## Tick Tock owner wants to aid in Canton's downtown revitalization

CANTON – The new owner of Canton landmark wants to be part of a pending downtown revitalization in the village of Canton.

Will Pena purchased the Tick Tock from the Cassera family, closing on the 9-11 Hodskin Street property on July 12.

"I'm excited about this project. My dream is to make this happen and bring this property back to life," stated Pena, who owns McDuff's Pub in Potsdam. "I have a passion for real estate and historical rehab. I like this block because of what the village has done with parking and the electric charging stations."

His aspirations in the 4,000-square-foot downstairs area include offering a kitchen serving lunch and dinner, a lounge area and a space to host sports teams and other gatherings. He eventually wants to have an outside deck area. He also plans to continue the tradition of a college hangout at night.

Upstairs, Pena wants to convert the two three-bedroom apartments into four one-bedroom units. The price tag of the entire project is around \$1.2 million, said Pena.

Pena is seeking funding

through the village's \$4.5 million NY Forward grant.

"Hopefully I'll be chosen. I'm hoping to meet all the thresholds," he said. "Without the NY Forward funding will really delay the progress and I'll have to do it in segments," Pena noted. The deadline to submit a project pro-

posal for NY Forward funding is Wednesday, July 31.

A long-time physical therapist, Pena said the keys to a successful business is assembling a good team based on trust and consistent customer service.

## Potsdam adds new economic developer

POTSDAM – The village has hired a new part time economic developer.

David Thurlow of Potsdam, formerly of Montana, was provisionally appointed by the village board of trustees Monday, July 29.

Thurlow will work part-time with the anticipation he will take over the village Planning and Economic Development Director position from current director Fred Hanss, when Hanss retires next spring.

The appointment was approved after a brief executive session at a special meeting Monday.

Thurlow will work 24 hours a week at a salary of \$50,000, from Aug. 5, 2024 to May 31, 2025. According to the resolution, the position will be reevaluated during the next year's budget development process in the spring and a decision made to continue Thurlow's employ by May 1, 2025.

Thurlow has run the firm, Thurus Consulting, specializing in providing entrepreneurship and business development support for



universities and municipalities, since 2017.

He has also worked previously as a program manager for Launch NY, obtaining and managing multi million grant awards and assisting more than 300 startups. Thurlow has been active in various professional capacities with entrepreneurship development in New York City and Toronto and other cities.

He and his wife Aiko and their children reside in Stockholm having relocated here several years ago to be closer to family.

## Kids Online Safety Act backed by Canton mother passes in Senate

CANTON – One week ago Sen. Chuck Schumer honored a request from 20 families -- including a Canton mother -- to hold a vote on the Kids Online Safety Act (KOSA) and the Children and Teens' Online Privacy Protection Act (COPPA).

On Tuesday, July 30, the Senate Majority Leader reported that the state Senate passed both bills.

Schumer said the bipartisan bills are the most robust federal tech reforms for children in decades, and will institute a set of safeguards, accountability, and

privacy measures that shield children in New York and across the country from the harms created by social media companies and other online platforms.

"I've met with families across New York and the country whose children and teens have been subjected to online harassment, bullying, and other harms. KOSA and COPPA will be perhaps the most important updates to federal laws protecting kids on the internet in decades," said Senator Schumer. "This means banning targeted advertising to kids, providing parents with tools to protect their kids, enhancing privacy protections and giving

families more options for managing and disconnecting from these platforms. I've heard from so many parents whose kids, sadly, took their own lives because of what happened to them on social media. To their everlasting credit, these parents, instead of cursing the darkness, lit a candle. They turned their grief into grace, and we worked together to help get this bill over the finish line, so that what happened to their families doesn't happen to any others. To the parents and families that fought for this change, thank you. And that's not from me as a

## Potsdam hires new treasurer

POTSDAM — The village has hired a new treasurer to fill the vacancy left by the promotion of previous treasurer Isabelle Gates-Shult who was appointed as the village administrator.

Erica Leonard will be taking over the duties of the post.

“Erica is a seasoned professional with a wide array of knowledge in business and financial management. Her years of experience have equipped her with a comprehensive skillset in financial oversight, budgeting, and ensuring responsible stewardship of resources,” said a statement from the village announcing the appointment.

