Canton limits recording access

Lawmakers says safety at root of decision

CANTON -- In the wake of this year's surprise audit by a First Amendment group that created friction at the St. Lawrence County Courthouse in June, the Village Board has passed a policy on access to and recording in non-public forums.

"The First Amendment folks caused a lot of problems at the county level," stated Mayor Dalton.

Deputy Mayor Anna Sorensen, who authored the resolution, said the board had to take a look at spaces where people's private information is there and make those spaces on-public unless invited.

The Town of Canton has also adopted a similar policy.

The resolution passed Sept. 25 creates restrictions of access in non-public forums to protect the security and privacy of employee and taxpayer information.

"The Village is responsible for protecting the safety of employees, vendors, taxpayers and general public.

"The Village is responsible for protecting employees,' taxpayers' and

Slight hike expected in Potsdam taxes

Tentative budget will likely change before finalized

POTSDAM -- Although the numbers have yet to be finalized, town tax payers could see a slight increase in their tax rates in 2025.

Town officials are currently holding work sessions to hash out the final numbers for the budget but a tentative budget for the coming year shows an increase by \$1.93 per \$1,000 of assessed property value for the town's general fund.

This is a jump from the 2024 adopted budget of \$1.72 per \$1,000 of assessed value.

Total tax levy is also expected to increase for the general fund with the town projecting a collection of \$1,141,722 in 2025, a jump from the current year's levy of \$1,009,656.21.

The increases will help cover a hike in total appro-

priations the town is expecting in 2025.

Appropriations for the 2025 general fund in the tentative budget are projected to be \$2,027,022, up from the current year's \$1,995,356.21 million.

The town board, supervisor and department heads are expecting about a \$22,500 jump in employee retirement costs, a \$3,800 jump in hospital insurance for employees, and a \$55,000 jump in the town's contingency fund under special items.

Salary increases for town officials are forecasted in the 2025 fiscal plan, including a \$1,500 jump for the town clerk, \$1,395 for the deputy town clerk, \$1,050 for the town custodian, \$2,125 for the town highway superintendent, \$4,420 for the

Direct flights to Orlando, Fla. coming to SLC this winter

Those heading south for the winter can fly directly from Ogdensburg to Orlando, Fla. starting in February.

Breeze Airways will offer the direct flights for \$89 one way on Thursdays and Sundays from Feb. 13 through April 27.

The flights will depart from the city at 11:55 a.m. and arrive at 3:30 p.m. Orlando, Fla.

Charlie Garrelts, Ogdensburg International Airport Manager, said the new flights were wel-

comed news for those seeking warmer weather in the winter months.

"Say hello to new horizons," Garrelts said in a prepared statement. "Breeze Airways is connecting Ogdensburg to the vibrant warmth of Orlando—your gateway to sunshine and smiles starts here."

Breeze launched daily service to Washington Dulles on Friday and is the only carrier offering nonstop service on both new routes.

"Breeze is less than a week old in Ogdensburg and yet we're

announcing another new route today," David Neeleman, Breeze Airways' Founder and CEO said in a prepared statement. "Now in addition to daily service to the nation's capital, Ogdensburg Guests can also make a convenient and affordable winter getaway to Orlando for just \$89* one way."

Garrelts said as a promotion to celebrate the new flight options in Ogdensburg travelers can visit the airport in person on Tuesdays from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. to save 1/3

Are you ready to vote? You have to be registered!

YOU MAY NEED TO RE-REGISTER IF YOU:

- Have changed your name
- Moved — even across town, or especially from another place
- Haven't voted in recent elections

YOU MUST:

- Be a United States Citizen
- Be 18 years old by Election Day

Students attending local universities are eligible to vote in the town where they are living and attending classes, or can vote in their hometown elections.

They must register in St. Lawrence County to vote here; or vote by absentee ballot, Early Mail Ballot, Early Voting or In Person in their hometown.

Canton Town Board accepts low bid of \$492,775 for Miner Street Road paving

CANTON - Residents along the Miner Street Road and motorists will see a freshly-paved road to Taylor Park by Oct. 18 at the cost of nearly a half million dollars.

The Canton Town Board approved a low of \$492,775 from Paverite, Copenhagen, N.Y. at a Thursday afternoon meeting.

A second bid from Heidelberg Materials came in at \$521,531.25.

"Start up is to be determined by Paverite because they know there is a deadline. There is some pre-work that needs to be done that the high-

way department will be doing," said Town Supervisor Mary Ann Ashley. "When we have a definite date, we will notify you and publicly post it."

The road has been milled and had contracted with the St. Lawrence County Highway Department to perform the paving but county officials say that is no possible due to extensive emergency repair work from Hurricane Debby on Aug. 9.

