Karyle Edgar clearly remembers the day she and her husband Corby Edgar got the call. It was 3 a.m. on New Year's Day 2017, and all she could hear was screaming on the other end of the

phone.

The news was grim. Their 18-year-old daughter Kaitlynn was on her way to John Peter Smith hospital, crews were doing CPR, trying to resuscitate her. She hung herself.

Enough already

Flash floods cause mess at sheriff's department, families seek help as water rises

Heavy rainfall wreaked havoc in Parker County on Monday, flooding the sheriff's department and causing one neighborhood to call for help as rising water surrounded their homes.

Parker County's Emergency Management Coordinator Sean Hughes said emergency personnel had to retrieve three families off of Bethel Road due to the rising water.

"They were trapped and couldn't get out of their properties," Hughes said.

No injuries were reported during the incident.

The flash flood also caused the Parker County Sheriff's Department building to flood, with water deep enough to cover tires of deputy vehicles in the parking lot. Water also seeped into the hallway and into the county's server room.

Public Information Officer Danie Huffman said rising water came in from the north side of the building, causing the computer-aided dispatch (CAD) system and landlines to go down for about an hour.

"The 911 system was not affected," Huffman said.

County employees assisted with immediate water removal until clean-up crews could arrive, and preventative measures were taken for more rain expected.

Huffman said damages appear to be minimal.

Parker County Sheriff Russ Authier said "it was an unprecedented

event which we have not seen before."

Jason Godwin, meteorologist with the National Weather Service (NWS) Fort Worth, said rainfall in Parker County during a 24-hour period May 24 totaled 2 to 5 inches in Weatherford, a lot more than Springtown and Azle received with .75 inches and .84 inches respectively.

For the month, as of 6 a.m. May

25, Parker County received 4 to 7 inches county-wide, with 7.08 inches reported from the NWS Cooperative Observer Program.

"That is significant," Godwin said.

Long term, the average is 4.73 inches for May.

"We are well above normal for the month of May," Godwin said.

Stopping the cycle

SMS student organizes fundraiser to help abuse victims

Counselors at Freedom House will now be able to help more families thanks to a Springtown Middle School fundraiser organized by Kurstin Poe.

On May 24 the eighth-grader presented a \$1,600 check to Freedom House, a non-profit organization that offers counseling services free of charge to adult and child victims of domestic and/or sexual violence.

In the United States today, 1.8 million teens have been the victims of serious sexual assault. In Texas, 74% of people have either themselves, a family member and/or a friend experienced some form of domestic violence, according to Freedom House.

Pressley headed to Texas Wesleyan

It's nearly every high school athlete's dream to earn an athletic scholarship to the school of their choosing, but only six-percent of all high school athletes get the opportunity to play a collegiate sport.

Springtown senior short-stop Tristan Pressley will have that chance this coming year after signing a baseball scholarship with Texas Wesleyan back on May 11.

Pressley is a four-year starter for the Porcupines and he helped lead SHS to the second round of the playoffs two weeks ago.

When asked how it feels to accomplish a long-time goal of his, Pressley said words couldn't describe the feeling.

"It feels great. I've spent my entire life dedicating myself to baseball, and for a while I was worried it would be my last season to play. But thankfully Texas Wesleyan came at the right time and offered me."

Pressley, who hit .343 and had an on-base percentage of .464 proved to be a vital part of the Porcupines' program in his final year.

The 5-foot-7 infielder was SHS' leadoff hitter all season long and proved to be an effective base runner.

Texas Wesleyan's offer to Pressley was somewhat of

a surprise to the senior who had serious doubts that he would get to play college ball moving forward.

"Earlier this season I had some doubts that I might not get a scholarship, but when Texas Wesleyan messaged me after seeing some of my tape, they invited me for a workout, that went well and I signed the same day. It was a no-brainer for me."

The biggest factor that played into Pressley's commitment to Texas Wesleyan was a chance to play college baseball while still being close to home.

Texas Wesleyan is located east of downtown Fort Worth and the program competes as a member of the Sooner Athletic Conference in the NAIA.

