Village getting the word out on flood damage reporting

CANTON - Deputy Mayor Anna Sorensen reports that many village residents have questions on how to report damages from the Aug. 9 flooding event in Canton.

"The Clerk's office continues to receive phone calls from folks unsure of how to report damage from the flood or apply for assistance with repairs," stated Sorensen. "In addition to ensuring their access to help, we want to make sure our community reports the extent of the damage as that may influence the funding that can be accessed for improving infrastructure against future storms, etc."

The village has posted information on the website and social media but are trying to get the word out more widely and, of course, "thought of you

Horse infections draw imminent threat designation for county

Five cases of Eastern Equine Encephalitis found in county

CANTON -- Five horses have been infected with Eastern Equine Encephalitis (EEE) in St. Lawrence County, prompting county officials to apply for an Imminent Threat to Public Health designation.

According to St. Lawrence County Public Health Director Erin Streiff, the New York State Commissioner of Health initially suggested applying for the designation after the first cases were discovered in Norfolk, Norwood and Brasher.

State steps in

Streiff said she received a call recently from state officials who wished to voice their concerns due to the rising number of cases.

Streiff said the designation will allow the coun-

ty to be reimbursed through state aid at a higher rate now that the designation has been approved by state officials.

She told legislators during the August 19 services committee meeting that the number of cases was a concern to state officials, noting that five cases in eight days was highly unusual.

Streiff said compared to 2023, the county only

Potsdam looks for funding to bolster stormwater management

POTSDAM -- In the wake of the recent storm and flooding that hit Potsdam, the village is looking for grant funding to help update its stormwater management system.

At their Aug. 19 meeting, the mayor and board of trustees approved a resolution which directs village staff to find funding for upgrades.

The resolution states village personnel will be authorized to identify potential sources of federal and state grants and debt financing that can be used on stormwater management facilities.

Staff are asked to find funding sources and report back to the board by Sept. 30.

The village, like other communities in the North Country, took a shellacking

Potsdam museum grant would fund upgrades

POTSDAM — The Potsdam Village Board of Trustees recent-

ly agreed to apply for a grant for the museum, approved several personnel appointments, and approved the Active People, Healthy Nation Proclamation.

The board approved several resolutions covering those issues at its meeting Aug. 19.

Trustees and the mayor acknowledged and approved Museum Director Trevor Blank’s submission of a grant proposal to the New York State Council for the Arts seeking up to \$50,000.

The funding would be used to upgrade the museum’s facilities and support programming and daily operations.

The village would not have any matching funds obligation with this particular grant.

Trustees approved Village Mayor Alexandra Jacobs Wilke’s appointment of David Whitesock of College Park Road to a five-year term as a member of the Village of Potsdam Zoning Board of Appeals, effective Aug. 20, and expiring Aug. 20, 2029.

The Mayor’s appointment of Brian Ohl of Leroy Street to a five-year term as an alternate member of the Village of Potsdam Zoning Board of Appeals, effective Aug. 20, and expiring Aug. 20, 2029 was also approved by the board.

Finally, the board and mayor passed a resolution approving the Active People, Healthy Nation Proclamation for the village.

The proclamation stated that the village will implement Active People, Healthy Nation strategies, including increasing physical activity through community design, improve access to places for physical activity, develop and encourage more school and youth programs to promote physical activity before, during and after school, and to create community-wide campaigns to promote physical activity, partnering with public health organizations and institutions.

Former McCarthy's Furniture Barn deemed unsafe Building razed to make room for the brewery

CANTON - The ground has been cleared for the Bent Beam Brewery in Canton.

The former McCarthy's Furniture Barn, the historic and original structure that housed the brewery, was torn down last week after a contractor deemed the building unsafe.

"After doing everything we could to save the barn, ultimately, the frame had too much rot and deterioration that was hidden behind some of the interior walls," stated Gary Hammond, chief financial officer for St. Lawrence Suds. "The engineer and general contractor both declared the building unsafe to work in, so we have had to pivot to demolition and reconstruction."

Original plans to open the establishment in the former McCarthy's Furniture Barn, 41 West Main St., were squashed when contractor Northern Tier Contracting (NTC), Gouverneur, issued a report to the village board that the building was unsafe.

Hence, the building had to be razed.

"We had to do additional environmental testing and had some asbestos removed. Additional review was also

conducted by the State Historic Preservation Office before we were given the go ahead with the demolition," noted Hammond. "With the help of the Village and the [St. Lawrence County] IDA we confirmed that we can still use our grant towards the project."

