Many new faces at MCS

Students will be greeted by 43 new faculty and staff members

MASSENA -- It's back-to-school time, with students, faculty and staff in the Massena Central School district preparing for the academic year ahead.

New staff orientation was held on Aug. 22, with the district's annual "Ready 4 School" event scheduled for Aug. 29 from 12-3 p.m.

Superintendent Ron Burke said

students and families will see a number of new faces this year.

In total, the district has hired 43 new faculty and staff members. Fifteen new teachers join the ranks, along with two teaching assistants, two social workers, one school psychologist intern and seven support staff that includes monitors, maintenance workers and secretaries, he said.

But some positions remain open, he said.

"We are still seeking a certified

Art Teacher for elementary; a Behavior Consultant; a certified English Language Learner teacher; a Special Education Itinerant Services Provider; and, an LPN and bus drivers," Burke commented.

New opportunities for students to be involved in the arts will also come to Jefferson and Madison Elementary, he said.

"For the past few years,

At the elementary level nine new teachers join the ranks. Don Albert will teach grade 5 at J.F. Kennedy School, Abraham Baxter will teach special education at Madill, Jillian DiSalvo will teach grade 1 at JFK, Regan Kelly will teach grade 1 at JFK, Janise Ladouceur will teach grade 6 at Madill, Sadie O'Neil will teach grade 4 at JFK, Andrew Rupert will teach special education at JFK, Amy Farrell will teach physical education at Madill, and Joshua Myers will teach physical education at JFK.

The district also has hired eight

new secondary teachers. They include chemistry teacher Samuel Falicia, social studies teacher Ryan Hewer, math-science teacher Alexa Hooper, social studies teacher Emmalie Ladouceur, health teacher Margaret Rider, family and consumer science teacher Jordyn Sweeney, art teacher Julia Jones, and physical education teacher Al Benda.

Tapanga Barr (special education office), and Andrea Piercy (OFA grades 7-12) join the district as key-board specialists.

New teaching assistants to begin the year are Cooper Beaudin, Emma Murray, and Nathaniel Weidel.

New bus drivers transporting students will be Joseph Martin and David Troiano. Harold King has been hired as a bus monitor.

"We are implementing a new Mathematics program for all students in Grades UPK to 6, called Reveal Math," Kendall said.

Reveal Math is described as a balanced elementary math

United Helpers buys Gran-View, Windjammer

It's the end of an era for the Williams family, but former owner will stay on to aid with transition

OGDENSBURG -- United Helpers has purchased the Gran View and Windjammer Lodge, but as far as service goes, no major changes are expected.

The deal, which has been in the works for sometime and finally closed Aug. 26.

A spokesperson for United Helpers said that the purchase of the hotel and resort will fall under the for-profit branch of the organization and will help offset costs associated with the non-profit services.

United Helpers like many non-profit nursing providers have struggled due to lack of investment from the state.

The Gran View has a long legacy in Ogdensburg and United Helpers intends to honor that in the transition. In fact, the former owner William Lewis Junior will be staying on to help with the transition of ownership.

"People coming here to eat, stay or get married are not going to notice any difference," he said. "I'm 70 years old and not a young guy anymore, I just needed to start thinking about the future for my wife and I, as well as the

Gran-View and the Ogdensburg community."

The Gran-View's riverfront location, as well as the convenience of an on-site hotel led to the property's growth as a premier wedding location, where people could get married, hold their reception, and even spend the night without having to get in their cars and travel to another location.

"We've easily done over 1,000 weddings," Williams said. "We have been honored to be a part of the beginning of so many couples'

Road repairs expected to be in the millions after flood

County finance committee approves \$650,000 in emergency repair funds

CANTON — Road and structural repairs following an Aug. 9 flood in St. Lawrence County are expected to cost the county millions of dollars but officials say they are seeking reimbursement through the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

Legislators passed a resolution during the Aug. 26 Finance Committee meeting, authorizing \$650,000 for emergency road and structure repairs to reopen all affected roads.

County Highway Superintendent Don Chambers said the work to repair many roads and structural projects like culvert replacement are still underway, with crews having begun the work just hours after the storm subsided Aug. 9.

"It's going to likely be into the several million dollars to complete repairs even though we have, for example, some bridges that have already been replaced or had extensive repairs," he said.

