Two remain on leave following city police shooting

OGDENSBURG -- Ogdensburg City police officer Daniel Hollister, who was shot by another officer has been released from the hospital and is recovering at his home, officials confirmed Monday.

Ogdensburg City Police Chief Mark Kearns identified Hollister, a seven-year veteran of the department as the injured party and shared that Jessica Rivers, a 17-year veteran of the city police force as the subject being investigated in what is believed to be an accidental shooting that took place at the city police Department June 20.

Kearns said that six officers and a civilian member of the force have been cleared to return to work following interviews conducted by St. Lawrence County Sheriff's investigators earlier today.

He said two officers still remain on administrative leave.

Details regarding the incident are very limited at this time with the Sheriff's office leading the investigation.

In a response to questions from North Country This Week St. Lawrence County Sheriff Rick Engle confirmed that the gun involved was a service weapon and both the victim and shooter were on duty at the time of the incident.

Engle said he did not believe the incident was captured on video.

Engle said that this week he expects to know if there will or not be charges related to the incident.

As for disciplinary action, Engle said he was not familiar with Ogdensburg Police Department's policies. Disciplinary decisions will likely be determined by the city. In addition to the sheriff's investigation, Kearns said an independent investigation is being conducted by the City of Ogdensburg and the Office of the Ogdensburg City Police Chief.

On June 21, Kearns offered a prepared statement explaining that an officer had been shot in what appeared to be an unintentional shooting. He said the victim was in stable condition and said the department's thoughts

Massena considers trash code change following complaints

MASSENA -- Two village residents voiced their frustrations over trash and recycling pickup in the village, saying Department of Public Works employees are destroying their bins and losing lids during pickups.

Village resident Ronald LeRoux Jr. said he has been forced to replace recycling bins and two lids after DPW crews haphazardly three them down after disposing of the contents.

LeRoux Jr. said on multiple occasions lids were lost or blew down the street because crews "failed to take a second to make sure the lid was put on right."

According to LeRoux Jr., he was forced to buy new bins after he was tagged as having bins that exceeded the village code maximum capacity of 40 gallons.

"I had to stop using my 45-gallon bins. I didn't complain, I went out and bought other ones to comply. But I've bought the smallest ones I could without being

City eyes solutions for basement sewage

OGDENSBURG -- "My basement flooded and it wasn't just water. It's sewage. Untreated, raw sewage."

That's what Ann Loffler told city council Monday. She and other residents near Patterson Street believe the problem was caused by a street expansion project that wrapped up in 2015.

The flooding took place following a major rain event that occurred Thursday night in the city. The problem isn't a new one. Over the years the city has heard complaints about flooding that's believed to have stemmed from the street expansion.

But on Monday city council took a lashing about the problem as residents described the expense and shared the details about just how bad the problem had become.

"I watched human feces float through my basement. When the water went down, I had, in plain English, one hell of a mess," she said.

Multiple residents referred to the problem as a health hazard.

Also speaking at the meeting was Marlene Shaver who lives on East David Street who says the problem has predated the

Waiting on grant for Schine Theater project

MASSENA — The village of Massena and the Massena Arts and Theater Association could be just days away from learning the fate of their Restore NY Grant application that would be the final piece of the puzzle to complete the Schine Theater restoration project.

Village Administrator Monique Chatland told village trustees at the June 18 board meeting that the news could come “at any time.”

Chatland told NCTW that the funding could be the final piece to get the project over the finish line, if all goes according to plan.

“There has been a lot of fundraising over the last few years but especially in the last year. A few big donations came through recently too. We’re hoping the Restore grant is the last, albeit a large, piece of funding needed to finish the project,” she said.

Chatland said that like many projects in the village, environmental factors like asbestos abatement play a big

role in the restoration.

“They’ve done a lot of work on the theater already. The marquee is done and ready to be hung up again. It looks great and now we’re trying to get the funding together for interior work. Things like asbestos abatement, electrical and other aspects of the project will be next on the list,” she said.

Chatland said MATA is also seeking \$640,000 from the New York Power Authority Northern New York Power Proceeds grant program. There has been no update on the status of that grant but officials hope to learn the fate of the application soon.

“It’s an exciting project, we’re very hopeful that the funding will all come together and work can continue on the theater,” she said.

Restore New York is a municipal grant program that pays for demolition, deconstruction, rehabilitation and reconstruction of vacant, abandoned, surplus or condemned residential, commercial or mixed-use buildings, state officials said.