The town agreed to put the job out to bid with a requirement to complete the work this paving season.

The paving phase of the Miner Street Road project is just one of the many challenges the town

council has faced.

Once completed, a stretch of the Miner Street Road from the village limits to Taylor Park will have two 10-foot driving lanes and mainly two 3-foot shoulders for pedestrian and bicycle use. That decision was made by the Canton Town Board at a special meeting on Wednesday, Sept. 4.

Original plans called for two 10-foot travel lanes and two 5-foot pedestrian and bicycling lanes. But once construction got underway, it was determined this roadway was not wide enough to accommodate these specs.

SLC blighted property cleanup continues

CANTON -- If you drive around the county you may notice a number of properties have been cleaned up in recent years after sitting vacant for years.

That's due in large part to St. Lawrence County's blighted property program.

St. Lawrence County Attorney Steve Button said the program has been a major success for the county, allowing for dozens of properties with unsafe structures to undergo remediation.

Once structures are removed, the property can then go back on the tax rolls through auction, Button said.

"The legislature and my office view this program as a top priority. This is a way to restore communities, to remove unsafe structures

and to put properties back on the tax rolls," he said.

Funding for the program comes from the state, with hundreds of thousands of dollars spent every year to clean up blighted properties that have long been in violation of local, county and state codes.

Button said he is confident the program will continue on in the future as well.

"The county legislature will continue to support the program, as well the state, allowing us to clean up more properties in the future. We're very confident this program will continue to be a success," he said. Currently, five properties are undergoing cleanup, including in the towns of Canton and Potsdam, the village of Massena and Pitcairn, Button said.

Village of Massena officials say they were notified last month that properties at 56 and 58 Sycamore

Street would be cleaned up as part of the program.

Those properties were deemed to be unsafe structures and will be torn down by the end of the year.

Button also touched on another program that cleans up properties with possible environmental contamination, like old gas stations and dry cleaners for instance.

He said that program, which began in 2015, has crossed the century mark this year with the 100th property cleanup.

Button said funding for the program comes from the state Oil Spill Fund with cleanups conducted by the state Department of Environmental Conservation.

"We really need to give the Comptroller's Office a great deal of credit for their support of the program, as well as the DEC. Without their support we wouldn't be able to do this," Button said.

Village of Potsdam using \$425,000 grant to offset new salt barn costs

POTSDAM - The village has received more than \$400,000 in expected New York State Touring Routes Program grant money to reimburse the expense of putting up its new salt barn.

Village Administrator Isabelle Gates-Shult told the village board at its meeting Monday, Sept. 24 that the village had received the money and that it was offsetting the cost of the new barn that was constructed last year.

"These funds reimburse the three installments made on the

72-by-100-foot salt barn in 2023. These included payments made in February of 2023 for \$106,000, July of 2023 for \$213,000 and then September of 2023 for \$106,000," Gates-Shult said.

The administrator clarified that the funds the village received would reimburse the purchase of the salt barn and its construction that the village made up front in 2023.

That expense was initially covered by the village's fund balance.

The new barn was built at the village DPW facility off Cherry Street by village personnel and Hybrid Building Solutions of Pembroke and completed in October of last year.

In addition to the grant money to reimburse the project, the village was able to save money on the pavement resurfacing at the site of the salt barn as well. The state provided millings from its Pierrepont Avenue resurfacing project which the village was able to use to backfill the site saving them around \$140,000.

SLC receives 'Emergency Disaster Declaration' following flooding Aug. 9-10

President Joe Biden has approved a Major Disaster Declaration that will provide federal assistance to communities impacted by tropical storm Debby August 8-10.

With the declaration in place, federal financial assistance can be secured to support public infrastructure reconstruction efforts in St. Lawrence County, state officials said.

The funds would come through the Federal Emergency Management Agency's Public Assistance Program, providing funding to local governments and eligible non-profits for debris removal, protective measures, and repairs to buildings and infrastructure, including roads, bridges, water and wastewater treatment facilities, critical infrastructure sites, schools, parks and other facilities.

St. Lawrence County Superintendent of Highways Don Chambers said the county has been continually documenting damages to county infrastructure, with the documentation expected to be used as part of the county's submission to the state for aid.

St. Lawrence County was hit particularly hard by the storm on Aug. 9 and 10, with record amounts of rainfall in many municipalities.

According to the NWS, some

areas throughout the county saw in excess of seven inches of total rainfall, including areas near Colton, South Colton and Fowler.