Chambers said the \$650,000 the resolution approved spending is just for emergency repairs to ensure "roads are safe to the traveling public."

He said some structures, like culverts, would require improvements to a standard set by the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) following an assessment after the storm.

Chambers said larger culverts and significant road repairs were needed around the county but said it was his hope the state and federal government would help financially.

"Hopefully what we'll see is some

help from the state and federal government to address these final needs, but I just wanted to be clear this is for getting the emergency repairs done," he said.

Chambers said the county and other area counties like Lewis County suffered enough damage to meet the threshold for the state to apply for emergency aid through FEMA.

Despite that, Chambers said he was unsure if the county would be made whole for all repairs or just the emergency repairs through FEMA.

He said in 10 years as a superintendent downstate he experienced four large scale storms such as the Aug. 9 storm, with FEMA only offering emergency aid in some cases. Chambers said the cost for permanent repairs fell to the county and municipalities in those cases.

But Legislator Jim Reagan said it would be wise to speak with federal representatives to ensure the county's needs are met.

He said Senator Chuck Schumer, the top Senator, and Representative Elise Stefanik, the fourth ranking Republican in the House of Representatives, could play an instrumental role in securing funding through FEMA.

"It's not like we don't have anyone to take our case to Washington to make the point that this was a very unusual occurrence," he said.

"It's their job to assist when disaster strikes."

Reagan said he was not speaking ill of FEMA but rather commented that it would only be beneficial to keep informed those who appropriate funding to federal agencies.

"I'm not questioning or speaking ill of FEMA, but sometimes it helps

to make sure the people who provide the funding to the agency, in this case our federal reps, are aware of what's happening and whether they are following the mandate they expect. I don't think it's an unreasonable request that they offer us help for a very unusual event," he said.

Chambers said he was confident Governor Kathy Hochul would submit the request for aid to the federal government, but suggested legislators first begin working with the county's state representatives to get the ball rolling.

"It will have to start with the state reps, that's where we're at," he said.

Chambers also took a few moments to thank the County Highway Department, state Department of Transportation, local municipalities and material suppliers who offered immediate assistance following the storm.

"The staff was basically on for hours upon hours," Chambers said.

He commented that the state DOT and Jefferson County also offered pipes, materials and equipment to aid in the efforts.

"It was a seamless process with all municipalities, the DOT and everyone else helping," Chambers said.

Not long after the flood waters subsided, Chambers said state Emergency Management personnel were on the ground to assess the damage.

"We went out personally to show them the damaged areas. That will all go to FEMA now," he said.

Chambers said he does not expect to hear from FEMA until October but noted that a virtual

meeting would at least be held at that time.

Despite the emergency repair work that needs to be completed, Chambers said all projects slated by the department are still on pace to be completed this year.

"We were four weeks ahead of schedule at the time of the storm. We're working with the towns to figure it out now," he said.

Chambers said some towns were previously on the list to receive help with paving from the county, however a lack of resources now means the municipalities will be on their own to complete the work.

He also commented that many municipalities are feeling the crunch and have cut back on paving in general, let alone with assistance from the county.

"Some towns have already pulled back on their requests for help. But, all projects we scheduled for this year will be complete and we will get our CHIPS reimbursement. I'm confident of that," Chambers said.

Chairman of the Legislature David Forsythe took a moment to thank Chambers and his crews. He said Legislator Rick Perkins had reached out to him to ask what legislators could do to help.

"When this all happened I was trying to think of some way to help. I thought 'Jeez, I can run a skid steer, I can do something.' I thought about it over that weekend and it came to me, keep hiring good people to be department heads and put them in the right position based on their qualifications. And you have proven it time and time again."

"Thank you. Again, I couldn't do it without the team," Chambers said.

Indicted for killing child

CANTON — Two Massena residents have been indicted and charged with killing a 3-year-old boy last November.

A St. Lawrence County grand jury handed down indictments against Jovannie E. Vega, 24, and Kaitlin Cyrus, 24, on single counts of second-degree aggravated murder, second-degree murder, first-degree manslaughter, first-degree assault, and second-degree assault.

The indictments stem from the death of Kayden Flowers Nov. 28 at the University of Vermont hospital.

The child died following an assault that led to a brain bleed, severe brain swelling, loss of brain function, a broken femur, broken arm and lacerated liver, according to Massena police.

