Grant paves way for Massena fabric plant

MASSENA -- A Canadian fabric company with a pilot plant in Italy is one step closer to setting up shop in the former St. Lawrence Centre Mall in Massena with the New York Power Authority Board of Trustees approving a \$1.2 million award.

According to Governor Kathy Hochul's office, Natural Insulation Products America will receive \$1.2 million as part of the Northern New York Power Proceeds Fund.

NYPA economic developer Patricia Wilson previously made the recommendation that NIPI receive a \$1.2 million allocation as part of round 12 of the Northern New York Economic Development Fund allocations.

As part of the agreement, she said Natural Insulation Products America Inc. would spend more than \$6 million on the project.

"Natural Insulation Products plans to establish commercial scale production in the St. Lawrence Industrial Complex, formerly the St. Lawrence Centre mall, in order to better pursue the North American market," she said.

The company has already completed its proof of concept stage and successful market entry from its pilot plant in Italy, she said.

According to Wilson, Natural Insulation Products are hoping to pursue the North American market by establishing a foothold

Don't dispose of discarded syringes, call police instead

OGDENSBURG -- Ogdensburg City Councilor Storm Cilley said residents who encounter discarded syringes in the city should contact Ogdensburg Police Department.

Cilley said he's received a number of complaints recently from residents regarding discarded hypodermic needles and other drug-related items found in their yards.

"I don't know what we can do as far as action on it, but I've seen several complaints about needles and drug paraphernalia being left

in people's yards," he said. "I'd encourage them to contact the PD rather than clean it up themselves if they come across them."

Mayor Michael Tooley thanked Cilley for raising the concern, but there was no further discussion on the matter.

Since 2021, Ogdensburg has seen an uptick in the number of homeless persons in the city. That problem has been accompanied by a growing number of reports of needles, drug paraphernalia and feces found in public places.

Those issues and vandalism at local parks led the city to implement curfews at the city's parks and greenspaces. The city also

saw an uptick in small crimes at the same time the police department saw cuts, though some of those positions have since been restored.

Attempts were made to bolster a neighborhood watch program, but those plans haven't seen the level of participation the city had hoped.

The city has had some good news recently that could help some people find permanent homes in Ogdensburg.

A nearly \$10 million grant will allow STEP by STEP Inc. to bring 42 permanent housing units to

Massena man says village needs to crack down on absentee landlords

MASSENA -- Village of Massena officials have attempted to crack down on absentee landlords for months now but a village resident is now calling on the board to step in and address tenant and landlord issues in his neighborhood.

At a recent meeting of the board of trustees, Donald Lucas asked the board to set up a public comment period to address tenant responsibilities.

Lucas, who lives on Richards Street, brought in photographs of "less than favorable tenants" in his neighborhood who are negatively impacting living conditions in the area.

"Since the closing of General Motors, a lot of people have abandoned their properties and we have unscrupulous landlords coming up and buying these properties. They have absolutely no consideration for the degradation and the blight they're bringing into the communities," he said.

Lucas said the properties near his home have historically been family homes.

"Families would come in, they would raise their children and then another family would come in," he said.

But things have changed over the last 20 years or more, Lucas said.

Lucas told board members of a number of instances in which properties were not properly main-

tained, including one instance in which a 14-foot-long, 3-foot-wide section of metal roofing blew off.

He told trustees the roof went unprepared, despite the metal roofing being improperly installed to begin with.

Lucas said the metal roofing was only tacked on to the ridge, allowing it to blow freely in the wind. "It was making all kinds of noise 24 hours a day," he said.

Lucas said in April and May it became insufferable with the high winds experienced throughout the north country.

"This went on 24 hours a day. My neighbor works midnights. He was up all day long. My wife and I are retired. We sleep at night, but we were up all night long," he said.

According to Lucas, code enforcement said the issue was to be corrected in 30 days, however he felt it should have required an immediate fix to negate both the safety concerns and noise issues.

"A section even blew off into my back yard," he said.

Lucas said the tenant began to repair the roof on day 28.

