Massena continues to tackle blight

MASSENA — A public hearing will be held Oct. 15 at the beginning of the next Village Board of Trustees meeting as officials seek to remediate an unsafe structure.

Trustees say the former Woodlawn Hotel, located at 40-42 Woodlawn Ave., is a problem property that needs to be addressed.

Code Enforcement Officer Aaron Hardy said he issued an initial report detailing the structure's integrity and condition, prompting him to recommend the board take action on the property.

He recently said the structure has been on his radar multiple times in recent months.

The structure, which has been boarded up in the past, has had water issues for some time, he said.

Along with those issues, the village also is forced to utilize a contractor to maintain the yard of the property. Those bills are then passed on to the owner, who then pays them on their tax bill, officials said.

Just what prompted the review and public hearing? Hardy said he received a call from the company that mows the property, requesting he assess the structure.

Hardy said he received a call, saying he "had to come take a look at the side of the building."

City hires law firm for human resources

City manager hopes change will reduce litigation

OGDENSBURG -- Hoping to improve employee relations and reduce costly legal battles Ogdensburg has hired a labor relations attorney and consulting firm.

Ogdensburg City Manager Fonda Chronis told council in September that he lacked the expertise necessary to properly address employee relation issues and that bringing in someone to assist in that field could potentially save the city money in the long run.

"I think everybody on council knows the city does not have a dedicated HR department. As a matter of fact the city manager is designated as the personal officer," he said. "Many of the city's HR and civil service related issues that are faced currently by the city are cer-

tainly beyond my expertise."

Chronis said hiring the firm would allow the city to streamline its legal services, improve efficiency in addressing human resource related issues, provide department heads with a dedicated resource to help them walk through complicated issues and speed processes involving HR related problems.

"Our departments spend an inordinate amount of time, as do I, on human resources and civil service issues. We need an expert to help us guide this," he said.

In recent years the city has racked up extensive legal fees related to labor contracts which resulted from a soured relationship between former members of city council and the fire department union.

Chronis said the money is

Direct flights to Orlando, Fla. coming to SLC this winter

Those heading south for the winter can fly directly from Ogdensburg to Orlando, Fla. starting in February.

Breeze Airways will offer the direct flights for \$89 one way on Thursdays and Sundays from Feb. 13 through April 27.

The flights will depart from the city at 11:55 a.m. and arrive at 3:30 p.m. Orlando, Fla.

Charlie Garrelts, Ogdensburg International Airport Manager, said the new flights were wel-

comed news for those seeking warmer weather in the winter months.

"Say hello to new horizons," Garrelts said in a prepared statement. "Breeze Airways is connecting Ogdensburg to the vibrant warmth of Orlando—your gateway to sunshine and smiles starts here."

Breeze launched daily service to Washington Dulles on Friday and is the only carrier offering nonstop service on both new routes.

"Breeze is less than a week old in Ogdensburg and yet we're

announcing another new route today," David Neeleman, Breeze Airways' Founder and CEO said in a prepared statement. "Now in addition to daily service to the nation's capital, Ogdensburg Guests can also make a convenient and affordable winter getaway to Orlando for just \$89* one way."

Garrelts said as a promotion to celebrate the new flight options in Ogdensburg travelers can visit the airport in person on Tuesdays from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. to save 1/3

Are you ready to vote? You have to be registered!

YOU MAY NEED TO RE-REGISTER IF YOU:

- Have changed your name
- Moved — even across town, or especially from another place
- Haven't voted in recent elections

YOU MUST:

- Be a United States Citizen
- Be 18 years old by Election Day
- Have lived at your present address 30 days before the election
- Not be currently incarcerated for a felony
- Not be judged mentally incompetent by a court
- And not claim a right to vote elsewhere.

DEADLINES

Address changes for registered voters must be completed by **Oct. 21**, and deadline for new registration is **Oct. 26**, whether online, in person, or with a postmarked application. Mailed applications must be received by Oct. 26.



COLLEGE STUDENTS

Students attending local universities are eligible to vote in the town where they are living and attending classes, or can vote in their hometown elections.

