## Horror in the Adirondacks

Local filmmaker launches indie film in time for Halloween

A locally made indie horror film shot in St. Lawrence County and the Adirondack Mountains is now available on several streaming services.

Severance Mountain was directed and produced by Ogdensburg musician, tattoo artist and business owner Ethan Henry, the movie features local actors, music and production work.

Henry said work on the film has been underway for about two and half years and it officially went live, fittingly, on Friday the 13th. Some locals were also greeted with Severance Mountain "parking tickets" as part of a viral marketing campaign.

Henry said that while the film was made on a very lean budget, viewers can expect excellent camera work from John B. Sovie II of Sov's Media, Massena.

Henry said he sees the film as a way to highlight the North Country and the untapped talent that lies here.

Although his interests tend to lie more in science fiction and drama genres, Henry said making an indie horror film allowed him to do more with less.

"We didn't have a big budget. So I thought let's do what we can and put everything we've got into this," he said. "We ended up with a really high quality indie horror film."

St. Lawrence County residents will likely recognize some of the cast mem-

bers. Henry said drawing from local talent allowed him to write characters that leaned into the personalities of the actors.

Henry said having the local setting was important to him.

"First and foremost I wanted to do something here. I used as many local resources as possible. No one's really

## Flights to D.C. begin Oct. 1

Breeze Air awarded federal air subsidy

OGDENSBURG -- Flights to Washington D.C. on Breeze Air's 137-passenger flights should begin Oct. 1.

U.S. Senate Majority Leader Charles E. Schumer said Tuesday that the U.S. Department of Transportation named Breeze Airways as Ogdensburg International Airport's new Essential Air Service carrier.

The Senator said that Breeze will be launching a new direct, daily route from Ogdensburg International Airport to Washington, D.C. starting on October 1st. In this year's five-year reauthorization of the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), Schumer secured more than double the funding for the Essential Air Service program to guarantee service to smaller and rural communities. In October, Breeze will start offering flights between Washington, DC's Dulles International Airport and Ogdensburg.

The Ogdensburg Bridge and Port Authority had been awaiting the news since June, when they voted in favor of awarding the Essential Air Service Contract to Breeze. Officials said the airline's larger jets fit with the Port Authority's vision.

"It's official Breeze is landing in Ogdensburg! Breeze expanding its service in the North Country with flights between Ogdensburg and DC is great

## Crypto mining concerns

Massena residents can chime in on crypto laws

MASSENA — Town residents will have opportunities to offer their input during two public hearings during the town board's Sept. 18 meeting, including

Town officials will meet at 4:30 p.m., first hosting a public hearing to consider overriding the 2% tax cap as is required by state law.

Town Supervisor Sue Bellor said the public hearing is a technicality that allows the town to exceed the tax cap, if necessary, but does not guarantee the town will actually exceed it.

"We do this every year. That does not mean we will exceed the tax cap but this would give us the authority to do so, if we found it absolutely necessary," she said.

Bellor said during a recent meeting of town supervisors that state officials highly recommended passing the resolution to override the

tax cap out of an abundance of caution.

Following the tax cap public hearing, the board will then hold a second public hearing to potentially adopt a local law that would put in place regulations for crypto currency and data mining operations in the town.

The regulations have been in the works for literally years now, following multiple extensions of a moratorium that was put in place following numerous complaints related to operations in the town that utilized sea box shipping containers as opposed to proper, permanent structures as will be required under the new regulations.

The public hearing will also allow the town board to extend the moratorium for an additional six months, if necessary.

Town Attorney Eric Gustafson said the option would give the board options in the

# North Star Health adding ambulance service to help with facility transfers

New service will supplement local agencies, says CEO

OGDENSBURG -- North Star Health Alliance, which includes Ogdensburg and Carthage hospitals, will soon launch its own ambulance service to ensure critical access transports can be completed.

