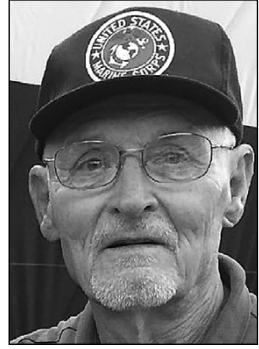

foot off the gas and it bites us,” said Evan Miller, senior. “We’ve got to be ready for any team because it’s baseball. You can have an off day and lose and have a good day and beat whoever.”

Despite some tough endings, Foley’s baseball program has achieved remarkable success throughout the regular season behind talented rosters, and this year’s Falcons squad is no different. While the team lost starting pitchers Lo-

gan Winkelman and Chuck Hackett to graduation, there are several mound magicians waiting in the wings. Trey Emmerich, Josiah Petersen, Brett Leabch, Miller and Derek Dahmen led a hungry, well-rounded pitching rotation.

While expectations are high and the Falcons are focused, the team also remembers the most important aspect of high school sports, especially at the tail end of a snowy winter that never seems to end: having fun. The team is coming off a unique scrimmage against Paynesville at the Husky Dome in St. Cloud April 1 and eagerly awaits getting on the field and making memories.
