## Flooding cost village more than \$17k

POTSDAM — The Village of Potsdam incurred more than \$17,000 in expenses dealing with the Aug. 9 flooding that resulted from the hurricane-influenced weather event.

The municipality has submitted an application to the Federal Emergency Management Agency for disaster aid to help reimburse those expenses.

Meanwhile, a local grassroots organization has formed up to discuss concerns about possible flooding financial aid and possible longterm solutions, and they plan to hold a public meeting on the issue Oct. 28.

“Treasurer (Erica) Russell prepared and submitted the FEMA grant application to begin the process for reimbursement for the village of Potsdam. Which included all of the damages as a result from our August 9th flooding,” Village Administrator Isabelle Gates-Shult told village board of trustees members at their meeting Monday, Oct. 22.

“The total damage incurred was \$17,923.97,” the administrator told the board.

She said the total cost included costs for staff time, damage to equipment and debris removal.

Gates-Shult told the village board that the municipality would be reviewing St. Lawrence County’s Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan to help the municipality with future planning concerns regarding occurrences like the August flooding.

The county’s 2022 plan, prepared by

## In split vote, county opposes Prop 1

CANTON -- A majority of county legislators voted for a resolution opposing Proposition 1 but the vote was not made strictly along party lines.

Legislators debated the measure during the Oct. 21 Operations Committee meeting, with one calling the resolution “improper and illegal.”

In an 8-4-1 vote legislators approved the contentious resolution, with Legislators Dave Forsythe, Larry Denesha, John Burke and Margaret Haggard voting in opposition. Legislator Nicole Terminelli abstained but did not offer a reason why.

Voting in favor of the resolution were Legislators Jim Reagen, Joseph Lightfoot, William Sheridan, Harry Smithers, Ben Hull, Glenn Webster, John Gennett and Rita Curran.

The controversial measure will be on the New York State ballot this year, with voters set to decide on a constitutional amendment to expand existing equal protections laws.

### Proposition 1

Specifically the proposition would amend the state constitution to read:

“No person shall be denied the equal protection of the laws of this state or any subdivision thereof.

“a. No person shall, because of race, color, [ethnicity, national origin, age, disability,] creed, religion, [or sex, including sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, pregnancy, pregnancy outcomes, and reproductive healthcare and autonomy,] be subjected to any discrimination in civil rights by any other person or by any firm, corporation, or institution, or by the state or any agency or subdivision of the state,

# Village of Potsdam water plant upgrades in works

POTSDAM — The village is considering upgrades at its water plant.

According to Village Administrator Isabelle Gates-Shult, a resolution approving a request for qualifications for an engineering study of the village's water plant could be ready for village board of trustees review and approval by the next village meeting in November.

Gates-Shult told the board at their meeting Monday, Oct. 22, that she had met with water plant staff on the need for upgrades and said an RFQ could be ready at the next meeting.

"This overall process can take years so we would like to be proactive and spearhead these efforts now," Gates-Shult said.

"Staff will be preparing an RFQ with assistance from our chief water plant operator Brian Page who will be retiring next month. An RFQ will be presented to the

board once completed," she said.

The village's water system annually provides about 10 million gallons of water to 10,000 residents, businesses, SUNY Potsdam and Clarkson University, and other buildings in the village.

The water, drawn from the Raquette River, is pulled to the village's treatment plant and filtered through a sand filtration system and into two elevated storage tanks. The water then supplies miles of water mains to supply village buildings.

The village water department has implemented various improvements to the municipal water supply system over the last couple years. Gates-Shult reported earlier this year that the municipality has been able to reduce its

water consumption by around 54 percent over the last three years. The village produced about 23 million gallons in 2022, and the level for the current year, all measured in June, was around 10.7 million gallons.

## Village begins search for new auditing firm

POTSDAM — The village is looking for a new firm to complete its annual fiscal audit.

Village Administrator Isabelle Gates-Shult told board members at their meeting Monday, Oct. 22 that the municipality's normal firm, Potsdam-based financial firm Pinto Mucenski Hooper Van-House & Co., CPA's, PC, can no longer complete the audits due to staffing issues.

The village approved a resolution later during the meeting authorizing the administrator to circulate a request for qualifications among likely accounting firms who could do the job.

The village is searching for a firm that can conduct two audits, one for fiscal year 2022-2023 and for the current fiscal year, 2024-2025.