CEO Richard Duvall said the ambulance service is being launched to supplement local agencies with a primary focus on transportation from facilities to other facilities.

"One of the challenges we've been faced with all over the North Country is the availability of ambulance services to transport patients who need higher levels of care than we can provide locally," he said. "In recent years it's been harder for EMS providers to find staff and volunteers."

Duvall said that locally things have been difficult. In recent weeks

he said that a Watertown ambulance was used to transport an Ogdensburg patient to Syracuse, because local options weren't available.

"That's not a situation that anyone wants to see," he said.

Duvall said that while the North Star ambulance services could help with local emergency transports, that's not their primary intent or purpose.

"We really just want to alleviate the problem with patient transfers," he said.

Duvall said he expects to add three ambulances with one at Claxton-Hepburn Medical Center one at Carthage Hospital and one as a backup.

Duvall said that even with the addition of North Star's ambulance services, they won't be able to handle all of the facility transports by themselves.

"This is going to supplement

existing services to meet the need," he said. "We have no expectation that we'll be able to do all of the transfers."

In a press release issued Sept. 18 North Star Health Alliance (NSHA) said the initiative is designed to ensure timely and reliable patient transfers within the region.

"The necessity for additional emergency medical providers has been well-documented by various agencies and highlighted by numerous media reports over the past several years. NSHA has recognized this gap and is actively seeking a Certificate of Need (CON) from the New York State Department of Health. This certificate will authorize the operation of an ambulance service across the tri-counties region, with a primary focus on facilitating inter-facility transfers," the release said.

According to the release, the proposed service will connect patients to and from North Star Health Alliance's network of hospitals, medical offices, school-based clinics, and outpatient facilities. Members of NSHA include Carthage Area Hospital (CAH), Claxton-Hepburn Medical Center (CHMC), North Country Orthopaedic Group (NCOG), Meadowbrook Terrace, and Rural Health Clinics in Carthage, Canton, Hammond, Madrid, Ogdensburg, Philadelphia, and Waddington. Additionally, the service will support school-based clinics located at Beaver River Central School, Carthage Middle School, Carthage High School, and LaFargeville Central School.

"Our goal is to ensure that patients receive prompt transport to higher levels of care while allowing local volunteer ambulance services to focus on community emergencies," said Dominic Doldo, Vice President of Emergency Services and Security at North Star Health Alliance.

"We are committed to supporting the communities we serve, and our new ambulance service will actively participate in county-wide mutual aid plans in Jefferson, Lewis, and St. Lawrence counties."

North Star Health Alliance anticipates receiving approval from the Department of Health and aims to commence operations by Jan. 1, 2025.

# Ogdensburg considers ban on sleeping in parks

Public hearing planned for Sept. 23

OGDENSBURG -- As the city faces growing reports of vagrancy and sanitary concerns in local parks, council has decided to enact a stricter curfew and probity overnight stays.

On Monday council set a public hearing that would allow the city to make several changes to the city code.

Under the proposal city code would be modified to close parks from 10 p.m. to 5 a.m. Previously parks had been closed at 11 p.m.

Additionally the city proposed a code change to end vehicular traffic at the city docks at 9 p.m.

Previously it had been allowed until 11 p.m.

Although the marina remains open to renters at all hours, quiet hours would run from 10 p.m. to 7 a.m. Previously quiet hours began at 11 p.m.

The city also proposed a code to prohibit towing tubes or other inflatable devices with passengers within 100 feet of the marina or municipal dock.

Although the city code already prohibited camping in parks, the section of the law would be changed to clarify that sleeping in parks overnight is no longer allowed without a permit.

It would also allow the city manager and chief of police to prohibit animals at certain events.

The hearing resolution was read by Police Chief Mark Kearns and approved unanimously by council.

Mayor Michael Tooley said that hearing would be held Sept. 23 at 6 p.m. at City Hall.

At that time the public will have the ability to share comments in favor or opposition of the proposal.