The Bent Beam Brewing project received \$610,000 in Restore NY funding in December 2022.

"Short work was made of bringing the barn down," he said.

The change in plans warranted the village board to pass Type II SEQRA

action which they did at their July 17 meeting.

"The St. Lawrence Suds project proposed for the property at 41 West Main Street in the Village of Canton does not meet or exceed any applicable Type I thresholds nor is it deemed likely to have a significant adverse impact on the environment. The replacement project involves work on the same site and footprint and is deemed as not subject to SEQRA review," the resolution reads.

A report from the engineering firm Tisdell Associates cited problems with the foundation and existing walls.

The report, dated May 24, indicated the existing building foundation was in very poor condition and only extended 12" ± below existing grade, which does not provide adequate frost protection; the interior structure had previously been damaged by a fire. The extent of fire damage was much more extensive than we had anticipated; the main structure had been extensively damaged by water intrusion causing the structure to be compromised; it appears that the building walls have begun to fail and that the structure is not safe; and it does not appear that the jacking and raising the existing structure to install a new foundation is practical.

The Type II SEQRA resolution also noted that "St. Lawrence Suds will construct a replacement structure in the same location along with new

electric service and hookups in the village's sewer and water infrastructure. When finished the building will be approximately 3,660 square feet.

Mock dorm fire at Clarkson

POTSDAM — Clarkson University hosted their annual “Mock Dorm Burn” in front of the Educational Resource Center earlier this month. The mock dorm burn purpose is to show and demonstrate to new and returning students the rapid progression of a fire in a small mock dorm room, according to an online post from the Potsdam Fire Department. Clarkson University’s Fire and Life Safety Specialist, Brian Moulton was on hand to speak to students about knowing two ways out of their dorm room and to take all

alarms seriously by evacuating the building in a timely manner. Once the fire was lit, it was shown how quickly it takes for the room to become “fully involved” in just under three minutes, the department said. The students were able to feel the intense heat and see the thick black smoke generated by common materials found in dorm rooms. Once the mock dorm room was at flashover stage the firefighters moved in and extinguished the flames.

Municipal buildings to be surveyed in village to establish energy use benchmarks

POTSDAM -- The village has adopted a new slate of policies and procedures for analyzing the energy usage of its municipal buildings. The energy use benchmarks, which is part of the village’s Climate Smart Communities Task Force work, will help the village to apply for grant funding for sustainability projects. The village board of trustees and mayor approved the new procedures at their meeting on Aug. 19.

“This is very long, complicated wording all to say this is part of the Climate Smart Planet Smart Communities Task Force work and the Energy Smart Communities work,” Mayor Alexandra Jacobs Wilke told the board. “In short there is an EPA portal and we are gathering our energy usage data for municipal buildings of 1,000 square feet or larger from the past two full calendar years,” Wilke said. “It’s just going through all those bills and the energy usage and the amount we spent. It gets uploaded

into this portal and it will earn us a free energy study. It should identify ways we might plan ahead to improve our infrastructure and energy use and it gets us points towards all those sustainability grants,” Wilke said. “So, this is part of all that.” The new policies and procedures list definitions, set down deadlines for the information gathering and how that data will be disclosed to the public. The resolution also specified how the benchmark information will be managed and maintained and how the reporting will be enforced at the village level.

President Biden signs off on federal disaster relief funding for St. Lawrence County

CANTON -- St. Lawrence County has been approved for federal disaster relief following extensive flooding and storms that struck the north country July 10 and 11.

The news broke yesterday, Aug. 29, as President Joe Biden signed off on the Major Disaster Declaration to provide federal assistance to the affected communities.

Governor Kathy Hochul also announced the support, saying the federal financial assistance would support public infrastructure reconstruction efforts throughout multiple counties, including St. Lawrence County.

"The effects of Hurricane Beryl caused extreme damage across Upstate New York this month, and I'm thankful President Biden has approved my request for a Major Disaster Declaration," Governor Hochul said.

"My administration will work

directly with FEMA in the coming weeks to ensure our local government partners receive the critical funding they need to begin the recovery and rebuilding process."

A Major Disaster Declaration secures financial assistance from the federal government, primarily through the Federal Emergency Management Agency's Public Assistance Program, to provide funding to local governments, tribes and eligible non-profits for debris removal, protective measures and repairs to buildings and infrastructure, including roads, bridges, water and wastewater treatment facilities, critical infrastructure sites, schools, parks and other facilities.