“Born and raised in the area, Erica possesses a genuine commitment to community engagement. Ms. Leonard will be an asset to our village, and we look forward to her contributions in moving Potsdam forward,” the statement said.

Leonard was previously the general manager of the St. Lawrence County mall in Massena from 2017 to 2022 and worked as the general

manager for University Suites prior to that. She has also worked as a general manager for the Johnson Newspaper Corp., Tarbell Management Group LLC, All American Pub and Olympia Hospitality.

Leonard will be overseeing the village’s day to day financial operations working under the auspices of the administrator.

Leonard was hired as the treasurer for a one-year term, with a probationary period to be reviewed after 6 months, with a salary of \$60,000, Gates-Shult told North Country This Week.

She takes over the position from Gates-Shult who was promoted to village administrator earlier this spring.

“We are so pleased to welcome Erica as our new treasurer for the Village of Potsdam. Ms. Leonard has already impressed administration and the board with her knowledge and expertise in finance and budgeting in just a short time,” Gates-Shult said. “Erica’s self-motivation, initiative and passion for what she does has enabled her to delve right into her role, and we look forward to continue moving Potsdam forward in a positive direction.”

## Village seeks water line service signups

POTSDAM — The engineering firm handling the village’s lead service inventory project is having difficulty getting residents to sign up for the inspection.

According to a David Powers from the engineering firm Barton & Loguidice at the village board meeting July 15th, about 250 properties had signed up thus far out of 1400 to have the inspection done after an initial mailing to residents and businesses.

“So we’re only at about 18 percent from that initial mailing,” Powers said.

The engineering firm Barton & Loguidice, with offices in Watertown and other areas, is the lead firm on the lead inspection and is contracting the lead inspection portion out to national company Electro Scan Inc.

“ElectroScan said when those mailings first went out, we had about 100 people sign up in the first few days, and then as you can expect it just slowly tapered off to where we are only having a few

people sign up each week,” Powers said.

As of the second week in July the firm had completed scans at 122 residents, Village Administrator Isabelle Gates-Shult told the village board at the meeting July 15.

“Sixty-four were complete with no lead that was detected. And then 58 were abandoned due to the crew’s inability to access the lateral which was due to the presences of bonnet valves,” Gates-Shult said.

For the locations that were abandoned, ElectroScan will schedule a time to bring in their plumber to return to the house and replace the bonnet valve, the administrator said.

“The cost to replace the valve is the responsibility of ElectroScan and is included in their inspection price,” she said.

The project, required by U.S. Environmental Protection Agency lead rules, seeks to identify lead sections from the service pipe lines feeding residences. Many of the lateral service lines installed prior to 1986 are expected to contain some amount of lead in the solder, fixtures or pipes.

The sections identified can then be removed by the village in a second phase of the project over the next decade as required by the EPA.

The village has 10 years for full compliance with the removal of the lead laterals.

The village was awarded a grant for just over a million dollars to pay 100 percent of the inventory project. B&L is subcontracting the work to Electro Scan, which will use electrical resistance to analyze the material used in the village’s roughly 1400 service laterals, looking for lead. The scan will take less than one hour and require no digging.

However, the village needs more residents and business owners to sign up with the village to get the scan complete.

Powers told the board that he and village officials are working on potential ideas to get village residents and property owners engaged to sign up.

“The first thought, it’s an easy one, is door hangers,” Powers said. “Most people might have that piece of paper on their counter or in their junk drawer and the door hanger might remind them to get it out and sign up. Fred (Hanss, village planner and economic development director) had some other ideas, including potentially getting an article in the paper, maybe doing a radio spot,” Powers said.

Powers said the homes that don’t sign up for the initial inventory document, due in October to the EPA, get marked as “unknown.” Powers said the federal government requires this preliminary inventory be completed by October.

“Most communities aren’t where you are. They are going to have 99 percent ‘unknown’ unless they know from a recent project,” the engineer said.

## Canton composting program receives boost from Canton Community Fund

CANTON – The composting program continues to receive financial support to maintain a collection site in the Village of Canton.

The Canton Community Fund, at its June 27 meeting, approved a \$2,000 grant for the food collection program.

This money, along with a gift from the First Presbyterian Church in Canton, will foot the bill for the remainder of 2024.

Collection service is provided by NoCoCompost (NCC), a community composting business based south of Canton.