"This was 28 days of not being able to sleep at night. There's sections of the roof that are still missing," he said.

Lucas also touched on another incident he reported that involved a piano sitting in a neighbor's yard for weeks.

"It wasn't a nice piano. It was just a piece of junk, just sitting in the yard," he said.

He said eye sores like that need to be removed.

Lucas said garbage has also been an issue for a multiple unit dwelling that had 18 garbage cans.

He told trustees the cans were overflowing with garbage since residents do not recycle.

Lucas showed trustees photos of garbage bags piling up next to garbage cans just an hour after the garbage trucks went by.

"Now I've got skunks and apparently I guess we're starting to get rats. But, we have all sorts of feral cats in our neighborhood. So, the garbage is an issue," he said.

Across the road is another apartment structure where the same tenant is carrying out a dismantling business that should require a permit, Lucas said.

Lucas said the tenant is likely

collecting scrap metal as part of a business, which itself is unsightly.

"I don't think there's one person here that would allow their next door neighbor to do that. I've run a business in this town for 34 years, and some of my clients had to come to my home, and I was ashamed to have them drive through my neighborhood," he said.

At the request of Major Greg Paquin, Lucas provided the photos to Code Enforcement Officer Aaron Hardy to help build a case against the tenant.

"That's evidence that can be used to turn properties into nuisance problems. Declaring a property as a nuisance property is more than just code violations. It's also, being very general here, how many times the police department shows up," Paquin said.

Though Lucas is seeking action as soon as possible, Trustee Ken McGowan cautioned, saying that in many cases individuals have 30 days to take corrective action for a code violation.

McGowan suggested that the village may need to take further action, pointing to a new apartment code requirement passed last year.

"Maybe we need to take it a step farther. I know there's other places on Beach Street with this constant problem. So, maybe we need to have more of a presence over there, and maybe we need to start taking some of the property owners to court," he said.

McGowan said the property owners would then have to explain to the court why they are not properly maintaining the property.

But Lucas said the larger issue is that many property owners want to use rents to pay off properties as fast as possible "to put money back in his pocket."

"But, he has absolutely no consideration for the neighborhood. That landlord has no responsibility for maintaining his property or having any supervision over the people that live there," Lucas said.

Until action is taken, Lucas said the problem will persist and continue to get worse.

Village officials reassured him they would address the situation, with code enforcement officers expected to investigate in the very near future.

No formal action was taken.

Mayor thankful local prisons will stay open

OGDENSBURG – Following an announcement that Great Meadow Correctional Facility in Washington County and Sullivan Correctional Facility in Sullivan County would be shuttered, city council expressed gratitude to state officials.

According to legislation, both prisons are to be closed in the next three months.

Gov. Kathy Hochul has been given the power to close as many as five prisons, but at this time there is no indication additional prisons will be closed this year.

In recent years Ogdensburg Correctional Facility was shuttered and remains vacant and off the tax rolls with no indication with a reuse plan on the horizon.

Though the state has continued to keep the heat on in hopes of maintaining the structural integrity of the facility.

In St. Lawrence County, state and municipal governments remain the area's number one employer.

On Monday Mayor Michael Toolley read the following statement to offer his appreciation to the state in recognizing the quality of St. Lawrence County's remaining prisons.

"Ogdensburg City Council thanks Gov. Kathy Hochul and Department

of Corrections and Community Supervision Daniel F. Martuscello and their respective administrations for recognizing the excellent work by administrators, security and civilian staff at Riverview Correctional Facility in its implementation of the DOCCS mission statement. That being to provide sound rehabilitation for incarcerated individuals to the many in education and vocational programs with a high degree of professionalism, integrity and efficiency.

Ogdensburg city council also expresses its appreciation for the continuing support of North Country Prisons and in particular Riverview Correctional Facility by New York State Sen. Mark Walczyk and New York State Assemblyman Scott Gray.

"Councilor (Michael) Powers, Councilor (Dan) Skamperle, City Manager Fonda Chronis and I will continue to serve on the St. Lawrence County Prison Task Force as it continues its efforts to develop ideas for protecting and advocating for Gouverneur Correctional Facility and Riverview Correctional Facility." 



