**City of Albany
Amendment to Ordinance No. 60
Liquor**

The City Council for the City of Albany, HEREBY OR-
DAINS that Ordinance 60 Liquor shall be amended as follows:

1. That Section 60.02 shall be amended by the addition of
Subd. 12 which shall read as follows:

"Subd. 12: Restaurant. Shall mean an establishment, other
than a hotel, under the control of a single proprietor or manager,
where meals are regularly prepared on the premises and served at
tables to the general public, having a minimum seating capacity
for twenty-five (25) guests."

2. That Section 60.04 shall be amended by the addition of
Subd. 12 which shall read as follows:

"Subd. 12: On-Sale Wine License. The City may issue on-
sale wine licenses, with the approval of the Commissioner of
Public Safety to theaters, restaurants that have facilities for seat-
ing at least 25 guests at one time, and licensed bed and breakfast
facilities which meet the criteria in Minn. Stat. § 340A.4011,
subd. 1, as it may be amended from time to time and to. The fee
for an on-sale wine license as established by the Council under
Section 60.09. Applicants for an on-sale wine license shall be
subject to an investigation pursuant to Section 60.08, Subd. 1.
The premises subject to an on-sale wine license may extend to
outdoor patios and decks if the conditions set forth in Section
60.08, Subd. 4 are met. A separate license for Sunday sales shall
not be required."

3. That Appendix A is hereby amended by the addition of the
following:

60.09.1 Liquor License Fees: On-Sale Wine \$600
The Ordinance Amendment shall be effective upon publica-
tion.

The Ordinance was approved by the majority of the City
Council of Albany on 7th day of August, 2024.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Managers of the
Sauk River Watershed District pursuant to Minnesota Statue
103D.605 will hold a hearing August 20th, 2024 at 6:15 p.m. or
thereafter at the Sauk River Watershed District office located at
642 Lincoln Road in Sauk Centre, Minnesota. The purpose of
the hearing is to consider and take comments on the 2024 Out-
door Heritage Fund "Sauk River Watershed Habitat Protection
and Restoration Phase 5" Lessard Sam's Outdoor Heritage Fund
Grant, project #**361 TBD**.

Using conservation easements and fee land acquisition, we
will protect approximately 387 acres of high priority habitat in
Minnesota's Prairie and Forest-Prairie Transition Area. We will
restore/enhance approximately 107 acres of wetlands and ac-
companying uplands, creating vital habitat for waterfowl, fishes,
and populations of threatened and endangered species. Proper-
ties selected will be strategically targeted using innovative site
prioritization model that maximizes conservation benefit and fi-
nancial leverage.

The total estimated cost of the project is \$3,965,000 to be
paid from a grant from the State of Minnesota under the Les-
sard Sam's Outdoor Heritage Fund; with \$375,000 to Great
River Greening; \$1,199,000 to Sauk River Watershed District;
\$1,192,000 to Pheasants Forever; and \$1,199,000 to Minneso-
ta Land Trust. Up to \$168,000 to Minnesota Land Trust is to
establish a monitoring and enforcement fund. These funds are
provided by the Clean Water Land & Legacy Amendment. Addi-
tional funds, including in-kind contributions may come from, in
addition to the organizations above, local Soil and Water Conser-
vation Districts, The Nature Conservancy, US Fish and Wildlife
Service, Department of Natural Resources, Ducks Unlimited, the
State's Clean Water Fund program, the State's Clean Water Part-
nership program or other sources.