They must register in St. Lawrence County to vote here; or vote by absentee ballot, Early Mail Ballot, Early Voting or In Person in their hometown.

School graduations could move into auditorium

MASSENA -- Future graduations at Massena Central School may be held in the auditorium after one board of education member suggested the change during a recent meeting.

Following a Policy Committee report, Board Member Patricia Murphy made the suggestion.

Officials on the committee said discussions were held to possibly create a new policy for graduations that stemmed from a school board retreat held earlier this year.

Board Member Zach Monroe commented that the committee is "planning to draft a potential policy for review" but noted that the policy needs further discussion for development.

One major concern raised by residents and Murphy as well is the cost to host graduation on the turf field as opposed to the auditorium.

"Each year that we've had outdoor graduation, it's become and more expensive for the district," Murphy said.

Murphy suggested moving graduation into the auditorium so family members in attendance could watch in comfort with air conditioning and comfortable seats available, as opposed to sitting on bleachers for turf field ceremonies.

Murphy suggested the change would also save on manpower, with far less setup required if graduations were held in the auditorium.

Graduations have been held on Friday nights on the school's turf field for a number of years, with rain dates typically set for Saturdays. If graduations are rained out two days in a row officials have utilized the school gym as a backup option.

Prior to the turf field ceremonies, the district typically utilized the Massena Arena.

Though there may be support to move graduations to the auditorium, Board Member Daniel Tusa said a lack of seating may pose an issue.

"With the numbers that we get at graduation, I don't think this auditorium would accommodate all those who wish to come. What would happen is that we would end up with potentially TV screens and community members and family

members in our gymnasium sitting on bleachers watching the screen. They wouldn't necessarily be able to see the ceremony in person. Space is an issue," he said.

But Murphy suggested it may not be the worst move because many attendees watch the ceremony on the jumbo TV screens the district sets up for easier viewing.

She said the capacity in the auditorium has increased as well.

"When they did have larger classes, they fit all of the students on the stage and they had fewer seats here and they accommodated everybody," Murphy said.

Former city manager censured at international firefighters convention

OGDENSBURG - A former Ogdensburg City Manager who had a strained relationship with county officials and local firefighters was censured at a recent convention at the International Association of Fire Fighters recently.

The delegates voted to censure Stephen Jellie stemming from his actions in New York during which he repeatedly demonstrated a disregard of the law, fundamental lack of respect for professional fire fighters and callous and careless actions that compromised the safety of the community and the firefighters serving it.

It took place in Boston during a bicentennial event.

Firefighters say that in Wyoming, Jellie "created an unsafe work environment for responders by cutting minimum staffing from two to as few as two firefighters per station, reducing the qualifications needed for members of the fire service, and misrepresenting the resources and fiscal condition of Teton County."

The measure was advanced in the form of a resolution offered by the New York State Professional Fire Fighters President Sam Fresina, and Kevin Ready, President of the Federated Firefighters of Wyoming.

Jason Bouchard, President of Ogdensburg Firefighters Association, was critical of the former city manager.

"During Mr. Jellie's tenure, which lasted approximately 28 months, he attempted to dismantle, discredit and destroy a City Fire Department that stood for more than 150 years. He repeatedly put politics before the well-being of the people of Ogdensburg and its fire fighters," he said in a prepared statement.

In August, Jellie was appointed to the City Manager position in Palmer City, Alaska.

The censure was advanced in the

form of a resolution offered by the New York State Professional Fire Fighters President Sam Fresina, and Kevin Ready, President of the Federated Firefighters of Wyoming.

"Today, every IAFF affiliate learned that Stephen Jellie repeatedly put his political agenda first and compromised the safety of firefighters and the communities across the county. He creates a chaotic environment, jeopardizes public safety, and abruptly leaves because his actions simply cannot be tolerated. However, he continues to be placed in a position of trust, and it is my hope that by speaking out -- others will be aware that from a public safety perspective the pattern of behavior and conduct are simply unacceptable," Frenesia said.

Jellie was a controversial figure during his time with the city. He was hired without the traditional search and lengthy interview process typi-

cally involved in such hiring.