As part of the declaration, New York was also granted access to FEMA's Hazard Mitigation Grant Programs. Following a Presidential disaster declaration, FEMA provides funding for states to administer grant programs supporting local hazard mitigation

planning and long-term hazard mitigation measures to reduce the loss of life and to improve property damaged by natural disasters. Local governments and certain non-profits that perform government-like functions are eligible to apply for these grants. All counties in the State will have the ability to apply for this funding. More information will become available in the coming months.

The news of the federal aid comes as welcome relief to the county, not long after County Highway Superintendent Don Chambers informed legislators that repairs for bridges, highways and other infrastructure would cost in the millions of dollars.

Legislators passed a resolution during the Aug. 26 Finance Committee meeting, authorizing \$650,000 for emergency road and structure repairs to reopen all affected roads.

County Highway Superintendent Don Chambers said the work to repair many roads and structural projects like culvert replacement are still underway, with crews having begun the work just hours after the storm subsided Aug. 9.

"It's going to likely be into the several million dollars to complete repairs even though we have, for example, some bridges that have already been replaced or had extensive repairs," he said.

Chambers said the \$650,000 the resolution approved spending is just for emergency repairs to ensure "roads are safe to the traveling public."

He said some structures, like culverts, would require improvements to a standard set by the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) following an assessment after the storm.

Chambers said larger culverts and significant road repairs were needed around the county but said it was his hope the state and federal government would help financially.

"Hopefully what we'll see is some help from the state and federal government to address these final needs, but I just wanted to be clear this is for getting the emergency repairs done," he said.

saw five cases between July and October of last year.
“So, we saw roughly one case per month last year. Compare that to five in just over a week’s time this year... when rates are high enough to affect mammals, that becomes a concern,” she said.

What is EEE?

Eastern equine encephalitis (EEE) is an extremely rare but serious and often fatal infection that causes encephalitis or inflammation of the brain. It is spread by the bite of a mosquito infected with EEE virus (EEEV).

EEEV can also infect a wide range of animals including mammals, birds, reptiles, and amphibians. The spread of EEEV to mammals (including humans and horses) occurs through the bite of infected mosquitoes that feed on both birds and mammals, according to New York State Department of Health officials.

Possibility of spraying

Streiff said state officials also recommended spraying to eliminate adult mosquitoes that may transmit the disease to birds and in some cases mammals, however there is no clear cut area to spray to eliminate the disease.

She said the cases have been spread out “in an arc across the northern portion of the county” but noted there was no specific location to spray that county officials were confident would help.

Streiff said state Department of Health officials suggested spraying near Brasher State Forest and Fish Creek Wildlife Management Area.

She said both areas may have significant swamp land that is a breeding ground for mosquitoes that can carry EEE.

“I’m personally not opposed to spraying but want to know that the money being spent on spraying is going to be successful for that sort of investment,” she said.

Legislator Glenn Webster commented on the possibility of spray-

ing in trouble areas as well, telling Streiff that Brasher sprays every year to eliminate mosquitoes.

Streiff said she was aware of the spraying conducted by the municipality but said those efforts are centered over populated areas, not swamps and forested areas with standing water.

No history of travel

Streiff said the five horses infected with EEE have no documented travel. She said the Department of Agriculture and Markets conducted their own investigation into the matter, also finding the horses were not vaccinated against EEE as well.

“I don’t know how you sort that out because there’s probably no record,” Legislator Margaret Haggard said.

Streiff said she encouraged all owners to get their horses vaccinated if they have not been already.

She said immunity may not be built up in the event that a horse were to be bit by an infected mosquito, which was also cause for concern.

Streiff said in the case of horses that become infected, most die “within a matter of a few days, unfortunately.”

Fatality rates

Horses are not the only mammals in danger, with humans also being at risk for contracting EEE.

According to Streiff, the state DOH informed her that 11 cases in humans have been reported since 1971.

Though that may not seem significant, Streiff said eight of the 11 infected died shortly after. The remaining three individuals infected all suffered significant neurological damage, she said.

“There is no cure for this,” she said.

In an effort to inform the public, Streiff and Public Health Deputy Director Carly Zimmerman said messages have been disseminated through press releases, social media posts and handouts at events like Bassmasters in Waddington.

Streiff said the department would also be reaching out to Amish communities in an effort to help them combat EEE.

She said Public Health encourages all horse owners to ensure their animals are up to date with all vaccinations to limit the spread of the disease and possibility of infection.