Following the hearing city council will likely act on a resolution making the proposed code changes into law.

Since 2021, Ogdensburg has seen an uptick in the number of homeless persons in the city.

That problem has been accompanied by a growing number of reports of needles, drug paraphernalia and feces found in public places.

Those issues and vandalism at local parks led the city to implement curfews at the city's parks and greenspaces.

The city also saw an uptick in small crimes at the same time the police department saw cuts, though some of those positions have since been restored.

Attempts were made to bolster a neighborhood watch program, but those plans haven't seen the level of participation the city had hoped.

The city has had some good news recently that could help some people find permanent homes in Ogdensburg.

A nearly \$10 million grant will allow STEP by STEP Inc. to bring 42 permanent housing units to the former Lincoln School property.

# Screwdriver attack alleged

BRASHER FALLS -- A Brasher Falls man is facing six charges following a domestic dispute in the town of Brasher Falls.

State Police say Nicholas J. Rubado, 39, was charged with arson 3rd, strangulation 2nd, criminal mischief: reckless property damage, criminal mischief 3rd, assault 2nd, and harassment 2nd following a dispute on Sept. 10.

According to police, troopers responded to a domestic incident involving a vehicle fire on Smith Street at 9:42 p.m.

An investigation determined Rubado and the victim were involved in a verbal argument which

turned physical when Rubado allegedly started to choke the victim and presented a screwdriver to stab the victim, police say.

The victim was able to get away from Rubado, though at some point during the altercation, Rubado is alleged to have set a 2007 Chevrolet Silverado truck on fire, also causing damage to a 2007 Honda Odyssey minivan, according to police.

Rubado was arrested, arraigned in Town of Massena Court and remanded to St. Lawrence County Correctional Facility in lieu of \$25,000 cash, \$50,000 secured bond or a \$100,000 partially secured bond.

# ATL to monitor air quality during demolition

MASSENA — Atlantic Testing Laboratories has been hired to monitor air quality of the former Massena Business School as the building is torn down to make way for a new green space and river walk.

The news came from the St. Lawrence County IDA as the organization recently approved the contract for the work.

The project, part of the village's Downtown Revitalization Initiative, is one of nine projects to receive a portion of the \$10 million award.

Village officials have said the project will assist in tying together the

downtown walking paths, making it easier for residents and visitors alike to access a planned riverwalk.

Once complete, the facade of the building will remain, with work to be completed to ensure the structure is safe.

Village and IDA officials both previously said the roof of the building has collapsed, rendering the structure unsafe to enter.

As part of the project, asbestos sampling and abatement activities will be needed, however with the roof in disrepair, that part of the project will be difficult.

Instead, Atlantic Testing will be onsite during the demolition process to ensure the demolition does not

negatively impact the air quality of the surrounding area, officials said.

Samples will be taken daily to ensure there are no elevated asbestos levels, IDA CEO Patrick Kelly said.

The project is expected to cost \$1.9 million from the DRI. Atlantic Testing will receive \$23,071 from the IDA for services rendered for the project.

Bids for demolition will be due by Oct. 1, with a bid expected to be awarded sometime in October. Demolition work should be complete by the end of the year, officials said.

The facade project will be the first major project to break ground in a public manner, though Mayor Greg Paquin recently said multiple projects are well under way with significant work being completed.

"As I've been saying since we received the award in 2021, it's a long process and it will take yard before the bulk of the work is underway and we really start to see the progress. But I can tell you, there has been a ton of work already underway behind the scenes and a lot more planned for the near future," he previously said.

Village Administrator Monique Chatland also spoke to the work schedules, saying many projects that were awarded funds have already begun but the work is not noticeable to the public just yet.

"There is a lot of work being conducted behind the scenes. The former J.J. Newberry project is one that has received a lot of grant funding aside from the DRI. A lot of steps need to be completed first, from structural reviews to asbestos abatement, planning reviews, bids for demolition and construction and that sort of thing. It's an extensive process to break ground on projects," she previously said.

