Breathe Easy

You still have time to figure out what you want to do. Take Upstate's Darian Baines, Class of '24, for example. Initially planning to become a teacher, she discovered her true passion was a job she never heard of before, through a chance encounter with a respiratory therapist.

Since the pandemic began, respiratory therapy have become some of the most in-demand professionals in healthcare.

They provide education and care for patients with breathing or cardiopulmonary disorders. Additionally, they perform intubation procedures to establish airway access for patients who may subsequently be placed on ventilators.

Respiratory Therapy (On Campus): Upstate's B.S. in Respiratory Therapy program combines classroom instruction with hands-on clinical experience, ensuring gradu-

ates are fully prepared to provide high-quality care in various settings, including hospitals, private practices and home care, from day one of their careers.

For Darian, her calling was always to help children through education; she just didn't realize it wouldn't be in a traditional classroom environment. "I want to become a pediatric asthma educator," Darian says. "If we teach children when they're young, they'll be better at managing their disease as they grow into adulthood."

See the Unseen

If a career in healthcare that combines people skills with technical expertise sounds like it could be your thing, medical imaging might be the perfect fit for you.

As a medical imaging specialist, you would provide critical information for patient diagnosis and treatment by capturing images of inside the body using specialized equipment.

Upstate offers programs in Radiography (X-ray, with opportunities for specialization in CT or MRI) and Ultrasound (also known as sonography).

Medical Imaging Science/Radiography (On Campus): Upstate's B.S. in Radiography teaches you how to use X-ray equipment to create and interpret images of bones, organs and tissues.

This field is ideal for those who want to work in settings ranging from emergency rooms to outpatient clinics.

Medical Imaging Science/Ultrasound (On Campus): Upstate's B.S./BPS in Ultrasound teaches you how to use high-frequency sound waves to produce and interpret images of organs, tissues and blood flow.

Beyond obstetric scans for pregnant women, they work with patients with abdominal or pelvic issues and perform vascular and cardiac evaluations as well.

Save Lives

At Upstate, we're focused on making a difference in people's lives through careful diagnoses and compassionate care.

Katie Cooke, 23, started out studying to become an X-ray tech, but switched to radiation therapy because she realized her skills were better suited for a role where she could have a more direct impact on saving lives.

While radiographers work more in a diagnostic capacity, radiation therapists work ongoingly with oncologists to provide daily treatment for patients with cancer.

Radiation Therapy (On Campus): Radiation Therapists use targeted doses of radiation beams to destroy cancerous tumors without permanently damaging nearby normal tissues.

Upstate's B.S./BPS in radiation therapy program provides comprehensive training in radiation physics, treatment planning and patient management.

"I decided to move to the treatment side, where we form strong relationships with the patients because we see them every day," Katie notes. "It not only fills the need to help others, while treating their disease, we're helping them in their darkest moments."

You may have heard at some point that nursing is the largest profession in healthcare. That means it's also one of the most in-demand fields as well.

Unfortunately, New York state critically needs more nurses. The good news? Upstate has job opportunities for you once you graduate as an RN.

If you've done research on the nursing profession, you are probably already aware that New York state requires new nurses to have earned their bachelor's degree within ten years of initial licensure. This law exists for a reason: baccalaureate-prepared nurses have better patient outcomes than nurses with their associate's degree alone.

RN to B.S. (online): Upstate's 100% online nursing bachelor's program is an excellent option for nurses looking to start their career and finish their education requirements at the same time.

Many medical technologists work in hospital or physicians' office laboratories conducting measurements from simple blood tests to complex analyses for cancer, AIDS, bone marrow abnormalities and molecular diagnoses.





A Scholarship Just for North Country Students

For St. Lawrence students who graduate from North Country high schools, the University can award more than \$500,000 in tuition assistance each year.

Established in 1974, the Augsburg North Country Scholarship (ANCS) recognizes exemplary academic and extracurricular leaders from over 100 eligible North Country and Canadian high schools.

We award \$20,000 to \$35,000 per year to selected nominees from each school. Students may nominate themselves or be nominated by their guidance counselors.

For alums like Amber Stickney '21, the ANCS made college possible. "I am a first-generation college student from a family of three children, so affording college for all three of us was pretty

impossible for my parents," says Amber, who is from Norwood, New York.

"But through Augsburg, I was able to go to the school of my dreams."

Nominations are open to seniors with at least a 90 average in a challenging curriculum.

All nominations, along with nominees' completed applications to St. Lawrence, are due no later than Monday, December 2.

Nominees are also eligible for need-based financial aid through the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

Massage Therapy

Training includes classes in anatomy and physiology, psychology, pathology, kinesiology (the study of the mechanics of body movements), and massage, both Eastern and Western methods and techniques. Graduate and have the tools to help clients relieve pain and stress and rehabilitate injuries - while facilitating their growth and well-being.