City pool will be free to public all summer

OGDENSBURG -- Ogdensburg’s city pool will be free to the public thanks to a donation from the St. Lawrence Federal Credit Union.

The pool opened last week as a heatwave swept the county and was open at no charge to the public through Sunday June 23.

However, at the Monday city council meeting Mayor Michael Tooley shared news of the \$8,000 donation from the local credit union and offered praise to the administration and board of trustees.

It comes at a much needed time in Ogdensburg, which has struggled with financial woes in the wake of major projects, changes in the sales tax formula and delayed repairs on a number of city properties.

Although open and functional the city pool and surrounding facilities are dated and could use a variety of improvements.

One of which is to catch up with American Disabilities Act regulations.

Interim City Manager Andrea Smith said the city will be seeking a grant of up to \$5 million that could allow for a number of improvements including a bathhouse, new lockers rooms and potentially the addition of a splash pad.

The NY SWIM program would require a 20 percent

match, which would be about \$1 million if the city was awarded the max \$5 million.

The deadline for the grant is mid-July with an award announcement expected in August.

Ogdensburg City Council recently offered praise to city staff, especially the Department of Public Works for fast tracking repairs and getting the pool open in time for summer break.

The city has been working to provide a regular summer program without a recreation director. DPW Director Shane Brown and Interim City Manager and Planner Andrea Smith have been handling the duties.

Swimming Lessons

With help of the Ogdensburg Zonta Club the city will also be offering swim lessons Tuesday through Friday from 8-11:30 a.m. Lessons are available to children ages 4-14. Cost is \$30 per student and testing groups will be held July 2 and 3. Lessons will be held July 9 through Aug. 9.

Pool Parties

Pool parties are also being offered through the Recreation Department from 10 a.m. to noon on Saturdays and Sundays beginning June 22 and ending August 18.

The two-hour span would occur prior to public swimming opening at noon on the weekends. Cost is \$75 an hour.

Ogdensburg man shoots drone out of the sky

OSWEGATCHIE -- State police have charged an Ogdensburg man after he allegedly shot down his neighbor’s drone.

Police say Joseph H. Dishaw, 60, has been charged with second-degree menacing and fourth-degree

criminal possession of a weapon after the incident.

On June 18 around 6:06 p.m., troopers responded to Haggert Road for a report of a drone being shot down, according to police.

After an investigation, police determined Dishaw became angry when his neighbor started flying a drone over his property.

Dishaw allegedly used a shotgun to shoot down the drone in the direction of the victim in a threatening manner, police say.

He was arrested and transported to SP Ogdensburg for processing.

He was then arraigned in Town of Morristown Court where he was released on his own recognizance.

Massena DPW changing hours of operation

MASSENA -- The village of Massena Department of Public Works is moving to a Monday through Friday schedule, village officials say.

Mayor Greg Paquin informed the public of the change during the June 18 board meeting.

The change in schedule will begin July 3, with crews working Monday through Friday.

"Even though Wednesday is not a garbage day, that will be the primary day where they're going out to pick up the waste batch, your grass clippings and things like that," Paquin said.

Paquin said the crew's hours will be from 6 a.m. to 2 p.m., he said.

As for curbside pickup of long branches and grass clippings, Paquin said that pickup will begin in September as usual.

Branches, trimmings and clippings are picked up every April, May, September and October, village officials said.

Though the village code dictates the pickups, DPW Superintendent Marty Miller said he could authorize an emergency pickup if a larger scale weather event impacted a number of properties.

He said recent storms with high winds that took down tree limbs are a prime example of that.

Miller said that crews were making the rounds throughout the village to assist with cleanup following the recent storm, he said.

Others took it upon themselves

to dispose of the limbs themselves, noting the gate at the DPW site on South Main Street remains open.

Cleanup for village residents will be a topic in the coming weeks, with the traditional spring cleanup moved to Aug. 19 to 31.

Residents will be able to take items to the county transfer station on State Highway 420 during normal hours of operation, village officials said.

Paquin reminded residents that the station is closed on Wednesdays, however.

To take part, residents must pick up a voucher from the DPW department between 10 a.m. to noon and 1-3 p.m. during weekdays in July.

"You have to be able to show proof of village residency, whether it be a water bill, tax bill or something," Paquin added.

If an individual is unable to pick up a voucher during normal business hours, Paquin said they can call the department to arrange an alternative pick up.

This marks the second large change to spring cleanup in recent years after village officials opted to eliminate curbside pickup in 2019 in an effort to save money.