This past season, the Rams went 27-16 overall and 15-6 in conference play, finishing third.

Pressley will have a chance to play for Bobby Garza as he enters his fifth year at the helm.

Garza played catcher at Dallas Baptist before beginning a coaching career that led him to Texas Wesleyan in 2018.

While college sports can be extremely stressful and competitive, Pressley said he has plenty to look forward to.

"I'm excited to experience baseball on a global scale. Lots of the players

on the team are from all over the world and learning from them is something I look forward to."

Pressley also said he credits his club team coach Tim Henrich and parents John and Laura Pressley for instilling a competitive mindset in him.

"I played select baseball for the North Texas Shockers, and my coach always preached about competing just like Coach (Josh) Ward did in high school. So I believe I'll be ready to play when I get to college."

Henrich was the head coach of a Shockers club team that's based in Mansfield/Venus area and Pressley said Henrich played one of the bigger roles in him accomplishing his baseball goals.

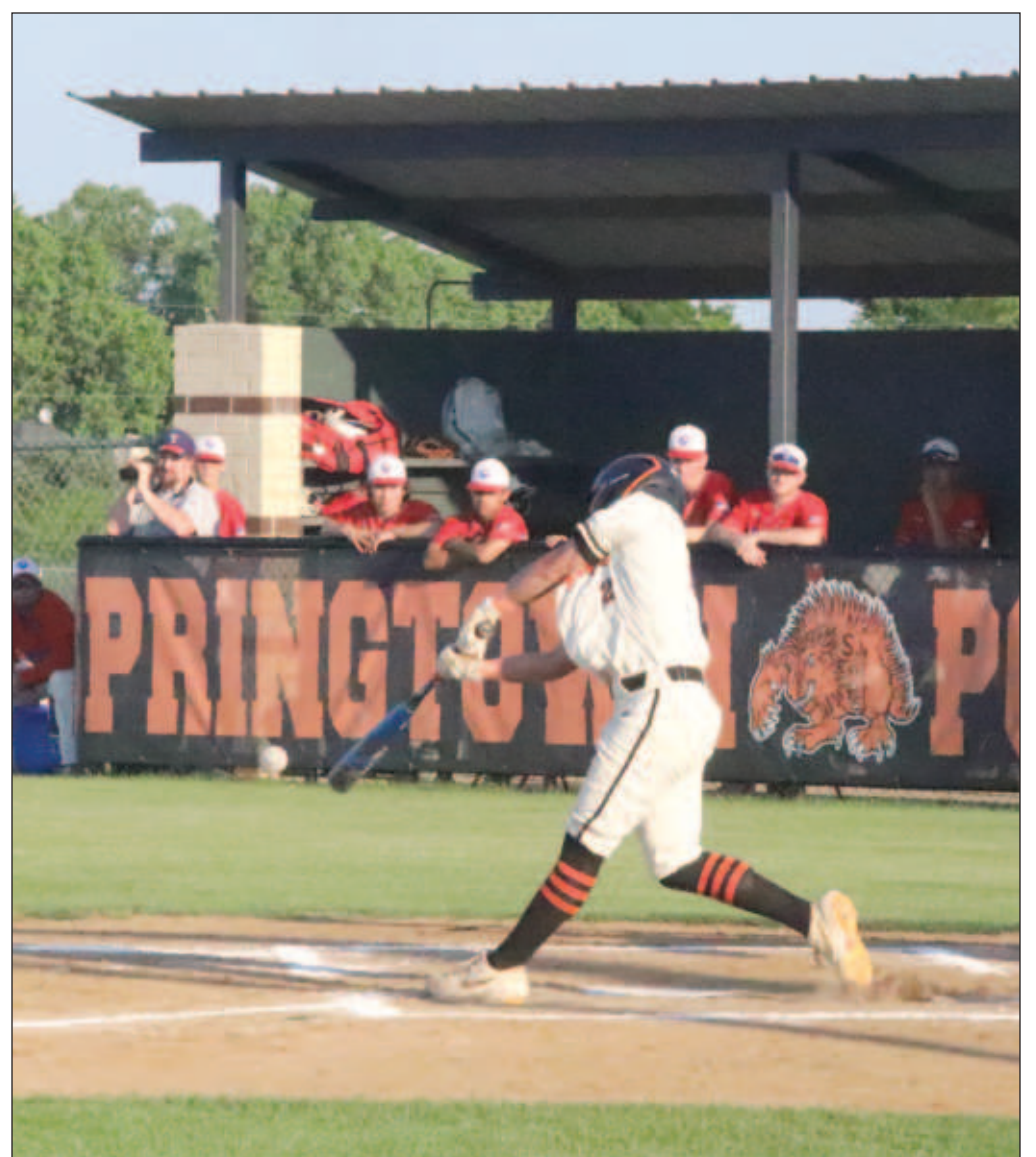
As a senior Pressley was second in hits (35), second in doubles (5), and tied for first in triples (2).