NCC is a joint effort of two Canton residents, Cory Vinyard and Greg Todd. Vinyard grew up on his family's dairy farm on the edge of Canton where he now practices rotational grazing for his Dexter beef cattle and Dorset sheep.

Todd has been a resident of Canton since 2022.

He previously resided in Brooklyn, N.Y. where he led a community garden and was a member of the Brooklyn Solid Waste Advisory Board for 10 years.

He is a member of the Canton United Methodist Church and the Canton Sustainability Committee.

“To continue funding for the years ahead, NCC with the help of Compost for Good, a Saranac Lake based composting support group, is applying for a USDA grant intended to fund food scrap diversion. If successful, the grant would cover collection for two years and also allow NCC to expand its service area and improve its composting operation,” said Todd in a press release announcing the Canton Community Fund grant.

NCC has been picking up food scraps at the Bend In The River site on a weekly schedule since September.

The large 2 cubic yard dumpster previously at the site has been replaced with four 35 gallon sealed totes.

At the request of the village trustees, NCC locks all containers and only those providing contact information are allowed access.

The intention is to provide the Village with more information about who is using the service and hopefully reduce contamination. NCC also weighs the amounts collected weekly to track usage and

maintains the site on a frequent basis.

The service is free to all village and town residents and is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The program is actively seeking additional users.

## Stec supports prison reuse

Senator Dan Stec is calling on his fellow state lawmakers to support legislation that would ensure closed state prisons can be repurposed instead of sitting dormant.

In a recent press release, Stec was critical of the failure to advance prison reuse amendments which would have allowed municipalities affected by prison closures to repurpose the facilities.

“I’ve said for years that the state government must enact a reuse plan for dormant prisons. But I’ve done more than talk about it; I’ve acted. This year, my constitutional amendment that would allow for New York State to sell the closed Camp Gabriels facility passed the state Senate. It’s not the first time my amendment has passed the Senate, however. Since taking office in 2021, the Camp Gabriels amendment has passed each year I’ve been in office,” he wrote.

Despite the legislation passing the Senate again, Stec said Assembly members failed to advance the bill.

He noted an “11th hour push from the governor’s office” that would lead to a constitutional amendment

to allow the sale of three shuttered prisons, however it “failed to surface in either chamber of the legislature.”

Stec pointed to Governor Hochul’s decision to delay congestion pricing in New York City as a likely reason for the amendment’s failure to surface.

According to Stec, it is almost a certainty that the legislature will reconvene this year to address the MTA situation again.

“At that time, the Assembly should do the right thing and pass the Camp Gabriels amendment for the first time. That way, we can move one step closer to finding a new use for the facility that helps it become an economic driver, rather than blight. Or, the Legislature should take up the three-prison amendment the governor’s office has proposed, but not submitted,” he said.

Stec said if neither option comes to fruition, “the governor and Assembly Democrat leaders owe the North Country an explanation as to why they refuse to move forward with these or any substantive prison reuse plan.”

Stec’s statement comes as the Governor’s office has signaled more closures will be announced in the near future.

Roland graduated in 1969 from Massena High School, received an associate's degree from Jefferson Community College in 1971, then a bachelor's degree from the State University College (SUNY) Potsdam in 1973. He married Colleen Ann Harris in August 1975, and the couple had two children. The marriage ended in divorce.

Roland was an elementary school teacher at Brushton-Moira Central (BMC) for more than three decades, and he continued as a substitute for years thereafter. Over the years, he also intermittently served as director of the Brushton-Moira Summer Recreation Program. A good-natured prankster and born storyteller, Roland also performed as an amateur thespian with local theater companies.

Athletics were a large part of Roland's life, starting with the freshman grid squad Football team at Massena Central in 1965. While at Potsdam, he participated in Clarkson University's Cycle Club.

In 1986, as the cross-country coach at BMC, the Program hosted the Section 10 championship for the first time in school history, Realizing state-class program strength under Roland's tutelage. As founder of the BMC "Biddy Ball" program, he actively sought new ways to improve community programs.

For many years, he worked with

Roland coached AAU basketball as well as woman's junior varsity and varsity Panther basketball at BMC from 1986-2001,

including a "great-eight" run at the state championships.