City tables Dirty Gringo lease deal

OGDENSBURG -- City residents hoping to see the Dirty Gringo open a concession at the Dobisky Center will have to wait a little longer.

On Monday City Council tabled a resolution that would have allowed the Dirty Gringo owners to rent the facilities following a public hearing.

That's because there weren't enough councilors present and able to vote at the meeting to pass it.

Mayor Michael Tooley said that leasing agreements require 2/3 votes of the city council, which would be six affirmative votes to pass the resolution.

Councilor Dan Skamperle was not present and councilor Jennifer Stevenson attended the meeting

remotely due to a family emergency. Because the notice of her remote attendance did not appear on the agenda, she was able to participate, but not vote in the meeting, according to state law.

The resolution would allow the city to rent the facilities to Murray and Jenna Graveline who operate the Dirty Gringo restaurant.

According to the agreement the city would rent the facility for \$500 per month.

That's the same price that had previously been offered to Nathan Griffith, who had been approved to rent the property from the city, but was not able to meet the timeline to get started, according to city officials.

The lease is proposed to last through Dec. 31, 2026 and will be

on the agenda at the next meeting.

City Councilor Jennifer Stevenson offered an apology to the business owners for any delays the action might cause for them.

The Dobisky Center previously housed 'The Window' eatery.

Prior to that, the city had struggled to keep a regular operator since its construction.

Despite its location and negotiable price, it remained vacant from 2013 until 2021.

The kitchen is 389 square-feet in size and includes basic commercial kitchen equipment and appliances such as refrigerators, freezers, grill, fryers and a stove.

The Dirty Gringo is a 'fresh Mex' restaurant that opened 2011 at 104 Ford Street.

SLC legislators largely oppose new gun dealer signage mandate

CANTON -- A majority of St. Lawrence County legislators say they are not in favor of legislation that would require gun dealers and gunsmiths to post signage that warns potential buyers of the dangers of firearms.

In legislation passed along party lines before the end of the legislative session, state lawmakers passed a bill that would require dealers to post signs in their shops to warn potential customers about the potential risks associated with firearms.

The sign, which must be "conspicuously located" within the shop must state the following:

"Access to a weapon or firearm in the home significantly increases the risk of suicide, death during domestic disputes, and/or unintentional deaths to children, household members and others. If you or a loved one is experiencing distress and/or depression, call the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline at 988."

But the new legislation, which is still awaiting Governor Kathy Hochul's signature, did not sit well with Legislator Larry Denesha.

During the July 29 finance committee meeting, Denesha called the legislation "arbitrary and capricious."

Denesha told his fellow legislators that he spoke with a number of constituents, many of whom said the new law and required signage would do nothing to curb violence and suicide.

"This legislation is not designed to enhance safety at all, it's just another affront to our Second Amendment way of life," Denesha said.

He said he would not support the legislation that he felt was just another attack on the Second Amendment.

While Denesha was firmly opposed, Legislator Margaret Haggard said she did a great deal of research on the matter, citing a study from the Harvard School of

Public Health.

Haggard said the study showed a direct correlation between firearm ownership and an increased rate of suicide.

"I found several studies on this (correlation between firearm ownership and suicide), for what it's worth," she said.

Haggard said that the studies may not persuade other legislators either way on the legislation but said she wanted to note that firearm prevalence in the home leads to higher rates of suicide.

"The inverse is also true, less guns means a lower suicide rates," she said.

But Legislator Rick Perkins, who requested to be added as a cosponsor to the resolution, pointed to the Surgeon General taking a stand against cigarettes years ago, saying the warnings issued about cigarette use leading to cancer and other ailments did not deter tobacco use.

Legislator Nicole Terminelli said the same could be said in a number of cases, including airbags in vehicles.

"This is an educational component more than anything," she said.



Terminelli commented that the warning signs would be just like those in other facets of life.

"Warnings like this are prevalent and are to protect the liability of the person selling the...McDonalds cup with hot coffee," she commented.

She said it "is everyone's responsibility to educate each other."

