Flash floods cause mess at sheriff's department, families seek help as water rises

Heavy rainfall wreaked havoc in Parker County on Monday, flooding the sheriff's department and causing one neighborhood to call for help as rising water surrounded their homes.

Parker County's Emergency Management Coordinator Sean Hughes said emergency personnel had to retrieve three families off of Bethel Road due to the rising water.

"They were trapped and couldn't get out of their properties," Hughes

No injuries were reported during the incident.

The flash flood also caused the Parker County Sheriff's Department building to flood, with water deep enough to cover tires of deputy vehicles in the parking lot. Water also seeped into the hallway and into the county's server room.

Public Information Officer Danie Huffman said rising water came in from the north side of the building, causing the computeraided dispatch (CAD) system and landlines to go down for about an

"The 911 system was not affected," Huffman said.

County employees assisted with immediate water removal until clean-up crews could arrive, and preventative measures were taken for more rain expected.

Huffman said damages appear to be minimal.

SMS student organizes fundraiser to help abuse victims

Counselors at Freedom House will now be able to help more families thanks to a Springtown Middle School fundraiser organized by Kurstin Poe.

On May 24 the eighth-grader presented a \$1,600 check to Freedom House, a non-profit organization that offers counseling services free of charge to adult and child victims of domestic and/or sexual violence.

In the United States today, 1.8 million teens have been the victims of serious sexual assault. In Texas, 74% of people have either themselves, a family member and/ or a friend experienced some form of domestic violence, according to Freedom House.



Four die in Springtown collision

A two-vehicle collision resulted in four deaths Tuesday in Springtown. Police were called to the 2900 block of FM 51 North at 12:45 p.m.

Springtown Police Chief Cres Salazar said three of the mains under investigation. four occupants of the two vehicles were declared dead at the scene of the accident.

A fourth person, identified by the Tarrant County Medical Examiner's Office as 84-year-old Milton Wolfe, died after being taken to Texas Health Harris Methodist Azle Hospital.

Identity of the other victims is being withheld pending notification of next of kin.

FM 51 North was closed during the incident and traffic was detoured on Thomas Road and CR 3699. The cause of the accident re-

The idea to raise money for Freedom House stemmed from Poe and SMS student Kendall Penneston's "Stop the Cycle" presentation at the Family, Career and Community Leaders of America (FCCLA) regional conference.

After Poe returned from the regional conference, she began a campaign to raise money to help "stop the cycle" of abuse. She went on to compete at the state level, finishing in second place, which landed her a spot in the FCCLA National Leadership Conference in Nashville this summer.

Poe had used services at Freedom House herself, so she wanted to focus her fundraiser on that organization.

In March, Freedom House and the Children's Advocacy Center of Parker County signed a lease agreement for an office space on the Square in Springtown. With both non-profits based in Weatherford, the new location makes it more convenient for those in and near Springtown.

The money was raised in eight weeks as the SMS FCCLA chapter held "Hat Days" on Fridays, where students could wear a hat or hoodie in class all day

for a \$1 donation. Students safe place where you can **CAN MEN AND** would receive a wrist band to wear, showing they had donated. Many bought additional wristbands each week.

Natalie Hill, SMS career education teacher and FC-CLA advisor, said after just four days, students contributed more than \$750. By the end of the fundraiser on May 20, \$1,600 was raised. "Our initial goal was



Kaitlynn was kept on life help them heal?" support until she was dewas a kidney donor.

Karyle Edgar, a Springtown resident, said suicide is something not discussed often and there is not enough information out there about healing from this type of death.

"With cancer, the grieving period is usually five to seven years; a car wreck is seven to 10 years. But with less." suicide, we don't have this statistic," she was told. "Left with no answers, you're not going to have a closing period."

Prior to Kaitlynn's passing, Karyle was healing from four other deaths. In May 2010, she lost her paternal grandfather. A few months later in July, her maternal 2010, her oldest brother died and in June 2014 she lost her baby brother.