Pressley was also second in stolen bases at a 96-percent success rate and tallied 24 stolen bases in 2021.

As an infielder Pressley was impressive, as he successfully fielded 91.7-percent of balls that came his way, and had just 10 errors in 34 games played.

SHS coach Josh Ward said he's happy for Pressley and feels he's earned this opportunity through hard work and sacrifice.

"I'm proud of Tristan and

excited for him to play college ball and it's even better that he gets to stay close to home. I've played the known that he could play at the next

level he just needed someone to give him the opportunity. Texas Wesleyan did just that and they got a good one!"

Pressley will likely move to Fort Worth late this summer just before school begins in August.

Four die in Springtown collision

A two-vehicle collision resulted in four deaths Tuesday in Springtown. Police were called to the 2900 block of FM 51 North at 12:45 p.m.

Springtown Police Chief Cres Salazar said three of the four occupants of the two vehicles were declared dead at the scene of the accident.

A fourth person, identified by the Tarrant County Medical Examiner's Office as 84-year-old Milton Wolfe, died after being taken to Texas Health Harris Methodist Azle Hospital.

Identity of the other victims is being withheld pending notification of next of kin.

FM 51 North was closed during the incident and traffic was detoured on Thomas Road and CR 3699. The cause of the accident remains under investigation.

Springtown emergency personnel was assisted by Texas Department of Public Safety troopers, deputies from the Wise County Sheriff's Office, Wise County EMS, Wise County ESD, Wise County Fire Marshall's Office, Reno Police officers, Parker County ESD 1, and LifeCare EMS.

Record rainfall for Parker County in May include 16.38 inches in 1957, 12.44 inches in 2015, and 10.85 in 2019.

Going forward Thursday and beyond, rain and thunderstorms remain in the forecast "but nothing

suggests a major washout," Godwin said.

"We expect this in late spring and early summer," Godwin said. "Some can get heavy rainfall, but not everybody. These events can drop 1 to 2 inches pretty quickly."

The idea to raise money for Freedom House stemmed from Poe and SMS student Kendall Penneston's "Stop the Cycle" presentation at the Family, Career and Community Leaders of America (FCCLA) regional conference.

After Poe returned from the regional conference, she began a campaign to raise money to help "stop the cycle" of abuse. She went on to compete at the state level, finishing in second place, which landed her a spot in the FCCLA National Leadership Conference in Nashville this summer.

Poe had used services at Freedom House herself, so she wanted to focus her fundraiser on that organization.

In March, Freedom House and the Children's Advocacy Center of Parker County signed a lease agreement for an office space on the Square in Springtown. With both non-profits based in Weatherford, the new location makes it more convenient for those in and near Springtown.

The money was raised in eight weeks as the SMS FCCLA chapter held "Hat Days" on Fridays, where students could wear a hat or hoodie in class all day

for a \$1 donation. Students would receive a wrist band to wear, showing they had donated. Many bought additional wristbands each week.

Natalie Hill, SMS career education teacher and FCCLA advisor, said after just four days, students contributed more than \$750. By the end of the fundraiser on May 20, \$1,600 was raised. "Our initial goal was \$1,000," Poe said.