It is alleged Cyrus allowed Vega to "engage in ongoing physical abuse of the three-year-old victim" and "failed to seek aid and did not seek medical attention for the victim until 48 hours after the abuse occurred," said police.

During the assault, Vega is alleged to have thrown the victim into the bedroom wall before slamming the child on the ground several times.

Accused of child sex abuse

LISBON — Ryan A. Fifield and Benjamin N. Reed, both 28, of Ogdensburg, were charged by state police with first-degree sexual abuse: Victim under age 13, felony.

The incident was reported to police Dec. 13, 2023.

Both subjects were listed as held.

School hopes survey will help with career planning, grad rates, standarized testing

MASSENA -- Massena Central School officials say they want to gather information on recent graduates to track their professional progress.

Board Member Patricia Murphy said she hopes the district could use the information gathered to better prepare students for their futures.

In previous action, board members approved a contract with Life Track Services Inc. to track students following their high school graduation.

The intention is for Life Track Services to survey students three times, ranging from six months prior to graduation, to 18 months post high school graduation and finally five years after graduating high school.

The survey questions were compiled by the board of education, high school administration and the guidance department.

Superintendent Ron Burke previously said the contract would be completed through a Board of Cooperative Educational Services purchasing agreement. The cost

would be \$15 per student, coming in at just under \$3,000, he said.

Board members appeared keen to move on the contract after learning that nationally the company saw a return rate of 60% on all surveys issued to students who graduated 15 years prior.

Murphy said she was keen to see the results of the survey but noted that it might not be an appropriate time right now.

"I don't know when that would be appropriate. Maybe like a few months down the road," she said.

Officials said they hoped the survey would allow them to see what students might be attending two-year or four-year institutions, technical schools or entering the job market immediately following graduation.

Murphy also suggested that the tracking information could assist with future class reunions, giving organizers an up to date list with contact information.

Board Vice President Kevin Perretta said the information would be very helpful for the district down the road, allowing officials to "get a perspective from seniors."

"If we can keep the engagement,

it helps us. What are we doing great? What are we doing wrong?" he said.

But Murphy wondered what time frame would best serve both students and administrators alike, saying people would be more willing to share their information if they knew it would aid others in the future. She said the ultimate goal is to help raise graduation rates.

"If students engage, that might be a way to do that. The goal is not anything other than how did we prepare you for where you're going after graduation," she said.

Burke said the survey would aid in more than just graduation rates, however, aiding the district with Regents exam scores as well.

"Regents scores are one piece of data. But, what did we really do? Are you really prepared for life? Are you prepared to be successful in college, for a career, or for the military? This is one avenue for it," he said.

Surveys have since been distributed to the class of 2024, the first class that will participate in the new initiative.

Local businesses encouraged to participate in Major League Fishing bass tournaments

MASSENA -- Major League Fishing was in town once again, bringing with them over 300 anglers and fans from across the region.

Town officials say they hope the influx of tourism will be an economic booster, with competitors and fans staying in local hotels and Airbnbs, eating at local restaurants and hopefully visiting local businesses.

Town Council Member Adrian Taraska said it was his belief that area businesses could greatly benefit from participating in the tournaments. But it's up to them to reach out and let it be known they want to take part.

"There's going to be 320 anglers out there that are going to be spending money somewhere. I really would like the businesses of Massena, if they want these guys to come to their business, to approach Don or me or Jason (Hendricks) to help them be successful in what they're doing here," Taraska said.

In the case of Fahrenheit Bar and Grill, the business has offered 300 free drink chips to be distributed to anglers.

Taraska said efforts like that are simple ways to drive business to local businesses.

"We're doing everything we can to bring the people in. Now, we need help promoting your business, and it's free. We're not charging anything. So, if you want to get involved, call Jason or Don or me and let us know that you want to be involved, and we'll see what we can do for you," Taraska said.

Town grant writer Linda McQuinn echoed the sentiment during her monthly report, telling board members that the tourna-

ments bring in significant numbers of competitors and fans alike.

For the Toyota Series tournament, 159 boats with 318 anglers began the tournament, competing to avoid elimination after day 2. Day three would be contested between the top 25 pro anglers and their co-anglers, McQuinn said.

Massena Sports-Fishing Promotion Director Don Meissner was unable to attend the meeting due to commitments related to the tournament registration meeting that occurred that evening.

