POTSDAM -- A new deputy mayor has been appointed in the village of Potsdam following the retirement of former long-time deputy mayor Steve Warr.

Warr's departure, along with the resignation of Trustee Monique Tirion have left two open seats on the board and a search has begun to find two candidates to step in and fill out the remainder of their terms which conclude at the end of this year.

The village board held a special meeting Wednesday, Jan. 22 and Mayor Alexandra Jacobs Wilke addressed the departures during her comments, and subsequently appointed Trustee Lynzie Schulte as the new deputy mayor for the rest of the year.

Potsdam okays \$29K National Grid quote

POTSDAM — Another step towards a start date for the village's downtown overhaul of the Market Street Block was taken recently.

The village has accepted a price quote from National Grid to remove street lights in preparation for its Downtown Streetscape Project.

The mayor and trustees voted at their special meeting Jan. 22 to accept the quote from National Grid of an amount not exceed \$29,099.05 for the work.

Under the auspices of the agreement, the company will ultimately remove existing street lights on Market Street between Maple, Main and Depot streets intersections and on Raymond Street.

According to the resolution passed by the board, the cost of the removal is eligible for reimbursement by the state Department of State through the Downtown Revitalization Initiative Project.

The village's Downtown Streetscape Enhancement Project and its connected Downtown Riverwalk Trail project will cost around \$4.5 million. Potsdam was awarded \$10 million in reimbursable funds in 2018 through the state's Downtown Revitalization Initiative. The streetscape and riverwalk projects will be funded through that state funding promise.

Streetscape Enhancement work is expected to get started this spring on Market Street from its intersection with Depot Street to the intersection with Maple and Main Streets, and Raymond Street from the intersection with Market Street to its terminus at Garner Park.

Plans for the village's Downtown Streetscape Enhancement project include areas of Market Street from its intersection with Depot Street to the intersection with Maple and Main Streets, and Raymond Street from the intersection with Market Street to its terminus at Garner Park.

New sidewalks, pedestrian safety features, decorative crosswalks, pedestrian-scaled LED street lighting, stormwater management facilities, new trees, signage, and benches are all part of the scope of the project.

While attending SUNY Potsdam, he had pieces selected each year to display in the Best of SUNY Art Exhibition in Albany at The State Museum.

His various works would later be featured at The Tauny Gallery in Potsdam NY, and The Gallery at Lake St. Lawrence in Waddington NY. In fact, he received many awards, accolades, and recognitions for his work throughout his life.

He was a highly respected and talented sculptor and artist of the Asheville, NC art community. His works sold to collectors worldwide.

A brilliant creator and pioneer, he was one of the most successful artists in Trackside Studio history 3 years in a row.

Lisbon man says it's time to send a farmer to congress

Lisbon native Blake Gendebein says his experience as a farmer, businessman, school board member, coach, father, husband and dairy cooperative board member make him the best choice to replace Elise Stefanik when she steps down from the 21st Congressional District.

The Democrat says he wears many hats, but what makes him a unique candidate in the traditionally very red congressional district is the fact he is not part of the political machine.

Although the NY 21st is traditionally a Republican district, Gendebein says he brings something different to the table for Democrats.

Not beholden to parties

"I'm not a politician. I'm a farmer at heart who cares about my neighbors. I don't have pressure from Albany. I don't have pressure from D.C."

He said he is disappointed in government grid lock and jockeying for power he's seen on both sides of the aisle.

"It resulted in a lot of inaction in the North Country," he said.

Gendebein said when he sees a car off the road, he doesn't ask what their political affiliation is, he hooks his chain up and pulls them out.

He plans to govern the same way. He said that if he's elected to congress he'll be representing all of the constituents regardless of their party membership.

"I do not see myself being a victim of the lines being drawn. This is my neighborhood," he said.

Addressing local issues

Gendebein wants to go to D.C. as an advocate for the entire North Country.

He wants to tackle the problems that face everyone right now. That includes reducing grocery prices, fuel prices and holding line on tax burdens.

Six people, including three children die in house fire

MASSENA -- A late night fire on January 27 claimed the lives of six Massena residents, including three children, when a blaze broke out at 6 Chase Street.