"We received news that our external auditor that is assigned to

our annual audit is resigning and the firm does not have sufficient staffing to take over our 2022-2023 audit," Gates-Shult said.

"So we have begun preparing the RFQ in anticipation of the approved resolution tonight," the administrator said.

Gates-Shult said she and the village treasurer also have a meeting scheduled with a representative of an auditing firm who they met at the annual New York Conference of Mayors to get more information on what that company could provide.

Village board members have discussed at past meetings how the municipalities annual audit, traditionally available in February, has been late in recent years, sometimes not arriving until October.

As early as this past February, board members were discussing the lateness of last year's audit and considering the idea of contracting with a new firm.

## Little Caesars serving up slices soon in Potsdam

POTSDAM — Whether you are looking for deep dish, thin crust or stuffed crust, local pizza lovers will soon be able to get their Little Caesars slices in Potsdam.

The company, long rumored to be opening a franchise at the site of the former Kentucky Fried Chicken at 119 Maple St., at the Mountain Mart there.

A quick online search for nearby Little Caesars restaurant shows that the Potsdam location is slated to open on Nov. 11. A Mountain Mart employee verified that the restaurant would be opening at the Maple Street shop, but could not verify the date.

The Kentucky Fried Chicken drive-thru, a feature of the convenience store and gas station since December 2018, closed in August. The other anchor restaurant at the station and store, Dunkin' Donuts, has remained open.

Company representatives were not available for comment on the new franchise late Friday.

# Sen. Stec addresses nursing shortage in SLC

CANTON -- State Senator Dan Stec was on hand as St. Lawrence Health officials opened a new \$80 million regional care pavilion at Canton-Potsdam Hospital but staffing may be difficult unless a state law is changed.

During the county legislature's full October board meeting, Stec commented that the four story building, 108,000-square-foot expansion project will be essential for the North Country.

But the Compact Nursing Bill is still hung up in the State Assembly and Senate, making it difficult for nurses from other states to come work in New York.

Legislator Rita Curran raised concerns with the extended delay in passing the bills, commenting that they would greatly benefit healthcare facilities in the region.

If passed, the bills would enact a nurse licensure compact that would allow licensing for registered nurses and licensed practical/vocational nurses to be recognized by party states even if such license was issued by another state.

That means nurses coming from other states would not have to endure a lengthy and costly application process to work in New York.

"Do you see anything coming forward? As you know we have a really hard time staffing hospitals in this state," she asked Stec.

Curran commented that the process is "ridiculous" for out-of-state nurses and costs more to obtain a license as an out-of-state nurse.

"A compact license would give us a lot in terms of being able to staff our facilities," Curran said.

But Stec said bills like the Compact License Bill sometimes "sit for years before they're acted on."

"Sometimes I breathe a sigh of relief when some bills aren't brought up but other times we know bills, such as this one, would make a world of difference for everyone," Stec said.

Stec said the licensing bill, among others, have plagued the healthcare industry throughout the state.

Another such issue is Medicaid reimbursement rates, which still remain critically low, he said.

Bills currently sit with the state legislature to address those wide-

spread issues but with the state legislature out of session, relief won't come anytime soon.

"There's a lot of good legislation out there that, for the life of me, I don't know why it's still sitting there," Stec said.

Stec touched on the efforts of many local colleges, including Clarkson University and SUNY Canton, which are focused on producing Physician Assistants and Registered Nurses as fast as they can.

Many schools, from private to state run institutions, have made significant shifts in recent years to add more healthcare training opportunities.

But those efforts are not enough to bridge the gap in terms of staffing, Stec said.

"Community colleges and SUNY Plattsburgh and Canton are pumping out nurses as fast as they can," Stec said.

Another major issue is a lack of educators to train the next generation of nurses and physicians as well, Stec said.

In many cases, nurses make twice as much money in a clinical setting compared to an educational institution, Stec said.

"No one wants to teach nursing right now," Stec said.

Curran said numbers are still down for hospitals throughout the state, exacerbating an already serious issue.

"If you're a nurse and making good money, God bless you, I understand why you want to do it," Stec said.

Curran said the cost of hiring traveling nurses also affects the bottom line for patients as well, with travel nurses making 2.5 times more than a local nurse.

"We could add another nurse and a half per travel nurse if we are able to hire locally," Curran said.

Stec said he wanted to continue to push the issue in the next legislative session but noted it may be an uphill battle at the moment.