He's received great praise from former Ogdensburg Mayor Jeffrey Skelly as well as then Deputy Mayor Steve Fisher.

He also received significant criticism from Councilors Michael Powers, Dan Skamperle and Nichole Kennedy, as well as members of the community.

During his time as city manager Ogdensburg has seen drastic reductions in its police and fire department. The city has also outsourced comptroller services and was entangled in lawsuits with the fire union and St. Lawrence County. The city additionally started collecting its own sales tax and requested the county take over a variety of services.

Code office launches online portal to efile documents and permit applications

Move expected to save time and money in the long run

MASSENA — Town of Massena residents applying for a building permit or hoping to obtain or file paperwork with Code Enforcement will soon be able to handle everything online.

Code Enforcement Officer Pat O'Brien said the move will save the office and town both time and money in the long run.

O'Brien previously updated officials regarding a new online portal for the office, which includes forms like building permits applications. He said the new portal was already saving time and money, noting that anonymous code violation complaints were being filtered out.

That alone cut down on man hours, he previously said.

Both residential and commercial property owners are able to utilize the portal for all their needs, O'Brien said.

Now with the portal in place, all documents are sent directly to the code office for review once completed, he said.

O'Brien detailed the previous process, saying it would take two to three trips to the town clerk's office to finally get a permit.

"Now it will be one and done. You fill it out online, it comes to us, it's approved, they'll get the invoice, the town clerk receives a copy of the invoice. So, when they begin, she already has everything up. She knows what they owe, and you pay for it," he said.

O'Brien commented that the

process is now much simpler for all parties involved and has been "streamlined."

Next up for O'Brien will be the town planning packet, which he said will operate similar to the code office forms.

"You'll be able to go online for anything that's going to go to the Planning Board. You'll be able to fill out all of that," he said.

Forms that require an affidavit are also in the works, he said.

"We have a process in place for that where we can submit the application. When they come in to pay and pick up, we would have them sign anything required," he said.

Village of Massena battling illegal dumping at former DPW site

MASSENA -- Once again, village of Massena officials have been forced to remind the public of proper procedures for dumping brush at the former Department of Public Works location on South Main Street.

During the Village Board of Trustees meeting on Sept. 17, Trustee Ken McGowan reiterated that the location is only for sure by village residents, not out-of-town residents and professional tree cutters.

He said in recent weeks there has been considerable dumping at the site by both groups, drawing the ire of village officials.

McGowan said the location should also not be used for disposing of lumber scraps, as has been seen recently.

"It's back to the point where we have non-residents that are using the brush pile. For residents, it was meant for brush. It's not meant for lumber," he said.

McGowan commented that the added waste means a higher bill for the village since a contractor is needed to chip the pile.

That expense adds up quickly, according to Village Administrator Monique Chatland.

"It costs us \$500 per hour, plus a \$100 moving fee each time they do it. It adds up fast, especially when there may be trees, limbs or brush being dumped there by people that shouldn't be," she said.

"It's just crazy to me," McGowan said.

He went on further, saying it should be common knowledge that out-of-towners and professionals should not utilize the location for dumping, but times have changed.

If the situation does not improve,

trustees say they may have to revert back to locking the gate.

That possibility was recently discussed with DPW Superintendent Marty Miller.

Officials say if the gate were to be locked going forward, individuals would be required to obtain a dumping permit from DPW before dropping off their brush.

That process was described "as a real pain" by trustees but is under consideration unless the situation improves.

Trustees also weighed similar issues last November when similar dumping issues arose.

In that case, Miller said DPW was able to find the individual who dumped 12 stumps and have them removed from the site.

Shortly thereafter, village officials opted to place cameras at the site.

That still hasn't deterred individuals from outside the village from dumping at the site though.

McGowan previously said Miller was in contact with the village police department to handle the situation, but that meant that resources were being allocated to a situation that should not have required police officers to begin with.

Concerns also arose this spring when village officials opted to move spring cleanup to August in order to not conflict with the town of Massena's spring cleanup.