Public Health will also work with area veterinarians to spread the word as well, Streiff said.

How to combat EEE

Streiff said mosquito prevention kits are available for free to county residents, with mosquito dunks being one of the better ways to combat the population.

Mosquito dunks are disks about the size of the palm of an individual’s hand that help eliminate larvae from hatching in standing water.

Streiff said a single dunk can treat a 10 foot by 10 foot area of water.

She said the Soil and Water Department purchased a significant quantity of the kits to distribute for free to any residents who wish to utilize them in standing water around their properties.

Legislator Rita Curran noted that there would likely be significantly more standing water due to the wet summer and significant flooding the county saw on Aug. 9.

Streiff said the dunks should help cut down on mosquitoes around properties but suggested that spraying may be the only way to ensure larger bodies of water are treated.

She also said insect repellents like Deet would also be helpful, though she understood the negative connotation with the products.

Streiff suggested applying repellents like Deet to clothing to ward off mosquitoes as well.

Mosquito dunks are available in limited quantities at the Public Health Office, located at 80 State Highway 310, Canton.

DPW super praises pro-active approach to future storm events

during the storm and flooding event that occurred August 9.

The National Weather Service estimated that up to 7 inches of rain fell on the village during the storm in what is considered a 100-year-rain-fall event.

Village police, public works and fire crews were busy during the storm, answering emergency calls and pumping out basements. The fire department alone answered about 93 calls for service, which included washed out roads, flooded basements, disabled vehicles, a collapsed ceiling, underwater propane

tanks, carbon monoxide leak, gas leak, electrical problems and a possible vehicle fire.

At the top of the meeting, Village Mayor Alexandra Jacobs Wilke said once potential funding sources had been found, she recommended that the village engage an engineering firm to design stormwater retention ponds and other stormwater management strategies.

“As discussed, I think that will be a lot of ongoing work and I agree with Trustee (Monique) Tirion that it will be a team effort,” said Wilke, after the measure later passed.

During his remarks earlier in the meeting, Department of Public Works superintendent Greg Thompson praised village officials for taking a proactive approach towards dealing with future flooding events.

“I don’t think, always, we are going to see rainfall as often and as intense as we’ve seen this summer, but I do think it is a reality. So I commend the board and staff for not kicking the can down the road anymore. Let’s take a stand on this. Let’s get things taken care of,” Thompson said.

“The other night in that storm, in all honesty the Crosstown Canal could have been twice the size of it is. It wouldn’t have taken the amount of water that was coming into the head wall up behind the school. It was insane,” the DPW supervisor said.

Mayor Michael Dalton updated the board on the extensive damage throughout the village and town at the village board’s Aug. 21

“Heavy damage was caused due to the rain event on the 9th with over 6.75 inches in a short period of time,” Dalton reported. “Sullivan Drive washed out leaving limited emergency access to the apartment building and to Partridge Knoll and all parks were flooded when the Grasse reached a historic level, with heavy damage to all.”

Flooding closed Taylor Park for the summer season and a New York State swift water team had to rescue a family from the park.

“Damage was unprecedented in all our parks,” he said.

Sewer treatment operations were out for a substantial period of time when the main lift station flooded. A fire truck and three 4” trailer mounted pumps pumped directly into the river.

“A damage assessment to replace much of the equipment is approximately \$1.5 million,” the mayor said.

The mayor stressed the importance of homeowners and businesses to report all damages associated with flooding. A form is available on the town and village website.

“There’s a lot to think about. There will be resiliency money down the road but will need documentation,” stated Dalton who noted the fire department has kept very good records of storm damage.

The Canton Fire Department received 85 calls for assistance in just the first 10 hours of the storm and another 20 calls over the following 14 hours. Twenty-four members responded and would be out on calls for more than 12 hours before getting a break.

Any property owners, both residential and commercial, are encouraged to report damages.

Bust nets \$180,000 of meth

CANTON – A traffic stop in the Village of Canton Sunday evening netted a street value of approximately \$180,000 of crystal methamphetamine and crack cocaine.

Canton Police Chief James Santimaw reported Tuesday that at 6:53 p.m. a vehicle was stopped for passing a red signal at the corner of Main Street and Riverside Drive.

Arrested were Christopher J. McGregor, 43, of 18 Burney Ave, Massena, and Nancy S. Perry, 38, of 43 Sherwood Drive, Massena. Both subjects were each charged with one count of second-degree criminal possession of a controlled substance (methamphetamine), a Class A felony, and first-degree criminal possession of a controlled substance (Narcotic Drug 8 oz. or more, also a Class A felony).

