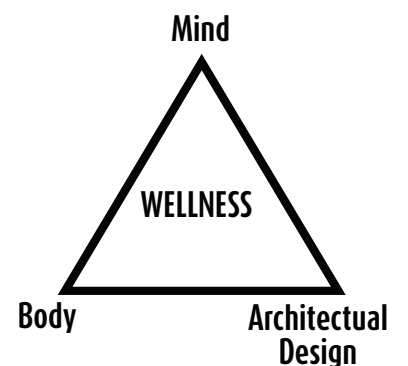

Potsdam library vote set

POTSDAM — Voting for the Potsdam Public Library’s proposed 2024-2025 budget to raise the tax rate 2.3% increase will be held Wednesday, June 26.

Election of four library trustees will also be held, with up to three write-in candidates possible.

Voting takes place from 12-8 p.m. in the library basement.

The budget vote is a proposal for an increase of \$14,113 over the current budget,

changing the tax rate from \$1.07 to \$1.09 per \$1,000 of assessed property value. For a \$100,000 home,

the increase would be \$2 for the year library officials say.

Current trustee Abigail DeCastro is running for re-election, but Mary Cabral and Tammara Madeja are not running again. All are for three-year seats.

In addition, voters will be asked to elect a trustee to a two-year seat to fill the remainder of a vacant position. However, other than DeCastro, no district residents filed nominating petitions by the May 20 deadline. As a result, the top three write-in candidates, if any, will fill three of the four trustee positions on the ballot.

involve a comprehensive redesign, modernization and enhancement of the downtown business district.

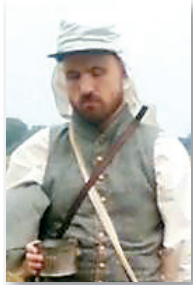
The Depot and Raymond streets block is also undergoing an overhaul, with some state DRI funding through various entities.

He became employed with Robinson's farm equipment until he entered the artificial insemination training course at Cornell University in 1958.

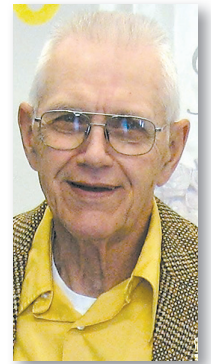

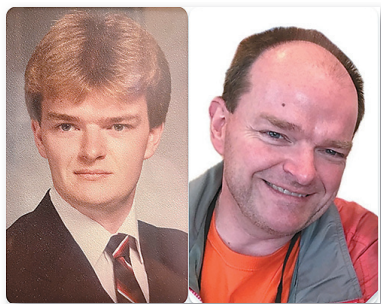

New law helps SLC recoup tax delinquent property costs

CANTON -- St. Lawrence County has approved amending a local law that will allow the county to recoup fees and expenses related to the acquisition and sale of tax delinquent properties.

St. Lawrence County Attorney Steve Button said the law was amended following the Tyler v. Hennepin County decision by the Supreme Court.

"This local law will help the county facilitate the tax delinquency process and recapture expenses or costs for cleanup, remediation of waste or general administrative expenses incurred with the process of acquiring and selling tax delinquent properties," Button said.

In that case, the Supreme Court unanimously held that a Minnesota statutory scheme deprived a property owner of her condominium's surplus equity in excess of her tax debt, calling the move a "classic taking."

With that ruling in place, states with similar statutory schemes, including New York, would be forced to remit the excess funds from the

sale of a tax delinquent property to the previous owner once the county was made whole on the delinquent taxes.

Button said the state then had to scramble to establish a response bill that would allow counties to be made whole for other fees and services incurred while handling the tax delinquent property.

New York is one of 12 states with a similar statutory scheme in place, all affected by the Supreme Court's decision in the Hennepin case.

Numerous lawsuits have also been filed and enjoined following the Supreme Court's decision as well.

Button said the new local law will allow the county to bill for permitted expenses, such as administrative expenses, environmental remediation expenses and similar expenses that may be incurred when the county takes over such properties.

He said in some cases the county would still be operating at a loss but by implementing the new law, it would lessen the burden in the end.

"If a property owner owed \$15,000 in taxes and environmental remediation cost \$30,000, the county would be owed \$45,000. If

that property, following remediation, were to sell for \$40,000 the county would still be down \$5,000," he said.

But that is far better than the alternative, he said.

When the county is forced to take action on a tax delinquent property, Button said that action wipes out any existing lien holders so the county has a clear title for the property.

If a property were to sell for a far greater amount than was owed, the excess would inevitably go to the formerly tax delinquent individual or estate.

Button said on average the county sends around 150 to 200 properties to auction each September.