Meissner told NCTW the event has grown even larger this year, with more anglers involved, more vendors and more local businesses offering support.

"It has really been incredible to see the whole community pull together for these tournaments and to see so many people coming to the intake to see if for themselves," he said.

Meissner said he heard from many anglers personally how much they enjoyed coming to Massena.

"It's not just about the area or the fishing. It's also about the local businesses, the people they meet. So many of them have told me they were shocked how nice everyone is and how helpful they have been. Everywhere they go they meet great people who are excited to have them here," he said.

Meissner said the event is an economic opportunity not just for the Massena, but for the North Country as a whole.

"They stay in surrounding towns too. They eat at local restaurants. They shop at local shops. It's just a great way to give the local economy a boost and bring some of the best bass fishermen in the world to the best bass fishery in the world," he said.

MASSENA — While village trustees begin to take legal steps to address issues at 18 Park Avenue, public hearings have also been set to address unsafe properties at 31, 33 Pine Street and 21 Tamarack Street.

The news came from a village board of trustees meeting held Aug. 21, during which Code Enforcement Officer Walter Bean informed trustees that the property owner failed to meet the deadline for an "Order to Remedy."

The properties, owned by Down Family Revocable Trust, are in an advanced state of disrepair, according to Bean. He said they may constitute a danger to nearby properties and to the public's safety due to the proximity of the structures to the sidewalk and street.

"It's unknown if the place is occupied. I tried to establish that. We've got no contact from the owners. The owner of the property has yet to reach out to our office or remedy any of the issues," Bean said.

One of the large issues with the structure is the porch, which Bean said is collapsing.

Under the village code, property owners are meant to maintain the exterior of the property, from paint and siding to the actual physical structural integrity. Bean said the property owners have failed to do so, leading to the porch and front roof assembly beginning to collapse right near the sidewalk and street.

He said for that reason the village must take action on the property to ensure public safety.

The other property, located at 21 Tamarack St., has also proven to be a problem for a significant length of time, village officials said.

That property has a number of code violations, including abandoned vehicles sitting in the driveway, along with trash and tall grass that is not being maintained.

According to Code Enforcement Officer Aaron Hardy, the property is "another one of those out-of-country property owners who has done absolutely nothing with it."

"We mow it. We pick up the trash. We mow it. We pick up the trash," he said.

Hardy said he and other code enforcement officers have heard rumors about other activities that have been occurring in the backyard but noted they were not able to get to the back part of the property. He did not specify what activities specifically were rumored to have occurred there.

With the board unanimously passing a resolution to take action on the property, Hardy said that would allow his office to take action if the owner does not comply with the request within seven days.

The notice to comply is the next step required for the village to take further action on the property.

Hardy said that would allow the village to step foot on the property and "basically take care of everything."

"I think this is the right way forward with it. Once we get it cleaned up, we may have to come back in a month or two to establish an emergency and board it up for an unsafe structure. But, we need to be able to really see this whole property from top to bottom," he said.

While board members said they were pleased to be able to move forward with cleanup efforts, Mayor Greg Paquin noted that more work was needed on various other properties throughout the village.

He said in the case of 21 Tamarack St., the cost of the cleanup efforts and other costs incurred by the village would be added to the property owner's tax bill for reimbursement.

Trustees signaled that similar action would be taken on other properties in the future if cleanup and remediation efforts were not carried out by property owners who are not in compliance with village code.

Trustee Ken McGowan was critical of the numerous landlords who did not live within the community and failed to keep up with their properties.

He said it was time for the village to "play hard ball" and begin cracking down on those who are delinquent in their responsibilities to the village, their tenants and the community as a whole.

McGowan said the actions taken by the board during the recent meeting should put property owners on notice.

MASSENA -- The 44th Annual Solidarity Parade and Picnic will be Sept. 2 at 11 a.m.


The parade will begin at the intersection of Center and Willow streets, near Coach's Corner Restaurant.



program, developing the problem solvers of tomorrow by incorporating both inquiry-focused and teacher-guided instructional strategies within each lesson.

In order to teach students, they first must get them in the classroom.

"Our focus this year will be in the area of chronic absenteeism," Kendall said.

Chronic absenteeism is defined as having missed 10% or more of a school year.

"That would equate to having missed 18 or more days of school in a school year," the super said.