The drugs seized were 47.6 ounces of crystal methamphetamine and 40.6 ounces of crack/cocaine, said police.

The defendants were arraigned before Canton Town Court Justice Mike Morgan and both were remanded to the St. Lawrence County Correctional Facility without bail.

Canton Village Police were assisted by the St. Lawrence County Drug Task Force, the St. Lawrence County Sheriff’s Office, the NYS PVNET Unit, the Massena Village Police Department, and the United States Border patrol.

CLARE -- The state Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) has temporarily closed the Lampson Falls accessible trail at the Grass River Wild Forest.

This indefinite closure is necessary to accommodate trail repair work following recent extreme flooding events, officials say.

Visitors who do not require use of the accessible trail will continue to be able to reach the falls and the beach area using the alternate trail.

DEC encourages visitors to consider accessing other State properties across the Western Adirondacks and Eastern Lake Ontario Region.

A Little Bit About 'The Friends'

The Friends, a non profit 501c3 organization, was formed approximately twenty years ago with the initial purpose of improving winter recreation in the Park and the ultimate goal of building a warming building.

In the first few years the group created bird and tree guides, purchased benches for the Park and began working on trail expansion.

The Town of Colton obtained a grant for a grooming drag which was then turned over to the Friends for grooming at the Park. A grant was written for monies to go toward a warming building. It was decided to go instead for a combination Lodge and Nature Center.

The monies, plus a major fund raising campaign resulted in enough funds to purchase materials for the building.

The Regional Parks Office provided staff to construct the building which opened in 2014. In 2016 the Friends raised sufficient funds to purchase a dedicated grooming sled to replace one of the personally owned sleds previously being used.

In 2018 they supplemented the grooming fleet with a roller. Around the same time the Friends purchased a quantity of youth cross country ski equipment for the rentals



for the Park and started a school lesson program.

Over the last several years, the Friends have purchased 50% of the tractor trailer loads of woodchips for trail improvements. A youth ski group, the Ermines, was started, as well as an adult lesson group.

In 2020 a second, wider, used grooming drag was purchased. In 2022, thanks to another grant, and partnership with the Parks, a storage building for the grooming fleet which includes the purchased equipment, St. Lawrence University's sled and drag, and one personally owned sled was completed. In 2021 work on a grant application to purchase an ADA Kayak Launch was begun.

The grant was awarded, the launch purchased and installation of it is currently in progress by the Regional Parks Office.

The group has expanded its activities to include interpretive walks, an iNaturalist Project, and a designated "Tree" trail. The Friends constantly look for ways they can contribute to enhancing the Park experience.

Canton Town Board wants to slow down traffic on business-laden stretch of U.S. Highway 11

CANTON - The Town of Canton will be submitting yet another speed reduction request, this time directly to the New York State Department of Transportation to slow down traffic on a stretch of road on Rt. 11 east.

At the town board's Aug. 14 meeting, officials agreed to draft a resolution to request lowering the 55-miles-per-hour speed limit from where the 40-miles-per-hour zone shifts to 55 mph just before the Park-

way Express all the way to the town line near Johnson's Towing and Auto Repair.

The speed concern was introduced to the town board by town resident Thomas Archetko, noted Town Supervisor Mary Ann Ashley during the correspondence segment of the meeting.

Deputy Town Supervisor James T. Smith agreed with the request, noting there is a lot of business activity along that stretch of Rt. 11.

"There has to be 15 or so businesses in that 55 miles per hour zone,"

said Smith.

Recent additions to the Rt. 11 business sector are the 11 West restaurant and the relocation of the St. Lawrence Health Regional Administrative Campus, 6196 U.S. Highway 11, formerly Frazer Computing.

Included in the string of Rt. 11 business are Parkway Express, UHaul, Rt. 11 Truck & Equipment Sales & Service, Colton Glass, Holiday Inn Express, Bourdeau Bros. Inc., the St. Lawrence Health Medical Campus, Atlantic Testing

Laboratories, Empire Tractor (New Holland), Mike's Trophies, Summer-Haven, and LeBerge & Curtis. Traffic safety concerns are also generated by a right turn onto the Cowan Road to the Woodchop Shop, and in and out of the Champion trailer park.

The town board is expected to pass the resolution at its Sept. 11 monthly meeting.