"One aspect of this event was the impressive rainfall rates observed in the core of the heaviest precipitation swath. Within this band, precipitable water (PWAT) values, or the amount of water held in the atmospheric water column, ranged from 2.1 to 2.4 inches. These values approached record levels for the date as interpreted by the NOAA/NWS Storm Prediction Center's Atmospheric Sounding Archive, using Albany, NY as a closest proxy," the NWS said in the report.

On average, rainfall throughout the county was over 2" per hour at the peak of the storm, according to the NWS.

According to the report, a 50 to 70 mile swath of excessive rainfall struck the county and northwestern Franklin County, leading to a much higher average rainfall total that peaked at 7.35" in North Lawrence.

North Emeryville was also hit hard, with 7.1" of total rainfall.

Norwood saw 6.6" in total rainfall, with Hermon not far behind with 6.49"

Potsdam was struck with 4.91" total, while Canton saw 3.86", according to the NWS.

Massena saw 4.25" of rainfall,

while Gouverneur saw 3.92" total.

That excess rainfall had a significant impact on infrastructure like highways throughout St. Lawrence County, causing damage that will cost millions of dollars to repair.

St. Lawrence County legislators passed a resolution during the Aug. 26 Finance Committee meeting, authorizing \$650,000 for emergency road and structure repairs to reopen all affected roads.

Chambers said the work to repair many roads and structural projects like culvert replacement are still underway, with crews having begun the work just hours after the storm subsided Aug. 9.

"It's going to likely be into the several million dollars to complete repairs even though we have, for example, some bridges that have already been replaced or had extensive repairs," he said.

Chambers said the \$650,000 the resolution approved spending is just for emergency repairs to ensure "roads are safe to the traveling public."

Website to provide Deer River updates

BRASHER -- Following significant pushback from citizens during a public town hall meeting recently, North Country Dairy officials have made good on their promise to create a website to keep the community updated on operations after contamination in the Deer River was cited to the dairy plant.

DEC officials first met with residents July 23 in an attempt to offer updates regarding the ongoing investigation into the contamination, detailing a number of reports and

aspects of the investigation.

DEC officials previously released a statement which said the department determined the growth to be primarily *Leptomitius lacteus*, "a filamentous microorganism similar to a fungus."

The growth was later identified to have come from North Country Dairy, a dairy processing plant along the river in North Lawrence that makes Greek yogurt.

Though DEC officials and North Country Dairy officials offered very different views and opinions on the source of the contamination and necessary remediation to clean up the 12 mile stretch of the river, residents

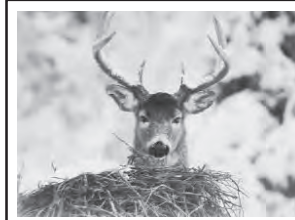
were happy to learn dairy officials were at least willing to establish the website.

The website contains information for the public, including background materials like Freedom of Information requests and responses from the DEC and U.S. Environmental Protection Agency related to the ongoing investigation.

The website also features EPA data for the plant.

To date, the plant has been issued two notices of violation related to the contamination.

**TOWN OF PARISHVILLE
LOCAL LAW NO 01 OF 2024
WATER RENTS AND ASSESSMENTS**

Local Law entitled “Water Rents and Assessments” establishing and imposing water use charges (assessments and rents) in Water District No. 1 in the Town of Parishville, St. Lawrence County, New York (herein after referred to as “The Town”). Be it enacted by the Town board of Parishville as follows:

ARTICLE 1. PURPOSE.

It is hereby determined and declared to be necessary and conducive to the protection of the public health, safety, welfare and convenience of Water District #1 of the Town of Parishville (hereinafter called the District), to levy and collect special assessments; from all lands or parcels located within the district and, in addition, water rents from all premises served by having connections to the water system of said District as may now be constituted or as may hereinafter be improved or extended, the proceeds of such levies so derived to be for the use of said District as hereinafter provided.

ARTICLE 2. DEFINITIONS.

Unless the context of this law indicates otherwise, the meaning of terms used in this law shall be as follows: “Connection Charge” (tap fee) — This shall mean a one-time fee to offset District expenses Incurred in processing of an application for service and the connection of a service line to the public mains, including construction, plan review, permit issuance, legal or engineering costs and inspection costs. “Water Rent” — this shall mean the annual charged levied upon all premises connected to the water system to cover the district expenses incurred to operate and maintain the District’s facilities. “Equivalent Dwelling or EDU” — An EDU is a unit of water flow, expressed in gallons per day equivalent to the use by an average single family residence. Determination of, and adjustments to, the number of EDU’s for each “lot” or “user” shall be made on the basis of the amount of water used and maximum rate of flow of water. “Lot” — a lot is a unit of real estate ownership. Lots shall be calculated based upon the most current information available in the St. Lawrence County Real Property Office unless lands have been legally subdivided or joined. In the event of a legal subdivision, the lots as shown on the subdivision map shall control “Status Date” — January of each year. “User” a user is any lot, building or facility to which water is provided.

