BENTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS **REGULAR MEETING MINUTES FEBRUARY 6, 2024**

The Benton County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on February 6, 2024, in the Benton County Board Room in Foley, MN. Call to order by Chair Jared Gapinski was at 9:00 AM followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag. A roll call showed Commissioners Beth Schlangen, Steve Heinen, Scott Johnson, Jared Gapinski and Ed Popp present.

There was a request to discuss a resolution of support for the Hunters for Hunters organization as the last agenda item after County Engineer Chris Byrd at 9:40 AM. Motion by Popp and seconded by Johnson to approve the amended agenda. Motion carried unanimously.

There was no one present to speak under Open Forum. Motion by Johnson and seconded by Popp to approve Consent Agenda items 1 – 10: 1) approve the Regular Board Meeting Minutes of January 16, 2024 and authorize the Chair to sign; 2) approve the Committee of the Whole Meeting Minutes of December 18, 2023 and authorize the Chair to sign: 3) approve the Committee of the Whole Meeting Minutes of December 20, 2023 and authorize the Chair to sign; 4) approve the Committee of the Whole Meeting Minutes of January 2, 2024 and authorize the Chair to sign; 5) approve the Committee of the Whole Meeting Minutes of January 8, 2024 and authorize the Chair to sign; 6) approve the Committee of the Whole Meeting Minutes of January 23, 2024 and authorize the Chair to sign; 7) accept and file the County Administraor's report; 8) approve the 2024 Solid Waste Haulers License Round I and authorize the Chair to sign; 9) approve the 2023 Federal Equitable Sharing Agreement and Certification and authorize the Chair to sign; 10) approve the Resolution desgnating Hearing Officers for Dangerous Dogs Appeals and authorize the Chair to sign. Motion carried unanimously.

Next, Benton Economic Partnership (BEP) Executive Director Amanda Othoudt shared that Kevin and Julie Johnson, owners of 539 Properties received the Project of the Year Award from the Economic Development Association. The Johnson's had a strong desire to revitalize and bring economic development to the East Side of St. Cloud. Othoudt noted that the Economic Development Association looks at all projects throughout the entire state of Minnesota and chose the 539 Properties as the recipient of this prestigious award.

Next, County Administrator Montgomery Headley requested to discuss County Development Fees. Othoudt has requested to meet with two County Board members to discuss the County's development fees and how such fees could be reduced to help encourage more development. Motion by Popp and seconded by Heinen to appoint Johnson and Heinen as the County Board Members on the BEP Fees Panel. Motion carried unanimously.

Next, Headley requested discussion regarding State Sales Tax exemption for Government Center project. Cities, counties and schools have approached the State Legislature in the past and have been granted an exemption from State sales on materials, supplies and equipment incorporated into the construction of public facilities. These exemptions have been ranted on a case-by-case basis. Headley asked the County Board if they will seek similar exemption during the 2024 legislative session for the Government Center project. There was a consensus of the County Board to pursue the State Sales Tax exemption for the Government Center project.

Next, Headley stated that the Park Commission recently discussed having a member added to represent Benton Couny Public Health to the Park Commission Board. It was the ecommendation of the Park Commission to amend the Park Commission ordinance to add a representative from Public Health. Headley posed a question on whether or not the Public Health representative would be required to maintain County residence? There was a consensus of the County Board that the Public Health representative would be required to maintain County residence, and to have Public Health recommend a representative from their department to be considered by the County Board.

Next, Headley requested to discuss a process for completing Department Head evaluations. The County Board

be evaluating the County Administrator, the Information Technology Director, the Human Services Director, the Land Services Director, the Public Health/Community Health Board Director, and the Public Works Director. There was a consensus of the County Board to conduct the evaluations in a closed session at the March 5th Regular Board Meeting.

Next, Headley shared information on Remote Meeting options under the MN Open Meeting Law. This item was for informational purposes only.

Next, Headley reviewed the overtime, comp time and PTO reports with the County Board. There was a consensus of the County Board to see a summary of the reports and not the full report quarterly, and to invite Department Heads to a future Regular Board Meeting to discuss the process of approving comp time and overtime.

The County Board recessed the Regular Board Meeting at 10:03 AM to conduct a Ditch Authority Meeting.

The County Board reconvened the Regular Board Meeting at 10:27 AM.

Next, Benton County Auditor/Treasurer Christine Scherbing requested the County Board to consider appointments to the Canvassing Board for Presidential Nomination Primary. The Canvassing Board membership includes two members of the County Board who are not candidates at the election (Minn. Stat. 204C.31). The Presidential Nomination Primary Canvassing Board will be held on March 7, 2024 at 10:00 ÅM in the Benton County Boardroom. Motion by Johnson and seconded by Gapinski to appoint Popp and Heinen to the Canvassing Board for Presidential Nomination Primary. Motion carried unanimously.