A few months ago, the town board agreed to submit a request to lower the speed limit on a stretch of the Miner Street Road from 45 mph to 30 mph.

Last September, the town board pitched a request to lower the speed limit from 55 mph to 30 miles on the State Street Road just past Canton Central School to the Route 310 intersection. That stretch includes the outskirts of the school, the baseball and softball fields, the entrance to the Partridge Run Golf Course and Recreation Trail, the United Helpers Maplewood facility and now a solar center.

The town has yet to hear from the state DOT on their requests.

Supporting them in return has given us a way to honor my mother's memory, and I am honored to be associated with them.

Activities that can promote cardiovascular health

Although any exercise can be beneficial, there is a fitness recipe designed to be the most effective for strengthening the heart and helping it to work to its full potential. Here are the guidelines recommended by the American Heart Association and Johns Hopkins Medicine.

- Get 150 minutes per week or more of moderate-intensity aerobic activity or 75 minutes per week of vigorous-intensity aerobic activity, or a combination of both. These activities can include running, cycling, swimming, and others that will get the heart pumping.

- Incorporate moderate- to high-intensity muscle-strengthening activity at least two days a week.

- Strength training should be designed to work the entire body. It doesn’t have to be traditional weightlifting, either. Body weight exercises, yoga, Pilates, and even tai chi can build strength and offer additional benefits like improving balance.

- Don’t discount everyday activities in relation to how they can enhance heart health. Walking, gardening, playing with children, or tossing a ball to a family pet are beneficial aerobic activities.

Strategies that can lower breast cancer risk

Breast cancer affects millions of individuals each year. The World Cancer Research Fund International

reports that breast cancer is the most commonly diagnosed cancer in women across the globe, affect-

ing roughly 2.3 million women each year. Despite the global prevalence of

breast cancer, various organizations report high five-year survival rates, particularly among women whose

cancers are detected in the earliest stages of the disease.

In fact, a 2023 study published in the journal *BMJ* found that the risk for dying from breast cancer in the five years after an early-stage diagnosis fell to 5 percent in recent years, a notable improvement from the 14 percent risk of death that was reported in the 1990s.

Increased survival rates for breast cancer are welcome news for women and their families.

The higher survival rates are a byproduct of the tireless efforts of cancer researchers, who also have discovered links between the disease and certain lifestyle factors.

Though there's no way to eliminate one's risk for breast cancer entirely, the American Cancer Society notes certain variables are within women's control.

With that in mind, women can consider these three strategies that can lead to improved overall health and might help women lower their risk for breast cancer as well.

1. Reach and maintain a healthy weight. The benefits of maintaining a healthy weight include a lower risk for heart disease and stroke, and women should know that weight and breast cancer risk are linked as well. According to the ACS, increased body weight and weight gain as an adult are linked to a higher risk of developing breast cancer. That's particularly so among post-menopausal women. A 2023 study published in the journal *BMC Women's Health* found that the chances of developing breast cancer increase among post-menopausal women who are obese.

2. Avoid a sedentary lifestyle. Exercise is one of the ways to achieve and maintain a healthy weight, so it makes sense that being physically active can reduce breast cancer risk. The National Cancer Institute reports that a 2016 meta-analysis of 38 cohort studies found that the most physically active women had between a 12 and 21 percent lower risk for breast cancer than women who were the least physically active. The NCI also notes that additional studies have found that women who become more physically active after menopause also have a lower risk for breast cancer than those who do not.

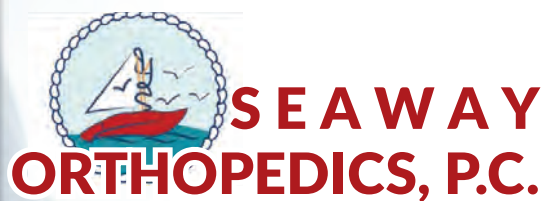
3. Limit or eliminate alcohol consumption. The ACS urges women who drink to consume no more than one alcoholic drink per day, noting that consumption of even small amounts of alcohol have been linked to an increased risk for breast cancer. Officials with the MD Anderson Cancer Center note that the link between alcohol consumption and breast cancer risk is low. However, the MDACC notes that alcohol can contribute to unwanted weight gain, thus increasing cancer risk. In addition, alcohol can increase levels of estrogen and other hormones associated with breast cancer.

It may be impossible to completely prevent breast cancer. However, women can embrace strategies that improve their overall health in ways that lower their risk for breast cancer.