ARTICLE 3. GENERAL

SECTION 1. DEBT SERVICE, BENEFIT ASSESSMENT. The source of revenues for retiring debt service, funding capital reserve accounts and funding capital expenditures shall be a benefit assessment pursuant to Town Law Section 202. It is hereby determined that each lot within the District will be benefited by the establishment of the water system on the basis of EDU’s. The annual benefit assessment per EDU shall be established by the Town Board by local law or resolution no later than the last day established by law from time to time for the adoption of the Town Budget.

The cost and expense of the establishment of the District and of construction of the system and improvements thereto, including all costs shall be assessed against each of the parcels in the district in proportion to the benefit received as set forth above.

Revenue derived from benefit assessments, including penalties and interest, shall be credited to a special fund to be known as the Water Capital Projects Fund The monies in such fund shall be used to pay all proper costs of establishment of the District improvements, including interest, as set forth in Town Law Section 202.

SECTION 2. RENTS. The source of revenues for operation and maintenance shall be water rents collected pursuant to the adoption of Local Law in accordance with Municipal Law.

It is hereby determined that the annual costs of operation and maintenance of the District shall be charged to the users connected to said system on the basis of EDU’s.

The annual fee per EDU shall be established by the Town Board, by local law, following a public hearing and in accordance with Municipal Law of NY S.

Revenue derived from water rents, including any penalties and interest, shall be credited to a fund to be known as the Water Operating and Maintenance Fund. The monies from such fund shall be used pursuant to and in accordance with Municipal Law. Such funds may be used for construction or debt service costs only to the extent such funds are not necessary for operation, maintenance and related costs.

SECTION 3. BILLING AND COLLECTION.

(A) General

Benefit assessments and water rents shall be billed as separate items for each lot or user in the District. Benefit assessments and rents may be combined on the same bill at the District’s convenience.

(B) Assessment

Bills for the benefit assessment shall be mailed, via regular mail, on a quarterly, semiannual or annual basis as determined by the Town Board from time to time.

Assessments shall commence in the year that substantial “commencement” of operation of the system begins.

(C) Water Rent

Bills for water rent shall be mailed, via regular mail, on a monthly, quarterly, semi-annual or annual basis as determined by the Town Board from time to time.

(D) Payment and Interest

Payment shall be made by the due date specified on the bill. In addition to the charges specified herein, a penalty charge of 8% of such amount shall be added thereto in the event of failure to make payment by the due date. An additional one-half of 1% shall be added for each month thereafter, and (he total thus obtained will be the charge in each case.

(E) Non-Payment

All benefit assessments and water rents imposed on any lot shall constitute a lien upon such lot. The lien shall be prior to and superior to every other lien or claim except the lien of an existing tax assessment or other lawful charge imposed by or for the State or a political subdivision or district thereof.

If any benefit assessment or water rent remains unpaid on November 10th of each year, it shall be certified to the Town Supervisor who shall cause said sums and all interest and penalties to be placed on the next real property tax bill for such lot to be collected as other Town taxes are collected.

(F) Water Rent for connections After Effective Date

For any lot, land, building or premise from which connection is made to the District system or which begins to receive service from the District system, after this law becomes effective, the rent charge shall be pro-rated, except rent shall be for not less than one month in duration.

ARTICLE 4. ASSIGNMENT OF EDU's

Section 1. GENERAL

The EDU’s set forth in Table 1 shall be presumptively correct. EDU’s for any use not described on Table shall be established by the Town Board, taking into account the existing system capacity, the requirements of this local law and the values in Table 3 “Expected Hydraulic

Loading Rates” of the 1988 Design Standards for Wastewater Treatment Works published by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation.

Section 2. Water Flow Adjustments

When determined necessary by the Town board for a particular facility, the number of EDU’s assigned to any premises shall be adjusted in consideration of the peak water flow rate for facilities which consume water at a rate of 75 gallons per minute (GPM) or larger for periods lasting more than 15 minutes on a periodic basis as follows:

Adjustment factor: Maximum Flow Rate (in GPM)
Assigned number of EDU(s) x 3

The number of EDU’s assigned to the facility shall be EDU’s, as otherwise herein determined, times the adjustment factor. The adjustment factor shall not be less than 1.15.

Section 3. EDU Adjustments

For each residential dwelling containing more than one (1) family unit or apartment, one (1) user unit shall be charged to each family unit or apartment, except as defined in table No. 1.

For each commercial establishment and using more than 200 gallons of water per day average, additional EDU’s, in increments not less than ½ of an EDU, shall be applied to each additional 200 gallons of water, or portion thereof, used per day on average.

