Kampraths celebrate collective 108 years with SVFD

As Terry Kamprath, 73, observes his 50th year with the Seward Volunteer Fire Department this October, he and his wife, Connie, 72, reflect on their family's time serving the community.

Terry started at the department in October of 1972. He was working in construction at the time, and one of his co-workers, who was a member of the SVFD. asked him if he was interested in joining the department.

pleted the Firefighter I exam, which has a question portion, a practical portion and a physical portion. They all encouraged one another to do well and helped each other practice.

Terry and Connie found a shared interest in that they both worked in the criminal justice field.

Terry worked at the sheriff's office, and Connie worked at the women's prison in Newark.

The time they spent at those jobs in combination with the time they spent at the SVFD added up to a busy schedule for Terry said. "I picked the couple, but they said this because if I got to they loved every second of it because it was good for the heart. "We had pagers on 24 hours a day, seven days a week," Connie said. "He would always have his clothes laid out in case he needed to jump into them because he would always go for the fire calls. He would go right away."

Connie said the Kampraths have enjoyed participating in outings with the firefighters, including the Fourth of July parade and annual water fight. The SVFD has a scrapbook that captured these special memories.

Terry spent 33 years in active service and now has 50 years and counting on the department.

Connie, who had previously spent six years volunteering for the Staplehurst Volunteer Fire Department, joined the Seward department in 1996. That is where she met Terry.

"I was in training, and he was doing trainings all the time, so I told him I chased him down," she said. "He was always so nice."

Their son, Bill Anderson, became a volunteer firefighter for Seward in 2001 and was a member until 2013. Their cousin, Scott Kamprath, was part of the department for 20 years.

Terry took over as chief in 1985, and he implemented the numbering system SVFD uses to keep track of the people on the fireground.

He also crafted a wooden board with the names of all active and reserve members that hangs in the SVFD.

Terry and Connie played an instrumental role in the installation

They still place flags on the graves of former firefighters every Memorial Day.

Terry said he encourages anyone who is interested to apply to the department.

In recent years, it has become more difficult for the department to find enough volunteers.

He said there was a time when SVFD had nearly 75 members, and new applicants were put

on a waitlist.

"I'm just proud of anyone who wants to do this, and I'd recommend it to anybody who wants to try it," he said.

The Kampraths said the SVFD and the Firefighter's Association have led them to friendships that will last a lifetime.

"You just meet very, very good people," Terry said. "It's more like a family."