Presenting at state, winning a national competition spot and raising money above her goal surprised Poe, who said she knew her presentation was good, but presenting it at competition was a bit scary.

Patti Wilson, executive director for Freedom House, said the money will likely be used for programs at school to educate students about abuse and how to seek help.

Below, Freedom House has answered some common questions about their services.

Violence can be verbal, physical, or sexual. It is all about controlling you and having power over you. Yes your abuse qualifies as family violence. Verbal abuse can be the worst of all.

CAN MEN AND BOYS BE SEXUALLY ASSAULTED?

Yes! And they can be victims of family violence. Freedom House serves many survivors of abuse who are male.

IF I RECEIVE THERAPY, DOES THIS MEAN I AM CRAZY?

Most definitely not! The fact that you recognize that you need help to heal means that you care about yourself and those who love you. Therapy is a way of regaining your own power so you can live a happy violence free life.

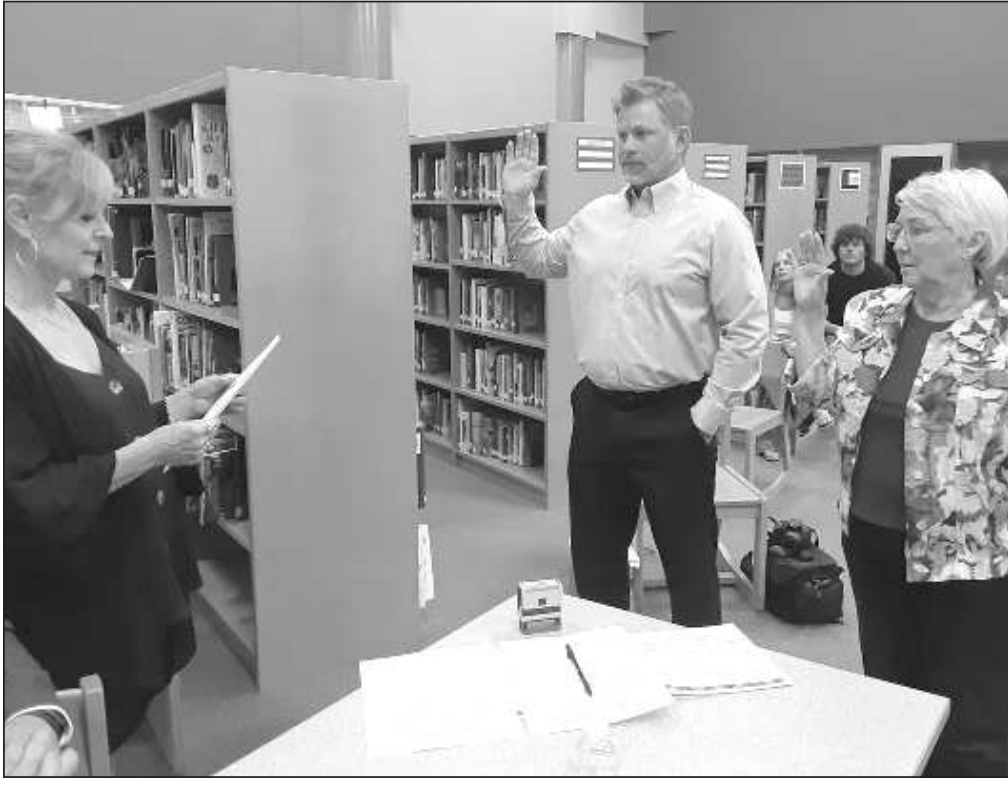

Kaitlynn was kept on life support until she was declared brain dead, which would be the next day. Her death saved two lives, as she was a kidney donor.

Karyle Edgar, a Springtown resident, said suicide is something not discussed often and there is not enough information out there about healing from this type of death.

“With cancer, the grieving period is usually five to seven years; a car wreck is seven to 10 years. But with suicide, we don’t have this statistic,” she was told. “Left with no answers, you’re not going to have a closing period.”