The All-Northern Athletic Conference honored him as Division II "Coach of the Year" in 1989. Many of the teams that Roland coached have been inducted into the BMC "Hall of Fame," and he himself was recognized with that honor as well.

In retirement, Roland continued coaching a wide variety of sports teams.

Surviving are two daughters, Jessica Moquin (Christian Vischi), Earlville, NY and Gabrielle Scott (Paul), Malone; two sisters Betty Anne Yost, Rochester, NY and Marilyn Choudry, Springfield, ILL.; one brother Raoul, Massena; two grandchildren, and several nieces and nephews.

# Oral rabies vaccine airdrop for wildlife populations to begin in early August

CANTON – St. Lawrence County is preparing for its annual oral rabies vaccine (ORV) distribution, an essential initiative. ORV baits will be distributed by air throughout St. Lawrence County from August 2 through August 6.

Bait distribution in New York is part of a nationwide, cooperative effort by USDA to prevent the westward spread of rabies in the eastern US. This will distribute approximately 622,800 oral rabies vaccine bait in the St. Lawrence Valley Region.

The bait resembles a fast-food ketchup package, includes a vaccine wrapped in a plastic packet that is dipped in fish oil and coated with

fish-meal crumbles to attract target wildlife. The vaccine has been proven safe when given to more than 60 species of mammals and birds.

Residents who come in contact with wildlife vaccine packets can call the NYSDOH Rabies Information Line (888) 574-6656 with questions or concerns.

- Do not disturb vaccine packets. Most packets are eaten within four days; almost all baits will be gone within a week. If packets are not found and eaten, they will harmlessly dissolve and the exposed vaccine will become inactivated. If you must move a vaccine packet, wear gloves or use a plastic bag or paper towel to pick it up. Place any damaged baits in the trash; throw intact baits into a wooded area or other raccoon/wildlife habitat.

- Residents should Wash Hands Immediately if they come into direct contact with the vaccine or packets, then call the NYSDOH Rabies Information Line at (888) 574-6656.

- Supervise children's outdoor activities during bait distribution and for one week afterward.

- Confine dogs and cats indoors and observe leash laws during the bait distribution interval and for one week afterward. This will increase the probability of wildlife vaccination and decrease the chance of pets finding the bait.

- Baits and vaccines are not harmful to domestic animals. However, an animal may vomit if it consumes several baits.

- Residents should not risk being bitten while trying to remove bait from your pet's mouth.

For more information, call the St. Lawrence County Public Health Department at (315) 386-2325.

Always notify your medical provider or SLCPHD if you are bitten by a pet or a wild animal. Additionally, keep your pets up to date on their rabies vaccination, and make sure your home is bat proof.

SLCPHD will be hosting free rabies vaccination clinics throughout the remainder of the year.

## St. Lawrence Health gives advice for day at the fair

GOUVERNEUR – Going on rides, eating all kinds of goodies, looking at the animals – there’s nothing quite like a day at the fair. A bit of planning ahead and heeding some tips can make this special day even more enjoyable.

Stay hydrated by drinking plenty of water throughout the day and minimize sugary or limit alcoholic beverages that can lead to dehydration,” Dr. Hadian recommended. “Choose comfortable shoes for walking and standing, opt for lightweight, breathable clothing to stay cool and consider bringing an umbrella for shade or light rain.”

For many visitors, going from station to station to indulge on edibles they only get this time of year is a main attraction of the Fair. Whether it’s fried dough, cotton candy, nachos or something else, the smell of favorite Fair foods is often too good to resist.

Dr. Hadian suggests pacing your time between rides and eating can make your Fair experience even better.

“After eating, wait at least 30 minutes before going on any intense rides to prevent nausea or discomfort,” Dr. Hadian advised. “Enjoy light snacks rather than heavy meals if you plan to go on rides frequently. Continue drinking water, but avoid excessive amounts right before going on rides.”

And of course it wouldn’t be a Fair experience without the rides! Some of us prefer slower paced rides, while others are up for anything. If you or someone in your party does, however, go on a ride that was more than they bargained for and they become scared, be kind to them.

