

The biggest contributor that year was Fort Dodge Bottling Works at \$25. Ellen and Edgar Ballou, who owned Security Bank, gave \$12.50 each. On the other end of the spectrum, "Six of St. Mary's School Girls" pooled their cash to give \$1.