Village officials also opted last fall to implement paper bags for grass clipping pickups, with the requirement to switch being phased in this spring.

Officials have weighed possible zoning pickups or appointments to ease the process for village residents but nixed the idea after reviewing the possible cost.

Dairy speaks out on river contamination

NORTH LAWRENCE -- North Country Dairy officials say they are in close communication with the Department of Environmental Conservation and local council members as they attempt to identify the root cause of contamination in the Deer River.

The dairy plant has been under scrutiny in recent after county Legislator John Gennett and residents along the river vocalized concerns about contamination in the river that has killed fish and other wildlife over multiple miles of the river.

In a press release sent to NCTW, North Country Dairy officials say they are aware of the recent concerns regarding the water conditions within the proximity of the plant.

"We join in that concern, as the health of our shared environment is incredibly important to us—not just as a company, but as individuals who live and work here, raise our families here, and care deeply about this community," officials said.

They went further, saying they were in communication with community members, council members and the DEC about the issue.

"As a highly regulated facility, we strive to operate our plant in a way that not only complies with recommended practices but exceeds them. We are collaborating with the DEC

in its ongoing investigation while continuing an internal review of our operations to ensure they meet our high expectations and all applicable regulatory requirements," they said.

Officials say they are eager to understand the root cause of the problem and "once known, come together to find a solution to protect our shared environment."

"We are committed to transparency throughout this process and will continue to keep the public updated as our collective review progresses," they said.

DEC officials recently said they have identified the contamination in the Deer River but have yet to determine the cause.

According to a DEC spokesperson, the department continues to investigate the growth found in the Deer River and downstream of the hamlet of North Lawrence.

According to officials, recent samples of the material have determined the growth to be primarily *Leptomitius lacteus*, "a filamentous microorganism similar to a fungus."

"Dense growth like what was found in the river is typically an indicator of high nutrients and organic material in the water. Additional factors such as changes in temperature and other water quality parameters may also affect its growth," officials say.

According to the spokesperson, additional targeted water qual-

ity sampling is being conducted to determine the next steps and officials will continue to keep the community informed as the investigation continues.

County officials raised the alarm last month after numerous residents in Brasher, North Lawrence and the surrounding area complained of an increasingly foul stench, dead fish and lack of wildlife over a large stretch along the river.

St. Lawrence County Legislator John Gennett, who represents the Brasher and North Lawrence area, said he has had numerous constituents come to him about the water quality and the impact on aquatic life in recent weeks.

"If you want to see some hairy rocks, come to the Deer River," he said at the legislature's May 6 full board meeting.

"There are no fish left in the Deer River, nothing," he said.

The contamination has also drawn the ire of local fishing promoter Don Meissner, who called the Deer River a "hidden gem" of the north country.

Meissner said he has also been in touch with the state Department of Environmental Conservation.

"They said they would start their research to sort out what the cause of the contamination is," he said.

Meissner said the "white globules floating down the river" are "extraordinarily alarming."

Collecting ticks at Nicandri

MASSENA — Nicandri Nature Center crew are collecting ticks for a New York State community science project out of Cornell Cooperative Extension.

The project is being conducted in St. Lawrence County and in the southern regions of New York State to understand where different tick species are present in the state and track their expansion.

Tick collection is from June 16-June 29.

Nicandri Nature Center is one of many teams that signed up around

the state to help collect ticks. Individuals can offer to collect too.

The project is specifically looking for lonestar ticks and Asian long-horned ticks to gauge spread in the state, but all ticks found will be listed in the final results.

Most of the 13 ticks found at the nature center their first day were tiny nymphs.

Ticks were put into test tubes and lint roller sheets and mailed for species and pathogens testing.

Nicandri Nature Center is funded by the New York Power Authority.

Public defecation charge

OGDENSBURG -- An Ogdensburg man was accused of defecating in public June 22, according to city police.

John G. Wunder, 44, was cited for defecating in public at Riverview

Towers at 10:30 a.m., officers said.

The charge stemmed from an investigation following a complaint by the local housing authority.

Wunder was cited and released, officers said.