Officials also hoped changing spring cleanup procedures would save both time and money in the long run.

Some officials also questioned why village residents were not allowed to participate in the town wide cleanup despite living in the town and paying the same tax as town residents.

Despite raising those concerns

both the town and village pressed forward with their cleanup programs, though both have questioned the cost/benefit ratio of both.

Miller previously said that if unauthorized dumping were to continue and services are maintained as they are now, including spring cleanup, the village may be in financial trouble.

McGowan reiterated that sentiment during the September board meeting, saying the village needed to have a hard look at the figures before committing to continue offering services.

Among them, McGowan said spring cleanup and trash services may need to be trimmed to close a half-million dollar deficit in the next budget.

"I know everyone wants to keep these services they are paying for, I got that. But the costs have continually gone up and no one wants to pay more in taxes. None of us do. But in the end, that's how these services are paid for and something will have to give," he said.

McGowan said he expects to hear more about cleanup efforts in the coming months as the village begins to prepare for next year's budget.

"I'm sure in the next few months we'll hear some more about the cleanup, if that's cost-effective. Is that something we really want to keep on the docket here? How much are we spending? When I went and dropped off, the county had no help there and we're paying for them to be there," McGowan said.

Chatland said much the same, noting that the village sent two workers during spring cleanup as well.

"I know our guys are busy and they help with a lot of people coming through there. I don't under-

stand why we should have to send them if the county already has people there, or should," she said.

Mayor Greg Paquin said he hoped the village would be able to maintain services for residents.

"It's a shame, that is a really great service for everyone," he said.

But McGowan commented that costs continue to rise and next year's budget will be a tight one.

Police chief and trustee address concerns over mental health issues in village

Homeowner's ring camera shows man on sidewalk scratching back with axe, other residents point to drug use

MASSENA -- Just what can be done when individuals appear to be a danger to others or themselves?

That was a topic of conversation during the Sept. 18 village board meeting as residents raised concerns of individuals who "appeared to be a danger to themselves and others."

Angela Mossow, a village resident, commented that videos have circulated online that showed individuals who appeared to be heavily intoxicated or under the influence of illicit substances.

On another occasion, Ring camera footage from a homeowner showed an individual walking on the sidewalk while scratching their back with an ax.

Mossow said the same individual has also been observed walking down the street with just a towel around their waste.

On other occasions they were also seen "twitching on the ground in broad daylight," she said.

"Concerned citizens want to know what the village's position is on this matter. People are in fear. And these are just a few examples," she asked.

She said multiple houses on Beach Street have also had multiple individuals enter unwanted in the middle of the day, presumably in an effort to find drugs.

"Concerned citizens would like to know what we're missing, what is the PD's criteria for the issue of pickup orders. What is recommended for us?" Mossow asked.

Chief of Police Jason Olson addressed the concerns, saying officers always respond when a call is made but action cannot be taken on every call.

"They're aware of the individual on Liberty Ave. As a matter of fact, I think his family said they are trying very hard (to get him help). We have no control over pickup orders, those have to be issued by psychologists or psychiatrists," he said.

Due to the legal requirements set forth by the state, Olson said his department is unable to transport an individual on a pickup order unless it falls under specific criteria.

"We have no control over that. We have very little control over when we can take somebody into custody, obviously, if they are committing a crime or they utter anything that states that they're a danger to themselves or others," he said.

But "odd behavior" does not always rise to the level of police intervention, he said.

"Although we all probably feel that sometimes we should, we can only work within the law," he said.

Olson said he and his officers have been "very, very frustrated over the years" as they attempt to address similar situations but commented that they "will continue to work within the law and will continue to do everything we can with the staffing that we have."

Trustee Shelyn Peets also weighed in on the rising number of mental health calls and the criteria necessary for police to transport.

"I can attest to what the chef says about issuing a pickup order...the police can pick up an individual who threatens to kill themselves or kill somebody else. But as far as a pickup order, I know the general public thinks that if somebody is a danger to themselves, there's criteria that they are a danger to themselves," Peets said.

Though citizens may be concerned, Peets said individuals can be mentally ill in the community, especially if they are not a danger to themselves or others.