Legislator William Sheridan said when he saw the county resolution he immediately opted to support it, saying the state was just attempting to "chip away at our Second Amendment."

"I've never met a tax I liked and never seen a mandate I liked. Shall not be infringed, that's what you have to remember about it. It's pretty simple."

Legislator Joseph Lightfoot questioned how the regulations would be enforced and at what cost to taxpayers.

Lightfoot said enforcement would mean "sending people out, to go to gun shops and gunsmiths" to ensure the signs are posted.

"Gun dealers already have a lot of signage, I doubt another sign will do very much," he said.

Lightfoot said the state needs to

inform the counties how the mandate will be enforced, saying "for lack of a better term, a whoopee law like this, this is just ignorance."

"It just seems like an awful waste of money," he said.

The resolution was supported largely along party lines, with Terminelli and Haggard voting against the resolution. Legislators David Forsythe and Rita Curran were absent from the meeting.





Water chestnut pick planned

HEUVELTON -- Volunteers are needed to assist a removal effort of an invasive plant called water chestnut (*Trapa natans*) on the Oswegatchie River in the Village of Heuvelton, on Monday, Aug. 5 between 11 a.m. and 4 p.m.

There will be a guided paddle to manually collect sparse populations of water chestnut on the River between the Village of Heuvelton Boat Launch and the Eel Weir State Park.

Water chestnut is an invasive

aquatic species that has environmental and economic impacts. They grow thick dense floating mats that shade out native aquatic vegetation, impede outdoor recreation, and reduce shoreline property values; the hard, pointy seeds of water chestnuts can puncture vehicle tires or injure feet if stepped on. If not managed, the infestation of water chestnuts on the Oswegatchie River can grow and easily spread to connecting waterbodies, like Black Lake.

MLF Bass Pro Tour set for finale in Massena

MASSENA — The Major League Fishing (MLF) Bass Pro Tour is set to wrap the 2024 season of the Bass Pro Tour next week, Aug. 6-11, in Massena with the seventh and final event of the year — the Minn Kota Stage Seven at the St. Lawrence River presented by Humminbird.

The six-day event, hosted by the Town of Massena, will feature a field of 78 professional anglers, including superstars like Ott DeFoe, Jacob Wheeler, REDCREST 2024 Champion Dustin Connell and reigning Fishing Clash Angler of the Year (AOY) Matt Becker. They'll be competing for a season-long purse of \$3.9 million — including a top prize of \$100,000 at the St. Lawrence River — and valuable AOY points in hopes of qualifying for the General Tire Heavy Hitters all-star event and REDCREST 2025, the Bass Pro Tour championship.

The tournament will showcase the MLF catch, weigh, immediate-release format, in which anglers catch as much weight as they can each day, while also feeling the pressure and intensity of the SCORETRACKER® leaderboard. The tournament will be live streamed on MajorLeagueFishing.com, the MyOutdoorTV (MOTV) app, and Rumble.

"We are pleased to host Major League Fishing again this year for the 2024 Bass Pro Tour," said Don Meissner, Director of Tourism for the Town of Massena. "This promises to be one of the most exciting events that the town of Massena has had the good fortune to bring to the folks in northern New York. Our partnership with MLF and their key personnel continues to provide great benefit and promise to the community and all of the North Country."

The St. Lawrence River has hosted hundreds of MLF (and FLW) tournaments over the years, but this event will mark just the second time that the venue has hosted the Bass Pro Tour, MLF's top circuit. When the Bass Pro Tour last visited Massena in 2021, pro Jacob Wheeler of Harrison, Tennessee, caught a final-day Championship Round total of 35 bass weighing 129 pounds even to win by an impressive 28-pound, 10-ounce margin over his nearest competitor, pro Jeff Sprague of Wills Point, Texas.

"I was able to spend three days there at the St. Lawrence River before it went off limits, and the fishery is just incredible," said pro Spencer Shuffield of Hot Springs, Arkansas, who won the 2022 Tackle Warehouse TITLE championship event on the St. Lawrence River

and will be among the 78 competitors. "That place has so many 4-to 5-pound smallmouth. I expect the weights to be really big — I'll be interested to see the numbers after we wrap up, but I'm willing to bet the average fish that is weighed in averages 3-12 to 3-15."