The Medical Tent being supported by SLH will be available for anyone who is not feeling well while at the Fair. Some common symptoms may include:

- Mild Dehydration: Dry mouth, dizziness, fatigue
- Minor Injuries: Cuts, bruises, sprains and other minor injuries
- Allergic Reactions: Insect stings or certain foods

## Case against SLC dismissed in federal court

CANTON -- A federal judge has dismissed a lawsuit against St. Lawrence County that was filed by former attorney Michael Kelsey, who was convicted of sexually assaulting a child and attempting to assault another during a Boy Scout camping trip to Cranberry Lake in 2014.

Victims told investigators that Kelsey assaulted one boy and attempted to assault another during the trip.

Kelsey previously filed a lawsuit in the Southern District of New York, United States District Court, in an attempt to strike at the constitutionality of his sex offender status, which was overturned on appeal in November.

As a result of the dismissal, Kelsey could potentially appeal the decision, however court documents state “that any appeal from this Order would not be taken in good faith, and therefore in forma pauperis status is denied for the purpose of an appeal.”

With in forma pauperis status

denied, Kelsey would be subject to paying all fees associated with an appeal and would not have filing fees and other related expenses waived.

St. Lawrence County Attorney Steve Button said the county was “pleased with the outcome” and will continue to litigate the matter in court if Kelsey were to appeal.

“We feel we will continue to be victorious in this matter and we aim to ensure that the rule of law is enforced in a civilized society,” Button told NCTW.

Button said the county takes such matters very seriously, noting that Kelsey was in fact convicted of multiple felonies by a jury of his peers.

“It’s fairly well known now that Kelsey was in fact a Dutchess County legislator at the time of his charges, as well as a federal litigator. He has since been disbarred but is still able to represent himself,” Button said.

Kelsey was charged with sexual abuse first-degree: person incapable of consent- physically helpless (D felony), attempted sexual abuse first-degree: person incapable of

consent- physically helpless (F felony) and forcible touching: forcible touching other person’s sexual/intimate parts (A misdemeanor).

He was subsequently convicted on May 12, 2016.

Kelsey was originally sentenced to an aggregate prison term of seven years to be followed by 10 years of post release supervision following his conviction.

The punishment issued in 2016 was then held up on an appeal, according to court documents.

Kelsey was released from prison in May 2022 but prior to his release, a risk assessment instrument was submitted by the Board of Examiners of Sex Offenders that classified him as a risk level two sex offender with a sexually violent offender designation.

He is still listed as a level two sex offender with a sexually violent offender designation, according to the state database.

Kelsey previously tried to reargue the designation but was denied “based on a failure to provide notice of motion to the People,” according to court documents.

## Massena woman killed in Norfolk crash

NORFOLK – A Massena woman was killed in a two-car motor vehicle accident on Wednesday, July 24 on Rt. 56 in the Town of Norfolk.

New York State Police reported that Marlise A. Bond, 45, died from injuries sustained in the accident at approximately 3:57 p.m.

A preliminary investigation

determined a black 2019 Nissan Versa, operated by Bond was traveling north on State Route 56 when she crossed the centerline into the southbound lane striking a gray 2017 Dodge Caravan operated by driver Roger A. Bevins, 36, of Potsdam, and passenger Shawn S. Felix, 27, of Norfolk. Bevins and Felix

were transported to Canton-Potsdam Hospital for non-life-threatening injuries. Bond was pronounced deceased on the scene, according to police

State Police were assisted by Norfolk Fire and Rescue and the St. Lawrence County Medical Examiner.

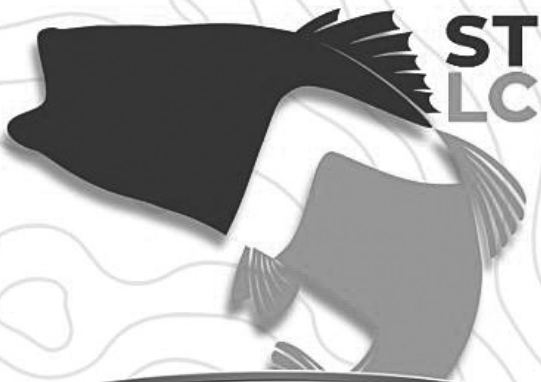

# SLC lawmakers largely oppose new gun dealer sign mandate

CANTON -- A majority of St. Lawrence County legislators say they are not in favor of legislation that would require gun dealers and gunsmiths to post signage that warns potential buyers of the dangers of firearms.