Village officials recently said they hope to see some projects in progress by summer 2025, though no set timetables have been established just yet.

# County signs contract to stream meetings

CANTON -- St. Lawrence County has entered into a contract with CDW-G for the acquisition and installation of audiovisual equipment in the Board of Legislators chambers.

In a corresponding move, legislators also approved a budget modification along with the contract during the Sept. 9 full board meeting.

The contract for the audiovisual equipment is one that some legislators previously said was long overdue as the existing equipment was outdated and had no support in the event of a technical failure.

Officials said the need to integrate visual technology has developed significantly in the past several years, in particular as it relates to the ability to remotely attend a board or committee meeting.

During the COVID pandemic, the county legislature began broadcasting meetings with a live stream on Youtube. The broadcast was a way to meet state requirements for transparency in government and to allow for remote attendance by legislators.

But as the pandemic waned and other governmental institutions opted to do away with live streams, the county continued to broadcast the committee and full board meetings each month.

"Audiovisual technology has advanced significantly over the past few years, bringing new opportunities for cost-efficient, excellent results, and CDW-G has been a trusted partner of St. Lawrence County for many years and sourced

a similar system for Jefferson County with an exceptional outcome," the resolution states.

The contract and budget modification will cost \$130,403.

The launch of a new system was not entirely smooth during the full board meeting on July 1, with viewers met with silence due to a technical error.

County officials were able to quickly rectify the situation in time for the July 8 committee meeting.

The technical glitch came as the county legislature transitions to a new broadcasting system.

In early June, county officials posted a quick tutorial to inform viewers that the meetings would be hosted on a new platform, one that is designed specifically for municipalities that host meetings online.

Now viewers can view meetings, see all agenda and resolution documents and presentations in one convenient space.

Viewers who wish to view the meeting afterward will also have shortcuts available to skip to specific agenda items, public comment periods or presentations if they wish.

Agenda packets are also available for download in both PDF and Plain Text formats.

County officials say the move was done in hopes of creating a better viewing experience for everyone that would continue to allow for public engagement.

# Accused murderer to stand trial

CANTON -- A Lake Placid man accused of murdering two men in February 2023 and March 2023 is heading to trial beginning October 15.

Adam Smith, 48, stands accused of murdering Ronald Durham, 72, Gouverneur, and William Freeman, 67, Rossie last year.

Smith was indicted on charges of first and second degree murder, manslaughter, first degree robbery, and first degree assault for the Feb. 11, 2023 killing of Durham.

The indictment also charged Smith with the crimes of first and second degree murder, manslaughter, first degree robbery, and first degree assault, third and multiple accounts of fourth degree grand larceny for the March 1, 2023 killing of Freeman.

The larceny charges stem from Smith allegedly stealing Freeman's 2018 Chevy Silverado, before being apprehended by Jefferson County Sheriff's Deputies.

Smith was subsequently transferred back to St. Lawrence County, where the Sheriff's Office charged him with fourth-degree criminal possession of stolen property as well.

Smith was officially charged with second-degree murder in the death of Freeman on March 7.

At that time, former St. Lawrence County Sheriff Brooks Bigwarfe reported that Smith stabbed Freeman to death on March 1 in Freeman's trailer on County Route 10 in the town of Rossie.

Evidence gathered at the scene, coupled with Smith's criminal history and probation status quickly led police to him, according to the sheriff's department.

On Feb. 11 State Police responded to East Side Cemetery on Van Buren Road around 8:20 a.m. following a report of a deceased male.

When troopers arrived on the scene, they reportedly located Durham deceased under suspicious circumstances.

An autopsy has determined Durham died from sharp force injury to the neck.

During a press conference held last year, St. Lawrence County District Attorney Gary Pasqua said Smith was also involved in the killing of Durham. He was later charged.

Since his arrest, Smith has been an inmate at St. Lawrence County Correctional Facility.