If a problem persists, Peets said there are resources available.

"So if they're concerned about that, they can always contact Reach Out at 315-265-2422," she said.

Peets said in that case a citizen can voice concerns and ask for an evaluation if they want someone checked on.

She went on further, saying that it does not need to be a criminal matter to seek help for someone who may be suffering from a mental illness in the community.

Olson said residents should always call the police if there is a concern for anyone's safety.

He continued, saying it is also important for individuals to provide evidence, statements, names and addresses so police are able to adequately investigate a case.

Without the public's support, he said the job of the responding officers is exponentially more difficult.

"If they (the caller or witness) have evidence that they have an issue, they have to call us. The follow up with that (situation), this is another issue. When you call us and we need your assistance to give us a deposition or give us your name or talk to us when we show up to your home and not just not answer the door. That's pretty important too for us to be able to do our job. We cannot support any type of arrest without evidence, and sometimes that evidence is in the form of a witness statement," he said.

Olson said if citizens are unwilling to cooperate with police, it leaves them with limited options to address issues.

"I know people are nervous and scared, but at some point they have to take control of their community. They have to do their part as well," Olson said.

City council looking for volunteers to join Charter Review Commission

OGDENSBURG – Ogdensburg city council is looking for volunteers to join the Charter Review Commission.

Applications are available on the city's website Ogdensburg.org and at city hall.

Ogdensburg's City Charter was last reviewed in 2017, with the last meeting of its Charter Review Commission held on Nov. 13, 2017.

The commission consists of 12 individuals appointed by council. They are tasked with reviewing the city's charter and making recommendations for changes. Such changes may include small adjustments to ensure consistency and continuity in language or larger changes that can modify rules and regulations that govern the city and its government.

The commission was last formed in 2017 and included chair Fred Bean, Sean O'Brien, Laura Pearson, Sean McNamara, Laura Ashley, Douglas Loffler, Andrew Putmar, Kevin Kendall, Storm Cilley, Christopher Pitcher and Scott McRoberts.

Last time around the commission offered many suggested changes, though many were not supported by the city council.

Among the failed proposals would have a three-year term for the position of mayor and a call to ensure that each of the city's election districts included a representative who resided within it.

Instead the city opted to continue "at large" voting which allows anyone who resides in the city to run for any available seat.

It is possible for the charter commission to bypass the council via public referendum, however that does not appear to have been done in the past.

Another recommendation made by that Commission, which was approved by Ogdensburg City Council, reduced the time period between City Charter reviews from

10 years to six years, thus requiring a City Charter review begin no later than December 31, 2023. On July 24, 2023, City Council amended the City Charter to change the deadline date for City Charter review to Dec. 31, 2027.

Mayor Michael Tooley, with City Council support, stated early in 2024 his intention to have City Council appoint a City Charter Review Commission this year. On Sept. 23 Ogdensburg City Council outlined the process by which a City Charter Review Commission shall be appointed in 2024, with its meetings to begin in 2025.

Based on the number of applications received and their review of these applications, Ogdensburg City Council hopes to appoint the 2025 City Charter Review Commission at its Nov. 12 regular meeting.

The first meeting of the 2025 City Charter Review Commission is scheduled Wednesday, Jan. 8, 2025, in Room 3 at City Hall.

This timeline allows nearly a two-month period which will allow time for the following:

- City staff make available a hard copy of the City Charter, if requested, to the Commission (the Charter can be found on the City of Ogdensburg website).

- City staff to prepare information for the Commission outlining their role as defined in NYS Division of Local Government Services.

- Review of the City Charter by all interested and affected parties to submit to the Commission suggested amendments to the City Charter. This includes City Council, City Administration, citizens, business owners, among others.

Stewart's eyes move in village to downtown location

No action is expected this year as Stewart's wraps up a number of projects at the end of 2024, officials said.

