Preserving history, future for Milford's fire department

A "visual representation" of the dedication of members of the Milford Volunteer Fire and Rescue Department to the community they serve.

That is how one of its members, LaDonna Howe, described a memorial wall recently established in the meeting room of the community's fire department. One of its wall's features are individual plaques with names of members of the department throughout its nearly 120-year history who have passed away.

"We wanted to try to preserve the memory of people who served and show the respect that people that have passed on deserve," she said.

The project was made possible through memorial funds donated by the family of Scott Burroughs, a member of the department from 1998 to 2013. Howe – who was approved as a member of the department at a meeting on Sept. 11, 2001 – said Burroughs was a 1st Assistant Rescue Chief and a 2nd Assistant Rescue Chief while he served.

But some of his most notable contributions were geared toward grant writing, which resulted in the Milford department receiving a lot of equipment it might not have had access to otherwise.

He passed away this May after a battle with cancer.

"He was an amazing mentor to a lot of people in the department," she said.

Wendy Burroughs, Scott's wife, said hearing of the proposed plans for the memorial wall was "very emotional. The people Scott served with were a family ... they truly become your brothers and sisters ... and he was grateful and honored to be a part of it.

"When you serve on a (fire and rescue) department, it goes beyond time served. It's a lifelong membership and they are remembered even when they are not physically present."

Wendy, who now lives in Columbus, said they left Milford in 2013 so Scott could go to work on his family's farming operation in Morton, Illinois. Scott was diagnosed with cancer in his eye in 2015 which eventually spread and claimed his life.

"He had the heart of a servant," she said, "and was very honored to be a part of the team to help the community any way he could."

Howe said she talked to Burroughs as his health was declining and he shared at that time that memorial money would be donated to the Milford department. It was eventually determined to pursue the concept of the memorial wall, and thus the Burroughs memorial funds – along with a donation by Copley's Carpentry of Lincoln of a large wood piece for a sign that was prepared for placement by Howe and her husband, Mike – now has a place in the meeting room.

The dominant black wood piece has the words along the top "In memory of our fallen bothers and sisters" then the "Thin Red Line of Courage" and finally another wood piece with "Heroes are never forgotten" printed on it. The red line represents the last ounce of courage firefighters find deep in their blood to conquer their darkest fears in order to save and protect life and property.

A memorial wall at the Milford Volunteer Fire and Rescue Department has been established to recognize members throughout the history of the department who have passed away.

"We put it in the meeting room as that is the place where members help each other deal with things – good and bad – and to help keep the morale positive," she said.

As well, when activities such as the department's pancake feed are again placed on the calendar, the public can see the new display. Along with the names, the display features a bell that was taken from a truck in the department's fleet that was purchased in about 1949 and retired in the early 1960s. In the future, it will be rung as a tribute to a deceased team member after their name is mentioned in the roll call the first meeting after their passing.

The Milford Volunteer Fire Department was established in 1902, according to Howe. She said the earliest documented member she could find was D.E. Warnke in 1908. Thus far, 85 names of past members who have passed away have been registered and are represented by nameplates attached to the wall.

Howe said she would welcome people to contact her with names of their family members who served on the department, as there are generally not detailed membership records. They could send a message via the Milford Volunteer Fire and Rescue Department Facebook page.

Ringing the bell, answering the call to serve

Members of the Garland Volunteer Fire Department proudly sat in front of the new memorial adopted outside of the department for pictures. Behind them sat a resorted bell, surrounded by brick and stretches of chain.

In a way, the bell came with the place. Not the new place where it's perched next too now, but the original Garland fire hall.

Originally built in 1926 when Garland Fire and Rescue was first chartered, that bell fastened to a metal pole was rang to gather firefighters on emergency calls. The bell already served fits purpose for decades when the original fire station was torn down and replaced with the current fire station in the 1970's. By that point, the bell was taken down because the steel poll used to support it rusted too badly for use. Garland Volunteer Fire Department Secretary/Treasurer Phil Hargis said that at that point a member of the department asked what to do with the bell.

The 94-year old bell was stored for decades before the idea for new memorial came about. Plans for the memorial, dedicated to all of the past, present and future members of the Garland Fire and Rescue Department, went into motion. The bell was sent to Lincoln where it was refurbished by TMCO and the department held its annual soup supper and auction fundraiser in February to help pay for the memorial.

"The generosity shown by the residents of Garland and the surrounding area was record setting and is greatly appreciated," Hargis said in an email. "We hope they like what we have done." Outside of the bell brick pedestal and concrete flatwork designed by Dave Wurderman of Blue Valley Contracting in Garland, members of the fire department put the rest of the memorial together following tedious planning by the village board, Garland Planning Commission and the fire department itself.

Lights have been installed next to the memorial so the bell stays illuminated at night.

Additional fundraising will be needed to fund new plans for the memorial that have formed.

The fire department was going to hold a dedication in September for the new memorial only for its celebration to get canceled because of health directives related to the pandemic.