The news of the fire was confirmed by Fire Chief Tom Miller, who did not release the identities of the deceased as families have not yet been notified.

"Sadly, several residents perished in the fire. Details related to victims will not be released pending identification and notification of family. Our hearts go out to all those affected by this tragedy," Miller said.

Condolences poured in online, including from Massena Central School Superintendent Ron Burke who confirmed three students and their parents died in the fire.

"Last evening, three of our students and their parents perished in a house fire. Our hearts are broken at the loss of the three Bowen children: Eli, Joshua and Karmen. I had hoped that we would have remained open today to provide students and staff with the opportunity to have grief counseling. Unfortunately, there was enough doubt about the road conditions which ultimately led to the decision to close," Burke said.

School officials opened the Madison Elementary library on Jan. 28 to allow community members to gather.

In his message, Burke said residents could "stop in for a few minutes or stay for the full time to simply talk and process."

The news has hit the community hard, including the Highland Family Restaurant. In a Facebook post following the fire, the restaurant offered condolences to those lost.

"It is with sadness that we extend our deepest sympathy to our Highland Family and the loss of our former chef and our accountant's family. Please pray for the families who are facing this horrific loss and the community as it grieves. Thank you to all the first responders for their service during this unimaginable tragedy," they wrote.

According to a release from the Massena Fire Department, crews responded to the structure fire shortly before 10 p.m. local time.

Upon arrival, crews encountered heavy smoke and a fully involved fire that was spreading rapidly throughout the structure, according to the release.

Any initial attack was conducted while crews performed a search of the structure, at which time multiple victims were located, rescued and transported to area hospitals.

Mutual aid was provided by Massena Rescue Squad, Potsdam Rescue Squad, Louisville Fire, Norfolk Fire, Hogansburg-Akwesasne Fire, Massena Police, New York State Police, St. Lawrence County Fire Investigation Team, New York Office of Fire Prevention and Control, St. Lawrence County Sheriff's Office and the St. Lawrence County Coroner.

process in place that allows that to happen smoothly.

At the same time, he says we need to secure the northern border and "stop using it as a political tool to divide us," he said.

He said immigration and traveling workers are crucial to the American farms labor force. He said a failure to keep that workforce thriving is the fastest way to drive up grocery prices.

"A good way to make food more expensive is to import it all," he said.

At the same time, he believes America could feed the world if it ensures a viable workforce exists. He said farmers know that, and that they should be part of the conversation.

Although Pres. Donald Trump doesn't have a strong history of working across the aisle, Gendebein said if he's elected he will work to find common ground where it exists.

He said that one such area could be on some aspects of border security.

"He is our president, I'm a critical thinker. If there is common sense legislation that is delivered, I will support it," he said.

Who is Blake Gendebein?

Gendebein graduated from Lisbon Central School before going on to Penn State University and after that moved to Germany to work for the Fendt Tractor Company.

In that job he helped introduce the Fendt tractor brand to North America. He went on to work for

Agco Corporation where he served as product marketing manager for the Rogator/TerraGator equipment.

Gendebein recalls that it was around that time he was living in Georgia, and he received a phone call from his father telling him the farm next door was for sale and said that after discussing plans with his wife, they decided to move back home where they continue to operate today.

Aside from running the 500-cow dairy Twin Mill Farms, Gendebein also serves as Vice Chair of the Cooperative Board of Agri-Mark, which is one of the largest milk suppliers in the North Eastern United States.

He and his wife have also operated the Jules of Life Foundation, a non-profit that provides assistance for families navigating cancer related issues. Additionally they oper-

ated Glow Skincare and Spa, which they later sold, and A Wholesome Glow, which manufactures skincare products.

Gendebein also served on the Lisbon School Board, but stepped down to coach basketball there.

His love for agriculture and family permeates nearly every response to any question asked of him. Gendebein said he's grateful that he continues to work with his father on a daily basis and sincerely believes farmers are some of the best businessmen and problem-solvers in the world.