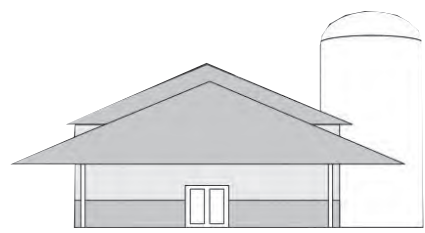
Stewart's officials say they plan to have discussion with the Planning Board in the near future to assess each property to ensure they have the appropriate amount of space to meet the needs of the new location.

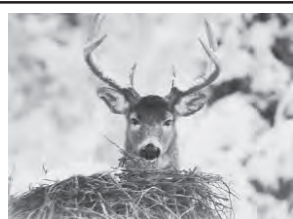

City of Ogdensburg to receive \$688,300 to replace lead water service lines

OGDENSBURG — The city of Ogdensburg is slated to receive a \$688,300 grant from New York State to replace lead water service lines.

According to a press release from the governor's office, the funding is part of nearly \$90 million in taxpayer dollars the state is redistributing among communities across New York to improve drinking water infrastructure.

The money is to be used to identify and replace lead service lines, the state said. Numerous St. Lawrence County municipali-

ties are currently engaged in inventory projects of their service lines to meet an Oct. 15 deadline put forth by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. The inventory is the first step in a mandated process to eventually remove all lead from municipal water infrastructure.

Lead is harmful to human health and can enter drinking water when plumbing materials that contain lead corrode, especially where the water has high acidity or low mineral content that corrodes pipes and fixtures, the press release said.

The most common sources of lead in drinking water are lead pipes, faucets, and fixtures. In homes with lead pipes that connect the home to the water main, also known as lead services lines, these pipes are typically the most significant source of lead in the water. Lead pipes are more likely to be found in older cities and homes built before 1986, said the state.

The state funding awarded is specifically targeted for historically disadvantaged communities, the governor's office said. The awards prioritize communities that meet one

or more of the following criteria:

- The community's median household income is less than 80 percent of the regionally adjusted statewide median household income
- The community's local poverty rate is higher than the statewide poverty rate
- At least 50 percent of the community's lead service line project serves an environmental justice community.

Ogdensburg was the only municipality in St. Lawrence County to receive a grant.

County receives Emergency Disaster Declaration following flooding Aug. 9-10

President Joe Biden has approved a Major Disaster Declaration that will provide federal assistance to communities impacted by tropical storm Debby August 8-10.

With the declaration in place, federal financial assistance can be secured to support public infrastructure reconstruction efforts in St. Lawrence County, state officials said.

The funds would come through the Federal Emergency Management Agency's Public Assistance Program, providing funding to local governments and eligible non-profits for debris removal, protective measures, and repairs to buildings and infrastructure, including roads, bridges, water and wastewater treatment facilities, critical infrastructure sites, schools, parks and other facilities.

St. Lawrence County Superintendent of Highways Don Chambers said the county has been continually documenting damages to county infrastructure, with the documentation expected to be used as part of the county's submission to the state for aid.

St. Lawrence County was hit particularly hard by the storm on Aug. 9 and 10, with record amounts of rainfall in many municipalities.

According to the NWS, some areas throughout the county saw in excess of seven inches of total rainfall, including areas near Colton, South Colton and Fowler.

"One aspect of this event was the impressive rainfall rates observed in the core of the heaviest precipitation swath. Within this band, precipitable water (PWAT) values, or the amount of water held in the atmospheric water column, ranged

from 2.1 to 2.4 inches. These values approached record levels for the date as interpreted by the NOAA/NWS Storm Prediction Center's Atmospheric Sounding Archive, using Albany, NY as a closest proxy," the NWS said in the report.

On average, rainfall throughout the county was over 2" per hour at the peak of the storm, according to the NWS.

According to the report, a 50 to 70 mile swath of excessive rainfall struck the county and northwestern Franklin County, leading to a much higher average rainfall total that peaked at 7.35" in North Lawrence.

North Emeryville was also hit hard, with 7.1" of total rainfall.

Norwood saw 6.6" in total rainfall, with Hermon not far behind with 6.49"

Potsdam was struck with 4.91" total, while Canton saw 3.86", according to the NWS.