"There's a lot of really good legislation that's tied up in Albany. Unfortunately, I don't get to set the agenda as to what is voted on," Stec said.

Stec said more needs to be done to address the nursing shortage. He suggested constituents continue to reach out to representatives or to write to Governor Hochul's office to request a second look at

the legislation in question.

"I wish I had a better, more substantive answer. Everyone should advocate. These aren't exciting issues compared to some of the topics that people have been advocating for, I know," Stec said.

Stec said constituents can reach out to him as well if pending legislation is of concern to them.

"Certainly, you can reach out to me, to Assemblyman Ken Blankenbush, Assemblyman Scott Gray and Senator Mark Walczyk's office.

You had us at hello, we're with you on this," Stec said.

Stec said writing to the Governor as well can only benefit the region.

"It won't hurt, it can only help," Stec said.

# Legislators approve funding new systems for Emergency Services Department

CANTON -- The St. Lawrence County Emergency Services Department has selected APCO International for the Intellicom and Guidecard System for the department.

Legislators approved a contract with APCO during the Oct. 7 full board meeting following a review by Emergency Services staff was conducted on multiple options.

Officials say APCO International would "best benefit the residents of the County as the best option when considering public safety and emergency communications."

"IntelliComm expands the current EMD System to include not only medical guidecards but also law enforcement and fire guidecards, offering the most consistent, efficient, and safest

dispatching options with each discipline always available on-screen for immediate access as well as portable accessibility from mobile phone devices to help ensure continuity of operations," officials say.

APCO International also offers online training and required recertifications for Public Safety Communications, Law Enforcement, Fire Service, EMD manager and supervisors.

The cost for APCO International implementation will be \$59,412 with an added cost of \$2,891 estimated for training, products and manual.

Estimated annual maintenance will be \$7,000.

In other action, legislators also signed off on an agreement with Relcomm Inc. for the implementation and maintenance of a new phone system including the Mitel Revolution Emergency Notification System.

A corresponding budget modification was made for the 2024 Information Technology Department budget.

Officials noted the Mitel-based telephone infrastructure of the county was installed in 2008 and was in "dire need of updating from both a hardware, equipment and software perspective."

"The County has expressed an interest in improving its ability to communicate effectively in emergency situations and as a part of this project will be implementing an enterprise-wide internal notification system for emergencies," officials say.

RelComm, the current Mitel support vendor for the county, has provided a detailed thorough plan to effectuate the upgrade, officials say.

RelComm is also a Mitel partner for the implementation of the Revolution Emergency Alert system, enabling messages and alerts to be sent to all county phones.

The new phone system will displace nine physical controllers with two virtual controllers, reducing maintenance costs and potential points of failure, according to officials.

Officials say the remaining old telephone handsets, of which there are 678, will be replaced with new systems that will have screens which can receive messages.

Telephone infrastructure will be improved and service to lines and will have increased redundancy, resulting in reducing the potential service failures.

The total cost of the project will be \$423,500.

## Potsdam fire driver resigns; highway worker appointed

The resignation is effective Oct. 17.

Village trustees and the mayor also approved the hiring of Jeremy Keleher as a motor equipment operator.

The appointment was to fill a vacancy from a recent resignation.

Keleher was hired at 90 percent of the CSEA contracted salary. The rate equates to \$23.19 an hour for one year from his hire date.

Keleher will serve a probationary period of no less than 6 months and not greater than one year.

He starts Oct. 22.

# Adam Smith murder trial begins in contentious fashion

CANTON — The murder trial of Adam Smith began with a contentious start on Tuesday, Oct. 22.

Smith is accused of murdering both Ronald “Huck” Durham and William Freeman last year in separate instances.

An opening statement from defense attorney Brian Barrett was called into question multiple times by District Attorney Gary Pasqua.

As he sought to address the 12 jurors and four alternates, Barrett said Pasqua and his associates were going to “piece together this puzzle of a million pieces by presenting grisly evidence of two horrific crimes.

Barrett said Smith “thought highly” of the two men and has continually denied in open court “each and every accusation that has been lodged against him.”

“He is innocent and presumed innocent by law. Since March 2, 2023, Adam has been living a nightmare, falsely accused of two murders and other associated offenses that he did not commit,” Barrett said.

He said the charges stem from “a relentless, haphazard police investigation” through which Smith was a “soft target by relentless investigators who were laser focused on him.”