Prior to Kaitlynn’s passing, Karyle was healing from four other deaths. In May 2010, she lost her paternal grandfather. A few months later in July, her maternal grandfather died. In October 2010, her oldest brother died and in June 2014 she lost her baby brother.

“My kids have seen a lot of death and heartache,” she said.

After Kaitlynn died, Karyle feared her family would not cope.

Kenzie Edgar was best friends with her sister Kaitlynn. Also left behind, Kaitlynn’s dad Corby, her brother Tyler, and her other sister Karmin.

“I’m a fixer. My heart hurt. My kid’s heart hurt,” Karyle said. “How do I deal with this horrible tragedy, turn it around and fix it? How do I

help them heal?”

Karyle knew she had to do something, and quick. Reminiscing on some of Kaitlynn’s favorite things to do with the family, an idea was formed.

“She loved all the charity work we did,” Karyle said. “When the kids were young, we made them go through their toys before birthdays and Christmas, to donate. As they got older, we would to go a soup kitchen or make blessing bags for the homeless.”

Those memories inspired the forming of The Speak Life Adventure, an organization that helps bring awareness to suicide and helps those in need.

Each year, the family designs a T-shirt and sells them to help raise funds to benefit the homeless.

On the back of the shirts is an inscription: “You are important, You have purpose, You are loved, You cannot be replaced. In loving memory of Kaitlynn.”

“If Kaitlynn knew how loved she was, it would have been different,” Karyle said.

With help from volunteers, they gather supplies for “blessing bags” and take them to the homeless in Fort Worth. The bags have various items such as Bibles, toiletries, food and water, crayons, kids coloring books, socks, diapers and even dog food.

The project started with about 50 bags, and grew to 200, then 500 and this year

the goal is to pass out 1,000 blessing bags.

Last year, the group could not do the benefit because of the pandemic. This year, as Karyle and her husband began going through items stored from 2019, they discovered field mice had made a mess of things.

“I was in tears,” Karyle said. “I just thought, oh my gosh, we are not going to have enough.”

The next morning, she called a friend, and asked if she knew of someone who could donate Bibles.

Her friend later replied. “Have you ever been blessed so big your hair stands on ends? You guys are going to meet your goal.”

The Servolution Network, a local non-profit that helps those in need, stepped up and organized donations for the group.

The only thing lacking now is more backpacks. The group needs them before June 4, which is pack day, so they will be ready to hit the streets in Fort Worth June 5.

Lindie Dean, Corby Edgar’s cousin, has helped with the event since day one.

“It was a punch in the gut,” Dean said, of learning about Kaitlynn. “This young girl was not one you would typically think would ever do something like this. I have teenagers that looked up to her.”

Dean said Karyle is “always trying to fix things.”

“Kaitlynn really loved to give and serve, so Karyle

turned this into something magical for people,” Dean said.

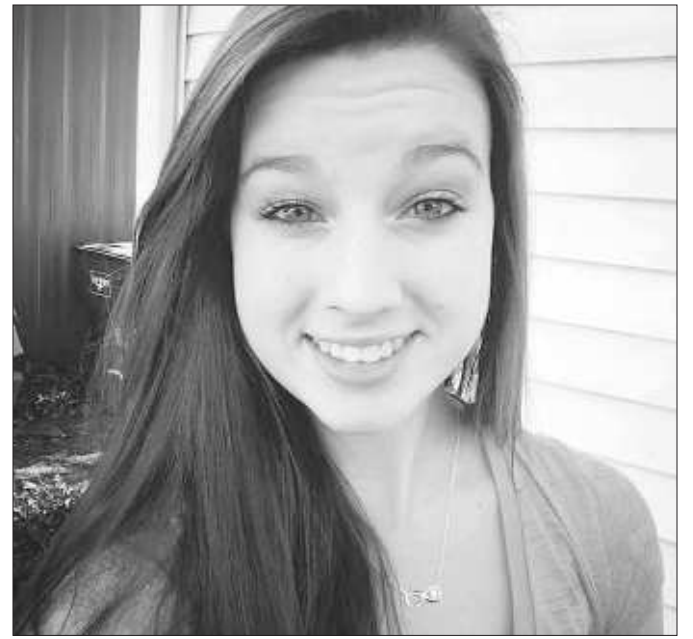
Karyle’s sister, Donna McGee, said her niece Kaitlynn was always happy and showed no signs of depression. She had just graduated from high school and had plans to attend college and become a nurse.