Massena saw 4.25" of rainfall, while Gouverneur saw 3.92" total.

That excess rainfall had a significant impact on infrastructure like highways throughout St. Lawrence County, causing damage that will cost millions of dollars to repair.

St. Lawrence County legislators passed a resolution during the Aug. 26 Finance Committee meeting, authorizing \$650,000 for emergency road and structure repairs to reopen all affected roads.

Chambers said the work to repair many roads and structural projects like culvert replacement are still underway, with crews having begun the work just hours after the storm subsided Aug. 9.

"It's going to likely be into the several million dollars to complete repairs even though we have, for example, some bridges that have already been replaced or had extensive repairs," he said.

Chambers said the \$650,000 the resolution approved spending is just for emergency repairs to ensure "roads are safe to the traveling public."

He said some structures, like culverts, would require improvements to a standard set by the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) following an assessment after the storm.

Chambers said larger culverts and significant road repairs were needed around the county but said it was his hope the state and federal government would help financially.

That help is now on the way from the federal government with the latest announcement from the President's office.

"The effects of Tropical Storm Debby caused extreme damage across parts of New York last month, and I'm thankful President Biden has approved my request for a Major Disaster Declaration," Governor Kathy Hochul said.

"My administration will continue to work with FEMA to ensure those affected receive the critical funding they need to begin the recovery and rebuilding process."

Athletic courts upgraded at Waddington park

WADDINGTON – The new recreational facilities at Whitaker Park are complete.

The local park and boat launch facility is associated with New York Power Authority's (NYPA's) St. Lawrence-FDR Power Project on the St. Lawrence River. The work included the resurfacing of existing tennis and basketball courts allowing for enhanced recreational opportunities, including pickleball. NYPA Board Member Judge Cecily Morris joined state and local elected officials Tuesday in Waddington at a ribbon cutting to officially unveil the new facilities.

Whitaker Park is one of several recreational facilities that fall within the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's project boundary for NYPA's St. Lawrence-FDR Hydro-power Plant in Massena.

The work celebrated today involved drainage improvements, new subgrade and asphalt, layout improvements, additional court options for pickleball, lighting and electrical upgrades and increased playing surface.

The improved courts contribute to the overall NYPA facility which also includes boat launches, restroom facilities, baseball fields,

walking trails and a playground. The recent enhancements were performed by Fiacco and Riley Construction of Norwood.

"The Whitaker Park improvements are a result of the great partnerships NYPA has formed with the local communities where we have facilities," said Andy Boulais, NYPA regional manager of Northern New York and senior vice president. "NYPA built these recreation facilities for our host community many years ago and as part of NYPA's commitment to maintain them we are now celebrating improvements that address the changing needs of the local community."

Work on recreation facilities stemmed from the Power Authority's 10-year review of the 2003 Relicensing Agreement for the St. Lawrence-FDR Power Project. The New York Power Authority owns and operates the park and funded the renovations.

Located along a scenic portion of the St. Lawrence River and New York's international border with Canada, Waddington is a popular stop for boaters and serves as an inviting local attraction for visiting tourists. It is also the site of several national fishing tournaments.

Waite to head softball program

Waite spent the past season as the assistant softball coach at SUNY Potsdam. During her senior season she helped lead the Cardinals to their first sweep of Cortland since 2006 as she recorded a walk-off single and walk-off sacrifice fly to secure the sweep. Waite also appeared on the SUNYAC Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll multiple times.

"I would like to thank Randy Sieminski and the rest of search committee for trusting me to be the next head softball coach at SUNY Canton," Waite said. "Having spent my whole collegiate coaching and playing career in the SUNYAC and North Country, taking the helm of the Roos softball program excites me. I am looking forward to hitting the ground running with the returning student-athletes and new recruits as we look to make a successful transition to SUNYAC softball."

Waite is a native of Winthrop, where she was a three-sport athlete competing in softball, soccer and basketball at St. Lawrence Central.

already being spent on attorneys, but believes the funds would be better spent helping the city navigate these through a single firm.

Council agreed to hire Roemer Wallens Gold and Mineaux at cost of \$4,500 per month through the end of 2025.

