Tourism costs raise concerns

Chamber says
pre-approval needed for
reimbursements

MASSENA -- Reimbursement rates from the St. Lawrence County Chamber Of Commerce were called into question recently by Massena Sports-Fishing Promotion Director Don Meissner and town Grant Writer Linda McQuinn.

In her monthly report to the Massena Town Board, Meissner said he and McQuinn are winding down their attendance at sport fishing expos throughout the region after months on the road and running tournaments in Massena.

But reimbursement rates were questioned during McQuinn's report.

In her report, McQuinn said she and Meissner were informed by Chamber officials they did not seek chamber approval prior to attending the shows, leading to a disparity in reimbursements.

Prior approval is required due to limited funding, Chamber officials told North Country This Week.

McQuinn said she and Bookkeeper Brenda Mossow worked together on the reimbursement request for the county chamber, totaling up over \$10,000 for the request.

"This was for five sports shows that

Donate your deer after an accident

If you happen to hit and kill a deer this year with your vehicle, you can now donate the meat to elderly in the community.

The St. Lawrence County Sheriff's Office announced the launch of a new Venison Donation Program aimed at supporting older citizens locally.

"This program will take any legally harvested and tagged deer (as well)," said St. Lawrence County Sheriff Rick Engle. So if a hunter wishes to donate their harvest, they can.

Car-deer accidents account

for a large percentage of the accidents in the area, and the sheriff's office investigates many of them.

Here's how it works when a motorist strikes a deer: When a vehicle strikes a deer, the driver is offered the opportunity to take possession of the animal. If the driver doesn't want it and the deer is salvageable, deputies step in.

"When a vehicle is involved in a car-deer accident, and the owner or operator would like a carcass tag to take possession of said animal, law enforcement will issue a tag and document same in the complaint," the sheriff said.

Unfortunately, in many cases,

the meat from these accidents goes to waste. But with this new program, the sheriff's office is working to change that.

Officers will ensure the deer is taken to a processing facility. The venison will then be donated to benefit the elderly in our community, providing them with quality, nutritious meals.

"We are working together with the Office of the Aging," Engle said. "They already have a consumer list and a way to distribute the product. We will be working this program like we did the produce from the garden."

Massena Schine Theater rehab in line to receive \$640,000 NYPA grant

MASSENA -- Members of the Northern New York Power Proceeds Allocation Board (NNYPPAB) are recommending NYPA trustees approve a \$640,000 grant for the Schine Theater restoration project.

The news comes from a recent NNYPPAB meeting as the board weighs what projects will receive funding as part of round 13 of the Northern New York Economic Development Fund.

The theater restoration project, spearheaded by the Massena Arts and Theater Association (MATA), has received significant support in recent months including a \$2 million RESTORE NY grant.

Village Administrator Monique Chatland previously said the grant funding will be a huge boost as the theater is restored.

"The RESTORE NY funding will assist immensely in the transformation of this storied, historic landmark and reclaim its rightful place as a focal point of our downtown and within our community. Revitalizing the Schine Theater, as well

as the existing and planned redevelopment throughout our downtown core and within our community will serve as a catalyst for future growth and both economic and community development," she said.

The project is expected to cost in the millions, with MATA expecting to spend more than \$3.2 million, according to NYPA Senior Economic Development Manager Patricia Wilson.

The project is expected to renovate the entire interior and exterior of the building, including the original facade and marquee. Roof repairs and masonry work are also part of the project, along with new HVAC, plumbing, lighting, electrical systems, interior finishes and other repairs, officials say.

Funding from NYPA would be used to reimburse for expenses related to theater seating, lighting, audio equipment and non-retail related expenses, officials say.

The \$640,000 grant would assist in addressing a funding gap needed to complete the project, potentially enhancing tourism in the downtown area and allowing the village to tap into the Canadian market

with live music, performance art, comedy shows and other forms of live entertainment.

Abstaining from the vote was Chairman Pat Kelly, who cited a conflict of interest due to his role as the executive director of the St. Lawrence County Industrial Development Agency.