County officials said interviews have been conducted by multiple departments, with leads followed up on that led to the arrest, with numerous search warrants issued on multiple properties, vehicles and locations relevant to the investigation.

Prior to Smith being a suspect, police had charged Frederick Wing, 22, with the murder of Durham. Wing was released from county jail on Friday, March 3 at the request of Pasqua and law enforcement after evidence came to light during the Freeman murder investigation that implicated Smith in the case.

According to Pasqua, the arrest was "not made on a whim" and was only made after physical evidence at the scene gave law enforcement probable cause to arrest Wing.

It still remains unclear what motivation Smith had for committing either crime, however both Bigwarfe and Pasqua previously confirmed the victims and Smith did have connections and these were not random acts of violence.

# 'People first' model could help homeless in Jefferson County

OGDENSBURG -- A peer service organization in Ogdensburg that's found success in helping displaced residents offered ideas to officials in neighboring Jefferson County at a housing summit Thursday.

A housing summit organized by Assemblyman Scott Gray, R-Watertown, connected St. Lawrence and Jefferson County officials to discuss the growing homeless population in the region.

Gray said that under the direction of David Bayne, Step By Step Inc. has created a model he believes can be a stepping stone for issues facing Jefferson County.

He said getting county, city and state officials in the same room allowed for a conversation about how to best leverage resources for the most effective outcomes.

Gray said one of things that makes Step By Step so unique is that staff members are peers who have experienced many of the same problems in their life as those they are seeking to help.

He said that creates a level of trust and rapport that can be hard for authority figures and civil servants to establish.

He said the "people first" model established by Step By Step could help Jefferson County officials make headway in helping house displaced residents in their communities.

The meeting began with a tour of Step By Step's Knox Street facility which provides housing. This summer a nearly \$10 million grant allowed STEP by STEP Inc. to add 42 permanent housing units to the former Lincoln School property which is expected to break ground soon.

In 2022, the organization completed a \$5.2 million apartment project which brought 20 units of supportive housing for adults with mental illness who have experienced homelessness.

Support services will be provided by STEP by STEP, which is a peer-run organization that strives to empower the members of the community "by establishing person-centered relationships, providing advocacy, educational, recovery, and social services, and creating affordable and safe housing opportunities."

STEP by STEP, Inc. opened its doors on June 1, 1997, and began as a one-room Drop-In-Center with a mission to provide people with mental health issues support as they move back to the larger community, according to Director David Bayne.

Since then the organization has grown substantially. The growth really picked up in 2018 with the acquisition of the former Lincoln School where the organization provides both housing and a warming center.

Bayne said the 42 units will help meet an unmet need in Ogdensburg and St. Lawrence County.

It's no secret that the city's seen a large

increase in displaced and homeless individuals in recent years.

The additional housing units could go a long way toward safe alternatives for those looking for permanent housing.

"The need in the area is growing day by day. When we added 20 units that was great now we'll be adding 42 more. It's not going to solve the problem overnight but it's going to go a long way to help," he said.

Bayne said the project offers direct access to essential support services for vulnerable residents in St. Lawrence County who are experiencing homelessness by providing safe, affordable housing.

"We are grateful for OTDA's Homeless Housing and Assistance Program and the state's steadfast commitment to expanding the supply of permanent supportive housing for vulnerable New Yorkers, and STEP by STEP is honored to be the awardee of this contract for St. Lawrence County."

The grants were awarded through a competitive process by the Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance's (OTDA) Homeless Housing and Assistance (HHAP) Program and are part of Hochul's \$25 billion comprehensive Housing Plan aimed at preserving and creating 100,000 affordable homes across the state, including 10,000 with support services for vulnerable populations.

# Local deer hunters eligible for \$60 ammo rebate through new DEC initiative

The Department of Environmental Conservation is offering a \$60 rebate for the purchase of non-lead ammunition for the 2024-25 hunting season.