In his statement, Barrett denied the claims of investigators who accused Smith of stealing Freeman’s truck shortly after his death. He said Freeman allowed Smith to borrow the vehicle, at which time Smith was arrested by police “in the process of returning it to him.”

“The police didn’t pay any attention to a word Adam said, but they should have because in this very complex case, the facts don’t add up to Adam committing any crimes that

he is accused of,” Barrett said.

Barrett went on further, detailing Smith’s arrest before giving a brief history of Smith’s life.

He called Smith “the quiet kid” at school who was not an outcast but also not in the inner circle of a friend group.

“He got you your first pack of cigarettes in middle school. He got you your first 12 pack of beer in high school. And when he went to that field party and you got sick from those first beers, Adam got you into his car and gave you a ride home and would never ask for a thing later on,” Barrett said.

But post graduation, Barrett said Smith would sell marijuana and cocaine to make ends meeting.

“But an individual who sells drugs does not equate to a violent person who is capable of homicide,” Barrett commented.

Barrett then attempted to call into question the history of many individuals who knew Smith, attempting to detail drug overdoses, drug use and other questionable actions by potential witnesses.

On eight separate occasions Pasqua objected to Barrett’s statements, forcing the attorneys and Smith to approach the bench. Each time, Judge Greg Storie sustained Pasqua’s objections, forcing Barrett to revise his opening statement.

While Barrett portrayed the case as a “complex puzzle of evidence,” Pasqua said the case was in fact very simple.

He commented that both Freeman and Durham had similar lives, with both being born in the 1950’s, both living in the southern portion of the county, both driving pickups “like many people do in the North Country” and both having known Smith prior to their deaths.

“What they didn’t know is that the defendant is an opportunist who exploits the circumstances of people around him for his own needs, wants and desires, and doesn’t care about the damage and destruction he leaves in his wake.

Pasqua said it was due to this that Smith eventually got the better of both, eventually murdering them before stealing their trucks, cash, valuables, credit cards, debit cards and even rifles.

He said the evidence of the two cases “is nearly identical in each case,” with both men eventually succumbing to wounds inflicted by Smith as he attempted to rob each of them.

Pasqua said both had their throats cut before their valuables were stolen. Smith then went on to steal both of their vehicles before driving south to Syracuse “and going on shopping sprees.”

He detailed how Cortland Police seized Durham’s truck with Smith at the wheel after it was found to have an expired registration.

It wasn’t until a month later that police eventually searched the vehicle and found Durham’s checkbook, blood and the knife used to kill Durham, Pasqua said.

He went on further, saying the knife not only had Durham’s blood on it, but also Smith’s DNA.

Pasqua said it took a month for police to search the truck because another individual had wrongly confessed to the murder of Durham previously.

It was due to that wrongful confession that allowed Smith to be free for another month, leading to the death of Freeman on March 1, he said.

He said Freeman put up a better fight, sustaining defensive wounds to his hand before being “stabbed in the

back, through his liver, touching his ribs in the front so hard that you will see it bent that knife.”

Pasqua then detailed what he claimed were Smith’s attempts to

cover up the murders before being caught by law enforcement shortly after Freeman’s murder.

PARISHVILLE - Eugene P. Groebler, 89, passed away on Tuesday, October 15, 2024, at the Canton-Potsdam Hospital.



### Proposition 1 is a Trojan Horse

Proposition 1 claims to expand civil rights. But in reality, this amendment would inject our State Constitution with poorly-defined terms and would tear a hole in our Constitution's equal protections guarantee.

Part (a) of the amendment expands classes shielded from discrimination. It adds "ethnicity", "national origin", "age", "disability", "sex", "sexual orientation", "gender identity", "gender expression", "pregnancy", "pregnancy outcomes", and "reproductive healthcare and autonomy." Some of these terms lack any common or legal definition, so incorporating them into our Constitution is simply reckless.

Forbidding distinctions based on age and sex sounds good at first. But these distinctions are often used for the benefit and protection of vulnerable people. If the amendment passes, girls' sports programs could become unconstitutional. How could we allow sports programs for girls without distinguishing on the basis of sex?

Even worse, age-of-consent laws would be called into serious question. In 2021, New York raised the age of consent to 18 to protect vulnerable children from exploitation. That law was passed with an overwhelming majority, but it (like so many laws) discriminates on the basis of age. Proposition 1 could render that law unconstitutional too.