The IDA has assisted with the project by administering funding from the St. Lawrence Valley Redevelopment Agency, along with assisting MATA to find bridge funding for the project.

Fundraising efforts also continue with a capital campaign project, with sponsorship levels ranging from \$1,000 to \$50,000 and up.

Businesses and individuals interested in sponsorships can become a Visionary Advocate by donating \$1,000 to \$2,499, a Cornerstone Sponsor by donating \$2,500 to \$9,999, a Heritage Partner by donating \$10,000 to \$24,999, a Legacy Patron by donating \$25,000 to \$50,000 and a Founding Benefactor by donating more than \$50,000.

City to hire finance director

New position will support Gray & Gray service

OGDENSBURG – Ogdensburg is looking to hire a Director of Finance to supplement the Comptroller's Office, which is currently being run by Angela Gray of Gray & Gray and Associates, Canton.

For decades the city had a dedicated in-house comptroller position, but under the previous administration led by Mayor Jeffrey M. Skelly, the city opted to outsource those duties to an accounting firm.

Since that time the city has contracted services with Angela Gray who has been instrumental in the city's budgeting and provides frequent financial updates.

Some members of council have expressed interest in restoring the comptroller as a city employee position.

City Manager Fonda Chronis said the director finance position won't do that. He said the director of finance would not be a department head, but would rather supplement services provided by Gray and Gray.

The goal would be to grow that position in time and eventually transfer it into a comptroller position, which he says is a higher-level

finance position.

The starting salary range is \$75,000 - \$85,000 depending on experience and qualifications with fringe benefits.

According to the job posting the position entails responsible, professional, and often confidential financial management functions.

The employee would be responsible for developing and managing the entire financial structure of the Department's operations and supervises the staff of the Finance Unit and all financial consultants and auditors retained by the Department.

The work is performed under the direction of the Department Head. The incumbent does related duties as required.

At a minimum the job will require graduation from a New York State registered or regionally accredited college or university with a Master's degree in Business Administration and three years of work experience in accounting or finance which shall have included two years of supervisory experience or graduation from a New York State registered or regionally accredited college or university with a Bachelor's degree in Accounting, Finance or Business Administration and five years of work experience in accounting or finance which shall have included two years of supervisory experience.

The city would also accept candidates who have graduated from a New York State registered or regionally accredited college or university with an Associate's degree in Accounting, Finance or Business Administration and seven years of work experience in accounting or finance which shall have included two years of supervisory experience.

Applications will be accepted until the position is filled with the first review of applications being completed on October 15, 2024.

Those interested will need to fill out a Civil Service application along with a resume and cover letter to Cathy Jock, City Clerk, 330 Ford Street, Ogdensburg, NY 13669.

The successful applicant will need to take a civil service examination and score within the top three interested candidates in order to be permanently appointed.

Massena to pay back state pension liability from 2020 hospital sale

MASSENA -- The town of Massena is set to pay back millions of dollars to New York State in the form of a pension liability that remains from Massena Memorial Hospital, despite selling the health care facility to St. Lawrence Health in January 2020.

According to Town Supervisor Sue Bellor, the town is slated to pay back around \$5 million beginning in 2025 with an interest rate of 7%.

That means the town will pay \$383,214.24 every year for 30 years.

Town officials said during the Sept. 19 board meeting that the funds will have to come from taxpayers unless action is taken in Albany to assist.

In January of this year, town officials passed and signed the "home rule for state legislation," which they said would give the town expanded bonding authority to cover up to \$5 million of the pension liability.

Despite the town's best efforts, it appears a lack of action in Albany is going to end up costing taxpayers hundreds of thousands of dollars each year to settle the trailing liabilities from the hospital sale.

Town officials previously

approved spending \$1.7 million to cover a worker's compensation debt to the county as well, taking a big chunk out of the town's fund balance.

Bellor said those efforts are putting the town in a financial crunch.