NCCC's massage therapy program is NYS Education Department registered and approved. Graduates will be qualified to take the state's massage therapy licensure exam and also the national certification exam.

Nursing Programs

Our programs give you the opportunity to complete the requirements to become a registered professional nurse (RN) in two years - first completing the requirements to become a licensed practical nurse (LPN) in one year, with an option to complete the RN requirements in a second, two-semester course.

This unique career-ladder design lets you build a career, and education, without repeating previous courses. Once you complete this second, two-semester course, you'll be eligible to take the state's licensing exam to become a registered nurse and be prepared to transfer to a four-year school to complete your bachelor's degree.

Graduates of our program are equipped to make an immediate impact in their commu-

Radiologic Technology

If you wind up with an injury or a need for a fluoroscopy procedure, a Radiologic Technologist will be there to assist you and capture the images.

As a Radiologic Technologist you'll combine patient care with an in-depth knowledge of human anatomy and proficiency with high-tech equipment.

The AAS Radiologic Technology program is an accredited program. It is a two-year program, which includes the first summer. It is one of the oldest in the country -- but it's also one of the most up-to-date, as new equipment keeps you at the forefront of imaging technology.

Our energized radiology suite enhances the student experience in positioning patients prior to clinical rotations.

Clinical experience is a significant educational component of the Radiologic Technology program. Each student must complete approximately 1,600 hours of clinical throughout the program.

North Country is affiliated with 13 sites across a 200-mile radius, including Alice Hyde Medical Center in Malone, Adirondack Health in Saranac Lake, Samaritan Medical Center in Watertown and UVM's Elizabethtown Community Hospital Ticonderoga Campus.

Ultimately, successful completion of the academic and clinical requirements within the program allows the student admission to take the American Registry in Radiologic Technology, a national exam, and subsequent licensure by the State of New York.

Wilderness Recreation Leadership

Since 1979, our Wilderness Recreation Leadership program has given students the leadership skills and outdoor experience to

become guides, outdoor educators and other recreation pros.

Get hands-on training in an international capital for outdoor recreation.

Develop skills including rock climbing, whitewater rafting, skiing and snowshoeing; recent research projects have included site visits to the Adirondack Park Agency, Adirondack Hamlets to Huts, and the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation.

Build an intensive backcountry experience during which you'll spend more than 40 days in the wild. Gain your Wilderness First Responder certification, Lifeguard certification, Leave No Trace training and NYS Guide License.

Internships and apprenticeships at ski areas, guide shops and other locations give you industry connections that often lead to future work.

Guaranteed Transfer Pathways

With multiple transfer degrees and even more track options, North Country gets you prepared for many bachelor's degrees in mathematics, biology, chemistry, environmental science, history, sociology and other people-focused areas.

The AA Transfer Degree focuses on general studies that lead to a wide range of degree options. Additionally, students can choose specific tracks such as Early Childhood Education, English and Psychology.





Parents can help with college preparation; extracurriculars, tests, visits all important

Parents can educate themselves on the process needed for students to apply to college and guide their children accordingly.

Junior year is a pivotal time in the lives of high school students.

Junior year marks a transition to upper classmen, and students begin to ponder their post-high school academic careers around this time as well.

The college preparatory process can seem daunting, particularly if a student does not have a sibling who recently went through the steps and can offer advice.

Well-meaning parents may want to share their own experiences, but much has changed since parents were looking ahead to their own college experiences.

That doesn't mean parents can't offer important assistance, particularly when they learn the ropes of today's college preparatory process.

Speak with a guidance counselor to plan courses

Parents and students can meet collectively with a guidance counselor to talk about goals and coursework.

Many high schools offer Advanced Placement classes or dual enrollment courses that enable students to earn college credit.

Discuss extracurricular activities

Colleges and universities do not just look at grade and test scores; they consider the entire applicant.

Therefore, high schoolers should dabble in various clubs, organizations and sports to make them more appealing to admissions departments.

Enroll in a test preparation course

Though a growing number of American colleges and universities have abandoned ACT and SAT scores as part of their admissions process, many schools still require those scores.

Students can benefit from taking test prep classes either in school or through out-

side tutoring businesses.

Learning strategies for the tests as well as seeing sample questions can remove some of the anxiety associated with the tests.

Visit schools and attend college fairs

Parents and students should make appointments to visit several college campuses that offer courses students are interested in.

Getting one's name in admissions departments' databases also opens up students to emails about upcoming events and application deadlines.

Learn about The Common Application

The Princeton Review says most schools will use The Common Application as part of the admissions process.

This enables students to enter all of their information and apply to multiple schools using the same account.

However, schools will typically have different supplemental essay topics or test score requirements. Essays typically are required to be around 650 words.

Get financial paperwork in order

Applying to college and applying for financial aid (which every student should do regardless of income) are two separate processes.