Part (b) is even more destructive. It creates a constitutional loophole which allows discrimination if it's "designed to prevent or dismantle discrimination." This would allow individuals, businesses, and the government to commit widespread civil rights violations if they claim the discrimination is preventing or dismantling discrimination. Besides sounding like Orwellian doublespeak, this is a sinister and deeply un-American notion.

The framers of our Federal and State Constitutions pursued equality of rights and equality of opportunity. But Proposition 1 scraps that tradition for the utopian goal of equal outcomes where civil rights must yield to equity.

Are you worried about the government treating you unequally because of your race or religion? Proposition 1 would allow such mistreatment as long as it's tied to a social justice goal. For example, Proposition 1 would give the government the power to levy taxes and create crimes which only apply to people of a certain race or religion.

Proposition 1 allows the government to take liberty from one person for the benefit of another

and call it progress. That is a false premise. We cannot dismantle discrimination by authorizing more of it. We will not solve historical wrongs by simply inflicting old injustices on new victims.

Proposition 1 sets the stage for unequal treatment writ large. I urge you to vote "No."

Pickleball concerns in Potsdam

As property owners in the town of Potsdam and passionate pickleball players, we've faced significant frustrations with the management of the Sandstoner Courts, currently overseen by the North Country

Pickleball Club (NCPC).

Our concerns revolve around the lack of transparency, arbitrary treatment of members, and the inappropriate conduct of a village official. This taxpayer-funded facility is being managed like a private club, excluding many players, including ourselves.

Our membership, granted by Trey Smutz, Director of the Potsdam Recreation Department (who has no authority over the courts), was revoked by NCPC leaders.

They claimed the club had too many members, despite allowing others to join during the same period. The NCPC offers lifetime

memberships to Potsdam residents for \$60 and charges non-residents \$125 annually. However, they have granted lifetime memberships to non-residents who are friends of the board, demonstrating clear favoritism.

Five of the nine NCPC board members don't pay Potsdam taxes, despite controlling a taxpayer-funded facility. We suspect our membership was denied due to our association with a friend who was banned from the courts over a minor tournament dispute. Her one-month ban was extended indefinitely, and there are ongoing rumors of further scrutiny if she's allowed to return.

This has fostered a toxic environment where members distance themselves from her to avoid jeopardizing their own memberships.

The club's membership policies are inconsistent, and court time is often left unused because it's controlled by lifetime members.

This prevents many eager players from accessing the courts, which goes against the very purpose of public facilities.

Fortunately, Mayor Alexandra Wilke and Town Supervisor Marty Miller have acknowledged our concerns and are working to address these issues. The village is revising its policies to ensure fair and transparent management of the courts, and plans to hire an assistant recreation director to oversee court access.

We urge the community to support these efforts to ensure Sandstoner Courts are managed fairly and transparently. Public facilities should serve all residents, not just a select few. We remain hopeful that these issues will be resolved, and the courts will become a welcoming space for all.

North Country Conservation is on the Ballot

With the upcoming November elections, it is vital for us all to make informed decisions when voting for congressional representatives.

As Elise Stefanik runs for her sixth term as Congresswoman, I hope all members of the 21st district will look at her previous track record and decide if Stefanik continues to keep the values of Northern New Yorkers at heart in her votes.

As someone who grew up spending time in the St. Lawrence Valley and the Adirondacks, I learned the intrinsic value of wilderness preservation. If you too hold this value, don't vote for Stefanik.

Looking back on her votes in the 118th Congress, Stefanik voted against the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA). This legislation did pass, increasing funding for conservation projects, land restoration, and forest management.

Its emission reduction standards will decrease the acid rain which threatens aquatic and riparian ecosystems in our region. Her vote against the IRA demonstrates Stefanik's anti-environment voting pattern.

Stefanik voted to decrease funding to environmental agencies including the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and the National Park Service. Her pro-fossil fuel energy stance greatly impacts public land use. While New York does not have public land, the North Country is directly impacted by laws that slow the transition to renewable energy and increase pollution. We will directly experience these impacts through warmer winters, invasive species, lake warming, and forest stress. Stefanik's website calls her district "the largest and most diverse ecosystem in New York State" while her votes directly threaten its safety.

The St. Lawrence Valley and Adirondack Park are under threat. If you believe in protecting the ecosystem that sustains the North Country, vote for a Representative who shows this support through actions.

