Sixth graders this fall attended outdoor education at Camp Carol Joy Holling, located near Ashland, Nebraska. This was an exciting outdoor education experience for students. Outdoor education provides a hands-on learning environment that combines outdoor adventure with educational enrichment. From nature hikes through Nebraska's diverse ecosystems to interactive science lessons, students learn to appreciate the natural world in ways that classrooms can't always provide.

Students did a wide variety of activities like archery, fishing, making a fire, creating rain sticks and dream catchers along with many other activities. Three of the larger group activities the students attend while at outdoor ed are presentations by Dallas Chief Eagle, a Native American storyteller and hoop dancer. Students get to attend a campfire where they listen to campfire songs, star gaze and listen to a motivational speaker. Students this year also got to partake in a team building ropes course as well as swim. Outdoor ed was an amazing experience for all who participated.

High School

Fall Junior ACT Test

All juniors will take an official ACT Oct. 29. For many juniors, this will be the first time taking the ACT. This is an opportunity to see what the four sections of this test are like in a controlled-, timed-test session. The four sections of this test are English, math, reading, and science. Writing, a fifth section, will not be tested on this test day. This test will be scored by ACT and scores can be sent to colleges/universities. The counselors and administrators will meet with juniors to interpret scores. For those students who have taken the test already, this is another opportunity to reinforce or strengthen concepts for when all juniors take the test again April 8 as required by the State of Nebraska. This October test is part of the junior year preparation for the state ACT test. All juniors should report to the Concordia Campus by 8:05 a.m. - with two No. 2 pencils and a calculator (Students will be provided more specifics as we approach the test date).

Testing Day Tips

- Charge the Chromebook (The Chromebook will be used by students to complete the NWEA test. Students will need a full charge this day)
- Dress comfortably: wear layers for temperature fluctuations.
- Get a good night of sleep two days before the test.
- During the exam schedule, sleep smart. A few days before an exam, get your seven to eight hours of sleep if you can. Sufficient sleep will help solidify memory for easy retrieval during the exam.
- Eat a well-rounded breakfast.
- Come to the test session with a positive attitude. This is your chance to show what you know and can do.

Gather and Grow - It's the perfect motto for St. Vincent de Paul Church and School's Capital Campaign that is soon to be sprouting up during the last few months of 2024. Our Gather and Grow Capital Campaign objective is to nurture the seeds for the growth of our journey and cultivate a community that will gather our parish together in ways that will be remarkable!! In years to come, this exciting venture will produce many desired outcomes, especially in the areas of Catholic School growth and Spiritual Ministries in our parish. 
Preschool is so much fun where our youngest students learn through play.

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
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
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