"We tried for two years with the Senate and Assembly to try to get a resolution so that we could pay our hospital pension debt back at a better rate, and it has not passed both houses two years in a row. So, therefore, next year we need to start paying back the hospital pension debt each month," she said.

She said the plan is for 30 years barring "some kind of miracle that comes across to help us out."

The town board previously voted to authorize bonding to cover the debt in 2022, but Town Attorney Eric Gustafson said the town was not "actually in a position where we're ready to issue bonds to respect any of the potential liabilities in the hospital."

At the time, he suggested the town hold out for the pending state legislation that could have assisted the town with the debt.

If passed, the bill would have expanded the town's borrowing capacity under the local finance law,

he said.

With Albany seemingly unwilling to take action, town officials also took action to approve a resolution that would allow the town to exceed the 2% tax cap if necessary.

Deputy Supervisor Pat Facticeau said given the financial predicament with pension repayment beginning in February 2025 and increased insurance costs for retirees, the town very well may need to exceed the tax cap.

"We're paying out over \$300,000 each year for the pension, plus the insurance costs are pretty much doubling. It's very possible we need to exceed the cap," he said.

Facticeau commented that in a recent training for town supervisors it was recommended by state officials that all municipalities at least approve a resolution to allow local governments to exceed the cap given the current economic climate.

Repayment of the hospital pension will begin four years after St. Lawrence Health took over ownership of the facility. Taxpayers voted in Nov. 2019 to approve the sale by a margin of 1,963 to 174.

The change in ownership came months after Massena Memorial Hospital board members, along with

the town board, agreed to a management and operations agreement with St. Lawrence Health that saw SLH take over management, operational strategy and guidance of the hospital.

That agreement was approved by the state Department of Health in June 2019, along with a \$20 million grant from New York's Statewide Health Care Facility Transformation Program as the facility transitioned from a municipal hospital to a private non-profit controlled by SLH.

Adding to the town's financial crunch will be a significant increase in health care costs for retirees and employees in 2025.

Bellor said the town recently received notice from insurance companies that the town would be paying a "big, big jump" in health-

care costs.

The rise in expense comes one year after the town entered into the Broome County Healthcare Alliance, an association organized by Broome County that covers over 6,000 retirees through a healthcare program that is negotiated on behalf of multiple counties and municipalities.

The Broome County Healthcare Alliance program includes medical paid in full with no co-pay for members, along with a \$0 co-pay on generic medications, \$5 co-pay for brand name drugs and \$20 co-pay for non-preferred brand name drugs.

Bellor said the rise in insurance costs came as a surprise to the town board but noted it would have to be dealt with when town officials set the budget for next year.

Village sets up committee to overhaul code

MASSENA -- Village of Massena officials are establishing a sub-committee to overhaul village code regulations that some officials have called "insufficient and outdated" for many situations encountered today.

Mayor Greg Paquin recently made the announcement after a string of properties were found to be in violation of village code.

Despite the efforts of the Code Enforcement Office, Paquin and Code Enforcement Officer Aaron Hardy say the code is in dire need of an overhaul.

"In essence, this would be looking at the code in terms of rental properties, but also in terms of repeat offenders," Paquin said.

Hardy will be a member of the board, along with Deputy Mayor Chad Simpson and Trustee Ken McGowan. Paquin said more members with backgrounds in code and planning will be added in the near future.

He commented that he had already sought assistance from Dennis Kemison and Todd Manning, both of whom agreed to take part in the committee.

Paquin noted he would also speak to Don Lucas, a Massena landlord who has been increasingly vocal about a number of violations near his properties in recent months.

"I think he'd be great too," Paquin commented.

Paquin said that would likely make up the committee to review the village code, however changes

could come in the future.

He said the committee will continually meet to overhaul the code, likely for the first time in the next couple of weeks.

"This isn't going to be one meeting. I'd like to see your first meeting be within the month, and then progressively work and be ready to present something to us, say for the April or May meeting so that code can take effect," Paquin said.

Code enforcement has been a hot topic in Massena in recent months with village officials taking action on a number of properties.