McGee, who has dealt with mental health issues herself, is an advocate for the cause.

“I’ve been in a dark place before. So many people don’t understand, it’s hard to comprehend,” McGee said.

Each blessing bag contains this message of “why” this outreach is being done, and the beautiful life it honors; with the hope it reaches the hearts of those who need to hear the message.

A Few Agricultural Facts

After retiring from the high school Agricultural Science classroom with thirty-four years of experience I still had the desire to pass along knowledge about Agriculture.

When the idea of writing this column surfaced, here was my answer, but instead of teaching high school students I would have the chance to share Agricultural knowledge with newspaper readers. What a great opportunity this has been.

As we start this week's column let's look at a few facts.

• Fact number one, according to the Survival Rule of 3 we as humans can survive without air for 3 minutes, 3 hours without shelter, 3 days without water and 3 weeks

without food. Keep in mind that these numbers can and will vary to a certain extent depending on the individual and the conditions that they are in.

Agriculture provides three of the items that figure into the Survival Rule of 3, those

being lumber to be used as materials for shelter; cotton, wool, linen and silk fibers along with leather to be made into clothing which is just another form of shelter and of course there's food. Honestly even though food is number four on the Rule of 3 list, it is most likely the first thing people think of when considering the importance of Agriculture. Let's also not forget Agriculture's contribution of fuel sources in the form of firewood and ethanol.

• Fact number two, Agricultural products cannot be produced just anywhere. Most of our Agricultural production is reliant on fertile, productive soils. These rich soils are essential in producing the seeds and other plant parts that are used directly by humans or indirectly as

feedstuffs for livestock and other animals in the production of meat, milk, wool, etc.

Many of the things that our productive soils are being used for today could be happening elsewhere on lower quality soils that are not suitable for Agriculture. Some of you may remember from a previous column that "just add more fertilizer" is not always the correct answer for "fixing" a soil. And there are some soils that cannot be fixed or made any more productive.

• Fact three, food and other essential Agricultural products DO NOT come from stores, they come through stores, but they originate from the hands and efforts of less than 2% of the U.S.A. population; the farmers, ranchers, beekeepers, feedlot operators, dairymen

along with hundreds, if not thousands of other types of Agriculturalists.