To date, ammunition containing lead is still legal to use during big game hunting in New York State, though Senate Bill S4976A and Assembly Bill A2084A have sought to restrict the use of lead ammunition in the taking of wildlife on state-owned land and on land contributing to surface water to the New York City water supply.

DEC officials say the move to non-lead ammunition was spurred by an initiative to increase the state's bald eagle population.

"The bald eagle population has been steadily increasing in New York since the 1980s. While the bald eagle popula-

tion is soaring, research has shown that lead-related deaths have slowed population growth," officials said in a release.

One of the major concerns is bald eagles scavenging through entrails of harvested deer, which can prove deadly to bald eagles if lead fragments are left.

"A lead fragment as small as a grain of rice can be deadly to an eagle, and lead fragments can travel as far as 18 inches from the point of impact," officials said.

"A fundamental tenet of hunter safety is knowing your target and what is beyond it. The use of non-lead ammunition is an extension of that mindset to protect all scavenging animals, including eagles, from lead poisoning."

The rebate program and other initiatives to alleviate lead contamination are part of a state-wide, multi-year cooperative project among the Department of Environmental Conservation, Con-

servation Science Global, United States Geological Survey, and the New York Cooperative Fish and Wildlife Research Unit at Cornell.

"The goal of this project is to determine how the increased use of non-lead ammunition can improve the health of bald and golden eagle populations in NY. For the 2024-2025 hunting season, all licensed deer hunters in NY who purchase certified non-lead bullets, will be eligible for a \$60 rebate," DEC officials say.

In order to receive a rebate, participants are responsible for producing a receipt for certified non-lead bullets and must participate in a pre- and post-hunting season survey to be eligible.

The project has been in development for the past two years as the sheriff's office worked to get equipment and supplies for clearing and breaking/

The produce has been donated to the Office of the Aging and is distributed to residents of assisted living facilities, homebound residents they serve, and used in meal production.

To date, more than totes/boxes of vegetables and over 50 pumpkins have been donated and utilized by the Office of the Aging for the elderly of our communities throughout St. Lawrence County.

# Solar farms planned in Massena, Brasher, Norfolk

MASSENA — Two companies are planning solar projects in the town of Massena and Brasher, but first the public will have an opportunity to seek further information during public events.

Boralex, a solar developer, first initiated a proposed 200-megawatt project in 2021.

That project, known as the Two Rivers Solar Project, would be situated in the towns of Brasher and Massena.

Officials were on hand for a second public session Sept. 12, answering questions from the public during the three-hour event held at American Legion Post 675 in Winthrop.

The open house event featured information on the current project area, including results of field studies.

Officials also detailed an application the company will submit to the Office of Renewable Energy Siting (ORES).

The project, which will include solar arrays, will also require the installation of site roads, electrical interconnection to the power grid and a substation, according to the proposal.

Officials have said the project will utilize roughly 1,500 acres, though 3,000 acres has been studied to find the most suitable tracts of land.

According to the proposal, no battery storage structures are part of the project. If officials were to opt to include battery storage facilities, ORES would have to approve them, according to state regulations.

The project would begin construction in the fourth quarter of 2025, if approved.

Roughly 150 construction jobs would be created over an 18-month project, the proposal states.

The Gateway Solar Energy Center, centered in Brasher, Massena and Norfolk, is a proposal by a subsidiary of NextEra Energy Resources, LLC. The proposed 180-megawatt project is the second attempt in the last three years by the company to establish a major solar infrastructure project in the town following a failed attempt in 2022.

A similar, 180-megawatt project planned by NextEra energy was nixed in August 2022 after state officials on the state siting board determined the environmental impact would be extensive and damaging.

In testimony conducted on Nov. 17, 2021, Christopher Balk and Matthew Walter, both of whom are employed by the Department of Environmental Conservation, raised a number of concerns over the project including the impact it would have on the local ecosystem.

