





Two new rules will be implemented this season for Class B basketball and one for Classes C and D.

For all classes, fouls will reset every quarter, and the one-and-one free throws at a team's seventh foul have been eliminated. Teams will get two free throw shots once the other teams

hit five fouls. Once the quarter ends, the fouls will be reset.

According to the NSAA, the rationale for the rule is that it "Improves flow by providing an opportunity for teams to adjust their play by not carrying over fouls from quarters one and three to quarters two and four while significantly reducing the opportunity for correctable errors to occur.

Minimizes risk of injury by eliminating the oneand-one and reducing opportunities for rough play during rebounding opportunities."

The rule has been used in college women's basketball.

For Class B, a 35-second shot clock will be at all games this season, unless they are playing a Class C team. The Class C team will get to choose

whether to use the shot clock or not.

The 35-second shot clock forces teams to attempt a shot and hit the rim within the time limit. If a team doesn't attempt a shot, they turn the ball over.

The new shot clock rule will prevent teams from holding the ball and will make for fasterpaced games.