For each building containing family units or apartments in addition to commercial establishments, each family unit, apartment and commercial establishment therein contained shall be assigned additional EDU’s as defined in table No. 1.

The number of EDU’s for specific facilities located within the District shall be as contained in Table No. 1. Attached hereto or otherwise determined by the Town Board.

ARTICLE 5. CONNECTION

(A) General

Every owner of real property within the District on which a structure is used for commercial purposes, or on any parcel on which any structure is built which, if serviced by a private water system would be considered a public water system by the New York State Health Department, shall cause such property to be connected to the District system within sixty (60) days of the completion of the district system or the building’s construction, which ever comes first. After such connection, all private wells and pipes shall be filled with a suitable substance acceptable to the NYS DOH.

The Town board shall establish a connection fee from time to time. Said foregoing mandatory connection policy shall be subject to the availability of sufficient water source capacity and sufficient main flows in the District system. Should such capacity not exist, no connection shall be made.

(B) Variance

Any owner of real property within the District may apply to the Town Board, in writing, for a variance from this mandatory connection requirement. The application for variance must be received within 180 days from the effective date of this local law, or prior to commencement of constructing any new building. A variance will only be granted if (1) compliance with this section will divest the property owner of a substantial portion of the usefulness of the land and (2) the building is serviced by a properly working private water supply system which meets all applicable laws, rules and regulations.

Any such variance shall be valid for one (1) year only and must be re-applied for before the expiration of such one (1) year period. Any such variance shall run with the land and shall not be personal to the owner of such land. Any lot or building required to be connected to the District system which is not so connected shall be subject to a penalty which shall be equal to the water rents which would be charged if such property was properly connected, this section is made and provided in the exercise of the police powers of the Town. The form of variance applications shall conform to Attachment No. hereto. The application shall be rejected if the application form is not fully and neatly completed containing all information at the time it is submitted. The burden of proof any the onsite water supply system complies fully with the New York State Sanitary Code shall reside with the applicant.

The Town may elect to perform sampling, tests, and all other such investigations to verify compliance with the code.

ARTICLE 6. COLLECTIONS.

•All charges levied pursuant to this law shall be collected by the Town Clerk or other such official authorized by the Town Board. Payment of all water rents shall be submitted to the Town office in person, via U.S. mail or online by credit card payment.

ARTICLE 7. ENFORCEMENT AND REGULATIONS.

The Town Board shall make and enforce such rules and regulations as it may deem necessary for the safe, economical and efficient management and protection of the District system, for the construction and use of building connections to the District system, and for the regulation, collection, rebating and refunding of any charges.

ARTICLE 8. VALIDITY AND SEPARABILITY.

SECTION 1. Validity. All local laws or parts of local laws in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. Separability. The invalidity of any section, clause, sentence or provision of this Local Law shall not affect the validity of any other part of this local law which can be given effect without invalid part or parts.

ARTICLE 9. SCHEDULE OF CHARGES.

The Town Board shall adopt a schedule of charges by Local Law or resolution each year setting forth amounts and effective dates and charges for at least the following items: water connection charge, benefit assessment per EDU, water rent per EDU, annual variance fee and other such items as deemed appropriate and as contained in Table No.2.

ARTICLE -10. LOCAL LAW IN FORCE.

This local law shall be in full force and effective immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

ARTICLE 11 - LIMITATIONS ON USAGE DURING PERIODS OF DROUGHT

11.1 Limitations on Use:

During drought conditions or during periods of excessive usage of water, or other conditions for which water conservation is justified, the Chief Water System Operator shall have the power to impose limitations on the use of water for non-essential purposes such as lawn watering, car washing, and similar uses. Limitations shall be imposed in the form stages as defined in this law.

11 .2 Water Conservation Stages:

Water conservation restrictions shall be as follows:

Stage I — Water Conservation Measures:
When the Chief Water System Operator has announced that Stage 1 water conservation measures are in effect, the following uses of water will be prohibited:

- Filling of swimming pools, including “water hauls” by the Fire Department.
- Use of any lawn or garden sprinkler between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. or using more than two average size residential grade sprinklers in excess of three (3) hours per day outside these hours.

Stage II Water Conservation Measures:

When the Chief Water System Operator has announced that Stage II water conservation measures are in effect, the following uses of water will be prohibited:

- Filling of swimming pools, including “water hauls” by the Fire Department

- Use of any lawn or garden sprinkler between the hours of 6:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. or using more than one average size residential grade sprinkler in excess of one (1) hour per day outside these hours,
- Washing of motor vehicles between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Stage III — Water Conservation Measures:

When the Chief Water System Operator has announced that Stage III water conservation measures are in effect, the following uses of water be prohibited:

- Filling of swimming pools, including “water hauls” by the Fire Department.
- Use of any lawn or garden sprinklers at any time. Use of water cans to water gardens and/or plantings of limited extent is acceptable.
- Washing of motor vehicles at any time.

