Your generous donations bought winter wear for kids who needed it

Mr. Goodfellow has closed his books for the year as temperatures drop to the single digits, and thanks to you, kids in all of our local schools are keeping warm.

Staff in Buena Vista County schools spent \$15,204 to purchase coats, hats, snow pants, gloves and hats for grateful children who could otherwise not afford them.

Meanwhile, your contributions this year added up to \$14,446, surpassing the past two years' totals.

With thousands of dollars still in the account, Mr. Goodfellow is ready to help again next year, and many years into the future.

Special thanks go to staff members at Storm Lake Public, Alta, Newell-Fonda, Albert City-Truesdale, Sioux Central and St. Mary's who identify the needs of children in their schools, request an amount to spend and make the appropriate purchases.

The exact number of children served is estimated, considering that some of the students perhaps only needed gloves, so that's what Mr. Goodfellow bought for them.

Here is the breakdown of our expenditures:

That's wonderful. It means not only merry Christmas for all the poor kids in Storm Lake but in addition, clothing and stockings and shoes for needy youngsters thruout the winter season.

During the Depression few people had extra money, but in the Dec. 24, 1936 issue of the Storm Lake Pilot Tribune, donors were able to scrape together \$257 for the Mr. Goodfellow Fund to buy "clothing and stockings and shoes for needy youngsters thruout the winter season." The biggest contributor that year was Fort Dodge Bottling Works at \$25. Ellen and Edgar Ballou, who owned Security Bank, gave \$12.50 each. On the other end of the spectrum, "Six of St. Mary's School Girls" pooled their cash to give \$1.

The Storm Lake Times Pilot proudly carries on the tradition of Mr. Goodfellow.