Trustees have already taken action on 18 Park Ave., 31 and 33 Pine St., along with 21 Tamarack St., all of which were deemed unsafe structures that were not fit for habitation by humans.

Violations have piled up for each property with 18 Park Ave. proving troublesome for residents, code enforcement and law enforcement alike.

In the case of the Pine St. structures, they were deemed to pose a risk to pedestrians and neighboring properties, according to Code Enforcement Officer Walter Bean.

Hardy also commented on the Tamarack St. structure, saying it had multiple code violations that, if left unanswered, would give Hardy's office the authority to address the issues at the property.

"I think this is the right way forward with it. Once we get it cleaned up, we may have to come back in a month or two to establish an emergency and board it up for an unsafe structure. But, we need to be able to really see this whole property from

top to bottom," Hardy said.

Trustees are also expected to take action on 40-42 Woodlawn Ave., the former Woodlawn Hotel, at the next board meeting on Oct. 15 as well.

Hardy said he issued an initial report detailing the structure's integrity and condition, prompting him to recommend the board take action on the property.

He recently said the structure has been on his radar multiple times in recent months.

The structure, which has been boarded up in the past, has had water issues for some time, he said.

Along with those issues, the village also is forced to utilize a contractor to maintain the yard of the property.

Trustees will hold a public hearing Oct. 15 at 5:30 p.m. to address concerns about the property.

New electric vehicle charging stations to be installed in Massena

MASSENA -- Residents with electric vehicles in the North Country will soon be able to charge in Massena as electric vehicle charging stations are installed.

The new charging stations are part of an agreement with Air Products, a green hydrogen production company that is building a facility on Pontoon Bridge Road in the town of Massena.

According to Town Attorney Eric Gustafson, the company was required to seek approval from both the town and village boards to install the stations.

Village officials signed off on the

agreement first, quickly followed by town officials the following day during regular board meetings.

"What they're looking for is a letter of intent that will authorize them to install electric vehicle charging stations," Gustafson said during the town board meeting in September.

Gustafson detailed the agreement, saying Air Products and the Department of Environmental Conservation were in an agreement that in order to obtain the required air quality permits for the facility, the company would be required to install charging stations throughout Massena to show "they were working on reducing greenhouse gas emissions."

Gustafson said the letter of intent

required for Air Products to move forward authorized the company to install the stations as a donation to the town, subject to final agreements and specifics related to the projects, he said.

During the village board meeting, Mayor Greg Paquin also detailed the agreement, saying the charging stations would be placed around the village following a review process. The locations have yet to be determined, he said.

"They just have to put this letter in with our approval saying we are going to do this. If they aren't doing it, we don't want them," he said.

Revenue generated by the charging stations would also come back to the village, he said.

Paquin went on further, saying those who would use the charging stations would likely receive a separate rate that was determined by the open market which would be separate from the rates a homeowner would pay for their own power.

"My belief is that they pay the rate of whatever the purchase power rate is on the open market. Massena is allotted X amount of power. Sometimes at high peaks, like when it's hot out and everybody's running their air conditioner, the amount of power that we're getting from the

Power Authority isn't enough. So, Massena Electric has to go out in the open market and buy that," which is more costly, he said.

With the agreements signed by town and village officials, Air Products will be able to take the next steps to install the charging stations as part of a \$500 million project.

The facility will harvest 35 metric tons of green hydrogen daily on the 84.4 acre property once it becomes fully operational in the first quarter of 2027.

Fall Fest coming to Massena

MASSENA -- Fall Fest: Pumpkin-palooza is set to take over downtown Massena on Saturday, October 12, with food and beer trucks, live music and activities for the whole family.

The event was brought back last year by Village Trustee Shelyn Peets, bringing in over 3,000 people to the village of Massena.

Peets recently offered an update on the 2024 iteration of the event, telling fellow trustees and the public that over 50 vendors have signed up for the event this year, along with six food trucks and two breweries.

Live music and children's activities will also be held during the event, which is slated to run from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Though fireworks were held after the event last year, Peets said it wasn't in the cards for this year.