Stage IV — Water Conservation Measures:

When the Chief Water System Operator has announced that Stage IV water conservation measures are in effect, the following uses of water will be prohibited:

- Filling of swimming pools, including “water hauls” by the Fire Department.
- Use of any lawn or garden sprinklers at any time.
- Washing of motor vehicles at any time.
- Using in excess of ten (10) gallons per day per lot for watering of flowers, gardens or plantings of any sort.
- Any other use for which the Chief Water System Operator determines to be wasteful,

11.3 Public Notification

The Chief Water System Operator shall be responsible to provide notification to the public via announcements on publicly broadcasted radio stations, posting of notices prominently at all Town owned buildings and Other public places (i.e. stores, Post Office, etc.)

11.4 Penalty for Non-Compliance

Persons violating this provision shall be subject to the following penalties and/or fees:
1st Violation: A written notification via mail or personal delivery and fee of \$10 which will be suspended if no further violations occur within one year.
Subsequent violation(s): (following written notification)-\$50 per day.
Continual violation(s): The water service to the lot or premises will be terminated after 30 days,

SLC unemployment higher than state

The unemployment rate in St. Lawrence County in August was 5.1%, without seasonal adjustment, 0.7 percent higher than the New York state seasonally adjusted rate.

According to a state Department of Labor report issued this week, the county's unemployment rate increased 0.3 percent when comparing August 2023 to August 2024. The unemployment rate in St. Lawrence Coun-

ty currently sits at 5.1% The state unemployment rate is 4.4 percent.

In neighboring counties, the unemployment in Jefferson County is 4.3 percent, up 0.2 percent from 4.1 percent in August 2023.

The unemployment rate in Franklin County is 3.9, a 0.1 percent increase from a year ago.

Lewis County's unemployment rate also rose 0.1 percent

when compared to August 2023, up to 4.0 percent.

Labor force statistics, including the unemployment rate, for New York and every other state are based on statistical regression models specified by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. These are the most up-to-date estimates of persons employed and unemployed by place of residence.

town assessor, \$1,515 for the assessor clerk, \$10,000 for the town supervisor, \$1,175 for the supervisor's confidential secretary, \$1,395 for the deputy court clerk and \$1,520 for the town court clerk.

Drops in expenses for the town's general fund for the coming year include: a salary reduction for the supervisor's bookkeeper to \$25,000 from \$43,260, a \$13,000 drop for a data collector for the assessor's office, a \$30,000 drop on the grant line under the special items section of the budget, and a \$10,000 decrease for software.

Under the 2025 plan, the town is also budgeting \$200,000 again for the town-wide tax revaluation to hire outside firm GAR Associates.

Besides taxes, the town's total revenues to cover 2025 appropriations do not yet add in a \$300,000 appropriated fund balance that town officials used to balance things in 2024. So expected revenues outside of taxes are lower for 2025 than the current year at this point. However, all of the numbers listed above are subject to change as town officials hone down the general fund budget.

Highway budgets

The town is also working out its 2025 Highway DA budget.

This budget features an increase in total appropriations expected at \$1,091,053 in 2025 versus \$1,076,850 in 2024.

However, thanks to an expected increase in revenues, the tax levy is expected to drop to \$985,053 from \$995,850.51. The tax rate is similarly anticipated to drop to 1.67 from 1.7.

The town's Highway DB budget also anticipates an increase in appropriations at \$1,416,530.48 in 2025, versus \$1,371,091.53 in 2024.

Those appropriations are covered

by incoming revenues, and taxes won't be levied.

Other budgets

Besides the general fund and town highway budgets, the town also is mulling over its budgets for:

- Town Outside which shows a drop of a few thousand dollars in total appropriations and is covered by incoming revenues, not taxes.

- Potsdam, Hannawa, West Potsdam and Norwood fire contracts. These feature a slight decrease in the tax levy in 2025 at \$358,500, down from \$363,400 in the current year. The 2025 tax rate for the fire budgets is currently estimated to be 1.109 per \$1,000 of assessed property value, down from 1.126 for 2024.

- Hewittville and Sissonville lighting districts which are covered by the residents living in the districts.

- The town's sewer budget which features a slight increase in appropriations at \$33,747.81, up from \$33,402.06 in the current year. A tax levy of \$18,387.81 will help pay for the budget, down slightly from the current year.