Two dogs transported to Cornell for surgical examination

Necropsy set for pets that died in Waddington, mayor seeks answers

WADDINGTON -- Two recently deceased dogs in Waddington have been transported to Cornell Veterinary Lab for a necropsy in hopes of determining what has made a number of dogs throughout Waddington fall ill and die.

Necropsy is essentially an autopsy performed on animals.

According to Mayor Mike Zagro-

belny, Silver Birch Veterinary Urgent Care in Norfolk played a role in making the arrangements after the dog's owners agreed to the necropsy.

"Hopefully the tests will give us some answers. That process takes time, so please be patient," Zagrobelny said.

He said he will continue to keep residents updated with information as it becomes available, however he will not release any private infor-

mation of owners and addresses to anyone other than law enforcement or state and county agencies.

"Please respect their privacy. Several people have posted on-line about their experience and that is their choice," Zagrobelny said.

He also commented that he was notified by Department of Environmental Conservation Region 6 Director Randall Young that the area had been reviewed for Blue-Green Algae and the "likelihood of a

bloom in January is unlikely."

"If anyone sees a bloom, please contact me, and I will alert the DEC," he said.

Zagrobelny said Deputy Gotham of the St. Lawrence County Sheriff's Office is also continuing the investigation and taking information from residents, while District Attorney Gary Pasqua has been made aware of the situation and "is sympathetic to the community."

"Several people have reached out

with theories and those that can be researched are being researched," Zagrobelny said.

He said he knows the situation is scary for dog owners and animal lovers alike and continues to take the situation seriously.

"The purpose of the original post was to create awareness and promote vigilance regarding our pets. I'm still walking my two dogs through the village (when I'm not too afraid of the cold)," he said.



Engineering firm tapped for water plant upgrades

POTSDAM — Upgrades at the village water plant are moving forward.

Potsdam has hired LaBella Associates, PC, which has offices in Potsdam managed by local architect Brooks Washburn.

The village board of trustees approved the contract with LaBella at their special meeting on Jan. 22.

The firm is to prepare a preliminary engineering report on "existing conditions, options for addressing deficiencies, and identifying potential sources of financing for renovation of the Village of Potsdam Water Treatment Plant and Water Towers," the resolution said.

The work is to be funded through the village's water fund reserve account.

Village Administrator Isabelle Gates-Shult told board members

that staff played a roll in the decision to go with LaBella.

"Staff met to discuss two firms that were considered for the water treatment plant project. Both had a lot of value to add and expertise," Gates-Shult said.

"Staff scored the proposals, selected finalists and had several discussions comparing each proposal and determining which firm's vision closely aligned with the village's," the administrator said.

"Ultimately, staff made the recommendation to the board and mayor to select LaBella to complete the engineer study for the water plant upgrade," she said.

The administrator said the firm's statement of qualifications was well communicated and emphasized adapting to village scheduling needs.

"This decision was not made lightly and it ultimately came down to the references that each firm provided," she said.

Potsdam names team to address village stormwater concerns

POTSDAM — The village board has approved the mayor's appointments of several people to a committee eyeing stormwater mediation efforts moving forward.


In December the village hired Barton and Loguidice to conduct the engineering study on Potsdam's stormwater flow and management. Local municipal and town officials along with some residents have been involved in several discussions regarding the issue after the Aug. 9 flooding event that soaked several village neighborhoods and caused some infrastructure damage in the region. The village is using \$50,000 from its American Recovery and

Reinvestment Plan act allotment to pay for the study which will focus on stormwater management needs and facilities. The firm is expected to complete the work by May 16.

The committee members will be working with the firm to advise and inform on the community's flooding issues. They are expected to recommend grant-funded projects and financing options to pursue, in order to improve the municipality's stormwater management system.

Once complete, the municipality hopes the engineering study will help secure Clean Water State Revolving Fund money to pay for mitigation efforts.

"So this group will be busy in a few weeks I think," the mayor said.

Cracks in sidewalks highlight gaps in justice

The project exists in cooperation with the Red Sand Project, which encourages communities to pour the material into sidewalk cracks as a 'symbolic reminder of those who have fallen through the cracks,' according to the sheriff's office. The project's mission is to create opportunities for people to question, connect and take action against vulnerabilities that can lead to human trafficking, modern slavery, and exploitation. The nontoxic, red sand is distributed for free to those participating in the program.