"We're going to do something a little different with the kid's activities this year with some carnival-type games with prizes," she said.

Trustees approved spending \$2,000 on the event earlier this year, which was "money well spent," according to Mayor Greg Paquin.

Massena board of education to discuss district cell phone policy in future meeting

MASSENA -- Should cellphones be allowed in the junior high and high school? That question will be up for debate during a future Massena Central School Board of Education meeting and the public is being asked to weigh in.

The topic recently arose when Board Member Joyce Giroux suggested the board consider discussing the district's cell phone policy in the high school and junior high, a move that was supported by Board President Paul Haggett.

While Giroux initially suggested the board discuss the district's policy, Board Member Patricia Murphy took it a step further and suggested the public also be involved as well.

"I would like to invite anyone from the public who wants to be part of that to come to the board meeting and state what their preference is and why, and any supporting evidence that they have for a change in the cell phone policy," she said.

Stakeholders will also be invited as well, Haggett said.

Currently, student use of cell phones are prohibited during the school day, however the board of education also has a policy in place to allow for the use of school or per-

sonal technology for use during the school day for educational purposes only.

Administration and teachers also reserve the right to restrict the use of such technologies on school property or at school-sponsored events, board of education policy states.

Teachers can also indicate when and if classroom use of such technology is acceptable, according to the Building Code of Conduct and Student Handbook.

According to the high school student handbook, cell phones and electronic devices are not permitted "from the beginning of the first period (7:35 a.m.) to the end of 9th period (2:16 p.m.)."

"All electronic devices must be placed in the student's locker during this time," the handbook states.

Though policies state cell phones are not permitted for personal use during school hours for junior high students, they are allowed to bring cellphones to school if they remain in lockers "at all times."

"We recognize that sometimes communication from home is needed during the day. Students are permitted to check/send text messages at their locker only and then return

the device to the locker," the handbook states.

Cell phones must remain out of sight otherwise, according to the handbook.

School officials also have a list of offenses that could result in a phone being confiscated if used during the school day.

A first offense will result in the device being held in the Student Affairs Office before being returned to the student at the end of the day.

A second offense leads to the device being held at the Student Affairs Office for a parent or guardian to pick up at the end of the day.

A third offense will result in the device being taken and a parent must pick up the device from school. A disciplinary referral for insubordination will also occur after a third offense, policy states.

The student handbook also states that use of cell phones in the school or on school transportation will result in the phone being confiscated and may result in further disciplinary action.

It is unclear at this time if board members will seek to modify the district's cell phone policy following the public forum.

I think far too often we miss out on great fun in our own back-

yards. Much like the board game renaissance my boys brought back into my life when they discovered chess.

They have now returned the childhood wonder and old-fashioned fun around the fire to my life, just in time for Halloween.

While we'll certainly be enjoying some spooky television, movies and music this fall, we'll also be continuing this tradition of campfire tales until the weather turns.

If you can swing it, I highly recommend joining some friends around the fire and taking a crack at one of humanity's older traditions, that is of course if you aren't too scared.