That involves significant leg work and allocation of resources to ensure the properties are ready for auction.

"We start with anywhere from 1,700 to 3,000 properties though," he said.

Over the course of the spring and summer, most people pay off their taxes, while another group typically sets up a conference to work out a payment plan.

"Most of the properties that are left after that are typically abandoned," he said.

Of the 160 or so properties that the county offered a conference for, Button said a dozen actually set up a meeting.

"Nine were residential and three were corporate. When we hold a conference we try to make people aware of programs that may be able to help them. We don't want to take properties from anyone, so we try to work with them as much as possible and provide as much guidance as we can," he said.

The Application will propose a project to rebuild the existing 115kV transmission line from the Colton Substation in the Town of Pierrepont, St. Lawrence County, through the Towns of Parishville and Hopkinton, St. Lawrence County, to the Nicholville Substation in the Town of Lawrence, St. Lawrence County, New York.

During the course of the proceedings, alternate routes not included in the Application filing or affected by the proposed primary route may be offered without further notice by publication. In addition, the Commission may, without further notice by publication, approve a route for the line that traverses municipalities not presently affected by the proposed primary route.

DESCRIPTION OF THE PROJECT

National Grid proposes to rebuild and reconductor a portion of the existing 115kV T3170 Colton-Malone 3 transmission line for approximately 18.3 miles between the Colton Substation in the Town of Pierrepont and the Nicholville Substation in the Town of Lawrence (to be known as the "Colton-Nicholville 3 Project", or the "Project"). The Project is located in the Towns of Pierrepont, Parishville, Hopkinton, and Lawrence in St. Lawrence County. The Project is being undertaken to replace deteriorated structures, conductors, and shield wires in order to maintain reliable transmission service. The line utilizes primarily wood single circuit H-frame structures and is approximately 18.3 miles long.

The proposed line between Colton Substation and structure 3 will be rebuilt on horizontally configured H-frame type, single circuit, galvanized steel pole structures located on the existing centerline. The line between Structures 4 and 6 will be rebuilt on delta davit arm deadend, single circuit, single-pole (i.e., monopoles), galvanized steel pole structures located on the existing centerline. The remainder of the line between Structure 6 and the Nicholville Substation will be rebuilt on horizontally configured H-frame type, single circuit, galvanized steel pole structures located on the existing centerline with the exception of the portion of the line between structures 67 and 71. This portion of the line will be rebuilt adjacent to the existing centerline on new 100-foot-wide right-of-way.

The Project proposes to reconductor the existing line, which primarily features 336.4 kcmil 26/7 Aluminum Conductor Steel Reinforced "Linnet" conductor with double bundled 636 kcmil 26/7 Aluminum Conductor Steel Supported "Grosbeak" conductor. The existing 3/8" Extra High Strength 7-strand steel shield wire will be replaced with a single 3/8" EHS 7-strand steel shield wire and a 48-count Fiber Optic Ground Wire. In locations where only one aerial ground wire is installed, the 3/8" 7-strand steel shield wire may be terminated at structures on either end of the single aerial ground wire segment.

PROPOSED ROUTE

In general terms, the proposed route of the Project will traverse the Town of Pierrepont, Town of Parishville, Town of Hopkinton, and Town of Lawrence, all within St. Lawrence County. The proposed route will traverse approximately four miles within the Adirondack State Park. The precise route can be found in figures in Exhibit 2 of the Applicant's filing, which will be available for public inspection as described below.



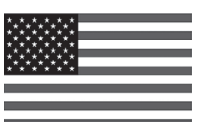

Trunks are not closets, so resist the temptation to use them to store golf clubs and other items that are better stored in a house or garage. Research has indicated that an extra 100 pounds in a vehicle can reduce gas mileage by about 1 percent.

Use cruise control when possible

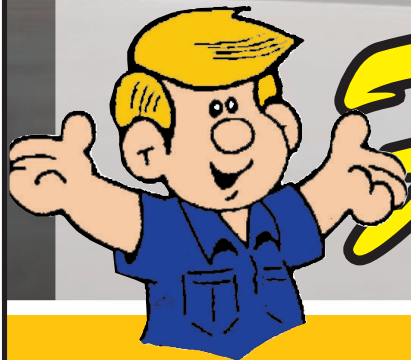

Tires important part of vehicle maintenance

Inflation has been a hot topic for several years, as the cost of everything from groceries to gas to housing has increased considerably since 2019.

Cars are no exception to that phenomenon, and anyone who has purchased a new car over the last half decade likely experienced some sticker shock when they started their search for a new vehicle.