Richardson said dozens of volunteers, young and old, scraped the building prior to painting; Dave and Kate Parker sourced the paint; LeBerge & Curtis organized the lift

rental; the Canton Minor Hockey Association and St. Lawrence Figure Skating Club for donating funds towards the cost of the paint; and the Canton Recreation staff for enduring the last project of the summer while simultaneously kicking off the ice season.

"With every visitor through the doors, the compliments are many. The most memorable comes from Canton Minor Hockey parent, Dana Hill. Hill shared the experience her two young boys, Jackson and Ashton, had while they volunteered to scrape the building and heard hours of stories about how the Pavilion was built and the history of past players," stated Richardson. "Furthermore, the boys have had added excitement as they watched the building change colors with every visit during the last week, feeling that Canton Pride because they helped, in their own little way, to 'Complete Our Pavilion'".

### Storied History

The Canton Pavilion has been a home away from home for Howe who for the past 40 years has spent his Sunday nights playing pickup hockey, including the annual Colonel's Cup for the past 20 years. Doing the math has Howe participating in approximately 840 hockey games at the Canton Pavilion.

Richardson provided North Country This Week with some Canton Pavilion history and Howe's involvement.

The Canton Recreational Pavilion was constructed in 1979. During its initial years of operation, the Pavilion offered limited skating when the ambient temperatures allowed for natural ice. In 1987, through local efforts by the "Complete Our

Pavilion" committee, with a goal of expanding recreational opportunities for Canton, an artificial ice system was installed.

The Complete Our Pavilion director, Tom Coakley, co-chairs Anne Ryan and Terry Martin, and a dedicated team of community members, orchestrated the transition of a natural ice surface to artificial. Additionally, locker rooms, bleachers, and bathrooms were constructed through grants, donations and pledges from families and local businesses.

Howe not only purchased the original steamer for the therapy/steam room located in locker room two, he was one of many local individuals who pledged monies to help "Complete Our Pavilion."

Howe has been involved with the Pavilion since its inception, and remains passionate about giving back to the building that has provided decades of fun, for not only himself every Sunday night skating with the Canton Flames, but for the entire Canton Community.

According to Richardson, the Flames, a collection of your neighbors, friends, family and local business owners, have continued the legacy of the "Complete Our Pavilion" committee, with the mindset of giving back to the community that we all live, work and play in.

Howe is the eldest member of the Canton Flames.

The inaugural Colonel's Cup in 1987 was organized by long-time Canton Flame, Mark Brackett who came up with the idea of putting the Flames against local high school all-stars. Throughout the years, the Colonel's Cup has created special bonds and even featured several father

and son rivalries. Proceeds from the game have historically been distributed to the Canton Church and Community Program, The Lodge at Dreaming Tree Ranch, Canton Free Library, Renewal House, Canton Recreation and other local organizations.

## Legislators debate Proposition 1

"b. Nothing in this section shall invalidate or prevent the adoption of any law, regulation, program, or practice that is designed to prevent or dismantle discrimination on the basis of a characteristic listed in this section, nor shall any characteristic listed in this section be interpreted to interfere with, limit, or deny the civil rights of any person based upon any other characteristic identified in this section."

While section b. would be entirely new, the changes of the section "a" are in brackets.

For some legislators, like Smithers, it's a matter of protecting women and ensuring that biological males are not able to participate in women's sports.

### The debate

Smithers said he has spoken to many family members who all opposed Proposition 1, specifically as it pertains to women's sports and the use of facilities like locker rooms and bathrooms.

Webster commented much the same, saying he never thought a day would come "when we would vote to put men in women's sports to beat them up."

"I have no problem if someone wants to be a butterfly, a cat or even a jackass. I have no problem with that," Webster said.

But Proposition 1 is crossing the line, he said.

He commented that he has received numerous phone calls about the measure with many constituents asking "what are you going to do about it?"

"I believe this is our responsibility (to constituents), to speak on this," Webster said.

But Haggard opposed the sentiment, going as far to say that the resolution was a violation of law established following Stern v. Kramarsky.

### Is it legal?

Haggard said she had spoken with an attorney from the New York State Board of Elections who supplied her with documentation that described actions such as the resolution as "improper and illegal."

"It inhibits the democratic process through the misuse of government funds and prestige," Haggard said.