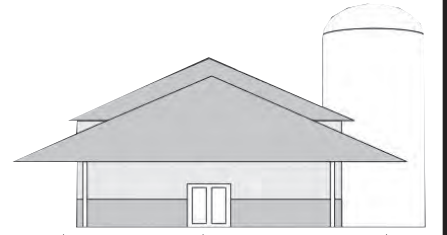

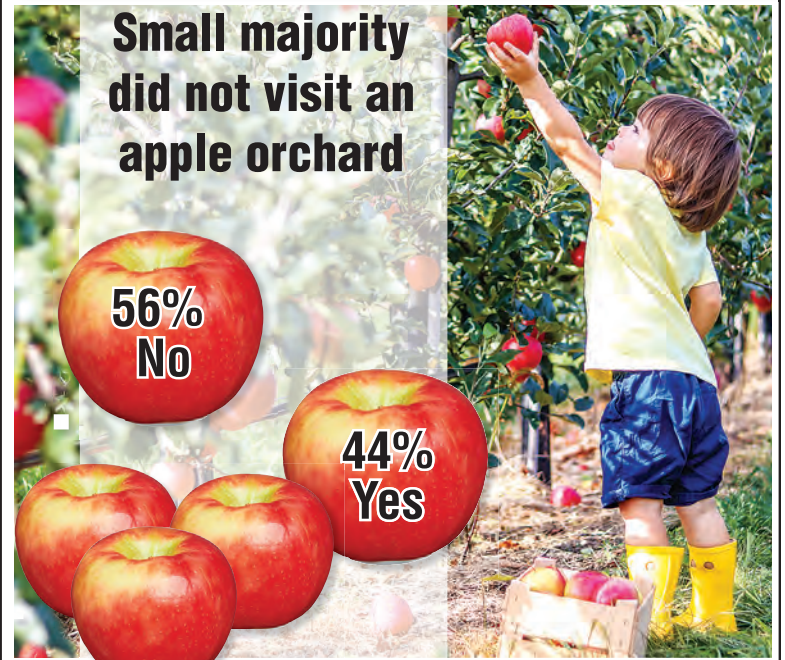

Breast and Ovarian Cancer Walk in Gouverneur raises \$235,000

GOUVERNEUR -- The Gouverneur Breast and Ovarian Cancer Fund walk raised over \$235,000 during the organization's 23rd annual walk on Oct. 5.

Hundreds of survivors, advocates, supporters and family members gathered downtown for the event which also featured raffles, prize tables and a number of speakers who sought to raise awareness for breast cancer and ovarian cancer testing and treatments.

The Gouverneur Breast and Ovarian Cancer Fund was established to provide financial assistance to those fighting breast or ovarian cancer that has metastasized from those cancers.

The organization assists individuals in St. Lawrence, Jefferson, Lewis and Franklin counties by providing them with financial assistance to cover household, medical, travel and living expenses during treatment.

Board member Joey Shelly said when the organization was founded the first board members had no idea how large it would grow, providing assistance to cancer patients in four counties in the North Country.

"I am so blessed to be able to carry on my mom's legacy and to be part of such an amazing cause. While a few things have changed over the years our mission has remained the same, to assist patients in St. Lawrence, Jefferson, Franklin and Lewis counties that are fighting breast or ovarian cancer. Our hope is to alleviate some of the financial burden that they may face during their treatment, allowing them to focus on recovery and healing. But without all of you, we wouldn't be able to do the work that we do, so thank you," she said.

Funds come from many sources for the organization, from registration donations to 50/50 raffle tickets and sponsored teams that raise funds through events to donate.

One such team was team Lynn Tharrett, who raised \$7,708 through a golf tournament last month.

The team were on hand to represent Tharrett who passed away on September 11 after battling the disease for many years.

An advocate who sought to raise awareness about breast cancer, Tharrett was the guest speaker during the 2023 walk.

Another team that had a huge impact on fundraising efforts this year was Twin Peaks, which has raised over \$100,000 collectively over the previous nine years.

The team members were awarded a plaque in recognition of their efforts to support the annual walk by 106.7 host Johnny Spezzano.

"Here's a plaque for you guys, presented in appreciation of your continued support and dedication and the fight against breast and ovarian cancer. Your team spirit and love for Chris continues to shine greatly year after year. Thank you for all you do to assist those in need," he said.

Treasurer Marilyn LaPierre commented that the process is simple for those who require assistance to apply, with an initial application required and a second portion to be filled out by a doctor to verify the patient information.

"Immediately, we sent them \$500, no questions asked. We know there's expenses, just to alleviate their mind that when they get this \$500 that we're there and we'll always be there," LaPierre said.

This year alone the fund has spent over \$120,000 on clients, over \$80,000 in St. Lawrence County

alone, she said.

For 2024, LaPierre said the organization aimed to raise \$150,000, which she said they were well on pace to achieve through special events throughout the year, along with a number of anonymous donations.

"We are so appreciative of our sponsors. Without our sponsors, we couldn't do what we do," she said.