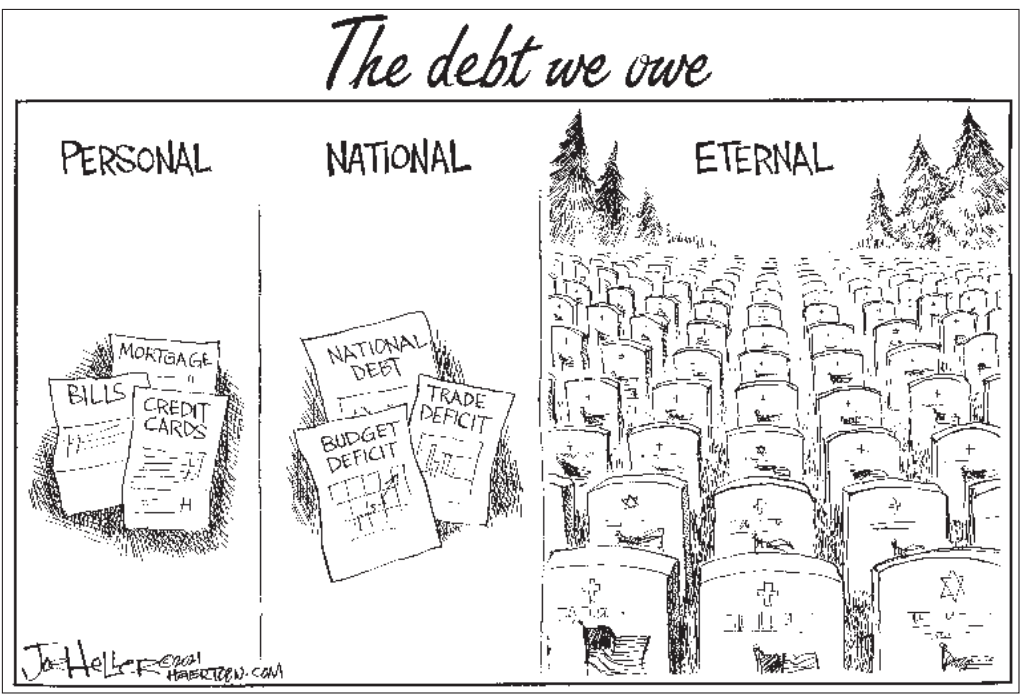
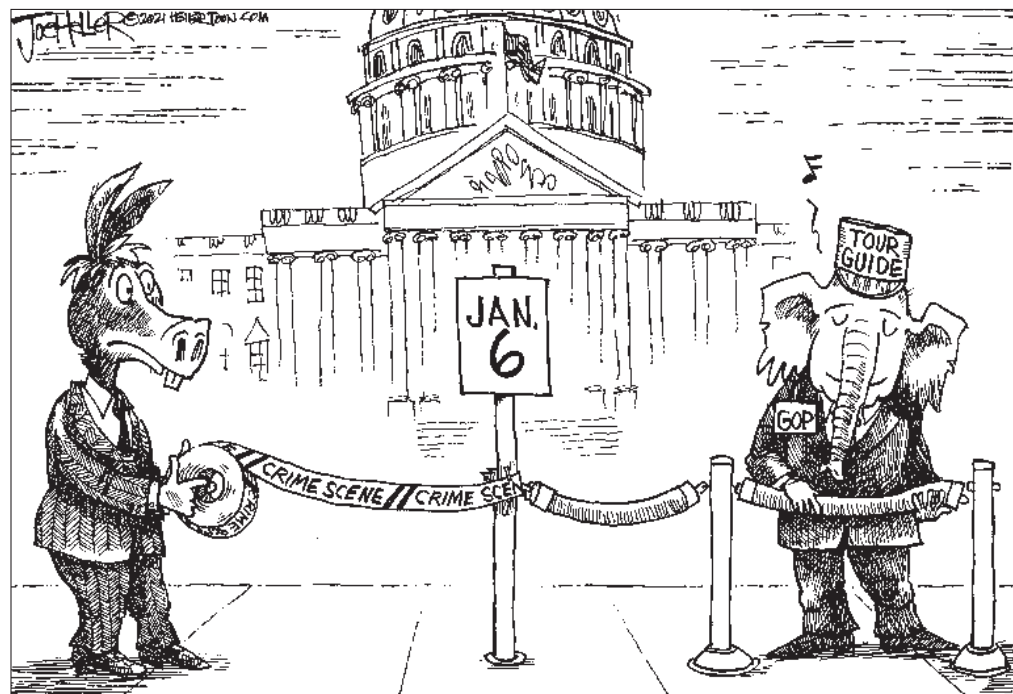
I do not mean to lessen the value and importance of the processors, transporters and merchants. In times of shortages, just going to the store to get more food is a weak answer supplied by many people. If the shortage is because of processing, transportation or marketing problems these things can usually be fixed or worked around. But if the lack of products on the shelf is a producer problem, that is something for which there usually is no quick fix.

So what are some of the reasons for producer problems? A few of them could be shortages of fuel for equipment, unusual weather patterns that can affect plant growth and/or livestock


health, shortages of fertilizer and seed, unusual livestock and plant diseases, insect and other predator invasions, equipment and parts shortages, a lack of available quality land, inflation, etc., etc.

If you will notice most of these problems are way beyond the control of the producer, the same as with many of the problems for processors, transporters and marketers of these products. However, overlooking or just not knowing that the producer is probably the most important step in providing our nation and a portion of the world with Agricultural products is a dangerous precedent. Keep in mind the adage: Knowledge is power.