Data from Kelley Blue Book indicates the average cost of a new car was \$37,590 in 2019. By 2023, the average cost had risen to \$47,899. That marks an increase of more than 27 percent in a four-year period.

Cars are indeed a significant investment, which underscores the importance of vehicle maintenance. Maintenance is more than just tending to what's under the hood. Tires also require drivers' attention, as aging, damaged tires pose a safety risk that also compromise vehicle performance. Tires are easily overlooked, but the following are four signs tires need to be replaced.

1. Worn tread: The automotive experts at AutoZone® note that tread depth is the most prevalent indicator that a tire needs to be replaced. Depth should be measured across the tread and around the circumference. If the tread is at or below 2/32 of an inch, the tire should be replaced.

2. Bulges, gouges or cracks: Geico® notes that a deflated tire bulges at the sides, and that can compromise the safety of everyone in the vehicle. AutoZone® says bulges occur when air gets between the inner liner and outer rubber layers, which can happen after hitting a curb or driving over a sizable pothole. A gouge or cut that is deeper than the outer layer of the tire also necessitates replacement.

3. Poor grip: Drivers may be able to feel certain tire problems, including poor grip, while driving. In such instances, tires may feel as though they are slipping. Drivers who feel their tires are slipping can test the tread and replace tires that are low.

4. Vibration: Vibration is another issue drivers may feel rather than see. And identifying the cause requires noting where the vibrations are felt. A suspension issue could be to blame if the steering wheel feels like it's vibrating. Either feeling should be brought to the attention of a mechanic immediately.

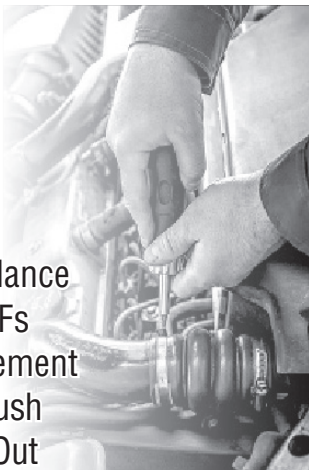

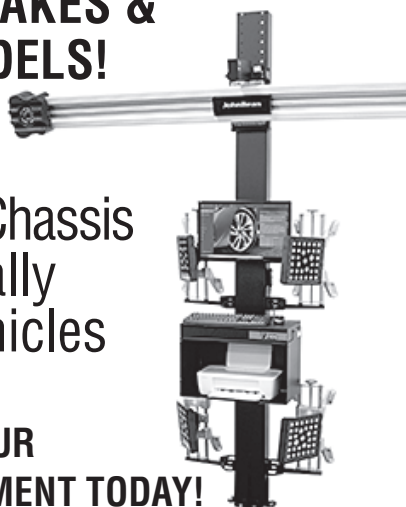

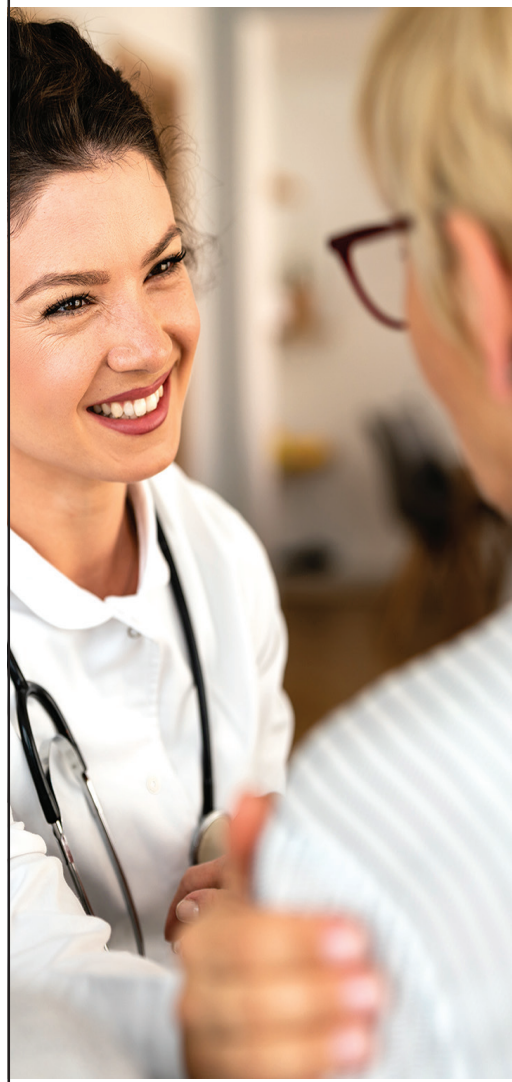