LaPierre said the organization has assumed serving 65 new clients this year, along with 33 from previous years.

That figure may rise over the next

few years though, according to Dr. Velmalia Matthews-Smith.

Dr. Matthews-Smith, who works in Hematology and Medical Oncology for St. Lawrence Health, works in the Center for Cancer Care. It is estimated that 310,000 patients will be diagnosed with breast cancer for the first time in 2024. In total, 16,000 of those will be in New York, she said.

"Unfortunately, 42,000 women will lose their battle with cancer, and 2,500 of those women will likely be in the state of New York," she said.

But there is good news as well, she commented.

"The good news is, at this time, there are almost 4 million women who are living with breast cancer in the United States, so we are having a huge impact on the outcome of this disease, 91.2% of women are going to survive their breast cancer and that number actually goes up to over 99% when these cancers are found early," Dr. Matthews-Smith said.

She went on to say the key to early detection is to get consistent mammograms beginning around

the age of 40.

However, only 83% of women in New York State are doing so, she said.

"So, we have some work to do there," Dr. Matthews-Smith said.

Another risk factor is if a first degree family member, like a mother, sister or daughter has breast cancer, she said.

In that case, individuals are at a higher risk of developing breast cancer.

"So, if there's a family history you know of, you need to stay on top of your mammograms," she said.

Grieving in aisle 10

When you're grieving the smallest things seem overwhelming. The idea of leaving the house even to just run to the bank or grocery store can fill you with anxiety.

Once you're able to finally convince yourself to jump in the car, do a quick grocery run, and come right back home you get stuck with the "wonky cart."

You know the cart I mean; the one with one wheel that's sticking or shaking and super squeaky. The one you think isn't that bad until you've already grabbed the apples, caramel dip, baby carrots and paper towels and it's too late to ditch it, so you just push (no pun intended) through. The one that causes everyone to stare just a bit because it's so loud. The wonky cart could easily send you over the edge when you're already a little stressed. Your grief in public is the wonky cart. You feel awkward and people are staring but you cannot just get rid of your grief.

For suggestions on how to manage your grief while in public Hospice of St. Lawrence Valley recommends the following:

- Have a plan. Of course, bring your grocery list so you're not spending more time in the store than necessary but plan for more than that. Have an idea of what you're going to say if someone asks how you've been doing. A plan for if someone asks about the person who died because they didn't know they died. Have a small pack of tissues handy or plan to stop on the way home for a small reward (perhaps a pumpkin spice latte) for yourself.

- Beware of the Devil's Food cookies. Understand you may reach for a certain food only to realize you no longer need to buy it because the

person who loved it is gone. This can be upsetting and bring on tears. It is ok to cry in public. It is not the most comfortable experience but if you need to cry, do so. If you really want to avoid this think about what foods will be hard for you to leave on the shelf those first few grocery trips. Avoid them if possible.

- Know you're not the only one. While you may feel as though you're the only person to ever cry in a public place you're not. It is ok for you to cry. It's ok for you to abandon the cart mid grocery shop if you truly just cannot handle anymore that day. You will likely not even be the only person grieving in the store at that time.

Heading back into public after a loss, especially in the small communities we have in the North Country can be complicated. You need to get shopping done but you're dreading being asked how you are and breaking down. You don't want to feel like people are staring because they know you're grieving. You will adjust to heading into the store alone and dragging your grief around like the wonky cart. role as Director of Development and Major Gifts focusing on ensuring the sustainability and growth of the Club's financial resources.

covered the promotion of Massena and activities that went from January through the end of March. The total of that reimbursement was over \$10,000," she said.

McQuinn said she and Meissner were told to keep all receipts related to the shows so the town could be reimbursed for both fees, lodging and mileage.

"We were told upfront that we could not put in meals, which we did not and in fact we don't bill the town for those. That's something that Don pays for. We also didn't put in for tolls because we do travel on interstate highways and there are tolls associated with that travel," McQuinn said.