Village eyes DEC grant for food composting pilot program

POTSDAM — The village will apply for a state grant to fund a pilot program for food scrap collection and recycling.

The mayor and trustees voted for a resolution at their special meeting on Jan. 22 authorizing the mayor to apply for the funding through New York State Department of Environmental Conservation's Municipal Food Scraps Recycling Grant to pilot a food scraps collection program.

The village hopes a collection program would reduce landfilling, support local food production through composting and educate the community about sustainable waste management.

The cost of the project is expected to be \$77,131. The DEC grant would contribute \$57,774. The village would provide \$19,358. The resolution passed by the board says the local share cost would be covered by "time of Village staff and Climate Smart Communities Task Force members, the value of contributed brown materials, and participant fees."

The collection service is provided by NoCoCompost (NCC), a community composting business based south of Canton. The local company collects from the village's Bend in the River Park collection site on a weekly basis. The service is available for free for all town and village residents, and open 24 hours a day, however, those dropping off compost must leave contact information to be able to access the collection containers.

In Potsdam, village staff would be responsible for submitting the grant application, managing the grant if accepted, overseeing subcontracts and coordinating yard waste collection to "supply compost brown materials," the resolution said.

"If successful, this will allow us to test a system in the village that will be completely voluntary for, the target

number is 120 households, to be able to do municipal composting," Village Mayor Alexandra Jacobs Wilke told village board members. "So instead of your own backyard, a pickup, drop off. And that would go out to contract with the service provider and it would also serve the school district under the proposal and possibly an apartment complex or two."



Community focused

However, he says his department is "continually collaborating with community services and other agencies within St. Lawrence County and the Canton community to help connect people to resources and education."

"We strive to consistently provide our officers with the training they need to better help our community obtain the help they need and deserve," he said.

Cole wants to remind the community that his department's work should strengthen bonds between the public and police.

He said it is "important to know that police officers frequently deal with people during some of their worst moments in their lives and we do our best to approach every situation with empathy and compassion."

"We are community members too, the uniform does not dehumanize us. He also said that safe communities are built on "a strong

partnership" between the police and the public," Cole added.

"Building a trusting relationship where information can easily be shared allows for a more effective and efficient police service. I look forward to working with everyone in the community and to help the Village of Canton be as safe as it can be."

Local ties and education

Cole grew up in North Lawrence. He currently lives in Potsdam with his wife and two children.

Cole started his law enforcement journey at Monroe Community College, continuing his education at SUNY Canton, where he earned a degree in criminal justice.

His choice to pursue an internship with SUNY Canton's David Sullivan Police Academy led to his first job offer from then-Canton Police Chief Lori McDougal. He has been with the department for 11 years.

"Law Enforcement has allowed me to be a part of something bigger than myself," Cole said. "It continues to be a rewarding profession, with many challenging and humbling moments."

Cole says his education has continued since joining Canton Police. He credits former Canton chiefs of police for helping him advance in the department, receiving training as a Juvenile Officer, Field Training Officer, Drug Task Force Narcotics Investigator, General Topics Instructor, and Firearms Instructor. He served as a sergeant before being promoted to chief.

I would personally like to thank Mr. Warr and Ms. Tirion for their service to the community," Wilke said.

"Mr. Warr has been a member of the recreation committee and our negotiations committee to secure past contracts with the village's collective bargaining units. He was a driving force behind the new pickleball courts at Pine Street Arena and of course a strong advocate for hockey," Wilke said of Warr.

"Ms. Tirion had been highly engaged as a member of the board, helped to develop needed updates to our water and sewer billing processes and rate systems, and was a dedicated member of the Climate Smart Communities Task Force," Wilke said.

"Even as they step back, the work will continue on all fronts on those initiatives," Wilke said. "I appreciate both of their efforts. I know we all do, and we wish them well in retirement."