Next, Scherbing requested the County Board to consider the Resolution regarding tax due date. Mail from surrounding area travels to Minneapolis to be postmarked. With that travel comes delays and mail may not be postmarked the day it was out in the mailbox or post office mail receptacle. Resolution #2016-4 from January 2016 allowed for 1 additional business day postmarked. Per state statute 279.01 subd. 1 a penalty must be imposed if the tax payment is not received by the due date. After researching many other local counties, none allow a "grace day". After a discussion on whether or not to keep the "grace day", Popp motioned to keep the tax due date as is which allows for a one-day grace period. Seconded by Johnson. Motion carries on a 3 to 2 vote with Commissioners Popp, Johnson and Schlangen voting "aye" and Commissioners Gapinski and Heinen voting "no'

Next, Land Services Director Roxanne Achman requested to establish the date and time for County Board of Appeal & Equalization or Special Board of Appeal and Equalization for the 2024 Assessment Year. The County Board of Appeal and Equalization or the Special Board of Appeal and Equalization (SBAE) shall convene after the second Friday in June and allow for 10 consecutive days in June. Historically, these have occurred at 6:30 PM – 7:30 PM on a Monday. Motion by ohnson and seconded by Heinen to establish Monday, June 17, 2024 from 6:30 PM to 7:30 PM for the Special Board of Appeal and Equalization for the 2024 Assessment Year, to accept the list of appointees that was provided by Achman, and to set the payment per member of \$150. Motion carried unanimously.

Next, County Engineer Chris Byrd requested the County Board to consider the purchase of a side-by-side utility vehicle. Byrd has received quotes through the State Cooperative Purchasing Venture (CPV) from a vendor to purchase a new utility vehicle. This vehicle will be used primarily to inspect our ditch systems. It may also be used for surveying on road reconstruction projects. If we purchase through the CPV we will meet all sate laws/requirements of government purchases. We will also need a trailer to haul the vehicle to the ditch systems. Byrd suggests that the purchase occur through the Highway Department, then "rent" it to the ditch system when it is being used for ditch work. This rental will repay the purchase price. The estimated cost is \$33,168. Byrd stated that we could use \$25,000 from the Engineer's budget to pay for the side-by-side and trailer. Headley recommended using the remaining funds from the Contingency fund. Byrd stated that we would establish a base hourly rental rate which would be brought to the County Board for approval. Motion by Heinen Benton County Administrator

and seconded by Popp to approve the purchase of a side-by side utility vehicle and trailer. Motion carried unanimously.

Next, Byrd provided a Legislative update. The Governor released his budget recommendations on January 19th. While he is proposing \$982 million in infrastructure improvements most of it is going to State facilities. We submitted a Capit tal bonding request through the Minnesota Management and Budget Office, for CSAH 1 Reconstruction and CSAH 29 ex tension. While the governor did not recommend funding for our project, hope is not lost. We need to rely on our Legislator to author a bill and negotiate a funding package into a final ap propriations bill. This may require someone testifying during a bonding committee hearing. Often times, notice for these committee hearings have short notice and we will need to be prepared to move quickly. Heinen and Gapinski stated they would be willing to go to the State Capital to testify for the projects during a bonding committee hearing, and Byrd has the support of the County Board to pursue the Capital bonding

Next, Byrd provided an update on CSAH 29 and CSAH 1 Roundabout (RAB) project. This item was for informationa purposes only.

Next, Byrd requested the County Board to consider a res olution to support the City of Sauk Rapids for Safe Routes to School (SRTS) Grant application. The City of Sauk Rapids would like to submit an application to the SRTS program to receive funds to place pedestrian crosswalk flasher systems along CSAH 3, 2nd St North. Since CSAH 3 (2nd St North is a County Road, a resolution of support is required. The pro posed scope includes installing pedestrian crosswalk flashe systems at two existing RAB's on 2nd Street North (CSAH 3) One RAB is at Summit Avenue North and the other is at 6th Avenue North. The scope also includes appurtenant pedestri an curb ramp, signing, and pavement marking work. The City of Sauk Rapids will be responsible for all cost such as de sign, local match costs associated with the construction of the project, and the City will be the lead agency. If they received the Grant, a utility permit would likely be required from the City of Sauk Rapids to install the pedestrian crosswalk flasher system. The City received a similar resolution last year but was unsuccessful in receiving the grant. Motion by Heinen and seconded by Popp to approve the Resolution of Suppor to the City of Sauk Rapids for Safe Routes to School Gran Application. Motion carried unanimously.

Next, Byrd provided an Engineer's update for informa tional purposes only.

Next, Board members reported on recent meetings the attended on behalf of Benton County.

Next, County Board members were asked to consider Resolution of Support for Hunters for Hunters urging the Fed eral Government to remove Federal protections from wolve allowing the State of Minnesota to manage wolf population wolf management be returned back to the State of Minnesota the State of Minnesota allow a wolf hunting season once they are removed from federal protection; and to support a letter to U.S. Senator Amy Klobuchar urging the removal from federal protection. Motion by Johnson and seconded by Popp to ap prove the pending Resolution of Support to Hunters for Hunt ers, and a letter to U.S. Senator Amy Klobuchar urging th removal from federal protection. Motion carried unanimously