She said all individuals, whether they are gay, straight, transitioning,

trans, pregnant or another protected class all contribute to fund the government through taxes. Those public funds are "trust funds and are thus sacred and are to only be used for the running of government," she said.

To pass the resolution would tantamount to a school board using public funds to advocate for the passage of a school budget, which was deemed illegal in 1986, she said.

"Each legislator has a First Amendment right to personally advocate but the body itself does not," Haggard said.

Terminelli likened the resolution to passing a resolution advocating for a slate of candidates, another idea that itself is outside the legal scope of a governing entity.

While Haggard and Terminelli said it was an illegal resolution, Hull questioned the language of the resolution as cited by the pair.

"I'm trying to find where the word or some synonym of the word 'urge' is in this resolution," he said.

Hull said he questioned how the resolution was urging any voter to vote against the proposition when it was merely urging the legislature to oppose Proposition 1.

When asked to weigh in, County Attorney Steve Button said arguments for an against the proposition were both "interesting and slightly misleading."

He commented that both the left and right have attempted to frame the arguments around women's rights and parental rights but "both are a very limited view of the modification that is being proposed in Prop 1."

Button said the new language would create a new series of classes, many of which were incorporated in the 1964 Civil Rights Act but were never codified into the New York State or U.S. Constitutions.

Button said the new language would ultimately create new protected classes. He said the new language, specially in section B, will allow the state to "engage in certain acts to propagate those classes they feel have been discriminated against in the past."

### Chairman opposed

While many Republicans on the board supported the resolution to oppose Proposition 1, Chairman of the Legislature David Forsythe voted against the resolution, despite saying he was against Proposition 1.

Forsythe took a moment to comment on the "political science in the arena," which came in the form of pro-Proposition 1 advocates attending the meeting with political signs.

He said he took exception to the move, saying that sort of act is "meant to be outside" of chambers.

"I'll be very clear, I'm a 'no' all the way if someone wants my free speech. But I don't appreciate the signs in our chambers," Forsythe said.

**Will do, won't do for Prop 1**

Misinformation is spreading about the statewide ballot proposal that voters will find on the back of their ballot this November.

Here, as summarized by the NYC Bar Association, is what Prop. 1 will, and won't do.

"WILL establish constitutional protections against discrimination based on ethnicity, national origin,

age, disability, and sex—including sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, pregnancy and pregnancy outcomes, and reproductive healthcare and autonomy. These protections would be in addition to the current explicit protections against racial and religious discrimination under the State Constitution. When a right is established in the Constitution, it is protected from future legislation that might put it at risk.

WILL protect abortion rights and access to reproductive healthcare, including birth control and IVF, by preventing future State laws banning abortion and/or punishing or prosecuting pregnancy outcomes like miscarriages.

WILL protect LGBTQ+ New Yorkers by preventing future State laws from rolling back current LGBTQ+ rights to equal treatment.

WILL protect older, disabled, pregnant and LGBTQ+ New Yorkers from government discrimination in hiring, pay, and promotion.

WILL ensure that older and disabled New Yorkers have the access they need to vote and to use public spaces and facilities.

WILL NOT impact parental rights. Prop 1 does not address parental rights, which are governed

by other developed areas of State and federal law. Prop 1 does not change existing law with respect to parental consent, or parents' ability to be involved in decision-making about healthcare or medical procedures for their minor children, including gender-affirming care.

WILL NOT change current law with respect to participation on sports teams. Prop 1 does not change existing law and has no explicit provision relating to participation on sports teams. Prop 1 is consistent with Title IX, the controlling federal law that has already been interpreted by federal courts to require young people to play on sports teams that match their gender identity and expression.

WILL NOT impact or change the qualifications for voting. A separate part of the State Constitution governs qualifications for voting based on citizenship status. Prop 1 does not enfranchise any new classes of voters."

I can add that it also WILL NOT affect the status of undocumented immigrants in New York.

Know the facts before you cast your vote on Prop. 1 this November.

## Firefighters Association urges SLC residents to install smoke alarms

POTSDAM -- Are your smoke alarms all working? And do you have enough?

St. Lawrence County residents are urged by the Firefighters Association of the State of New York (FASNY) to check their alarms and install new ones if needed prior to the start of home heating season.

FASNY recently observed Fire Prevention Week 2024 (Oct. 6-12). This year's theme, "Smoke Alarms: Make Them Work for

You!," underscores the vital role smoke alarms play in day-to-day fire safety.