Wilke said that she has been in conversation with several people who could be nominees to serve as acting trustees to complete the unexpired terms of both open seats. The two terms conclude Dec. 1.

"When there is an announcement to be made about those appointments, we will share that with the community," Wilke said.

"In the meantime, I would like to thank my colleagues for their continued dedication and hard work on behalf of the village," Wilke said.

Wilke said the village board and employees are still "hard at work on all fronts" and said now is not the time to "slow down or give up."

"It's a time to roll up our sleeves

and band together. Each and every one of us here today has an intention to leave this place better than we found it and we are going to take every opportunity to do just that," the mayor said. Wilke said the staff and board are doing an "exemplary job" serving the village.

During her comments, Deputy Mayor Schulte also thanked Warr and Tirion for their service.

"Both of them have been great advocates for the village and have provided vast knowledge of the history of the village and things that have been going on over the years," Schulte said. "So, that has been wonderful and I'm sure we will continue to see them."

During her time on the board Tirion had routinely expressed concerns and frustration regarding the village's lack of an annual audit from the firm it had previously contracted with, and had often requested up-to-date financial information regarding village accounts, stating that she could not vote for the mostly village expenditures without knowing that information. [The village board did approve the hiring of a new audit firm, EFPR Group LLP certified public accountants, at the Jan. 22 meeting. The firm will conduct audits on village finances for 2022-23, 2023-24 and 2024-25.]

At the Jan. 22 meeting, Schulte said a goal is to continue to make improvements on how the village handles finances, reports and budgets moving forward.

Reasons for departures

While Tirion did not give specific reasons for her departure, her frustrations over what she felt were lack of access to the village's monthly financial information were voiced at numerous meetings over the last year.

Warr, on the other hand, told North Country This Week in a recent interview regarding his retirement, that he did not approve of the direction the village was headed and said it was not sustainable. The trustee who had served on the board for the last 15 years said there were several initiatives that the village had worked on over the

years that had been put on the back burner, like much-needed rehab at Pine Street Arena, which need to be addressed instead of things like merging the parks and recreation departments. Warr had said that Tirion was not listened to by village employees when she had requested additional financial information. He said he felt she had been disrespected and that contributed to his decision to retire from the board.

Public comment

At the meeting Jan. 22, village resident Robin Bovay during the meeting's public comment section asked about the departures of the two board members.

"They both didn't decide to retire at the same time. Something's going on. I would like a little transparency there," Bovay said.

Wilke said that she couldn't comment on Warr's or Tirion's decision to leave and pointed out that they had spoken to local media regarding their departures. She suggested that Bovay speak directly to them to learn about their reasons for leaving.

"I just got a text that there seems to be a hostile work environment here. What's going on there? They try to get questions from you and there's some hostility," Bovay asked directly of Village Administrator Isabella Gates-Shult a little later during the public comment section.

"Respectfully there are two sides to every story and I encourage you to hear both before you make your judgment or opinion," Gates-Shult responded.

"I haven't made a judgement, that's why I'm asking questions," Bovay said.

"I'm comfortable, but I don't think this is appropriate (venue), but I'm happy to have that conversation with whomever, including the two trustees. But there has to be a willingness both ways to have those conversations in order for it to be effective," Gates-Shult said.

"Something's going on. People just don't tell me 'Oh I'm going to retire now.' There's something going on. The people should know. If you're not willing to tell it, then we gotta get it secondhand I guess," Bovay said.

After public comment was concluded, Wilke responded to Bovay's hostile work environment statement.

"I will just say that there is absolutely no hostile work environment at the village of Potsdam and we are happy to work with... current and former colleagues included," she said.

The Energy Transition: Portugal's Progress

The energy transition is a huge undertaking consisting of three simultaneous endeavors: the conversion of fossil fuel based electrical generation to renewable sources (primarily solar and wind), the conversion of fossil fuel-based energy usage to electricity (transportation, industrial processes and heating are examples) and the expansion of energy production to meet growing demand (think AI or bigger TVs). To meet this challenge countries around the globe are breaking records for increasing renewable energy production while decoupling their economies from fossil fuels. It's a wonder to behold.