In the United States, students will start with the Free Application for Federal Student Aid.

The FAFSA will help determine eligibility for grants, scholarships, federal work-study, and student loans.

The FAFSA requires information taken from federal income tax statements.

Parents can help guide their students further by following up on school transcripts, teacher recommendations and providing application cost fees, which vary from \$50 to \$100 per school.

The road to college may seem confusing, but a few simple strategies can make it easier to navigate.



Volunteering has many benefits for students

There are many reasons for parents to encourage children who express an interest in volunteering.

Volunteering is a social activity that can help children develop their social and networking skills, and many parents credit volunteering with instilling a sense of perspective in their children that they might not have gained had they not been exposed to people from different backgrounds.

Volunteering also has been linked to stronger academic performance.

The Corporation for National and Community Service reports that students who

indicate they're doing better in school are more likely to be volunteers than students who report doing less well.

The broadened exposure to people and places that students may otherwise not encounter without volunteering also can benefit them in the classroom, helping them more readily identify with cultures and societies they're studying.

College applicants with volunteering experience also may set themselves apart in the increasingly competitive application process.

Though a 2019 Pew Research study reported that most schools admit more

than two-thirds of their applicants, that figure is significantly lower at many of the more highly rated institutions in the United States.

For example, Stanford University (4.3 percent) and Harvard University (4.9 percent) recently reported acceptance rates below 5 percent.

Though volunteering alone won't help applicants gain acceptance to such competitive institutions, it can serve as a strong résumé builder and be even more effective if it also produces the previously noted improvements in academic performance.

College application process involves many steps

The college application process involves several steps, many of which begin well before an applicant is ready to sign on the dotted line.

These facts and figures can help applicants and their families gain a better understanding of what goes into the college admissions process.

• College admissions teams view a potential applicant as more seriously interested in the school if they know he or she has visited.

Interested parties can go above and beyond taking the Open House tour by auditing a class or even spending a night in a dorm.

• Due in large part to COVID-19 disrupting SAT and ACT testing schedules and potentially setting an uneven playing field for those who tested and those who could not, many colleges are now test-optional schools.

Despite that, guidance counselors may urge students to test and submit strong scores to test-optional schools because those scores can help unlock merit-based aid.

• The College Board indicates the average financial aid award per student is \$15,000. And the National Association for College Admission Counseling says 43 percent of all institutional aid funds are merit-based.

• The Common App is one tool used to apply to colleges in

today's digital age.

The same application can be used to apply to more than 400 schools.

However, some schools may still supplement the application with essays or questions as part of their individual admissions processes.

• The Huffington Post reports that students who have a first-choice college should apply to it early decision, as early decision has been shown to increase an applicant's chance of admission by up to 25 percent over regular decision admission rates.

• Applicants should seek recommendations from people who know them best and can provide detailed reasons as to why they are the right fit for a school.

• The Princeton Review says the top admissions factor at schools is a student's GPA, underscoring the importance of getting good grades.

• College applicants feeling the stress of the waiting game can rest assured. According to the Cooperative Institutional Research Program at the Higher Education Research Institute at UCLA, more than three-quarters of college applicants get into their first-choice schools.



Nine-month paramedic program at Clarkson trains students in Emergency Medical Services

The Paramedic Program at Clarkson University aims to address the significant Emergency Medical Services (EMS) staffing shortages in the North Country.

The nine-month program, which is starting its second cohort this fall, is a collaborative effort with Clarkson's Lewis School of Health and Life Sciences and St. Lawrence Health.

The paramedic program is a full-time educational opportunity for 20 students per cohort, ensuring students can immerse themselves in their studies and gain hands-on experience in simulated emergency scenarios.

In the future, participants will also be able to earn college credits, making the program an attractive option for those seeking to further their academic pursuits.

The program has received state approval and is in the process of completing national accreditation.

The program focuses on personalized attention and hands-

on training with state-of-the-art equipment and facilities to ensure students are "field train ready" in a field with multiple opportunities for gainful employment.

There is no weekend commitment, but class is at least four days a week (Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays from 8:30 am - 4:30 pm).

After the first 16 weeks of didactic coursework, students will have another 16 weeks of conducting clinical time (284 hours) and field time (364 hours).

The Media Production Center provides resources for producing and editing visual and audio content, including photos, videos, music, podcasts and additional forms of digital media.

Innovation at Full SPEED

One of the most fun and exhilarating ways to put learning into practice is through Clarkson's Student Projects for Engineering Experience & Design (SPEED) program, which has maximal access to the state-of-the-art Student Prototyping Machine Shop – Clarkson's one-stop shop for design and fabrication needs.

Every year, hundreds of Clarkson students from all majors join one of 13 SPEED teams to put their skills to the test and engage in endless collaboration. From concept to completion, teams dream, design and build projects, including a concrete canoe, Baja off-road vehicle, clean snowmobile and more.