Currently, Ogdensburg district enrollment is at 1400, down from 1440 last year.

"We are still enrolling new students and that number could change," Kendall said.

Breakfast and lunch will continue to be free for all students through the Community Eligibility Program. No action is needed by parents.

The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) has expanded access to the federal Community Eligibility Provision (CEP). CEP allows eligible schools participating in the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs to offer free school meals to all students.

Nightengale Elementary has produced a very successful musical. This year, we will be expanding this opportunity to students at Jefferson Elementary and at Madison Elementary," Burke said.

District officials, including the board of education, also recently announced their primary goals for the academic year.

Board President Paul Haggett said officials wanted the district goals to "be more granular," with officials paring down the list to include reducing chronic absenteeism, improving graduation rates and improving the school climate for students.

Burke elaborated further, saying the district hopes to reduce chronic absenteeism by 1% in PK-6 grades and by 2% in grades 7-12.

Standardized test scores are also a district goal this year, with officials saying they hope to see a proficiency increase of 2% for grades 3-8 in English Language Arts, a 1% increase for grades 3-8 math and a 1.5% increase in proficiency for NYS Regents exams.

School climate has been a topic

of conversation in recent years, as both students and families, along with school officials and staff hope to improve the quality of life for all students in school.

Burke said school officials hope to increase assets by 5% and decrease risks by 5%, as reported by students on the annual Climate Survey.

"On the non-instructional side, we will be focused on preparations for a capital project referendum which will address priority issues that were not addressed in the last project as well as the preparation for electric buses as mandated by the State," Burke said.

Board of Education members are diving into the next capital project, having signed King + King as the district's next architect.

Some ideas that have been floated include continuing HVAC improvements, along with outdoor recreational spaces like pickleball courts and other various improvements to athletic facilities just for starters, officials said.

Burke enters his second year as the superintendent of Massena Central School, pushing to complete more instructional goals that will benefit the student body.

"I am immensely proud to lead the Massena Central School District. As I enter into my second year at Massena, I am excited that we have designed instructional goals that are wholly focused on improving student success. By focusing on the ABCs with attainable steps we will improve the educational experience for all students," Burke said.

journeys together."

Being a valuable member of the community is also important to the Williams family and something that he says will not change following the change in ownership. History of the business

A press release issued by United Helpers says Louis and Tina Williams first opened the Gran-View Hot Dog Stand above Pythian Beach nearly 80 years ago, they dreamed of something so much bigger.

In the years that followed the Williams family turned the Gran-View from a small hot dog stand into an iconic destination for weddings, parties, fine dining and many more special occasions

Today people think of the Gran-View as the premier location along the St. Lawrence River for weddings or a gourmet meal, but that wasn't always the case.

Louis Williams Jr. explained that when his parents Louis and Tina Williams first opened the Gran-View, they did so as a hot dog stand. It operated while they were making renovations to the former Tim's Manor restaurant to build an apartment where they could live over top of what would become the Gran-View restaurant as we know it.

Sadly, the original Gran-View was destroyed by fire on Christmas Eve in 1953. When rebuilding the Gran-View, the business was moved to its current location where a hotel and resort would also eventually be built.

In 1979 Mr. Williams and his wife Claire moved back to Ogdensburg on a permanent basis. They would both work for the elder Mr. and Mrs. Williams until 1982 when the couple purchased the business from his parents.

"The structure of the business at that time was very similar to what it is today," he said.

"We've just renovated and added pieces over the years."

Today, in addition to the restau-

rant and bar, the Gran-View is a 46-room hotel plus a four-bedroom cottage. There is also a pool on the property. The hotel operates as part of the Ascend Hotel Collection, a boutique brand by Choice Hotels International, earning the company's highest honor "gold status" for each of the past three years.

When asked about what makes the Gran-View so special, Mr. Williams said, "There aren't many places where you can sit on a balcony, enjoy a cup of coffee in the morning or a glass of wine while

you take in what I consider to be among the most beautiful sunsets in the world. A lot of people look at us as an oasis in an otherwise busy world and I say they're absolutely correct to do so."

Williams credits his wife for much of the business' evolution. "The flowers, the décor, the landscaping, and redesigns of the properties were all her," he said. "She's a very big part of everything that happens. We still wouldn't be in business if it wasn't for her."