- The water budget for the town also features a slight increase in appropriations in the 2025 plan at \$26,000, up from \$25,500 in 2024. The tax levy in 2025 is expected to be down slightly at \$18,120 from \$19,600 in 2024.

- The town's Route 56 Sewer District budget features an increase to \$63,968 in 2025 versus \$25,710 in 2024. The appropriations are covered by the town's debt service bond it has secured to cover the district's cost until grant funding and fees can be applied in the future.

- And, the town's Route 56 Water District. The appropriations for this district are expected to be \$63,968, up from the \$25,710 in 2024. Again, these expenses are covered by the town's debt service bond it has

secured.

The town is expected to hold other work sessions to zero in on the budget numbers. Once the tentative budget is approved as a preliminary budget, the town will host a public hearing before finally passing the 2025 plan.

The town's deadline for passing the budget is Nov. 7.

how important it is for our smaller communities to stay connected to a key hub and the national travel network, and I'm grateful that the program helped Breeze land in St. Lawrence County making this expansion possible. The sky is the limit for Breeze and Ogdensburg," Schumer said in a prepared statement.

The Airbus A220-300 aircraft flights allow for three levels of seating and fare bundles feature options for bags, seats, and inflight WiFi. The airline doesn't charge change or cancellation fees up to 60 minutes prior to departure and offers other benefits such as free family seating and a la carte pricing.

Breeze, which was recently ranked in the top five of Travel + Leisure's "Best Domestic Airlines" for the third year in a row, began selling service from just 16 cities in May 2021.

The airline is also offering flights to Dulles airport in Washington D.C. be purchased for \$49.

The flights leave from the city at around 5 p.m. daily. The flight is roughly 1.5 hours .

Passengers also soon have the option of flying from Dulles to other destinations including Provo, Utah, South Bend Indiana and Vero Beach Florida, but with the current schedule, doing so would require an overnight stay in D.C.

While the new flight options from Ogdensburg are welcomed, Breeze Airways currently lacks interline connections, which is a concern for some travelers.

The lack of interline agreements puts a bigger burden on passengers looking for connecting flights. They can't book them with a single purchase and they must recheck their luggage. While experienced flyers may not be bothered by that, it can be a hassle for those who have little knowledge of air travel.

Locally, community members have also raised concerns about the flights being in the afternoon, which can make it difficult to make connections.

Although it still remains a concern, OBPA leaders say they believe Breeze is still addressing the matter and hopes to hear good news on that front by the end of the year.

Free Trees for Gouverneur Street available from Canton Village Tree Committee

CANTON – The Canton Village Tree Committee continues its quest to enhance the natural beauty of the village by offering 15 or so free trees to be planted on Gouverneur Street this fall.

The committee is reaching out to Gouverneur Street property owners willing to have a tree planted between the residence or business and sidewalk. If you are interested then please send your name, address and email and phone number to: Canton Tree Committee Chair Lance W Rudiger at lrudiger@aol.com. "This year about 15 trees are planned for that area, so although you may not be selected for this opportunity, your information will be kept for further plantings. Canton Village has planted literally hundreds of trees in the past few years," Rudiger told North Country This Week.

"If you have a tree that is newly planted, it is critical for success to water the tree on a regular basis (every few days) the first year, and water when things are dry in warm months. Watering needs to be maintained beginning in May and ending in September. The greatest cause of failure is usually lack of water or damage from weed eaters, lawn mowers and human interference," he noted.

The Canton Village Tree Committee implemented a tree program around 2010 and has planted numerous trees throughout the village since then.

"Since the Village created the Tree Committee we looked at the village trees and decided to first direct attention to the entrances. Of course, the NYS project of road

construction helped to replant a lot on Main Street from Stewart's to the light at the Cascade. We were able to pretty much plant the rest of Main Street/Route 68 from that light to the village border at Coakley's. State Street, Riverside Drive, Park Street were also pretty much planted," Rudiger said.

"All the entrances to Canton have flowering crabapple trees planted. That left Gouverneur Street which was not very picturesque. I approached SUNY Canton and St Lawrence and they were thrilled to hear that an improvement was planned for that entrance--especially considering graduation time when flowering trees and green trees on that Route 11 entrance would be blossoming. This is an effort to try to continue on that improvement path."

The tree planting program is funded from various grants and also village support.

"We are hoping to make people aware of the overall project and also get some applications we might have not thought of or missed. We hope to plant again in the spring and fall of each year but the emphasis on location will vary as to need. The Gouverneur Street planting have had a focus on flowering trees and also specimen trees," Rudiger stated.

He said last year the Tree Committee replaced all the missing trees for Main Street and plantings on Rt. 68 and in the parks. Since the Tree Committee was created literally hundreds of trees have been planted in the village.