"FASNY consistently educates the public that smoke alarms are a critical component of home safety, and it is important to ensure they are always in working order," said Eugene Perry, President of FASNY.

Working smoke alarms could make the difference between life and death in a home fire.

According to the National Fire

Prevention Association, the risk of dying in a home without working smoke detectors is 55% higher than in a home with fully-functioning alarms.

Additionally, three of every five home fire deaths are in residences without working smoke alarms.

In 2019, New York State enacted legislation that required all new smoke detectors sold to contain 10-year, non-removable batteries to discourage tampering.

If you're not sure when you last replaced the batteries or bought a smoke alarm, FASNY encourages purchasing a new one.

According to the U.S. Fire Administration, New York State is currently ranked 4th in the country for home fire fatalities.

As the cooler months approach people will be turning on their home heating systems, starting to use space heaters, and enjoying outdoor fire pits and chimneys.

This makes Fire Prevention Week the perfect time to ensure that your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms are properly installed and maintained.

Key smoke alarm safety tips and guidelines include:

- Installing smoke alarms in every bedroom, outside each separate sleeping area (like a hallway), and on each level (including the basement) of the home.
- Testing smoke alarms at least once a month by pushing the test button.
- Replacing all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old or stop responding when tested.

# Inspect oil fuel tanks, equipment for leaks, spills

DEC reminded property owners that connecting occupied buildings to wells producing natural gas is dangerous and potentially deadly.

DEC also encouraged property owners to inspect fuel storage tanks for potential leaks or spills prior to receiving shipments of fuel oil for the upcoming heating season.

In addition, DEC urged residents to take steps now to utilize programs designed to save consumers energy and money.

## Natural Gas Safety

Natural gas produced by a gas or oil well is odorless and difficult or impossible for a person to detect.

While the primary component of natural gas is methane, gases like propane and butane may also be present in addition to water, because the gas is raw and untreated.

This may result in improper and erratic combustion in appliances. The risk of an explosion due to natural gas build-up in a home is substantially greater when that gas is not provided by a utility.

If a home-use well is connected to a house or other structure:

Contact a plumber licensed to work on gas lines and have the fuel source switched to utility natural gas or consider another fuel or heating appliance;

Natural gas directly from a well is odorless and colorless, meaning it may build up to explosive levels without detection. Install methane detection alarms in any closed space where methane may accumulate;

Commercial gas suppliers always add the odorant mercaptan to natural gas before it is delivered for use. Consider adding mercaptan to natural gas from a home use well so it can be more easily detected; and

Contact DEC if the well is not registered in DEC's database.

Owning and operating an oil or gas well comes with regulatory responsibilities to protect the environment.

New York is actively plugging oil and gas wells throughout the state and home wells may be eligible for the State's program.

## Fuel Oil Safety

DEC also reminds home and property owners to inspect heating fuel oil storage tanks for leaks or spills before ordering and receiving fuel oil.

Annual inspections can prevent leaks and spills and protect property, public health, and the environment. Homeowners are advised to look for the following concerns and contact their fuel oil service provider if they see any of the items from the lists below.

For above-ground heating fuel oils storage tanks, look for:

Bent, rusty, or wobbly tank legs or tank located on an unstable foundation;

Signs of rust, weeps, wet spots, or many dents on the tank's surface;

Drips or any signs of leaks around the oil filter or valves;

Fuel oil lines not covered in a

protective casing - even if under concrete;

Overhanging eaves where snow and ice could fall onto the tank;

Stains on the ground or strong oil odor around the tank;

Browning, dying, or loss of vegetation around the tank;

Silent overfill whistle while tank is being filled - ask fuel delivery person;

Fully or partially blocked tank vent from snow, ice, or insect nests;

Signs of spills around fill pipe or vent pipe;

Improperly sized vent pipes - ask fuel delivery person; and

Cracked, stuck, or frozen fuel level gauges or signs of fuel around them.

For underground heating fuel oils storage tanks, look for:

Water in the tank - ask fuel delivery person to check;

Oil or oil sheen in your basement sump or French drain;

Silent overfill whistle while tank is being filled - ask fuel delivery person;

Fully or partially blocked tank vent from snow, ice, or insect nests;

Signs of spills around fill pipe or vent pipe;

Well water has strange tastes or smells;

Complaints from neighbors of fuel oil smells; and

Using more than normal amount of fuel.