How to work through disenfranchised grief

When grief is judged

International Overdose Awareness Day is August 31st and marks the world's largest annual campaign to end overdose. It's a time to remember, without stigma, those who have died and honor the grief of family and friends left behind.

Grief associated with a death from an overdose is frequently called "disenfranchised grief." In short, those grieving someone who died from an overdose feel as though the person who died is being judged (which may very well be true) as are they for grieving them. Other deaths which often come with this feeling of judgment include deaths by suicide or a stigmatized disease, and when the relationship was an unrecognized one like an ex-partner or an extra-marital partner.

Hospice of St. Lawrence Valley offers the following to help people navigate disenfranchised grief both their own and that of others:

own grief. Do not feel you must explain why you're grieving someone. The type of relationship you had with the person does not determine if you're entitled to grieve. People grieve family, friends, friends they've had falling outs with, ex-spouses, all types of relationships. If a person's death deeply impacts you, grieve. Regardless of the circumstances around the death if you need to grieve, grieve!

Try not to disenfranchise other's grief. Think twice if the first thing you want to say to someone after they share they're grieving the death of someone is a question other than "how can I help?". Asking questions like "did you know they were using again", "were there signs they were thinking about suicide", "didn't you break up with them over five years ago", or "were they vaccinated" immediately let the grieving person know, based upon their answer, you will judge them and their grief.

Have a plan of how to respond to questions. While it would be wonderful if people did not ask judgmental and insensitive questions they likely will. Have a prepared response which lets the person know you are grieving, have a right to grieve, and will not stand for your grief being judged or questioned. For example, if someone asks for details like what substance was used, a response like "I'd love to talk with you about the person who died, not how they died" could work. If there are questions about the type of relationship something as simple as "It is sad when people die. I'm grieving. The type of relationship doesn't matter."

Disenfranchised grief is far too common to be ignored. Events such as International Overdose Awareness Day and International Survivors of Suicide Loss Day are a step in the right direction. These recognition days help to recognize and normalize the profound grief left when someone dies of an overdose or by suicide. It is cruel to judge these losses. Hospice encourages you to support those in your community grieving these types of losses the same way you would any other loss. THIS IS ONLY A TEST.

This is a test of 1st Amendment free press to hold elected officials accountable at the ballot box.

There is a North Country judge whose overt bias on the bench has undermined the clear, legally-executed written care instruction of a frail helpless old lady, leaving her to waste away in an out-of-state nursing home, instead of having the care of North Country family she chose.

The NYS Commission on Judicial Conduct has chosen to dismiss a complaint of bias by refusing to even acknowledge the evidence of clear bias, claiming not to “have authority to change a judge’s decision or to review the merits of matters within a judge’s discretion.”

My complaint was about bias:

- 1) The judge accused the old lady’s (physician son) chosen guardian of abducting her from an out-of-state nursing home to bring her home to live with family, with no criminal due process, or even hearing from the accused.
- 2) When the transcript of the initial hearing was requested, its existence was denied, and not provided.
- 3) The transcript of the next hearing was provided; it confirmed the prior hearing two days earlier. However, another witness in that hearing confirmed hearing the old lady clearly answering “No” when asked if she wanted her daughter as guardian; that question and response disappeared from the transcript.
- 4) The dozen or so staff in the judge’s clerk office are **all** women! No matter what you think about equal rights or affirmative action, a judge named Ruth Bader Ginsburg built her career defining such “disparate impact” as first-face proof of discrimination and bias, requiring no further proof. The judge in question therefore has a proven history of bias.

I have reached out to some elected officials in the area to contact the Commission for a closer look at this case. What I received was another brush-off: “judicial discretion” and “legal issue”, rather than admitting at least a reasonable fact-based suspicion of bias.

We all know that state bureaucrats pay much closer attention to elected officials than to ordinary voters like you and me.

Election time is by far the best time – and quite often, the only time - to pressure elected officials to *attentively* respond to the needs of their constituents.

THIS IS A TEST.

Is this the kind of impartial due process and family-friendly justice that we expect of our judges?

Is this the kind of responsiveness by our elected officials, that we expect when we present them with evidence of unelected state officials failure to perform their duties diligently and fairly? Is it asking too much for them to make a phone call to look into this?

Or is it necessary to elect new officials – with a little help from a full page ad every week from now to Election Day ... with names ?