Siting board officials listed a number of reasons the project was denied, including negative impacts to wetlands consisting of two-thirds

of the project, along with concerns surrounding numerous endangered and threatened species.

Critics also highlighted the possibility of extending a PILOT to 15 years through the IDA, which goes against the norm of a 10-year PILOT other projects have procured in the past.

Critics of the project also showed concern over the lack of permanent job creation after officials revealed temporary construction positions would only last around a year, with

less than a dozen full-time staff required to maintain the project after completion.

Despite this, the subsidiary of NextEra is moving forward with another proposal that would see commercial-scale solar arrays, access roads, electrical collection lines and a new substation built in the project area.

The developer announced during a June 6 public meeting they intended to submit an application to ORES for the project by the end of August.

event something unexpected popped up during the public hearing. "I don't think that will be necessary, but I don't want us to be caught short," he said. The passage of the regulations would bring an end to a six-year journey for the town following discussions of a moratorium in July 2018. One of the major sticking points has been language that one existing operation said could limit their expansion possibilities in the future. North Country Colocation Services CEO David Fogel has attended a number of town board meetings in recent months, advocating for clarification of language that would allow a large-scale operation like NCCS to expand operations in

both existing and new structures if the operation is based in an industrial zone. NCCS is located in the former Alcoa East plant in an industrial zone. Fogel previously said the crypto operation will still go through proper channels when the time to expand occurs, including planning and zoning board reviews. "We will adhere to all existing regulations. Our intention is not to be grandfathered in to skip the entire process. We just wanted language included in potential regulations that would allow us to go to our potential investors, so we could show them that we could in fact expand our operation," he previously said. Fogel said a \$100 million expansion project was on hold due to the moratorium, something he and NCCS board members were keen to

move forward with soon. "We support the efforts of the town of Massena to adopt cryptocurrency mining regulations that address the concerns of Massena residents involving small cryptocurrency mining operators that are causing visual and noise nuisances and that may not be following applicable safety rules and regulations," Fogel said. Fogel said smaller operations operating in residential zones are the primary reason the regulations became necessary, something he said the town absolutely needed to move forward with. "NCCS is a large company, employing nearly 100 workers, and operates in an industrial zone with mining operations that do not present any of these same concerns. Our operations are inside buildings far away from residential areas and are run in a safe and ful-

ly compliant manner," Fogel said. He said it has always been a priority for the operation to be "good neighbors." "We follow all regulations, all laws. We're inspected by OSHA regularly. There is a lot of oversight for an operation like ours, in an industrial zone like the former Alcoa East plant. We've gone to great lengths to ensure everyone is safe, that we are following all regulations and are good neighbors," Fogel previously said. But before that, the town board and various department heads will review budget requests for the 2025 budget. The review will begin at 2:30 p.m. on Wednesday, Sept. 18 following weeks of preparation by departments. Bellor previously told department heads she hoped to see budget proposals submitted by July 31

so the town could begin work on the next budget. Bellor also welcomed department heads to meet with her individually before the meeting to discuss budget proposals if they felt it was necessary. Scheduled to be at the 2:30 p.m. budget session are representatives from the Celine G. Philibert Cultural Centre and Museum, dog control officer, Greater Massena Chamber of Commerce, Highway Department, Museum International Airport and Massena Public Library. Beginning at 3:30 p.m., the board will meet with the Massena Senior Citizens representatives, as well as Massena Meals on Wheels, town assessor, town clerk and tax office. All workshops are open to the public and will be held in room 30 at the town hall.

doing this stuff here and I thought it would be cool to do something made here, by people from here," he said.

Henry said his production company Ignorant Tourist Productions, LLC., was established with the hopes of creating a production company that can make movies here.

"It would be nice to say that movies on Amazon and Netflix were filmed here someday. I think that's kind of what we achieved here with this film. When you turn on the T.V. and you see people you know like Kim Snyder or Eddie Randle, it's really cool," he said.