In legislation passed along party lines before the end of the legislative session, state lawmakers passed a bill that would require dealers to post signs in their shops to warn potential customers about the potential risks associated with firearms.

The sign, which must be "conspicuously located" within the shop must state the following:

"Access to a weapon or firearm in the home significantly increases the risk of suicide, death during domestic disputes, and/or unintentional deaths to children, household members and others. If you or a loved one is experiencing distress and/or depression, call the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline at 988."

But the new legislation, which is still awaiting Governor Kathy Hochul's signature, did not sit well with Legislator Larry Denesha.

During the July 29 finance committee meeting, Denesha called the legislation "arbitrary and capricious."

Denesha told his fellow legislators that he spoke with a number of constituents, many of whom said the new law and required signage would do nothing to curb violence and suicide.

"This legislation is not designed to enhance safety at all, it's just another affront to our Second Amendment way of life," Denesha said.

He said he would not support the legislation that he felt was just another attack on the Second Amendment.

While Denesha was firmly opposed, Legislator Margaret Haggard said she did a great deal

of research on the matter, citing a study from the Harvard School of Public Health.

Haggard said the study showed a direct correlation between firearm ownership and an increased rate of suicide.

"I found several studies on this (correlation between firearm ownership and suicide), for what it's worth," she said.

Haggard said that the studies may not persuade other legislators either way on the legislation but said she wanted to note that firearm prevalence in the home leads to higher rates of suicide.

"The inverse is also true, less guns means a lower suicide rates," she said.

But Legislator Rick Perkins, who requested to be added as a cosponsor to the resolution, pointed to the Surgeon General taking a stand against cigarettes years ago, saying the warnings issued about cigarette use leading to cancer and other ailments did not deter tobacco use.

Legislator Nicole Terminelli said the same could be said in a number of cases, including airbags in vehicles.

"This is an educational component more than anything," she said.

Terminelli commented that the warning signs would be just like those in other facets of life.

"Warnings like this are prevalent and are to protect the liability of the person selling the...McDonalds cup with hot coffee," she commented.

She said it "is everyone's responsibility to educate each other."

Legislator William Sheridan said when he saw the county resolution he immediately opted to support it, saying the state was just attempting to "chip away at our Second Amendment."

"I've never met a tax I liked and never seen a mandate I liked. Shall not be infringed, that's what you have to remember about it.

It's pretty simple."

Legislator Joseph Lightfoot questioned how the regulations would be enforced and at what cost to taxpayers.

Lightfoot said enforcement would mean "sending people out, to go to gun shops and gunsmiths" to ensure the signs are posted.

"Gun dealers already have a lot of signage, I doubt another sign will do very much," he said.

Lightfoot said the state needs to inform the counties how the mandate will be enforced, saying "for lack of a better term, a whoopee law like this, this is just ignorance."

"It just seems like an awful waste of money," he said. The resolution was supported largely along party lines, with Terminelli and Haggard voting against the resolution. Legislators David Forsythe and Rita Curran were absent from the meeting.

# Clarkson awarded \$65,000 for recycling tech work

POTSDAM -- FuzeHub recently awarded seven collaborative projects through its Jeff Lawrence Innovation Fund, including one to Clarkson University and KLAW Industries.

Clarkson University and KLAW Industries are partnering with FuzeHub to bring a new recycling technology leveraging artificial intelligence to market in the Southern Tier.

KLAW Industries is expanding to alternative recycling markets to source waste glass for use in high-performance, low-carbon concrete projects with the New York State Department of Transportation and the City ofinghamton.

The partnership builds on federal investment by the Environmental Protection Agency to overhaul the recycling industry and demonstrates FuzeHub's ability to help scale industry-changing technologies.

FuzeHub is a not-for-profit organization providing small to medium-sized manufacturers with guided access to an extensive network of industry experts, programs, and resources to solve

business growth challenges.

The Innovation Fund, consisting of more than \$1 million annually, supports a set of activities designed to spur technology development and commercialization across New York State and is made possible through funding and support from Empire State Development's Division of Science, Technology and Innovation (NYSTAR) and the U.S. Economic Development Administration (EDA).

As part of the Fund, FuzeHub offers Manufacturing Grants to New York State not-for-profit organizations, including higher education institutions, that propose innovative projects in partnership with a New York State small to medium-sized manufacturer. ## Bent Beam Brewery plans upgrades

CANTON – The Bent Beam Brewery in Canton will now have a fresh look.