Despite keeping receipts, McQuinn said the town would only be reimbursed \$2,000 for shows she and Meissner requested permission to attend.

"That sounds on the face of it as though the chamber is deciding how the town of Massena conducts its tourism efforts. In fact, what it exemplifies is a lack of understanding on the work that Don Meissner has done for these last 10 years because, when Don goes to sports shows, he does a great deal of collaboration and a great deal of interaction with people who can bring more opportunity to Massena,"

McQuinn said.

McQuinn commented that the response to the request for reimbursement suggests "that perhaps the town of Massena doesn't know what it's doing with respect to sports show attendance."

She went on further, saying it was a "misguided approach" to wait for the chamber to tell the town of Massena how to promote its tourism.

She said the lack of reimbursement was "a sad state of affairs."

"But, unless we ask their permission, we won't be reimbursed in the future," McQuinn said.

Tiffani Amo, director of tourism for the Chamber, said limited funding for such ventures, like attending sporting shows, means the chamber must be careful in choosing where to spend the funds.

"The St. Lawrence County Chamber of Commerce's tourism programming supports and promotes tourism efforts throughout the county. Attending trade shows in out-of-county markets is one of the many ways in which we promote our localized tourism assets to key visitor demographics. To best leverage our limited budget for this specific form of promotion, we have forged partnerships with local organizations, often volunteer-based, to provide supplemental financial support for their trade show attendance costs on the basis that they also promote county tourism assets alongside their specific initiative. This collaborative partnership ultimately enables the county, the chamber, and the organizations to more feasibly and effectively reach valued tourism markets," Amo said.

Amo said those limited funds are allocated to support a wide array of organizations and tourism assets throughout the county. She noted it is necessary for potential partners to submit budgets and obtain pre-approval before incurring costs for which they wish to seek supplemental reimbursement.

"This did not occur with the request being addressed here. Had budgets been submitted in advance, it would have been made expressly clear that the extent of those financial requests could not be met and would have far exceeded our overall promotional trade show budget. As a result of this misstep, there has been an unfortunate outcome regarding expectations versus deliverables, a discrepancy which we hope can now be avoided in future collaborations," she said in reference to the situation in Massena.

Amo said it was the belief of the Chamber that the town of Massena was doing "a great job promoting its tourism assets and developing a tourism economy," something the Chamber wished to recognize, encourage and continue to support

in the future.

"As the designated tourism promotion agent for the county, we also understand the contribution of fishing to our local tourism economy, and we have continued to support fishing activities and tourism throughout the region, including by hosting the Bassmaster Elite Series in Waddington and the BASS Nation tournament in Ogdensburg most recently, alongside ongoing print and digital campaigns throughout New York State, surrounding states, and in Canada as well as other efforts in partnership with the Thousand Islands International Tourism Council and the Adirondack Regional Tourism Council. We are committed to pursuing tourism initiatives to support our local communities and to promote our many and varied assets with the limited resources available," Amo said.

DEER...

Motorists should not attempt to put the deer out of its misery yourself, as it is unsafe and illegal. Call law enforcement to come to the scene.

The owner of a vehicle damaged by collision with a deer is allowed to keep the carcass for consumption or give it to a third party. For that to happen, the accident must be reported to a police agency and a "carcass tag" must be obtained to transport it home or to a butcher.

"We're excited to help reduce waste and give back to those in need. Together, we can turn a difficult situation into something positive for our neighbors," Engle said.

Sheriff Engle was made aware of the program during a meeting with the Fulton County sheriff.

"I personally did not have the time to get it started, but one of our corrections sergeants stepped in and took control," the sheriff said.

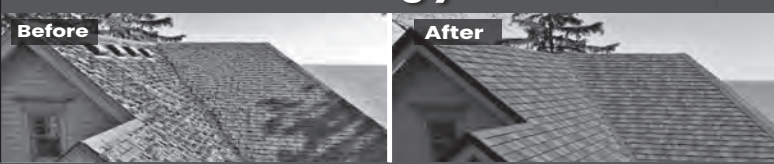