The movie's namesake Severance Mountain is a real location in the Adirondacks in Essex County.

Henry said the name was too good not to use, but said a lot of the film was actually shot in the Adirondack foothills in St. Lawrence County.

Henry said Severance Mountain features some elements of classic horror and is paced to keep the tension high.

Henry said that nearly all of the movie is done with practical effects he fashioned by refurbishing and sculpting props he collected over the years.

He said only one scene is digitally altered and said that work was done by a friend in the Ukraine.

"It was actually pretty crazy," he said. "Oleksander was working on this for me when Russia invaded. And he would contact me on and off. He'd be in a bunker for days and then come back and work on this scene for me. It was pretty crazy

This decision is a win-win-win for Breeze, Ogdensburg, and the North Country's economy. Ogdensburg International Airport is a gateway for commerce, tourism, and travel for North Country residents. The sky is the limit for Breeze and Ogdensburg."

Ogdensburg officials offered appreciation for the news.

"On behalf of the OBPA and community we serve, I would like to thank Senator Schumer for working with USDOT to ensure that there is no interruption of air service in Ogdensburg. The launch of Breeze Airways at Ogdensburg International Airport is a pivotal moment for our airport and our region, and the Senators efforts to cut through the red tape and make that happen are sincerely appreciated," said Steve Lawrence, Executive Director of the Ogdensburg Bridge and Port Authority. "We are confident this new service to Washington, D.C. will not only meet the needs of local travelers but also stimulate economic growth in the area."

The Department of Transportation's Essential Air Service program subsidizes trips between smaller and larger airports to ensure access to travel for smaller and rural communities.

**Breeze Air will offer 137 passenger flights with wi-fi. The company has also expressed interest in adding additional destinations in the future.**

Schumer has support a bill to ensure NY's airports are adequately funded and in this year's FAA bill secured an over 111% funding increase per year to strengthen the Essential Air Service (EAS) program and ensure small and rural communities maintain regular commercial service.

The bill also makes it harder for airlines to terminate contracts that could leave communities without air service by incentivizing airports to keep their essential air service contracts, protecting families in areas that would not have easy access to an airport without the small one in their community.

Ogdensburg International Airport is one of five airports in New York state that currently depends on this critical program.

Breeze Airways proposal provides a 137-passenger jet with one daily round trip flight from Ogdensburg to Washington D.C. One-way fares were estimated at around \$60.

Breeze is also in ongoing conversations with the airport about offering flights outside of the EAS proposal that could include flights to Florida.

Breeze Air representative Eric

Fletcher noted that he was formerly an employee of Allegiant Air, which once offered flights from Ogdensburg to Florida, which were not part of an EAS contract.

He said Breeze Air currently offers that service in Plattsburgh and says market data suggests that such flights could be profitable in Ogdensburg, despite being ineligible for federal subsidies.

The weakness in Breeze's proposal is the lack of interline partnerships. Fletcher said that while he believes that such partnerships will exist by 2024, at this time he can't share details.

Essentially that would mean travelers would need to book their connecting flights from D.C. separately, if such deals do not come to fruition.

As for strengths, the larger jet planes tend to be more palatable for some fliers and the planes will include Wifi and options of three levels of seating ranging from general to first class.

Fletcher noted that the company believes it can capture the Canadian market in Ottawa with the flights to D.C.

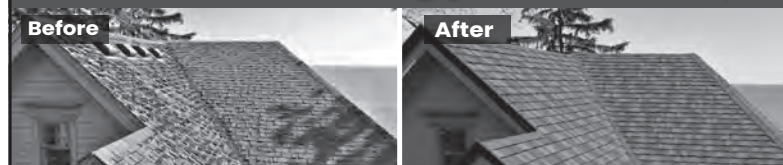

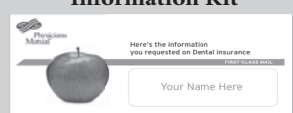