Several countries are already at or near 100% renewable electricity. Costa Rica, Paraguay, Albania, Norway, and Iceland all fall into this category. Until recently hydroelectric and geothermal energy have been the main contributors. Recent gains stem from the build out of wind and solar. By 2030 New Zealand, Austria, Denmark, and Estonia are all expected to be at or near 100%. A

growing list of nations are not far behind.

Portugal, a country about the size of Maine has 10.6 million people. It is considered a developed country. However, with a GDP ranked 19th out of the 27 EU nations, it is not wealthy. Like many economically struggling places the energy transition provides a path to reduce energy costs and improve national cash flow. Importing all its oil, natural gas and coal, the sooner it can move to renewables the sooner Portugal can stop sending its limited cash abroad. Portugal's policy is based on the idea "why pay for energy from somewhere else when we can make it cheaper at home?" A question that needs to be asked by any region economically struggling that imports energy.

Renewable energy production in Portugal has grown from 34% in 2006 to 71% today. Wind and hydroelectricity provide 27% and 28% respectively. Solar provides 10% and biomass, 6%. Portugal has even built the first commercial wave energy plant. Cool stuff. Natural gas usage for electricity production has dropped to a level not seen since 1979. Working towards 85% renewable electricity by 2030 Portugal is concurrently transitioning its vehicle fleet to electricity with 25% of the new car market now new energy vehicles (full electric at 16% and plug in hybrids at 10%). A sunny region with significant solar resources Portugal may one day transition from net energy importer to exporter. Now that's progress.

Former Hannawa Falls Country Market to become Billy's Ice Cream

HANNAWA FALLS – The former Country Market will be transformed into an ice cream shop this spring.

County and Pierrepont planners have approved a site plan for Billy's Ice Cream, which owner Bill LaPierre hopes to open in May.

The shop will offer soft serve custard, a variety of hard ice creams and includes plans for some special concoctions.

LaPierre said he'd had the idea to open an ice cream shop for sometime, and as a Colton native and

resident, he'd originally planned to open a location there.

However, when he saw the former Country Market was available, it got the wheels turning.

"I thought, hey Hannawa Falls doesn't have an ice cream shop," he said.

LaPierre said he also had fond memories of the store which has fallen into disrepair over the years.

"I remember going there as a kid when it was the Country Store. In recent years they kind of let the place go. So that's kind of when I said this would be a good place for an ice cream shop," he said.

LaPierre said he's sinking a fair

amount of money into the building, and while he hopes the ice cream shop is successful, it's also nice to be able to restore the property.

LaPierre said that if everything goes well the shop will open in May, though that could change based on weather. Once opened he expects the shop will operate seven days per week and he's hoping it can remain open until October.

"I see a lot of ice cream shops close down on Labor Day, but we have some nice falls up here, so we are hoping we can extend the season a bit," he said.

Although construction began in November of 2024, LaPierre said

the Pierrepont planners approved his project Jan. 22. Prior to that, County Planners said the project should move forward, but with some modifications to the plan.

The board suggested the parking area and access drive areas laid out in his plan be switched to improve pedestrian safety.

Doing so would allow the pedestrians to reach the shop's window without having to cross the parking lot.

Planners also suggested creating a barrier along the highway to improve safety and said buffers should be placed along adjacent lawns.

Planners said any lighting should be downcast and "dark sky" compliant and signage should meet the Town of Pierrepont's standards.

LaPierre said he's got a plan to address those concerns and is hoping to add some additional shrubbery and foliage.

LaPierre said that while there is still a lot of work to be done, he's had a lot of support from the public who are both excited for an ice cream shop and to see the old store put to good use.

LaPierre also owns LaPierre Waste, which provides residential trash hauling services and roll off trash container rentals.

Waddington Village Trustee Benny Fairchild, who is also second vice-president of the St. Lawrence County Chamber of Commerce, concurred.


"Small business is the backbone of any community, but unfortunately in today's economy, small businesses cannot afford to advertise their businesses at the same level as their larger counterparts," he said.

"This proposal will allow many of our region's small businesses to advertise their services to the community at large, in some instances, likely for the first time."