"When a front yard tree is cut we ask that the homeowner contact us if they wish to have a replacement. It is not a guarantee but most of the requests get fulfilled," he said.

SUNY Canton's CDL training expands with tractor-trailer donation

CANTON – A new tractor-trailer, new classes and new ways to fund license learning courses are driving SUNY Canton's Commercial Driver's License (CDL) program forward without tapping the brakes.

The college recently received a \$50,000 gift from the Garrett Family Fund to purchase a blue 2016 Freightliner Cascadia 125 and new trailers for the program. It was the latest in a series of generous donations given by Carthage native and 1972 SUNY Canton graduate Donald F. (Don) Garrett and his wife, Jamie Rhoads Garrett.

"We are honored by Don and Jamie's continued support of our college's initiatives," said Vice President for Advancement Tracey Thompson Hastings. "Their donations have paved the way for new opportunities for students in the Canino School of Engineering Technology and now will help fund our

thriving continuing education and workforce development programs."

Don was inducted into the college-wide Hall of Fame in 2022, recognizing his continuing support and career achievements.

The CDL program has expanded its classes, including CDL-B and CDL-B to A tracks, which are designed to prepare even more drivers for their license examinations.

The program also offers drivers the opportunity to drive and test in both manual and automatic transmissions.

"Our CDL program enhances our ongoing workforce development efforts and deepens our connection with companies seeking in-demand drivers," said Elizabeth A. Brown, executive director of the SUNY Canton Center for Workforce, Community and Industry Partnerships. "The program bolsters the growth

of local businesses and contributes to the strength of our overall economy."

A new SUNY-wide initiative offers New York State tuition assistance for part-time students, which can offset the cost of attending the classes necessary to drive one of the college's two semi-tractor-trailers. Students who meet eligibility requirements may be eligible for Part-Time TAP. To qualify, students must complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

SUNY Canton began offering CDL-A classes in 2019 and received backing from the St. Lawrence County Industrial Development Agency in 2021. Last year, 25 drivers enrolled in the program.

Local tracking dog comes out of retirement to help hunters find lost game

WADDINGTON — A local tracking dog is coming out of retirement to help hunters locate their game this season.

“After a thorough exam at the vet’s office, he gave permission for Luna to resume her tracking career,” said Tom Rausch, tracker.

Hunting season is almost here, with bear season opening Sept. 14 and early archery for deer opening Sept. 27.

Rausch and other local trackers are available to come help if you’re unable to locate your game after the shot.

Rausch offers some important things to do after the shot:

While still in your stand/blind, make a mental note or take a picture of the hit site so you’re able to find it. Look for sign and mark the hit site. This is where the tracking team will start and important information on the hit can be gathered here. This information is necessary to formulate the best recovery plan possible.

Follow the blood trail, walking to the side of it. Even if it’s easy to follow, throw up a ribbon or toilet paper every so often. You’d be amazed at how many times the hunter is unable to locate blood when they come back, even just a couple hours later.

When you are unable to find any more sign, mark last blood and back out.

He warns hunters to not grid search.

Even though you’ve done your best to walk to the side of the trail, often you’ll inadvertently step in blood or on the animal’s track without realizing it.

If a grid search is conducted, false trails will be put down, making the track a lot harder for the dog than it needs to be.

Obtain permission for the tracking team to enter neighboring properties. Be sure and tell the landowner they are welcome to join us, often this will help ease their mind and they’ll allow us to continue.

During daylight, the hunter should carry the weapon of the season in case the animal is still alive when found.

The tracker is armed and allowed to finish the job, but the DEC prefers the hunter do it during daylight. At night, the tracker is allowed to carry a weapon to dispatch wounded game.

Trackers typical wait times: Leg or shoulder hits, start tracking immediately; liver, wait six hours and wait a minimum of 12 hours for a gut-shot.

This is a free service, but donations for gas are appreciated.

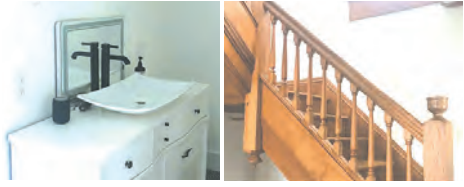

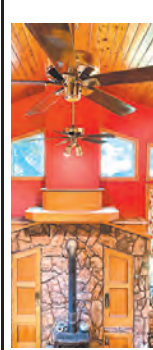

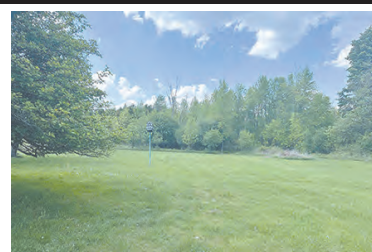