Original plans to open the establishment in the former McCarthy's Furniture Barn, 41 West Main St., were squashed when contractor Northern Tier Contracting (NTC), Gouverneur, reported to the Village Board that the building was unsafe.

Gary Hammond, a partner and chief financial officer of St. Lawrence Suds, said there are plans to construct a new building with further details to be announced at a later date.

A groundbreaking ceremony was held May 9 but since then major problems with the historic structure have been discovered.

The change in plans warranted the passage of a Type II SEQRA action by the village board at its July 17 monthly meeting.

"The St. Lawrence Suds project proposed for the property at 41

West Main Street in the Village of Canton does not meet or exceed any applicable Type I thresholds nor is it deemed likely to have a significant adverse impact on the environment. The replacement project involves work on the same site and footprint and is deemed as not subject to SEQRA review," the resolution reads.

A report from the engineering firm Tisdell Associates cited problems with the foundation and existing walls.

The report, dated May 24, indicated the existing building foundation was in very poor condition and only extended 12" ± below existing grade, which does not provide adequate frost protection; the interior structure had previously been damaged by a fire. The extent of fire damage was much more extensive than we had anticipated; the main structure had been extensively damaged by water intrusion causing the structure to be compromised; it appears that the building walls have begun to fail and that the

structure is not safe; and it does not appear that the jacking and raising the existing structure to install a new foundation is practical.

"Based on the above observations, it is my opinion that the structure is not safe and should be demolished," the report by Aaron B. Jarvis, P.E., stated.

The report also noted NYC has installed temporary supports to prevent the building from collapsing.

The Type II SEQRA resolution also noted that "St. Lawrence Suds will construct a replacement structure in the same location along with new electric service and hook-ups in the village's sewer and water infrastructure. Renovations are to be completed per plans and specs are subject to review of the Village Planning Board. When finished there will be approximately 3,660 square feet of space for the brewery, restaurant and serving areas on one floor."

The Bent Beam Brewing project received \$610,000 in Restore NY funding in December 2022.

Leader, or a Senator, but as a dad and grandpa.”

Mary Rodee, a Canton mother who lost her 15-year-old son to suicide after the teenager was targeted online, was included in that letter. Her son, Riley K. Basford, was a sophomore at Potsdam Central School, when he committed suicide in 2021.

“Given leadership has stated they want the Kids Online Safety Act (KOSA) and the Children’s Online Privacy Protection Act (COPPA) to move together out of the Senate, the two bills have been stitched together,” said Rodee of Schumer’s announcement last week. “No substantive changes have been made to the bill text. They’re more technical in nature in order for the two bills to be combined together.”

“I’m optimistic. I really hope that we can get this done before August recess. Biden said in his last two state of the union addresses that we needed to do something about the youth mental health crisis fueled by social media. I hope we can get this passed in the senate before their August vacation and

get it going again in the house to be signed this fall,” Rodee said. “If the Senate passes KOSA, that will put enormous pressure on the House to do the same. Schumer is committed and he has done what he said he would do as far as getting some of the last minute objections.”

She said there are continued objections by Ted Cruz and Rand Paul but Cruz was one of the biggest showboaters at the hearings so I hope he keeps his word.

“More kids are dying just like Riley. We can’t let this keep happening,” Rodee remarked. “Social media platforms are designed in ways that expose kids and teens to harmful content that often leads to a negative body image, self-harm and many other mental health disorders. They are purposefully addicting children for profit.”

“We are grateful for your co-sponsorship and prioritization of this landmark legislation,” the parents wrote in a letter to Schumer dated June 18. “We know it is an issue you are deeply committed

to, because you met with many of us on May 9 and again on June 5 to reiterate your support for our cause. We were encouraged at that first meeting by your promise to bring KOSA to the floor and by your subsequent commitment to hold a vote by June 20. We write to you today with a single question, because June 20 is fast approaching: Will you keep your word and bring this critical legislation up for a vote?”

Schumer has been an advocate in the fight against social media and online excesses.