Felony drug charge leveled

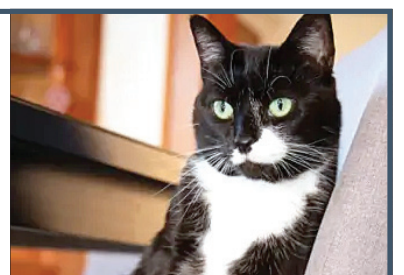
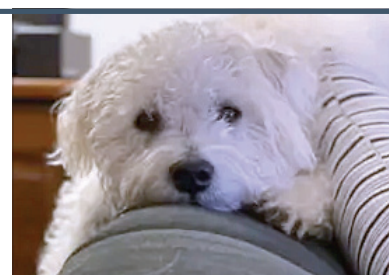
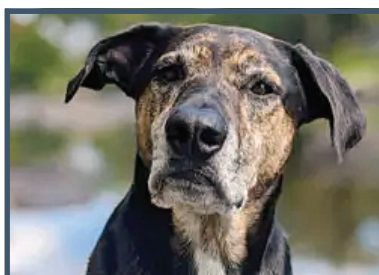
MASSENA — Two St. Lawrence County residents were charged with drug possession early this morning, according to state police.

Countdown to deadline for Community Fund applications

MASSENA — The clock is ticking for businesses in the village to submit applications for the Core of the Community Fund, which can be used for a number of improvements.

Village Administrator Monique Chatland told trustees that the final day to apply is July 15 and a large chunk of grant funding is still available.

"We've really seen a lot more interest in the program this last round. So, I encourage people who intend on applying to do so sooner rather than later," Chatland told trustees during the June 18 board meeting.

Chatland told NCTW it was normal for businesses to apply near the end of the application period but wanted to encourage businesses to apply as soon as possible so they did not miss the deadline.

"The money they can receive through this program can change the face of their business. We hope all eligible businesses who want to apply do so by the July 15 deadline," she said.

Those who apply now are also eligible for up to \$100,000, double what applicants in the first two rounds were able to receive.

Chatland said the criteria change was to ensure the funds were fully expended on eligible businesses to help them grow. Funding will be

approved only after all applications received on or prior to July 15 are reviewed, she said. Business owners who wish to apply will only have to contribute a 25% match as well, she said. That's down from the previous required 50% contribution business owners had to put up towards their projects.

In order to apply, a business must reside within the Downtown Revitalization Boundaries, which encompasses a large portion of the downtown within the village.

The village received a \$10 million DRI award in Dec. 2021, which officials say they hope will help revitalize the downtown. As part of the funding, eight projects were approved to receive a portion of the grant, including the \$500,000 Core of the Community Fund that the village oversees.

Chatland said the first two rounds of the fund have been a success, with \$187,000 having been awarded thus far. She said those funds have been used to assist with the Schine Theater marquee restoration, a kitchen expansion and new sign at the Gristmill Brewery, along with funding for equipment that will assist a new coffee shop to open soon.

Culvert work delayed over paperwork issues

MASSENA — A Center Street culvert project has been delayed due to right-of-way documents but Department of Public Works Superintendent Marty Miller said he's confident the project will be started by the end of the year.

Miller provided an update to board members during the regular meeting held June 18, saying the documents are needed to move forward with the project but one party has yet to sign off on them.

The delay in documentation

comes after trustees previously approved compensation for the residents who will be affected by the project, what officials said at the time would be six parcels owned by three different property owners.

Compensation would be \$500 each for parcels one, four, five and six, and \$850 for parcels two and three, trustees previously said.

"There's really not much changing in their property," Miller previously said.

He noted that the compensation, which will come from a \$1 million state grant, would be for the inconvenience that would arise from the

work being conducted.

The project, which has been in the works for several months, will include a culvert replacement, along with the installation of two new utility poles and relocation of overhead lines. That work will be completed prior to the culvert work.

Miller previously said that gas services for two buildings will also be relocated prior to culvert work.

Engineers had previously proposed three options to the village, which included doing nothing, rehabbing the existing culvert or installing an entirely new one.

In the end, Miller recommended full replacement to ensure no structures would be damaged if the culvert failed. He also previously said that rehabbing the culvert would also prove costly and would likely be a short-term fix.

Officials do not have a specific timeline to begin the project but had hoped work would be under way by the end of June at the latest.

Deadline to apply for the last round of Massena's Core of the Community grant funding is July 15.

that sort of thing first took place, but from my limited research it sounds like there is at least some possibility that it started more than 1 million years ago.

I don't know too many things that have endured so long and remain in such high regard, but I know it predates all known lan- guages, religions and societies as we know them today, which is pretty amazing.

I think part of the magic of the fire is that when I'm sitting near one I often reminisce on all the fires I've enjoyed before. It's also something my oldest ancestors probably did as well, which is wild to think about.

Summer's in full swing now and will be gone before you know it. So please don't waste too much time inside watching television because I assure you, you'll make better memories sitting around the fire.