With so many accolades on the line — Fishing Clash Angler of the Year, REDCREST 2025 and Heavy Hitters qualifications, requalification into the 2025 Bass Pro Tour — the final event on the St. Lawrence River is sure to be a nail-biter.

"It's just an awesome fishery — one of my favorite places in the country, no doubt," Shuffield went on to say. "I think on the final day, you're going to need to catch at least 140 to 160 pounds to have a chance. It's going to be a smallmouth smash fest, and a great event to wrap up the season."

Anglers will launch at 7:30 a.m.

ET each day from the Massena Intake Boat Launch, located at 1415 State Highway 131 in Massena. Each day's General Tire Takeout will be held at the launch, beginning at 4 p.m. Fans are welcome to attend all launch and takeout events and also encouraged to follow the event online throughout the day on the MLFNOW!® live stream and SCORETRACKER® coverage at MajorLeagueFishing.com .

In addition to the competition, numerous events held in conjunction with the tournament will be taking place around the North Country during the week. On Friday, Aug. 2, pro Dave Lefebvre and his band, The Band 814, in conjunction with Fish Massena, NY presents: The Break Every Chain Live Concert Series, a powerful night of praise, worship and testimony at the Massena Town Beach. Additional Bass Pro Tour anglers scheduled to appear at the concert include Alton Jones, Jr., Alton Jones, Sr., Nick LeBrun and Ott DeFoe. Gates open at 7:30 p.m., and the concert starts at 8 p.m.

On Monday, Aug. 5, the MLF pros will participate in the Johnson Outdoors Clean Earth Challenge, from 4 to 5 p.m. at the Massena Intake Boat Launch. The National Wildlife Federation and Johnson Outdoors teamed up to launch the Clean Earth Challenge in 2022 to inspire people to get outdoors and take simple conservation actions to help preserve and restore the outdoor spaces we all love. The pros will spend their time collecting trash and debris from the Massena Intake Boat Launch and surrounding areas, with a post-clean up weigh-in taking place to determine how much trash and debris was collected during the challenge.

On Saturday and Sunday, Aug. 10-11, from 1 p.m. to 6 p.m. MLF welcomes fans of all ages to visit the Massena Intake Boat Launch for the MLF Watch Party. Fans can watch the pros live on the MLFNOW! big

screen, enjoy free food, enter to win hourly giveaways and cheer on their favorite pros. Live music will begin each day at 4 p.m. The first 50 kids 14 and under will receive a free rod and reel from Pure Fishing each day. The final 10 Championship Round Bass Pro Tour anglers will be on hand at the trophy celebration on Championship Sunday to meet and greet fans, sign autographs and take selfies.

The Minn Kota Stage Seven at the St. Lawrence River will feature anglers competing with a 2-pound minimum weight requirement for a bass to be deemed scorable. The MLF Fisheries Management Division determines minimum weights for each body of water that the Bass Pro Tour visits, based on the productivity, bass population and anticipated average size of fish in each fishery.

The 2024 Bass Pro Tour features a field of 78 of the top professional anglers in the world, competing across seven regular-season tournaments around the country, for millions of dollars and valuable points to qualify for the annual General Tire Heavy Hitters all-star event and REDCREST 2025, the Bass Pro Tour championship, set for April 3-6, 2025 on Lake Guntersville in Huntsville, Alabama.

The 39 Anglers in Group A compete in their two-day Qualifying Round on Tuesday and Thursday — the 39 anglers in Group B on Wednesday and Friday. After each two-day Qualifying Round is complete, the anglers that finish first through 10th from both groups advance to Saturday's Knockout Round. In the Knockout Round, weights are zeroed, and the remaining 20 anglers compete to finish in the top 10 to advance to Sunday's Championship Round. In the final-day Championship Round, weights are zeroed, and the highest one-day total wins the top prize of \$100,000.