That price would increase to \$4,750 per month in 2026 and \$5,000 per month in 2027.

The agreement calls for day-to-day support of human resource functions, comprehensive negotiating services and consultation and advice regarding the city's rights and liabilities on numerous human resource topics.

Powers said he is familiar with the firm and believes them to be reputable. He offered his support for the measure.

Mayor Tooley agreed. "Personally I think this is a support service that has been long overdue," Tooley said. "I think this is a wise expenditure."

Councilor Donna Trimm asked if this was a better solution than hiring an HR specialist as a city employee.

Fonda said he believed that this was a more cost effective approach and allows the expertise of an entire firm rather than a single individual.

Deputy Mayor Dan Skamperle said his hope is that the service will allow the city to extinguish a fire before it becomes a bigger problem.

"It seems that oftentimes there are little things that don't need to go to litigation," he said.

Skamperle says he's hopeful the firm can help the city address problems before they make their way to the courtroom.

He said that in the last three years the city has spent more than \$700,000 on legal fees.

The measure passed with support from all members of the council.

The airline doesn't charge change or cancellation fees up to 60 minutes prior to departure and offers other benefits such as free family seating and a la carte pricing.

Breeze, which was recently ranked in the top five of Travel + Leisure's "Best Domestic Airlines" for the third year in a row, began selling service from just 16 cities in May 2021.

The airline is also offering flights to Dulles airport in Washington D.C. be purchased for \$49.

The flights leave from the city at around 5 p.m. daily. The flight is roughly 1.5 hours .

Passengers also soon have the option of flying from Dulles to other destinations including Provo, Utah, South Bend Indiana and Vero Beach Florida, but with the current schedule, doing so would require an overnight stay in D.C.

While the new flight options from Ogdensburg are welcomed, Breeze Airways currently lacks interline connections, which is a concern for some travelers.

The lack of interline agreements puts a bigger burden on passengers looking for connecting flights. They

can't book them with a single purchase and they must recheck their luggage.

While experienced flyers may not be bothered by that, it can be a hassle for those who have little knowledge of air travel.

Locally, community members have also raised concerns about the flights being in the afternoon, which can make it difficult to make connections.

Although it still remains a concern, OBPA leaders say they believe Breeze is still addressing the matter and hopes to hear good news on that front by the end of the year.

BLIGHT...

Upon review, Hardy said the structure "hit pretty much every single" requirement to be legally deemed an unsafe structure.

Broken doors, windows and significant structural issues persist, he said.

Hardy submitted photographs to the village board for their review.

"The structural issues are my biggest concern. If you look at the opening on that one corner of the building, you can see weather rot. You can see the structural members starting to collapse floor by floor on that thing," Hardy said.

Hardy said the public hearing will allow the village to determine what to do with the property by either requiring it be secured or even removed.

"Just looking at it, from what I'm seeing so far really being inside of it, I don't think anybody should be going inside of that. Maybe even trying to secure it would cost way too much money to try to do anything other than tear this thing down," he said.

Like many other structures, Hardy said the property is owned by an absentee landlord, this time one from Flushing, Queens. Prior to that, the previous owner was from Amsterdam, New York, Hardy confirmed.

"We've had zero communication. We have nothing," Hardy said.

But the list of properties to be addressed won't end there. Hardy said another structure is very likely going to be addressed at the October meeting, along with the Woodlawn property.

"I can tell you that there's a very good chance we're going to have another one of these to discuss with you next month," Hardy said.

Trustees have already taken action on 18 Park Ave., 31 and 33 Pine St., along with 21 Tamarack St., all of which were deemed unsafe structures that were not fit for habitation by humans.

Violations have piled up for each property , with 18 Park Ave. proving troublesome for residents, code enforcement and law enforcement alike.

In the case of the Pine St. structures, they were deemed to pose a risk to pedestrians and neighboring properties, according to Code Enforcement Officer Walter Bean.

Hardy also commented on the Tamarack St. structure, saying it had multiple code violations that, if left unanswered, would give Hardy's office the authority to address the issues at the property.