“Children and teens have been subjected to online harassment, bullying, and other harms for far too long. This legislation will require social media companies to design their products with the safety of kids and teens in mind, bans targeted advertising to kids, provides parents with tools to protect their kids and gives families more options for managing and disconnecting from these platforms,” said Senator Schumer. “Over the past few months, I’ve met with families from across New York and the country who have gone through the worst thing a parent could endure – losing a child. Rather than retreating into the darkness of their loss, these families lit a candle for others with their advocacy to better control social media and online excesses. I am proud to work side-by-side with them to better protect our children online and on social media.”

According to the Schumer press release, the Kids Online Safety Act (KOSA) will create more requirements for platforms to create a safe online environment for kids and teens. The bipartisan bill will:

Require platforms to give kids and teens the option to protect their data and opt out of algorithmic recommendations.

Allow parents to control how their kids’ information is used and require platforms to create a dedicated channel to report harmful behavior.

Obligate platforms to prevent and mitigate dangers to minors by limiting the promotion of harmful behavior such as suicide, eating disorders, substance abuse, and sexual exploitation.

Require independent audits to research how social media platforms impact kids’ and teens’ mental health and well-being.

COPPA strengthens online privacy protections for kids and teens. The bipartisan bill builds on the original Children and Teens’ Online Privacy Protection Act signed into law in 1998 which cre-

ated protections for children under the age of 13, and will:

Prohibit internet companies from collecting data from users under the age of 17 without their consent, increasing the age from COPPA’s legislation.

Ban advertising that targets kids and teens.

Revise the requirement established in COPPA that obligates platforms to protect kids and teens if they have “actual knowledge” of their age, instead covering all platforms that are “reasonably likely to be used” by kids and teens.

Require companies to allow the deletion of data for kids and teens when possible.

Establish a “Digital Marketing Bill of Rights for Teens” that limits how data is collected from teens.

Create a Youth Marketing and Privacy Division at the Federal Trade Commission.

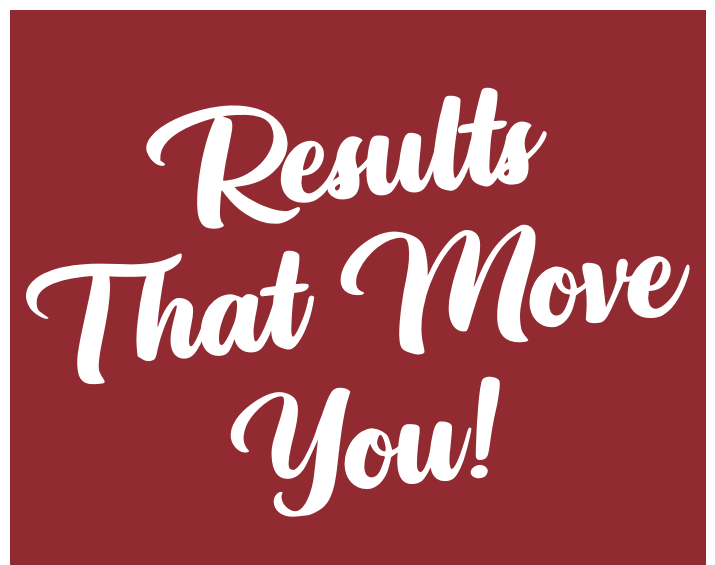

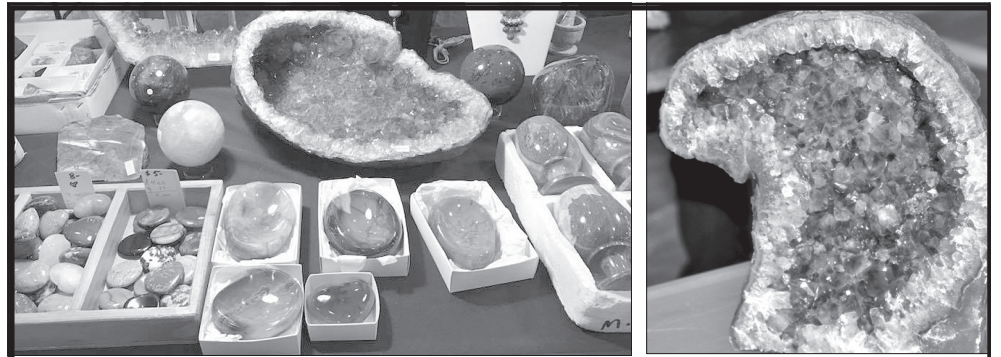