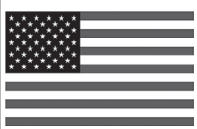

Patterson Street project. She said water comes up through the toilet and the shower shooting up "like a geyser."

She said that in more recent years, the water problem turned into a sewage problem.

"There is feces and toilet paper and all that down on my floor that after I suck the water up I've got to suck that up and throw it out," she said.

Andy West, a Franklin Street resident said thousands of dollars of workout equipment has been damaged by sewage backup problems. She also said that she's spent thousands of dollars on cleanup of raw sewage. She said her basement has been dry for 17 years and only recently began having issues.

Her husband Eric West said he'd reached out to the Department of Environmental Conservation about the problem.

He said that he was led to believe that the DEC forced the city to raise weirs that led to the flooding issues, but said following the conversation that doesn't appear to be the case.

"Their requirement is 85% treated water to 15% untreated water is what is acceptable to be released," he said.

He said that it appears it was the city's recommendation, not the DEC's, but acknowledged that perhaps they were raised to meet that requirement, which is something council confirmed later in the meeting. Interim City Manager Andrea Smith said the city was not yet prepared to present an action plan, but said that speaking with engineers and perhaps the Development Authority of the North Country would be a good starting point.

Department of Public Works Director Shane Brown said that there are issues, but said he does not have a solution yet. He said that he would speak with the DEC to seek more information.

City Councilor Dan Skamperle wanted action taken immediately. He suggested adjusting the weirs, but his fellow councilors and Smith said that something like that would require a professional opinion and involve the DEC.

"None of us up here are engineers," Councilor Michael Powers said.

Brown said the problem is awful for the homeowners and is bad for the city too. He noted that the city just invested \$40 million in a water treatment plan that nearly flooded in the recent rain event.

Skamperle said he considers the situation an emergency and needs to be addressed as quickly as possible.

The city discussed bolstering a program that reimburses residents for some costs associated with a black flow installation. However, without knowing the costs or best solutions, the council opted to wait before enacting something without more information.

Powers said he'd like to see if that could be done in time for the July meeting. That's something Mayor Michael Tooley and Councilor Jennifer Stevenson agreed on.

Although no formal action was taken, the council was clear that addressing the flooding was a priority.

destroyed," he said.

"Now, all of a sudden, after using it for two years, my recycling is no longer being picked up out of that," he said.

Mayor Greg Paquin explained that many residents "were tagged" after one individual felt singled out when DPW crews stopped picking up their trash because the bins were too large.

"Unfortunately for some reason,

the garbage men on their own decided to start tagging a few. Then, an individual complained and forced everyone to tag everybody else," Paquin said.

Paquin said he received a number of complaints in recent weeks, with some residents saying that in some cases bins were not only tagged, but trash and recyclables were left in the bin as well.

"It's unfortunate. I wish they would have been doing this from the word go. It created some strong opinions," he said.

Paquin said he could only apologize for the inconvenience and damage caused to resident's bins, acknowledging how expensive they are to replace once, let alone three or four times like LeRoux Jr. has had to do.

"I'm fine with having to buy them. But, there has to be some accountability for these men to take care of stuff that's not theirs," LeRoux Jr. said.

In an effort to save residents money and aggravation, he asked Paquin if it would be possible to amend the village code to allow for bins up to 45 gallons, like those he was using prior to being tagged.

He said the recyclables would not be that heavy, telling board members that the extra five gallon capacity would not push the bins to exceed the maximum allowable weight. Paquin said the board will look to amend the code in the future, while also saying that he and DPW Superintendent Marty Miller would have a conversation over the matter.

"We'll have a chat with everyone. They know everyone is not happy. So, all I can do is apologize," Paquin reiterated.

Fellow resident Terry DuBray went a step further, saying he would refuse to purchase new cans if the "pattern of carelessness" were to continue.

Though two residents attended the meeting to raise concerns about the destruction of their bins, Trustee Ken McGowan said he has had similar experiences but sought to fix his bins in an effort to save money.

"I've had to tie a rope to my lid so it didn't go blowing down the street. I also use zip ties to hold my bins together. They do work, just a thought," he said.

In response to the situation,

village trustees will hold a public hearing on July 16 at 5:30 p.m. to consider changing the size of the garbage cans, Paquin said.

"Specifically, I'd like to see it go up to 45 gallons. I think that's the one that a lot of people have. Some people probably already have that one out," he said.

Trustees say if the public sentiment is to up the volume allowed, an amendment could be made to the code at the following month's meeting.
